

# COUNTY OF WATERLOO G A Z E T T E E R,

AND

GENERAL DIRECTORY,

## COUNTY OF WATERLOO, PROVINCE OF CANADA.

THIS County is bounded on the West by the County of Perth; on the South by the Counties of Oxford and Brant; on the North by the County of Wellington; and on the East by the same County.

The County is divided into six Townships, as follows, viz. : North Dumfries, North and South Waterloo, Wellesley, Wilmot, and Wool-The County is well watered by the Speed, Grand River, Coneswich. togo, and Smith's Creek, together with a number of small streams, tributaries of the Grand River. All these Rivers and their tributaries supply abundant hydraulic power for mills and manufactories of various kinds. Waterloo formed at one time, for judicial and electoral purposes, a part of the old Wellington District, subsequently changed to that of the United Counties of Waterloo and Brant. These Counties were disunited by Act of Parliament in January, 1863. The County now consists of the following Municipalities, viz.: Village of Berlin, North Dumfries Township, Town of Galt, Village of New Hamburg, Village of Hespeler, Village of Preston, Village of Waterloo, Townships of North and South Waterloo, Wellesley, Wilmot, and Woolwich.

The timber is chiefly hardwood, with pine and cedar interspersed. The County contains every variety of soil and surface, clay, loam, sand, and gravel; hill, valley, meadow land, and swamp. The soil is rich and fertile, and perhaps no County in Canada is better improved, or none where the agricultural classes are better off, and exhibit with a determination to earn their bread by the sweat of their brow, a prudent carefulness and thriftiness.

The Grand Trunk, and the Guelph and Galt Branch of the Great Western Railway, intersect the County, and furnish every facility for the transportation of produce to Eastern markets. The County has also several good gravel roads, which are kept in excellent repair.

The total population of the County (that is, of the Townships that now form the County), in 1825, was less than a thousand souls; in 1841 it had increased to 13,782; and the total population in 1861 was 38, 750—exhibiting an increase of 25,000 during twenty years. The total occupiers of land in the County are 2,792; the amount of acres held by them in 1861 were 295,275; the number of acres under cultivation, 183,613. The number of acres of wood and wild land is 111,662. The cash value of farms, in dollars, \$12,446,531. The number of acres under fall wheat in 1861, 27,843; the number of bushels raised was 616,163, shewing a yield of about twenty-two bushels as an average to the acre. The number of acres under spring wheat was 28,161; number of bushels raised, 501,034, being an average yield of eighteen bushels. Acres under barley, 2,041; number of bushels, 52,969. Acres under oats, 18,736; number of bushels, 661,178.

#### EDUCATIONAL.

The County of Waterloo has made great progress in the important matter of education. She has now the advantage of a liberal and permanent provision for the thorough and general education of the rising population, fully enjoying the privileges and benefits conferred by the excellent School Act for Upper Canada.

The following is a report of the school statistics of the County :--

#### THE COMMON SCHOOLS.

Receipts and Expenditures of Common School Moneys for the year 1861.

#### RECEIPTS.

The amount appropriated and paid by the Department of Public In-

struction from the Legislative Grant for salaries of teachers, was, in the County, \$3,362 50; for the town of Galt, \$319; town of Berlin, \$225 50; village of Hespeler, \$87; village of Preston, \$160; village of Waterloo, \$169; New Hamburg, \$104. The amount apportioned and paid for the purchase of maps, apparatus, prizes, and libraries, being in proportion and equal to the amount expended from local sources was, for the County, \$330 56; Galt, \$82 94; Berlin, \$42 10; Preston, \$30; and New Hamburg, \$17 98. The law requires that each municipality shall provide a sum by assessment at least equal to the Legislative Grant, but each municipality can provide as large an additional sum as it may think proper for school purposes. The amount provided by municipal assessment was, for the County, \$3,900; Galt, \$3,881; Berlin, \$1,711; Hespeler, \$54,209; Preston, \$1,400; Waterloo, \$1,050; and New Hamburg, \$1,100—exceeding the Legislative Grant, in the aggregate, by the sum of \$7,157 09.

As the Council in a municipality, so the trustees in a school section have authority to provide money for the support of their school or schools by assessment, and also by fees on pupils, unless the ratepayers decide in favour of a free school. The amount of assessment levied by trustees, in addition to the levy by Municipal Councils, was \$21,020 for the County.

Rate-bill fees on pupils are only imposed where the schools are not free. The amount of rate-bills imposed, was for the County, \$1,617 38.

The amount received by trustees, from the Clergy Reserve Fund and other sources, and appropriated for the County, was \$2,322 06; Berlin, \$177 63; Galt, \$81 90; Hespeler, \$30; Preston, \$215 97.

The amount available in 1861, from the balance of 1860, was for the County, \$4,714 73; Galt, \$945 54; Hespeler, \$4 59; New Hamburg, \$543 85; Preston, \$424 16; Waterloo, \$45 44.

The total receipts for Common School purposes, for the year 1861, in the County were \$37,267 49; Berlin, \$2,210 51; Galt, \$5,257 84; Hespeler, \$663 58; New Hamburg, \$1,768 58; Preston, \$2,238; Waterloo, \$1,234 57.

#### EXPENDITURE.

The amount paid for the salaries of teachers, was in the County, \$24,897 67; Berlin, \$1897; Galt, \$3,465; New Hamburg, \$626; Preston, \$1409; Hespeler, \$442 57; Waterloo, \$925.

The amount expended in the purchase of maps, apparatus, prize-

books, and libraries, was for the County, \$727 62; Berlin, \$84; Galt, 60; New Hamburg, \$46; Preston, \$61.

For sites and building school-houses, for the County, \$4,043; for Galt, \$43 66.

The amount paid for repairs and rent of school-houses, was \$756.

The total expenditure for all common school purposes during 1861, including the towns and villages of Galt, Berlin, Waterloo, Preston, and Hespeler, was \$41,748.

Unexpended balances of the preceding years, were for the County, including the towns and villages of Galt, Berlin, Waterloo, Preston, and Hespeler, \$7,223. These balances are rather apparent than real, arising from the fact that many of the municipal councils and school trustees do not, until after the close of every civil year, collect the sums necessary to pay the expenses of the year.

#### RELIGIOUS EXERCISES, BIBLES, TEXT-BOOKS, AND APPABATUS USED IN THE SCHOOLS.

Out of ninety-five schools in the County reported, it appears that the daily exercises of seventy of them are opened and closed with prayer; and that in seventy-eight of them, the Bible or Testament is read. The uniform series of National Text-books is used in all the schools of the County. It is gratifying to observe that Sangster's improved edition and adaptation to Canadian currency of the National Arithmetic, is rapidly superseding the old and inferior edition, it having been introduced into forty schools in the County.

The total number of maps used in the schools in the County was 673; and the number of schools in which maps were used was eighty-five; with forty using globes, and ninety in which blackboards were used.

