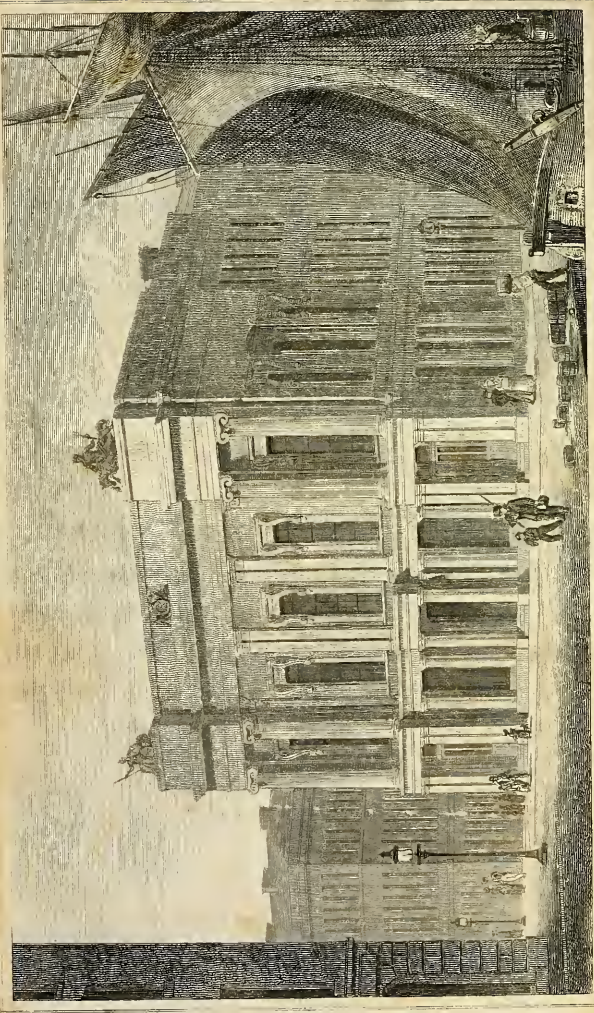

Two years have not elapsed since the last **DUNDEE DIRECTORY** was published ; but it being generally acknowledged, that at no recent period of twenty-four months, previous to the date of that publication, have so many unforeseen changes and casualties taken place in Dundee than during the last,—thereby rendering the former **DIRECTORY** almost useless.

The Publisher therefore begs leave to produce another for 1842-43, on which he with confidence asserts, that neither pains nor expense have been spared to render it as accurate and complete, as that can possibly be accomplished. The **DIRECTORY** and **LISTS**, after these were in types, have been carefully examined by those competent to judge of their accuracy, and such alterations made thereon, as was by them satisfactorily pointed out,—still, to say that it is free of errors or omissions, would be presumption.

The present **DIRECTORY** contains about three hundred Names more, and an equal number of **Lists** with its predecessor ; also a selection, from the *New Tariff*, of **Articles Imported into Dundee** ; besides prints of the **Exchange Buildings**, and of the **Churches**, as they appeared before the fire in January 1841,—which were not promised in the **Prospectus**,—and these without any addition to the price.

The Publisher has to acknowledge an extensive **List of Subscribers** for this small **Work**,—indeed, the number far exceeds expectations when the first sheet was put to press ; and, as the impression is but limited, he will escape the error fallen into with former similar publications—by having many of them useless on hand, while with the present, he will have only a few copies for general sale after **Subscribers** are supplied.

## REGULATIONS.

A letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, may be sent from  
 any part of the United Kingdom to any other part, for ONE PENNY,  
 if paid when posted, or for TWOPENCE, if paid when delivered.

For all letters, whether sent by the General or by any Local Post,  
 the scale of rates, if paid when posted, is as follows :—

If not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce, one penny ; exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce, but not  
 exceeding 1 ounce, twopence ; exceeding 1 ounce, but not exceeding,  
 2 ounces, fourpence ; exceeding 2 ounces, but not exceeding 3  
 ounces, sixpence,—and an additional twopence for every additional  
 ounce. With exceptions, the weight is limited to sixteen ounces.

INLAND LETTERS, if not paid when posted, are charged double  
 the above rates.

COLONIAL LETTERS, if sent by packet, are charged twelve times (or 1s., if not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce), and if by private ship, eight times the preceding rates.

FOREIGN LETTERS.—As the packet rates vary, they may be seen at the Post-Office. The ship rates are the same as for Colonial letters.

As regards Foreign and Colonial letters, there is no limitation as to weight. All sent outwards, with few exceptions, which may be learned at the Post-Office, must be paid when posted, as heretofore.

Letters to go by private ship, must be marked "*Ship Letter.*"

No articles should be transmitted by post which are liable to injury by being stamped, or by being crushed in the bags.

It is particularly requested that all letters may be fully and legibly addressed, and posted as early as convenient.

#### MAILS AND HOURS OF CLOSING.

It is arranged that, on and after Tuesday 6th September 1842, the Day Mail from the North is to arrive in Dundee, as stated above (at 11 o'clock forenoon), when the South and North letters will be delivered together, commencing at a quarter before 12 noon. By this change, Dundee will lose a post, or half a day in answering letters going *South*. To obviate this loss, it is in contemplation to establish a Day Mail betwixt Dundee and Perth, to reach that city in time to meet the Mail from Inverness, by which means letters will arrive, as they do now, at their respective destinations in the South.

## BILLETING OF SOLDIERS.

Soldiers on the Recruiting Service, and not lodged in the Barracks, are billeted on the inhabitants in regular rotation, with the following exceptions,—viz. parish ministers and schoolmasters, unmarried ladies not in business and who do not keep lodgers, and paupers. Occupiers of houses at L.3 and under L.7 yearly rent, one man one week, or two men any number of days under a week; and upwards of L.7, two men one week, or any number of days that may happen under fourteen.

When it is inconvenient to furnish soldiers with a bed, it has been usual, in lieu thereof, to pay 1s. a-week to each man and return the billet, or 1s. 7d. a-week if the billet is kept, at the option of the inhabitant.

Government allows a return of 1d. per day to each soldier. The billetmaster attends at the Town-house, from 11 till 3 o'clock, on the first Thursday of every month, to pay the Government allowance.
