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INTRODUCTION.

IT is, perhaps, not too much to say that the family of Gresley of Drakelowe is one of the few families which remain that can boast of being settled at the same place and of possessing the same lands which were assigned to their ancestor in the *Domesday Record*. Its founder was Nigel de Toeni, called in *Domesday* "de Stafford", and subsequently from the place which he made his principal residence, "de Gresley", who, with his brothers Robert and Ralph, was among the followers of William the Conqueror into England. Their father, Roger de Toeni, Standard Bearer of Normandy, was descended from an uncle of Rollo, Duke of Normandy, and thus being of kin with their victorious leader, when the spoils were divided the three brothers received shares not inappropriate to their rank and position. Robert settling in Stafford, and called on that account "de Stafford", was the ancestor of that family of Stafford of which Humphrey was created Duke of Buckingham by Henry VI; Ralph was the ancestor of the Cliffords, and Nigel, to whom were allotted Drakelowe and eleven lordships in Derbyshire, with Morton and Kingsley in Staffordshire, taking up his abode at Gresley, in which township Drakelowe was, became the ancestor of the family of "de Gresley", of which Sir Robert Gresley, 11th Baronet, is the present representative.

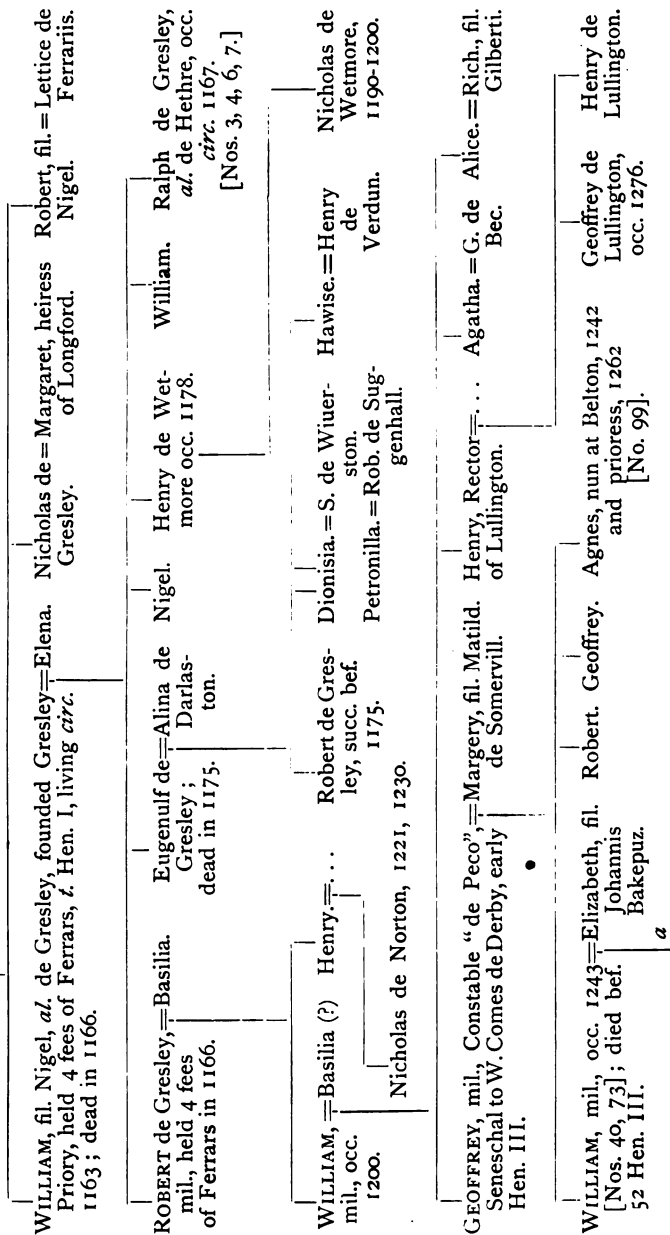
At Gresley, thenceforth to be called Castle Gresley, William, Nigel's son, in the time of Henry I, built a castle, and near the castle founded a small priory of Black Canons of the order of St. Augustine. Other hamlets, in addition to Drakelowe, in the township of Gresley were Swadlingcote and Linton.

