






Independence rally in Lithuania



During the war in Iraq, Saddam Hussein's forces ignited hundreds of oil wells in Kuwait. Smoke belched from the torched wells for many months afterwards. Satellite photos showed a black-grey plume swept south of Kuwait as far south as the Arabian Sea- equal to the distance from Manhattan to the tip of Florida. Meanwhile, the invasion of Iraq caused destruction estimated to be in the hundreds of millions of dollars. Months after the American military forces freed Kuwait city, the effects of war were still evident.

Year In Review: U.S. News



President Bush nominated Clarence Thomas, a 43-year-ol-! conservative Republican, to replace the retiring Justice Thurgood Marshall on the Supreme Court. Nearly three months later he was confirmed by the U.S. Senate by a vote of 52 to 48. But, it was a tumultuous confirmation process. After a series of public hearings, the Senate Judiciary Committee split 7 to 7 on his nomination. Just days before the full Senate was to vote some serious allegations of sexual harassment were raised. Professor Anita F. Hill, a 35-year-old law professor form the University of Oklahoma and former assistant for Thomas at the E.E.O.C., claimed she was the victim of sexual harassment while the two worked together about ten years earlier. The Senate committee reconvened and heard about three days of riveting testimony from Thomas and Hill and a group of supporters from both sides. The full Senate then debated the issue and voted to confirm the U.S. Appeals court judge to the nation's highest court.





As the school year began in September, 1991, President George Bush was trying to get his nominees to the Supreme Court (Clarence Thomas) and the Central Intelligence Agency (Robert Gates) successfully through the confirmation process. But two of his major tasks were peace in the Middle East and a lingering recession at home in the United States. And with a presidential election around the corner, the president was putting together his re-election team.



After nearly seven years as a hostage, Terry Anderson was released on December 4, 1991. Anderson spent 2,455 days as a hostage in Lehanon making him the longest held American hostage. He is shown here arriving in Weisbaden, Germany being greeted by his sister, Peggy Shay.

The emotions surrounding the competition were heightened by the fact that her mother, who is legally blind, was watching her daughter's graceful moves from no more than five inches away from a t.v. monitor. Despite some problems in her long program, Kerrigan's grace, strength, and beauty came together and she skated on to a Bronze Medal.

New President

Curry College Names New President

Catherine W. Ingold has been named as the first woman president of Curry College. Dr. Ingold, 42, succeeds Dr. William L. Boyle, Jr., who last February announced his retirement, effective December 31. She was chosen following an exhaustive search guided by a committee representing all major segments of the College community. The Board of Trustees unanimously elected her to her new post at its December 9 meeting. She took office as the College's 13th president in mid-March.

In taking the Curry post, Dr. Ingold left the presidency of The American University of Paris, an institution built on the U.S. educational model and serving some 900 students.

Prior to assuming the presidency of AUP, Dr. Ingold served in a number of posts of increasing responsibility at Gallaudet University, an institution for deaf students.

Dr. Ingold holds a bachelor's degree in french from Hollins College. She received a master's degree in romance linguistics, and a Doctorate in French in 1979, both from University of Virginia. A Phi Beta Kappa scholar of French Literature, Dr. Ingold served from 1989-91 as a Fulbright Fellowship Reader in literature and linguistics. Her languages include French, German, and Spanish, and she is fluent in American Sign Language.





The first evening was spent meeting the new prospects and catching up with the returning players. It was the last and only night of being pain free. Then the adventure began at 7:00 am Thursday morning. First breakfast and then to the training room, followed by the daily two mile jog at eight sharp. It appeared from the onset that the Curry Women's Soccer team would have a successful season, but there was work to be done; there always is.

Pre-season consists of two very grueling weeks of physical activity. There are three sessions a day, each two hours long, sometimes longer. It is two weeks of sore muscles and aching feet. Curry College Men's Soccer 1991


The Colonels started off last season in a positive manner, after going 2-0 in pre-season. They defeated nationally ranked Massassoitte Community College 1-0, and then Dean Junior College 2-0. Things looked good for the Colonels until they dropped their season opener 3-1 to Roger Williams College in overtime. The Colonels scored early in the game and it looked like they were on their way to another victory, but then in the second half they looked like a totally different team, and the overtime period was all Roger Williams. Coach Vasiliadis had this to say about the game, "we had them early but we just could not keep the fast paced tempo of play. That is something we are going to improve on if we want to be contenders for the Commonwealth Coast Conference Championship." After the heartbreaking loss to Roger Williams College the Colonels lost 6 straight to some worthy opponents such as Tufts University, Brandeis University, and the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. The Colonels got their first win of the season on September 21, by beating Anna Maria College 3-0. The Colonels were back on track and playing quite well. Their next game was against Stonehill College a division II power. Never the less the Colonels did not seem to care although Stonehill gor an early one goal lead, the Colonels came back to get three of their own and with six minutes to play in regulation they found themselves beating Stonehill 3-1. Then at the 80 minute mark in the game Stonehill came within one, and then with twenty seconds left in regulation they tied the game. The overtime period was all Stonehill, and they scored 2 goals to beat our Colonels 5-3. Coach Vasiliadis was quoted as saying "we had them beat, but once again overtime killed us. We just do not have as deep a bench as they do, and that was what won it for them."

The Colonels split their last eight games 4 wins and 4 losses. Then came the Commonwealth Coast Conference Tournament, the Colonels drew Salve Regina for the first round of play. The Colonels were favorites in this game, but came up short once again and lost the game 2-0. The season closer was against Nichols College, the battered Colonels lost that one 3-1. When asked about the season Coach Vasiliadis said this, "It was very upsetting to go 5-13, but we really got hurt by injuries Senior Captain Matt Belcastro was out for the season with a recurring knee problem, and several other key players had season long injuries as well."

Some post season banquet notes: Senior Co-Captains Sean Quinn and Jared Sturner were voted Most Valuable Players, freshman Tim Kelley and Mike Wein were voted Rookies of the Year, and David Rivers was voted Most Improved, also senior Sean Quinn and freshman Mike Wein were selected for the Commonwealth Coast Conference All-Star team. The Colonels graduated eight seniors and will be looking at a very young team the next couple of years.

There was also an abundance of sports information from recent sporting events, Features highlighted special people and groups, and Arts and Entertainment had the latest film and band reviews.

The Times was a fun place to work this year, despite 3:00 am layout nights and the hassles of deadlines which seemed forever to be hanging every reporter and editor's head. It was a close knit family especially with the help of our wacky, easygoing advisor Marcy Kornriech who gave us constructive criticism, support and a lot of praise and advice.

The Currier Times has come a long way since its return in 1989, and with the past year's work as evidence, it should continue to be a popular and fun organization within Curry's borders.

In time we won't remember any of the bad days, only the laughs and good times that we've shared over the last four years will come to mind. They will warm you on a cold winter day and bring a smile to your face when you most need one.

On behalf of the class of 1992, I am honored to present Curry with a gift that will benefit students for many years to come. So much of my time here was spent advertising for events on campus that I had planned through program board or student government. I have seen first hand the need for better communication on campus. This was also the feeling of the class of 1991 class officers that desperately wanted to see their gift come into fruition. However, a lack of funds prevented this from occuring. It is my pleasure to announce that we would like to pick up where they left off by presenting Curry with a large sign board that will feature an awning and lights here in the academic quad to be used by clubs and organizations to better spread the word about oncampus events.


