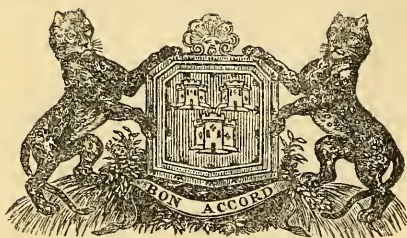

CONVEYANCES FROM ABERDEEN.

ABOYNE.—The “MARQUIS OF HUNTLY” Coach leaves Aboyne for Banchory every lawful day at 6⁴⁵, A.M., arriving in time for the 8.45, A. Down Train to Aberdeen. Passengers from Aberdeen to Aboyne, leave by the Deeside Railway at 4⁰, P.M., arriving at Banchory, at 5⁰, P.M., at which hour the coach starts for Aboyne.

CITY RENTAL.—The estimated rental of heritages, within the burgh and freedom of the City, taxed for certain purposes by the Board of Taxers, was, in 1821, £74,869; in 1852, it was £134,480; thus showing an increase of nearly double.

CORPORATION FUNDS.—The accounts of the Corporation for the year ending 15th Oct., 1853, show a total revenue of £23,650 17s. 2d.; and the expenditure, £20,331 13s. 11d., leaving a surplus of £3319 3s. 3d. The amount of Treasury stock, as at the last noted date, was—*Cr.*, £236,827 10s.; *Dr.*, £175,040 4s. 8d.; balance, £61,787 5s. 4d.—this balance being, however, subject to the surplus expenditure, on the Kirk charge, which amounts to between £1100 and £1200 yearly.

POPULATION.—By the Census of 1851, the population of Aberdeen amounted to 71,973;—made up of the following items, viz.:—East Parish, 5,403 (inclusive of 221 military in barracks); West, 11,227; North, 6,167; South, 4,548; Greyfriars, 6,654; St. Clement's, 7,466—total of six city parishes, 41,465: Old Machar parish (part of), 30,503; Banchory-Devenick (part of), 5—gross total as before, 71,973, of which number, 31,746 are males, and 40,227 females. The returns state the number of inhabited houses at 5,839, with 17,356 separate occupiers.

The population of the city and county, in the same year, was 214,658.

POLICE ESTABLISHMENT.

By the Act 10th, Geo. IV., (1829) "for better paving, cleansing, lighting, watching, and improving the Streets, Lanes, and other Public Places and Passages, within the City of Aberdeen, and certain grounds adjacent; for regulating the Police thereof, and for Supplying the Inhabitants with Water," the city and suburbs are divided into Nine Wards, each of which returns two Commissioners, who, with four *ex officio* Commissioners, are entrusted with carrying the act into effect. The qualification of electors is the occupation of premises within the respective wards assessed under the Act, and valued at not less than £5 of yearly rent. And the Commissioners are chosen from electors occupying premises in the ward, assessed under the Act, of the yearly value of not less than £15, and being likewise resident in the ward.

The election takes place on the Second Thursday of October, biennially. The next election is in 1855.

Sweden *via* Belgium. under ¼ oz. 1s. 2d. above ½ oz. 2s. 4d. above 1 oz. 4s. 8d. Every additional ounce 2s. 4d. Prepayment optional.—Newspapers free.

India *via* Cape of Good Hope. 1s. per half-oz. Prepayment optional.—Newspapers free.

Island of Ascension. 1s. per half-oz. Prepayment compulsory.—Newspapers free.

Sierra Leone. 1s. per half-oz. Prepayment compulsory.—Newspapers free.

West Coast of Africa. 1s. per half-oz. Prepayment compulsory.—Newspapers free.

Island of St. Helena, by Cape Packet. 1s. per half-oz. Prepayment compulsory.—Newspapers free.

EXCEPTIONAL RATES OF POSTAGE, &c.

Periodicals not of daily publication, issued in the shape of pamphlets, may be sent to Belgium, Bremen, France, Hamburg, Holland, Prussia, and the United States, at the following rate, which must be prepaid: not exceeding 2 oz., 1d.; 2 oz. and not exceeding 3 oz., 6d.; 3 oz. and not exceeding 4 oz., 8d.; with an addition of 2d. for every additional ounce up to 16 ounces, above which weight the privilege does not extend; and at the same rate of postage, pamphlets, not being periodicals, may be sent to the United States, if not exceeding 8 oz.

