The caterpillar hangs upside-down by a silken thread. It will then molt one last time, creating its chrysalis.



While inside the chrysalis, the caterpillar is liquified and reassembled. This process takes about three weeks.

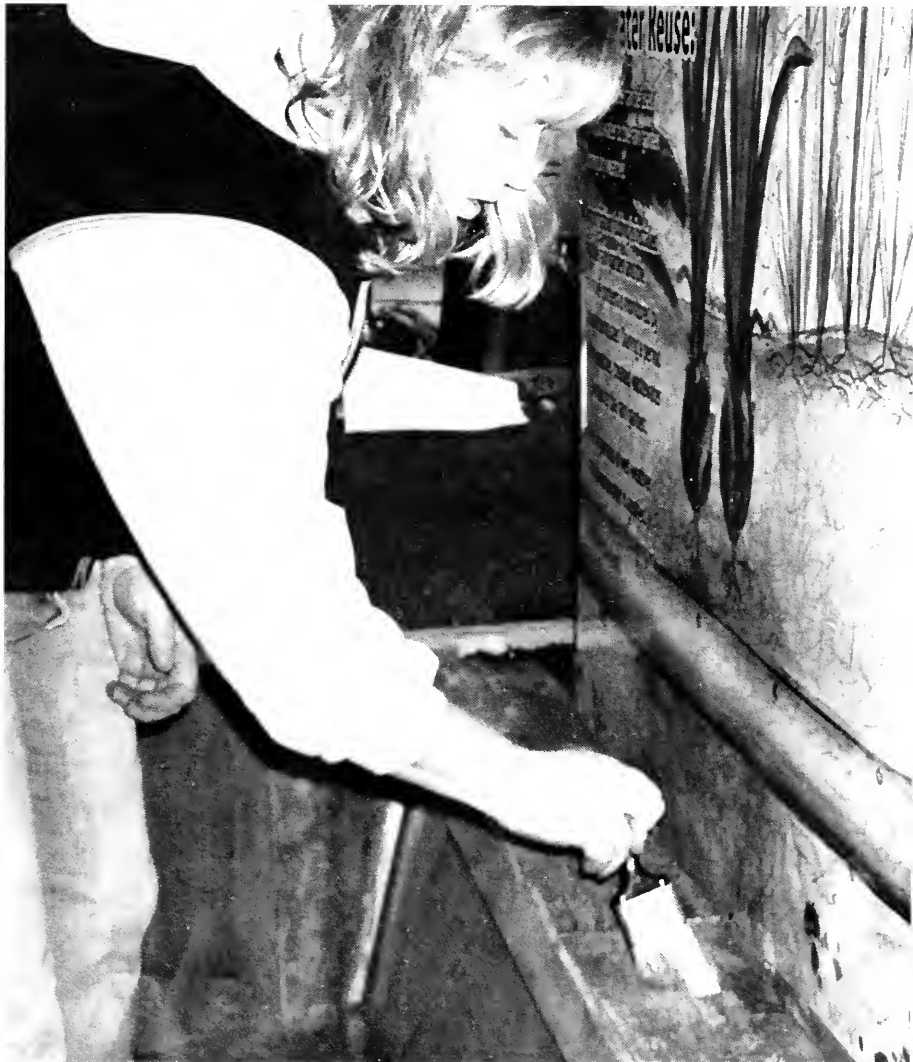

This year's Philadelphia Flower Show was yet another triumphant success. The flower show has been a DVC tradition since 1950. The theme of the exhibit this year was the reduction of pollution and waste through practical building and landscape techniques.

"This year's exhibit displayed rainwater conservation with the greenroof, rainbarrel, and wetland-like raingarden. It is the first-ever DVC display funded by a state grant — the Dept. of Environmental Protection backed it with a substantial Coastal Zone Management conservation grant. This program encourages the management of runoff that would otherwise become sources of non-point pollution like sediment, fertilizer, nutrients, road salts, septic systems, etc.," stated William Rein, director of the exhibit.

It was displayed from March 1st through the 11th and earned two distinguished awards. The Pennsylvania Horticultural Society's Award of Merit and the Garden Club Federation of Pennsylvania Conservation award.

The design was originally conceived by students under the direction of Douglas Kane. Upon his passing in October, the students decided to dedicate the show to his memory.

