

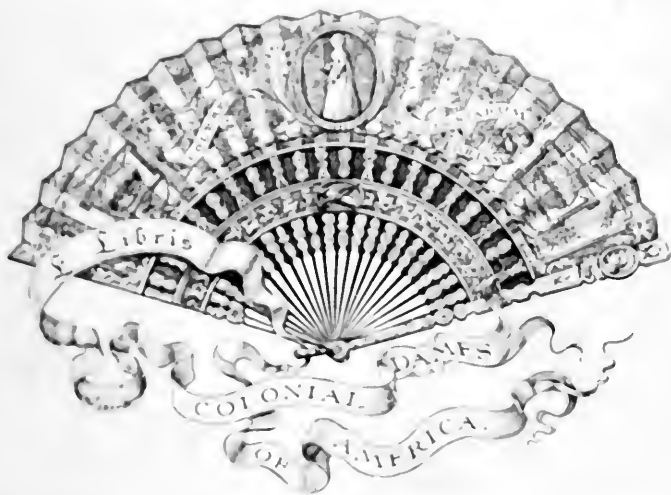
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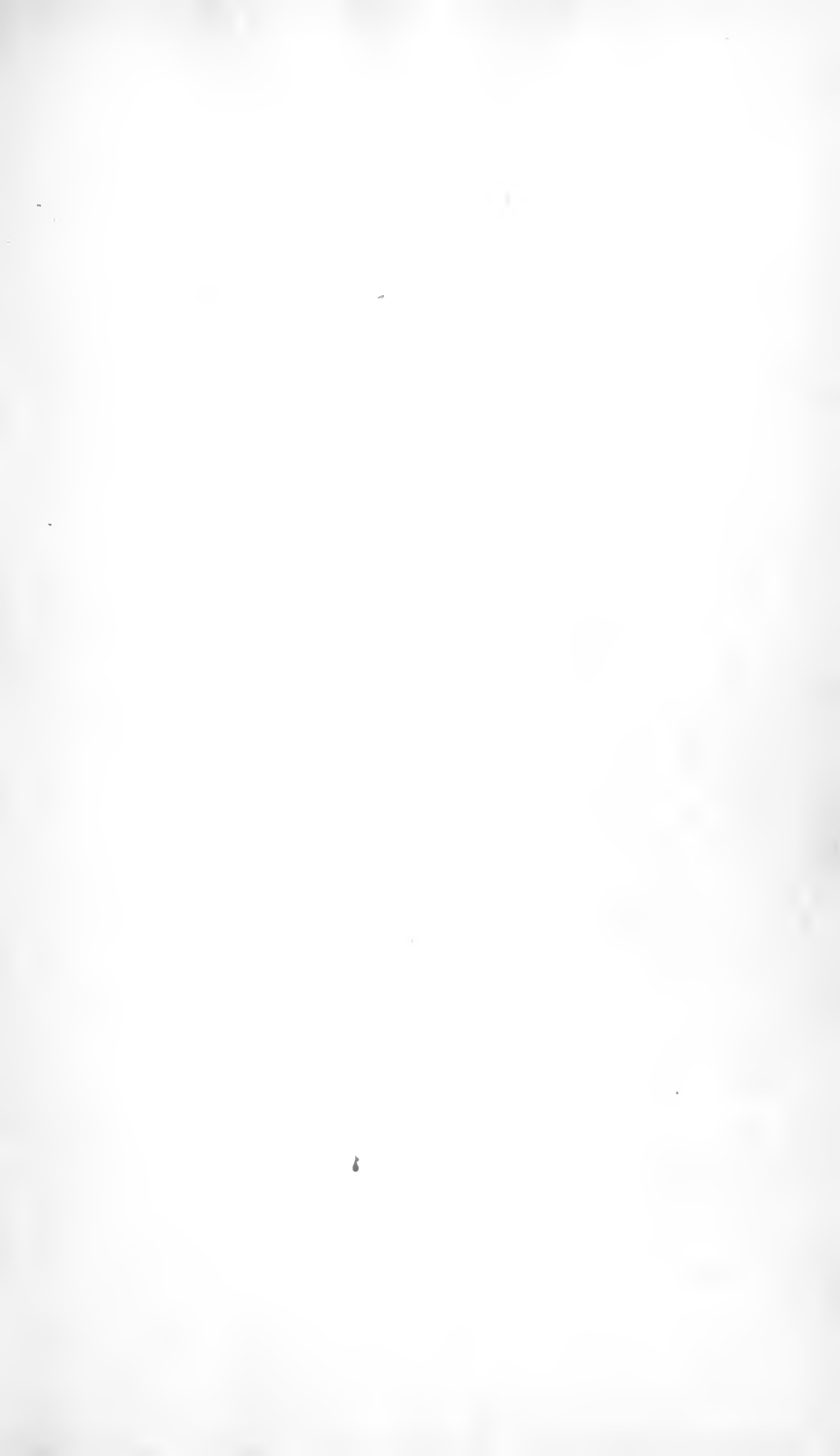

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P R E F A C E

This book represents the genealogical gleanings of thirty years. The first steps were made by Edwin Lamson, of Summit, N. J., in 1888, and the collection of further data was later taken up by the author and compiler, who has worked at it ever since with varying degrees of genealogical enthusiasm and intensity. The demands of a busy professional life have retarded the work to a large extent. Much help has been given to him by Miss Flora M. Lamson, of Cottage City, Mass., who died in 1916, and by Albert H. Lamson, of Elkins, N. H.

The author begs to apologize in advance for any errors or inaccuracies, which may appear in the book. The difficulties in the way of gathering accurate statistics are very great. Not only do the Town Records and Vital Statistics at times show conflicting data, but personal letters, abstracts from old documents, family bibles, deeds, etc., from which a work like this is largely made up, present a surprising variation in their statistical information. Then, too, awkward gaps occur in certain lines of descent, which must be bridged by painstaking analysis of the facts available, and the most logical inferences and hypotheses have been selected as the probably correct solution of the problem.

The difficulties above mentioned and an unwillingness to record on the printed page any possible inaccuracies which might impair the value of a genealogical work, have led to a diffidence in having this work published. But there is so much that is of interest to William Lamson's descendants, and the author has been requested so many times, by so many people, to have the results of his investigations published, that he offers this book as a record of his gleanings.

INTRODUCTORY

The earliest mention in this country of the name of Lamson,—variously spelled LAMPSON, LAMPSONNE, LAMBSON or LAMSON,—occurs in the vicinity of Boston, Mass., and New Haven, Conn., and the three men who are the ancestors of the vast majority of those who bear that name were:

1. WILLIAM LAMSON, of Ipswich, Mass.
2. BARNABAS LAMSON, of Cambridge, Mass.
3. THOMAS LAMSON, of New Haven, Conn.

1. WILLIAM LAMSON is said to have come over from England about 1634, and first appears on a list of Freemen at Ipswich, May 17, 1637.

2. BARNABAS LAMSON came over from Harwich, England, in the ship *Defence* on the 10th of August, 1635, in company with Rev. Thomas Shepard. From researches made in England it has been found that in the Ridgewell, Essex Co., Register, 1562-1700, the baptisms of two of his children are recorded, viz.:

“1631, Barnabas Lampsonne filius Barnabe Lampsonne et (—) uxoris ejus baptizatus 22 Novembris.

“1633/4, Martha Lambson daughter of Barnabas Lambson and Marie his wife baptized 13 January.”

Barnabas settled at Newtowne, now Cambridge, Mass., arriving there about the time that the Rev. Thomas Hooker left there to settle a large portion of his congregation at Hartford, Conn. In 1636 he received a grant of land on the south side of the Charles River, consisting of six acres, in lots given out by the town; and he was a Selectman of Cambridge in 1636.

In May, 1634, the people of Newtown, meditating removal, “sent men to Agawam (this name was changed to Ipswich in August, 1634), and Merrimack, and gave out that they would

move," but they emigrated to Connecticut, so that there was probably some social connection between Ipswich, Cambridge and New Haven in those early days, and the first settlers perhaps radiated out along these lines.

3. THOMAS LAMSON appears for the first time in New Haven, Conn., about 1639, when his name is on a list containing all the "Freemen of the Courts of New Haven." Where he came from originally, or whether he located elsewhere previously, before going to New Haven, is not known.

It seems fair to presume, in view of the above facts, that William, Barnabas and Thomas Lamson might have been the traditional "three emigrant brothers," or at least closely related to each other,—that they came from the County of Essex in England about 1634 or 1635, and that they settled as their fancy or the exigencies of their position demanded, or their religious connections led them, in Ipswich, Cambridge and New Haven, respectively.

A partial list of the descendants of Barnabas Lamson of Cambridge has been published by Mr. Frank B. Lamson, of Buffalo, Minn., 1908, in a *Memorial of Elder Ebenezer Lamson, of Concord, Mass.* The following pages are devoted to the descendants of William Lamson, of Ipswich, Mass.

IPSWICH, MASS.

As William Lamson selected Ipswich for his home, and as it has numbered citizens by the name of Lamson from 1637 to the present time, it may be interesting before proceeding to the strictly genealogical part of this work, to obtain a general idea of the early conditions in that town, and to familiarize ourselves with the daily life of these first Colonial settlers. The character of our New England ancestors was formed by years of struggling against adverse conditions. A new country was to be developed, land cleared, houses built and furnished, while the dreaded Indian foe lurked ever ready to destroy life and property.

For a most interesting description of the early Ipswich days the reader is referred to *Ipswich in the Massachusetts Bay Colony, 1633-1700*, by Thomas Franklin Waters, President of the Ipswich Historical Society, to which the writer is indebted for much of the following description.