Newspapers from France and Belgium pay ½d. each; and Newspapers from Canada 1d. each.

The postage on Newspapers to the parts of Turkey, &c., specified in the Table, is as follows: not exceeding ½ oz., 1½d.; ½ oz. and not exceeding 1 oz., 3d.;

1 oz. and not exceeding 2 oz., 6d.; with an addition of 3d. for every additional ounce.

The privilege of the Book Post to and from India and New South Wales is limited to packages not exceeding 3 pounds in weight. Any package weighing more than 3 pounds is liable to the Letter Rate of postage.

According to the regulations of the German Customs' Union, no Letter exceeding 50 grammes (a little more than 1½ oz.) in weight, and containing any other enclosure than paper, can be allowed to circulate by the post. Any Letters, therefore, forwarded in the Mail to Prussia, above that weight, and containing any other enclosure than paper, will be liable, on their arrival at the Prussian frontier, to be stopped, and sent to the Custom House for delivery as freight.

INLAND POSTAGE AND GENERAL REGULATIONS.

All Letters and Newspapers should bear a FULL and LEGIBLE address, to facilitate their despatch and insure a speedy delivery

The prepaid rates of postage on Inland Letters and Packets, are as follows:—not exceeding half an ounce in weight, 1d; one ounce, 2d; two ounces, 4d; three ounces, 6d; and so on, two rates being added for every ounce. When put into the Letter Box unpaid, they are charged double the prepaid rates of postage.

POSTAGE STAMPS, &c.

Stamps may be procured at the General Office, Market Street, the Stamp Office, and the several Receiving houses.

When the value of Stamps on a letter is less than the amount of the postage to which it is liable, the letter will be charged double the amount of such difference on delivery.

Stamps may be used for Foreign, Colonial, and Ship Letters, *outwards*. Letters for *parts abroad* posted with Stamps of less value than the full amount of

Postage, if addressed to places to which prepayment is not compulsory, will be forwarded, charged with only such amount of Postage as shall be equal to the difference between the value of the Stamps and the proper rate of Postage; but letters addressed to *places abroad*, to which prepayment is compulsory, if posted with Stamps of less value than the full amount of Postage, will be sent to the Dead-Letter Office, to be returned, in all practicable cases, to the writer. Stamps are not permitted to be used on Letters arriving in the United Kingdom from the Colonies or Foreign Countries.

These Regulations are applicable to Newspapers, in those cases where they are liable to Postage.

If the Stamps affixed to letters are mutilated or defaced the letters will be liable to the unpaid rate.

A Stamp which has been cut from an envelope and affixed to a letter, entitles it to pass free of charge.

Re-directed Letters are charged an additional postage for each re-direction, according to the Prepaid Scale.

Letters to Warm Climates should be sealed with wafers, as wax destroys the letters by melting, causing them to adhere to one another.

No Letter, when once posted, can be given up to any but the person to whom it is addressed, neither is any person allowed to alter the address of a letter after being posted.

Adhesive Stamps should be placed on the right-hand corner of the upper side of the letters, above the superscription. The most effectual plan is to dip the label wholly in water, to shake off the water immediately, and to press the label upon the letter with a piece of clean blotting paper. *When the gum is dull in appearance, it will require rather more time and moisture to make it stick firmly, than when it is glossy.* The purpose of wetting the label wholly is to counteract the tendency it has to curl up from the letter, when one side only is wetted, a tendency caused by the expansion of that side as it imbibes the moisture.

LIMITATION OF WEIGHT.

A letter to pass *unpaid* by the post may not exceed *Four Ounces*. All above that weight must be prepaid in Stamps. In the event of any *unpaid* letter above the weight of four ounces being posted, it will be charged with *double* the *prepaid* rates of postage; if *insufficiently paid*, by affixed stamps, it will be charged with *double* the amount of the *difference* between the *stamps affixed* and the *prepaid rates*, and *thus charged*, "shall and may be *detained* and *opened*, and, at the *option* of the *Postmaster-General*, shall be either returned or given up to the *sender* thereof, or given up to the person to whom it shall be addressed, or be forwarded to the place of its destination."—*Treasury Warrant*, '22d October, 1847.

