North Carolina College Eagles

The 1955 North Carolina College Eagles finished the season in third place in the CIAA, behind the unbeaten Maryland State Hawks and arch-rival A&T College, after two successive years as crown-wearers of the championship. All seven of the Eagles' foes, which were pointing toward the clash with NCC, were dominators of the CIAA.

Rated by many as the heaviest team in the conference, NCC, minus some of its reputable beef of the past years, managed to overcome four of their opponents, while losing one and tying two.

Coach Herman H. Riddick had the smallest group that he had ever worked with to report for the September 1955 practice because of a new CIAA rule which limited member schools to a thirty-six man roster.

Leading this '55 aggregation were Co-Captains Ross Hines and Matthew Boone, along with robust Jack Aiken, the only seniors on the club.

The Eagle gridders flashed their championship form of previous years as they knocked their first two opponents and rang up 58 points on 9 touchdowns while holding their victims to two touchdowns, both of them via the air. The Eagles' forward wall proved impregnable led by Boone, Hines, Aiken, Baxter Holloman, Joe Woodhouse, "Buck" Forbes, Frank Roberts, and Hank Lewis.

In their initial test of the '55 season, NCC, after a fumbling first half, combined the talents of two "frosh"

finds, halfbacks, Clifton "Stonewall" Jackson and Harold Joyner to pin down the St. Augustine's Falcons 18-6. Their next foe, the Yellow-Jackets of West Virginia State were completely helpless as the Eagles found their stride and romped to a 10-7 victory over the Yellow-Jackets. Their next formidable opponent, the Virginia State Trojans, seeking revenge from last year's defeat by the Eagles, jumped in a lead by a 6-0 half-time score. NCC roared back in the third period, with two minutes remaining, and tied the score as Albert Montgomery, Gastonia junior quarter-back, scouted six yards around the left end on a keep play. Dearnly Webster's try for the point after touchdown was blocked and NCC had to settle for a 6-6 tie with the Trojans. The following week the Eagles journeyed up to Maryland State College to tangle with the mighty undefeated Hawks, but the Eagles fell victim to Johnny Samples, Sherm Plunkett and company as they were zeroed 36-0, and NCC dropped its first game of the season.

The following week, in a gala-homecoming weekend of festivities, NCC rebounded to beat the surprisingly powerful Shaw University Bears 27-0. The brilliance of two unheralded quarter-backs was inviolated in this tussle. Robert "Bud" Price and Eddie "Magic Eye" Hadson, sparked the Eagle victory. South Carolina State, a non-conference foe, served as tune-up for the Eagles Turkey Day final with A&T. The South Carolina State Bulldogs went down 26-7 after a rugged fight against the Eagle fortress.



Before a crowd of 8,000 spectators viewing the 25th Annual Carolina Classic on Thanksgiving day, NCC knotted the A&T College Aggies 7-7. The Eagles pulled the surprise of the day when they shifted from their customary "T" formation into the old rock'em-sock'em single-wing and pushed the Aggies all over Greensboro Stadium in the second half. The Aggies scored late in the first half to lead 7-0 at intermission. At the start of the second half the Eagles shifted into a single wing for the first time in five years, completely baffling the Aggies, while piling up a 112 yards gain in the final half and scoring their only "TD" to deadlock the game. The Eagles launched a 77 yard drive to march toward paydirt as "Big John" Baker, 290 lb. fullback, scored in two plays from the 8-yard line. NCC unveiled its diminutive frosh place-kicker Willie "Pete" Hayes, who boomed the pigskin through the uprights to knot the score 7-7.

Riddick's squad finished the season with a 4-1-2 record and a third spot in the vastly improved CIAA.

Closing out their last season of collegiate football for NCC are three stellar seniors, Matthew Boone, Co-Captain, 240 lb. tackle from Hampton, Virginia, who was drafted on the 18th round of the Pro-Player Pool draft by the New York Giants; Co-Captain and end Ross Hines from Detroit, Michigan; and Jack Aiken, gigantic 260 lb. guard from Charlotte, North Carolina.

Boone, since his arrival at NCC, has been a bulwark in the Eagle forward wall. As a freshman in '52, he was voted the "most valuable frosh griddler, as a member of the platooned-defensive team." "Mac," during his junior year, was elected to the *Pittsburgh Courier's* All-American team and also picked on the various All-CIAA teams. This year the robust tackle was nominated

to NAIA All-American squad and repeated for the second year on the *Pittsburgh Courier's* All-American and All-CIAA squads.

