Covington Facts in Tabloid 🗫 🗫

Population 55,000, mostly Americans, Germans and Irish.

Territorial area 4.81 miles.

Covington showed a greater percentage in population from 1900 to 1910 than any other Kentucky city. 60 to 65 per cent of the workmen own their homes. There are no slums in Covington—no places where people are crowded for air.

Covington is the second largest city of Kentucky—"just across the bridge from Cincinnati;" it is within a short distance of both the center of population and the center of manufacturing; a circle with a radius of 700 miles embraces 70 per cent of the population of the United States.

Covington has three railroads, reaching north, east, south and west; also trap car service with roads having Cincinnati terminals.

Covington has 50 miles of macadam, 13 miles of brick and 3½ miles of asphalt streets: 54 miles of sewer; owns and operates its own water works and garbage crematory; has 39 public, parochial and private schools, kindergartens and business colleges.

Covington has over 550 acres of public parks and playgrounds; 50 churches representing all denominations; 307 societies, associations and unions; 30 miles of street car lines; eleven banks and trust companies with combined paid-up capital of \$1,645,000; combined surplus and undivided profits, \$532,700; combined deposits, \$6,749,000.