The Indian name of the village was Agawam, and it was early famed for its fertile land and rich fisheries. In order to secure this valuable tract of land the Governor and Council of the Massachusetts Bay Colony sent an expedition thither, in March, 1633, led by John Winthrop, son of the Governor, with twelve men of good rank and quality, who, during the summer, built themselves comfortable homes and raised crops sufficient to carry them through the following winter. There was a steady growth in the population, and on Aug. 4, 1634, the Court of Assistants decided that the place should be called Ipswich, after old Ipswich in England, "in acknowledgment of the great honor and kindness done to our people who took shipping there." Ipswich, England, is in Suffolk County, and only a few miles from Harwich, from which point Barnabas Lamson emigrated to this country.

The early location of a mill for their food supply, a meeting-house for their spiritual nurture and a burying-ground for their dead was imperative, and around these centres the crude homes

of the settlers naturally grouped themselves. Roads were cut through the woods, and some of them were known as, "the way to the mill," "the way to the Meeting-House," "Dirty Lane," Mill Street, ye Great Street, ye Long Street, King's Highway, etc., showing the utilitarian or topographical character of these thoroughfares. On all these streets, plots of various sizes, but rarely more than three acres, were assigned for house-lots. Tillage lands were apportioned in six or twelve acre lots, or more, and great farms on the outskirts.

The house-lots were fenced in, or paled with sharpened sticks, enclosing gardens, and protecting them from stray cattle. The houses were small and very roughly made, for there was no saw-mill of which there is certain record until 1649, and the planks were all sawed by hand. Every nail, hinge and bolt was also forged by hand. The chimneys were built of wood, daubed with clay, and the danger from fire was ever present. The houses were unpainted. The appraisal value of an estate, in these early days, was rarely over £100. The average price received from the sale of a house was less than £25, and often, we may presume, they were built of logs.

The interior furnishing of these houses was correspondingly meagre. On the ground floor there were generally two rooms—the living or family room, where they cooked, worked, ate and sat, and the parlor or fine-room. In the former the large fire-place, with its andirons, bellows and tongs, and the iron bar (later supplanted by the crane), from which were suspended large and small pots of copper, brass or iron, dripping-pans, spits for roasts, skillets and the indispensable warming-pan—all this was the centre of cheer and comfort, as the snapping and crackling logs sent forth their warmth and glow. Upon the open shelves stood rows of pewter plates and pots, or brassware, candlesticks and a few books—notably "the great Bible." Homely household utensils also were in this room—"chirnes," powdering-tubs (for salting meat), barrels and "keelers," "bucking-tubs" (for washing), pails, etc. Strings of dried apples, corn and fat hams swung from the ceiling. The necessary firearms and swords, ready for instant use against Indian attacks, hung on the walls. A table and a chair or two, with some benches completed the usual furnishing

of this room. In the parlor or "fine room" the most conspicuous article was the best bed, of imposing size, with long curtains hanging to the floor. A feather bed and a warming pan were essential to ward off the cruel cold of those long winter nights. A trundle-bed was common, and few chairs were used. Large chests contained the bedding, table-linen and wearing apparel. There were few pictures on the walls or carpets on the floors, or any other ornamental furnishings. The sleeping apartments of the family were above stairs, mere lofts, cold and cheerless.

Every citizen who owned a house and land within the limits of the town owned also the right of pasturage for his cattle on the Common, although the right of Commonage did not permit him to cut down trees without special order. The Common was surrounded by a fence, and certain officers were elected to see that it was kept in repair, called Fence Viewers, whose function was of great importance in those early days. The cattle were driven out to the Common by the Cowherd soon after sunrise, and brought back just before sunset, and he was responsible for all danger coming to them. For his services he received 12 pence for each cow before he took them, a shilling and sixpence fourteen days after midsummer, and the rest at the end of the term in corn or money. Swineherds looked after the "pigges" in a similar manner, and Pounders were chosen to care for stray animals and put them in the Pound and collect the fines.

The strict observance of the Sabbath was perhaps the most striking characteristic of this colony and of others of its time. Work ceased on Saturday after three o'clock, and the rest of the day was spent in learning the catechism and preparing for the Sabbath. The morning of the Sabbath was begun by home worship, and then at nine o'clock the Meeting-House bell summoned every citizen to public service, only the sick and disabled being excused. The Meeting-House was a crude, humble structure, built of logs chinked with clay or moss, with a thatched roof. It was surrounded by a stone wall or fort for protection against sudden attack by Indians. Every man above eighteen years of age brought his firearms to church, and sentinels paced their beat outside during the service. There were no pews, only benches, and the men and women sat on different sides of the aisle. The

aristocracy of old Ipswich was nowhere more formally recognized than here, however, as the front seats were rigidly reserved for those of the highest social rank, whether due to official station, education, family connection or wealth. Further back were seated the lower gentry and yeomen, and last of all the poorer ones and servants. The service was long and solemn.

About two in the afternoon a second service was begun, followed by the baptism of children, which was an important ceremony, as Puritan babies were invariably taken to church for baptism on the first Sunday after birth, no matter how inclement the weather. At sunset the Sabbath was ended.

Stern and forbidding as that old worship appears at the present day, yet beneath it all we discover that simple, unswerving fidelity to Conscience and the Bible which compelled those men to make their Sabbath what it was. In that rugged spiritual soil were planted the seeds of a religious character which has exerted its influence on all their descendants, and we cannot help reverencing and respecting them for their consistency.

As a result of their strong religious convictions it was ordered by the first General Court of the Colony that "no man shall be admitted to the freedom of this body politic but such as are members of some of the churches within the limit of the same." Every Freeman, after investigation by the Court had showed that he was suitable for election under the foregoing order, took the Freeman's Oath of allegiance, and was thereby eligible to vote for the officers of the Colony and to take part in the town-meetings. For thirty years this restriction of the franchise to church members was vigorously enforced, but after that the separation of Church and State grew wider and wider.

For a more detailed and comprehensive description of the early days in Ipswich the reader is referred to the book above mentioned.

DESCENDANTS OF
WILLIAM LAMSON
OF IPSWICH, MASS.

WILLIAM¹ LAMSON was born in England, and came to this country in 1634.

Of his arrival we know nothing, but he went to Ipswich soon after he landed, and the records show that on Feb. 5, 1637, there was "granted unto Will^m Lampson six acres of planting ground, between Paul Williamson's meadow and Goodman Andrews ten acres near the upper end of Labour-in-vayne Creek." In 1640, too, he received another grant of land, and in that year it was voted that "the highway to Chebaco beneath Heart Break Hill forever be repayed by the benefit of the grass yearly growing upon the same," and John Leigh was to enjoy all the profits for "maintaining the highway from Rocky Hill to William Lampson's lot."

On the bank of the Ipswich River, on a point jutting out into the stream at the end of the road leading to Labour-in-Vayne meadows, William Lampson was granted a house lot "in the beginning" and it was expected that this attractive locality, called the Turkey Shore, would become a compact neighborhood; but the houses disappeared, however, and some lots were never utilized. William Lampson and William Story, who owned adjoining lots there, sold their property, now owned by Mr. Benjamin Fewkes, prior to 1644, and the neighborhood evidently did not prove popular. He also had a grant of about one and a half acres a little further up the river on the Turkey Shore, bordering on Hunt's Cove, and this was sold to Deacon Whipple. It is now owned by Dr. William E. Tucker. In 1649 there was also granted to "Wm. Lamson 6 acres of salt marsh neare Hog Island by John Dane his Island."

There is a hill in Ipswich named Lamson's Hill since 1678, and perhaps earlier. His farm is still owned by his descendants.

Thus we see that William Lamson was early a man of property, and from the extracts from the town records we find him to have been a man of considerable standing in the community and interested in town affairs. His name appears on a list of Freemen of Ipswich, May 17, 1637. This shows that he was a member of the church in good standing and thereby entitled, after taking the oath of allegiance, to vote for the officers of the Colony and take part in town affairs.

In 1641 he was entered as a Commoner on the Town Book of Ipswich, which showed that, owning a house and land within the bounds of the town, he was entitled to the right of pasturage for his cattle in the wide domain beyond the Common fence. These Commoners, from the very beginning, met in Commoners' meeting, had their own records and legislated with reference to all the duties and privileges of Commoners and voted on all questions relating to the common lands. In 1657 it was "ordered that Wm. Lamson (and others) pay 12^d y head to the cove keeper for their coves going on the Comon according to an order made in March last."

One of the earlier offices which he held was that of Pounder, and the duties were to care for stray animals, shut them up in the public pounds and collect the fines due. It was ordered "that Mr. Wilson . . . and William Lamson, and they only, shall have power to impound Swyne off the Common."

Another office held by him was that of Fence Viewer, which was of the highest importance in those early days, as any break in the fence around the Common might involve great loss in growing crops at a time when a scarce harvest was a very serious menace to the health and comfort of the little community. So it is no wonder that men of the greatest sobriety and carefulness were chosen for the responsible duty of viewing and having charge of this rude fence. In 1640 "William Lampson was appointed to look that the Common fence on the South side be sufficient."

The right of Commonage did not carry with it the right to cut wood in the dense forests on the Common, and the privilege of cutting down trees had to be obtained from the town, under

penalty of a fine. In Sept., 1641, there is a record that "Willi Lampson hath liberty to fell 300 trees on the other side of Chebacco so it be not in the limits of any town."

In 1648 he was again on a list of Freemen and paid tax of 2 shillings.

The military life of the early settlers was of great importance to the community and the fear of attacks by Indians was ever present. Every adult male above the age of eighteen years was liable to military service. The training of the military bands was constant and arduous, and breaches of military etiquette and neglect of training were punished by fines. Thus we find, in Oct., 1643, a "List of such as have forfeited for not returning their powder according to an order of the Towne, . . . £1-0-0. Willm. Lampson."