Everyone in the Horticulture department is looking forward to next year's show. It will be DelVal's 55th, and hopefully the best ever!!!

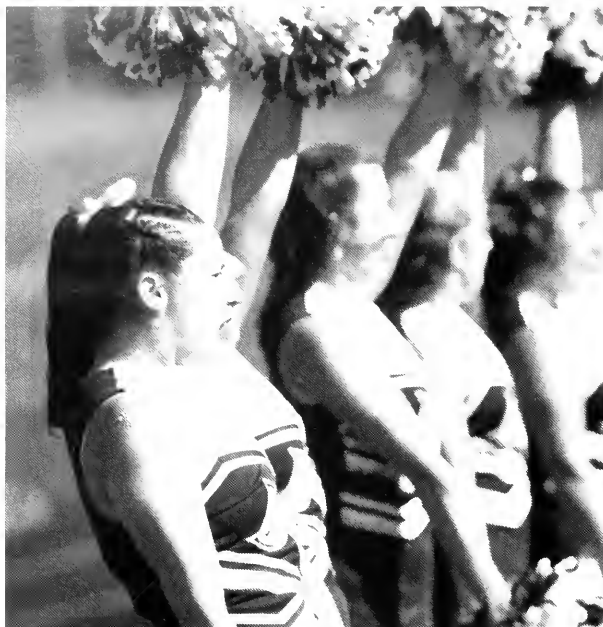

Throughout the next couple of years, the girls hope to continue to improve their skills and keep the crowd pumped during every game.



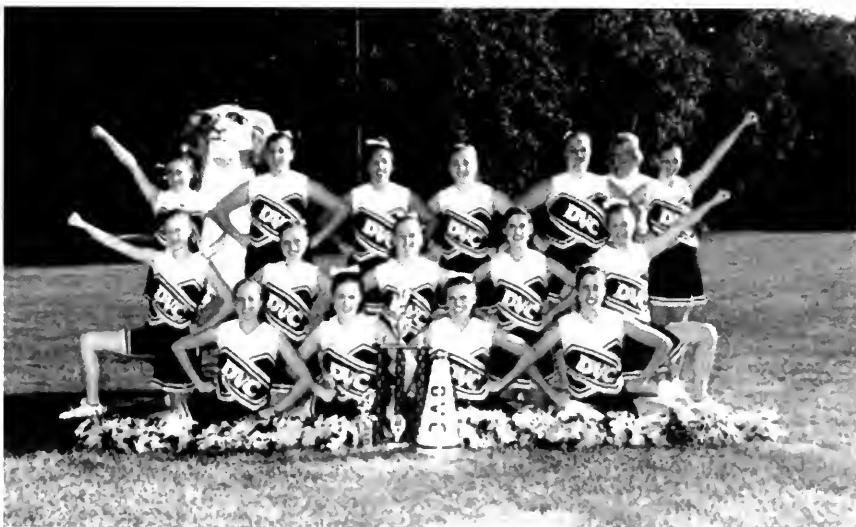

Men's Cross Country

The Delaware Valley College men's cross country team of 2002 with their first-year head coach Ed Andrewlevich ended their season without enough seasoned runners to score as a team.

Seniors Andy Hannah and Nick Fritz led their team all season and made themselves known during the 2002 campaign. Hannah opened the season by placing third out of twenty runners with a time of 32:10 at the team's quad meet and posted his best season time of 29:32 at the Middle Atlantic Conference Championships finishing in 58th place.

This season's Men's Cross Country certainly made themselves known at Delaware Valley College.

Women's Cross Country

First-year head coach Ed Andrewlevich wrapped up the 2002 campaign with the Delaware Valley College women's cross country team who won three head-to-head meets and placed 12 out of 13 teams in the Middle Atlantic Conference Championships (MAC).

The Senior Erins, Baker and Redding in their final college year made quite a mark for the Aggies this season. Baker in the home quad meet had 8th place honors and had her best showing by placing 98th with a time of 30:17 at the conference championships. Redding with a time of 23:31 placed third in the quad meet and then took 51st place at the Dickinson Invitational 4k run with a time of 17:26.