LIMITATION OF SIZE.

A letter to pass by the post, either *paid* or *unpaid*, must not exceed the dimensions of *twenty-four inches* in length, or breadth, or width, or depth. Any letter above these dimensions, may if *fully paid* be *detained* and *opened* or forwarded at the *option* of the *Postmaster-General*. Any letter *unpaid*, or *insufficiently*, will be taxed precisely after the scale of charges mentioned in the preceding paragraph, as applicable to *unpaid* letters exceeding four ounces weight, and *thus charged* be either *detained* and *opened*, and returned to the *sender*, or forwarded at the *option* of the *Postmaster-General*. The only *exceptions* to the foregoing regulations as to size and weight are in the case of—1. Parliamentary proceedings or Addresses to Her Majesty. 2. Petitions to either Houses of Parliament, forwarded to any Member of such House. 3. Printed votes or proceedings of Parliament. 4. Letters or packets to or from public departments or public officers in Her Majesty's service. 5. Letters, &c., to or from places abroad.

All persons sending letters by the post *unpaid*, which, from any cause whatever, cannot be delivered to the parties to whom they are addressed, are liable to pay the postage charged thereon, which may be recovered, with costs, by summary proceedings before a Magistrate.

Printed votes and proceedings in Parliament are charged at the following rate, between places in the United Kingdom, and between the United Kingdom and the Colonies, when conveyed by packet:—

Not exceeding 4 ounces, 1d.
Exceeding 4 ounces, and not exceeding 8 ounces, 2d.
Exceeding 8 ounces, & not exceeding 12 ounces, 3d.
And so on in proportion. Prepayment optional.

ILLEGAL CONVEYANCE OF LETTERS.

By the 1st Victoria, cap. 36, sec. 2. any person illegally conveying Letters, incurs a penalty of £5 for every offence, and £100 for every week the practice is continued. The sender also incurs a penalty of £5 for every offence, with full costs of suit. NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS, SEAMEN, AND SOLDIERS IN HER MAJESTY'S SERVICE ABROAD.

Letters to seamen and soldiers may be forwarded by post, at the rate of one penny each, under the following regulations. 1st. The penny must be paid at the time the letter is put into the post office. 2nd. The direction must signify the class of seamen or soldier. 3d. The name of the ship, regiment, or corps to which he belongs. 4th. The letters must not exceed half an ounce, and be upon their private concerns only. Letters for seamen or soldiers, whether in her Majesty's, or in East India Company's military or naval service, (while on actual service) may be forwarded under the foregoing regulations, to India, China, &c., *via* Southampton, they can now be sent to India, *via* Marseilles, on payment of the British rate of one penny, besides the French rate of 5s., if under a quarter of an ounce, or 10d., exceeding that weight, or to any foreign country, on payment of the foreign rate of postage, in addition to the British rate of 1d. as above. Letters for seamen or soldiers, forwarded by private ships, (with the following exceptions) St. Helena, East Indies, New South Wales, Cape of Good Hope, and Mauritius, are charged 3d. each. Letters of soldiers and seamen, addressed to the United States of America, will, in future be chargeable with the American rate of five cents, or two-pence half-penny sterling each, in addition to the ordinary British rate of one penny. The postage of all such letters must be pre-paid. Warrant officers, either in the army or navy, or masters mates or engineers of the navy, are not entitled to transmit letters at less than the usual rates of postage. Seamen's or soldiers' letters received from any part beyond sea, upon which the said penny has not been pre-paid, shall be charged to the receiver, with double the rate. *viz.*, 2d. each.

The following Instructions have been addressed to all Postmasters, and are strictly acted upon:—

"GENERAL POST OFFICE.—On and after the 1st January, 1845, should any Letter or Packet be tendered at your Office, which you may ascertain to contain, or which you have reason to believe, contains any of the following articles, *viz.*—Any Glass or Glass Bottle; any Razor, Scissors, Knife, Fork, or other Sharp or Pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetables, or other perishable substances, any Bladder or other Vessel containing Liquid; or any article, matter, or thing whatsoever, which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious either to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags; you will refuse to receive such Letter or Packet.