Among the early leaders of the military companies was Captain, afterwards Major Denison, who became so valuable as a commander that the people of the town in 1645 voted to pay him every year £24-7-0 for his "military helpfulness to them" in order to retain his services. This was apportioned among the townsmen, and in 1648, in a subscription list "to our leader, Major Denison," we find that William Lamson gives two shillings.

The General Court at times assumed extraordinary authority over the private affairs of the citizens in those early days. A scarcity of materials for clothing led to statutes increasing the number of sheep in each town to relieve the lack of woolen cloth, and in 1656 it was ordered that "all hands not necessarily employ'd on other occasion, as women, girls and boyes shall & are hereby enjoined to spin according to their skill & abillitie." The Selectmen were directed to rate each family and the amount of time that might be given to spinning. The usual amount of spinning that a spinner could do in a day was to be the standard, and each family was to be assessed so many "spinners," or fractions thereof. Thus we find on the town records for 1656, "The Selectmen having considered the severall families of this Towne & their employment have, according to the order of the Court, assessed them spinners as is underwritten for the year ensuing. . . . Wm. Lampson $\frac{3}{4}$ spinner,—£67 $\frac{1}{2}$."

William Lamson married Sarah Ayers,* daughter of John and Hannah (—) Ayers of Salisbury, and later of Haverhill, Mass. John Ayers or Eyres is mentioned among the original settlers of Haverhill, Mass., and was there in 1640. He removed to Ipswich and later to Haverhill, his name being on the Freeman's list there in 1646. This list has the valuation of each man's property, and John Ayers is put down at £160, the largest but one on the list.

William Lamson died about January 1, 1658/9, at Ipswich, Mass. His estate was appraised as follows:

*Although there is no record of the marriage of William Lamson and Sarah Ayers, it is supposed that she was the daughter of John Ayers of Salisbury for the following reasons: His eldest son, Captain John Ayers, married as his second wife Susanna, daughter of Mark Symonds of Ipswich. In Nov., 1672, he sold all his rights in Ipswich, the following quotation, "belonging to my father-in-law Mark Symonds," proving his wife to have been the (only) daughter of Mark Symonds, Susanna. In 1661 when Sarah Lampson, widow of William Lampson, proposed to marry Thomas Hartshorn of Reading, John Ayers refers to the aforesaid William Lamson as his brother. His wife Susanna being an only daughter it is supposed that Sarah Lamson, widow, was his own sister.

The Court grants administration to the widow Lampson and order that she pay or cause to be payd to ye several children as they come to 21 years of age or their marriage wth her consent viz. the eldest son £12 ye rest £6 apeice and that the house & land stand ingaged to make good ye legacies. The other security be given ye satisfaction of ye Court if any of the children dye before they come to age then to be devyded equally to ye survivors."

When William Lamson died his widow Sarah was appointed adm^t of his estate, March 29, 1659, and presented the above inventory of his estate, which was made Feb. 11, 1658, by William Goodhue and Robert Ford, showing the net amount £111-10-2. According to the Probate Records of Essex County, Mass., he left four sons, the eldest aged 16, the second aged 9, the third 2 years the previous November, and the youngest 24 weeks old; and four daughters, the eldest 14 years, the second 7 years, the third — years, and the fourth 4 years old.

Sarah Lamson, the widow, had married previous to Nov., 1661 (Savage's *Gen. Dict.* gives April 10, 1661), Thomas Hartshorn of Reading, Middlesex County, Mass., and at the Probate Court, Nov., 1661, John Ayres and William Fellows, calling William Lamson and Sarah his widow, their brother and sister, petitioned that their brother Lamson's children may not be cheated out of their share of the estate, stating that the children had been put out to live in other families, and that the estate of said brother Lamson had not been valued near so high as it was estimated by them. Accordingly, Thomas Hartshorn made over as security his house and homestead of fifteen acres in Reading, and bounded by lands of James Pike and Walter Fairfield and the

common lands of Reading, etc., on the 11th of 12 mo., 1661, which satisfied the Judge of Probate.

Savage says that Thomas Hartshorn already had several children by his former wife, Susan, and that by Sarah, the widow of William Lamson, he had a son Timothy, born Feb. 23, 1662.

On Jan. 20, 1720, Joseph Lamson, the only surviving son of William Lamson, was appointed adm^r de Bonis non of his estate.

JOHN² LAMSON (William¹) was born at Ipswich, Mass., Nov., 1642, and died at Topsfield, Mass., 1717. He married Martha, daughter of Deacon Thomas and Phebe (Gould) Perkins of Topsfield, at Ipswich, Dec. 17, 1668. She was born in 1649 at Topsfield and died 1728.

Deacon Perkins was born in England, probably in Newant, Gloucestershire, in 1616, and sailed with his father "Quarter-Master" John Perkins, from Bristol, Eng., in the ship *Lyon*, arriving in 1631. John Perkins went to Ipswich with John Winthrop the younger and was Deputy to the General Court in 1636. Deacon Perkins removed to Topsfield and married Phebe, daughter of Zaccheus and Phebe (Deacon) Gould, about 1640.

John Lamson, the eldest son of William Lamson, lived in Ipswich and owned a large farm there. His name appears on a list of Freemen of Ipswich, May 27, 1674, and also on "a list of those who took the oath of Allegance of Ipswich town before the worshipfull Major Gen^l Denison, Esq., the 11th of December, 1678." Again his name appears on "the list of those that by law are allowed to have there votes in Town affairs. Voted to be recorded at the Towne meeting, December the 2th, 1679."

An interesting phase of life in those early Colonial days was the attitude of different communities toward witchcraft. In the autumn of 1692, Andover, Mass., was convulsed with an outbreak of the current delusion. The accusations of some who fomented the trouble caused the imprisonment of four women, two of whom came to the Ipswich prison. The lives of not only the

plainer people but also of magistrates and ministers were in peril if such baseless accusations were permitted to be continued, and calmer judgments began to prevail. On Jan. 3, 1692/3, by virtue of an Act of the General Court, the first Superior Court, called the "Court of Assizes and General Goal Delivery," was convened at Salem. The Grand Jury included several Ipswich men, and on the "Jury for Tryalls," among others, was John Lamson. On the whole, Ipswich suffered little from this delusion as compared with other important towns in the County, and her judicious and far-seeing temper preserved her balance in the wild excitement of the witchcraft period.

John Lamson bought and sold several pieces of real estate in Ipswich, as shown by the following records:—

John Lamson sen^r of Ipswich bought of John Fairfield about 30 acres in Ipswich at the north side of Mile Brook River and on the southeast side of the road leading to Wenham, 1694.

He bought of Elizabeth, widow of John Rogers, 6 acres of marsh on Stage Island in Ipswich, 1695, and sold the same to Joseph Fuller in 1704.

He bought of Walter Fairfield, Jr., the house where the grantor then lived with 1½ acres of land, 1694. He also bought of the same a house, barn and about 100 acres of land in Ipswich in 1697.

He sold to Rob Quarles a dwelling house and about 30 acres of land near Wenham which he bought of Walter Fairfield Dec. 30, 1712.

He deeded to his son John^s of Ipswich for £100 about 50 acres, "a certain parcell of ground which I bought of my brother Wm. Howlett," bounded "by the Ipswich River S. W. and N. W. and N. E. by Ipswich Common S. E. and Southerly as it is bounded in my deed," reserving a right of way for the grantor's brother Howlett to pass through the same, etc., June, 1700.

He bought of Col. John Appleton about 7 acres of salt marsh by the North side of Ipswich River in Ipswich, 1703.

He bought of Joseph Gerrish of Wenham about 3½ acres by Ring's Cove in Ipswich, March 5, 1706/7.

John Lamson sen^r of Ipswich yeoman for love and affection deeded to his son Wm.^s Lamson of Ipswich, yeoman, "a dwelling

house newly built and 60 acres of upland and meadow ground and being ye one halfe of my farm which I bought of Walter Fairfield, Jr., be it more or less, said house and land being situate lying and being in ye township of Ipswich afores^d and being bounded . . . by land of Joseph Whipple etc., and also 30 acres of salt marsh in Ipswich," June 28, 1706.

He sold to John Eaton of Redding, yeoman, land in Redding on the north side of Ipswich River, "it being a lot which was my Hon'd Father-in-law Hartshorn's." (Stepfather?)

To his two sons Thomas³ and Samuel³ Lamson of Ipswich, yeomen, he deeded, June 23, 1712, "all my houses and lands yt I now have in ye s^d town of Ipswich of what sort soever Both upland meadow marsh swamps or thatch banks and all yt my Common Right or Rights in Common that now or hereafter shall be divided to me in ye Common Lands in s^d Ipswich . . . with all housing thereon."

John Lamson made his will June 23, 1712, witnessed by Samuel Appleton, John Lamson,³ Jr., and William Lamson,³ and this will was proved June 17, 1717. It was signed by his X mark. By this will his wife Martha was to have the income of one-third of the real estate notwithstanding he had deeded it all to his sons. She, with sons Thomas and Samuel, to be executors. He mentions sons John, William, Thomas and Samuel, and daughters Phebe (who had married Theophilus Fisk, and they gave their receipt for their portion Dec. 4, 1713), Martha (who had married Benj. Bigsby or Bixby and their receipt was dated Dec. 1, 1713), and Sarah Lamson (who had married Paul Faulkner of Andover, Mass., before Jan. 18, 1714/5, when they gave a receipt for their legacy in the will).

SAMUEL² LAMSON (William¹) was born at Ipswich, Mass., Nov., 1649, and died at Reading, Mass., Oct. 7, 1692. He married Mary, daughter of Richard and Anna (—) Nichols of Ipswich, May 19, 1676.

He was a bricklayer by trade, and resided in Reading, Mass., where all his children were born. He served in King Philip's

War under Captain Davenport in 1675. In 1677 he was a member in full communion of the church at Reading. In 1686 he subscribed £4 for a new meeting house there.

