


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

NOTE

This Order of Service is not intended to be strictly adhered to, but may be shortened or otherwise varied by the officiating minister. It is not the object of this book to establish an inflexible form, but rather to afford the means of variety in public prayer, and to save it from becoming a one-man utterance, and not a general and congregational worship. Free prayer by the minister is at the same time an essential feature of this Order of Service. The ideal of public worship is the union in one service of free and liturgical prayer.

SUGGESTIONS

It is good to be in one's place before the service begins. The opening acts of worship give a spiritual tone to the hour. If unavoidably late, do not enter during reading or prayer.

Members of the Congregation are requested to rise before the commencement of singing, and not while the first words are being sung.

In prayer it is desirable for all to kneel, if possible.

Join heartily and reverently in the Service throughout, audibly in the responses and the Lord's Prayer, so that the worship may be the common prayer and praise of the whole congregation.

The Sermon may be closed with the *Gloria Patri*, or with some other ascription of praise. Amen by the Choir and Congregation. The reading of one or two Scripture Sentences just before or during the Offertory will help to make the Offertory more distinctly what it ought to be—a part of the service, an act of worship.

After the Benediction, it is recommended that the Congregation pause a short time for silent meditation and prayer before leaving their places.

Let us have grace that we may serve God acceptably, with reverence and godly fear.

Let all things be done decently and in order.

Let all the people say Amen.

Study to be quiet.

Worship requires serious effort, not only from the one who is to lead it, but from those who are to follow it and make it their own. Enter into every act with a devout spirit and a prepared mind, for in worship it is only as we seek that we find. Unto him who hath shall be given.

First Order of Service.

MORNING PRAYER.

SENTENCES INVITING TO WORSHIP.

(To be read by the Minister. All standing.)

O COME, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord our Maker.

The hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth.

The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise.

Humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, and He shall lift you up.

Draw nigh unto God, and He will draw nigh unto you.

People. It is good for us to draw near unto God.

PRAYER OF INVOCATION.

(All kneeling or bowing.)

Minister. Let us pray.

Almighty and Everlasting God, Father of lights, from

whom cometh down every good and perfect gift, grant unto Thy servants, now assembled for these holy offices of prayer and praise and meditation, the spirit of grace and supplication, that our worship at this time may be acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord, our Strength and our Redeemer. AMEN.

Minister. Let us with one heart and one voice humbly confess our sins unto God, our heavenly Father.

GENERAL CONFESSION.

(Said aloud by all.)

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from Thy ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against Thy holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done. But Thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us. Spare Thou them, O God, who confess their faults. Restore Thou them that are penitent, according to Thy promises declared unto mankind, in Christ Jesus our Lord; and grant, O most merciful Father, that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of Thy holy Name. AMEN.

COLLECT FOR THE DAY.

Minister. Grant us, O Lord, to pass this day in purity and peace; without stumbling and without stain; that reaching the eventide without being overcome by

any temptation, we may praise, Thee, the God of our life, in whose mercy is our salvation and our hope for ever. AMEN,

PRAYER OF INTERCESSION.

Minister. I exhort, says the Apostle, that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all men, for this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour.

Let us pray.

O God, the Father of all mankind, we pray for all the nations of the earth and for all kings, princes, and rulers; more especially for Thy servant King Edward, for his whole Council, and for all the people of his realm; that all things may be so ordered and settled that truth and justice, piety and peace, may be established among us for many generations.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, who hast appointed our lot, we pray for all schools and colleges; for all teachers and learners; for all who speak and write; for all who practise the art of healing; for merchants, and all who go forth unto their work and labour until the evening. Grant that every man may know himself to be Thy servant, and do with his might whatsoever his hand findeth to do.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, who settest the solitary in families, we pray that parents may bring up their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and that children may love and honour their parents; that masters may rule

with justice and kindness, and that servants may obey with diligence and faithfulness.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, the Giver of every good gift, we pray for our kindred and friends, and for all children who are dear to us, that they may be preserved outwardly in their bodies and inwardly in their souls, and that doing Thy will and rejoicing in Thy mercy and love here they may partake of Thy joy hereafter.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, the Strength of the weak, the Refuge of the sorrowful, we pray Thee to have compassion on those who are worn with toil; to defend and cherish all little children; to bless and support all aged persons; to protect all who travel by land or sea; to comfort those who are suffering in body or mind; to extend Thy mercy to the oppressed, and especially to those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake; to deliver the tempted and to bring back all who have wandered from Thy way; to save the sinful, and to receive the spirits of the dying.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we pray for Thy blessing on Thy Church throughout the world, that it may abide with steadfast faith in the confession of Thy Name; on all those who minister in holy things that they may faithfully discharge their ministry according to Thy will; on all

who do good work in the kingdom of Thy Son, that their labours may not be in vain; and on the whole of Thy people, that they may walk worthy of their vocation and strive to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, before whose face the generations rise and pass away; the Strength of those who labour and suffer, and the Repose of the holy and blessed dead; we rejoice in the communion of Thy saints. We remember all who have faithfully lived; all who have peacefully died, and especially those most dear to us. Lift us into light and love; and give us at last our portion with those who have trusted in Thee, and striven in all things to do Thy holy will. And unto Thy Name, with the Church on earth and the Church in heaven, would we ascribe all honour and glory, world without end.

People. AMEN.

Minister. O God, the Life of the faithful, the Bliss of the righteous, mercifully receive the prayers of Thy children, that the souls which thirst for Thy promises may evermore be filled from Thine abundance: through Jesus Christ our Lord, in whose words we would now join with one heart and voice:—

Minister and People. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. Give us

this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses ; as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil : for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

Minister. I will not offer unto the Lord my God of that which doth cost me nothing. The Lord loveth a cheerful giver.

Owe no man anything, but love one another.

PRAYER.

(After the Offerings are placed on the Communion Table.)

Accept, O Lord, these offerings which Thy people

make unto Thee, and grant that the cause to which they are devoted may prosper under Thy guidance to the glory of Thy Name. AMEN.

Or,

Almighty God who hast sounded in our ears Thy saving truth, enlighten our minds and souls to the full understanding of what has been spoken, and deepen in our hearts every serious impression, that we may not only be hearers of good words, but also doers of good deeds, striving ever to live blameless and faithful lives through Thy help, and to the glory of Thy Name. AMEN.

Bless all who worship Thee, from the rising of the sun unto the going down of the same. Of Thy goodness give us, with Thy love inspire us, by Thy Spirit guide us, by Thy power protect us, in Thy mercy receive us, now and always. AMEN.

HYMN.

BENEDICTION.

(All standing.)

The Lord bless us and keep us; the Lord make His face to shine upon us and be gracious unto us. The Lord lift up His countenance upon us, and give us peace.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. AMEN.

Second Order of Service.

EVENING PRAYER.

SENTENCES INVITING TO WORSHIP.

(To be read by the Minister. All standing.)

FROM the rising of the sun to the going down of the same, the Lord's Name is to be praised.

Let our prayer be set forth as incense, and the lifting up of our hands as the evening sacrifice.

Behold bless ye the Lord, all ye servants of the Lord, who by night stand in the House of the Lord.

People. The Lord, who made heaven and earth, bless us out of Zion.

PRAYER OF INVOCATION.

(All kneeling or bowing.)

Minister. Let us pray.

O Thou whose chosen dwelling is the heart that longs for Thy presence and humbly seeks Thy face; we come to Thee as the day declines and the shadows of evening fall. Deepen within us every feeling of shame and sorrow for the wrong we have done, for the good we

have left undone ; and strengthen every desire to amend our lives according to Thy holy will. Restore us to the joy of Thy salvation ; bind up that which is broken ; re-kindle the sacred fire ; give light to our minds, strength to our wills, and rest to our souls ; according to Thy loving kindness in Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

Minister. Let us humbly confess our sins to Almighty God, our Heavenly Father.

CONFESSION.

(Said aloud by all.)

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of all men, we acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, which we from time to time, and especially in the course of this day, most grievously have committed, by thought, word, and deed, against Thy Divine majesty. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings. Have mercy upon us ; have mercy upon us, most merciful Father : forgive us all that is past ; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please Thee in newness of life, to the honour and glory of Thy Name. AMEN.

PRAYER FOR PARDON.

Minister. Almighty and everlasting God, who art always more ready to hear than we are to pray, and art wont to give more than we either desire or deserve ; pour down upon us the abundance of Thy mercy, for-

giving us those things whereof our conscience is afraid, and giving us those good things which we are not worthy to ask, for Thy Name's sake. AMEN.

O Thou who art the confidence of all the ends of the earth, and the refuge of Thy children in all generations, enlarge our faith and love that we may pray for needs beyond our own, for our brethren and friends, for Thy Church and for the world.

For our country and King ; for our rulers and judges ; for the cause of justice and good brotherhood ; that in the work of righteousness we may find peace, and that the effect of righteousness may be unto us quietness and assurance for ever :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For Thy Church throughout the world, that every member of the same in his vocation and ministry may truly and humbly serve thee :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For those that work with their own hands,

that they may serve Thee in all things; and for those that buy and sell and get gain, that they may be rich toward God:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For all parents, that they may order their households in Thy faith and fear; and for all children, that they may also be Thy faithful children and true disciples of Thy Son:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For all who teach the young, that they may have faith and patience and the guidance of Thy Spirit:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For the ignorant and the poor, for the friendless and the homeless, for the unprotected and the tempted, for the unbelieving and the sinful; that Thy love may be their salvation and defence:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For the rich and the great, that they may not be high-minded, nor trust in any outward prosperity, but only in Thee, remembering that they are but stewards of Thy bounty, and that at last they shall be called to render their account:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. For the sick and the suffering, for the bereaved and the dying, that they may wait Thy will and have Thy help to walk by faith through the darkness:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O Lord.

Minister. O Lord God, the Life and Light of men, the Strength of those who labour and the Refuge and Rest of the dead, we remember all those once known to us on the earth, who have passed into the unseen world. May we have great peace and great hope as we think of them in this quiet hour. Even now may we be refreshed with true joy ; that so with patience we may run the race that is set before us, and with them serve and enjoy Thee for ever. AMEN.

Almighty God, who hast given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplications unto Thee : fulfil now, we pray Thee, the desires and petitions of Thy servants as may be most expedient for them, granting us in this world knowledge of Thy truth and in the world to come life everlasting : through Jesus Christ our Lord, who taught us to pray :

Minister and People. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil : for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

OFFERTORY.

Freely ye have received, freely give.

Let every man give according as he hath purposed in his heart; not grudgingly nor of necessity; for God loveth a cheerful giver.

With what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again.

PRAYER.

(After the Offerings are placed on the Communion Table.)

Minister. O God, who hast made us glad in the service of Thy house, may the blessing we have received not pass away from us. Accept our sacrifice of prayer and praise; and forgive the imperfection of our holy things.

We commend ourselves to Thee. We go forth again into the world to do Thy will and to serve our fellows in all honesty and charity; and whether Thou leadest us in green pastures and by still waters, or through trouble and strife, and the valley of the shadow of death, we pray only that we may never lose the light of Thy face, and that our hearts may ever be at rest in Thee. AMEN.

Or,

Almighty God, who makest darkness that it may be

night, and providest for Thy children the gift of rest ; mercifully grant, we beseech Thee, that while we rest we may rest in Thee, and when we wake, we may awake to Thy praise. AMEN.

(All standing.)

The Lord bless us and keep us ; the Lord make His face to shine upon us and be gracious unto us. The Lord lift up His countenance upon us, and give us peace.

Third Order of Service.

MORNING PRAYER.

SENTENCES INVITING TO WORSHIP.

(To be read by the Minister. All standing.)

SEEK ye the Lord while He may be found, call ye upon Him while He is near. Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts, and let him return unto the Lord, and He will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon.

It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the Lord.

The secret of the Lord is with them that fear Him, and He will show them His will.

God is our Refuge and Strength, a very present help in time of trouble.

Let us lift up our hearts with our voices unto God our Strength and our Redeemer.

People. We will lift them up unto God, who is our Strength and our Salvation.

PRAYER OF INVOCATION.

*(All kneeling or bowing.)**Minister.* Let us pray.

Almighty and all-merciful God, our Father in heaven, grant that we may desire and will, both now in our prayers and at all times in our life, what is pleasing to Thee. Give us grace that we may never have any wish which we cannot bring to Thee, nor any purpose in which we cannot seek Thy help. So may our spirits be ever at one with Thee, and our prayers such as Thou wilt hear and answer, according to Thy loving kindness declared unto us through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

Minister. Let us humbly confess our sins to Almighty God.

CONFESSION.

(Said aloud by all.)

Almighty Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we confess that we have sinned against Thee in thought, word, and deed. Have mercy upon us, O Lord; have mercy upon us, after Thy great goodness; according to the multitude of Thy mercies, put away our offences, and cleanse us from our sins. AMEN.

COLLECT FOR THE DAY.

Almighty God, in whose presence there is no night, and in whose Love there is continual rest; we bless Thee for Thy care of us during the hours of darkness, and we pray that we may dwell in Thy Presence and in Thy Peace this day and all the days of our life, to the glory of Thy holy Name. AMEN.

Most Holy and Most Merciful God, the Strength of the weak, the Rest of the weary, the Comfort of the sorrowful, the Saviour of the sinful, and the Refuge of Thy children in every time of need, hear us while we pray for Thy help in all the circumstances and experiences of our life :—

When our hearts are growing cold and dead, and we are losing our vision of Thy face, and living as if life had no spiritual reality :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. When the evil memories of the past trouble us, and we mourn over early dreams and hopes unrealized, over light within us turned to darkness, and strength to weakness :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. When we are tempted to mean and wicked ways, and sin puts on the allurements which make it less sinful in our sight :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. When we are called to difficult duty, to work in loneliness among men, and to bear burdens that are hard to be borne :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. When we are weary of our work and think it fruitless, and duty is painful because it seems unprofitable :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. When the unknown future troubles us, and amid our fears and anxieties we forget the Eternal Love and Care :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. When the last darkness closes about our life, and heart and flesh faint and fail, and vain is the help of man :

People. Help us, O God.

Minister. O God, who knowest us to be set in the midst of so many and great dangers, that by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always stand upright, grant to us such strength and protection as may support us in all dangers, and carry us through all trials : we ask it in the faith and spirit of Him who taught us to say:—

Minister and People. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. VI.

A Prayer for Deliverance.

Minister. Thus saith the High and Lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy : I dwell in the high and holy place ; with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

And it shall be said in that day, Lo, this is our God ; we have waited for Him, and He will save us.

Who shall deliver me from the body of this death ? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, we Thy frail and sinful children bow before Thee, confessing our weakness and failure, and our need of a Strength which we do not find in ourselves. We do not ask to be protected from Thee ; we come to Thee for protection and deliverance.

