CLASS HISTORY

September 15, 1959 was the day; the beginning of our college careers. Registration, orientation, and entrance examinations passed in a flash. Classes began and something called a Sophomore appeared to make life "interesting."

An administrative decree ended customs abruptly. The late-at-night activities of some Sophomores caused the cancelling of the rope pull thus our chance for sweet revenge was lost. As "Frosh" we were recognized by our name cards because the shipment of beanies failed to arrive on time.

The election of our class officers and a growing knowledge of campus activities allowed us to slip into the routine of college life.

This was a year for many firsts on our campus: 1. The enrollment of students into the new Chemistry and Biology Majors, 2. the expansion of the athletic program under the direction of Mr. Ned Linta, the new athletic director, 3. the use of a new gymnasium for many activities, and 4. the appointment of Mr. Robert Chiodi as Head Football Coach.

As the year progressed we became secure in the knowledge that we were an important part of this academic community. Our classmates were performing admirably in many facets of the College program.

Near the end of our first year we were informed of the change in the name of the College from National Agriculture College to Delaware Valley College of Science and Agriculture.

Following the summer program and vacation we returned to the campus eagerly looking forward to

guiding the Freshmen through the maze called customs.

A class dance, the blood bank participation award, and a successful A-Day were the highlights of the year for our class. Other important events of the year were: 1. The first visit by the Middle States Evaluation Committee, 2. the successful start of a College Blood Bank, 3. the showing of movies on campus, and 4. the appearance of Miley men on campus.

At the end of the year we turned to summer jobs hoping to see the application of what we had already learned.

The Junior year found us woven ever deeper into the web of college life.