Samuel Lamson died intestate and Mary Lamson was appointed adm^t of his estate. Her bond of £200 was witnessed by Joseph Lamson. The real estate consisted of 40 acres of upland and swamp. His eldest son Samuel took the real estate and paid out to his brothers and sister Sarah their shares. The minor children, when Mary their mother was appointed their guardian, were Ebenezer, aged 14; John, aged 13; Sarah, aged 9, and Elizabeth, aged 7 years.

NATHANIEL² LAMSON (William¹), according to the Memorandum on the back of the Inventory of his father's estate, was probably born in Ipswich in Nov., 1656.

He spent the early part of his life there and his name appears, with that of his brother John, on "a list of those who took the oath of Alegance of Ipswich town before the worshipful Major Gen^l Denison, Esq., the 11th of Dec., 1678." Like many of his fellow citizens he followed the sea for an occupation. Of his life little is known, but he probably moved to Malden, where his brother Joseph lived, before 1683, as the following power-of-attorney, given to his brother Joseph, shows (Middlesex 22:7, Reg. of Deeds):

* * * * *

Know all men by these presents that I, Nathaniel Lamson of Malden in New England, have and hereby do constitute my loving brother Joseph Lamson of Malden aforesaid my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name and stead to ask, demand, require, receive and to use all lawful means to (—) out of the hands of whomsoever it may concern, all such sums of money, Debts Goods or other Estate, be it gold, silver plate, Bullion, Jewels, pearls or otherwise that shall be due or coming to me upon the voyage I am now bound out upon to the wreck or wrecks or elsewhere for my share of what shall be gained or procured in said voyage, Giving and hereby granting to my said attorney full power and authority to sue, arrest, (—) and prosecute to effect in any court or courts and in my behalf to appear and any action or actions to defend: and if need be into prison to cast and (—) to deliver, release or other discharge upon payment to give and sign Composition if he see cause to make attorneys one or more to substitute and (—) at pleasure to revoke and (—) other way to act in my behalf, in as full and ample measure and degree as I might or could do if I were personally present to perform the same: all w^{ch} I shall ratify and confirm at all things by these presents: and if it should come to pass that I should depart this life before I return from the

voyage I am now bound out upon, then I do hereby fully bequeath to my said brother Joseph Lamson all the estate that I shall leave behind me or that shall be coming to me after my decease by him to be possessed and enjoyed as his own proper estate and to his heirs and assigns forever. In witness whereof I, the said Nath'l Lamson have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of December Anno Dom. 1683.

From this document it is clear that Nathaniel Lamson in Dec., 1683, was setting out upon some extended or perilous voyage, and as there is no further record of him in Malden or vicinity it has been thought possible that he may have gone to the coast of Maine (which was a part of Massachusetts until 1825, when it was admitted as a separate state into the Union), as others were doing at that time, and married there and settled. There are many Lamsons along the coast of Maine who trace their ancestry back to a Nathaniel Lamson who married Miriam Savage and lived in Edgecombe, Me., and this Nathaniel of Edgecombe may have been a son or grandson of the above Nathaniel of Malden. There is, too, a striking similarity of Christian names between this Maine branch and that of Nathaniel of Malden, which seems to make this possibility almost a probability.

JOSEPH² LAMSON (William¹), was born at Ipswich, Mass., Aug. 1657 or 1658, and died at Charlestown, Mass., Aug. 27th,

1722, and is buried there. He married three times: (1) Elizabeth Mitchell, December 12th, 1679, at Charlestown, Mass.; she died June 10th, 1703, at Malden, Mass., aged forty-five years, and is buried there; married (2) Mrs. Hannah Welch, widow of Thomas Welch, in 1704. She died Nov., 1713, at Charlestown, Mass.; married (3) Mrs. Dorothy Monsell, widow of Thomas Monsell and daughter of Thomas Hitt, in 1715, at Charlestown, Mass.; she died Aug. 27th, 1722, at Charlestown, Mass., aged sixty-four, and is buried there.

Joseph Lamson was a stone cutter and a cordwainer, and lived in Charlestown and later Malden, Mass. He was with Captain Turner on the Connecticut River in March, 1675/6. In 1693/4 he was "chosen to look after yoking and runing of swine" in Charlestown. He was a Proprietor and Freeholder there in 1694/5, and was appointed a Tithing man on March 8, 1696/7. In 1701 he was on a Committee for the boundary of County roads. In 1709/10 he was a Sealer of Leather. In 1710 his name appears on a "list of families yt bare publique charges in Malden." On Jan. 27, 1720, as "only surviving son," he was appointed Adm^r De Bonis non of his father, William Lamson's estate.

His will, dated on July 16, 1722, and proved Sept. 21, 1722, mentions him as a stone-cutter of Charlestown. By his will his wife Dorothy was to have what she brought with her when married and his sons Joseph, William, Nathaniel and Caleb were to have the residue and be executors of his will.

The inventory of his estate, in which his house was valued at £140, showed total valuation of £203.

JOHN³ LAMSON (John,² William¹), was born at Ipswich, Mass., Nov. 21, 1669, and died there Sept. 1, 1760, "aged ninety-two." He married Abigail Adams; who died in Ipswich, April 3, 1753, aged eighty-four years. He was a "husbandman" of Ipswich. He and his wife Abigail were admitted to full communion in the Congregational Church in Wenham in 1698.

In 1730, "John Lamson, John Lamson, Jr., Joseph Cummings and Israel Cummings, Jr., ask for an allowance, having built a bridge over the (Ipswich) river, and a way having been laid out from the old Lamson house, on the south side, to Gravelly Brook." (*History Essex Co.*, Vol. I, p. 574.)

He is spoken of in the records as Sergeant John Lamson.

In the Registry of Deeds of Essex County we find that he was a grantee or grantor about five times between 1720 and 1726. It seems that he was not called "Jr." after his father's death, as we find that a John Lamson, sold to John Lamson, Jr., his estate real and personal, (*Essex Co. Reg. of Deeds*, 41:63), viz:

"To all People to whom these present shall come JOHN LAMPSON of Ipswich . . . Know YEE that I the said John Lampson partly in consideration of the parentall Love and Naturall affection which I have and do bear towards my well beloved son John Lampson Jun^r of Ipswich afore^d and partly for and in consideration of the summ of two hundred pounds of passable money of New England to me in hand paid by my said son John Lampson Jun^r the receipt whereof to my full Consent and Satisfaction I do here by acknowledge . . . confirm to and upon my said son John Lampson . . . all my houseing Edifices Lands meadows or marshground thatch banks and common rights with my Goods Chattels and all my estate whether Real or personall which I am well entitled to and have either in possession or Reversion in ye Township of Ipswich or else where in New England together with all ye rights—privileges and appurtenances

thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining To Have" and June 11, 1722, he is called sen^r by the recorder and he ack^d it July 16, 1722.

He made his will Aug. 1, 1747, and it was proved Sept. 29, 1760. It mentions his wife Abigail, and the following children: Peter Lampson, Abigail Edwards (who was deceased with children, viz.: Mary, Abigail, Lucy, Rachel, Benjamin, and Ester), Priscilla Lampson, and John Lampson, who was the Executor, and had the residue. No Inventory or Account of his estate is given.

WILLIAM³ LAMSON (John,² William¹), was born in Ipswich, Mass., Aug. 19, 1675, and died probably after 1749. He married Lydia Porter, one of the six daughters of John and Lydia (Herrick) Porter of Wenham, Mass. They were published at Ipswich, Mass., Oct. 26, 1706. The Vital Records of Beverly, Mass., gives their marriage as Dec. 17, 1706, at Beverly. She died in Ipswich, at sixty years of age.

William Lamson was a farmer and lived in Ipswich, Mass., his homestead being next to the land of his brother, Ensign Samuel Lamson. He and his wife, Lydia, joined the church at Hamilton, a part of Ipswich, Dec. 10, 1727. He made several trans-

actions in real estate between 1716 and 1749, being grantee or grantor about twelve times. In 1734 he sold to his son Benjamin, a house and about four acres of land in Ipswich, which he bought of his brother Thomas Lamson. In 1749 he sold his real estate, half to his son Benjamin and half to his son Jonathan, and he probably settled his estate in this way, for we do not find his estate settled in the Probate Court.

THOMAS³ LAMSON (John,² William¹), was born at Ipswich, Mass., Jan. 3, 1682; died there July —, 1767. He was married three times; married (1) to Abigail Faulkner, daughter of Francis and Abigail* (Dane) Faulkner of Andover, Mass.

*Abigail (Dane) Faulkner, wife of Lieutenant Francis Faulkner, was the granddaughter of John Dane of Berkhamstead, England, who came to New England before 1641, and died in Roxbury, Mass., in 1658, and the daughter of Rev. Francis and Elizabeth (Ingalls) Dane. She was the first person of high social standing in the town of Andover who was condemned to death for witchcraft. In the State Archives may be seen the record of her sentence: "The Jury find Abigail Faulkner, wife of Francis Faulkner of Andover, guilty of ye felony of witchcraft, comited on ye body of Martha Sprague, also on ye body of Sarah Phelps. Sentence of death passed on Abigail Faulkner."