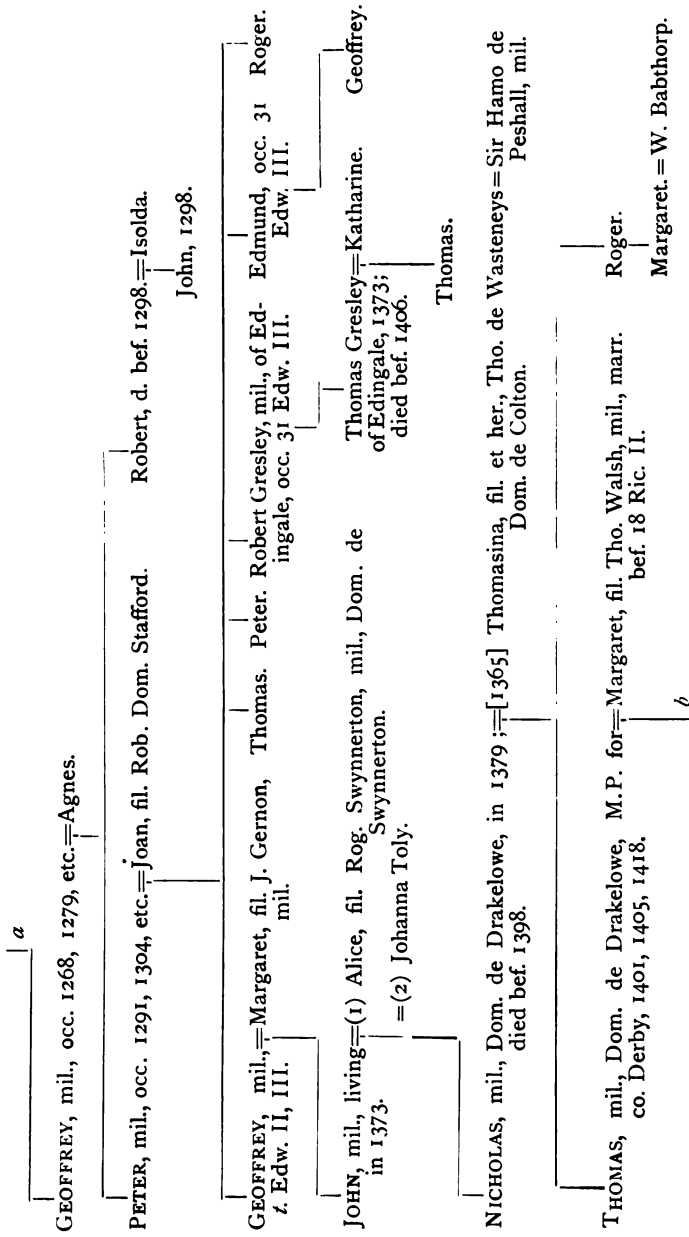
Besides William, Nigel had two sons, of whom Nicholas, marrying Margaret, the heiress of Longford, became the ancestor of the Longfords, and Robert, if we may conclude from a joint grant to Merivale Abbey, married Lettice de Ferrariis.