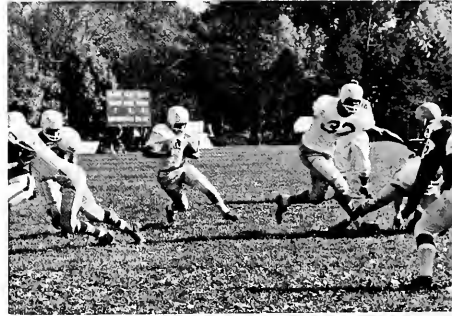

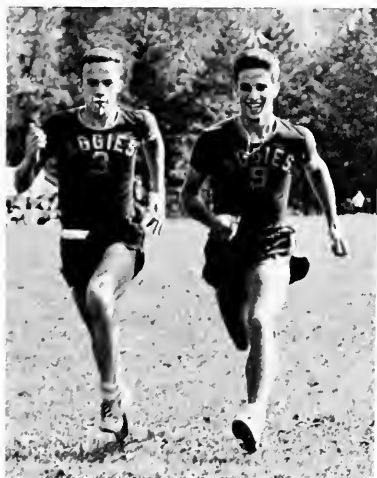

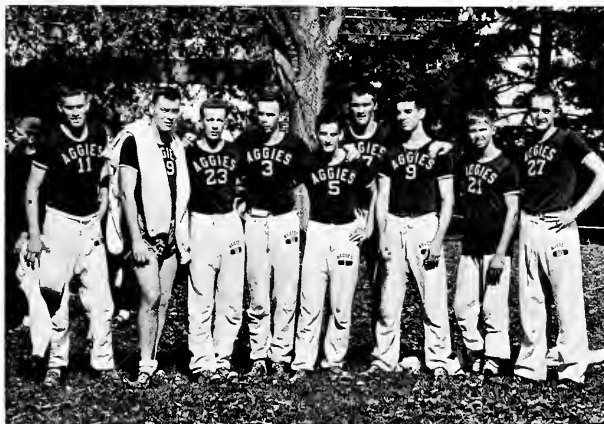

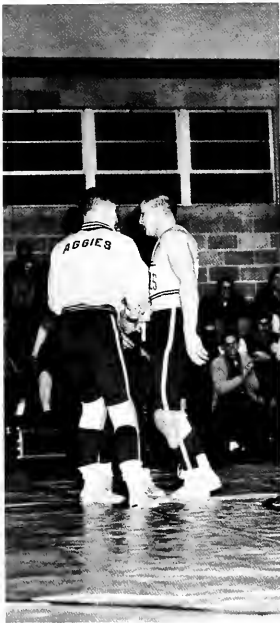

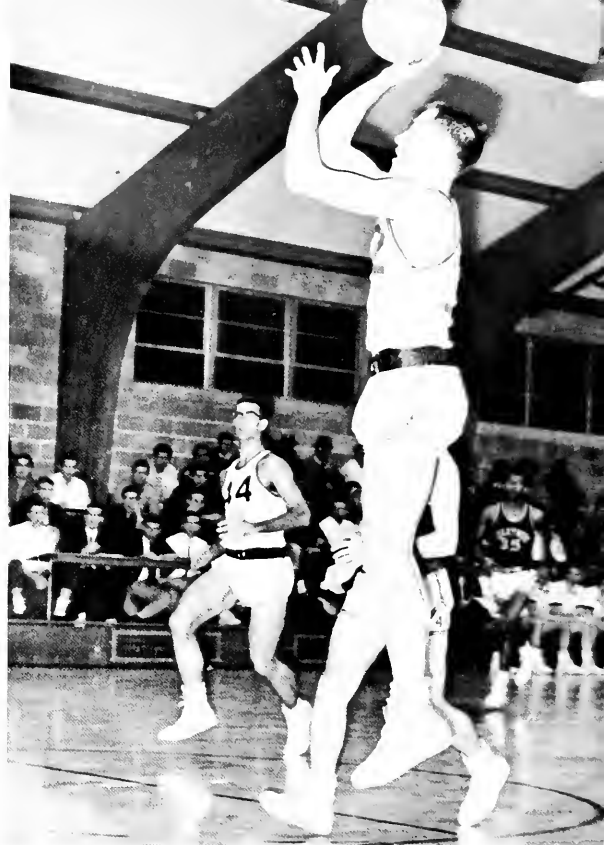

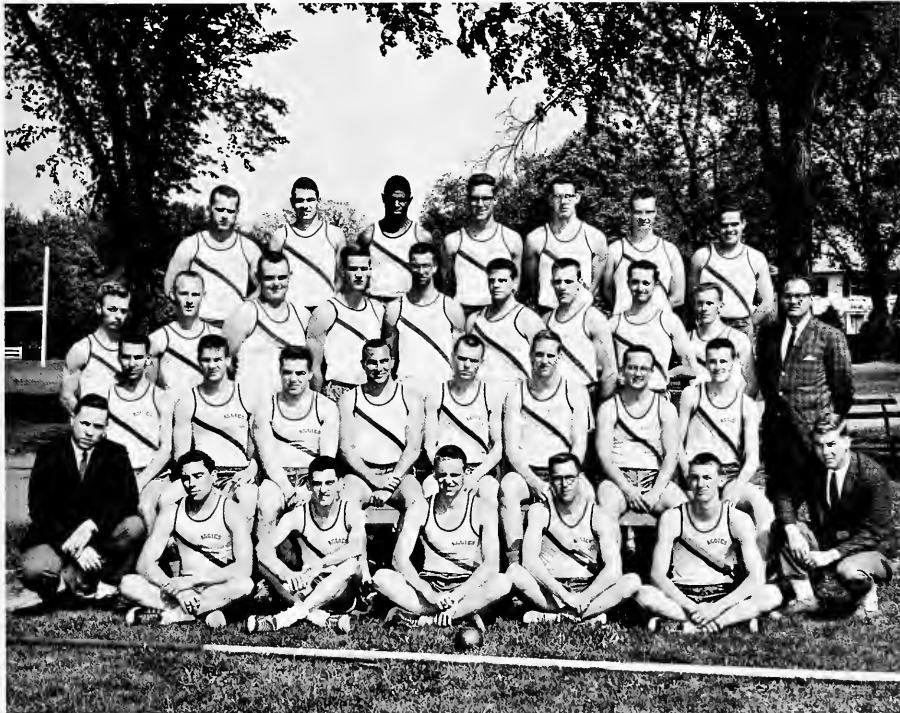

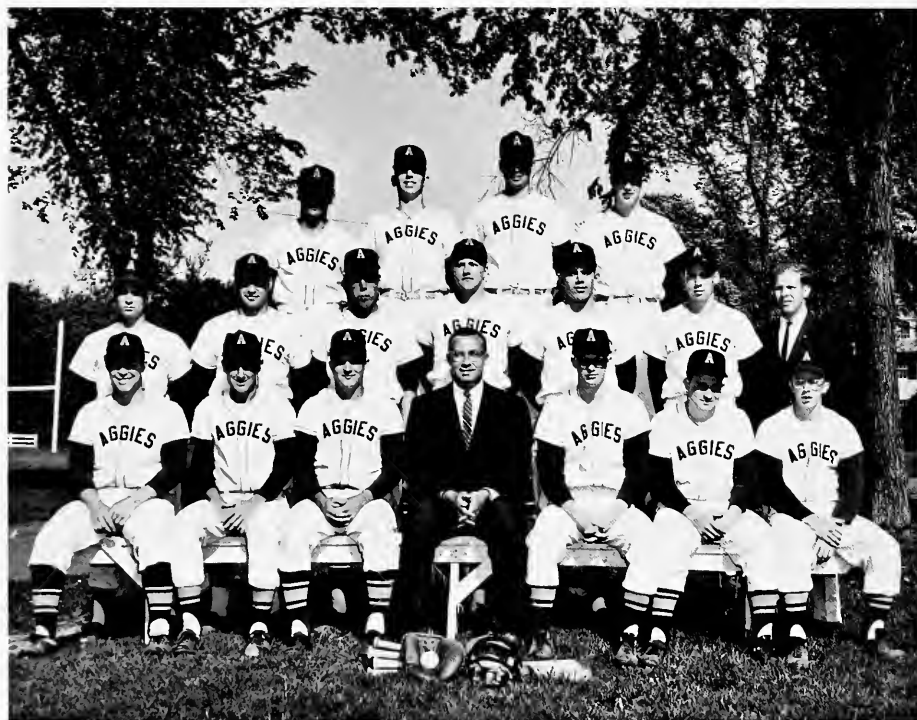

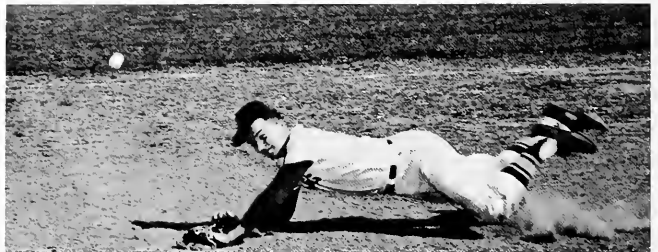

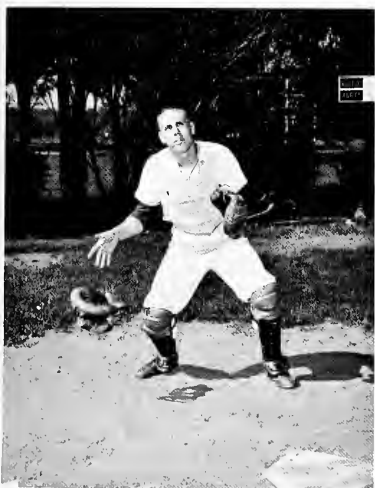
