



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INTRODUCTION

The Montana Legislative Council publishes the Directory of Interim Committees as a summary reference to the study assignments, interim committee memberships, and staff of interim legislative committees.

The Committee on Priorities considers requests for interim studies based on resolutions adopted by the legislature. At the end of the 1977 session, the Committee on Priorities assigned studies to seven interim committees, most of which are formed of members appointed from several standing committees in each house. All interim committees are bipartisan and are equally composed of senators and representatives. A chairman is elected by the members of the committee.

Each committee makes its own study and final recommendations for presentation to the next legislature. Approval of recommendations by the Legislative Council or a full standing committee is not required.

Staff assistance for interim studies is provided by the Legislative Council.

In addition to the interim committees, other committees that are established by statute continue to operate during the interim. In the following pages are listed all committees that have been established to operate during the 1977-79 interim.



SUBCOMMITTEE ON WATER RIGHTS

That resodistricts. lution asks for a study of the collection, preservation, and dissemination of Montana's historical and cultural heritage, investigate alternative methods of financing and coordinating an archival system for the state, the development of archeological sites, matters related to the Historical Society, and other related topics. The third assignment is a study of the governance of Montana's vocational education programs in elementary schools, high schools, postsecondary vocational centers, and colleges. As requested by HJR 100, the subcommittee is to recommend changes that will promote efficiency and effectiveness and determine the roles to be played by the various governing entities.





REVENUE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE


The Revenue Oversight Committee was established by Chapter 458, Laws of 1977, as a joint committee of the Legislature active until adjournment of the 46th Legislature. The committee is to make interim studies of the statewide reappraisal of real property and its property tax consequences, the taxation of financial institutions by methods that may replace the bank shares tax, and the appropriate level of taxation of the gross proceeds of metal mines. The committee is also charged with continuing legislative oversight of the Department of Revenue. The Department of Revenue will work closely with the committee to provide technical assistance.

Creation of such a commission is required by Article XIII, Section 3 of the 1972 Montana Constitution, which states that the commission is to "recommend compensation for the judiciary and the elected members of the legislative and executive branches."




WESTERN STATES FORESTRY TASK FORCE