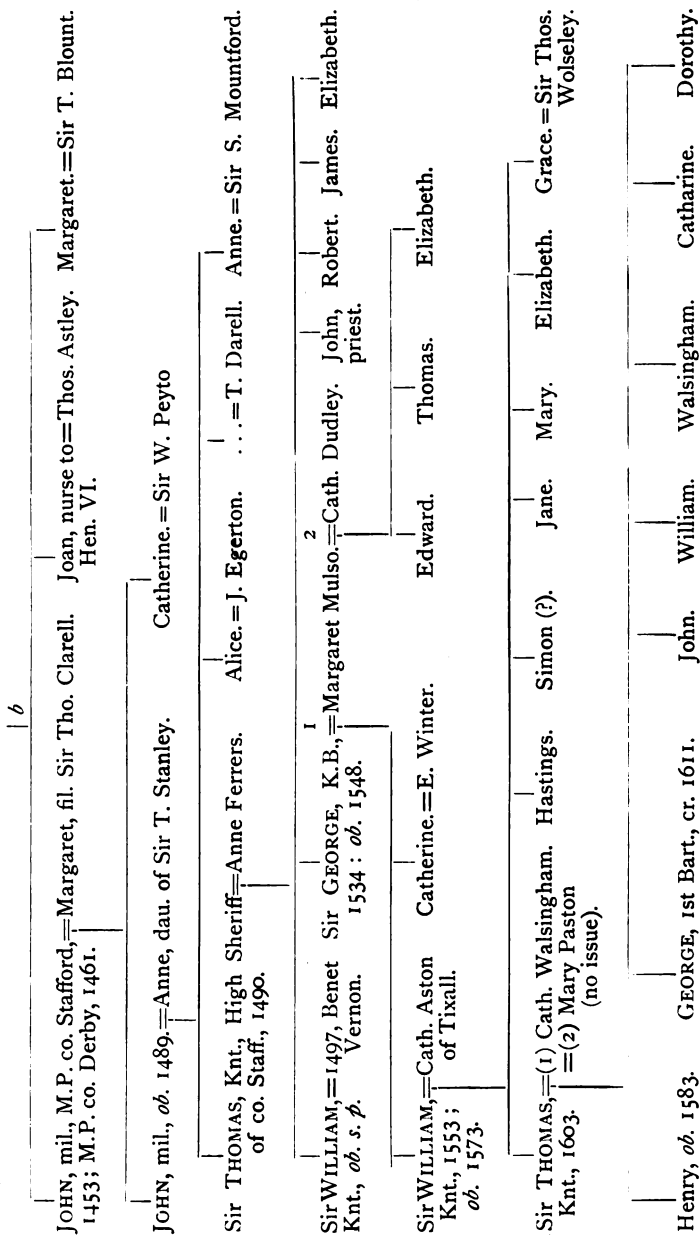
The accompanying pedigree has been compiled from the following sources, viz. (a) Nichols's *History of Leicestershire*, (b) Erdeswick's *Survey, etc., of Staffordshire* (several editions), (c) Pilkington's *View of Derbyshire*, ed. 1789, (d) The MS. in the Chetham Library, Manchester, known as the Gresley Chartulary, of which a short account will be found below, (e) a MS. pedigree by Eyton in Brit. Mus. Add. MS., 31,940, f. 211*b*, and (f) the Deeds in the present volume. It has, it is feared, some suspicious points about it, but it corrects a few errors made by Nichols, and goes to prove that the exhaustive account of the family given by Dr. Harwood in his additions to Erdeswick is considerably at fault; but we do not quite agree with Mr. Pym Yeatman, the learned and latest historian of Derbyshire, of whose work, unfortunately, only a few parts are yet printed, when he says that "the Gresley pedigree, like so many others, has been built up upon assumptions". Of his promise, however, to "test the truth of it" we wish a speedy fulfilment. It has been thought sufficient to carry it down to the creation of the baronetcy in 1611.

As far, however, as the present deeds are concerned, a very large majority relate to lands at Seal in Leicestershire. This place, variously spelt Sheile, Sheyle, Scheyle, etc., is divided into two townships, namely, Nether Seal, *al.* Great Seal, *al.* Church Seal, and Over Seal, *al.* Little Seal, *al.* Spital Seal. At the time of the general survey seven ploughlands in Scella and six ploughlands in another Scela were held by Robert under Henry de Ferrars. In the time of Henry I-II Nether Seal was held by a family which took its name from the place, and we find [No. 3] that about 1167 Ralph de Seila, with the sanction of his lord, William, Earl of Ferrars, sold the mill there with

four virgates to Ralph, fil. Will. de Gresle. By the time the Testa de Neville was compiled, the whole of both lordships had come to William de Ferrars, Earl of Derby, under whose fee it there occurs. From the time of that first acquisition by Ralph de Gresley, the family has possessed lands in Seal till the present century.

