## INTRODUCTION.

---

The following plates require some explanation. They are copies of the shields represented in the Dining Hall of Powderham Castle, and are intended to serve both as a key to their arrangement, and also as a brief record of the family.

In this, we were continually and most ably assisted by the late Sir Henry Ponsonby, and the late Mr. Edmund Boyle, one of the best amateur heralds of the present generation; indeed, it is entirely owing to them that we have been able to represent the French line as accurately and completely as the English branch of the family. The plan adopted has been to start from the north-west corner of the room, from which the English and French lines diverge in opposite directions.

The first few shields of each line are therefore necessarily the same, beginning with Athon, the founder of the family in the year 1000.

The separation of the two branches took place in the time of Henry II. of England, when Reginald de Courtenai accompanied Queen Eleanor to England about 1135, and his daughter Isabella married Pierre de France, surnamed Florus, the son of Louis le Gros, who took the name of Courtenai, and whose son and grandson were Emperors of Constantinople until 1261. The upper line of the French side represents the elder branch of that family, while the second and third represent the successive Seigneurs de Champignolles and Seigneurs d'Arrablay and Tanlay, and de la Ferté Loupière, who carried on the honours of the family until this branch of it in 1740 ended in Hélène de Courtenay, who married the Prince de Bauffremont. In the English branch a different plan has been pursued. The elder line is indeed represented throughout in the upper row, but at the beginning the Brionis, Barons of Okehampton, occupy the second line until that Barony was brought into the Courtenay family by the marriage of



Hawisa, "Lady of Okehampton," with the afore-named Sir Reginald, *temp.* Henry II.; and the third line is occupied by the Redvers, Earls of Devon, as long as the Brionis shields last; and then by the marriage with the daughter and heiress of William de Redvers, in the very next generation, the Redvers family was, in its turn, merged in that of the Courtenays. After this, the plan has been to represent, in the two lower lines, the ancestry on the mother's side for two or three generations in the same way wherever it has been possible.

Several shields represent the many sons of the second Earl, who, by his marriage with the heiress of the Bohuns, brought Powderham to the Courtenays, and left it to his fifth son Philip, the direct ancestor of the present representatives of the family, and whose shield therefore has had to be repeated more than once. The Courtenays of Powderham, however, as will be seen, do not rise to the upper line as heads of the family until after the death, at Padua, of the ill-fated son of the only Courtenay Marquis of Exeter—Edward Courtenay, Earl of Devon, who spent more than half his life in the Tower, and died an exile. After this the Earldom remained long in abeyance, the head of the family being content to be called Sir William Courtenay of Powderham for nearly 300 years, though each of these Sir Williams were *de jure* successive Earls of Devon.

It was not, however, until 1835 that the Earldom was revived, and it is a curious fact that the success of the attempt was mainly owing to the skill and patient research of my father, then Mr. Pepys—afterwards Lord Chancellor Cottenham.

It is much hoped that the following pages may be studied with interest by many who have a taste for heraldry and genealogy, giving as they do a very correct outline of the history of the Courtenays, and some account of the families allied with them by marriage.

In conclusion, I have the pleasure of dedicating my work, such as it is, to the present Earl of Devon.

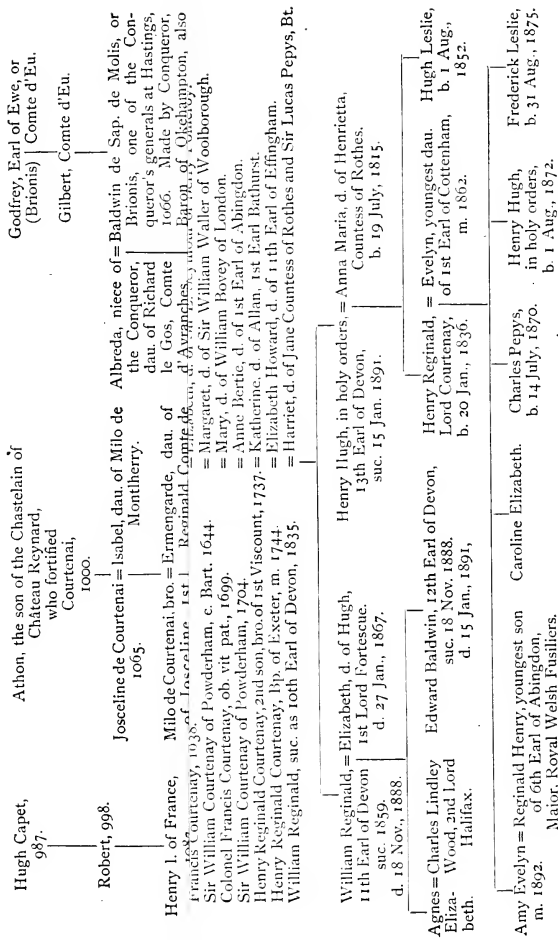






# TABLE OF DESCENT OF PRESENT EARL OF DEVON