There are two indictments of Abigail Faulkner: She was examined August 11, 1692, before Mr. Hathorne, Mr. Corwin and Captain Higgin-

(Int. of m. Jan. 31, 1707), at Ipswich; she was born Aug. 12, 1683, at Andover, Mass.; died Dec. 26, 1746, at Ipswich, Mass.; married (2) Sarah Rindge of Ipswich (Int. of m. June 18, 1747), at Ipswich; married (3) Ruth Bowls (Int. of m. March 25, 1758), at Ipswich; she died Sept. 16, 1776, aged eighty years.

son. Mr. Higginson said, "You are here apprehended for witchcraft." She answered, "I know nothing of it." Her accusers were mostly young girls. (Ann Putnam, one of them, was only twelve years old at the time and lived to bitterly repent. Some years afterward she made public confession of her sin, begging forgiveness of God and all who had suffered from her accusations.) Upon her (Abigail's) entrance, some of those who were present fell down in fits; her attention being called to it, she said, "Yes, but it is the devil does it in my shape." . . . She was urged to confess, but replied, "God would not have her confess that yt she was not guilty of." She had a cloth in her hand and when she squeezed it caused the afflicted to fall "into grievous fits" at which she said, "She was sorry they were afflicted," but was told and it was observed that she did not shed a tear. "Mary Warin was pulled under the table and was helped out of her fitt by a touch of said Faulkner." She said she had "looked on some of those afflicted when they came to Andover and hurt them not," but was told it was before she began to afflict them.

On August 30, 1692, she again denied witchcraft before the justices. She owned, however, that she "was angry at what folks said when her cousin, Elizabeth Johnson, was taken up." Folks had laughed and said her sister Johnson would come out next and she did look with an evil eye on ye afflicted persons consenting that they should be afflicted because they were the cause of bringing her kindred out and she did wish them ill, that, her spirit being roused, she did pinch her hands together. She knew not but that the devil might take advantage, but it was the devil, not she, that afflicted them."

This is the substance of Abigail Faulkner's examination as attested by
SIMON WILLARD.

On September 17, 1692, Ann Putnam witnessed that she was "afflicted on the ninth day of August." "Also that on the eleventh day of August during the examination she had been grievously tormented by her or her appearance. Also that she had seen her or her appearance grievously afflict Mary Wallace and Sarah Phelps," etc.

Sworn to before the Grand Jury.

The sentence was delayed in execution through the influence of friends. She was kept in prison thirteen weeks and when released with a general jail delivery was yet legally liable to penalty.

In the year 1700 she presented a petition or memorial to the General Court praying for defacing of this record against her, having received a pardon from Governor Phipps. Her petition says, "The pardon so far had its effect that I am as yet suffered to live but this only as a malefactor, convicted upon record of ye most heinous crimes, which besides its utter ruining and defacing my reputation will certainly expose myself to imminent danger of new accusations which will be ye more readily believed and will remain a perpetual brand of infamy upon my family. I do humbly pray that this high and honorable court will plan to take my case into serious consideration and order the defacing of ye record against me so

Thomas Lamson was a yeoman of Ipswich, Mass. He dealt in real estate, either as grantee or grantor, about a dozen times between 1713 and 1755. Some of these transactions were as follows:

June 11, 1713, Thomas and his brother Samuel sold to Lieut. Thomas Pearly of Boxford, lot No. 40, at a place called Perly that was their father's. December 30.

December 30, 1712, Thomas and Samuel Lamson bought of Wm. Rob and Fr. Quarles about 12 acres in "Vitson's meadow in Ipswich."

March 12, 1729. Thomas Lamson sold Thomas Smith for 50 shillings a thatch lot on Crosses Island.

that I may be freed from the evil consequences thereof." Not until eleven years, and after much petitioning was the attainder taken off. (References: *Records of Salem Witchcraft*, Vol. 2; *History of Andover or Historical Sketches of Andover, Mass.*)

Abigail Faulkner, daughter of the above, wife of Thomas Lamson, when a mere child of eight years of age, was brought before the Magistrates of Salem in the craze of 1692, accused of witchcraft and made to testify that her mother had made her a witch, thereby assisting in that mother's condemnation.

Lieutenant Francis Faulkner was the son of "Mr." Edmund Faulkner, who came to America from Kingscleare, Southampton County, England, and was married in Salem, Mass., Feb. 4, 1657/8, by Mr. John Winthrop, to Dorothy Robinson, the marriage being the first on record of an Andover citizen. He was one of the ten Freeholders required by law to organize the Church there Oct. 24, 1645. He, with Mr. Woodbridge, the first pastor, negotiated the purchase of the Plantation from the Indians. He was one of the few honored with the title of "Mr." In a surprise by Indians, April 18, 1676, "at Edmund Faulkner's they wreaked their vengeance on dumb animals,—they knocked off the horns of a cow, cut out her tongue, and so left her in great misery. They put an horse, an ox and cow into a hovel and then set it on fire."

A journey two hundred years ago from one town to another was made slowly and with many liabilities of delays from Indians, wild beasts, bad roads (if there were any at all), swollen streams, or dangers of being lost in storms or misled by imperfect landmarks of trees, stakes, and stones. "Entertainment for man and beast" was a frequent necessity in these wearisome journeys. The first man in a town frequently took in travelers as a courtesy; thus it often occurred that the Inn-Holder was one of the principal citizens. He was often also a "Vintnor." As the sale of liquor or strong drink to Indians made much trouble, the Court ordered that only the most trustworthy men should be licensed. The first on record to whom this license was granted in Andover was Mr. Edmund Faulkner in 1648. The Inns were frequently the resort for marriage, being the largest houses in the town.

Lieutenant Francis Faulkner's son, Francis, was the Colonel Francis Faulkner who led the Company to the fight at Concord Bridge in 1775. He also commanded the regiment that guarded General Burgoyne's army when prisoners of war.

April 16, 1731. Thomas Lamson for £325 sold Samuel Lampson three pieces of land in Ipswich—containing about sixteen acres.

May, 1732. He sold for £35, 4 acres to John Patch.

May, 1732. He and his wife Abigail for £35 sold Peter Lamson of Ipswich two tracts of land.

December 25, 1733. He sold for £15 in Public Bills of Credit to Sam'l and John Tilton about 10 acres of swampland in Ipswich, "it being part of ye farm commonly known by ye name of Saltonstal's Farm."

July 15, 1730. Thos. Lamson of Ipswich, husbandman, for £1100 bought of James Whipple of Ipswich his "new dwelling hous barn outhouseing orchard and about 70 acres of upland meadow and meadow ground . . . and ye homestead is about 20 acres. . . . a second parcel of land about two acres of pine swamp . . . a third piece of land on the northeasterly side of Black Brook . . . and a fourth parcel of land and meadow about 7 acres . . . bounds southerly upon Mr. Saltonstall's heir's Farm," etc.

March 1, 1754. Sold to John Lampson, Jr., of Ipswich, for 13-6-8, 16 acres of wood land . . . "and Sarah Lampson ye wife of ye said Thomas Lampson doth by these presents freely and willingly give up and surrender all her right and power of thirds in ye premises."

Feb. 25, 1763. Thomas Lamson and (his grandson) Thomas Lamson, Jr., both of Ipswich, yeoman, for 20-10 sold to Solomon Dodge of Topsfield, yeoman, "a certain piece of meadow with a small island in it and lying in the Township of Ipswich containing about six acres . . . at the mouth of a brook known by the name of Phasant Pond Brook where it emties into Ipswich River so-called on the south side of said River . . . to an island Known by the name of Candlewood Island &c." Ruth and Anna, wives of said Thomas and Thomas, Jr., consent to the sale.

Thomas Lamson made his will August 12, 1765, witnessed by Caleb Lamson, Nath'l Adams, Jr., and Paul Dodge, Jr., and a codicil Feb., 1767. It was proved July 27, 1767, he signing it with his mark. He gave to his wife Ruth, among other things

(given in a paper dated just before his death) "all the household goods that she brought with her when I married her." He mentions his children: (1) Abigail, wife of Francis Whipple, Esq., of Westborough; (2) Martha, wife of Abraham Knowlton of Shrewsbury; (3) Sarah, wife of Aaron Forbush of Hardwick; (4) Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Fisk of Hardwick; (5) Thomas Lamson, deceased, who had received half of his real estate by deed, July 8, 1747, and grandchildren Paul and Nathaniel to have the residue, viz.: "All the remainder of my house and other buildings and lands which shall remain after the debts and the above mentioned legacies are paid." Kinsman Ensign Jonathan was appointed executor.

Dower was set off Aug. 24, 1767. Her part of the homestead was the West and lower room, &c., and ten acres of land including a part of Pigeon Hill. Her "thirds" was by the land of Ezekiel and Thomas Adams, and land of a Paul Lamson and by the thirds of the young widow.

In the account of the Executor we find that he sold to Edward Lamson 13½ acres of land, to John Rogers 4 acres and part of the house and to Joseph Bowls part of the barn.*

* Dr. W. J. Lamson of Summit, N. J., has the original of a former will of Thomas Lamson, dated Feb. 20, 1743, in which he mentions wife Abigail, son Thomas (executor), daughters Abigail Whipple, Martha Knowlton, Sarah Lamson and Elizabeth Fisk.

Joseph Lamson was a Cordwainer and lived in Malden, Mass. It is recorded that "Joseph Lamson and wife Hannah were admitted inhabitants of Boston, Jan. 31, 1736." Another record says that "Hannah, widow of Joseph Lamson, and son Benjamin, were admitted inhabitants of Boston."

Joseph Lamson, Sergeant, was on the muster roll of Captain John Shelpe in 1722, and also of Captain Jeremiah Moulton, 1724/5. Also on muster-roll as consign, Nov. 25, 1725, in Captain Joshua Moody's Company.

In the records of York County, Me., we find that Joseph Lamson of Malden buys of John Lane of Gloucester, Essex County, Mass., lands in Casco Bay, Me. (It is to be remembered that Maine was governed by Massachusetts up to 1819, and was called the District of Maine.) We also find record of a deed in

which Aaron Cleveland, Samuel Newhall, Joseph Lampson and Josiah Nichols, of Malden, Mass., with others, grant to Benoy Bogg a tract of land in the Township of North Yarmouth, called Lane's Point (in Casco Bay) Dec. 25, 1732. (*N. E. Hist. & Gen. Reg.*, Vol. 35, p. 382.)