#### ROMAN CATHOLIC SEPARATE SCHOOLS.

#### RECEIPTS.

There are three Roman Catholic Separate Schools in the township of Wellesley, and two in the township of Wilmot. The schools in Wellesley are Nos. 9, 10, and 11, and the receipts for the last year were about \$450,-\$20 of which was paid for maps, &c., and the balance expended in teachers's salaries. The receipts for the two schools in the township of Wilmot, were \$424,-\$18 of which were expended for the purchase of maps and other purposes, and \$406 for teachers' salaries. In the town of Berlin there is a school with an average attendance of 100 pupils, established in 1858; and one in Preston, with an average attendance of 55 pupils, was established in 1857.

#### GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.

#### RECEIPTS, EXPENDITURE, PUPILS' FEES.

There are two Grammar Schools in the County, viz., at Galt and Berlin. The amount of legislative grant and fund apportioned and paid for masters' salaries (received from January 1st to December 31st) was \$1,222.

Legislative grant and fund apportioned for the purchase of maps, apparatus, and prize-books, \$18 32.

#### JUDICIARY OF THE COUNTY OF WATERLOO.

#### COUNTY COURT.

This court is presided over by the resident Judge in the county. Its jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50, and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties, or signature of the defendant to £100, and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills or actions for libel, slander, crim. con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. The County Court also possesses Equity powers to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery.

#### COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS.

Wm. Miller, Chairman.—This court is held four times a year for trials by Jury, in case of larceny, misdemeanour and other offences.

#### SURROGATE COURT.

The jurisdiction of this Court relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of Probate of Wills and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons, having estates or effects in the county, and all matters arising out of, or connected with, the grant or revocation of Probate or Administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery.

#### LAW CIRCUITS.

The Circuits are held twice a year in each County, between Hilary and Easter Terms, and between Trinity and Michaelmas Terms, and the Courts of the Oxford Circuit are held in the towns of Simcoe, Brantford, Guelph, Berlin, Stratford, Woodstock and Cayuga.

#### DIVISION COURTS.

Wm. Miller, Judge.

These Courts are held in different places in the County, for the summary disposal of cases not exceeding £25 currency, in amount so far as regards matters of debt or contract, and £10 so far as relates to injuries to personal chattels and torts. A jury is permitted in certain Attachments against personal property of debtors absconding cases. from the Province, leaving property liable to execution, or removing their goods from one County to another, or from the Province with intent to defraud, or keeping concealed to avoid service of process with intent to defraud, may be issued by the Clerk of the Division Court or by the Judge, or by any Justice of the Peace. Their jurisdiction does not extend to actions for gambling, debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to Land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim: con. 'seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a Justice of the Peace for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Courts are held once in each Division or oftener at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Court of Quarter Sessions.

The rate on letters to the United Kingdom is, by the Canadian Packet,  $12\frac{1}{2}$  cents per half ounce; and if by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per half ounce.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on arrival in England.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries. via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the United States (except California and Oregon) is 10 cents per half ounce; and for letters to California and Oregon, 15 cents per half ounce.

The postage rate to British Columbia is : Letters 25 cents per half ounce; newspapers, 2 cents each.

## TOWNSHIP OF WATERLOO.

This Township is bounded on the East by the Township of Guelph, in the County of Wellington, on the South by the Township of North Dumfries, on the West by the Township of Wilmot, and on the North by the Township of Woolwich. The Township was originally "Block No. 2, on the Grand River, and comprised 94,012 acres, and was owned in May, 1798, by Richard Beasley, James Wilson, and John Baptiste Rosseau; in 1804 Richard Beasley became the sole proprietor of the entire block No. 2, having obtained in December, 1803, a quit claim deed from Joseph Brant, Chief Warrior of the Mohawk or Five Nation Indians, of a part of the Block, comprising 13,430 acres; Richard Beasley and wife conveyed 60,000 acres to Daniel Erb and Jacob Erb on the 29th June, 1802, which purchase was afterwards, and is now known as the "German Company Tract," of the Township of Waterloo. This Township is one of the most thickly settled in the Province. In 1825 the Township contained 1,640 inhabitants; in 1841, 4,424; in 1850, 7,759; and in 1864, 13,952,-nearly 100 per cent. increase during the last twelve years.

The majority of the settlers are German, or of German extract. The surface is generally undulating; and there is no Township in Western Canada better watered. The soil is of a sandy loam intermixed with gravel. The Township contains the following Post Offices, viz :-Berlin, Blair, Blooningdale, Breslau, Bridgeport, Doon, Freeport, Freiburg, Hespeler, New Aberdeen, Preston, Shantz, Waterloo.

The Township of Wellesley is bounded on the north by the Township of Peel, County of Wellington; on the east by the Townships of Woolwich and Waterloo; on the south by the Township of Wilmot, and on the west by the Townships of North Easthope and Mornington, in the County of Perth. This Township formed one of the Townships of the "Queen's Bush" and was first settled about 1836. The first conveyance of land in the township on record was made during the year 1847 to Wm. Cunningham, to Josiah Hall in 1848, and to John Hawke in 1851. The Township of Wellesly in 1837 contained only sixty-three inhabitants, in 1841, two hundred and fifty four, in 1850, three thousand three hundred and ninety-six, and in 1861 five thousand eight hundred and eighty-The land throughout the whole township is of excellent quality, eight. and is chiefly timbered with hardwood, intermixed with a small quantity of pine, it is well watered, having several branches of the Nith and Conestogo rivers distributed over it.

The Township contains the following Post Offices, viz. : Bamberg, Crosshill, Hawksville, Linwood, St. Clements, Wellesley or Smithville.

## TOWNSHIP OF WILMOT.

The Township of Wilmot is bounded on the North by the Township of Wellesley; on the East by the Township of Waterloo; on the South by the Township of Blenheim, in the County of Oxford; and on the West by the Townships of North and South Easthope, in the County The Township was first settled in 1822 by Christian Naffof Perth. ziger, a German of the Menonist persuasion, who applied to the British Government for a free grant of fifty acres of land to each family who should emigrate with him from Germany to Canada. This grant he obtained, and in 1826 returned from Germany with a number of settlers. These grants comprised the front quarter of each lot to actual settlers on the North and South of Erb's road, North and South of Snyder's road, and North and South of Bleam's road. Elias Waldfong, Christian Howick, Joseph Goldsmith, John Haymaker, Daniel Hunziger, and Solomon Behringer were among the first parties to whom grants were given in the years 1830 and 1831. Block "A," comprising the first, second, and third concessions, and Block "B" the first, second, third, and fourth concessions were purchased by the Canada Company from the Crown in 1829. The township is well settled, and the farms well improved; the soil, a sandy loam. In 1841 the population was 2,220; in 1850, 4,863; and in 1861, 6,173. The Township contains the following post offices, viz. :- Baden, Haysville, New Dundee, New Hamburg, Petersburg, Philipsburg, and St. Agatha.

The Township of Woolwich is bounded on the North by the Township of Peel, in the County of Wellington; on the East by the Township of Maryborough, in the County of Wellington; on the South by the Township of Waterloo; and on the West by the Township of Wellesley.

