



The Men's Dormitory Council



The Men's Dormitory Council is designed to formulate and direct the social and business activities of the largest dormitory on the campus.

The Men's Dormitory Council, the advisory board to the Dean of Men, consists of eight students, the Residence Director, the Assistant Dean of Men, the Dean of Men and appointed students. Two students are elected from each of the four undergraduate classes residing in the dormitory.

The members of the council work with the men students' personnel staff in matters pertaining to the welfare and training of the men students. During previous years, the council has sponsored several worthwhile projects benefiting the North Carolina College community.

Honoring Dr. Howard J. Chidley on his annual visit, having the council banquet, and planning and entering a float in the Homecoming Parade were a few of the projects carried out by the council during the past school year.

The function of the Off-Campus Women's Council is to bring the programs and activities of the women students who do not live on the campus into closer harmony with the campus women and the campus activities. With the assistance of an Off-Campus Counselor, Mrs. Nesbitt, the council undertakes to provide supervised counseling to meet the social needs of the Off-Campus Women, and to create a feeling of belonging within them.

The council encourages planned social activities such as formal and informal parties and dances. It also undertakes projects to help develop the Off-Campus Women culturally. This may be in the form of teas, symposiums, panel discussions and receptions. The council serves as a link in the chain of friendship which binds the young women of

North Carolina College into one family.

The Women's Steering Committee

The Women's Steering Committee is composed of nine members (two representatives from each class and a seniorat-large) and acts as the planning body of the women's assembly at NCC. Serving as the liaison between the office of the Dean of Women and the women students in general, this committee assumes the responsibility of interpreting and conveying the thoughts, suggestions and opinions of the Dean to the students, and performing the same duty for the students to the dean.

The problem of receiving and relaying correspondence to the Women's Assembly is also a responsibility of the Steering Committee, and, more specifically, of the president who is elected each year from the nine representatives on the committee. The committee formulates plans and proposals for programs and projects and presents them to the Women's Assembly for approval or disapproval. Three of the traditional projects of the Women's Assembly are the Co-Ed Week-end, Mother-Daughter Week-end, and the Christmas Project for Kinston.

Senior Counselors

In each class, there are a few people, who during their stay, distinguish themselves. Each year several of the outstanding senior coeds are elected to serve as Senior Counselors to the Freshmen young women of Annie Day Shepard Dormitory. Though it comes as a tribute, the beginning of the school year brings many problems of adjustment to the Freshmen young women which sometimes makes the privilege seem a "job." Yet, later in the year as friendships are made, problems solved, the college spirit absorbed and a general adjustment having taken place, the Senior Counselors again find themselves with a position of pride and prestige.

THE STUDENT WELFARE COMMITTEE

The Student Welfare Committee

The student welfare committee is composed of ten faculty members and five students. It was organized at a time of transition between a system of strait supervision of student activities and a program of self-direction for the students both in social and disciplinary matters. The student welfare committee works in conjunction with the Dean of Women. Dean of Men, the student government, and the Pan-Hellenic Council. If a problem should arise which cannot be solved by the officials of the aforementioned organizations, the student welfare committee offers its assistance.

In connection with disciplinary action, the accused student has the right to appear before the committee to hear the charges and evidence against him, to make whatever statements he desires, and to bring witnesses and other persons to speak in his defense. Through this channel, it is hoped that the students will realize that no one person is responsible for disciplinary action, but that each misdemeanor and its circumstances are weighed carefully on the scale of justice before the verdict is decided upon, and the sentence, if there be one, is passed.

The Men's Dormitory Government

Under the leadership of its founder and first president. Henry Fair, the men's dormitory government attempts to provide opportunities for the students living in the dormitory, and to promote self-direction in group living.

All men living in the dormitory work together in the

governmental activities in order to provide leadership in the dormitory government, to vote in the election of the president of the government, and to formulate policies, procedures and regulations to govern the men residing in the dormitory. Throughout the year the government plan social, recreational, and cultural activities for the men.

By attending its meetings and participating in its activities, students get a chance to join in christian fellowship with others, thereby providing for a much richer campus life.




N. A. A. C. P.


The Band







CIAA Football Champs-1954

Double Crown Highlights Grid Season

The 1954 North Carolina College Eagles were named the CIAA CHAMPIONS for the second consecutive year. But the Crown that the EAGLES were more proud of resulted from having been the NATIONAL NEGRO CHAMPIONS for the same campaign. Displaying brute

force, and backs of amazing rapidity the charges of Coach Herman II. Riddick won seven games, lost one and tied one, in their climb to the top of Negro Football.