William Lamson removed to Stratford, Conn., about 1717, when he married. He became a large landholder there, and owned a saw-mill, a fulling-mill and a grist-mill. These mills were located on the Pequonock River, in the western section of the Township of Stratford, now the town of Trumbull. He was at first a member of the Congregational Church of Stratford, but at the time of the erection of the Second Episcopal Church edifice, he became a member and pew owner in that church. He is buried in the Old Burial Ground of Christ Church, Stratford.

An old record says (*Stratford Land Record*, Vol. 9, p. 57), "Will^m Lamson, of Stratford, Conn., for parental love to my son Nathaniell Lamson of Stratford," gives land in Stratford, &c., two acres with a new dwelling house thereon standing, March 17, 1745. Received for record March 28, 1746.

Caleb Lamson was, like his brother Nathaniel, a stonemason of Charlestown, Mass. He also lived in Malden, Mass. His wife, Dorothy, "owned the covenant" in Charlestown, Aug. 27, 1721, and was admitted to the Church May 16, 1731. Caleb Lamson was admitted to the Church April 18, 1730/1. On March 25, 1748, he was on the Muster roll, as Sergeant, in Captain John Codman's Company, of Charlestown.

An inventory of his estate, made May 5, 1760, was as follows: House £146, barn £29, mowing land £40, and boat £4. His name was still on the tax list at Charlestown in 1761.

LIEUTENANT JOHN⁴ LAMSON (John,³ John,² William¹), was born at Ipswich, Mass., Nov. 4, 1698, and died there July 5, 1774. He married Elizabeth Day, dau. of John and Elizabeth (Cue) Day. (Int. of m. Dec. 2, 1722.) She was bap. 7/22, 1705; died Feb. 5, 1779, at Topsfield, Mass.

Lieutenant John Lamson was a farmer and lived in Ipswich, Mass. Several families living in Ipswich wanted to be annexed to Topsfield, but the Town of Ipswich opposed their petitions. (*Hist. Essex Co., Mass.*, Vol. II, p. 973.) At last they asked the General Court to grant their request, which was finally granted, Feb. 11, 1774, when it ordered that the families of Joseph Cummings, John Lampson, Israel Clark, Joseph Cummings, Jr., John Lamson, Jr., and Thomas Cummings, with their lands and buildings, be set to the town of Topsfield.

John Lampson of Ipswich, gent., made his will July 20, 1763, and it was proved July 25, 1774. His wife, Elizabeth, was to have the use of the lower room of the east end of the house, etc. He mentions his children Elizabeth Goodhue, Ruth Bradstreet and John Lampson, who was to have the residue and be executor. His son Robert was not mentioned in his will.

PETER⁴ LAMSON (John,³ John,² William¹), was born in Ipswich, Mass., June 20, 1706, and died in Brookfield, Mass., Jan. 7, 1777. Tradition ascribes to him three wives, but there is no record

of the death of his first wife, nor of any marriage except as follows:—married (1) Elizabeth Adams, daughter of Thomas³ (Nathaniel,² William¹) Adams of Ipswich, Mass., at Hamilton, (Ipswich), Mass., April 18, 1728; she was born at Hamilton, June 22, 1707; her death is not recorded; married (2) Mehitable Gould, daughter of Samuel Gould of North Brookfield, Mass. They were published at Brookfield, Mass., March 10, 1754. She was born in 1729, and died in 1780, “the night before Thanksgiving.”

Peter Lamson was a tailor, and resided in Ipswich, Mass., until about 1745, when he removed to North Brookfield, Mass., when he married Mehitable Gould. He was a soldier in North Brookfield in 1748. He is said to have had twenty-three children. The records are somewhat incomplete and confusing.* Mr. Whipple of Ipswich, who left a note book in which some of the early Ipswich records were kept, gives the following:—Peter had Thomas, b. Jan., 1729; Eunes, b. May, 1731; Amos, b. July, 1733; Asa, b. Nov., 1738; Bethiah, b. Feb., 1739, and “a son,” b. March, 1740. *There is a lapse of fourteen years between the birth of his last child by Elizabeth Adams, and his marriage to Mehitable Gould. Some of his descendants say he had “ten,” others “nine” children by his first wife, and “thirteen by the third wife,” several dying when quite young.

Peter Lamson died at Brookfield, on Jan. 7, 1777, and his widow, Mehitable, and oldest son John, were appointed administrators. The appraisal of his estate, made at Brookfield, Feb. 17, 1778, was as follows:—

Mehitable Lamson, widow of Peter, died in 1780, and her oldest son, John Lamson, made the following petition to the Judge of Probate:—

“BROOKFIELD, January 9, 1782.

Sir:—

I would inform your Honour that my Honourd Mother, Mehetable Lamson, has lately deceased, and I suppose that the right of administrator belongs to me, but by reason of a very low state of health, I am utterly unable to attend the business and my own brethern by reason of the distance they live from this place, decline the undertaking.

I would therefore recommend to your Honour, my Brother-in-law, Mr. Solomon Barnes, as a proper person to administer on said estate, and request your Honour would be pleased to grant him letters of administration.

ENSIGN JONATHAN⁴ LAMSON (William,³ John,² William¹), was born at Hamilton, Mass., August 12, 1720, and died there Aug. 16, 1808. He married Anna Dane, daughter of Dr. John Dane of Hamilton, Mass., in 1742. Pub. March 12, 1742. She was born at Hamilton in 1726 and died there August 29, 1791, aged 65 years.

Ensign Jonathan Lamson lived in Hamilton (Ipswich), Mass., and his death was caused by "hot water"—probably scalded to death. His wife Anna joined the Hamilton Church before 1742. He was appointed an Ensign of the "Fifth Company of Foot" in Ipswich, in the Regiment of Col. Samuel Rogers. The following is a copy of his Commission, which was discovered at Windsor Castle, England, in 1875.

"COMMISSION OF ENSIGN JONATHAN LAMSON.

Francis Bernard, Esq., Captain General and Governor in Chief, in and over His Majesty's Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England, and Vice Admiral of the Same.

To JONATHAN LAMPSON, GENTⁿ.

Greeting:

By Virtue of the Power and Authority in and by His Majesty's Royal Commission to Me granted to be Captain General & cover this His Majesty's Province of the Massachusetts Bay aforesaid I do by these Presents (reposing especial Trust and Confidence in your Loyalty, Courage and good Conduct) constitute and appoint you the said Jonathan Lampson to be En-

sign of the fifth Military Company of Foot in the Town of Ipswich whereof Jn. Whipple is Captain and in the Regiment of militia in the County of Essex whereof Samuel Rogers is Colonel.

You are therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the Duty of an Ensign in leading, ordering & exercising said Company in Arms both inferior officers and Soldiers and to keep them in good Order and Discipline and they are hereby commanded to obey you as their Ensign. And you are yourself to observe and follow such orders and Instructions as you shall from time to time, receive from your Captain or other your Superior Officers, according to Military rules and discipline pursuant to the trust reposed in you.

THOMAS⁴ LAMSON (Thomas,³ John,² William¹), was born at Ipswich, Mass., April 8, 1710, and died there August 31, 1751. He married Mary Adams, daughter of Nathaniel and Abigail (Kimball) Adams, Jr., of Ipswich. (Int. of m. Aug. 11, 1732, at Ipswich.) Nathaniel Adams, Jr., was son of Nathaniel² (William¹) and Mercy (Dickinson) Adams, and was born in Ipswich, July 1670, and died Aug. 31, 1736. Abigail Kimball was the daughter of Caleb² (Richard¹) and Anna (Hazeltine) Kimball. The Kimball Coat of Arms is as follows:—*argent*, a lion rampant, *gules* upon a chief *sable*, three crescents of gold. The crest is a lion rampant, holding in the dexter paw a dagger *au propre*. Motto "*Fortis non Ferox*."

Thomas Lamson was a "husbandman" of Ipswich. He joined the church in Hamilton, Feb. 18, 1727. On July 8, 1747, Thomas Lampson (his father) of Ipswich, yeoman, for £250, "Bills of ye new tenor," sold his son Thomas Lampson, Jr., of Ipswich, husbandman, "the full one Half part of my Homstead whereon I now Live which I Bought of James Whipple Bounded as by the said Whipples Deed to me. Referrence thereto being had containing about Fifty acres be the same more or less scituate in Ips. afores^d with the one half of ye Buildings thereon standing."

"Also the one half of my upland and meadow lying in ye Tract of land commonly called Saltonstalls Farm also in said Ipswich."

"Also the full one Half of all my salt marsh & Thatch Ground scituate in ye Hundreds or else where in Ipswich aforesaid."

"Together also with the one half of all my Quick stock & Husbandry utensils of what kind soever together with one half of my common Right in ye thick wood Eighth so called in Ipswich aforesaid July 8, 1747."

Thomas Lamson died intestate, and Mary Lampson, his widow, was appointed administratrix of his estate, Nov. 18, 1751. The inventory, taken Dec. 14, 1751, by Captain Joseph Coming, Solomon Smith and John Lampson, Jr., showed the following:—

The court thereupon appointed you . . . to make partition of the premises accordingly, &c. Dated at Ipswich the 15th. day of June in the 32nd. year of his Majesty's Reign, Annoq 1759.