Other places where the Gresleys had possessions, of which many transactions are recorded in this volume, are Donisthorpe, which is partly in Leicestershire and partly in Derbyshire and Colton in Staffordshire. The former is found held by Nigel de Stafford in *Domesday*, while the latter was acquired on the marriage, in about 1365, of Sir Nicholas de Gresley with Thomasine, Domina de Colton, the heiress of the Wasteneys family. The Gresleys held land there as early as 1342 [cf. No. 256], though the principal Colton lordship came to the family as above described. A very excellent account of Colton has been written by Rev. F. P. Parker, Rector of Colton since 1874, and to it the present writer is much indebted for information on this part of the Gresley history. These deeds add but little to what he modestly calls "Some Account of Colton and of the De Wasteneys Family", but No. 400A seems to settle the very small point of a rector's name which is wrongly given in the Lichfield Registers.

Collections like the present one are usually expected with some reason, to supply particular information as to the Religious Houses of the locality. The compilers of Dugdale's *Monasticon Anglicanum* had not often the facilities or the time to examine original evidence, and though much additional matter has been collected by modern editors of county and parochial histories, there is plenty of material in the muniment rooms of our ancient families as yet untouched, and only awaiting the fortunate student who, by whatever means, is able to gain access to them. Nor is the collection now under notice altogether disappointing in this respect, for the deeds give considerable particulars concerning two religious foundations,

Merivale Abbey, co. Warwick, and Gresley Priory. Henry de Ferrars who, according to the *Domesday Record*, held lands in fourteen counties, his chief possessions being in Derbyshire, where he held 114 manors, founded Merivale in the thirteenth year of Stephen. The earliest mention of it recorded herein is the confirmation of a grant of 120 acres of land by Ralph de Seila [cf. No. 1], and early in the time of Henry II a Gresley grants to the abbey for the salvation of the souls of his brothers, his wife, and his lord. From this time records of similar transactions are constant.

Of Gresley Priory, Dugdale's editors confessedly knew but little. The foundation is merely recorded, and no list of Priors is given. The Priory Seal was unknown to them. A later historian, the Rev. J. C. Cox, the well-known author of *Notes on the Churches of Derbyshire*, has collected much information about this House, and has compiled the following list of Priors, which is now further supplemented from the present volume, the additional particulars being included in square brackets :—

The patronage or right of appointing to the office of Prior rested with the founder's family, and Nos. 402A-C record the proceedings incident on the death of a Prior in 1420, and the submitting of two names by the Canons to the head of the family, Sir Thomas Gresley, who is here called "patronus et noster legitimus advocatus", for him to select one.

Attention is called to the seal of the Priory attached to Deed No. 76, probably the only one in existence. For the following description I am indebted to my learned colleague, Mr. W. de Gray Birch. It represents St. George, the patron saint of the Priory, in a hauberk of mail, with continuous coif and *nasale* and a flowing surcoat; in his right hand a lance-flag, with square banner and three wavy streamers, held almost horizontally and extending across the shield into the inscription, and in his left hand a long convex, kite-shaped shield, of which only half is shown, charged apparently with an escarbuncle of eight rays. The legend, when complete, seems to have been SIGILLVM ; SANCTI ; GEORGII ; DE ; GRESELE. The Prior, as is usual, has impressed his own seal on the reverse. It bears a half-length figure of the Virgin holding the Child on the left arm, overhead a star, in her right hand a *fleur-de-lys* on a stalk; in the field over the Child's head a crescent moon. The representation of St. George as an armed warrior is curious and probably unique.

Mention should be made of the manuscript known and often quoted as "The Gresley Chartulary". By the kindness of the authorities of the Chetham Library, Manchester, it has been lent to me, but on a careful examination I cannot help thinking that its importance has been somewhat magnified. A full account of it was published in *The Reliquary*, vol. vi, ed. L. Jewitt in 1865, in an article communicated by Mr. John Harland, F.S.A., in which he relates what, he states, "may almost be called the discovery of the Chartulary", lost as it had apparently been in the covers of a Lancashire Visitation. But Nichols, the

historian of Leicestershire, quotes copiously from it, and Canon Raine, who collated the Visitation with the original MS. in the Heralds' College, and published it for the Chetham Society in 1850, could scarcely have missed it.