Sixty men reported to Coach Riddick on September 2, 1954 to hear the Veteran Coach, then starting his ninth year at the helm of the grid Eagles, tell them what was

expected. He told them of the achievements of his 1953 team, but reminded them that 1953 was 365 days ago, hence ancient history. "What we have here is this year's team, and I expect to see you perform as such."

They performed as they wiped off their first two opponents with a total of 53 points while holding them scoreless.

The St. Augustine Falcons went down by the score of 25-0 while the Pirates of Hampton Institute succumbed to the mighty Eagles at 31-0. But the holiday almost ended there, as the Eagles went up against more formidable opposition. The Virginia State Trojans, winners over the Eagles for three straight years, intended to upset the powerful grid machine, and went about the task on October 16. For an entire half the battle between the Eagles and the Trojans raged, and suddenly in the third quarter, Clint Freeman of Va. State flipped a pass to teammate Nash and the Eagles trailed for the first time in six games. With Albert Montgomery going 60 minutes in the quarterback seat, the Eagles caught fire and before the embers died the proud Trojans had been handcuffed and lost 12-6. The following week saw the Eagles again trailing, but Co-Captains Jerome (Little Willie) Evans. and Amos Thornton had ideas of their own. On successive plays these senior "mighty mites" combined efforts to amass a total of 66 yards and a TD to tie powerful Maryland State.

The holiday really did end the following week as the Tigers of Tennessee State College dealt the spirited Eagles their first defeat of the 1954 season. The charges of Tennessee Coach Henry A. Kean won their 25th game over a three year period by dealing the Eagles a 13-3 defeat.

It was after the Tennessee game of 1953 that the Eagles went haywire and 1954 was no exception. It was Johnson C. Smith for the second straight year on whom the Eagles displayed a savage fury. The Eagles whipped the Golden Bulls 47-7 in 1953 after the Tennessee State affair and 38-6 in 1954 after encountering the Tigers, J. C. Smith should feel lucky for on the following Saturday, the yellow jackets of West Virginia State College were downed to the tune of 40-12. Bad news hit the Eagle camp after this game. While readying for the Aggies of A&T College, Evans sustained a broken collarbone, which shelved him for the remainder of the season. Whether he would be missed was purely a matter of speculation. After all, he was only the team's leading ground gainer with a incredible mark of 8.3 yard per carry.

Whether his absence was felt or not, got support in the affirmative when on Thanksgiving Day—the A & T Aggies would have won over the Eagles 6-0 except for some excellent quarterbacking by Freshnan Ed Hudson. With two minutes remaining, Hudson pitched three straight passes (the last for a T.D.) and Deral Webster

converted to give the "Riddickmen" a 7-6 victory over the invaders. This win gave the Eagles the CIAA Championship and the right to represent the conference in the National Negro Championship against the Tennessee State Tigers who then owned a record of 27 straight victories. But it wasn't the Tigers' Day. With about 2.500 Durhamites in the stands, the Eagles combined savage line plays with expert ball handling and carrying to down the Tigers. This defeat broke a record unheard of in Negro Football since Morgan State went 54 games from 1932 to 1938 without losing a game.


The last football game of each year finds a group of warriors who due to rules and regulations must also call it their last collegiate game. For some of these men, the last game is a welcome relief, for others, the feeling is of another nature. Football is a full time business with them, and some have been successful enough to sign on the dotted line in the "play for pay" end of the game. Among these lucky chaps is the one-two punch, halfbacks and Co-Captains Jerome Evans and Amos Thornton. It seems that the Hamilton Bearcats of the Canadian League obtained the services of these two highly touted dynamos.

The records show that Thornton has been the Eagles' most valuable player with a possible exception of Carl Galbreath who is the most heralded of NCC football greats of all times. Thornton was selected to the CIAA first team for three years, was elected to Pittsburg Courier's ALL AMERICAN FIRST TEAM for two seasons, and was named on the Afro ALL AMERICAN team twice.

Jerome, a Goldsboro Ex-GI, was voted All-European while serving with the U. S. Forces in Germany in 1947. As an NCC Freshman, he was voted the outstanding rookie on the team and also the team's best defensive player. His Sophomore year also saw him win the team's most outstanding defensive title. As a Junior, and the return to the one platoon system. Evans became the team's best offensive back carrying the ball 36 times for an average of 4.3 vards per try. This season, although shelved for two games, he was named to the All-CIAA first team.