"They made partition, and laid off to the said Thomas Lamson as his half part of the Homestead and buildings about 35 acres of upland meadow and woodland . . . also the westerly end of Dwelling house to the middle of the chimney right up and down . . . and six foot and nine inches of the westerly end of the cellar under the easterly end of said house, and half the Corn house, to the middle beam right up and down . . . also a garden spot containing about eight rods on the southerly side of the highway aforesaid of the dwelling house . . . and half the well, and to have liberty to pass round the house as his occasion may be. Also a piece of meadow land in the homestead . . . a piece of plow land, meadow and woodland, . . . also the one half of a piece of pasture meadow and woodland called Black Brook . . . &c, also the westerly end of ye meadow that was part of Saltonstall's farm . . . also two and one quarter acres in Chebacco marsh &c . . . with a convenient way through the land of the widow and heirs aforesaid,—all of which is according to our judgment the one half part of the messuage and several pieces of land we were directed and impowered to make partition of &c.

The above division was rec'd and accepted by the Superior Court at Salem, Oct. 24, 1759."

Mary Lamson, widow of Thomas Lamson, married Robert Potter. (Int. of m. Oct. 11, 1760, at Ipswich, Mass.), and her son, Thomas Lamson, sold to Caleb Lamson, of Ipswich, Oct. 28, 1768, all his rights to "the Thirds of my mother Mary Potter's (Potter's) Estate, both real and personal."

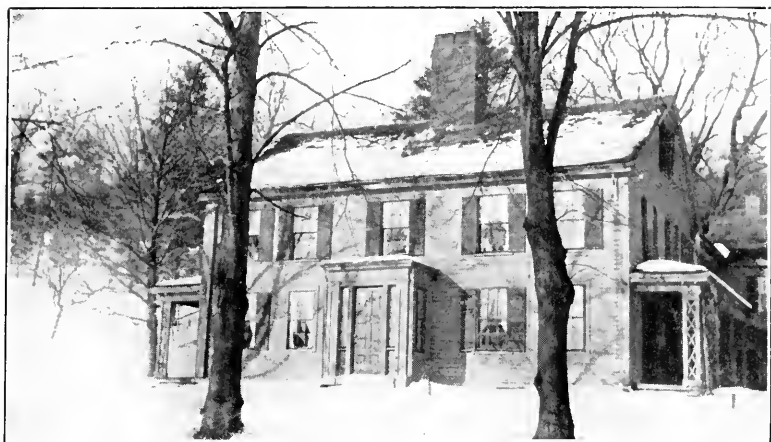

REV. JOSEPH⁴ LAMSON (William,³ Joseph,² William¹), was born at Stratford, Conn., March 28, 1718, and died in Fairfield, Conn., in 1773. He is believed to have been buried in Burial Hill Cemetery, Fairfield, where his wife and oldest daughter were buried, but there is nothing to mark his grave. He married (1) Alithea Wetmore, daughter of Rev. James and Anna (Dwight) Wetmore, of Rye, N. Y., July 26, 1747, at Rye, N. Y.; she was born in 1722, and died at Fairfield, Conn., Feb. 8, 1766; married (2) to Mary —; she died very suddenly Jan. 26, 1788, aged 66 years.

Rev. Joseph Lamson was graduated from Yale College in 1741. In 1744 he went to England to take Holy Orders. He returned to America in 1745. The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts appointed him as an assistant to the Rev. Mr. Wetmore, the missionary at Rye, N. Y. In 1747 he succeeded Rev. Mr. Caner as rector of the church at Fairfield, Conn. He also officiated at intervals at Ridgefield and Norwalk, Conn. The Episcopalians at Stratfield (now Bridgeport) had become so numerous that they proceeded under the guidance of Mr. Lamson, in 1748, to erect a house of worship which was called St. John's Church. (*Beardsley's History of the Episcopal Church in Connecticut.*)

He was an able and accomplished scholar and a devoted and enthusiastic churchman, and was greatly beloved among his people.

He received the degree of M. A. from King's College in 1773. He continued to reside at Fairfield until his death. His will, dated June 1, 1773, and proved Sept. 7, 1773, mentions his

wife Mary, Esther the wife of Stephen Hoyt, Anna, wife of Samuel Belden, and sons William and John, and daughters Elizabeth and Alithea Lamson. Inventory of his estate was £860. His library contained over 170 volumes, of which a considerable number related to medicine.

NATHANIEL⁴ LAMSON (Willam,³ Joseph,² William¹) was born at Stratford, Conn., Jan. 28, 1720, and died there in 1802. He married Tabitha Hawley, daughter of Nathaniel Hawley. She was Baptised at Stratford, Conn., Oct. 11, 1724, and died there July 8, 1815.

Nathaniel Lamson lived in Stratford, Conn. On March 28, 1746, William Lamson deeded for parental love, to his son Nathaniel two acres of land with a new dwellinghouse thereon standing. This house remained in the Lamson family for a number of generations, and is now (1906) in the possession of Mr. Nathan B. Middlebrook. It stands on the north side of the old King's Highway, just above the R. R. crossing, and near one of the Franklyn mile stones. He and his brother John were equal owners of their father's mill property on the Pequannock River. Upon the death of his brother John, in 1778, his brother's widow sold to him for £384-10s her interest in the Grist Mill.

John Lampson of Topsfield, "advanced in age," made his will March 11, 1784, and it was proved Nov. 6, 1797. CAPTAIN THOMAS⁵ LAMSON (Peter,⁴ John,³ John,² William¹), was born at North Brookfield, Mass., Dec. 9, 1762, and died at West Randolph, Vt., April 5, 1830. He married Anna Martin, daughter of Gideon and Rachel (Heath) Martin, May 12, 1785, at Randolph, Vt.; she was born at Hampden, Conn., Jan., 1767, and died at Randolph, Vt., April 29, 1849.

Captain Thomas Lamson spent the early part of his life in Brookfield, Mass. He was a private in Col. Denny's Regiment in Claverack, Mass., in 1779, and was discharged the same year. He reenlisted under Ensign Miller in the 6th Massachusetts Regiment of Springfield, Mass., June 30, 1780, and was discharged Dec. 18, 1780. He was present at the execution of Major Andre, the spy, Oct. 2, 1780. He had a pension, No. 20402. The *Historic Souvenir of Randolph, Vt.*, published in 1895 says of him: "He was one of a family of 23 children, whose father married three times. Of this family at least two brothers enlisted from Brookfield, Mass., in the Continental Army and served as Revolutionary soldiers. Thomas was in service six months, from July 1, 1780, to Dec. 1780, and again early in 1781.

Two of the brothers, Samuel and Thomas, came to Vermont in 1785, and Thomas Lamson, the progenitors of the Randolph Lamsons settled in Randolph, Vt., while his brother Samuel went to Windsor, Vt. It is recorded that Thomas Lamson, while journeying to Middlebury, Vt., from Randolph, with an ox-sled, met on the way two men with axes on their shoulders. He

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DR. JOHN⁵ LAMSON (William,⁴ William,³ John,² William¹), married Elizabeth Olden, daughter of John and Alice (Leavitt) Olden; she was born April 30, 1739, and died before 1797. We have no record of his birth or death, but he died before January 12, 1775, when an Inventory of his estate was recorded, showing valuation of £328-14-1.

The following petition, from the New Hampshire State Papers (Vol. XI., p. 652) shows that he was an army surgeon, in a New Hampshire regiment, in 1757, in an expedition sent to Fort William Henry against the Indians:

“To his Excellency, Benning Wentworth Esq. Captain General, Govenor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over His Majesty’s Province of New Hampshire;

To the Hon’ables, his Majesty’s council and House of Representatives for said Province convened in General Assembly, 26 Dec., 1758.

The Petition of John Lamson of Exeter, in said Province, Surgeon, most humbly sheweth that on the 20th. day of June, 1757, your petitioner was employed by the Hon’able committee of Wars as Surgeon mate to the N. H. regiment, then on the Canada expedition, and accordingly proceeded with a part of said regiment to Fort William Henry, where your petitioner, after a siege of seven days was taken prisoner by the Cohnewagoe

Indians and carried into Canada, where he remained a prisoner for about the space of 4 months, and was then transported to several parts of France, and from thence to Plymouth in England, where your Petitioner took Passage in the Norwich, Man of War, and arrived at Boston the 7th. day of October last, and got home on the 12th. of the same month.

That the said Indians striped your petitioner of his clothes and other things, an Inventory of which is herewith exhibited. That in the time of your petitioners captivity he had the Small Pox in Quebec, and the Nervous Fever in France, both which were very chargable and expensive, as well as very grievous and distressing, with many other scenes of difficulties and troubles too tedious to be here Enumerated.

Wherefore your petitioner most humbly prays your Excellency and Honour to take his case and condition under your wise consideration, and Grant him such Relief and in such way and manner as your Excellency and Honour in your great Wisdom and wonted clemency shall see fit.

And your petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray, &c.

Signed JOHN LAMSON."

He was allowed £160, new tenor bills, as damages.

The following account of his life is taken from *The Autobiography of Capt. Zachary G. Lamson*, published by W. B. Clarke Co., Boston. This book gives his Diary, covering a period from 1797 to 1814.

He says: "In my early years I was kept at school in town (Beverly), and at fourteen years of age studied the Latin Grammar, Trigonometry and the Elements of Navigation. My father did not wish to send me to sea, but it was my constant wish to follow a seafaring life." His father finally consented and in Nov., 1797, he embarked on board the *Essex*, bound for Havana, in capacity of cabin boy. On their first voyage they were nearly shipwrecked, but finally reached their destination. He made many foreign voyages,—in the brig *Mars* of Salem, the schooner *Rachel* of Beverly, the schooner *Wells* of Salem, and many others. The boy rose by being always competent to take a higher position, and by the time he was twenty-one, he had attained his first ambition and was captain of the vessel. What that meant in those days it is hard for us to understand. He left his home port perhaps with a cargo valued at \$100,000 and his instructions from the owner for the voyage might not cover half a sheet of note paper. When the captain had crossed the bar and was on the open sea he was his own master, free to sail wherever and buy whatever he wished. That he was personally brave goes without saying, for he had not only to manage his crew, and face the ordinary perils of the deep, but from 1800 to 1825 not a vessel left port but ran the danger of a piratical attack. Capt. Lamson's diary is filled with the most exciting adventures of this sort. Wrecked when a mere boy on Cape Cod, and in mature life on the "Blue Caicos," alternately a prisoner on French and English war-ships, twice captured by pirates, and three times beating them off, following his fortune in South America with alternate success and failure, Captain Lamson played the game of commerce for all it was worth; but the cards were stacked against him, and when he died in the delirium of fever in Granada, Central America, at the age of sixty-three, he was poor in all but experience.