Perhaps the reason of its being where it is may be explained in this way. There was, as is well known, a family of Grelli or Grellet, rarely, if ever correctly, called Greslet, settled in Lancashire, and it was anciently thought that this family and the Derbyshire Gresleys were one and the same. That this was an erroneous idea has been satisfactorily shown by more than one in later times, and there is no occasion here to re-open the question, but it may account for the existence of Gresley evidences in a Lancashire MS.

The Visitation is that of Wm. Flower, Norroy King of Arms, made in 1567, but there are proofs that the MS. belonged afterwards to William Smith, Rouge Dragon *temp.* Jas. I, a Cheshire antiquary, and it is possible that the Gresley additions were made by his direction. They were not actually made by him, as the handwriting has been compared with his copy of the Visitation which is now in the British Museum.

Besides some rough sketches of the Gresley and Wasteneys or Gasteneys families (which Mr. Harland, by the way, prints Castleneys), it contains abstracts of about three hundred deeds relating to those families. There is a certain chronological arrangement, but the undated deeds, which are generally the most important, do not seem to have much, if any, logical sequence. The dated deeds are arranged under the king's reigns, the last one bearing the date of 2, 3 Philip and Mary. There are, in addition, some genealogical notes scattered about which have been useful in elucidating the family descent. The compilation cannot be much earlier than 1600.

Of a very different character and value is the Rydeware Chartulary, of which a detailed description is appended to the present catalogue. The rubric at the beginning gives