The land in this Township is of excellent quality, timbered principally with hardwood. There are four or five black ash and cedar swamps. The Township is well watered, having the Grand River on the East, and the Conestogo on the West; the surface is generally hilly, and the soil a stiff loam intermixed with gravel. The farms are becoming well improved, and the farm houses are of a superior class.

A portion of this Township, or about 45,195 acres, was granted by the Crown in June, 1807, to one William Wallace, who disposed of the entire block to Augustus Jones, John and Jacob Erb, trustees for the German Company, the members of whom formed the first settlers of this section. A remarkable illustration of the difficulties attending the proper conveyance of real estate in this as in all new countries is presented in connection with this portion of the Township. Wallace, in conveying to the German Company through their agents, omitted to supply the bar to the dower of Mrs. Wallace. It was only in the year 1859, or fifty-two years after the original conveyance, that the omission was noticed, or steps taken under the dower to exact a consideration or a division of the property. In the year named, the heirs-at-law of Wallace took steps to enforce their claim; those steps had the effect of intimidating a few into an adjustment of the differences, and compromises followed. Emboldened thus, the possession of the remainder of the large settlement was attacked, and with some show of success. At this juncture, in the interest of his constituents, and for the wellbeing of a large and important section, the Hon. M. H. Foley, who represented the North Riding of Waterloo in Parliament, interposed, and, lending his personal efforts in conjunction with his legal abilities, succeeded, not without much trouble, and at considerable personal expense, in procuring the passage through the Legislature of a bill quieting all titles, and giving perfect repose to the entire settlement. The Township contains the following villages, viz. ;-St. Jacob's, Conestogo, Winterbourne, and Elmira.

# TOWNS, VILLAGES, AND POST OFFICES

OF THE

# COUNTY OF WATERLOO.

# AYR,

An important Village in the township of North Dumfries, in the southeastern portion of the township, on the river Nith; fourteen miles from Berlin, the Couniy town, and seven miles from Paris Station, on the Great Western Railway. There is a good gravel road leading from Ayr to Paris. The site of the village was first settled by James Jackson; and the village laid out for James Jackson, J. K. Andrews, and Robert Wyllie, the present Postmaster. The Post Office was first established in 1836. James Jackson was the first postmaster. The present postmaster was appointed on the 22nd day of December, 1844, by William, Earl of Lonsdale, through F. A. Stayner, the Deputy Postmaster General at that time in Canada. The village has excellent facilities for manufacturing purposes,-the river Nith and Cedar Creek furnishing an abundant supply of hydraulic power. Ayr contains one of the largest iron-foundries in the county, carried on by John Watson, who established the works in 1849. The cost of the buildings and the machinery has been over twenty thousand dollars. An engine of twelve horse power and twenty-four hands are kept in constant employment. Threshing, mowing, and reaping machines, and other agricultural implements, and stoves, are manufactured to the value of forty thousand dollars per annum. The shoe-peg factory and extensive steam furniture factory of James Gladstones, employs a steam-engine of ten-horse power to propel its machinery, and gives employment to six hands. Mr. Gladstones turns out about seven thousand dollars worth of shoe-pegs and furniture annually. This is the only shoe-peg factory in this section of Western Canada. In the village and its vicinity, propelled by the river Nith and Cedar Creek, there are five flouring mills, viz. : the Springfield Mills, with seven run of stones, owned by David Goldie; the Nith-

ville Mill, with three run of stones for flouring and two for the manufacture of oatmeal, owned by James Piper; the Jedburgh Mill, with three run of stones exclusively flouring, owned by the same party; the Glenleavit Mill, with two run of stones, owned by Mr. McGinnis; and the Avr Flouring Mill, with three run of stones, owned by Daniel Manley. The Ayr woollen works are carried on by Robert Walker. The machinery is driven by Cedar Creek. The establishment turns out about five thousand dollars worth of manufactured woollen goods per annum.-Ayr also contains a brewery, saw-mill, stone cutting machine, boot and shoe manufacturers. In the latter branch of industry Hugh Richardson employs eight hands, and turns out work to the value of five thousand dollars per annum. McGregor & Bell, in the manufacture of carriages and wagons, employ six hands, and turn out four thousand dollars worth per annum. Alexander Matheson is engaged in the manufacture of sashdoors and blinds, and employs a number of hands in building. Walter Gladstones is largely engaged in the manufacture of saddles and harness, and turns out four thousand dollars worth per annum.

Ayr contains a town-hall, erected in 1850, size  $35 \times 50$ , and built at a cost of eight hundred dollars; five church organizations, viz. : Free Church of Scotland, built of frame in 1844, at a cost of one thousand five hundred dollars, and capable of seating four hundred persons : Rev. Duncan McRuar, pastor. The United Presbyterian Church, erected in 1843, of frame, at a cost of one thousand five hundred dollars : Rev. George Irving, minister. The Methodists are now erecting a frame church edifice, which will cost when completed about one thousand two hundred dollars. The Evangelical Union congregation meets in the town-hall every alternate Sabbath : Rev. John Gray officiating. The Roman Catholic church was built in 1846, of frame, but there are no services held in it at present. The common school building was erected in 1854, at a cost of three thousand dollars. It contains primary, junior, and senior. Average attendance in senior department, fifty-five : Donald McLean, head teacher. Junior department, average attendance seventy : Miss M. E. McLean, teacher ; and primary department, with an average attendance of sixty-five, under the charge of Mrs. McLean. There is a private school conducted by Miss Morrison. An excellent library in connection with the Farmers and Mechanics' Institute, numbering nine hundred volumes; several insurance agencies; a wellconducted weekly newspaper, having a good circulation ; a lodge of Good Templars; and a fire-engine company numbering thirty-eight members, all show well for the growth and enterprise of the place.

### AYR FARMERS AND MECHANICS' INSTITUTE,

Organized in February, 1856. Meetings are held annually in the townhall, on the last Friday of January. Committee meetings are held quarterly, at the library rooms in Mr. Souter's residence. The library comprises over nine hundred volumes of well-selected works.



# BADEN.

A Post Village in the township of Wilmot, and a station on the Grand Trunk Railway, nine miles from Berlin, the county seat, sixteen miles from Stratford, and seventy-two from Toronto. Mr. Jacob Beck was the first settler, and had the village plat laid out for him by M. C Schofield, Esq., P.L.S., in 1855. The village is situated on Spring Creek, a tributary of the river Nith, which stream furnishes ample power for an excellent flouring mill, owned by Mr. Beck, and having three run of stone, with a capacity of grinding two hundred bushels of wheat per diem. This. mill manufactures about \$20,000 worth of flour per annum. On the same stream about half a mile from the village is a flax mill, owned by Perine Brothers, the same enterprising firm having three others distributed throughout the County ; this mill turns out about 25 tons of flax per annum. There is an iron foundry carried on by Mr. Jacob Beck, erected at a cost of about \$10,000 (buildings and machinery included) and employing about 12 hands, having a steam engine of eight horse power, in constant operation. This establishment turns out agricultural implements, stoves, and other castings to the annual value of about \$10,000. There is one steam flouring mill owned by Mr. Crombie, having three run of stones, with a capacity of grinding 400 bushels of wheat a day, and turning out flour to the annual value of about \$40,000. There are also two saw mills, one propelled by water, and the other by steam, the latter owned by Mr. M. Morley, who, in connection with the saw mills, has a pail, tub, stave, and heading factory employing about six hands and turning out a large amount of work annually.

