

The North Mails, by Oldmeldrum, Banff, and Inverness, and that by Kintore and Huntly to Fochabers, are dispatched at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, and arrive from half past 6 to 8 at night. The Buchan Mail, from Peterhead, by Mintlaw and Ellon, arrives at 3 o'clock, and is dispatched at 4 afternoon. The Deeside Rider, from Kincardine O'Niel, by Banchory, arrives daily at half past 2, and is dispatched at 4 o'clock. The Skene and Alford Runner, every day, at half past 2, and dispatched at 4 o'clock.—There is also a Runner to Maryculter and Durris, on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday, dispatched at 4 o'clock. Letters must be put into the Office for the North, Buchan, and other Roads, before the arrival of the South Mail, otherwise they cannot go for-ward that night.

Houses occupied in different tenements, being distinct properties, to pay 1s 6d for each window under 7. If the windows exceed 7, to be charged as an entire house.

Windows in Shops or Warehouses, in front, and on the ground or base-

ment storey, are exempt, if not exceeding the number of 3.

Poor who receive public charity, are exempted; also, persons having 3 children wholly maintained by them, and occupying houses not worth £5 yearly rent, and not having more than 6 windows.

Houses furnished, and left to the care of any person or servant, are liable

to window duty.

DUTIES ON COMMERCIAL SERVANTS.

Travellers or Riders, where one is employed, £1 10s. For two or more, £2 10s. each.

Clerk, Book-keeper, or Office-keeper, where one is employed, £1—for two or more do., £1 10s. each. Shopmen, Warehousemen, Cellarmen, Porters, &c. £1 each.—The only exemptions from these duties, are Apprentices bound for seven years, where no premium has been given or contracted for; and male persons employed as Shopmen wholly maintained and lodged in the house of their employers, being under 18 years of age.

^{*} Houses having less than 7 windows, if charged to the Inhabited House Duty, are liable to the duty of 3s.; and if not charged to that duty, only to 2s. 3d.
