The YM strives to take an active part in lending a helping hand to needy families in and around Dahlonega, both at Christmas and throughout the year.

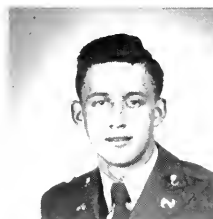

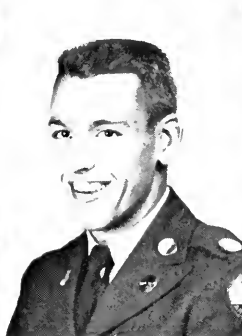


The Rex Fraternity is one of the traditional organizations of North Georgia College. It was organized in 1917 and is the oldest fraternity now on the campus.