Together with its extensive manufacturing establishments, the village contains four general stores, the usual number of mechanics, and one brewery. It contains one church, that of the Lutherans, erected at a cost of about \$1,000, of frame,  $30 \times 50$ , and capable of seating 300 persons, Rev. Fred. Ehgner, minister. The school is attended by an average of 60 pupils, and is under the charge of Mr. Thompson. The 5th Division Court is held here. Mails daily—Jacob Beck, Postmaster. Population—400.

# BERLIN.

The County Town of the County of Waterloo, situated on the line of the Grand Trunk Railway, at the terminus of the Preston and Berlin Railway, 62 miles from Toronto, and 8 miles from Preston on the Guelph and Galt branch of the Great Western Railway. The Preston and Berlin railway is not in operation at present, but it is in contemplation to have the roadway put in repair at an early day and resume the running of passenger and freight trains. The town is located in a very healthy and well settled portion of the county, on an eminence gradually sloping to the westward. It has no water power to assist it, but is entirely dependent upon the trade of the surrounding country of which it attracts a large and important share. There were many settlements in the vicinity of Berlin as early as 1816. The village site was not settled until about 1830, by Phineas Varnum, who started a blacksmith shop and hotel on the corner of King and Queen Streets, where Roat's Commercial hotel now stands. The first store was opened in the same year by William, David, and Frederick Millar, the old store room is now occupied as a tailor shop. Berlin was made the county town in 1852; the county buildings were erected in 1853, and the town incorporated in 1854.

In manufactures, there are two cabinet and chair factories, William Simpson in his factory employs about 12 or 15 hands, and turns out manufactured ware to the value of about fifteen thousand dollars perannum, the machinery using steam to the extent of ten horse power. Jacob Hoffman in the same line of business employs about 25 hands, and an engine of 15 horse power to propel the machinery. In addition to the chair and furniture factory, he has two planing machines, one flooring machine, sash, blind and door factory, and turns out about \$20,000 worth of manufactured articles during the year. In the manufacture of flour, Berlin has not much to boast of, the only establishment of the kind being the old wind mill with three run of stone, and built on the highest point in the town. Berlin is doing a very extensive business in the manufacturing of leather, the tannery owned by L. Breithaupt was established in 1858, contains 114 vats, employs a steam engine of eighteen horse power, 30 hands, and turns out leather to the value of one hundred thousand dollars per annum. That of B. Lang turns out about \$25,000 to \$30,000 worth of leather per annum.

In the building of carriages and wagons the establishment of Emilian Ziegler is the most extensive, employing 6 or 8 hands, and turning out work to the value of about 8 or 10 thousand dollars per annum; there are two or three other small shops employing from one to two hands Jacob J. Woefle is exclusively engaged in the manufacture of each. plows, and turns out about three thousand dollars worth per annum. There are two saw mills, one propelled by steam, in connection with Winger's steam pump factory, the largest pump factory in this section of the country; he employs a number of hands in the manufacture of lumber, planing, pump 'making and turning broom handles, having machinery capable of turning out many thousands per day of the latter article; in the same building Mr. Wegenast carries on a sash, blind and door factory, using steam power from Wingers steam pump factory; in the rear of these premises are the fine cut tobacco works owned by Geo. Randall, Esq., under the superintendence of J. Chamberlain. Considerable business is done in the manufacture of boots and shoes by several. firms, also in tinware, agricultural implements and other branches of industry.

In public buildings and hotels, Berlin can make some pretensions. The court house and jail were erected at a cost of twenty thousand dollars, and make an imposing appearance; and as soon as the court house square is fenced and the grounds ornamented with shade trees. it will be one of the finest situations for buildings of that description anywhere to be found. The other buildings most prominent in their appearance, are the Grammar and Central School buildings, erected at a cost of ten thousand dollars, the various churches, the Canadian Block, Victoria Block, American Block, Bowman's Block, and the private residence of W. H. Bowlby and H. F. J. Jackson, Esq. A great many of the other private residences have neat and ornamental grounds attached. Among the hotels may be mentioned the Commercial, American, St. Nicholas, Royal Exchange, and Franklin House. In connection with the St. Nicholas, there is an excellent, commodious and neatly fitted up public hall suitable for concerts, theatrical performances, &c. The town hall is a small frame building.

There are three newspapers published in Berlin, viz., one English, the "Berlin Telegraph;" and two German, the "German Canadian," and "Berliner Journal," all of which are well supported, and conducted with more than average ability.

In the mercantile line Berlin can with justice boast of as fine shops as any town of its size in Canada; there are large exclusive dry-goods establishments doing a fine business; grocery stores, and a large wholesale and retail hardware store owned by J. Fennell, doing an extensive business in Waterloo and adjoining counties. The Book-store of Boedecker Steubing is extensive, and they do a large jobbing as well as retail business.

It has one store, a daily mail, an excellent school with an average attendance of seventy-five pupils, one Menonite congregation meeting every alternate Sabbath, in the school house, one church, "Bible Believers." The church was erected in 1854, of brick, size  $30 \times 40$ , at a cost of \$1,200; it will accommodate 300 persons: Rev. James Sim pastor. Population 200.

## BRIDGEPORT.


A post village in the township of Waterloo, situated at the confluence of Laurel Creek with the Grand River, one mile and a half from the Grand Trunk Railway track, and half a mile from the northern limits of the town of Berlin. The place was first settled by John Brimgeman and Jacob S. Shoemaker, and was laid out as a village for Messrs. Peter N. Tagge. Elias Eby, Barnabas Devitt, and Thomas L. Ferrier, the proprietors.

It contains one church, edifice of brick, common to all denominations erected in 1847, at a cost of \$900—size  $27 \times 45$ —and will accommodate 300 persons. It has an excellent school, with an average attendance of 60 pupils, under the charge of Mr. Robert F. Cowan. The post office was first established in 1847, Mr. John A. Mackie, now a merchant of Berlin, being the first postmaster. Mr. Elias Eby is the present postmaster. The village was formerly called "Shoemaker's Mills," "Glasgow," and "Lancaster." The Grand River at this point has a gravelly bottom, and a fall of 9 feet, which power has not yet been made available, Laurel Creek furnishing ample power for its present manufacturing establishments, which consists of one fine flouring mill, owned by Messrs. Eby, containing five run of stone, and capable of grinding 400 bushels of wheat or eighty barrels of flour, per day. The mill was established in 1832, and cost, with its machinery, \$15,000. The same parties have a saw-mill, sawing half a million feet of lumber per annum; a stave factory, manufacturing 300,000 staves and 200,000 headings per annum; and an oil mill turning out 6,000 gallons of linseed oil per annum. The woollen factory, owned by Jacob Wendling, turns out about \$2,500 worth of woollen goods during the year, besides enjoying a large custom trade. The hydraulic power for all of these is furnished by Laurel Creek. There are several other factories, such as wagon, boot and shoe, furniture, &c. The village contains three stores —and has a daily mail via Berlin. The inhabitants are chiefly German. Population 400.

A post village in the township of Woolwich, situated at the confluence of the Conestogo with Grand river, seven miles from Berlin, and sixty-nine miles from Toronto. The village has excellent facilities for manufacturing purposes. The Conestogo river and a small tributary of the Grand river are now supplying constant power for a large flouring mill, established in 1846, and capable of manufacturing sixty barrels of flour per diem; two extensive flax mills, owned by Perine Brothers, and two saw mills. The postoffice was first established in 1849-Charles Hendry was the first postmaster. The village was laid out in 1846 by David Musselman and Charles Hendry; the latter gentleman, an extensive merchant, is still a resident There is a good common school, with an average of the village. attendance of about seventy pupils, under the charge of Gabriel B. Two churches, viz.: German Lutheran and Weslevan Bowman. Methodist, the former church edifice is of brick, erected in 1854, at a cost of \$500, and will accommodate about 150 persons; the Wesleyan Methodist church cost \$200, and was erected of frame in 1863. The Seventh Division Court is held here. Mails daily.

The village contains one store, one nursery of fruit and ornamental trees, two hotels, two wagon shops, three blacksmith shops, two shoe shops, two tailors. &c. The religious denominations of which there are four, viz., Church of England, Presbyterian, Primitive, and Wesleyan Methodists meet in the public hall. The Church of England and Wesleyan Methodists however, are now erecting substantial stone churches. There is also one public school numbering about 80 scholars, of whom Leonard A. Rose is teacher. Among the benevolent institutions supported in the village are the Loyal Orange Lodge No. 363, which was organized in 1857, the meetings being held in Oakley's Hall, on the first Wednesday of every month, and numbers 22 members. The officers are as follows : James McCutcheon, W. M.; James Manser, D'v. M.; Robert Hyndman, Treasurer, and Edward Sutcliffe, Secretary. The Sons of Temperance also have a lodge No. 113, organized in 1857, which meets in the public hall every Friday evening; number of members 40. Wm. Barbour Dep. Grand W. P.; Thomas Campbell, W. P.; Alford Manser, R. S. The population of the village is about 150. Mails daily.



A short distance from the village the extensive linen works and flax mills of PerineBrothers is located—the machinery is propelled by both steam and water, and they employ nearly 100 hands. There is one church, Canada Presbyterian, erected in 1856, at a cost of \$5,000. Rev. Malcolm McKenzie, pastor. There are the usual representatives of the professions and trades. Population about 200.

Nore.—The following interesting sketch of the town of Galt has been kindly furnished us by James Young, Esq., of Galt.

'The town of Galt is beautifully situated on the banks of the Grand River, in the midst of a rich agricultural district. It is the largest town in the County of Waterloo, and contains about four thousand inhabitants. It possesses a large and comfortable town hall and market, (erected at a cost of twenty thousand dollars), one of the finest public schools in the Province, and its appearance generally is handsome and picturesque.

#### MANUFACTURES OF GALT.

Galt has been called the "Manchester of Canada," on account of the extent and excellence of its manufactures, and its unequalled water power. There is probably not another town in the province of similar size, which has entered more extensively into manufacturing industry. Beneath is given a brief notice of some of the principal establishments.


#### THE DICKSON MILLS.

These excellent mills were built in 1843, and are now carried on by Mr. Richard Blain. The main building is stone  $75 \times 45$  feet, and four stories high. The machinery has recently been re-newed and put in first class order. The reputation of the Dickson mills stands high in the eastern markets, and its flour commands the highest price.

#### THE AXE FACTORY.

This establishment consists of a forge, grinding shop, finishing shop, and carpenter shop. It is now carried on by W. L. Distin, Esq. A large number of men are employed, and the axes and edge tools turned TOWN OF GALT.



out have a provincial reputation. At several of the provincial fairs, prizes have been taken for the best case of edge tools, and at the great exhibition held in Paris, France, its edge tools carried off the first premium! The European manufacturers are said to have expressed no little surprise that such superior articles could have been made amidst Canada's wild woods,

## CABINET WARE.

We have two steam cabinet factories in Galt—that of Mr. John Barbour, on North Water street, and that of Mr. Andrew Malcolm, on West Main street. Both shops turn out a large quantity of furniture annually, from the most substantial patterns to those of a more light and elegant form.

### DUMFRIES FOUNDRY.

The Dumfries iron and brass foundry, so long and successfully carried on by James Crombie, Esq., is well-known throughout Western Canada. Messrs. Goldie, McCulloch & Co., are now the proprietors. The buildings are of stone, and very extensive, and although a large number of workmen are employed, the foundry is taxed to its uttermost to supply its patrons. Its business consists principally in making steam engines, fitting up flour and saw mills, making French burr millstones, &c. The enterprising proprietors are just completing the machinery for the new Great Western Railway rolling mills at Hamilton—which was a very large contract. The machinery of the Dumfries Foundry has found its way to Cuba, California and other distant parts of the world.

#### WOOLEN FACTORIES.

Galt can boast of three large woolen factories. The largest is owned by Mr. Wm. Robinson, and is driven partly by steam and partly by water power. The buildings are commodious, and the machinery good. About twenty operatives are constantly employed. Thompson & Co., carry on the factory at the head of North Water street. Tweeds are the principal production, but occasionally doeskins, blankets and stocking yarn are made. R. Patrick & Co., on North Water street, have also done a large woollen business. These factories are a credit to the locality.

#### MALT FACTORY.

The manufacture of malt is carried on to a large extent by Mr.

Thomas Peck. Orders are filled for Sarnia, Windsor, Hamilton, Toronto, Suspension Bridge, and other places. The malt house is one of the largest stone buildings in the town.

#### CARRIAGES AND WAGONS.

J. m. hulla

The Victoria Steam Carriage Works, have been leased by Mr. Wm. Robinson, Mr. Thomas Todd acting as manager. Besides carriages, wagons, and buggies, etc., they make spokes, hubs, felloes, &c., by machinery. The manager informs us that they turn out about \$30,000 worth of work per annum. They recently made two splendid carriages for a gentleman in the West Indies. Mr. James Kay, North Water street, makes excellent work, and does a large business in this line.

#### DUMFRIES MILLS.

These old and well-known Flouring Mills are now owned by Mr. Thomas Stuart. There are seven run of stones in all, and when in complete running order the mills turn out nearly 200 barrels of flour daily. During a single year they have made 30,000 barrels, a number which speaks flatteringly of the capabilities of the establishment. These mills have rendered Dumfries wheat and flour celebrated in all the principal marts along the Atlantic seaboard.

## VICTORIA FOUNDRY.

This Foundry is carried on by Lutz & Co., and has been in operation over twenty years. The firm principally direct their attention to horsepowers and separators, reapers and mowers, ploughs and stoves. They employ about thirty men, and their business extends over a large extent of country.

#### SOAP AND CANDLES.

SIANDER

Mr. Adam S. Oliver carries on the manufacture of soap and candles, on West Main street. About 80,000 lbs. of common soap, as well as a large quantity of candles, are made each year. Fancy soaps are made to a small extent.

#### TANNERIES.

There are two tanneries, both steam-power, recently started. That carried on by O. Billings & Co. is one of the largest and most complete tanneries in Canada. The buildings are very large. About twenty workmen are employed, and the leather manufactured, first-class. No money was spared by its proprietor, John Davidson, Esq., in fitting it TOWN OF GALT.

Brodie, teacher; one lodge of Sons of Temperance. The churches are as follows, viz. : Primitive Methodists are about erecting a handsome brick church edifice on the site of the old church; the United Brethren are also about erecting a. brick church; the Wesleyan Methodists and Presbyterians are worshiping at present in the old church belonging to the Primitive Methodists. Mails daily. The 6th Division Court is held here, M. P. Empy, clerk. population about 400.

## HAYSVILLE.

A post village of the township of Wilmot, situated on the River Nith, three miles from the Hamburg Station of the Grand Trunk Railway; eight miles from Plattsville station of the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway; sixteen miles from Berlin, the county town, and seventy-eight from Toronto, The village was first settled in 1835, by Robert Hays, and the post office established in the following year, the same party being appointed postmaster. The present official is Miss Margaret Somerville. The village contains one Church, that of the Church of England, erected in 1862 of frame, at a cost of \$600; it will accommodate about two hundred persons. The Wesleyan Methodists meet in the school house, and have service every Sabbath, There is one school, with an average attendance of 40 pupils, under the charge of Timothy Newman.

The river Nith furnishes good water power, which is here used to propel the machinery of one flouring mill with two run of stone, established in 1835, owned by Andrew W. Cleland, and capable of manufacturing 50 bbls. of flour per day; the same party owns a woollen factory with one set of machines, established in 1855. Population, 250. Mails daily.

## HESPELER.

An incorporated village, beautifully situated on the Speed, and on the line of the Guelph and Galt branch of the Great Western Railway, in the southeast of the Township of Waterloo, ten miles from Berlin, the County town. The place was first settled in 1824, and laid out by Michael Bergey, under the name of New Hope, which name it retained until it was incorporated, about the year 1858, as the village of Hespeler. The post office was established in 1848, and Jacob Hespeler appointed postmaster. The village contains seven stores, all doing a thriving business. The river Speed supplies an abundance of good hydraulic power, which has been largely taken advantage of through the enterprise of Jacob Hespeler in erecting magnificent stone flouring mills, cloth and woollen manufactory, saw mill and distillery, all built of the same material, and in the most substantial manner. In the various establishments the proprietor employs about 150 hands. The flouring mill contains six run of stones, the woollen works three sets of machinery complete. Another extensive woollen factory and knitting works is in course of erection, the power to be furnished by the river Speed; the establishment will contain five sets of machinery, the whole costing about \$40,000, and have the capacity for turning out about 1,000 yards of cloth per week; and will manufacture goods to the amount of about \$125,000 per year.

F. Guggisberg, of Preston, is about establishing a furniture and chair factory, having lately purchased an eligible site for such an establishment. There are several other branches of trade carried on successfully.

There are four churches, viz.: the Canada Presbyterian, built of stone, erected in 1862, at a cost of \$2,200; Rev. M. McKenzie, pastor. The New Connection Methodist Church was erected in 1851, of stone, at a cost of \$1,000; Rev. Mr. White, pastor. The Evangelical Association, built of stone in 1863, cost \$1,200; no regular pastor. The Lutheran Church was erected in 1855, of frame, and cost \$300; no regular pastor. The Roman Catholic Church is built of stone, and was erected in 1858, at a cost of \$1,200; no regular priest.

## LINWOOD.

A post village of the Township of Wellesley, western section, 18 miles from Berlin. The village was first settled in the year 1849, and was laid out in 1857, by Moses McFadden, for F, & J. Wright, D. Walker, J. Scott, and J. Brown. The post office was first established on the 1st January, 1857, Joseph Winn Fish acting as postmaster; its present official is Robert C. Coote. The village contains one church of the Wesleyan Methodist denomination, under the pastoral care of the Rev. Isaac Crane; the church, which is frame, was erected in 1862, at a cost of \$800, its size  $34 \times 40$ , and capable of seating 200 persons.

The village also contains two general stores, one woollen and flouring mill, one steam saw mill, one hoop factory, two carriage and wagon factories, one fanning mill factory, and one good school, numbering about 35 scholars, and under the superintendence of Robert A. Graham.


The Linwood woollen mill above mentioned, Messrs. Wright & Wright proprietors, was established in 1863, at a cost of about \$7,000; it contains one set of manufacturing machinery complete, and a full set of custom machinery. The factory has the capacity of turning out about \$30,000 worth per annum, employing 13 hands and an engine of twelve horse power. The Linwood grist and flouring mills, F. Wright & Co., proprietors, was established in 1863, contains two run of stone, employs a 24 horse steam power engine, and has the capacity of grinding 50 barrels per day.

The steam coiled hoop factory, also under the proprietorship of F. Wright & Co., turns out about 4000 per day, and employs three hands.

Boomer's steam saw mill was built in 1855 by A. & J. E. Boomer. This mill employs an engine of 16 horse power, one circular saw, and is capable of turning out one million feet of sawn lumber per annum, the lumber averging in price here about \$7 per M.

The village has one daily mail; population 150.

## NEW HAMBURG.

An incorporated village in the township of Wilmot, situated on the river Nith, and on the line of the Grand Trunk Railway : fourteen miles from Berlin, the County Town. The village is located in a very rich and well cultivated section of the country, settled chiefly by Ger-It was laid out in 1832, and the post office established in 1840. mans. Mr. William Scott being the first postmaster. The river furnishes an abundant hydraulic power, and supplies the power for two woollen factories, and two flouring mills. One of the woollen factories is immediately in the village, having been established about twenty years, and contains a complete set of machinery for manufacturing cloth of the best description, together with machinery for doing custom work. Mr. Duncan Fisher, the proprietor, employs twelve hands, and turns out manufactured goods to the amount of ten thousand dollars. The other woollen factory is about one mile and a half from the village on the same river, the machinery propelled by water and steam. It contains a full set of machinery, employing twenty hands, and turning out finished goods to the value of \$25,000; the factory is owned by Messrs. T. H. McKenzie & Co. There is a flouring mill adjoining the woollen factory, owned by the same parties, containing two run of stone. The flouring mills in the village are owned by Messrs. Parker & Wilson, it contains three run of stone, and will manufacture about one hundred barrels of flour per day. The foundry of Samuel Merner, Esq., is one of the most extensive in the country, eighteen hands are employed at this establishment, in the manufacture of reapers, mowers, thrashing machines, separators, plows and all kinds of agricultural implements, woodsawing machines, &c.; the foundry was established in 1848, and the machinery is propelled by an eight horse power engine. In connection with the works there is a large tin and sheet iron factory. In the manufacture of carriages, buggies, wagons, &c., New Hamburg can boast of perhaps the largest shops in the country. Mr. Fred. Merner employs about eleven hands, and turns out carriages, &c., to the value of ten thousand dollars per annum; there are also several smaller wagon shops, two potteries, a brewery and tannery, eight stores, good hotels, viz., Wagner's Commercial Hotel, Seyler's Hotel, and two or three others.