"In the event of any Letter or Packet being taken in by you, and you do not, until afterwards, discover that it contains any Article as above described, or should any such Letter or Packet be deposited in the Letter Box, you will not forward it on its destination, but you will detain it in your Office, and inform me by the first Post, of the circumstances, taking the precise Address of the Packet, and its contents, or what you suppose them to be, when proper steps will be taken in this Department of the case, and you will be instructed in what manner to dispose of the Letter or Packet.

"Should any Letter or Packet, containing any article as before-mentioned, not to be discovered by the Postmaster at whose office it may be posted, but be forwarded on to its destination, the Receiving Postmaster, to whose town it may be addressed, upon discovering, or having every reason to believe, that its contents are such as those alluded to, will not send it out for delivery, but will detain it in his office, reporting the circumstance by the first Post, and stating the nature of its contents, when he will be duly instructed in what manner to dispose of it.

SERVICE OF PARLIAMENTARY NOTICES.—These Notices may be sent through the Post, provided they are posted on or before the 12th of December, at the chief offices of London, Dublin, and Edinburgh, or any of the following offices:—Birmingham, Exeter, Lincoln, Liverpool, Leeds, Manchester, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Norwich, Shrewsbury, Glasgow, Aberdeen, Inverness, Belfast, Cork, Athlone. the words "Parliamentary Notice," must be legibly printed on the face of the letter, the postage must be prepaid by means of Stamps, and a Registration Fee of 6d (which must be paid in money) at the time of posting, which may be known by applying to the time above offices. Duplicate Lists of the addresses must be sent with the Notices, which must be arranged in the same order as entered on the lists.

PERIODICAL WORKS.

Periodical Works, Printed Pamphlets, &c., not of daily publication may be forwarded by post to the United States, Oldenburgh, Lubec, Bremen, Belgium, Holland, and France, at the following regulated rates of postage, viz., not exceeding 2 oz., 1d.; 2 oz., and not exceeding 3 oz., 6d.; 3 oz., and not exceeding 4 oz., 8d., and so on; 2d. for every additional oz., up to 16 oz., in the case of Periodical Works, and 8 oz., for Pamphlets, the privilege being restricted to these weights respectively, provided the following conditions be carefully observed: 1st.—The postage must be prepaid. 2d.—They must be sent without covers, or in covers open at the ends or sides. 3d.—They must be printed in the English language.

NEWSPAPERS.

All Newspapers must be sent in covers, open at the sides, and no words or communication may be printed or written on such papers, or covers, after the same shall have been published, other than the name and address of the person to whom they are sent; nor any thing enclosed or concealed in either newspaper or cover. News-venders only may print their names and addresses thereon; Newspapers may be examined by the Officers of the Post Office; and if there be any breach of the above regulations, the packet is chargeable with Treble the amount of Postage to which a letter of the same weight would have been liable. Any person contravening the law, may, at the option of the Postmaster-General, be prosecuted as for a misdemeanour.

Clause of the Act of 1st Victoria, cap. 34, sec. 32.

"And be it further enacted, that in all cases in which a question shall arise, whether a printed paper is entitled to the privileges of a Newspaper, or other publication, hereby privileged, so far as respects the transmission thereof by the Post, under the Post Office Acts, the question shall be referred to the determination of the Postmaster-General, whose decision, with the concurrence of the Lords of the Treasury, shall be final."

MARKS OR WRITING ON NEWSPAPERS.

Writing or marks are allowed on a Newspaper

passing by Post between any one part of the United Kingdom and any other part, provided that a postage of one penny be paid, by means of a stamp conspicuously fixed outside the cover or folded Newspaper. But the privilege is confined to writing or marks on the Newspaper itself, and is not to extend to the cover. Any writing or marks other than the address, on which, or (if the Postage be not prepaid as above) on the Newspaper itself, will subject the Newspaper to the same rate of postage as that to which an unpaid letter of the same weight is liable.