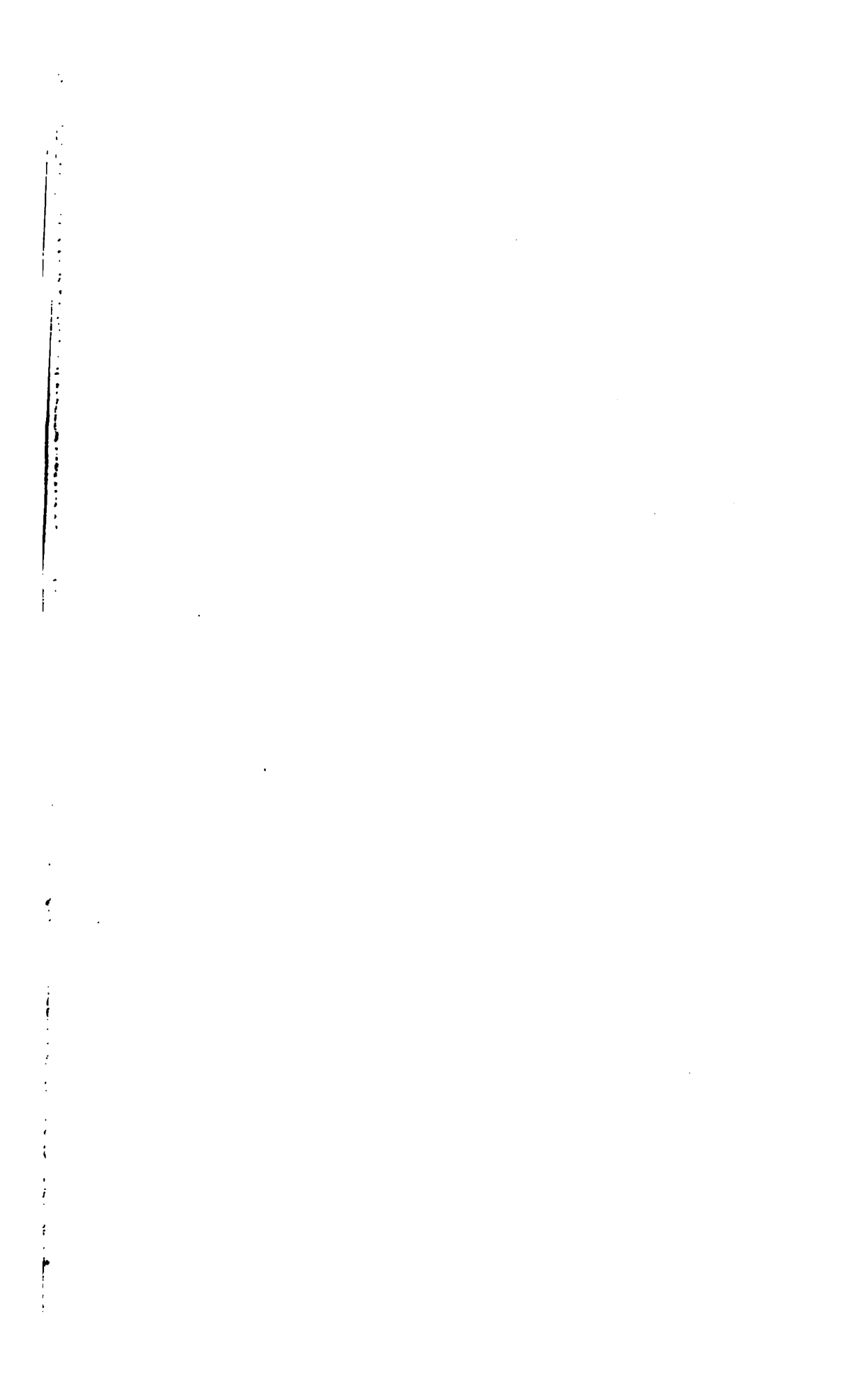
the date of it as 2 Edw. II, and states that it was made by the direction of Thomas, son and heir of Walter de Rydeware, and that it contains an account of all his possessions in Rydeware, Seal, Frilsham, Kettlebaston, and Rossington. During Thomas's lifetime (he was living in 1326) additions were made from time to time, the latest date apparently being 1331, and the scope of the contents is much wider than the modest rubric leads one to suppose. Its pages are illustrated by several neatly-executed pen-and-ink drawings generally characteristic of the deeds which they adorn, interspersed with a few grotesques. With regard to the drawing which has been reproduced opposite page 119, I am inclined to think that the meaning of it is somewhat different from that ascribed to it by Miss Gresley (cf. p. 119). It is suggested that it is rather a procession to judgment or to execution than a return from hunting. The criminal is the hound suspended by his legs from the axe, the instrument of execution, carried by a hare in charge, and followed by a second hare with herald's trumpet and official mace. The victim is the cock upon the spit borne at one end by a fox (who has, perhaps, volunteered his services as one who could have no possible sympathy with such a crime as poultry-snatching, and glad, at any rate, to assist in the violent end of his natural enemy, the hound) leading a brace of greyhounds in leash, and at the other end by a tailless ape in charge of the guilty hound's sorrowing companion. A third hare, ready with bow and arrows for any emergency, brings up the rear and completes the picture. The illustration has nothing to do with the deed of covenant above it, the latter having been squeezed into a vacant place by one of the later scribes.

Among the more interesting of the later Gresley Deeds are the following, *viz.*, No. 363, a bill of complaints by Burton Abbey against Sir Thomas de Gresley (*temp.* Rich. II); No. 437, an award by Humphrey, Duke of Buckingham, in the disputes between the Gresleys and the

Vernons, which contains a peculiar scale of compensation for wounds inflicted in a *melee* between their men (1455); No. 475, an award by Cardinal Wolsey in a suit between the "bastard sons" of Sir W. Gresley (who died without legitimate offspring), and Sir George his brother and heir (1525); No. 480, a deed of release by Anne of Cleves, the divorced wife of Henry VIII, bearing her signature (1551); and Nos. 497, 499, settlements of suits between the Pagets of Beaudesert and Sir Thomas Gresley, second Bart., respecting the weir and fulling-mill at Burton-on-Trent (1656, 1676).

1. CONFIRMATION by Robert, Bishop of Lincoln, of the grant by Ralph de Seila to Merivale Abbey, of a hundred and twenty acres of land, with wood, meadow, pastures, and common of pasture. Witnesses: Mag. Robert de Burnam; Mag. Peter; Mag. Ralph; William de Bugend', capellanus; Roger, fil. Willelmi; and Laurence. With episcopal seal, chipped. [1148-1166.]