It contains three churches, viz., Evangelical Association, Lutheran and Roman Catholic.

The Evangelical association church was erected in 1844, of brick, at a cost of \$1,200; size  $40 \times 60$ , and will accommodate eight hundred persons. Rev. Mr. Buesch, minister.

The Lutheran church, (German), was built in 1851, of frame, size  $50 \times 36$ , cost \$1,400, and will accommodate 350 persons. Rev. George. Schmidt, minister.

The Roman Catholic Church was erected in 1856, of frame, at a cost of \$300. Rev. Mr. Funkan, priest.

There is a fine school building, of brick, having an average attendance of about one hundred pupils. Messrs. Henry Smith and Ferdinand Newmann are the teachers.

New Hamburg has a volunteer infantry company, which is in a flourishing condition. The citizens have contributed liberally towards the erection of a drill shed now nearly completed, and no doubt the interest shown in the matter both by the citizens and members of the company, are due to the efforts of the commanding officer of the company, Capt. Goodman, who is a resident lawyer of the place.





There is also a woollen factory with a complete set of machinery carried on by Graham Watson, who turns out about four thousand dollars worth of cloth per annum. No post office.




### PETERSBURG.

A post village of the Township of Wilmot, on the line of the Grand Trunk Railway, six miles from Berlin, the County Town, and sixty-eight miles from Toronto. It was first settled, in 1838, by John Meyer, Peter Wilker, Jacob Stoebler, Deobold Segler, and John Marteyne. The post office was established in 1844, and John Ernst, sen., appointed postmaster. It contains one Lutheran Church, erected of frame, in 1851, at a cost of \$1,800, which will accommodate six hundred persons. The village contains a tannery, established in 1844, with thirty vats, owned by John Ernst, junior, who employs six hands, and turns out about twelve thousand dollars worth of leather per annum. Besides, it contains one store, two hotels, two wagon shops, two boot and shoe shops, tailor, and the usual number of carpenters and other mechanics. In the school there is an average attendance of about sixty pupils, under the charge of Ottimer Ehling. Mails daily.

### PHILIPSBURG.

A post village in the Township of Wilmot, three miles from Baden, a station of the Grand Trunk Railway, twelve miles from Berlin, the County Town, and seventy-four miles from Toronto. It was settled about 1843, and the village laid out by Christopher Doering. It has one Church (Lutheran) erected in 1851 at a cost of twelve hundred dollars; the building is frame, and will accomodate five hundred persons-Rev. F. Eighinger, minister. The school is under the charge of Deuchimai, and numbers eighty pupils as an average attendance. There is a large tannery in this village, established in 1843, by Christopher Doering. The business is now conducted by C. Doering & Son; they employ eight hands, and six horse-power engine, and turn out about twenty thousand dollars worth of manufactured goods per annum; the tannery contains forty-three vats. In connection with the above the proprietors are heavily engaged in the mercantile line. Mails triweekly. Population about 250.

### PRESTON.

An incorporated village in the township of Waterloo, on the line of the Guelph and Galt branch of the Great Western Railway, and the Preston and Berlin Railway It is also situated on the river Speed which supplies ample hydraulic power for all manufacturing purposes. The east end of the village was laid out as early as 1834 by John Erb, and the west end by Joseph Erb in 1852. It is distant 8 miles from Berlin, 3 from Galt, and about 60 miles from Toronto. The first postmaster appointed was the late Adam Ferrie, jun. The first store was opened in 1832 by Samuel Liebshitz, first iron foundry by Jacob Beck (now of Baden) in 1838; first mill in 1814 by John Erb, sen. The first hotel opened was in 1830, by Jacob Thoman. There is a newspaper published at this place, started, in 1845, called the "Observer," (German). The village contains several manufacturing establishments doing a safe and Among these may be noticed the following, viz:excellent business.

Clare & Beck, iron founders, who manufacture stoves, agricultural implements, and tinware. They employ about ten hands, and do a business of about twenty thousand dollars per annum. The establishment owned and carried on by Valentine Wahn was established in 1838 by Jacob Beck. Eight hands are kept employed, and about fifteen thousand dollars worth of manufactured articles turned out per annum. The 'Cambridge' flouring mills, owned by A. A. Erb & Brothers, was established in 1814 ; it now contains five run of stone, is four stories in height, and has the capacity of turning out 160 bbls. of flour per day. The same firm have in operation a saw mill sawing about half a million feet of lumber per annum, a stave factory making six million staves and heads, and a shingle factory turning out one million five hundred thousand shingles per annum. The Preston chair and cabinet factory owned by Fred. Guggisberg, was established in 1841, and employs ten hands and an engine of ten horse power, besides power from the Speed to the extent of eight horse. A large amount of work is turned out at this establishment from the plainest to the most elegantly upholstered and beautifully carved furniture. The village contains at present only one woollen factory, that of Hunt, Elliott & Co's, having been destroyed by fire a few month's since; their establishment was perhaps the most extensive in this section of Western Ca-Although the loss was very heavy still the enterprise of the firm nada. is shown in their again re-building their establishment as a flax mill and fitting it up with full machinery for dressing flax, and linen weaving. The woollen works at present carried on are owned by Wahn & Erb and were established in 1862; the mill contains a full set of machinery, employs thirteen hands and ten horse power engine, and turns out about six hundred yards per week.

There are two tanneries doing a good business, each employing from three to five hands.

The first brewery was established in 1844 by George Roos, the second in 1856 by Jacob Roos & Co., and the third in 1858 by Henry Bernhardt.

There are many other branches of trade carried on in this village with a fair share of success, and several stores all doing a good and safe business. The general appearance of the place is neat and clean. One feature of importance to the village is the artesian well on the premises of Dr. Cornell, proprietor of the North American Hotel. The well was bored in 1838 to a depth of three hundred and sixty feet, and forces the water twenty four feet above the surface; the water is considered excellent, and many former invalids can testify to its efficiency as a remedial agent. There are six bath rooms well fitted, furnished with heating apparatus. The North American Hotel is large and comfortable. There are three or four other hotels in the village, all well kept and comfortable houses.