Newspapers posted in Town, addressed to any part within the town delivery, charged paid or unpaid, 1d.

Newspapers printed or published in any of the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, and sent by Post between any of such Islands and Great Britain or Ireland, will be liable to the full letter rates of Postage, according to the scale for charging Inland Letters, with the exception of such as are printed in the French language.

NEWSPAPERS FROM THE BRITISH COLONIES

are delivered free of Postage at any place within the British dominions. Those for persons who have removed, may be forwarded by post, free of charge, provided they have not been opened at the place to which they were originally addressed.

THE BRITISH COLONIES AND FOREIGN PARTS.

Newspapers liable to the Stamp Duty may be forwarded to the British Colonies and Possessions by her Majesty's packet-boats, free of the duty of postage, provided the same be duly stamped, made up open at the ends, and put into any Post Office within seven days after the day of publication.

Newspapers may also be forwarded to the Colonies, by private ships, for a postage of One Penny each, and to Foreign Countries for a postage of Two-pence each, to be paid when posted, under the same regulations as to date, &c.

NEWSPAPERS FROM ABROAD.

Newspapers arriving from British Colonies or "Foreign Parts," to which they are despatched free, are delivered free of postage. From p. aces abroad, to which they are not despatched free, they are charged, on delivery, Two-pence each; excepting those brought by the closed mail through France, which are charged Three-pence or Five-pence each. All Newspapers must be printed in the language of the country from which they are sent.

INLAND BOOK POST.

The following facilities are afforded for the transmission of Books, &c., through the Post, within the United Kingdom. A Book Packet may contain any number of separate Books, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum or Parchment, (to the exclusion of Letters whether sealed or open,) and the Books, Maps, Paper, &c., may be either printed, written or plain, or any mixture of the three. Further, all legitimate Binding, Mounting, or covering of the same, or a portion thereof, will be allowed, whether such Binding, &c., be loose or attached, as also Rollers, in the case of Prints; Markers, (whether of Paper or otherwise) in the case of Books; and, in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of Literary or Artistic matter, or usually appertains thereto. The following are the additional regulations respecting the Inland Book Postage all remaining notices regarding it being cancelled.

RATES OF BOOK POSTAGE.

For each packet not exceeding one pound in weight, 6d; exceeding one pound and not exceeding two pounds, 1s.; exceeding two pounds, and not exceeding three, 1s. 6d., and so on; 6d. being charged for every complete pound, and for any additional fraction of a pound, the postage must be prepaid in full, by affixing the proper stamps outside; every packet must be sent either without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides; it must not contain any letter, open or sealed, or any sealed enclosure whatever. No Packet must exceed two feet in length. The Book Post to which the foregoing rules relate, is confined to the United Kingdom and does not effect the privileges allowed to votes and proceedings in Parliament, or to Newspapers,

FOREIGN BOOK POST.

Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets, (whether British Colonial or Foreign), may be sent to Canada, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and Bermuda, *via* Halifax; Malta, Gibraltar, Ionian Islands, Hong Kong, and Ceylon, *via* Southampton; New South Wales, and East Indies, *via* Plymouth or Southampton; Heligoland *via* Hamburg; British West Indies, Mauritius, St. Helena, and Cape Town, at the following reduced rates of postage:—
For each Packet not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. in weight, 6d.
" exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb., and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s.
" exceeding 1 lb., and not exceeding 2 lbs., 2s.
And so on increasing one shilling for every additional pound, or fraction of a pound.

REGISTRATION.

Letters whether containing Coin, or not, can be registered, on payment of a fee of 6d., in addition to the Rates of Postage, Inland, Colonial or Foreign. On those for delivery in France, the charges, besides the Registration fee, will be the English rate to France, in addition to double the French rate. A printed acknowledgment will be given to any person registering a letter. Registered Letters will be taken at the Bar Window and Receiving Houses within half an hour of the closing of the Box for the particular Mail by which they are to be dispatched. Letters for Registration, addressed to places within the United Kingdom, must be paid by affixing a sufficient number of Stamps; when addressed to parts abroad they may be paid either in money or by means of Postage Stamps.