The Delaware Valley College field hockey team, under third-year head coach Jennifer Wolfgang, wrapped up its 2002 season with a record of 6-13 losses overall and ended with 1-4 losses in the Freedom Conference. Of the 19 players on the Delaware Valley roster, 14 were freshmen or sophomores. The young squad recorded 350 shots during the year, just three shy of the single-season record set by both the 1997 and 2001 squads. Sophomore Kristin Cottman and freshman Tiffany LaRosa tied for the team lead in scoring as both forwards registered 17 points.

During her career, Cottman, who was a second team all-Freedom Conference honoree in 2001, scored six goals and assisted on

five others. LaRosa paced Delaware Valley as a rookie with seven goals while adding three assists.

Junior forward Sara Astbury notched six goals and two assists to finish third on the team with 14 points. Sophomore midfielder Kelly Geissler and freshman back Katie Wessner followed with seven and six points respectively. Lindsay Higgins Amy Hummel and Abby Wilson rounded out the Aggie scorers. Seniors Dyanna Capuano and Leigh Stiffler wrapped up their collegiate games. Capuano was a four-year starter on defense and she helped Delaware Valley notch 11 shutouts

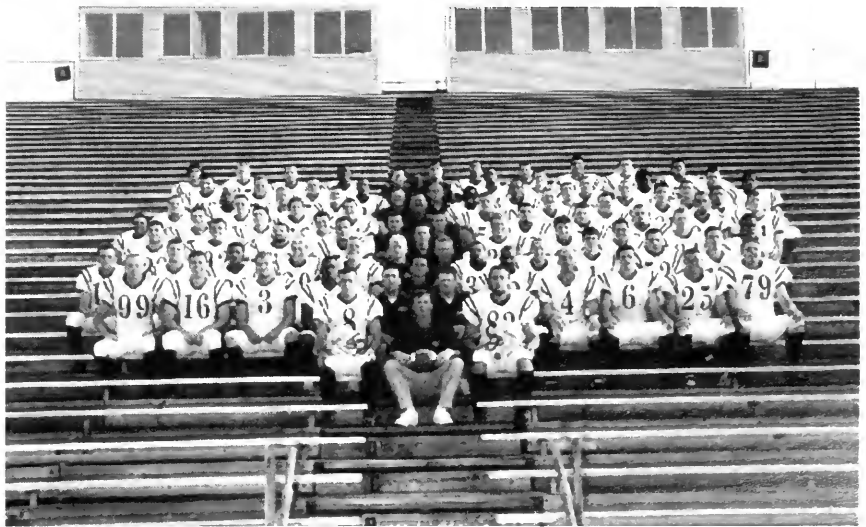

Head coach Laura Hogan has rebuilt the Aggies into a regional power of the last four years. The Delaware Valley College women's basketball team, under head coach Laura Hogan, completed its 2002-03 season with 11-15 overall and 6-8 losses in the Freedom Conference to qualify for the conference play-offs for the third consecutive year and four of the last five seasons.

Senior guard and first team all-Freedom Conference selection Amber Smolinsky led the team and the conference in scoring with an average of 17.7 points per game. Smolinsky finished her career as Delaware Valley's fourth all-time leading scorer with 1,409 points.

Sophomore forward center Bridget Golden was one of only two players in the Freedom Conference to average a double-double with 12.8 points and 10 rebounds per game. Golden's 261 rebounds were the fourth-highest, single-season total in school history.

Junior forward guard Shannon McCormick started 25 of the 26 games and notched career highs of 8.3 points and 4.9 rebounds per contest. The team captain also averaged 1.9 assists and 1.1 steals for the year.

Sarah Tuffner also served as a team captain and was ranked second in the Freedom Conference in blocks and seventh in rebounding.

