MEMORANDUM

TO THE PRESIDENT

DATE

10. The tenth part of the memorandum discusses the need for a strong and effective intelligence community. It suggests that the President should ensure that the intelligence community is well-funded and equipped to gather and analyze information that is essential for the national security.

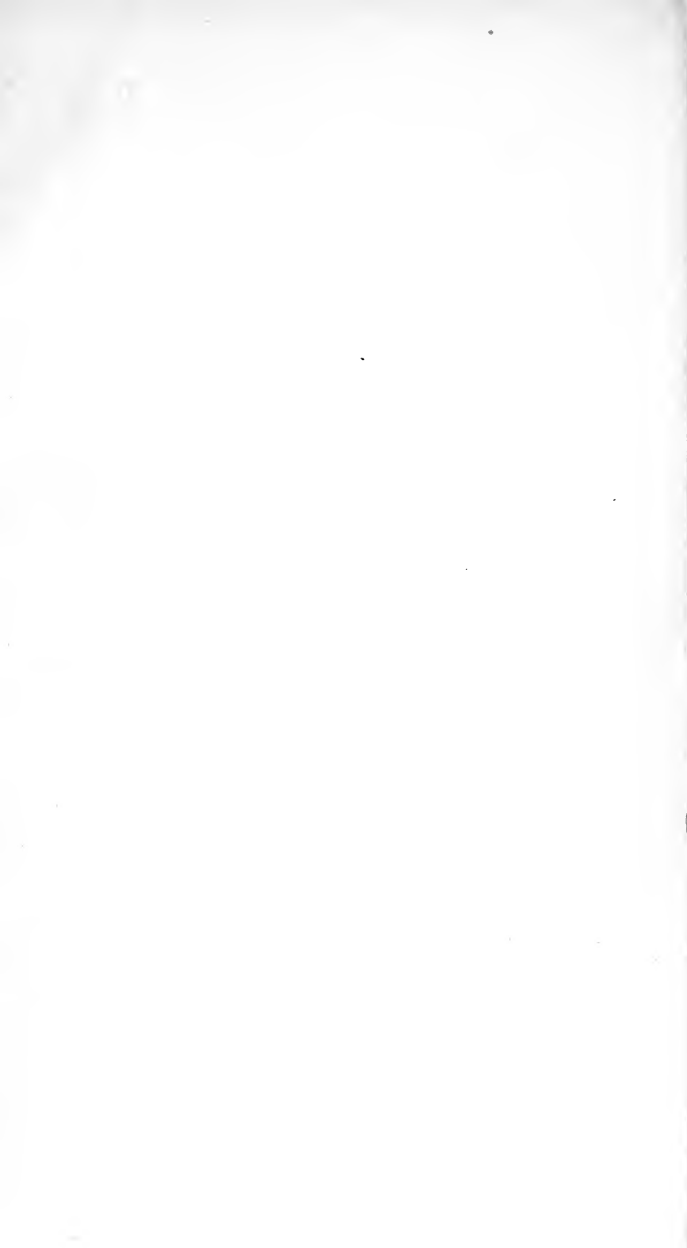