2. GRANT by Bernard, Abbot, and the Convent of Burton-on-Trent, to Robert de Gresele, of the land of Derl' [Darlaston-by-Stone, co. Stafford], to hold in fee, and heritage each year, for fifty-two shillings; and of the service of Ralph de Caldewalle, for five shillings to be paid yearly, and for the free service of his body: half the rent to be paid at the Feast of St. John Bapt. [24 June], and half at the Feast of St. Martin [11 Nov.]. In return for this grant Robert and his heirs owe homage and fealty to the Abbot and Church of Burton. Witnesses: *First*, the chapter itself—Jordan, prior; Martin, William de Duninton, Richard, Richard, Richard, William, William, and the rest of the monks. *Next*, Robert, priest of Staph [Stapenhill]; William de Grochesham; Nicholas, chaplain; Walter de Sumervill; Walter de Muntgumbere, etc. Seal of the Abbey: *Obverse*, a saint, probably the Virgin,

NOTIFICATION to the Bishop of Lincoln by Ralph de Gresele,¹ of his grant to Merivale Abbey of a carucate of land which he holds in Seal from Ralph de Seile at an annual rent of two shillings, which grant he made for the salvation of the souls of his brothers, his wife, of Earl Rodbert de Ferrariis [ob. 1158?], and of others, "ut Deus omnipotens nobis omnibus remittat peccata nostra et tribuat vitam eternam." Witnesses: Rodbert de Gresele, and Henry his brother; Rodbert de Curecun; William de Mungumeri; Rodbert, fil. 5. SIMILAR GRANT, differently worded, of the same piece of land. Witnesses: the same as in No. 4. With similar seal.

6. NOTIFICATION to —, ² Bishop of Lincoln, by Ralph de Seila of his confirmation of the grant by Ralph de Greseleia, made to Merivale Abbey of a carucate of land which he held from the said Ralph de Seila at an annual rent of two shillings. He makes this confirmation with consent of his lord, William, Comes de Ferrariis, and of Ralph his own heir, and for the souls of himself, his heirs, and of his lord, Robert, Comes de Ferrariis, and grants to the Abbey pasture for a hundred sheep and twelve beasts, "excepto numero ovium et animalium que antea habebant in elemosina mea in Seila". Witnesses: William, Comes de Ferrariis; Philip, prior de Lentona; Robert and Henry de Gresele; Philip, clericus; Walter, capellanus; Henry, fil. Fuch'; Thomas de Aucheuill'; Sawal, fil. Fuch';

NOTIFICATION to —, ¹ Bishop of Lincoln, and all the sons of Holy Church, by William, Comes de Ferrariis, of his confirmation of the grant by Ralph de Seila and Ralph de Greseleia to Merivale Abbey, of a carucate of land which Ralph de Greseleia held from Ralph de [Seila]. Witnesses: Henry, fil. Fuch'; Thomas de Aucheuill; Philip, clericus; William, fil. Hereberti; Robert de Greseleia, and Henry his brother; William, fil. Hugonis; Hugh de Thorendona. Temp. Hen. II.

8. AWARD by A[dam], Abbot of Evesham, and L[Laurence], Prior of Coventry, arbitrators nominated by the Pope, in a suit between the monks of Wenlock and William, clericus, concerning the church of St. Peter of Seal, namely, that the said William may possess the church "in perpetuum", paying to the church of St. Milburg, of Wenlock, eight shillings and fourpence yearly. Witnesses: Simon, Abbot of Persoure [Pershore]; Mag. Hugh de Coleham; Richard de Amberesleg'; Mag. Ernald de Bukingham; Matthew, clericus; Lucian de Seila; Roger de Strettun; Robert de Seila. Temp. GRANT by Ralph de Seila "concessione Radulfi filii sui", to William de Noreis "pro hominio et servicio suo", and to Wlfene his wife, of a virgate of land: to hold "libere et quiete scilicet de pannagio, de filiabus et de omnibus consuetudinibus domino pertinentibus dum predicta Wlfene uxor predicti Willelmi domino servierit, libere et quiete pro servicio suo predictam possidebunt et quando predicta Wlfene amplius domino non servierit, sponsus suus et heredes illorum annuatim xii.d. pro omni servicio

DESCRIPTION OF THE RIDEWARE CHARTULARY.