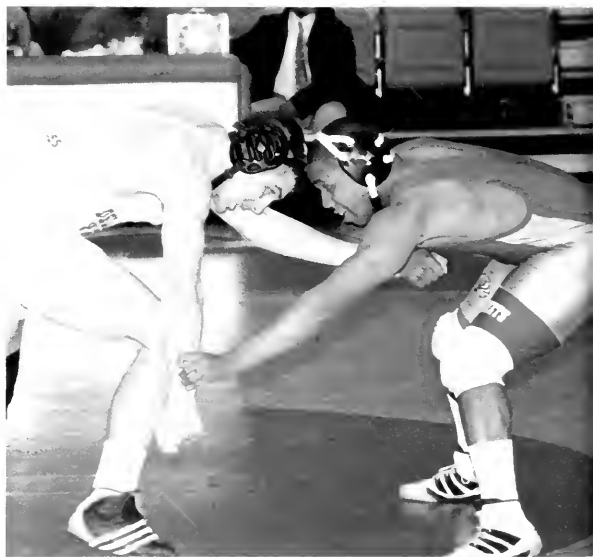

The Aggies wrestling team, ranked seventh in the country, has not had a losing season since the 1969-70 campaign. The 2003 season was no different. Coach Brandon Totten directed this year's squad to a 17-3 record, including a perfect 7-0 mark in Middle Atlantic Conference (MAC) matches. The Delaware Valley College wrestling team won the MAC Wrestling Championship for the second consecutive year and the 11th time in the storied history of the program. The Aggies then qualified four wrestlers for the NCAA Division III Championships. Coach Totten was named the MAC Coach of the Year for his efforts.

The Aggies finished in 13th place at the NCAAs with sophomore B.J. Wise earning All-American honors by placing third in the 133-pound weight class. As a team, Delaware Valley finished in 13th place.

Brandon Totten was recently named the NCAA Division III Wrestling Rookie Head Coach of the Year. The assistant coach and former three-time Division III national champion Shaun Smith was inducted into the Pennsylvania Wrestling Hall of Fame.

