











































































DEDICATION

Through Fire In Memory of Pamela Wrinch

But short was that reunion: without flowers, That final summering, as they, unknowing, Walked along the ocean shore to Eleusinian mysteries. We at these rites stand in the outer court And by the flaming toches, final flowers, We now renounce, before the Maker of the wind And rock, our first audacity--when we (Like Pluto and Demeter) presumed to call Her "ours"--and then the last audacity--When we presumed to know the seasons of the gods.

And how, as then, at dawn the finite fire Pales in the great infinity of light, Eternally renewed.

(In Greek mythology Kore is the daughter of the earth-goddess Demeter. While they are together, earth flowers and is fruifful; but Pluto, god of the underworld, abducts Kore. During her stay underground, the earth is winter-bound and barren; but Kore is allowed brief visits above ground, and these times of the reunions of Demeter and Kore are the fruitful, flowering seasons. The Greeks celebrated the mysteries of Demeter and Kore at Eleusis. There, after the participants had walked along the coast from Athens to Eleusis, the celebrations of the first night of the mysteries took place by torchlight outside the temple tiself.)