The third member of the "play for pay" aspirants is big, rough and tough Claude Mayfield, a 6 feet, 2 inches, 240 pound tackle. This Suffolk, Virginia lad should have no trouble crashing into the ranks of the "Bearcat" line. He was voted to the All-ClAA team for 1954.

Then, there are always boys who don't care for any more of football life. They would rather sit in the stands and cheer the players on. First among them is such a player as Charley Floyd, the "Wilson Flash," who has held down a starting end position for three seasons. Moreover, he has been a front line reserve for Coach Floyd Brown's Cagers. Another important cog who played his last game, was the highly regarded Francis McGhee. Known as "The Horse," this Alexandria, Virginia guard came to North Carolina College in 1946 and



immediately established himself as a front line reserve. His Sophomore year saw him take over a first line post and the Korean War proved the only thing that was able to move him. Selected as an honorable mention player in past seasons, the 205 pounds was considered one of the smartest linemen of his day. Mention here must also go to Otto "Eil" Beaver" Harvey, the team's most valuable player. Harvey, a player's player, trained hard, and played clean. He diagnosed plays as well as, or better than any member of the club and thus led in pass interceptions. His performance won for him "All-American honors."

Next we have a victim of injuries, Durham's Henry King this season who was never up to par. At the beginning of the season, he was the starting end, and continued at that post until his legs caved in. A former halfback, "Hank" will best be remembered for his winning T. D. catch over West Virginia State in 1953. This catch put NCC in contention for the CIAA crown which they won on Thanksgiving Day of that year.


Another end is Linwood "Tricky Joe" Jones, the team's most popular member. Tricky Joe has always been a crowd pleaser and except for time lost due to injuries, he was always the game's first substitute.

Cornelius Eason, former High School backfield mate of Ml-American Thornton, has been plagured with injuries during his entire stay in the Eagle's fold, "Teeux," as he is called, was the most heralded of all rookies when he reported to the Eagle camp in 1951 but a cracked knee forced this (the fastest) member of the team to the sidelines and reserve duty.

Zander A. Dockery, a 170 pound steel legged halfback from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, like Eason, is a victim of the injured leg. Zan, after a stint with the U. S. Army, was to be counted on for much of the line cracking duty, but his thigh muscles folded and his department remained the point after touchdown in which he did remarkably well.

The last senior member of the squad is 6 feet, 2 inches, 130 pound end James Courtney, a trackster by trade. Courtney was adept at snagging passes and runners enroute to the goal line.

We were glad to have the above mentioned gentlemen in the Eagle Fold along with the other spirited fellows. Other greats who will return are: Mathew Boone, Robert Adams, Jim Forbes, Billy Adams, Albert Montgomery, Thomas Caldwell, Leon Holley, Ross Hines, Deral Webster, John Roberts, Ed Hudson, Henry Lewis, George Alexander, James Crawford, Oscar Turner, and the mighty John Baker. To them and the entire squad we say good luck for '55. A challenge is hereby presented to the returnees for 1955 will round out a decad-for Coach Riddick at the local institution. His greatest gift, could only be in the form of a great year, and a repeat championship performance. The Eagle Staff would like to say "thanks again" for the opportunity of having been around to see the greatest Eagle team ever.

Basketballers Win Second Conference Title

The story of NCC Backetball again for the third straight year is the story of its youthful coach, Floyd Brown. Three years Brown has spent at the helm of the Eagles, but listen to how and where he has guided them. In 1952-53. his first year cracking the whip, Brown led the Eagles to a 15-4 conference record and a 17-7 overall.

That year saw the locals finish second in the conference, and get an invitation to compete in the NAIA district playoff at Nashville Tennessee where his court Eagles were defeated in the first round by Tennessee State 98-94. This marked the first time that Negro Colleges received invitations to the meet. 1953-54 saw Brown take a patched up



outfit and win a surprising 23 games while losing only 5. Again they were invited to the NAIA in Nashville, and advanced to the final round, only to be eliminated 79-59 by the same Tennessee State Tigers. After that final game Bennie Dix, George Greene and All-American Charles (Tex) Harrison graduated, "Sad Sam" Jones went to the Army and James Sligh was lost via the incligible route. So Brown was to have worries for 1954-55. He won his first game of the season over the Virginia State Trojans (76-60) then lost two straight, first to the Hawks of Maryland State (76-65) and later to Savannah State (74-70).