From despising the counsels of wisdom and truth ; from neglect of Thy law, and contempt of Thy grace ; from thinking and doing what is contrary to the mind of Christ, and from grieving and quenching Thy Spirit :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From sensual and selfish thoughts and desires ; from foolish and wicked speech and conduct ; from slavery to appetite and passion ; from all unseemliness and seductions to evil ; from the corruption of youth, and from tempting any one to follow unhallowed ways :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From all inordinate cares and ambitions :

from maxims of cunning and greed ; from the godless pursuit of pleasure and gain ; from wronging the poor, and from envying and flattering the rich ; from keeping back the price of labour, and from rendering eye-service :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From pride, presumption, and arrogance ; from the scornful spirit, and from all irreverence ; from failing to give honour to whom honour is due ; from vanity, small-mindedness, and undue self-assertion, and from despising and condemning others :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From ignorance, error and prejudice ; from calling evil good, and good evil ; from putting darkness for light, and light for darkness ; from the shame of answering a matter before we hear it, and of neglecting to judge for ourselves what is right ; from unholy indifference, selfish compromise, and zeal that is not according to knowledge :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From unrighteous anger and a quarrelsome spirit ; from unjust and uncharitable judgment, and readiness to believe evil ; from clamour and back-biting, and all evil-speaking ; from returning evil for evil, and from all remembrance of injuries ; from unlovely manners and ways, and from all blindness and hardness of heart :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From indolence, and from neglecting to make the most of the power and opportunity which Thou hast given us ; from want of diligence and fidelity in our callings, and from all unfruitfulness of life :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. From an ungrateful and fretful spirit ; from doubt of the goodness of life ; from fear of death and the hereafter, and from all distrust of the Eternal Love and Care :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. In all time of our tribulation ; in all time of our wealth ; in all the days of our earthly life, and in the hour of our final passion ; in this world, and in the world to come :

People. Good Lord, deliver us.

Minister. O Lord, Merciful Father, who despisest not the sighing of the contrite heart, nor the desire of such as be sorrowful, mercifully hear the prayers that we make before Thee ; and grant that we may put our whole trust and confidence in Thy mercy, and evermore serve Thee in pureness of living, to Thy honour and glory. We offer these our intercessions in the faith and spirit of **Him** who taught His disciples to pray :—

Minister and People. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil : for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

VII.

A Service respecting our Duty.

Minister. Jesus said: Not every one that saith unto Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of My Father who is in heaven. Whosoever shall do the will of God the same is My brother and sister.

Let us pray.

It is the will of God that we should endeavour to keep our bodies in health and strength, and our appetites and impulses under control, and everywhere and in all things to be temperate and pure.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. It is the will of God that we should train our minds, and be true in our thinking, and just in all our judging.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. It is the will of God that we should be honest, truthful, and upright in thought, word and deed.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. It is the will of God that we should be diligent and faithful in our several callings, doing our daily work in all simplicity, and integrity, and seeking and labouring only for the things which are just and good.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. It is the will of God that we should rule our spirits, bear with each other's infirmities, and as much as lieth in us live peaceably with all men.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. It is the will of God that we should live chiefly to be helpful to others, and not to seek only our own pleasure and gain.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. It is the will of God that we should do what we can to take away the sin and sorrow of the world, and to overcome all evil with good.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to do Thy will.

Minister. Grant to us, O Lord, we beseech Thee, the spirit to think and do always such things as be rightful; that we, who cannot do anything that is good without Thee, may, by Thee, be enabled to live according to Thy will, as faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, who taught us to pray:—

Minister and People. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

VIII.

A Prayer of Intercession.

Minister. I exhort, says the Apostle, that supplications, prayers, intercessions, thanksgivings, be made for all men ; for kings and all that are in high places ; that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and gravity. This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour ; who willeth that all men should be saved, and come to the knowledge of the truth.

That it may please Thee to bless the whole family of mankind from one end of the earth to the other ; to destroy every form of tyranny and superstition ; to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death ; to remember for good all kings, princes, and rulers, and to bind all nations in unity, peace and concord :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to look in kindness upon our country ; to preserve to us the blessings of an equal and impartial freedom ; to bring in upon us the righteousness of the kingdom of God, and so to control us by Thy good Spirit, that we may use our liberties alone for Thy glory and the welfare and progress of mankind :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to bless our King and all the members of the Royal Family, to rule their hearts in Thy faith, fear, and love, that they may ever seek Thy honour and glory, and that their example may be a power for goodness in the life of this nation :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to grant and continue unto us a succession of legislators and rulers who have been taught the wisdom of the kingdom of Christ ; and ever to strengthen and sustain with Thine own Almighty Hand those who strive to guide and govern men in Thy fear ; that all our affairs may be so ordered that virtue may prosper with us and truth prevail :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to bless our Parliament in all its deliberations ; to endow all its members with a right understanding, a pure purpose and sound speech that cannot be condemned, and to enable them to rise above all self-seeking and party zeal into the larger sentiments of public good and human brotherhood :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to purge our political life of every evil that would keep back the people from the highest measure of virtue and happiness ; to subdue in this nation all unhallowed thirst for conquest and love of vainglory ; and to inspire us with calmness and self-restraint, and the endeavour to get Thy will done everywhere upon the earth :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God,

Minister. That it may please Thee to prosper the *city* in which we live and all its institutions; to bless every effort made in our midst to remove the causes of ignorance and crime, to raise the general level of comfort, and to give a higher tone to public and private life :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to make to flourish all hospitals and homes of healing; to deepen within our breasts the spirit of liberal giving so that they may never lack support, nor fail of fulfilling their divine mission of overcoming disease in every form, and restoring health to all who suffer :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. O God, the Creator and Preserver of all mankind, we humbly beseech Thee for all sorts and conditions of men; that Thou wouldest be pleased to make Thy ways known unto them, Thy saving health unto all nations. More especially we pray for the good estate of the Church Universal; that it may be so guided and governed by Thy good Spirit, that all who profess and call themselves Christians may be led into the way of truth, and hold the faith in unity of spirit, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life. Finally, we commend to Thy fatherly goodness all those who are any way afflicted or distressed, in mind, body, or estate [*especially those for whom our prayers are desired*]; that it may please Thee to comfort and relieve them according to their several necessities, giving them patience under their sufferings, and a happy issue out of all their afflictions; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who taught us to pray :

Minister and People. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be

done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

IX.

A Prayer of Intercession.

Minister. I will therefore that men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands without wrath or disputing.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, the Father of all mankind, who hath commanded us to make intercession for all men, hear us while we pray:—

That it may please Thee to bless all classes of the people, and so to turn the hearts of men toward each other that the spirit of caste may be destroyed; that all unjust and needless inequalities may disappear; and that the fair brotherhood of men, which Thy Son came to establish, may exist among us of a truth:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to purge society from the love of luxury, from the pursuit of vanity and frivolity, from self-indulgence, and from vice; and to multiply the number of brave, earnest, self-sacrificing followers of Christ:

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to purify and exalt the domestic life of the people, to deepen their sense of the worth and sacredness of home, so that the

families of our land may be scenes of noble discipline and the nurseries of true religion :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to regard with Thy favour the commerce of our country ; so that men everywhere may be in their transactions upright and honourable, in their workmanship conscientious and thorough ; and that dishonesty, and avarice, and selfishness may speedily cease :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to guide all those who study the laws of the land, that they may give wise and just advice to men in their dealings with one another ; to give grace to those who humbly search out Thy works, and mark the wisdom in which Thou hast made them all ; and to help all writers of books and newspapers, and all who mould the thoughts and opinions of men, that they may be lovers of that which is pure and good, and use all their powers in the cause of truth and righteousness :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to prosper all colleges and schools of sound learning ; to enlighten and fill with Thy fear all who teach and train the young, and to endow with knowledge and skill all who practise the arts of healing :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to bless the *city* in which we live ; may our first men be our wisest and

best ; may knowledge, virtue, and religion grow in our midst ; and may we all so cultivate the spirit of fairness and charity that our opinions may not bitterly divide us, nor our practices dishonour us, nor our conflicts leave us unkind :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. That it may please Thee to pity and bless the poor and sick in our workhouses and hospitals ; the afflicted in our asylums ; the sufferers in their own homes ; and to guide through death to a better life all who are appointed to die :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. Almighty God, with whom do live the spirits of those who depart hence, and who hast knit all Thy saints in one communion unto life eternal, make us thankful for all Thy grace and mercy bestowed on those whom Thou hast taken to Thyself. Keep alive in our hearts the remembrance of their goodness ; and give us grace to cherish the hope that when the day breaks and the shadows flee away, we shall meet them again in Thy presence with exceeding joy ; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who taught us to pray :

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil : for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

X.

A Prayer of Intercession.

Minister. The Lord is good to all, and His tender mercies are over all His works. The Lord upholdeth all that fall, and raiseth up all those that be bowed down; and not one of His creatures is forgotten before God.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, who lovest all and forgettest none, we bring to Thee our supplications for all Thy creatures and all Thy children.

For all whom we love and for whom we watch and care :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who have blessed us with kindness, led us with patience, restored us with their sympathy and help, and whose charity has covered a multitude of our sins :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who have wished or done us ill, that Thou wouldst turn their hearts to penitence and ours to pity and blessing :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all dumb creatures; that men may be merciful to the beasts, and be touched with a feeling of their infirmities :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all prisoners and captives, and all women and children suffering from oppression, that Thou

wilt manifest Thy mercy towards them, and make the heart of man merciful as Thine own :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all on whom Thou hast laid the cross of suffering, the sick in body and the feeble in mind ; for all who are in danger, necessity, and tribulation ; and all who travel by land or by water :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who have been bereaved of relatives and friends, or are troubled by the suffering or sin of those they love :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who are visited by worldly loss, that in the dark and cloudy day they may find the peace of God :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who are absorbed in their own grief, that they may be raised to share the sorrows of their brethren, and know the secret and blessed fellowship of the Cross :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God, that grace and peace may rest upon them :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who are suffering because of their faithfulness to conviction and duty, that renunciation may bring strength, and sacrifice, joy ; and that they may have Thy grace, who seest in secret, and come at last to an open reward :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all perplexed by the deeper questions of life, over-shadowed with doubt, and concerned lest even in thought they should depart from Thee, that light may arise in their darkness :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For the careless, the scornful, the lovers of darkness rather than the light, that they may be delivered from the bonds of iniquity :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who are tried by passionate temptations, or cold ambitions, or mean suggestions, that Thy mercy may be their salvation :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who are sad because they cannot sorrow for sin as they fain would, that they may come to know the sweetness of Thy love, and the wideness of Thy mercy :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all who are lonely and sad in the midst of others' joys, that they may know God as their Friend and Comforter :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For the infirm and aged, and all who are growing weary with the journey of life, and for all who are passing through the valley of death, that they may find comfort and strength in God, and light at evening time :

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. For all forgotten by us, but dear to Thee, for the whole family in heaven and on earth.

People. We beseech Thee to hear us, O God.

Minister. O God our Father, have regard to our intercessions, answer them according to Thy will, and make us the channels of Thine infinite pity and helpfulness, worthy to pray as our Master taught His disciples, saying :

Minister and People. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil : for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

AN ORDER FOR THE ADMINISTRATION
OF THE LORD'S SUPPER
AND OTHER ORDINANCES AND OFFICES OF THE
CHURCH.

An Order for the Administration of the Lord's Supper.

*The Minister, standing at the Table, shall say one or more
of the following sentences :*

O TASTE and see how gracious the Lord is : blessed is the man that trusteth in Him.

And the Spirit and the Church say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

Christ, our passover, is sacrificed for us : therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness : but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

This is My commandment, said Jesus, that ye love one another, as I have loved you. If, therefore, thou art offering thy gift at the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath aught against thee, leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way, first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God ; and every one that loveth is born of God and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God ; for God is love.

If any man will come after Me, said Jesus, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily, and follow Me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it ; but whosoever will lose his life for My sake, the same shall save it.

Whosoever will be chief among you let him be your servant ; even as the Son of Man came not to be ministered unto but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for many.

Henceforth I call you not servants ; for the servant knoweth not what his lord doeth : but I have called you friends ; for all things that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you.

Not every one that saith unto Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of My Father who is in heaven. Whosoever shall do the will of God the same is my brother and sister.

ADDRESS BY MINISTER TO THE PEOPLE.

Ye that do truly and earnestly repent you of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbours, and intend to lead a new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in His holy ways ; draw near with reverence, faith, and thanksgiving, and take the Supper of the Lord to your comfort.

Come to this sacred Table, not because you must, but because you may : come to testify not that you are

righteous, but that you sincerely love our Lord Jesus Christ, and desire to be His true disciples : come, not because you are strong, but because you are weak ; not because you have any claim on Heaven's rewards, but because in your frailty and sin you stand in constant need of Heaven's mercy and help : come, not to express an opinion, but to seek a Presence and pray for a Spirit.

And now that the Supper of the Lord is spread before you, lift up your minds and hearts above all selfish fears and cares ; let this bread and this wine be to you the witnesses and signs of the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit. Before the Throne of the Heavenly Father and the Cross of the Redeemer make your humble confession of sin, consecrate your lives to the Christian obedience and service, and pray for strength to do and to bear the holy and blessed will of God.

Then shall this Confession be made by the Minister and the People.

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge of all men, we acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness, which we from time to time most grievously have committed by thought, word, and deed against Thy Divine Majesty. We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings, the remembrance of which is grievous unto us. Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father ; in the name of Thy Son Jesus Christ we beseech Thee to forgive us all that is past ; and grant that we may

hereafter serve and please Thee in newness of life; to the honour and glory of Thy name. AMEN.

Then shall the Minister offer one or more of the following Prayers :

Almighty God, unto whom all hearts be open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love Thee, and worthily magnify Thy holy name : through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

O God our Heavenly Father, who by Thy beloved Son hast consecrated for us a new and living way into the holiest of all, even the way of filial trust and love and sacrifice, grant unto us, we beseech Thee, the assurance of Thy mercy, and sanctify us by Thy Holy Spirit, that our fellowship at this time may be with Thee the Father, and with Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour, AMEN.

O God, the True Light of faithful souls, the Help of those that flee unto Thee, the Hope of those who cry unto Thee, cleanse us from our sins and from every thought displeasing to Thy goodness, that with a pure heart and a clear soul, with calm trust and perfect love, we may worship Thee as we seek at this time through these sacred symbols to remember and realize Thy love in Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

O God, our Father, who in Thy love to our race didst

send Thy Son into our world, to bring back the wandering sheep, turn not away Thy face from us, but cleanse us from our secret faults, and mercifully forgive our presumptuous sins, that we may receive these sacred symbols with a sincere mind and a humble heart, to the glory of Thy Name. AMEN.

We do not presume to come to this Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in Thy manifold and great mercies. Grant, therefore, that coming to Thee, in hunger and thirst after righteousness, we may eat of Thy living bread and be filled with the Spirit of Jesus Christ, and evermore dwell in Him and He in us. AMEN.

Then shall the Minister say :

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all who truly turn to Him :

Come unto Me all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn of Me ; for I am meek and lowly in heart ; and ye shall find rest unto your souls.

There is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth.

Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be filled.

Behold, I stand at the door and knock : if any man hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him and will sup with him, and he with Me.

Ask, and it shall be given you ; seek, and ye shall

find ; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. If ye, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father who is in heaven give good things unto them that ask Him.

I am the Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd giveth His life for the sheep. And other sheep I have which are not of this fold ; them also I must bring, and there shall be one flock and one Shepherd.

Hear also what St. Paul saith.

Through Christ Jesus we have access in one spirit unto the Father. For we have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear, but the spirit of children, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. The Spirit beareth witness with our spirits that we are the children of God.

Hear also what St. John saith.

There is no fear in love ; but perfect love casteth out fear ; and he that feareth is not made perfect in love. We love Him, because He first loved us.

After which the Minister shall say :

Lift up your hearts.

People. We lift them up unto the Lord.

Minister. Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People. It is meet and right so to do.

Then shall the Minister say :

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God.

And all the people shall reply with him :

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify Thy glorious name ; evermore praising Thee, and saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts ; heaven and earth are full of Thy glory : glory be to Thee, O Lord, most high. AMEN.

The following Psalm may be read by the Minister and people alternately :

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me
bless His holy name.

*Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His
benefits ;*

Who redeemeth thy life from destruction, who crowneth
thee with lovingkindness and tender mercies :

*Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things ; so that
thy youth is renewed like the eagle's.*

The Lord is merciful and gracious, full of compassion
and plenteous in mercy.

*He hath not dealt with us after our sins ; nor rewarded
us according to our iniquities.*

For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is
His mercy toward them that fear Him.

*As far as the east is from the west, so far hath He re-
moved our transgressions from us.*

What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits
toward me ?

I will take the cup of salvation and call upon the name of the Lord.

I will pay my vows unto the Lord now in the presence of all His people.

I will offer the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call upon the name of the Lord.

THE COMMANDMENTS.

(All standing.)

Minister. Jesus said, The first of all the commandments is this: Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord, and thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength. And the second is like, namely this: Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and incline our hearts to keep these laws.

Let not your heart be troubled; ye believe in God, believe also in Me. He that hath seen Me hath seen the Father. In My Father's house are many mansions.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and fill our hearts with the faith of Christ.

If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me. Whosoever will save his life shall lose it; and whosoever will lose his life for My sake shall save it.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and fill our hearts with the love of Christ.

Peace I leave with you ; My peace I give unto you ; not as the world giveth, give I unto you.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and fill our hearts with the peace of Christ.

If ye keep My commandments ye shall abide in My love ; even as I have kept My Father's commandments, and abide in His love. These things have I spoken unto you, that My joy may be in you.

People. Lord, have mercy upon us, and fill our hearts with the joy of Christ. AMEN.

Then shall the Minister read the following words :

The Lord Jesus, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks He brake it, and said, Take eat ; this is My body which is broken for you ; this do in remembrance of Me. After the same manner also He took the cup when He had supped, saying, This cup is the New Testament in My blood ; this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of Me.

In communion with Jesus Christ and with all His disciples and friends, let us offer our prayers together to the God of our salvation.

PRAYER.

(Here may be offered an extempore prayer, or one or more of the following prayers).

Most Holy and Most Merciful God, our Heavenly Father, led by Jesus Christ we draw near unto Thee. Beneath the shadow of His Cross, in the light of His

revelation, in the communion of His Spirit, in the fellowship of His Church, we would meditate and pray. Help us to yield ourselves to the influence of this hour of holy memories and immortal hopes. May our spirits be tender to Thy touch. May the appeal of Thy love enter our hearts. May the sanctities of our Christian faith be more real to us than the things that are seen and temporal.

We would remember Christ—remember that He has eaten with us the bread and drunk the cup of our life, that He had communion with us in our joy and sorrow, and tasted what it is for a man to die. We would remember the gracious beauty of His life, His obedience unto death, the charity of His Cross, and His victory over the world's sin and sorrow. We would remember all that we owe to Him—our greater nearness to Thee and to one another, our knowledge of Thy Fatherhood, and of our human brotherhood, our new and more abounding life, our deeper and more peaceful sense of immortality. Impress and quicken our hearts with the memory of our Master and Saviour, till we learn to feel it to be no task to serve Him, no hardship to follow Him in His obedience, and no burden to carry His Cross.

We confess with shame that we often forget our Lord. We forget Him in our fear and anxiety, in our distrust and doubt of Thee, our Heavenly Father. We forget Him in our indolence and weariness in Thy service, in our unforgivingness and uncharitableness of disposition, in our selfishness and worldliness. Forgive, O God, our forgetfulness. Help us so to enter into the spirit of this service that we may go out into the world better prepared

to remember Christ amid the care and strife and sorrow of our common days.

Holy Father, we praise Thee for all the gifts which Thou hast bestowed upon us and our race through Jesus Christ our Lord.

We thank Thee for the word of Christ, and we pray that it may dwell in us richly in all wisdom.

Help us to think as He thought, to believe as He believed, and to trust as He trusted.

We thank Thee for the life of Christ, and we pray that our love and reverence for His perfection may ever be a strong defence against the power of evil. Day by day may we be casting off some weakness, and becoming more and more like the Saviour we worship.

We thank Thee for the death of Christ, and we pray for grace to learn the lessons of His cross, and to have fellowship with Him in His sufferings.

In the light of His sacrifice we would see and realize the sinfulness of our sin. In the light of His love we would forget all our guilty fears.

O God, eternal and invisible, we bless Thee that we have seen Thy glory in Jesus Christ. We believe that He came out from Thee, that no soul of all Thy children might cry in vain for the vision of Thy face. We believe that in His life and character He made Thee known. We believe that in His sympathy with men He revealed Thine infinite compassion for our sinful race. We believe

that on His Cross we behold Thy redeeming mercy and grace. We adore Thy love revealed in Jesus Christ. Redeem us into a life of love. Take away our sin with the sin of the world. Make us to partake in the triumph of Thy Son over the evil of life, and to be conquerors and more than conquerors through Him who loved us and gave Himself for us.

We thank Thee, O God, for life and immortality brought to light in the Gospel, and we pray for strength to follow Jesus now in the path of obedience and love, that we may thus be prepared to follow Him in faith and hope through the darkness of death to the world of everlasting light, whither He has led the way.

Holy Father, we pray that we may have communion with Thy beloved Son in the spirit of His holy living and dying. May we take to our duties as He took to His; bear our mortal burdens and the cross of our sacrifice, even as He bore His. May sin be to us what it was to Him; and may our pain and sorrow only draw us deeper into His fellowship. As we take this perishable bread and wine from His hands, may we receive at the same time the spiritual food by which our souls are nourished. Thus may the bread which we break be to us the communion of the body of Christ, and the cup which we bless the communion of the blood of Christ.

Father of our spirits, God of love, we pray that in Christ and His Cross we may have communion with

Thee. In the face of Christ we behold Thy glory, and the Cross has revealed Thee to us. Thou hast redeemed us, and called us by name, and we are Thine. Make us perfect with Thy perfection; holy as Thou art holy; merciful as Thou art merciful; Thine in character as we are Thine in right.

O God, who art love, and who makest men to be of one mind, grant to us, Thy children, who eat of Thy heavenly bread, to bear one another's burden in the goodwill of a perfect charity, and in service to one another's necessities, that Thy peace, which passeth all understanding, may keep our hearts and minds in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Almighty God, who hast called and redeemed us through Jesus Christ our Lord to be a royal and priestly race, grant us both the will and the power to do what Thou commandest; that we may have the strength of faith in our hearts and the courage of faith in our actions; that we may rule our passions, and moods, and circumstances; that we may ever offer unto Thee the sacrifice of a filial life, and through the might of our faith and love, become fellow-labourers with Jesus Christ in bringing men to God.

Heavenly Father, we bless Thee that Thou hast set us in the line of many good and faithful men. We remember all who from the beginning of the world have wrought righteousness and walked with Thee. We remember

prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and all lowly people whose lives have been beautiful with the beauty of Christ. Thine was the spirit of knowledge in their minds, and Thine the spirit of love that dwelt in their hearts. We rejoice in the communion of Thy saints, more especially in those whom we ourselves have known and loved, the dear and holy dead who have made the unseen world a home for us. Let the cloud of witnesses be to us an example of godly life; and by faith, hope, and love, may we be united to them and to Thee now and evermore.

We remember in this sacred hour of communion the whole family of man; all our brethren everywhere. We remember with affection our friends, and with charity our enemies. We pray Thee to comfort the sad, to strengthen the weak, to refresh the weary, to protect the innocent, to reward the faithful, to save the lost, and to reconcile all hearts and lives to Thee.

Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend ourselves again to Thee. Give us some lowly place among the servants of Thy will. May we, and all who take Christ's name, be filled with His Spirit, and be enabled to follow Him in all purity and obedience, in all charity and loveliness of life, till we are changed into the same image from glory to glory. AMEN.

Here follows the Distribution of the Bread and the Wine.

The Minister shall say when he delivereth the bread:

Let us eat of this bread in remembrance of Christ; and may the life which was in Him be in us also.

When he delivereth the cup :

Let us drink of this cup in remembrance of Christ ; and may the spirit in which He died be our spirit.

*After Silent Prayer, shall follow the Lord's Prayer
said by Minister and people.*

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil ; for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever.

AMEN.

THE OFFERING.

Minister. Let us do this in remembrance of Christ, for inasmuch as we do good to one of the least of His brethren we do it unto Him.

As we have opportunity let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.

Therefore, as ye abound in faith, and utterance, and knowledge, and in all diligence, see that ye abound in charity also. For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that ye through His poverty might be rich.

*After the offering has been placed on the table
the Minister shall say :*

Blessed be thou, O Lord God, for ever and ever ;

Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty; for all that is in the heaven and in the earth is Thine: Thine is the kingdom, O Lord, and Thou art exalted as Head above all; both riches and honour come of Thee, and of Thine own do we give unto Thee. AMEN.

O Lord, save Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance.

Defend us Thy servants with Thy heavenly grace, that we may continue Thine for ever, and daily increase in Thy Holy Spirit more and more.

And keep us in everlasting fellowship with our brothers and sisters who have entered into the joy of their Lord; and with the whole Church triumphant: and let us rest together in Thy presence from our labours. AMEN.

O Lord, our Heavenly Father, mercifully accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and hear us as we humbly pray that the spirit of Thy Son may abide in our hearts continually, that following Him in these our days of temptation and strife, we, Thy children who have at this time, under the veil of earthly things, held communion with Him, may with unveiled faces behold Him as He is, and rejoice in His glory. AMEN.

(All standing.)

The peace of God, which passeth all understanding, keep our hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God Almighty be among us and remain with us always. AMEN.

An Order for the Baptism and Dedication of Children.

This Service may be used after Morning or Evening Prayer, or at any convenient point in either, or by itself, at the home.

The Parents with the Child or Children to be baptized being present, and standing before the Minister, the Minister shall begin the Service by saying :

EXCEPT the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it. Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord, and offspring is His reward.

The promise is unto you and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord your God shall call.

Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord ; and Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart,

and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be upon thine heart; and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down and when thou risest up.

The mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear Him, and His righteousness unto children's children.

He shall feed His flock like a shepherd: He shall gather the lambs with His arm, and carry them in His bosom.

And Jesus took a child, and set him in the midst of them; and, when He had taken him in His arms, He said unto them, Whosoever shall receive one of such children in My name receiveth Me; and whosoever shall receive Me, receiveth not Me, but Him that sent Me.

Take heed that ye despise not one of these little ones; for I say unto you that in heaven their angels do always behold the face of My Father who is in heaven. It is not the will of your Father in heaven that one of these little ones should perish.

And they brought young children to Him that He should touch them, and His disciples rebuked those that brought them. But, when Jesus saw it, He was much displeased, and said unto them: Suffer the little children to come unto Me, and forbid them not; for of such is the kingdom of God. Verily, I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein. And He took

them up in His arms, put His hands upon them, and blessed them.

Go ye and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

ADDRESS.

The service in which we are now engaged is one of thanksgiving and testimony, of recognition, and dedication, and the appointed way of entrance into the church of Christ.

It is a service of thanksgiving for all the sweet and solemn hopes which cluster around the new-born.

It is a recognition of God as the Source of life; a confession of the secret sense that He has come very near to you in the new blessing, the new duty, and the new need of wisdom and strength.

It is a testimony to the fact that all children are the children of God, and that He claims them. When we engage in this service we declare that it is not by our own choice or act we become children of God, any more than it is by our own choice and act we become members of a human family. It is the Heavenly Father claiming His little ones. It is the Christ saying to-day as he said long ago: "Suffer little children to come unto Me; of such is the kingdom of heaven."

Baptism is also the ordinance of initiation into the visible Church of Christ; the receiving of the child into holy relations and influences, and in order to be brought up from the first as a Christian child.

This service is also one of dedication and consecration

—the dedication of the child to the will of God—the consecration of the parents to new and holier fidelities. It is therefore a most becoming and beautiful thing that those to whom God gives children, should express in such a service as this in which we are now engaged, their gratitude for so good a gift, their recognition of the Heavenly Fatherhood, their sense of responsibility, and their earnest desire for wisdom and strength to fulfil faithfully and well a duty which cannot be other than a labour of love. By your attendance upon this ordinance you gratefully recognize the fact that your little one has come to you from God, and you also confess your sacred obligation to train the child both by precept and example in the knowledge and love of God, and in the faith and spirit of Jesus Christ.

Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting God, heavenly Father, we give Thee humble thanks, that Thou hast vouchsafed to call us to the knowledge of Thy grace and to faith in Thee: increase this knowledge, and confirm this faith in us evermore. Give Thy holy Spirit to this infant, and grant that Thy servants who bring *him* now to Thee, may have wisdom and power so to teach and train *him* that *he* may grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. AMEN.

Having been informed of the name the Minister, naming the child, shall say :

I baptize thee in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. AMEN.

Or,

In the faith and fellowship of the Church of Christ, I dedicate thee to God, our Father in heaven. AMEN.

Then the Minister shall say :

This child is now received into the congregation of Christ's flock, in the good hope that hereafter *he* may never be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and to fight bravely under His banner against sin, the world, and the flesh ; and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto *his* life's end. AMEN.

Let us pray.

Almighty and Most Merciful God, the Faithful Protector of all weak and lowly things, keep, guard, and bless this child evermore. As *he* has been baptized into the Christian Church, may *he* become one with Christ. Breathe upon *him* now and always Thy Holy Spirit. Create in *him* a clean heart. May *he* be a blessing to the home and the world into which *he* has been born ; and as *he* grows in years may *he* also grow in strength and beauty, and, being led in the ways of Divine wisdom, be added to the number of Thy good and faithful servants, and be brought at last to Thy heavenly kingdom.

Endue Thy servants into whose care Thou hast committed this little one with a wise, loving, devout, and faithful spirit. Help them to consecrate to Thee day by day this gift of Thy love, and to make their home the scene of pure affections, holy discipline, and sincere religion.

Help all who are here present to live unto Thee

Give us grace daily to rejoice in Thy goodness with thanksgiving, and to follow Thy law faithfully. We commit our ways to Thee, and trust in Thee. Preserve our going out and our coming in, from this time forth and for evermore.

Almighty God, we beseech Thee, let Thy continual pity cleanse and defend Thy Church; and, because it cannot continue in safety without Thy succour, preserve it evermore by Thy help and goodness; through Jesus Christ our Lord; in whose words we now pray with one heart and voice:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses; as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

BENEDICTION.

The Lord bless us and keep us; the Lord make His face to shine upon us and be gracious unto us. The Lord lift up His countenance upon us, and give us peace.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. AMEN.

A Dedication Service,

OR,

ORDER FOR THE ADMISSION OF BAPTISED PERSONS TO
FULL COMMUNION WITH THE CHURCH.

When those young persons who desire to make a public profession of Christian discipleship have met together, the Minister shall read the following sentences, or a part of them :—

Jesus said : Take My yoke upon you and learn of Me, for I am meek and lowly in heart ; and ye shall find rest unto your soul. For My yoke is easy, and My burden is light.

If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me.

I am the Good Shepherd ; and I know Mine own and Mine own know Me. My sheep hear My voice and they follow Me. Other sheep I have which are not of this fold ; them also I must lead, and they shall hear My voice, and there shall be one flock and one Shepherd.

If ye love Me keep My commandments.

Whosoever shall do the will of My Father who is in heaven, the same is My brother and My sister. Ye are My friends if ye do the things which I command you.

The young people standing, the Minister shall say :

You are gathered here wishing to take upon yourselves

the obligations of Christ's disciples, to make a public stand for all that was implied in your baptism, and freely and openly to join the communion of the Church of Christ, I ask, therefore,

Is it your desire to live during the coming years of your life as the faithful children of God? Will you strive to be sincere, and pure, and upright in thought, word and deed; to hallow your lives by frequent meditation and prayer; to be loyal to the call of duty, and ready to help those among whom your lot is cast?

Then shall the young people respond:

Such is our desire and purpose.

Then shall the Minister say:

Is it your desire to be united with this Christian congregation in its communion of worship and work? And since you are compassed about by a cloud of witnesses on earth, and in heaven, and are set in the train of many of God's faithful servants who have witnessed a good confession, and have entered into their rest;—will you also seek to yield yourselves unto God, that the same spirit which was in Jesus Christ may be in you, and that you may be His disciples not in name only, but in deed and in truth?

Then shall the young people respond:

Such is our desire and purpose.

Then, all of them kneeling (or standing) before the Minister, he shall lay his hand upon the head of each one, or take each in turn by the right hand saying :

The Lord defend thee with His heavenly grace, and by His spirit confirm thee in the faith and fellowship of all true disciples of Jesus Christ. AMEN.

Then shall the Minister say to all of them :

In the name of Christ, I receive and welcome you into this congregation of His flock, and promise you our sympathy in your desire and endeavour to live according to the will of God. And may He who knoweth the thoughts and desires of every heart strengthen, stablish, and settle you in every good affection and purpose ; make you ready to do and to bear His perfect will : and when this earthly life is finished number you with His saints in glory everlasting. AMEN.

Let us now together seek the help of God in prayer :

Almighty God, our Father in heaven, the Source of all strength and hope ; we give Thee thanks for these Thy servants who have this day witnessed a good confession, and we most earnestly beseech Thee, without whom no good thing begun by us can be brought to perfection, to continually renew and strengthen their holy desire and purpose, that they may not be parted from Thee by any discouragements and temptations. May the flame of devotion, which has been already kindled in their hearts, be fed by Thee, that they may

daily grow in all goodness of life, and know the peace which the world can neither give nor take away. In all their coming days, grant them grace according to their needs; and whenever weariness or sorrow overtakes them may the remembrance of this sacred hour, with its earnest hopes and purposes, be to them an inspiration and a stay.

Finally, we pray that Thou wilt confirm us all in Thy truth and spirit, that we may run with patience the race that is set before us, and be helpers of each other's joy and victory over evil: through Jesus Christ our Lord.
AMEN.

Marriage Service.

*The persons to be married and their friends being assembled,
the Minister addresses the congregation.*

We are met together in the presence of God, to join this man and this woman in marriage, according to the general custom of the Christian Church ; to impress upon them the sacredness and significance of the marriage bond, and to seek on their behalf the blessing of Almighty God.

Therefore it is fit that we bear in mind that marriage is an institution ordained by God in the laws and necessities of our being, for the comfort and help of His children, and that families might be trained in goodness and godliness of life. It was honoured and sanctioned by Christ, both by His presence and His solemn words ; and it is set forth and commended in the Christian Scriptures as innocent and honourable to all who enter it lawfully, seriously, and with true affection.

Therefore if any one can show just cause why these two persons may not be lawfully joined together, let him now declare it, or else hereafter for ever hold his peace.

Then speaking to the persons about to be married, the man standing at the woman's right hand, the Minister shall say :

I require and charge you both, as in the sight of God, and remembering your responsibility to Him, that if either of you know any impediment why you may not be lawfully joined together in marriage, ye do now confess it.

If no impediment be alleged, the Minister offers prayer.

Let us pray.

Almighty and Most Merciful God, we bow before Thee, desiring to acknowledge Thee in all our ways. We thank Thee, the Giver of every good and perfect gift, for all that is gracious and helpful in this earthly life. We thank Thee more especially at this time for the institution of marriage, which Thou hast ordained to guard, hallow, and perfect love. Be pleased to bless the persons who are now about to be joined in this relation. May this ceremony be the outward and visible sign of an inward and real union—a union of hearts in true affection and sympathy; and may it have the consecration of Thy presence and blessing: through Jesus Christ our Lord.
AMEN.

Then the Man must say in an audible voice :

“I do solemnly declare, that I know not of any lawful impediment why I, *A. B.*, may not be lawfully joined in matrimony to *C. D.*”

In like manner, the Woman must say :

“I do solemnly declare, that I know not of any lawful impediment why I, *C. D.*, may not be joined in matrimony to *A. B.*”

The Minister then asks the Man to take the Woman's right hand in his own, and to say after him :

“I call upon these persons here present to witness that I, *A. B.*, do take thee, *C. D.*, to be my lawful wedded wife, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy ordinance, and thereto I plight thee my troth.”

In like manner the Woman must say :

“I call upon these persons here present to witness that I, *C. D.*, do take thee, *A. B.*, to be my lawful wedded husband, to have and to hold from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death do us part, according to God's holy ordinance ; and thereto I plight thee my troth.”

(The following form may be used in Scotland.)

*After Prayer the Minister shall say to the Man and
Woman :*

Join your hands.

And when their hands are joined he shall address the Man by name, saying:

You, *A. B.*, do now take *C. D.*, whose right hand you hold, to be your wedded wife. You promise in the presence of God, and before these witnesses, to be a loving and faithful husband unto her, until death shall separate you.

Do you so promise?

Then shall the Man answer:

I do.

Then shall the Minister address the Woman by name, saying:

You, *C. D.*, do now take *A. B.*, whose right hand you hold, to be your wedded husband. You promise in the presence of God, and before these witnesses, to be a loving and faithful wife unto him, until death shall separate you.

Do you so promise?

Then shall the Woman answer:

I do.

The Minister takes the ring from the Man, and handing it back to him says:

As a pledge of your fidelity and affection, and according to custom, you will place this ring on the fourth

finger of her left hand. By this token, the ancient and accepted symbol of conjugal love, you do declare yourselves wedded to one another, according to the Divine ordinance and the law of this land: and you now solemnly engage and pledge yourselves each to the other, to live together in this holy bond; taking each other, from this day forward, for better for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death do you part.

Whom God has joined together, let no man put asunder.

Forasmuch as *A. B.* and *C. D.* have solemnly pledged themselves to live together in marriage, I now pronounce them husband and wife, in the name of Almighty God.

The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace. AMEN.

Then shall be said or sung one or both of the following Psalms, or such Anthem or Hymn as may be chosen by the persons concerned:

PSALM XXIII.

The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want.

He maketh me to lie down in green pastures, He leadeth me beside the still waters.

He restoreth my soul, He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for Thou art with me, Thy rod and Thy staff shall comfort me.

Thou preparest a table before me, in the presence of

them that trouble me ; Thou anointest my head with oil ; my cup runneth over.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

PSALM CXXVIII.

Blessed is everyone that feareth the Lord, that walketh in His ways.

For thou shalt eat the labour of thine hands : happy shalt thou be, and it shall be well with thee.

Thy wife shall be as a fruitful vine, upon the walls of thine house.

Thy children like olive plants round about thy table.

Behold, thus shall the man be blessed that feareth the Lord.

Yea, thou shalt see thy children's children, and peace upon Israel.

Here the Minister may read the following address, or give such words of exhortation as he shall consider convenient.

It will become you seriously to consider the engagement into which you have now entered. Men do not err in saying that marriage should be regarded as a sacrament. It will surely be a sacrament to you if you give to its sacred requirements a dutiful and glad obedience. It is only the love and patience and fidelity of all the years of its continuance, the common yearning and striving after things good and true and beautiful, that can make this relation truly sacred and rich in Divine blessing.

Marriage was not meant for happiness alone, but for the discipline and development of character, the continuance of family life, and the welfare of human society. Love, though natural and spontaneous in its origin, must not be regarded as a thing to be left to itself. Constant thought and care are indispensable to its higher perfection and beauty. Keep a strict watch over yourselves ; exact not too much one from the other ; study to control and subdue whatever tends in your respective tempers and dispositions to disturb your mutual love and peace, and to hinder your progress in the Christian life. Give to your love its full nobility ; guard it against self-seeking ; let it be to you not narrowing, but enlarging ; not secluding you in a selfish paradise, but taking you always into truer, tenderer, larger sympathies and companionships with other souls and other lives.

You will have serious duties, but you will be able to fulfil them if you live near to the Source of all strength. You will have your share of trial and sorrow, but if you meet and bear it in the right spirit, it will yield you the blessing of fortitude, patience, self-control, wisdom, sympathy, thoughtfulness, and faith. In sorrow, as in joy, you will be in your Father's hands, learning obedience by the things which you suffer.

And if you make your home the place of the highest affection, the noblest discipline, the most consecrated joys, the most transfigured sorrows, the sincerest religion, then it will be to you a shelter from the storm and a shadow from the heat of life ; and a foretaste of, and training for that higher and fairer world where joy is perfect and unceasing, and to which we can give no better name than Home.

Listen to the duties of husbands and wives as they are plainly set forth in the Sacred Scriptures:—Husbands, love your wives; dwell with them according to knowledge; giving honour unto the wife, as being heirs together of the grace of life. Live joyfully with thy wife whom thou lovest all the days of thy life.

Who can find a virtuous woman; her price is far above rubies. The heart of her husband doth safely trust her; she will do him good, not evil, all the days of her life. Strength and honour are her clothing. She openeth her mouth with wisdom, and in her tongue is the law of kindness. She looketh well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness. Favour is deceitful, and beauty is vain; but a woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised.

Let us pray.

Almighty and Most Merciful God, who settest the solitary in families, and art the Author and Giver of all good things; let Thy blessing, we pray Thee, descend and rest upon this husband and wife. Bless their marriage, and make it to them the source of abundant and enduring good. Keep them faithful,—tender and true—so that they may live together in peace and good comfort. Direct and strengthen them in the discharge of all their duties. May they find in each other all that they hope—a joy that passeth not away. May their mutual affection never know change, doubt or decay. May they love Thee supremely, and abide in Thy love; so shall their love for each other endure, and they remain comforters and helpers one of another unto their lives' end. Preserve them amid the manifold dangers and

temptations of the world. Teach them to order their household wisely and well, and to regard all their possessions as Thy gifts—to be employed in Thy service. Thus may they pass blamelessly through life and serve their generation according to Thy will.

We commend to Thee their kindred and friends. Hallow the ties which bind them to each other, and so fill them with gentleness and forbearance that they may live together in peace and love.

In the blessed sympathies and disciplines of the home, may these Thy servants be trained for life here and hereafter; and when death shall part them, may they again meet and attain to everlasting felicity in Thy holy presence. And these and all our prayers we offer as disciples of Jesus Christ, in whose words we would further pray for ourselves and all mankind:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

BENEDICTION.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. AMEN.

An Order for the Visitation of the Sick.

The Minister may begin with saying :

Peace be to this house and to all who dwell in it.

Then the following passages may be read :

Behold, blessed is the man whom God correcteth ; therefore despise not thou the chastening of the Almighty ; for He maketh sore and bindeth up ; He woundeth and His hands make whole.

O taste and see that the Lord is good ; blessed is the man that trusteth in Him. The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous and His ears are open unto their cry. The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart, and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit.

The Lord is my shepherd ; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures : He leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul : He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil : for Thou art with

me ; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me : Thou anointest my head with oil ; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life : and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Bless the Lord, O my soul : and all that is within me, bless His holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits : Who forgiveth all thine iniquities ; Who healeth all thy diseases ; Who redeemeth thy life from destruction ; Who crowneth thee with loving-kindness and tender mercies ; Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things ; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's.

The Lord executeth righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed. The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy. He will not always chide ; neither will He keep His anger for ever. He hath not dealt with us after our sins ; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is His mercy toward them that fear Him. As far as the east is from the west, so far hath He removed our transgressions from us. Like as a father pitieth his children, so the Lord pitieth them that fear Him. For He knoweth our frame ; He remembereth that we are dust.

Deep calleth unto deep ; all Thy waves and Thy billows have gone over me. Yet the Lord will command His lovingkindness in the daytime, and in the night His

song shall be with me, and my prayer unto the God of my life.

Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise Him, my Deliverer and my God.

As thy days so shall thy strength be. The Eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms.

I am continually with Thee. Thou hast holden my right hand. Thou shalt guide me with Thy counsel and afterwards receive me to glory. Whom have I in heaven but Thee, and there is none upon the earth that I desire before Thee. My flesh and my heart faileth, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion for ever.

The Lord God hath given me the tongue of them that are taught, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary. Who is among you that feareth the Lord, that obeyeth the voice of His servant, that walketh in darkness and hath no light, let him trust in the name of the Lord and stay upon his God.

Be not anxious for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment? Your Heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. Seek ye first His kingdom, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added

unto you. Be not therefore anxious for the morrow : for the morrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof.

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you : not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared to the glory which shall be revealed in us. We know that to them who love God all things work together for good.

And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes ; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain ; for the former things are passed away.

And there shall be no night there ; and they need no candle, neither light of the sun ; for the Lord God giveth them light : and they shall reign for ever and ever.

Then shall the Minister offer the following prayer :

Almighty God, in whose hands are our times, and the souls of all Thy children ; mercifully regard Thy servant, that *he* may endure patiently and with willing obedience the cross of suffering which has been laid upon *him*. Be near to *him* in the hour of *his* need. We ask for *him* Thy sustaining grace. Give *him* the assurance of Thine everlasting mercy, and open *his* heart to receive the com-

fort of Thy love. May Thy discipline work within *him* a truer and better life ; may it purify *him* from all selfish and vain desires, and lead *him* to consecrate himself more fully to Thy holy and blessed will.

Almighty God, without whom nothing is strong, and from whom cometh all hope ; we pray that Thy blessing may be upon the means which are being used for the restoration of Thy servant. Spare *him* that *he* may recover strength. But not our will but Thine be done. Be this the prayer of our hearts as well as of our lips. Shed abroad within *him* and us the peace of perfect submission. May *he* feel that living or dying *he* is the Lord's, and that neither life nor death can separate *him* from Thy love. Father of Jesus Christ, who suffered for us and with us, help *him* to walk by faith through the darkness and with a hope which is full of immortality.

Almighty Father, whose great mercy and love are over all, be near to all those who are dear to Thy servant. Help them to trust Thee in all things, and give them wisdom and sympathy to understand *his* sorrow and to minister to *him*. Help them to be brave and patient ; and whether their blessings remain or depart, let their faith in Thee abide, and by all events, whether joyous or sorrowful, may they grow in goodness, and be trained for Thy will. AMEN.

Or,

Almighty God, Lord of life and death, in whose hand our breath is, and whose are all our ways, we turn to Thee. Lord we believe ; help Thou our unbelief, and lift us above the shadows of earth into the light of Thy coun-

tenance, and the comfort of Thy presence. Hear us in our prayers for Thy servant whom Thou hast called to the fellowship of the Saviour's sufferings. May *he* find in *his* pain the blessing which all Thy gifts contain ; and dispose *him* to discern the working of Thy hand, and the graciousness of Thy purpose. Let not this darkness hide Thee from *him* ; but may *he* feel Thee to be near, and know Thee to be good. Fill *his* heart with Thy consolations ; and give *him* grace to learn Thy solemn lessons, that when *he* is raised up from this bed of pain *he* may walk before Thee in newness of life. AMEN.

A Prayer when the Communion of the Lord's Supper is observed in the Sick Room.

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who dost correct those whom Thou dost love, and chasten every one whom Thou dost receive ; we beseech Thee to look down in pity and tender mercy on this Thy suffering servant. Visit *him* with Thy salvation ; and help *him* now as *he* seeks to remember Thy beloved Son, who was also a man of sorrows and a sharer of our grief. Through the gracious thoughts and feelings which these sacred symbols awaken, may *he* come into more intimate communion with the Saviour's Spirit, and be made more willing and ready to pass through that door of suffering by which the Son of Man entered into His glory. Let *his* tribulation be that which worketh patience and hope, through the love of God which shall be shed abroad in *his* heart by the grace of Jesus Christ. AMEN.

A Prayer for a Child dangerously ill.

Most gracious God, as a father pitieth his children so do Thou pity this child lying sick and weak. *He* is Thine. Mercifully regard *him*, and lay no more upon *him* than *he* can bear. From Thee *his* spirit came, and to Thee it must return. But, O God, quench not yet the light of this home. Spare this precious life, and let the bitter cup pass. But Thy will be done. Let not our natural affections, which Thou hast given, be stronger than our faith. If Thou art about to take hence this little one who has come hither from Thee, may there be for *him* an easy translation, and tender care on the other side; and for Thy sorrowing servants may *he* not have been here in vain, but may the love which *he* has brought bind them closer to heaven and Thee. AMEN.

A Prayer for a Dying Person.

Almighty God, with whom are the issues of life and death, and with whom do live the spirits of the departed, let Thine everlasting arms be around Thy child as *he* goes down into the valley of the shadow of death. May *he* be near to Thee as Thou art near to *him*. Comfort and sustain *his* soul, and breathe into *his* heart the peace of Christ. Into Thy hands, as into the hands of a faithful Creator and merciful Father, we commend *his* spirit. May we believe that it is well with *him*, and that when *he* awakes on the other side *he* shall be still with Thee. AMEN.

A Thanksgiving for Recovery.

Almighty God, the Giver of every good gift ; we thank Thee for the health that Thou hast restored to Thy servant. *He* was brought low and Thou didst help *him*. Thou hast been with *him* in sickness and in sorrow ; be with *him* still in health and joy. May the life which is prolonged through Thy blessing be consecrated to Thee. We pray for ourselves. May we lay up Thy admonitions in our hearts. In the hour of returning gladness suffer us not to forget the days of darkness that are gone. Let us not be numbered among those who are forward to ask in time of trouble, but careless to show themselves thankful when mercy is bestowed. Be Thou, O God, loved and obeyed with all our strength, that living or dying we may be Thine. AMEN.

A Prayer after a Death in a Family.

Almighty God, Thou abidest though Thy children pass away, and Thou art ever near to uphold and bless. Hear now our prayer for Thy servants bowed down with grief. May they find strength and peace in Thee. Let this sorrow be unto them as Thy fatherly discipline. For all that hath been gracious and sweet and helpful in past days they would devoutly thank Thee ; and in the hour of their darkness they would say, "Thy will be done." Visit them with Thy comfort, and be Thou Thyself the Companion of the lonely. Let them not be unmindful of the many good things which still remain to them to make life dear and sacred. May this visitation of death unite the hearts of those who are left in a closer bond of

love and sympathy ; and give them strength to return to the duties of life with increased seriousness and with purer and more earnest purpose. And as Thou dost disappoint the earthly hope, wilt Thou grant unto Thy servants that better hope which is full of immortality ; and may their love for the living and the dead be to them the promise of immortal life and joy. May they ever feel that the Eternal God is their refuge, and that underneath are the everlasting arms. AMEN.

Burial Service.

*Passages to be read by the Minister in the House or
Cemetery Chapel.*

It is appointed unto men once to die. There is a time to be born and a time to die. One generation passeth away and another cometh. All flesh is grass, and all the glory of man as the flower of grass. The grass withereth, the flower fadeth, but the mercy of the Lord endureth for ever.

Lord, make me to know mine end, and the measure of my days what it is, that I may know how frail I am. Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear unto my cry ; hold not Thy peace at my tears : for I am a stranger with Thee, and a sojourner, as all my fathers were.

Lord, Thou hast been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever Thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, Thou art God. Thou turnest

man to destruction, and sayest, Return, ye children of men. For a thousand years in thy sight are but as yesterday when it is past, and as a watch in the night. We spend our years as a tale that is told. The days of our years are threescore years and ten ; and if, by reason of strength, they be fourscore years, yet is their strength labour and sorrow ; so soon is it cut off, and we fly away. Teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom.

Affliction cometh not from the dust, nor trouble from the ground. Man's days are determined, and the number of his months are with Thee. Thou hast appointed him bounds which he cannot pass. Thou changest his countenance and sendest him away. The Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away ; blessed be the name of the Lord.

The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil ; for Thou art with me ; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me.

Like as a father pitieth his children, so the Lord pitieth them that fear Him. He knoweth our frame ; He remembereth that we are dust. As for man, his days are as grass ; as a flower of the field so he flourisheth. For the wind passeth over it, and it is gone ; and the place thereof shall know it no more. But the mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear Him.

Leave Thy fatherless children ; I will preserve them alive : and let thy widows trust in Me.

When my father and my mother forsake me, then the Lord will take me up.

Let not your heart be troubled ; ye believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions ; if it were not so I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you, that where I am, there ye may be also.

I am the Resurrection and the Life, saith the Lord ; he that believeth in Me, though he were dead, yet shall he live, and whosoever liveth and believeth in Me shall never die.

When this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where is thy victory ? O death, where is thy sting ? The sting of death is sin ; and the power of sin is the law ; but thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy begat us again unto a living hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, unto an inheritance incorruptible, undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you.

Our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory ; while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen : for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are

eternal. For we know that, if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted. Peace I leave with you ; My peace I give unto you ; not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creation, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

To them that love God all things work together for good. For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that shall be revealed in us. If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons. Now, no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous ; nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them who are exercised thereby.

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Though He cause grief, yet will He have compassion according to the multitude of His mercies. For He doth not afflict willingly, nor grieve the children of men.

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and to-day, yea, and for ever. We have not a High Priest who cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities, but One that hath been in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore draw near with boldness unto the

throne of grace, that we may receive mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.

Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord ; even so, saith the Spirit, for they rest from their labours, and their works do follow them. And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes ; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain, for the former things have passed away.

*At the burial of a child the following passages may
be read:*

A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping ; Rachel weeping for her children, refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not. Thus saith the Lord ; Refrain thy voice from weeping and thine eyes from tears ; for thy work shall be rewarded saith the Lord.

And the Lord struck the child, and it was very sick. David therefore besought God for the child ; and David fasted, and went in, and lay all night upon the earth. And the elders of his house arose, and went to him, to raise him up from the earth ; but he would not, neither did he eat bread with them. And it came to pass on the seventh day that the child died. And the servants of David feared to tell him that the child was dead ; for they said, Behold, while the child was yet alive, we spake unto him, and he would not hearken unto our voice : how will he then vex himself if we tell him that the child is dead ? But when David saw

that his servants whispered, David perceived that the child was dead; therefore David said unto his servants, Is the child dead? And they said, He is dead. Then David arose from the earth, and washed, and anointed himself, and changed his apparel, and came into the house of the Lord, and worshipped: then he came to his own house; and when he required, they set bread before him, and he did eat. Then said his servants unto him, What thing is this that thou hast done? thou didst fast and weep for the child when it was alive; but when the child was dead, thou didst rise and eat bread. And he said, While the child was yet alive, I fasted and wept: for I said, Who can tell whether God will be gracious to me, that the child may live? But now he is dead, wherefore should I fast? can I bring him back again? I shall go to him, but he shall not return to me.

And when the child was grown, it fell on a day that he went out to his father to the reapers. And he said unto his father, My head, my head. And he said to a lad, Carry him to his mother. And when he had taken him, and brought him to his mother, he sat on her knees till noon, and then died. And she went up, and laid him on the bed of the man of God, and shut the door upon him, and went out. And she called unto her husband, and said, Send me, I pray thee, one of the young men, and one of the asses, that I may run to the man of God, and come again. So she went and came unto the man of God to Mount Carmel. And it came to pass, when the man of God saw her afar off,

that he said to Gehazi his servant, Behold, yonder is that Shunamite: run now, I pray thee, to meet her, and say unto her, Is it well with thee? is it well with thy husband? is it well with the child? And she answered, It is well.

Like as a father pitieth his children, so the Lord pitieth them that fear Him.

He shall feed his flock like a shepherd, He shall gather the lambs in His arms, and carry them in His bosom.

Jesus said, Suffer the little children to come unto Me, and forbid them not, for of such is the kingdom of God.

It is not the will of your Father which is in heaven, that one of these little ones should perish. For I say unto you that in heaven their angels do always behold the face of My Father which is in heaven.

After the reading is ended, the Minister may give a suitable address.

Then Prayer shall be offered, extempore, or read as follows:

Almighty and Everlasting God, the Lord of our life and death, we desire to acknowledge Thee in all our ways, and in all the events which befall us. In sorrow of heart, yet in quietness and confidence, we have gathered for these last solemn and tender offices of faith and love. Lift us above the shadow and the sadness of mortality into the light of Thy countenance and the comfort of Thy presence. Speak to each of us Thy word of peace, as we stand now in the presence of

death. It is Thine own hour, and a fast of Thine own appointing. The loneliness and the silence Thou hast made. But Thou canst do Thy children no harm. In sorrow as in joy, in loss as in gain, in life as in death, we confess Thee to be good.

Eternal God, we remember the frailty, the uncertainty, the awful brevity of our life upon the earth. We are strangers and sojourners, as all our fathers were. We dwell here but for a little while. We plan and toil, we suffer and enjoy; and then heart and flesh faint and fail, and we pass away from the familiar places into darkness and silence.

O Lord our God, help us as we seek to raise our thoughts from this changeful life to the calm eternity in which Thou dwellest, and to those things which know no change, save from glory to glory. Our weakness appeals to Thy pity. Hold not Thy peace at our tears. Lead us to the Rock that is higher than we. Lift us out of our disappointed purposes and broken hopes into the peace of Thy holy and blessed will. Our spirits turn to Thee in humble trust. Amid the decay of visible things, draw nigh unto our fainting souls, O Thou invisible Comforter. As the changes of life leave us poorer and sadder, may we know more of the constancy of Thy love, and the unfailing riches of Thy sympathy.

Almighty Father, we bless Thee that life and immortality have been brought to light in the Gospel.

We know from Jesus that Thou hast ordained our life, with all its relationships and circumstances, as a discipline for our souls. We learn by living. Thou art

training us by labour, quickening us through trial, making us stronger and tenderer, humbler and holier, through suffering. Help us to cherish that spirit which makes all things, whether joyous or sad, to work together for our good. O Eternal Goodness, train us for Thy will ; for it is Thy will to make us perfect.

We know from Jesus, and we bless Thee for the knowledge, that death is not the destruction but the expansion of our life ; that it opens the way into new opportunities of service and worship, new disciplines and new joys ; that it cannot take us out of our Father's hands, or separate us from the love of God. We are going whither we cannot see ; but we do not leave our Father's House ; we are the children of Eternal love, and underneath us are the Everlasting arms. O help us to realize the faith of Christ, and then we shall have the peace of Christ, and the bereavements that darken our homes will not break our trust.

Father of Spirits, we have joy at this time in all who have faithfully lived, and in all who have peacefully died. We thank Thee for all fair memories and all lovely hopes ; for the sacred ties that bind us to the unseen world ; for the dear and holy dead who encompass us like a cloud of witnesses, and make the distant heaven a home to our hearts. May we be followers of those who through faith and patience now inherit the promises.

Our Father, we acknowledge Thy great goodness in this finished life. Thy children thank Thee for the friend whom Thou hast now taken from their earthly

fellowship, and they rejoice in a hope which is full of immortality.

O Thou who art the Comforter of Thy children, Thou God of love and tenderness, we pray for those who mourn at this time. We need not tell their sorrow unto Thee. In the stillness of our hearts we ask for them Thy sustaining grace. Be Thou their stay in this sore trial; the Strength of the fainting heart and the Light of the darkened home. Open their eyes to see the Father's House on high, and may they feel assured that the departed has found a better life, and a more perfect rest in Thee.

Almighty God, may this visitation of death be Thy voice speaking to us, and may it minister to a truer and holier life in our souls. May our passing days be rich in those things which death cannot take from us; and do Thou strengthen us to live that life of faith and righteousness, of charity and peace, which makes the last earthly change but a step nearer to Thee, our Everlasting Refuge and Home. Hear us for Thy mercy's sake, through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

Prayer at the Burial of a Child.

Most Holy and Most Merciful God, we gratefully confess Thy goodness in these passing days; in Thy giving and in Thy taking; when our homes are bright, and when the shadows gather and deepen. We thank Thee for the little children who make us glad in their living, and call forth the richest treasures of our hearts. Through their dying may we be comforted and taught

in heavenly things. In our loneliness make our remembrance of them sweet and helpful.

Almighty Father, whose goodness loved us into life and whose mercies never fail; Thine is the beauty of childhood, and Thine the light which shines in the face of age. Thy children bless Thy holy Name for the little one Thou hast taken to Thyself, and for the grace Thou didst give unto *him* by which *he* was enabled in a short time to fulfil a long time. We believe that it is well with the child.

Merciful Father, who dost chasten us for our good, we commend to Thee the sorrowing parents. Pity them as a father his children: comfort them as a mother her little ones. Touch their wounds with Thy hand of healing and help them to be still. May strength and consolation come to them, and all holy thoughts and lovely hopes. May the words of Thy Son which speak of Thy care for little children breathe peace into their troubled hearts. Let their hearts follow the heart's treasure, and be persuaded that the sweetness and beauty in which they rejoiced for a season are not lost, that the child Thou hast lifted out of their sight is still with Thee, safe in the Eternal Love and care, and that no evil can touch *him* now.

Almighty God, our Father: we would remember, that from Thee and to Thee are all the pure and beautiful souls who have walked with us on this earth in gentleness and love. We praise and bless Thee that we cannot take their departure for misery; because Christ lives, they live also. Comfort and strengthen us in the assur-

ance that what was bound up with our life, and made a dear part of our being, cannot be lost; that the ties which are broken here are still preserved in the love that made them ours; and that the powers we would have helped to train must still be unfolding in the same Care that inspired our striving and will not let it be in vain. And suffer us not to forget that by the mystery of death we are brought nearer to the Infinite Goodness, in which we must confide, and on whose bosom, with our beloved who have fallen asleep, we can rest, sure that the God whom fatherhood and motherhood, and all our tender human relations suggest, interpret, and reveal, will keep that which has been committed unto Him: through Jesus Christ our Lord, in whose words we would now join with one heart and voice:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses; as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. AMEN.

At the Grave.

What man is he that liveth and shall not see death. Man that is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble.

In the midst of life we are in death. Of whom may we seek for succour, but of Thee, O Lord, in whom our souls do rest in hope.

Forasmuch as it hath pleased God in His infinite wisdom and goodness to take unto Himself the soul of the departed, we therefore commit *his* body to the grave, earth to earth, ashes to ashes, in the sure and certain hope that the spirit is at rest in God, and that as *he* has borne the image of the earthly he now bears the image of the heavenly.

(When Cremation is adopted instead of Burial, the words "the elements" are to be used instead of "the grave," and "earth to earth" are to be omitted.)

The dust returns unto the earth as it was ; the spirit has returned unto God who gave it, and over it death has no power ; for all live unto God, and He is mindful of His own ; He remembers His children.

After labour cometh rest ; after struggle, peace ; after life's fitful fever, this last sleep.

Beloved, hear ye now the words of one of the Lord's prophets in the olden time :

He will swallow up death in victory, and the Lord God will wipe away tears from off all faces, and the distress of His people will He take away from off all the earth.

For a small moment have I forsaken thee, but with great mercies will I gather thee : in a little wrath I hid My face from thee for a moment, but with everlasting kindness will I have mercy on thee, saith the Lord thy Redeemer. And all thy children shall be taught of the Lord, and great shall be the peace of thy children.

Here also what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto those who mourn :

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you ; not as the world giveth give I unto you. Let not

your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. In My Father's house are many mansions. God is not the God of the dead, but of the living ; for all live unto Him. My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me ; and I give unto them eternal life, and they shall never perish. My Father who hath given them unto Me is greater than all ; and no one is able to pluck them out of the Father's hand.

Hear also what St. Paul saith :

None of us liveth to himself, and none dieth to himself. For whether we live, we live unto the Lord ; or whether we die, we die unto the Lord ; whether we live therefore, or die, we are the Lord's.

I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, Write, From henceforth, blessed are the dead who die in the Lord ; even so, saith the Spirit ; for they rest from their labours, and their works do follow them.

PRAYER.

O God, our Heavenly Father, who art leading us through the changes of time to the rest and blessedness of eternity, be Thou near to us, as we leave this grave, to comfort and to uphold. Make us know and feel that Thy children are precious in Thy sight, and that they live evermore with Thee, and that Thy mercy endureth for ever. May the sweet and comfortable words of the Lord Jesus which speak of Thine eternal love dwell in us richly in all wisdom. Thankful for the life which Thou didst give us for a season, may we be trustful in Thee now that it has been taken away.

O God, give us of Thy strength that we may take up our lives more bravely, and seek to be more faithful in duty, and more loving and helpful to others, for the sake of those who are with us no longer here on earth. Send us back to the daily round of duties more eager to do Thy will, as though in the presence of death we had learned to know the deeper meaning of life. And when we too are called to leave this world of love and beauty, of joy and sorrow, may we be of ready heart to meet our forerunners who have passed within the veil. And to Thee, our Father, revealed in Jesus Christ, be glory for ever. AMEN.

Or,

Merciful and Eternal God, Strength of the weak, and Comfort of the sorrowful ; graciously receive the prayers of those who sigh before Thee and cry unto Thee ; that under their cross they may be cheered by Thy Spirit, and with the hope that Thou wilt change their pain and conflict into joy and peace. AMEN.

BENEDICTION.

A Service of Commemoration for the Faithful Departed.

The Minister shall commence the service by reading the following sentences, or part of them, all standing.

Blessed be the name of God for ever and ever: for wisdom and might are His. He giveth wisdom to the wise and knowledge to them that know understanding. Every good gift is from above, coming down from the Father of Lights. Praise ye the Lord.

Wisdom is the breath of the power of God; a pure influence flowing from the glory of the Almighty; the brightness of the everlasting light; more beautiful than the sun, and above all the order of the stars; the image of God's goodness: in all ages entering into holy souls, she maketh them friends of God and prophets.

The righteous shall be had in everlasting remembrance. The memorial of virtue is immortal; because it is known with God and with men. When it is present, men take example of it; and when it is gone they desire it. And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever.

Who are these that are arrayed in white robes and whence came they? These are they who came out of the great tribulation, and they washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore are they before the throne of God; and they serve Him day and night in His temple: and He that sitteth on the throne shall spread His tabernacle over them. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; neither shall the sun strike upon them, nor any heat: for the Lamb who is in the midst of the throne shall be their shepherd, and shall guide them unto fountains of waters of life: and God shall wipe away every tear from their eyes.

And I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, write, Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them.

And we desire that each one of you may show the same diligence even unto the end; that ye be not sluggish, but followers of them who through faith and patience inherit the promises. Let us also, seeing we are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and perfecter of our faith.

Let us now with quiet and grateful hearts remember before God, the wise, and the good, and the faithful who have passed away; the innumerable company of our kind gathered into the heavenly world for evermore. In the sight of the unwise they seemed to perish; but they are

in peace: mortal sadness is not in their life; their reward is with the Lord, and the care of them with the Most High. They live also in our hearts and the remembrance of them is dear and blessed.

Let us pray.

God over all, for ever blessed! help us to bring unto Thee hearts of gratitude, and to pray unto Thee a faithful prayer. In the midst of years which have been crowned with Thy goodness, we praise Thy mercy and Thy truth. We consider the generations of old, and our hearts say unto us,—Did ever any trust in God and were put to shame? O Thou God of our fathers, who hast made the old time sacred with the memory of Thy care; O Thou who hast watched over us from childhood, and never left us without a witness of Thyself; hither have we come to lift up to Thee the voice of praise. We thank Thee for good examples and brave testimonies; for the faith which wrought righteousness and obtained promises; for the witness of saintly souls; for ascended spirits with whom we once took sweet counsel together; for all those who being dead yet speak. Wise and holy men of old, martyrs and saints, fathers and children, and children's children, in the body and out of the body, Thou hast made us to be one family in Thee; and Thy care and love for Thy household cannot be told. In this hour of quiet thought and solemn joy may the meditation of our hearts and the answer of our lips be from Thee.

May our hearts be open to every holy affection, and ready to receive and cherish every sacred memory and serious impression. Give us to know the power of that death which this day commemorates. Let a portion of the spirit which led our Saviour to the Cross, descend upon us and fill our hearts with the love of God and man. Here and now may every selfish passion and desire be quiet, and may the peace of God which passeth all understanding keep our thoughts in Christ Jesus. Amen.

Holy and Ever-Blessed God, who dost ask abundant labours and sacrifices from those whose lives are enriched by much love, we thank Thee especially at this time for sending Thy Beloved Son to live and die for us men

and our salvation; and while we meditate on His final conflict and passion may we be filled with His Spirit, so that we may be enabled to offer up ourselves entirely, even as He did, to Thy holy and perfect will. AMEN.

Almighty God, Eternal and Invisible, we adore Thy love revealed in Jesus Christ our Lord. We believe that He came out from Thee that no soul of all Thy children might cry in vain for the light of Thy face. We believe that in His life and character He made Thee known. We believe that in His sympathy with men He revealed Thy compassion for our sorrow-stricken race. We believe that on His Cross we behold Thy redeeming mercy and grace. May the message of that Divine sacrifice conquer our fear and suspicion, and restore our souls to health and peace. Redeem us into a life of truth and purity and love. Take away our sins, and reconcile us to Thy holy and blessed will, through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

O Spirit ever present! O Providence unsearchable! if in any hour we cry like the Crucified, "My God! my God! why hast Thou forsaken me?" may we return like Him to a composed faith and say, "Father! into Thy hands I commit my spirit." Teach us to live to Thee with perfect trust. May one only care be ours, to finish the work which Thou hast given us to do; to walk to-day and to-morrow, if perchance the third day we may be perfected. May we bear our cross as true disciples, and count all denial and pain and reproach as only gain, if we may but fill up that which is behind of the sufferings

of Jesus Christ, and share in the sacrifice by which Thou redeemest the world. AMEN.

Almighty God, who in the life and teaching of Thy Son hast showed unto us the true way of blessedness, Thou hast also showed us, in His sufferings and death, that the path of duty may lead to the cross, and the reward of faithfulness may be a crown of thorns. Give us grace to learn these harder lessons. AMEN.

Lord of Life and Death, Father of the crucified Christ! in every sorrow which awaits us may we look up to Thee without doubt or fear, persuaded that Thy mercy is ever faithful and ever sure. In whom should we put our confidence but in Thee who canst not fail? There is no place or time where Thou art not. Uphold us in our weakness, and in our darkness visit us with Thy light. We are Thine: help us in life and in death to feel that we are Thine. And when our hour comes, may we follow our Divine Forerunner in His life's last act of renunciation, and say, "Father into Thy hands I commend my spirit." AMEN.

Easter Eve.

Father of our spirits! we bless Thee that in every passage of our mortal life, in the weakness of pain, in the solitude of sorrow, and in the ways of death, we may

ever look unto Jesus as the Leader of faithful souls who hath divinely borne our woes and passed to Thy rest. We cannot forget that He has eaten with us the bread and drunk the cup of our life, that in our human fellowship He passed down into the dark valley and tasted what it is for a man to die. We bless Thee now that He overcame pain with patience, sin with mercy, and with trust and love the sharpness of death. Almighty God, who didst give unto our Saviour Thy Spirit without measure in His life, and didst bestow upon Him Thy peace in death, mercifully grant that the like grace may be vouchsafed unto us, that, living a life subdued unto the simplicity and obedience of Christ, we may fall asleep in the sure and certain hope that when we awake we shall still be with Thee. AMEN.

Grant, O Lord, that as we are baptised into the death of Thy Blessed Son, so, by continual mortifying of our corrupt affections, we may be buried with Him, and that through the grave and gate of death we may pass to our joyful resurrection. AMEN.

Almighty God, by whose command the order of all time runs its course, we pray that we may bear away from our sacred meditations on the passion and death of Thy Son Jesus Christ a larger portion of His spirit. In the world may we seek no rest till we have fulfilled the will of Him who sent us. Reveal to us something of the

joy with which our Saviour now looks back on the days of His strong crying and tears, and teach us that it is far better to die in Thy service than to live a selfish and faithless life ; grant this, O Father, through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

EASTER.

This is the day which the Lord hath made ; we will rejoice and be glad in it. Christ is risen ; He is risen indeed. Because He lives, we shall live also. After two days will the Lord revive us : in the third day He will raise us up, and we shall live in His sight.

and whosoever liveth and believeth in Me shall never die." AMEN.

O Lord of Life, while we keep the festival of the Saviour's immortality, we would remember, that from Thee and to Thee are all the pure and beautiful souls who have walked with us on this earth in gentleness and love. We praise and bless Thee that we cannot take their departure for misery; because Christ lives, they live also. Comfort and strengthen us in the assurance that what was bound up with our life, and made a dear part of our being, cannot be lost; that the ties which are broken here are still preserved in the love that made them ours; and that the powers we would have helped to train must still be unfolding in the same care that inspired our striving and will not let it be in vain. And suffer us not to forget that by the mystery of death we are brought nearer to the Infinite Goodness, in which we must confide, and on whose bosom, with our beloved who have fallen asleep, we can rest, sure that the God whom fatherhood and motherhood, and all our tender human kindredships suggest, interpret, and reveal, will keep that which has been committed unto Him. AMEN.

Almighty and Everlasting God, by whose power Thy Son Jesus Christ overcame death; mercifully grant that we may purify ourselves even as He is pure; and, by continually mortifying our corrupt affections and seeking ever to do Thy holy will, may rise through death into a higher and diviner life. AMEN.

AMEN.

EASTER SUNDAY EVENING.

Almighty and Most Merciful God, who in our darkness can give us light, who in our weakness can give us strength, who in our trouble can give us peace, who in our loneliness and grief can give us the sympathy of perfect wisdom and perfect love, we lift up our hearts unto Thee in the confidence of children. In Thy goodness is the Light of life, and the Light which lighteth every man that is born into life. Strengthen us in the remembrance and assurance of Thy goodness. Lord, we believe; help Thou our unbelief.

We worship Thee as the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who passed through all the sorrowful experiences of our earthly lot, that He might shed upon the

dark and solitary passages of our pilgrimage, and on the valley of the shadow of death, the light of the Divine and Eternal life. We rejoice in His finished work, and in His victory over the world. The sword and the spear and the sceptre lie broken before His Cross, and in His submission and humiliation we see the power of God and the wisdom of God.

We praise Thee, O God, for the light and hope, the consolation and peace which flow from that spiritual triumph which this day commemorates. We bless and thank Thee for the great persuasion in our hearts and minds that the Life which was in Jesus was the Life of God and could not die, and that the Spirit which was in Him, and by which He lived, rose victorious through its Divine power over all mortal decay and corruption. We bow our hearts before Thee in holy joy. In the Son of Man we see our humanity raised and glorified; through His filial life we realise our childhood to Thee; through His love we know how Thou dost love us, and art assured that we are not the offspring of chance or fate, but the children of Eternal Fatherhood. In Him Thou hast brought nigh to our earthly darkness the glory of the heavenly life: the veil of death is rent in twain; and we know Thee to be the Lord of all worlds, visible and invisible, and are persuaded that neither things present nor things to come can separate us from Thy love. We bless and thank Thee for the dear trust and hope that in Thee nothing that is human ever dies; that although the bodies of those we love are laid in the dust their spirits rise and return to Thee; and that in Thee the lives

which are lost to us on earth are ever preserved and ever renewed.

Heavenly Father, we pray, that amid the shadows and darkness of time we may ever find in Christ the Light of life. To Him may we ever turn for the illumination of all mysteries. And since by Thy Son we have been lifted out of a darkness deeper than that which fills the grave, let us not love evil rather than good, but may we seek with our whole hearts all holy and heavenly things. May the truth of Christ abide in us; His purity cover us; His Cross crucify us to the evil in the world; His Resurrection quicken our strength and renew our hope, and be a resurrection unto salvation in our hearts and lives. Spread abroad over the earth the knowledge of His Gospel, that He may rise again and return in the new and redeemed life of the world; and as His disciples, to Thee, His Father and our Father, we lift our praise, now and evermore. AMEN.

ASCENSION DAY.

Grant, we beseech Thee, Almighty God, that as Thy Beloved Son hath passed into the heavens, so we may also in heart and mind seek to follow Him. Subdue unto Thyself our earthly appetites and passions, casting down every proud thought, and conforming our wills to Thine. Thus may we even now dwell with Christ in heavenly places, be glorified with the glory of His obedience and charity, and partake of His blessed immortality. AMEN.

WHITSUNDAY.

When He ascended on high, He gave gifts unto men. God hath not given unto us the spirit of fear, but of power and love and a sober mind. As many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

O God, who at this time didst teach the hearts of Thy faithful people, by the sending to them the light of Thy Holy Spirit; grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy comfort, through Jesus Christ our Saviour, in whose name we ascribe unto Thee all honour and glory now and for ever. AMEN.

Almighty God, the Inspirer of prophets and apostles, and of every true and good thought and feeling in all men; we would join the Christian Church throughout the world in thanking Thee for the gift of Thy Spirit by which Thou hast enabled some in all ages to be the teachers and leaders of their brethren; and we pray Thee so to pour out the same Spirit on us that we may know and understand the deep things of God, and that love and goodness and all the fruits of righteousness may abound in our lives to Thy praise and glory. AMEN.

Fountain of truth and grace, who visitest the world with times of refreshment from Thy presence, and so dividest Thy word as to kindle the fire of all hearts; come with Thy various energy into our midst; whether as the rushing wind to cleanse and brace our souls, or as

the hovering dove to quicken our faith, and hope, and charity. Cease not the pleading of Thy Spirit, O Comforter Eternal; but when our love grows cold and our prayer is dumb, and we fall into the sleep of selfish care, break in once more upon the darkness and void; waken and win us to Thy heavenly light, to know Thee as the Life of our deepest life, the Voice of our inmost conscience, the strength of our surrendered will. Burn up with Thy purifying flame every root of bitterness and seed of sin; and let the nourishing dews descend which shall cover every barren place with the grace of sweet affections and the fruits of holy living. Still let the blessed promise be fulfilled: leave us not comfortless, abide with us for ever. AMEN.

TRINITY SUNDAY.

Canst thou by searching find out God? Canst thou find out the Almighty unto perfection? It is high as Heaven, what canst thou do? deeper than Sheol, what canst thou know? Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.

The order of nature, the life of the Son of Man, and the moral and spiritual being of Thy children bear witness of Thee, and their witness agree in one. the Creation of which we are a part ; in the face of Jesus Christ our Lord, and in the movement of our own spirits. Lord, we believe, help Thou our unbelief. We bless Thee for all unknown and lowly people who were faithful in their day and place, strengthening the cause of truth and virtue, and whose forgotten labours have made the earth more beautiful for us who follow them. May these examples and memories stimulate us

to live a truer and braver life. Give us grace to live worthily, and to hold our inheritance as a sacred trust, that we may leave it with increase for those who shall come after. AMEN.

Almighty Father, the God not of the dead but of the living; we have joy together in all who have faithfully lived and peacefully died, and whose truth and beauty are even now in our hearts. May we be assured that they who are absent from us have found a more perfect rest in Thee, and the crown of an unfading life. No longer can we care for them; but Thou wilt care for them better than our love could do. By pastures green and by quiet waters, into higher life and service Thou wilt lead them, O Thou Eternal Lover of souls. Cherish and bless them, we pray Thee; and give unto us great peace and great hope as we think about them in this still hour. Take the veil from our hearts, and join us in one communion with all Thy saints on earth and in heaven. AMEN.

Thou who art the God of our Fathers, the Ancient of days, the Refuge of Thy children in all ages, be mindful of us now, and let the light of Thy countenance fall upon us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

Sacred Scriptures.

Blessed Lord, who hast caused all sacred Scriptures to be written for our learning ; we thank Thee for the signs of Thy providence and inspiration in many lands ; and we desire of Thee the gifts of insight and wisdom, of patience and charity, so to read the letter of things written in olden times, that Thy Holy Spirit of truth may ever live in us ; and that we may so meditate on the story of things temporal, as ever to worship Thee the Living and Eternal God. AMEN.

Good Books.

Blessed God, who hast caused all good books to be written for our learning, as Thou givest all good thoughts for our thinking, help us not to misuse the gift of Thy wisdom or Thy Spirit. So let us read all good books carefully, and listen to all wise teaching modestly, and meditate on all good sayings attentively, that we may be led into all truth, and nourished in all goodness of life, to the praise of Thy holy name. AMEN.

The Religion of Christ.

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast made unto us Way and Truth, Resurrection and Life ; we would seek in this sacred hour to learn His mind and to cherish His spirit. Having His mind and spirit we breathe trust and hope in Thee, the God of our life ; we breathe humility ; we breathe obedience ; we breathe self-sacrifice ; we breathe charity toward all mankind. More and more may we possess the mind, and be ruled by the Spirit of Christ, to the glory of Thy holy name. AMEN.

Almighty God, it is true knowledge to know Thy name, and true life to obey Thy will ; vouchsafe to us, we beseech Thee, the constant help of Thy spirit, that amid our daily duties and temptations, we may live by the light Thou hast made to shine upon us, and that growing in goodness unto the end, we may depart in peace, our eyes having seen Thy salvation. AMEN.

Almighty God, give us grace to contend always for the right, and, if need be, to suffer for it, and give us not over to any death of the soul, but rather lift us into newness of life, and let us glorify and enjoy Thee for ever ; through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

A Prayer for the Nation.

Almighty Lord, of whose righteous will all things are, and were created ; who liftest the islands out of the deep, and preparest not in vain the habitable world ; Thou hast gathered our people into a great nation, and sent them to sow beside all waters, and multiply sure dwellings on the earth. To our Legislators and Counsellors give insight and faithfulness, that our laws may clearly speak the right, and our Judges purely interpret it. Let it be known among us how

Thou hatest robbery for burnt-offering ; that the gains of industry may be all upright, and the use of wealth considerate. May wisdom and knowledge be the stability of our times : and our deepest trust be in Thee, the Lord of nations and the King of kings. AMEN.

A Prayer for the Church.

A Prayer for all Christian Workers.

Help us more and more to feel and realize that in Thy holy care are all Thy children, whether here or there; that the Eternal God is their refuge and home in this and in all the worlds. And unto Thee, known in Christ and loved in all the good and faithful, be praise and glory for ever. AMEN.

The Commemoration of the Departed.

Eternal God, Lord of every world, before whom stand the spirits of the living and the dead; we bless and praise Thy holy name for all Thy servants departed this life in Thy faith and fear; and especially for those most dear to us who worship Thee now with a voice from which all mortal sadness has passed away; and we beseech Thee to give us grace so to follow their good example that even here we may be united to them in fellowship of spirit; and that finally, when we too are called to bid farewell

AMEN.

A Prayer for Parliament.

Merciful God, to whom alone belong the issues of life and death ; we bless the goodness which hath preserved so many of us alive in the midst of a great mortality, and hath restored health in our land, and the voices of joy in many homes. Help us now to offer ourselves a living sacrifice to Thee, who art worshipped in spirit and in truth. AMEN.

A Prayer for the Coming of God's Kingdom.

O Thou whose eye is over all the children of men, and who hast called them, by the Prince of Peace, into a kingdom not of this world ; send forth His Spirit speedily into the dark places of our guilt and woe, and arm it with the piercing power of Thy grace. May it reach the heart of every oppression, and make arrogancy dumb before Thee. Let it still the noise of our strife and the tumult of the people ; put to shame the false idols of every mind ; carry faith to the doubting, hope to the fearful, strength to the weak, light to the mourner ; and more and more increase the pure in heart who see their God. Commit Thy word, O Lord, to the lips of faithful men, or to the free winds of Thine invisible providence, that soon the knowledge of Thee may cover the earth, as the waters cover the channels of the deep. And so let Thy kingdom come through Christ Thy Son. AMEN.

A Prayer of Intercession.

May no evil happen to them, nor any harm come nigh their dwelling. And may we be brought back in due time, in comfort and safety, to bless Thy name and confess Thy merciful and faithful care. AMEN.

A Prayer for a Service in a School or College.

O Lord our Heavenly Father, by whose spirit man is taught knowledge, who givest wisdom to all them that ask Thee, grant Thy blessing, we beseech Thee, to all who serve Thee here, whether as teachers or learners, and help us in the work which Thou hast given us to do. AMEN.

General Prayers.

I.

For Sunday Morning.

ALMIGHTY Father, each day would we offer Thee the first tribute of our thoughts, the freshest ardour of our affections. But this is the day which the Lord hath made, which brings to us with its hallowed light the memories of creating goodness and redeeming love. Oh, come, let us worship and bow down before the Lord our Maker, Preserver, and Benefactor. For unnumbered mercies and blessings, often unnoticed, oftener unimproved, ever undeserved, we thank and praise Thee. For being and wellbeing, for the supply of our wants and the preservation of our lives; for health of body, for vigour of mind, for all the temporal blessings Thou hast bestowed and the evils Thou hast averted, we bless and praise Thy holy name. But, as for the blessings of Thy providence, so also would we thank Thee for the riches of Thy grace. Our souls would magnify the Lord and our spirits would rejoice in God our Saviour. Alas! that the homage of our lips should be so often belied by the unfaithfulness and disobedience of our lives. Help us no longer to offend; suffer us no more to wound our consciences and grieve Thy Holy Spirit. The sins we confess enable us to renounce. The errors we deplore help us to correct. May the high motives and holy inspir-

ations of religion infuse a new elevation and dignity into our daily lives. May every thought of our minds, and every feeling of our hearts, and every energy and activity of our lives be brought into captivity to the obedience of Christ. From the stain of sin do Thou cleanse us; from the shame of sin do Thou cover us; from the dominion and power of sin, Redeemer of our souls, be pleased to deliver us. Endue us, we beseech Thee, with the mind of Christ. Bestow on us the spirit of self-sacrifice, a mind that ever contemplates not our own but others' good; a heart that knows not a selfish wish; a will that bends all its inclinations and purposes to the will of God. And whatsoever the lot in life Thou hast been pleased to assign to us, help us to be content therewith, and to find in all around us food for holy thought and helps to holy discipline. Illumine our minds with Thy wisdom, and direct our erring steps by Thy guiding hand. May every period of our lives as it passes render us more gentle, earnest, unselfish and heavenly-minded. Bring us ever in spirit and character nearer and nearer to Thyself; may we by Thy Spirit be perfectly transformed into the image of Christ, and thus made meet for serving Thee here, and made partakers of the glory which is to be revealed hereafter. All which we ask in the name of Him who is the pledge and earnest of all Thy gifts, in whom and with whom Thou hast freely given us all things, even Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. AMEN.

II.

ALMIGHTY GOD, we would look to Thee as our Sun and Shield : help us to be glad in Thy light, and to trust in Thy protection. Even when clouds and darkness are round about Thee, we would hold fast the conviction that Thou Thyself art light, and that in Thee is no darkness at all. Give us grace to believe that behind all clouds Thy love shineth eternally, and that all the mists of our earthly perplexities shall yet be scattered by its radiance. We bless Thee for the light of the knowledge of Thy glory in the face of Jesus Christ. We cannot fathom the mystery of His nature : but we cling to Him as Thine only begotten Son—the very image of Thy substance ; and we rejoice in the simplicity of that revelation which has come to us through Him. We thank Thee for the assurance which He has given us of Thy parental compassion and redeeming grace. We rejoice that He is our Living Way to Thee, the Father, and the holy channel of Thy holy salvation to us, Thy sinful children. We bless Thy Name also for the light which He has shed on our own nature, duty, and destiny. Grant, we beseech Thee, that we may all learn Christ, and be taught in Him, even as truth is in Jesus ; so that, following Him, we may not walk in darkness, but may have the light of life.

Heavenly Father, help us also to look continually unto Thee as our Shield. Defend us, we pray Thee, against every foe. We flee unto Thee to hide us—even from our own guilt and sinfulness. We humbly confess our past transgressions and failures :

we acknowledge the selfishness and self-will that lurk within our nature. Grant unto us, we beseech Thee, a deeper contrition of heart ; but keep us from remorse and despair. Help us to believe the Gospel of Thy pardoning mercy which is proclaimed to us through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We pray that, through the might of His Cross, we may be delivered both from the burden of guilt and from the tyranny of selfishness. Draw us into such fellowship and sympathy with the mind of Jesus, as that we may come into truer harmony with Thy perfect will, and Thy statutes may become our songs. May the gracious influences of Thy Holy Spirit purify all our thoughts, desires, and affections. Thus do Thou fortify us within, and do Thou likewise enable us so to hold fast the shield of faith as to quench the fiery darts of temptation which assail us from without.

Shelter us also, O God, we beseech Thee, in the day of affliction : be Thou a refuge from the storm, and a shadow from the heat. Even whilst we are lying safely in Thine arms, we are sometimes foolishly timid. O help our unbelief, and in Thy tenderness assure us of Thy protection. Thou canst make all things work together for good to them that love Thee. Let not calamity injure our souls : let not sorrow corrode our hearts. May we learn those lessons which Thou art seeking to teach us in every time of trouble : and may we grow humbler and holier through all Thy discipline and training. Defend us also, we entreat Thee, amid the perils of prosperity : keep us from pride and vain-glory, from avarice and worldliness.

May we remember that we have nothing which we have not first received ; and may the spirit of gratitude be our safeguard. Pour into our hearts also the spirit of unselfishness, so that, when our cup overflows, we may seek to share our happiness with our brethren. O Thou God of Love, who makest Thy sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sendest rain on the just and the unjust, grant that we may become more and more Thy true children, by receiving into our souls more of Thine own spirit of ungrudging and unwearying kindness.

Father of Spirits, who willest that all men should be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth, we pray that the light which Thou hast given us in Thy Gospel may be diffused throughout the world. Unto all peoples may the Sun of Righteousness arise, with healing in His wings. Strengthen and direct Thy servants who, in distant lands, are preaching unto the heathen the unsearchable riches of Christ. May multitudes be delivered out of the power of darkness : may they be rescued from their bondage to foul vices and superstitious terrors, and may life take on a new aspect for them, through knowledge of Thy redeeming mercy and Thy sheltering care. Bless and guide the churches of Christ in our own country, and fill them with the spirit of holiness and brotherhood.

May all Christians shine as lights in the world, holding forth the word of life, and directing their fellow-men to find shelter in Thy holy and boundless love, revealed in Jesus. We would ask all in

His name, as His disciples and subjects, desiring to be more faithful to His teaching, and more loyal to His kingdom. AMEN.

III.

A Morning Prayer.

Almighty and Everlasting God, our Righteous and Merciful Father, praised by all the voices of earth and the hosts of heaven, we glorify Thy Name and call one to another, Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord; heaven and earth are full of the majesty of Thy great glory. Glory be to Thee, O Lord Most High.

Praise be to Thee, Father of all, who callest in the darkness and openest to us the gates of the morning. Thou changest times and seasons; Thou settest the stars in their watches; Thou ledest forth the day. In this day which Thou hast given us may we reverence Thy holy law, and not be put to shame by our words and deeds.

Father of Mercy, who continuest to pour Thy blessings upon us, let Thy goodness be health and strength to us, that we may be thankful and holy. And unto Thee, O God our Father, be all praise and glory from the whole Church of Jesus Christ. AMEN.

Bring into harmony with Thy will our hidden thoughts and affections. Let the mind of Jesus Christ be in us also. Suffer us not in these swiftly vanishing days to be led astray by too eager desires for things that perish in the using. Help us to lay hold on the enduring things of character, the realities of faith, hope and love. Thus may our lives grow ever truer worthier and more beautiful in Thy sight.

Coming up hither week by week to commune with Eternal Love, we pray that our love may increase toward God and toward men. All men are Thy children : help us to live with them as brethren ; to put far away from ourselves all that is unjust and unkind, all that is little and mean and to reach out together toward all that is fair and good and great. XIII.

O God, whose mercy and grace never fail us, that we may enter into communion with Thee in the possession of truth and goodness and love, do Thou bless our worship at this time. Quicken, illuminate, and enlarge our minds and hearts. May we hear a diviner word than it is possible for us to hear amid the distractions of earthly interests and cares. Increase our faith; breathe upon us Thy Spirit; deliver us from the bonds of sense and selfishness, and the deadness of custom, and lead us into the glorious life and liberty of the children of God. We know that Thou hast given us our nature and life, and this world to dwell in, and we believe that Thou hast put no more darkness, nor difficulty, nor pain into our lot than is good for us, and that as we do not love these things, so dost not Thou love them for themselves alone. We believe in Thine infinite goodness, in Thy pity and care for us in all our earthly trial and discipline. Strengthen in us this great and comforting faith ; take part with the light in us against the darkness ; give victory to the good in us over the evil. Give us to partake of the victory of Jesus Christ, and to be conquerors and more than conquerors over the evil of the world and life.

O Thou, in whose grace there is strength to do and patience to endure, draw near in comforting to the mourner, in guidance to the perplexed, in strength to the tempted, in salvation to the sinful, in resignation to the dying, in rest and glory to the dead.

O God of life and death, of earth and heaven, we remember our brethren here with us, but forget not those taken from us ; and we pray, that we may diligently seek and daily strive after that holiness, without which, neither the living, nor the dead can see Thee as Thou art. AMEN.

XV.

Blessed be God, seen of no human eye, heard of no human ear, whom yet our souls confess, our hearts crave, our thoughts seek, and our tongues praise. Blessed be God, with whose fulness nature overflows, and whose image man bears in his moral being. Blessed be God, whom neither time nor space can measure and confine, Infinite and Eternal Spirit !

From Thee, O God, proceedeth the universe for ever new, fresh in the dew of its everlasting youth. Seasons and centuries pass ; the generations of men come and go ; but from age to age Thou art God. Beauty shines through all Thy works ; its Source and Soul Thou art. Love comes forth to redeem and bless ; Love alone Thou art. From the depths of sin, from the darkness of sorrow, we look up to Thee ; Thine it is to subdue sin, and to comfort sorrow. Blessed be Thou, the First and the Last, the only True and Holy, our Father and Saviour, now and for ever.

Almighty God, the Father of lights, we would seek and find Thee, not only in what appears to us exceptional and strange, but in the order of creation, in the perpetual marvel of life, in blessings daily given, in our minds and hearts, and in that still centre of our being where Thy calm voice rebukes our passions and our fears. Not with cold and ungrateful hearts do we bow before Thee, but with hearts full of thanksgiving and praise, eager to confess their sense of the goodness of the world and life. We feel the darkness and mystery which beset us behind and before, and how full our mortal days are of questions

which we know not how to answer ; yet, now and always, would we keep out of our hearts all terror and dismay. We would ever say with Thy servant of old, Thou art good, and there is no wrong with Thee. Thou knowest whence we came ; we trust to Thee whither we shall go. We remember Jesus Christ, who, by the life He lived, the temptations He conquered, the Gospel He taught, and the Cross He bore, has brought us nigh to Thee, whom to know is life, whom to resemble is perfection, and whom to love is the fulness of joy.

O God, in whose love we learn the meaning, and through whose strength we bear the burden and cross of life, we come here to feel Thy nearness ; to realize the law we ought to obey and that everywhere binds us ; to lay ourselves freely open to Thy Spirit ; to receive Thy truth into our minds, Thy love into our hearts, and Thy quickening energy into our wills. In this quiet and

sacred hour we seek wisdom and strength for the labour and trial of life. We look back through our days, and we see much weakness, failure, and defeat. Our lives are not what we would fain have them to be; not what we feel we might make them for ourselves, and for those about us. In Thy presence how poor, stained, and sinful they appear.

With great desire we desire at this time that in the coming days we may do and be better; that hereafter we may be wiser, stronger and more faithful. Awaken us to new vision and purpose. Help us to greater purity and fidelity in our common life. We know that we cannot fight against the best things, and not suffer pain and loss and defeat; and we bless Thee for the knowledge. Let us not be led astray by vain ambitions, and foolish impulses and dreams. Save us from the fate of those who are a curse, and not a blessing, to others, and from the condemnation of those who love darkness rather than light. We pray Thee, O Spirit of the Eternal, to subdue in us all passion and pride, all selfish desire and corrupt inclination. Keep alive in us all that is simple and true; all that keeps us unspotted from the world; all that makes us wise to improve opportunity, strong to resist temptation, brave to live and work by our faith, and to meet calmly the hour of death. We offer this our prayer in the spirit of Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

XVI.

Almighty God, the Ever Blessed, the Ever Holy, whose mercy is from everlasting to everlasting, and whose strength is perfected in our weakness, help us

now to draw near unto Thee, by calling in thoughts that stray, and controlling feelings that may be troubled, so that, with mind and heart, we may worship Thee. We do not ask to be protected from Thee ; Thou art our refuge and protection. We come to Thee, because without Thee our life is not worth living. We have the same deep needs our fathers had. We bring to Thee the thirst which we cannot quench at any earthly spring, and the hunger which is only satisfied by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

Almighty Father, lift us out of our shadows into Thy light, out of our fears into Thy comfortable thoughts, out of our perplexities into Thy clear truth, out of our burdens into Thy strength, out of our foolish and disappointed purposes into Thy holy and blessed will, out of our troubles into Thy peace. For sin give repentance, for sorrow give trust, from the strife of passion and care grant rest, and do Thou visit indifference with Thy quickening power, lest we sleep away into the second death.

We praise Thee for our intellectual life, for the power to observe and think, plan and meditate, and to influence others by the energy of our minds ; and for all wise and good books and teachers whose words quicken, enlarge and enrich our thought.

We praise Thee for our moral life, that, notwithstanding our transgression and sin, conscience still speaks to us, and that we have still the power to choose the right and reject the wrong.

We praise Thee for our social life, for all its beneficent fellowships and ministries, for home and friends, and all the things which give us strength and peace amid the disquietude and strife of our passing days.

Our temptations and infirmities are many; be Thou our Strength and Helper now, and at all times. We commend ourselves to Thee. We ask Thy guidance in life, that we may be prepared in Thy good time for death, and that, living or dying, we may be Thine through Him who hath conquered death; and as His disciples, to Thee, His Father and our Father, we render our praise now and evermore. AMEN.

That we may hate what is mean, and love what is good; that we may no longer take counsel with vanity and passion, the desire of the eyes and the pride of life; that we may live according to Thy will in all the relations of life, and patiently bear every cross which Thy providence layest upon us; help us, O God.

That we may forget the sins and sorrows of the past,

retaining only the wisdom and humility which they may have taught us ; that we may look forward hopefully to the future, believing that Thou who hast led and blessed us hitherto, will lead and bless us still ; help us, O God.

Through all the mystery and change of our earthly days we would ever feel that in the Everlasting Strength and Peace we have our abiding place and home. We would ever strive to commit ourselves to the perfect and unchangeable Order and Will which control and guide our human destiny, assured that the appointments of Infinite Wisdom and Goodness must be better for us than aught else we can desire or dream.

Hear my prayer for all who need His help, and for all who are striving to follow Him. AMEN.

After Communion.

Grant, O God, that by this holy meditation and communion I may be strengthened for daily service. Suffer me not to break my vows, but help me to live as I pray. May I strive more than ever I have done to live closer to conscience, and to the sweet and holy light of the Redeemer's life. Bind me to Thyself in faithful obedience, and bind me to all my fellow-creatures in the dispositions, charities, and sympathies of my Lord and Saviour. AMEN.

Aids to Silent Worship.

O Holy Father, be with me now, and teach me. Show me my sins, O Lord, but give me grace to leave them.

O God, help me, and make me Thine. Give me Thy Holy Spirit, that I may learn of Christ, and be Thine, as Christ is Thine.

O Father, teach me more and more to enter into the spirit of Thy holy child Jesus. Give me grace to hear Thy voice, and to do Thy will, even as He did it.

Make me faithful, O my Father, in my place and work. Teach me to forget and forsake myself that I may find Thee.

O God, so graft, I pray Thee, the memory of Christ's life and death upon my heart, that, receiving His image in my soul, I may become more worthy to be called His disciple and Thy child.

Pour into my heart, O God, the Spirit of Jesus, that being made one with Him in obedience and sacrifice, I may become one with Thee, even as He is one.

God bless and keep me ; rule my heart and quicken me in the Spirit of Christ, from this time forth and evermore. AMEN.

NOTE.

THIS new edition is almost a new book. The services have been re-arranged and made into orders that may be easily followed by a congregation. They are framed on the lines of a way of worship which has been sanctioned by universal experience; but ample room is left in each order for the voluntary and personal prayer of the minister. The two ways of worship (liturgical and free) have each proved their right to exist, and they may exist side by side. Responses which enable people to take part directly and audibly in the prayers of the church both engage the attention and assist in the cultivation of reverent habits. There is as much danger in slighting forms as there is in dependence upon them. The form may be the vehicle and helper of the spirit. We must not fail to use as means what, in their ignorance, many have misused as ends:

“Oh, sacred be the flesh and blood
To which is linked a truth Divine!”

It is often said that the great and growing disparity

between forms of worship and the actual beliefs of men, is the gravest and most threatening of all the religious signs of our time. In preparing and revising this book I have sought to find words at once large enough and deep enough to express the common worship of Christian hearts. The introduction of an element of human casuistry into solemn acts of prayer and praise is something which ought, if possible, to be avoided. No honest man cares to repeat in church what is unbelievable out of church. The spirit of truth and the spirit of worship ought not to be two, but one. The best prayers are those which express in simple language, the simple needs, aspirations, trusts and fidelities of the religious and Christian soul. It is possible to welcome and love the new light and freedom of this new day of God, and yet keep the old reverence for the church and its worshipful observance and ways.

For much contained in this book I am indebted to various sources; but most of the prayers which will be new to the reader are, I believe, my own. The first of the *General Prayers* was given me by the late Dr. Caird, Principal of the University of Glasgow, for the fifth edition of this book and the second by the late Dr. T. Campbell Finlayson of Manchester. The general prayers by Dr. Martineau and Dr. Service, which I had permission to use, are omitted from this edition as they can now be found elsewhere.

The version of the 90th Psalm in the *Service of Commemoration* is taken from "The Dream of Geron-tius," by the late Cardinal Newman.

A *Table of Lessons* for the Sundays of the year has by special request, been added to this new edition.

This book represents the thought of years. It makes me glad to know that it has been helpful to many, and that its public use has contributed to the devoutness and dignity of public worship in some of the churches of the land.