A post village in the Township of Woolwich, on the Conestogo river. eight miles from Berlin, the county town, and seventy miles from To-It was first settled in 1850. During the following year, the ronto. excellent flouring mills owned by Benjamin D. Snyder, Joseph Eby's hotel, Jacob C. Snyder's blacksmith shop, Yost, Winkler & Wideman's general store, and a brick cooper shop carried on by Gregory Hortenberger, were the first buildings and business places of the village. The old cooper shop has been transformed into an hotel building, and is now occupied by John Becker. The post office was established in 1852. and Joseph Eby appointed postmaster. The village is beautifully situated on both banks of the Conestogo river. The river furnishes an abundance of excellent hydraulic power, which is made available for the propelling of three run of stones in the flouring mill, one saw mill, and, until recently, an extensive woollen factory,-the proprietor, Jacob E. Eby, having lost, through fire, on the 24th of March last, his woollen factory, machinery, stock (finished and unfinished), as well as his books and accounts. The loss is not only felt by the owner, but as well by the village and this section of the country. Besides these, there is the tannery of Bowman & Zinkann, established in 1855, employing five hands, an engine of six-horse power, and manufacturing leather to the value of fifteen thousand dollars per annum. There is an excellent school, with an average attendance of sixty-six pupils, under the charge of Joseph B. Weber. There is one church (Evangelical Association) built in 1850. the congregation of which are now erecting a brick edifice, which will cost when completed, \$1,200. Rev. Mr. Peter Alles, minister. ### WATERLOO VILLAGE.

An incorporated village in the township of Waterloo, the corporate limits of the village and the town of Berlin adjoining on the north. It is distant about half a mile from the Grand Trunk Railway station at Berlin. There are few villages in Western Canada that have improved so rapidly as Waterloo. In manufactures there are two large flouring mills, viz :- The "Union Mills," established in 1816. The mills since their first starting, however, have undergone many changes and now contain seven run of stone, the machinery is propelled by a steam engine of forty-five horse power, and by the power furnished by Snyder's or Laurel creek, the whole has already cost over forty-five thousand dollars; the celebrated Haxall flour and farina is manufactured at this mill. The Granite Mills were established in 1858 by Hespeler & Randall, the mill contains four run of stone, and cost with machinery six thousand dollars; in connection with the mill is a distillery which has cost ten thousand dollars, and has a capacity of distilling fifty thousand gallons of proof spirit per annum. The proprietor's use steam power and give constant employment to about fifteen men.

IRON FOUNDRIES.— The Waterloo foundry was established in 1852 by Jacob Bricker & Co., they employ sixteen hands and an eight horse power engine; at this foundry steam engines, boilers, separators, agricultural implements, stoves, wood-sawing machines are turned out to the value of twenty thousand dollars per annum. The Union foundry is carried on by Fischer & Buehler who employ eight hands and a six horse power steam engine, manufacturing thrashing machines, separators, and all kinds of agricultural implements.

Waterloo Woollen Works were established in 1863 by Paton & Brieker, the factory has complete sets of machinery driven by an engine of sixteen horse power, and keeping thirteen hands in constant employment. The establishment turns out about six hundred vards per week.

In the manufacture of carriages and buggies Weber & Wells employ ten hands and manufacture six thousands dollars worth per annum.

CHAIR MAKING.—This branch of industry is carried on largely, one establishment employing ten hands and turning out sixteen thousand dollars in value per annum.

The manufacture of pumps, harness, leather, surgical instruments, staves and boots and shoes is carried on largely. Waterloo can look for-

ward to a bright future. Its manufacturing establishments are conducted by men of capital and enterprise, and combined with these a careful and prudent system of doing business that will ensure success to themselves, and prove of the utmost benefit to all classes and to the general prosperity of the village.

In the mercantile business there are many as well filled and fine looking stores as can be found among the best in any of the Canadian cities.

There are two churches, the German Lutheran, Rev. J. Hoelsche minister, and the United Brethren, the Rev. S. L. Downey officiating.

Waterloo may be justly proud of its School there being a very large average attendance; the school is under the charge of John L. Bowman as principal.



### WELLESLEY.

### (Formerly Smithville.)

A post village in the township of Wellesley and on the River Nith-17 miles from Berlin and 79 miles from Toronto. The village was first settled in 1847, by John Smith after whom the village was called until 1852. The facilities for manufacturing purposes are the river Nith, and two streams, tributaries of the same river. The post office was established in 1851 and William Brown appointed postmaster, the present postmaster is John Zoeger; the village contains two stores, one flouring mill carried on by Lawrence Doering, having three run of stone and will manufacture about 60 bbls. of flour per day; one saw mill sawing about a quarter of a million feet per annum; three waggon shops ; two boot and shoe shops ; a fine hotel, and new hall in connection, called the Wellesley Hotel, and two others ; two churches, German Lutheran, erected in 1854 at a cost of twelve hundred dollars, of frame, and the New Jerusalem church, erected in 1858, of frame, at a cost of four hundred dollars. There is a good school with an average attendance of 78 pupils under the charge of John Klein. Mails daily.

### ELMIRA.

(West Woolwich, P. O.

A post village in the township of Woolwich, on the Kannakajaique Creek; twelve miles from Berlin the county town; and seventy-four miles from Toronto. The village was first settled in 1832 by Henry Christman and Edward Bristow. The village plat was laid out by Winger and Good. The post office was established in 1850. It contains three stores, one woollen factory, containing a complete set of machinery, propelled by a twenty horse power engine, giving constant employment to eight hands, and turning out manufactured goods to the value of fifteen thousand dollars per annum. Adjoining the factory there is a steam saw mill employing a fifteen horse power engine, and sawing about half a million feet per annum. The factory and saw mill are owned by Winger & Weaver. There are three churches, two German Lutheran and one Wesleyan Methodist The Lutheran church under the pastoral care of Rev. Mr. Koessman is built of log; the other was erected in 1862, of brick, Rev. Mr. Ernst. minister. The Wesleyan Methodist have a brick church erected in 1855, but no settled pastor. There is a superior common school with a large attendance; Geo. W. Woodward, principal; Miss Elizabeth Jamieson, assistant teacher. Mails daily. Population, 400.

### WINTERBOURNE.

A post village of the township of Woolwich, situated on Cox's Creek. eight miles from Berlin, the county seat, and seventy miles from Toronto. It was first settled in 1854, and laid out by Charles Allen. Cox's Creek furnishes a good water power here, with fourteen feet fall. The vil age contains one store, two hotels, one flouring mill, one saw mill, two schools, one common school under the charge of John Scollon, and a private school kept by Miss Brittan. There are three churches, viz. :-Established Church of Scotland, Free Church, and Wesleyan Metholist. The Established Church was erected in 1838, of frame, at a cost of \$2,000. The Free Church is a frame building, built Rev. James Thom minister. at a cost of \$800; no settled pastor. The Wesleyan Methodist Church was built in 1856, of stone, and cost \$1,500. Population 200-Mails daily.