Regaining their winning ways, the Eagles dropped Bluefield State (64-55) and St. Augustine's College (68-62). It was after the St. Aug. encounter that Brown remarked that the "boys seemed to be working into shape." The Holiday Festivals in Greensboro saw them get two setbacks while winning one game over the Teachers of Fayetteville State 63-58. The Winston-Salem Teachers College "Rams" served them their first defeat by the score of 64-58 while Bethune Cookman of Daytona Beach, Florida dished them a 74-65 setback.

After the holidays, the Eagles returned to the court and picked up six games in a row downing Hampton Institute, Johnson C. Smith, St. Augustine, Winston-Salem, Shaw University and Virginia State College before they ran into the Garrett led Morgan State "Bears" and a resounding 104-79 thrashing. The 104 points were the highest ever scored against an NCC quint, and dropped them back to third place exactly 24 hours after they had taken over the second spot in the conference race. Then came the stretch and victories over A & T

64-52, Winston-Salem 76-72, Maryland 77-74, Hampton 74-59, West Virginia State 86-72, Morgan 89-73, Smith 71-70, A & T 64-60 (thanks to Dudley), West Virginia State 74-70, and finally over Shaw University Bears 74-46. Thus season's play ended and the NCC Eagles had completed a 19-2 conference record, and a 20-5 overall season record.

From last year's team he had Captain Charles Barrick, and Harvey Heartley at guard, Rudy Dudley and Karl Bell at forward, with Big Charley Badger at center. Of this starting five all were seniors except Badger, a sophomore, Barrick and Heartley finished the previous season as starters. Badger as a valuable reserve, with Dudley and Bell failing to make the squad during the 53-54 Tourney. The season progressed and the pace wore on. John Keels, a 6'-4" Freshman from Tarrytown, New York, who had been used chiefly as a reserve started showing rare form and was inserted into the starting lineup replacing Bell, as part of Brown's scheme of finding a workable unit. His height proved valuable and his 384 points were just what the doctor had ordered.

But whence cometh this Rudy Dudley? Well, Dudley is one of those rare players that comes upon the scene when a campus is loaded with skyscrapers. His 5′ 9″ are apt to be overlooked when a coach begins looking for a player. However, Dudley was retained because he had a little something extra, a little more drive than the average player, a cooler head under fire, and an uncanny knack of intercepting passes and dribbles. Brown got repaid for keeping Rudy around, because he lost some of those skyscrapers, and Rudy filled the bill. His 171 points do not tell the whole story of this valuable Eagle.

He was sensational, and was the most applauded of all Eagles.

Harvey Heartley, the Smithfield whiz kid on the court or in the classroom, was the Eagle's money player. He led the squad in rebounds, scored 441 points and after Captain Barrick was injured, served as the "field" general. Barrick has been a starter for four seasons. He, like Dudleys was a rare type player, but unlike Dudley's 5 ft. 9 in. Barrick was 6 ft. 1 in. He is best under pressure, owning a determined drive and a lay-up that is unstoppable. Never a leader in the scoring column, he did manage 189 points before missing the season's last four games with a leg injury. Big Charles Badger, a 6' 5" center, from Peekskill, N. Y., was the regular season's leading scorer. The once awkward looking center amassed a total of 458 points, and trailed only the 6 ft. 3 in. Heartley in rebounds.

After the holidays ended, a new face graced the N. C. Campus. James Cato. Standing only 5' 10", the recently discharged marine won himself a place in the hearts of the fans with an unorthodox one-hand set shot and brilliant all around floor play. He was chiefly used

as a reserve but will be heavily counted on next year. Cato scored 103 points for the year. Others instrumental in the uphill climb were Clayborn Fields, a 6 ft. 5 in. center, who became the victim of a serious groin injury before the holidays, and never completely recovered; Ed Wheeler, the lackadaisical Brooklyn guard, who helped the Eagles tremendously out of the tight spots, and Richard Berry of Manhattan, N. Y. who was in and out of the NCC line-up in almost each game.

There were more; there always are, but the fact remains that the guiding light behind the Eagles was Floyd Brown. For his consistency in fielding good clubs, and his all round gentlemanly attitude. Brown was honored by his conference fellow coaches by being named the president of the Central Intercollegiate Baskethall Coaches Association. Top seeded in the 1954-55 CIAA Tournament, his team was again knocked out by Morgan in the first round. But on the basis of the team's fine regular season's record, they were invited to represent the conference in the NAIA playoffs for the third straight year. Grambling of Louisiana, handed them a hearthreaking 71-63 defeat in the first round and the Eagles, with Dudley, Barrick. Bell and Hearthey said goodbye for 1955.