CARTULARIUM familiæ de Rideware, Dominorum de Sheile in com. Leic. ; temp. Edw. II.

The original brief description of the volume is given in the following rubric (f. 3 *b*): "Thomas de Rydeware, fiz et heyr Wauter de Rydeware, fit fere cet livre en l'an de Reigne le Roi Edward fiz le bon Rei Edward le secunde, de tus le tenemans qu'il tint en sa mein en Rydeware, en Scheyle, en Fridlesham et en Ketelberstone et en Rossingthone." A detailed table of contents has been added on ff. 6, 6 *b*, 7, according to which the MS. originally contained 134 deeds. These immediately follow the table, and are numbered in the margins i-xix by the original scribe, and 20-134 in a modern hand. From time to time copies of deeds have been added, most of them being in hands but little later than the first hand, but a few as late as the 15th century. These are described at some length at the end of this article. The main contents are :—

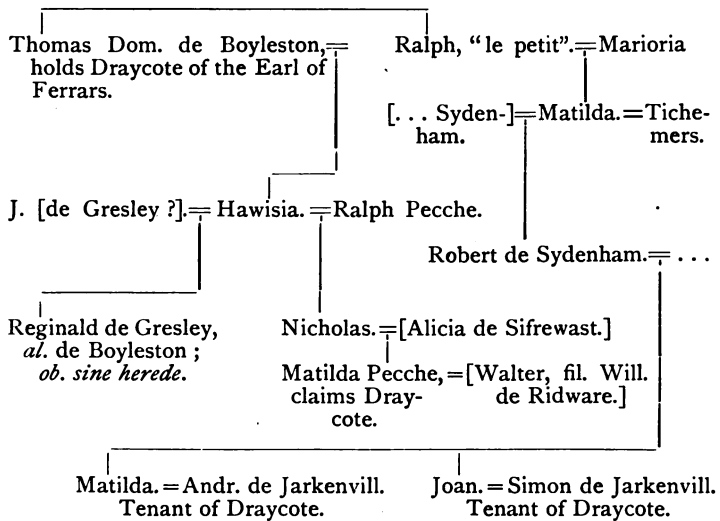

In addition to the pen-and-ink drawings described above there are others of considerable merit, on ff. 9, 15, 17, 20, 22 *b*, 23, 26 *b*, 27, 33, 35, 36 *b*, 37, 56 *b*. These were described in detail by Miss M. Gresley in 1860, 1861, for the Anastatic Drawing Society, of which the Rev. J. M. Gresley was sometime Secretary. As a rule the drawings are appropriate to the subject of the deeds which they illustrate, as, for instance, that on f. 23, a pig eating acorns under an oak tree, which accompanies a grant of pasture and pannage for pigs in Needwood Forest; or that on f. 15, a tree, with two magpies and two owls, which adorns the grant of a wood in Seal. There is a tendency to the grotesque in a few of the illustrations, notably that in the lower margin of f. 20 *b*, of which the following is Miss

Gresley's description in the above-quoted publication:—
“ It appears to be a mediæval representation of a phenomenon which is still in progress—the world being turned upside down. Coming home to a castle from hunting in a wood is a hare erect on her hind legs, and carrying a hound suspended by his legs from an axe ; another hare follows blowing a horn and holding a mace ; then comes a fox carrying a cock upon a lance (?) and leading a brace of greyhounds ; next a bear riding upon a hound ; and lastly, another hare carrying a bow and arrows.” The object which is tentatively called a lance is perhaps a spit. Illustrations of a similarly humorous character, but in colours, are found in Royal MS. 10 E. IV (British Museum), especially on ff. 48 *b*, 49, 56 *b*, 57, 57 *b*, 59 *b*, 62, 63 *b*, 64. The volume (large 4to) has a handsome modern binding of dark brown leather stamped with an elaborately ornamental pattern.

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