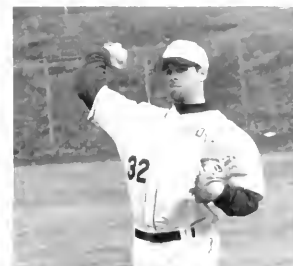

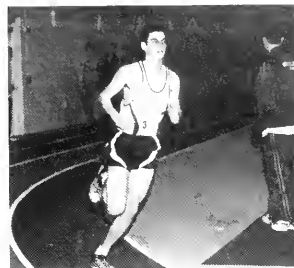

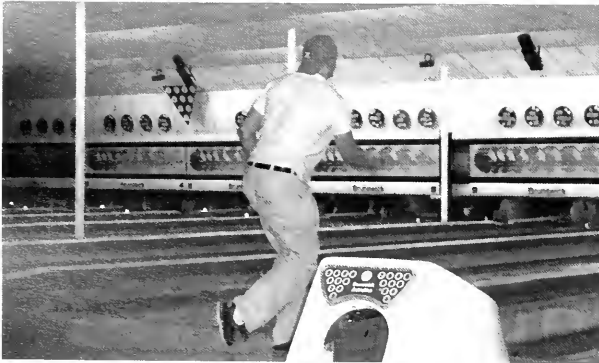

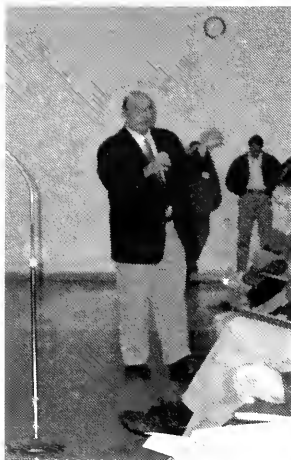

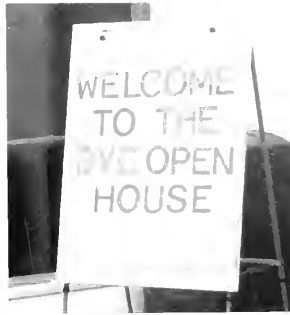

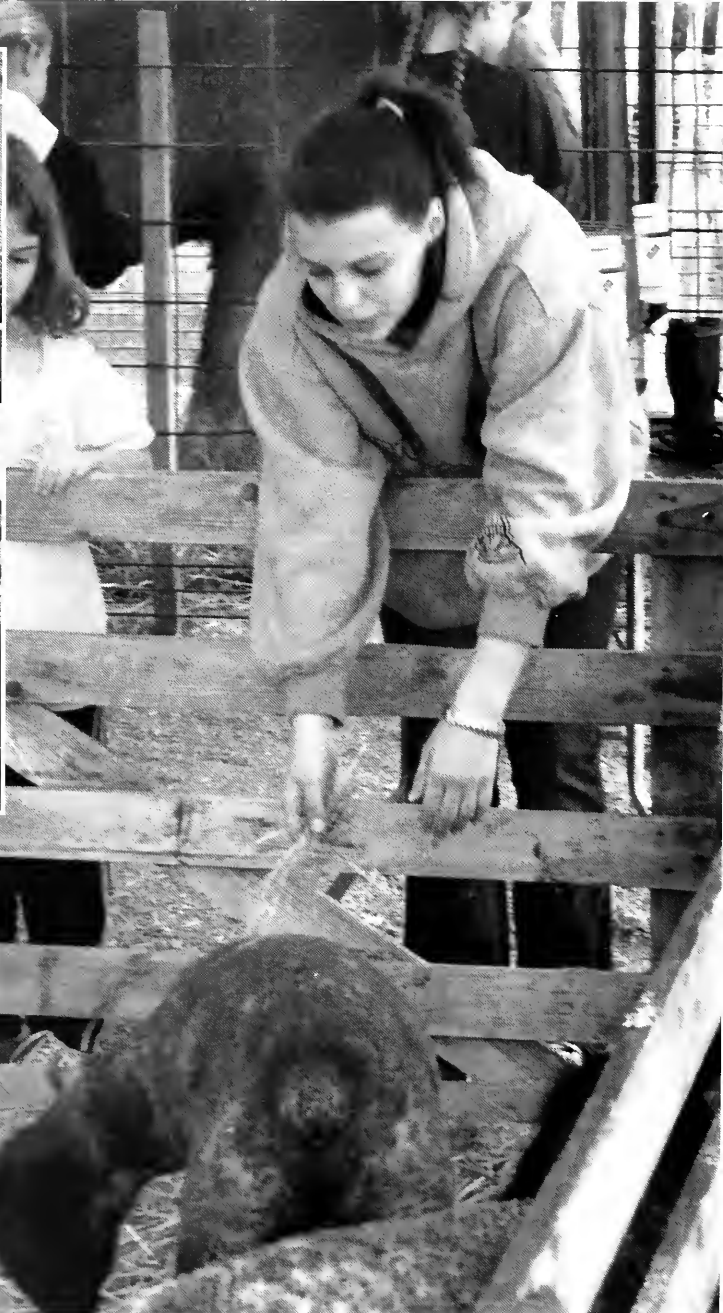

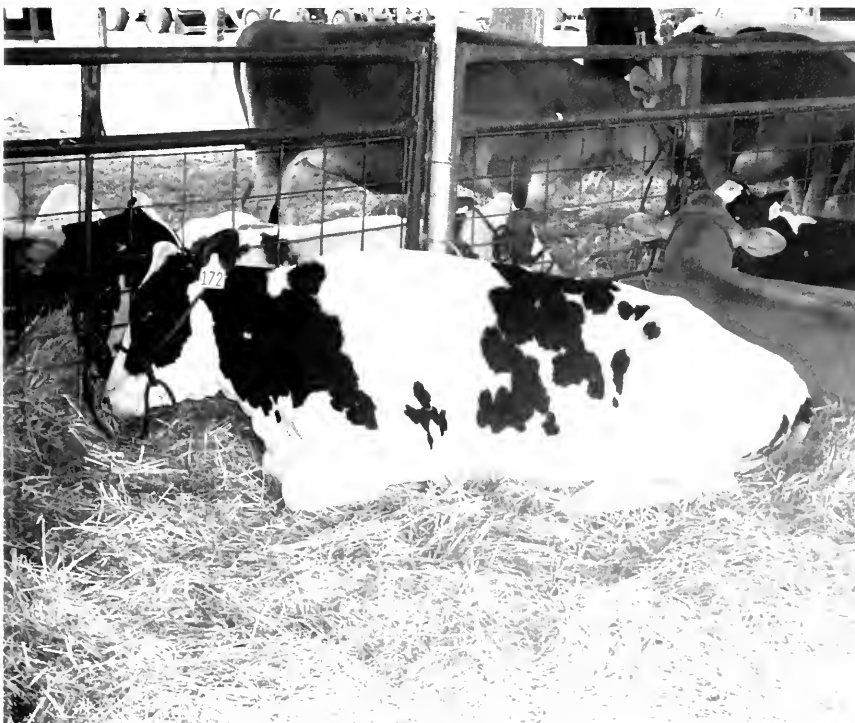