In cases of Foreign, Colonial, or Ship Letters, it must be clearly understood that Registration can only extend to the port of shipment. Letters, however, addressed to France, and Letters passing thro' France, are exceptions to this rule, the French Post Office undertaking to provide for their security till they shall have been delivered, *if addressed to France, and as long as they remain in the French territory, if passing through France.*

The arrangements for carrying out the system of registration have been made with the view of ensuring the safe delivery of Registered Letters. On their delivery, the parties to whom they may have been addressed will be required to acknowledge, in writing their receipt. *Parties transmitting Bank Notes, Bank Post Bills, Drafts Jewellery, &c., should invariably secure their transmission by Registration; and persons having occasion to send by Post small sums, are recommended to make use of*

THE MONEY ORDER OFFICE,

which is open every week-day, (fast days excepted) from 9 a.m. till 6 p.m. The charge for such Orders

is 3d. on sums not exceeding *two pounds*, and 6d. on sums between *two and five pounds*. No order will be given for sums beyond this amount; but if the sum to be transmitted exceeds *five pounds*, as many orders may be taken out as will make up the sum to be sent.

In cases where the personal attendance of the party to whom an order is payable is inconvenient, if the order is receipted (his or her name written in full,) and the person presenting the order be able to give full information as to the Christian name, surname, address, and occupation of the person who transmitted the money, payment will be made, but not unless these conditions are complied with. Orders will not be granted in favour of any person, unless the Christian name of such person can be given by the party obtaining the order. Orders cannot now be granted in favour of the "Secretary" of any Society, the "Publisher" of a paper, &c. In cases of Firms the initials only are required.

A Money Order must be presented for payment before the end of the Second Calendar Month after that in which it was issued; for instance, if issued, in January, it must be presented before the end of March, otherwise a new order will be necessary, for which a second commission must be paid; and if it be not presented for payment before the end of the Twelfth Calendar Month after which it was issued, the money will not be paid at all.

After an Order has been once paid, by whosoever presented, the Officer will not be liable to any further claim.

NEW REGULATIONS.

1.—Printed forms of application for Money Orders to be sold at one halfpenny for five, or any smaller number.

2.—When an Order is to be paid through a Bank, the Remitter need not state his or her occupation, or the name of the Payee; and, when presented for payment, it will be sufficient that it be receipted, and presented (crossed with the name of the Receiving Bank), by some person known to be in the employment of the Bank.

3.—An Order, not originally made payable through a Bank, on being crossed by the holder, will be paid on the above conditions.

4.—Compensation for alleged injury from the delay of paying an Order, or of paying it to a wrong person, cannot be allowed.



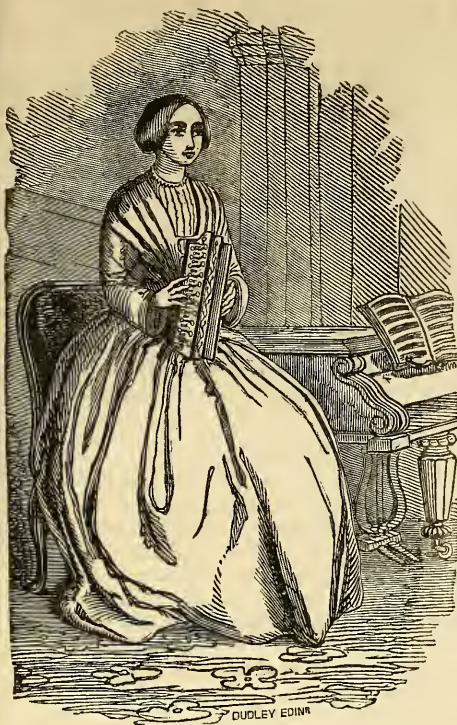

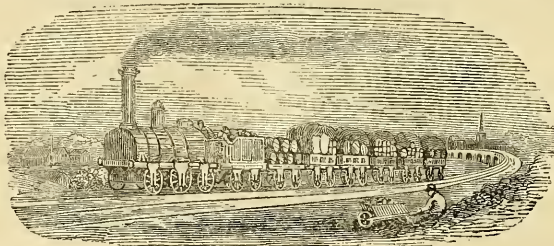