He is described as a handsome portly man, with curly hair and laughing blue eyes. He was a thorough sailor and a competent navigator. He was generous almost to prodigality, and made and lost large sums with equal facility. He was of an ambitious, optimistic temperament, a good father and a kind friend.

The following obituary notice was written by Mr. Daniel Knowles of Schoharie: "He was a genial, pleasant man in his intercourse with others, a true friend and a man of highest sense of honor,

whose word was as good as his bond. He was born in the state of Connecticut, and commenced life very poor, at the age of ten being obliged to work out for his board. The scenes of poverty were thus early impressed upon his mind, but by industry, economy and sound judgment in the management of his business and financial affairs he acquired immense wealth, and at his death was the richest man in Schoharie County.

"In his money matters he was the very soul of honor, as he never took advantage of any person, and was lenient to those who were indebted to him, especially if they were in any way embarrassed. With all his wealth he retained to a certain extent the same economical mode of life that necessity had imposed upon him in his early days, but was by no means parsimonious. For many years he had appropriated \$1,500 per year in annuities to distant poor. His funeral was held in the Methodist Church at Gallupville, Rev. T. Dwight officiating."

His estate was estimated at about a quarter of a million dollars. He never was married, and his estate was appointed by will among a large number of relatives, his nephews and nieces and their children. His grave is in Locust Cemetery, Greenville, Greene County, N. Y.

From 1832 to 1833 he was Principal of the Abbott Female Seminary at Andover, Mass. As a teacher he was held in great esteem and respect. On Christmas day, 1833, he received a large bible from his pupils, on the fly leaf of which is the following letter.

“Andover, December 25, 1833.

BELOVED TEACHER,

Please accept this bible as a token of affection and respect from your pupils. May you be encouraged in your labors of love by the promise contained in that sacred work that he who turneth many souls to righteousness shall shine as a star in the kingdom of heaven.

Your grateful pupils,

In behalf of the school,

HARRIETTE N. WOODS.”

He entered the Andover Theological Seminary and was graduated from there in 1835. His first pastorate was at Brighton, Mass. (1837-1841), where he preached in the Congregational Church. He also lived and preached in Tewkesbury, Mass. (1844-1846), and Nashua, N. H. (1846-1848). About this time his health became poor, and he gave up a regular pastorate. He supplied a pulpit for a time in Tewkesbury and North Reading, Mass. (1849-1851). In 1851 he was obliged to give up preaching and went to Brooklyn, N. "I loved him, as all men did, as a comrade—a nature altogether love-worthy, with something of the very grace of Christ upon it. For but five years he had been pastor here. But what a five years, and what a pastor! How tactful, wise, noble, fruitful! Dr. Lamson possessed a fraternal mind, full of good nature and good humor. The word for him is brother. Large in frame he was larger still in sympathy, strong in a healthy helpfulness, a man of cheer when, upon the retirement of the most distinguished man and orator in the Congregational Commission in this land from his position as President of the American Board of Foreign Missions, Dr. Lamson was unanimously elected to fill that difficult and important post, he was found ready and adequate, and his selection was immediately and amply justified. With a mind as fine in its poise as it was firm in its grasp, he instantly and successfully responded to whatever task was laid upon him. And yet the finest thing in him was his spirituality.

During these later years I had occasion often to meet him, and to meet him, however casually, was not only to be freshly charmed by his singular urbanity, but to be inspired by the deeper impression that this rare grace was the very grace of Christ Himself within him and upon him."

Although he might be called by some a "Jack of all Trades," he was also a master of many. He was educated in the Hopkinton and Fryeburg Academies, and studied medicine at the Dartmouth Medical School, and afterwards at the University of New York, where he took his degree of M. D., March 4, 1857. He settled in Fryeburg, Me. He early became a member of the Maine Medical Association, and was examining surgeon for pensions nearly up to the time of his death.

Dr. Lamson had a lucrative practice, and attended to it faithfully. Despite his mechanical talent he never neglected a patient for any pet invention. He was highly thought of everywhere within fifty miles of his town as an excellent and faithful surgeon and physician. He wrote several papers of interest, the best one of these being "Aphasia from Brain Injury," Maine Medical Association, 1882. He was often chosen a visitor to the Medical School of Maine.

He was a born inventor, and had he not adopted medicine as his profession he would have made his fortune, for with his own hands he invented a working steam engine, a double stitch sewing machine (long before such things were ever patented) and a mowing machine with which he lost a fortune by neglecting to get a patent.

He improved the telephone and was an expert electrician. For several years he kept the town clock wound up and in constant repair, climbing the tall tower for that purpose.

He was the leader of the village band, and a teacher of each instrument. He was the originator and took care of all the waterworks. Besides all this, he invented several surgical instruments, among them an automatic vaccinator, which is still in use in times of threatened epidemics. He was an ingenious man, and when he died from an apoplectic stroke it seemed as if the whole village ceased to live or breathe.

John Sawyer Lamson received his early education in the schools of Nashua, N. H. In 1850 he resided in North Reading, Mass., but was in business in Salem, Mass., with the firm of Phillips, Goodhue and Bowker, importing merchants in the East India trade.

In 1851 he removed to Brooklyn, N. Y., and entered into business with his uncle, George W. Lamson, who was an importer of varnish gums, at 14 South William St., New York City. A few years later he started in business for himself, as a gum merchant, and in 1860, with his brother, Edwin Lamson, he founded the firm of John S. Lamson & Bro., importers of African and South American products, at 77 Maiden Lane, New York, and this firm continued in business at this address for fifty years. They were largely interested also in asphaltum and manganese. At one time Mr. Lamson had control of a large collection of prehistoric pottery, thousands of pieces of which were taken from the ancient graves of Chiriqui, Panama. He sold part of them to the Smithsonian Institute, at Washington, D. C., and part to the Peabody Museum at Yale University, and other Museums.

In June 15, 1859, he married Mary Hart Hunter, daughter of the Rev. John Hart Hunter. Mr. Hunter was a graduate of Union College, Schenectady, N. Y., in 1825, and while a student there he founded the first chapter of the Kappa Alpha Fraternity, which has since grown to be one of the most prominent Societies in American college life. He held pastorates in the Congregational churches of Fairfield, Conn., West Springfield, Mass., Shrewsbury, N. J., and Bridgeport, Conn. He died at Galveston, Texas, Feb. 22, 1872. Miss Hunter's mother, Julia Maria (Judson) Hunter, was a daughter of Daniel Judson, of Stratford, Conn., who was a descendant of William Judson, who came to this country in 1634 from Kirby Moorside, North Riding, Yorkshire, England. She (Julia M. (Judson) Hunter) was born in Stratford, Conn., Jan. 11, 1811, and died at the age of 94, in New York City, on Oct. 14, 1905.

He received his early education in the schools of Boxford, Mass., and New York City, and also at Phillips Academy, Andover, Mass. He entered business in New York with his uncle, George Whitfield Lamson, who was an importer of gums. In 1860 he formed a partnership with his brother, John Sawyer Lamson, under the firm name of John S. Lamson and Bro., at 77 Maiden Lane, New York City. They were importers of African and South American products, gums, ivory nuts, pearl shells, etc., and later manganese and asphaltum. On the death of his brother, in 1883, Edwin Lamson carried on the business by himself, but under the same firm name. The business continued at the same place, 77 Maiden Lane, New York, for fifty years. He assisted in the development and control of various mines of bitumen and manganese in Mexico, Central America and the West Indies.

During the development of mines in Central America, he and his brother became interested in the prehistoric graves in the

forests of Chiriqui, Panama, and through their efforts the first excavations were made to secure the ancient pottery and gold ornaments contained in these tombs. The results of their important work are shown in the collections of these antiquities in the Peabody Museum of Yale University, the Smithsonian Institute at Washington, the British Museum, and in the complete Lamson Collection retained by the family in Summit, N. J.

Mr. Lamson was an active member of Dr. Howard Crosby's Presbyterian Church, in New York City, for many years. He was a man of sterling character, strong personality and reserve. Outside of a successful business career his life was devoted to a wide sphere of unostentatious philanthropy. He was a deep reader, and interested in an extensive variety of subjects. Among these was genealogy, and it was he to whom credit is due for the inception of the work which has resulted in the publication of this book.

He was unmarried. He resided in New York City until 1908, when failing health compelled him to give up active business, and he lived with his nephew, Dr. William J. Lamson, in Summit, N. J. He died at Loomis, N. Y., June 20, 1914, and was buried in Boxford, Mass.

He superintended the equipping and arming of the *Gettysburg*, of which he received command. He towed in the powder ship which was exploded under the walls of Fort Fisher in the first attack and led a naval division of the assault when the Fort was finally taken Jan. 15, 1865. At the close of the War he was appointed Flag Lieutenant, on the staff of Admiral Goldsborough, the first American Admiral to visit Europe, being promoted over thirty officers who antedated him in commission on the recommendation of five admirals. He resigned in 1866. He returned to Portland, Ore., in 1870, and was County Clerk from 1873-4, being also Professor of Mathematics at Pacific University. He was Clerk of the United States Court in Portland, Ore., for seventeen years, resigning in 1894. He was placed on the Naval Retired List. The *New York Evening Sun* of Aug. 22, 1908, says:
