


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


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PREFACE

THE object of the present work is twofold: on the one hand, to make available for the use of English Churchmen and Churchwomen some of the treasures of ancient and mediæval devotion; on the other, to supply materials which may possibly be serviceable to those who are engaged on the problem of what is called "Prayer-Book Enrichment."

In other words, the object of the book throughout is not scientific, but practical; not to furnish exact translations of liturgical texts, but to assist devotion.

Hence I have not scrupled to modify the texts translated where it seemed to me desirable to do so. In ninety-nine cases out of a hundred the modification consists merely in omission. In some cases the omission was dictated by the feeling that the things omitted were at variance with the teaching or practice of the English Church, but in the majority of cases it has been due simply to a desire for brevity and compression. Many of the Mozarabic prayers in particular are, in the original,

of inordinate length; and though the wealth of the Latin language may disguise tautologies, they would be intolerably obvious in a translation. The Ambrosian Collects, on the other hand, are the shortest of all—shorter even than the Roman, which are as a rule models of terseness and dignified restraint.*

Similarly, I have not scrupled to modify the form or alter the application of some of the prayers translated; Bidding Prayers have been converted into direct supplications, Prefaces into ordinary prayers; a Post-Communion or Secreta may be used as a collect, and *vice versa*. Prayers have been transferred from one season or day to another; others, originally assigned to particular days or occasions, have been made available for more general use. Again, where a prayer exists in more than one form, I have occasionally combined points taken from different authorities. A later text, though less original from the critical point of view, may from the devotional

* The few additions which I have made are enclosed in square brackets. They are confined almost entirely to supplying the concluding formulæ of prayers, which are frequently omitted by the scribes as being too well known to require to be written out in full. Of course I cannot be sure that the formula which I have added is the one which the scribe would have given had he written it at length. Probably a certain liberty was used by the officiating priest in matters of this kind.

point of view be superior. All devotional literature is liable to modification by the practical experience of those who use it. The Psalter has been subject to this process to a very large extent.

To the more important of these changes attention is called in the notes which will be found at the end of the book. But whether the changes be small or great, they can all be controlled by those who use this book, as I have in all cases given exact references to the sources from which my materials are derived.

This system of exact references is one point in which this work differs from another, to which, by way of suggestion, it owes much: the late Dr. William Bright's *Ancient Collects*. On the other hand, I have carefully abstained from using over again any of Dr. Bright's materials. If in one or two cases I have inadvertently done so, it is due to the fact that, owing to the want of exact references, I have not identified quite all Dr. Bright's sources. But those who know and value his beautiful little book will, I trust, be glad to have this supplement to it.

Another point of difference is that I have confined myself entirely to Western Sources, leaving the rich mines of Eastern Liturgies at present unexplored.

The arrangement of the two books is also somewhat different. And a word may now be said on this point. The present work is divided into ten sections. The first consists of prayers which may be used throughout the year, morning and evening prayers, prayers for Holy Communion, etc. The second section contains devotions for the Church's seasons; the "Proprium de Tempore" or "Temporale" of the Latin Service Books. In this section the only point which calls for notice is the Liturgy for Corpus Christi Day. Surely there is nothing superstitious in keeping a special day in commemoration of our Lord's great bequest to us of "this wonderful Sacrament," seeing that on the Anniversary of its Institution, the remembrance even of it is over-shadowed by His deepening Passion.

The third section comprises prayers for special Saints' Days, the "Proprium Sanctorum" or "Sanctorale" of the Latin Service Books. In this will be found three names which are not at present in our English Calendar: St. John Chrysostom, January 27, the greatest of Christian orators; St. Pancratius or Pancras, the Boy-Martyr of Rome, May 12, who not only gives his name to a well-known London parish, but whose ruined church outside Canterbury is one of the earliest shrines of

English Christianity; and, most interesting at the present time, St. Louis of France, August 25. There could be no better consecration of our alliance with our ancient rival, France, than the admission into our Calendar of this royal Saint, one of the most beautiful characters ever developed under the grace of God,

In that fierce light which beats upon a throne.

The fourth section contains prayers for certain general classes of Saints' Days, the "Com-mune Sanctorum" of the Latin Service Books. These would furnish devotions for those lesser festivals for which no special provision is made in the Book of Common Prayer.

The fifth section consists of intercessory prayers, general and special; while the sixth contains prayers for the departed. I think that one effect of the awful war now raging has been to make us realize more clearly our communion with the departed, especially with those who lay down their lives in this great ordeal; and I do not see how there can be any communion worthy of the name, which is not based on mutual prayer. The late Dr. Ellicott, sometime Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, who certainly was no Romanizer, once told a friend of mine that, in his opinion, the loss of prayers for the departed at the Reformation

had contributed more than any other single cause to despiritualize the religious life of England.

The seventh section contains prayers for blessings, general and special; the eighth, for special Christian graces.

The ninth section contains prayers for special occasions. Of these, the prayers "In Time of War," "In Time of Trouble," and "For Peace," have already seen the light.

The last section consists of prayers for the use of the clergy, especially in the Visitation of the Sick and Dying.

In almost all these sections it will be found that a considerable proportion of the devotions takes the form of suggested orders for the celebration of the Holy Communion. It is in this sphere, I think, that our Book of Common Prayer stands in greatest need of "enrichment." When we notice the number of Masses for special occasions and for special objects (*Missæ uotiuæ*) contained in the Latin Service Books, the poverty, not to say destitution, of our own Book becomes apparent.

In these suggested orders no alteration is made in the structure of our Communion Service, though there are additions. The prayer "Before the Consecration" corresponds with the "*Secreta*" of the Roman and allied

rituals; the prayer "Before the Blessing" with the Post-Communion. Of a Post-Communion we have recently had a fine example in the prayer, "Remember, Lord, what Thou hast wrought in us," the best of all the prayers put forth by authority in connexion with the present war. The Benedictions, which are such a beautiful feature especially of the Gallican and allied rituals, were given by the Bishop during the Communion of the people. I have placed them, in accordance with our own practice, at the end of the service. Where the passages of Scripture given for the Epistle and Gospel are enclosed in square brackets, they are merely my own suggestions; in all other cases they are taken from some ancient authority, which is indicated in the notes at the end of the book.

It will be observed that in these suggested orders I have not hesitated to bring together elements derived from different sources. But just as "Grace makes men think wonderfully alike," so the spirit of prayer harmonizes the devotions of different branches of the Church of Christ.

Of course, many of the devotions set down for the celebration of Holy Communion are quite suitable for use at other times.

Two things have come home to me with

special force during my labours on this book. One is the courage in supplication of the composers of these ancient prayers. They are checked by no chill doubts as to whether it is wrong to ask for this or that, because it is "material." Whatever may be innocently wished for—health, safety, victory—they freely and frankly ask at the hands of the Heavenly Father, who knows how to give good gifts unto His children. They act boldly on the precept: "In *everything* by prayer and supplication let your requests be made known unto God." The other point which has come home to me is this: the truth of the old maxim about the identity of the "lex orandi" and the "lex credendi." And I do not think that anyone can use these devotions in the spirit in which they were composed, without finding his own hold on the faith enlightened and confirmed.

The following is a list of the books and editions which have been used in the preparation of this work, with the abbreviations by which they are indicated:

For the three Roman Sacramentaries, the Leonian, the Gelasian, and the Gregorian (Leon. S., Gel. S., Greg. S.), I have used Muratori's *Liturgia Romana Vetus*, 2 vols., folio,

Venice, 1748. The columns of this edition have been preserved in Mr. Feltoe's edition of the Leonian Sacramentary (Cambridge, 1896), and in Mr. Wilson's edition of the Gelasian Sacramentary (Oxford, 1894); but, unfortunately, not in Mr. Wilson's recent edition of the Gregorian Sacramentary under Charles the Great (Henry Bradshaw Society, 1915). For the study of these three Sacramentaries, Mr. Wilson's *Classified Index to the Roman Sacramentaries* (Cambridge, 1892) has been an absolutely invaluable aid. For the Roman Missal (Rom. M.) I have used the edition by Dr. Lippe, in two volumes, issued by the Henry Bradshaw Society (London, 1899, 1907). Vol. i. contains a reprint of the first printed edition (Milan, 1474); vol. ii. contains additions from seventeen later editions, sixteen prior, and one subsequent to the reform of the Missal by Pius V. in 1570. (The Indices are by Mr. Wilson.)

The Missale Gallicanum Vetus (Gall. M.), the Sacramentarium Gallicanum (Gall. S.), and the allied Gothic and Francic Missals (Goth. M., Franc. M.) have been taken from the second volume of Muratori (*u.s.*).

For the Mozarabic Missal and Breviary (Moz. M., Moz. B.) I have used the reprints of Migne (Patrologia Latina, lxxxv, lxxxvi, 1862, 1891.) To these sources must now be added Dom

Ferotin's two monumental works, the Mozarabic Liber Ordinum (Moz. L.O.), and the Mozarabic Liber Sacramentorum (Moz. S.) forming vols. v. and vi. of Monumenta Ecclesiæ Liturgica (Paris, 1904, 1912). The former contains some of the most beautiful and pathetic prayers ever written by human pen. Further, the Mozarabic Psalter, issued by the Henry Bradshaw Society, under Mr. Gilson's editorship, in 1905 (Moz. Ps.); the Liber Comicus sive Lectionarius Missæ Ecclesiæ Toletanæ (Lib. Com.), edited by Dom Morin, Anecdota Maredsolana, i. (Maredsous, 1893) must also be mentioned, for, though it contains no prayers, it has furnished several of the passages suggested for use as Epistles and Gospels on particular occasions.

For the Ambrosian Rite I have used the fine edition of the Manuale Ambrosianum (Amb. Ma.) by Magestretti (2 vols., Milan, 1905). Of the Missal and Breviary (Amb. M., Amb. B.) I have only used modern editions; of the Missal, the handsome folio edition printed at the Archiepiscopal Press (Milan, 1909, divided into three sections with separate pagination); of the Breviary, the beautiful little edition in four volumes published by Cogliati (Milan, 1902). It should be noted that the Ambrosian Breviary is not divided, like the Roman, into

four sections — Hiemalis, Verna, Æstiva, Autumnalis—but only into two. Hiemalis, Æstiva, each subdivided into two volumes (Æst., i., ii.; Hiem., i., ii.).

Of English Service Books, the following have been laid under contribution:

The Sarum Missal (Sar. M.), edited by F. H. Dickinson (Burntisland, 1861, 1883.)

The Sarum Breviary (Sar. B.), edited by Francis Procter and Christopher Wordsworth, 3 vols. (Cambridge, 1882, 1879, 1886.)

The Sarum Manual (Sar. Ma.), printed as an appendix to the edition of the York Manual, mentioned below.

The Leofric Missal (Leof. M.), edited by F. E. Warren (Oxford, 1883).

The Pontifical of Egbert, Archbishop of York (Egb. P.).

The York Pontifical of Archbishop Christopher Bainbridge (York P.).

The York Manual and Processional (York Ma., York Proc.).

All these three northern Service Books form part of the publications of the Surtees Society for the years 1853, 1873, and 1874, respectively.

For information as to several of these books and editions I am indebted to the Rev. H. A. Wilson, Fellow of Magdalen College,

Oxford, to whom all liturgiologists owe so much.

I have not entered into any discussion of the character, age, or mutual relations of any of the sources which I have used, because, as I have already stated, my object throughout has not been scientific, but practical.

Introductory Prayers.

O LORD, open Thou my mouth to bless Thy Holy Name; cleanse my heart from all vain thoughts, that I may be heard in the presence of Thy Divine Majesty; through our Lord, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, who liveth and reigneth with Thee, etc. (*Sar. B.*, ii. 1.)

MAKE us, O Lord, we beseech Thee, intent on Thy sacred service, and that we may serve Thee without any spot of offence, do Thou Thyself make us what Thou wouldest have us to be; through our Lord, etc.

(*Rom. M.*, ii. 277.)

Morning Prayers.

SAVE us, Almighty God, and grant us everlasting light; through, etc.

(*Greg. S.*, 259.)

ALMIGHTY God, eternal Creator of all things, who after night's departure causeth the day-star to arise, bringing back light to our eyes, we pray and beseech Thee to drive away our sins, and to pour into our minds the light of eternal joy. Amen. (*Moz. S.*, 758.)

O GOD, the true Light of believers, the eternal Glory of the just, whose light never setteth, and whose brightness knows no bounds, grant us to live in Thy glory, and to enter into Thine eternity, that as, after the night past, Thou hast caused us to see the light, so Thou mayest bid us to come to that blessed and everlasting day; through, etc.

WE give Thee thanks, Almighty God, because in Thee we have rested in sleep, and to Thee we have risen after rest; let Thy grace ever wake in us, and the splendour of Thy brightness illuminate us wholly, that by striving we may attain to the path which leadeth to Thy light; through, etc.

POUR into our hearts, Almighty God, the pure and serene light of Thy truth, that we may avoid the darkness of sin, who have come to know and fear Thee, the eternal Light; through, etc.

WE give Thee thanks, Almighty God, for that Thou hast delivered us from the darkness of the night past, and illumined us with the light of day; we humbly beseech Thee that the close of day may find us pure in mind and undefiled in body; through, etc.

HEAR us, O Lord, the Giver of the kindly light, and illumine our hearts with the brightness of Thy shining, that we may not stain this day with any work of darkness, but, following Thy guidance, may in all things obey Thy blessed will; through, etc. (*Ibid.*, 442.)

MAY Thy grace, O Lord, bless us, and bring us to everlasting life; through Christ, etc. (*Ibid.*)

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, by whose command the day ariseth, and the world is adorned with the splendour of light, receive our prayers, and show us the light of Thy countenance, that, walking in the way of Thy salvation, we may follow Thee as our ruler and guide; through, etc. (*Ibid.*, 444.)

O GOD, the Author of the light, and the Discoverer of all brightness, enlighten, we beseech Thee, the darkness of our souls, and confirm Thy servants with Thy morning blessing; through, etc. (*Amb. B. Æst.*, i. 93.)

WITH all our heart we venerate, and with praises due we honour, the exalted Name of Thy Majesty, Almighty God, beseeching that Thou, graciously receiving the morning service of Thy humble servants, wouldst follow and cherish us with Thy wonted pity; through, etc. (*Amb. Ma.*, ii. 415.)

O LORD our God, whose Kingdom is everlasting, enlighten us, we beseech Thee, with Thy splendour, and confirm us with Thy strength; through, etc.

O LORD and merciful God, graciously look upon our morning prayers, and grant to Thy suppliants Thy heavenly benefits; that by Thine aid we may avoid the snares of the enemy; through, etc. (*Amb. Ma.*, ii. 439.)

Evening Prayers.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, by whose command the sun gives light by day, and the moon by night, graciously listen to our evening praises; grant us to pass tranquilly the ensuing night, and, when the darkness is past, fit us once more for our morning sacrifices, that the rising day may not show forth in us any stain of sin; through, etc.

O GOD, who commandest Thy mercy in the daytime, and declarest it in the night-season, we beseech Thee by day to protect us in safety, and by night to guard our rest. Amen. Through Thy mercy, etc. (*Ibid.*, 215.)

O GOD, whose radiance is not dimmed, and whose brightness knows no setting, we beseech Thee, that, while night succeeds to day, Thy light may ever rise upon our understanding, and our inner man be renewed by the splendour of Thy visitation, that we may not be overwhelmed by the darkness of sin; through, etc. (*Ibid.*, 243.)

THE day is past, O Lord, and we offer to Thee our evening sacrifice, humbly beseeching Thy Majesty, that whatever in us is darkened by the night of sin may be illumined by the brightness of Thy light, and that while our eyes are closed in sleep, our minds may be awake to Thee, so that, at the close of night, we may welcome with Thy praises the return of day. Amen. (*Ibid.*, 699.)

WE beseech Thee, O Lord, to hear the vows of Thy suppliant people; let our prayer be set forth in Thy sight as the incense, and let the lifting up of our hands be as the evening sacrifice; and let the gift of Thy mercy protect us in our acts by day, and guard us in our sleep by night; through, etc.

WE beseech Thee, O Lord, who art the true Light, and Author of light, dispel from us the darkness of sin, and illumine us with the light of virtue; through, etc. (*Gall. S.*, 961.)

WE beseech Thee, O Lord our God, repair the weariness of the day by the quiet of the night, that by the due succession of times our weakness may be refreshed; through, etc.

(*Leon. S.*, 373.)

HEAR, O Lord, Thy servants, who render to Thy Name their evening vows, and as Thou hast preserved them through each moment of the day, so deign to guard them through the quiet of the night; through, etc.

(*Greg. S.*, 236.)

HAVE mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, and abolish in Thy clemency the multitude of our iniquities; and whatsoever we have sinned during this day in thought, [or word,] or deed, do Thou graciously forgive, that escaping all the snares of the night, we may rise at morn in safety to pay our joyful debt of praise; through, etc.

HAVE mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, and may the light of Thy clearness illumine the darkness of our minds, that we may cheerfully walk in the paths of righteousness, and after our departure attain to blessedness with Thee; through, etc.

THOU hast given the night, O Lord, for rest, but the enemy seeketh occasion by reason of the darkness to tempt us with evil thoughts; wherefore we humbly beseech Thy Majesty, that in Thy gracious goodness Thou wouldest be with us through this night, and pour into our hearts the light of Thy Holy Spirit; through, etc. (*Ibid.*, 365, *shortened.*)

O GOD, who workest salvation in the midst of the earth, to whom the darkness is no darkness, and the night is as clear as the day, lighten our darkness, we beseech Thee, that after a tranquil and peaceful night we may rise at morning time to praise Thee; through, etc. (*Amb. Ma.*, ii. 418.)

O GOD, who to give rest to man's labour, spreadest a veil over Thy works, hear the prayers of Thy servants, and bring us free from offence to sing Thy morning praises; through, etc. (*Ibid.*, 440.)

O GOD, who above all changes remainest unchangeable, grant strength to our hearts, that being freed from all darkness of ignorance, we may be established in the light of Thy truth; through, etc. (*Ibid.*, 445.)

GUIDE us, O God, through the changing seasons, and preserve us through the successions of day and night, that, as by the

gift of Thy mercy we have passed this day in safety, so we may pass this night in purity of mind and body well pleasing to Thee; through Thy Son, (who riseth from the dead,¹) Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (*Goth. M.*, 582.)

GREAT and everlasting is Thy light, O Lord, and therefore we entreat Thy undeserved mercy, that our prayer, which is held captive by sin, and darkened by the hindrance of the enemy, may be purged by the brightness of Thy countenance; through, etc.

WE give Thee thanks, Almighty God, because, as day declines, Thou surroundest us with the brightness of the evening light; humbly entreating Thy boundless mercy, that Thou wouldest in like wise illumine our hearts with the light of Thy Holy Spirit; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with Thee in the unity of the same Spirit liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

THE day is past, and we give thanks unto Thy Name, Almighty God, humbly entreating Thy mercy, that whatsoever sins we have

HAVE mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, and fill our hearts with the sweetness of Thy love, that being firmly established in the bonds of Thy peace, we may yield no entry to the enemy. Let Thy protection overshadow us, and Thine angel-guards defend us, that while our wearied limbs repose, our souls may ever watch unto Thee, who watchest over us, O our God, who livest, and dost reign, and govern all things, world without end. Amen.

In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us depart and rest in peace. Amen.





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


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