Clifton Jackson lead the Eagle ball-carriers with 285 yards for an average of 5.7 yards per try. Jackson proved to be the most outstanding freshman on the squad as he also led the team in scoring with five touchdowns.

Eddie "Magic Eye" Hudson topped the CIAA quarterback brigade, winning individual forward passing laurels. "Magic Eye," an easy going sophomore from Williamsburg, Virginia, hit his targets on 14 out of 22 attempts.

Other important gridders who played great ball and helped to make NCC's grid season a success are George Alexander, "Big John" Baker, James Forbes, Leon Helley, James Henry, Baxter Holloman, Eddie Hudson, Clifton Jackson, Harold Joyner, Robert "Bobby" Johnson, Thomas "Speedy" Johnson, Al Montgomery, Douglas Nettingham, Robert Price, Frank Roberts, Oscar Turner, Paul Woodard, and Thomas Stith. To them and the entire squad we say "good luck for '56."

Basketballers Close-out Successful Experimental Season

The story of NCC basketball this year is not one of usual pattern, championship teams, a dismal one either. The 1955-56 season has been one of many experiments for coach Floyd Brown and his dominantly yearling squad which finished the season above the 500 mark, a record of 11-10 and third spot in a much stronger CIAA conference race.

This marked Brown's fourth year at the head of the Eagle Cagers and listen to where he has guided them. In 1952-53, his first year as Eagle mentor, Brown led the Eagles to a 15-4 conference record and 17-7 over-all. That year the locals finished second in the conference and got an invitation to compete in the NAIA district play-off at Nashville, Tennessee, where his hoopsters were defeated in the opening round by Tennessee State, 98-91. This marked the first time that Negro colleges received invitation to this post-season affair. 1953-54 saw Brown's constantly-changing club win a surprising 23 games while losing only 5. Again they were invited to the NAIA meet in Nashville, and advanced to the final round, only to be eliminated 79-59 by the same Tigers from Tennessee State.

The 1954-55 season, when Brown lost four men off his first team with only Charley Barrick returning, they won 20 games and dropped 7 to go on and win the conference crown for the second straight year. The Eagle hoopsters closed the season with a 10 game winning streak to soar from third spot to the top ring in the conference standings with 19 victories and only 2 set-backs in conference competition.

Brown's worries for the '55-56 season were to find replacements for last years starters, Rudy Dudley, Harvey Heartley, and Charley Barrick. The return of James "Chip" Slight to eligibility ranks along with two hold-overs from last year's starting quintet in Charley Badger and Johnny "Lunching" Keels, and perhaps the greatest crop of freshmen NCC has ever welcomed, sent buzzes through the CIAA that Brown's aggregation was again the team to beat.

The Eagles won their first game over their traditional season-opening opponent, the Virginia State Trojans (66-53) then lost their next three games, first to a surprisingly strong Shaw University team (63-69) and later

to non-conference rival Tennessee State University, (56-88, 58-60).

Regaining their winning ways, the Eagles dropped the Trojans again (61-59) but lost their next game to a weak Hampton outfit (51-60). Refusing to be denied the Eagles came back with a sound victory over a strong Virginia Union club (60-57) in Richmond. Unable to put together a consistent win streak, the young Eagle quintet lost their next two games to the fast-breaking Winston-Salem Rams (61-71) and the undefeated Maryland State Hawks (71-82).

The Eagles took to the road for a two-game series and booked two sound defeats on the Howard University Bisons (72-69) and on the Morgan State Bears (75-71), thanks to the sterling performances of Charley Badger, who seemed to have regained his peak form, and sub Dorian Parrott, who broke the Bears backs with his timely shots and his ball-hawking game. At A.&T. College the Eagles hit the bottom again as they dropped a hard-fought battle to the Aggies (61-68).

The Eagles returned home for a one-game stand and clipped the Winston-Salem five convincingly (66-50), to avenge an earlier defeat, before taking again to the road for their last swing in northern division to take on Maryland State and Hampton. The "boom" came down on the Eagles hard as they went down to the Hawks (51-71) and to Pirates (61-70).

Brown's squad returned home for its last home stand and its last chance to cinch a conference tournament berth. In a warm-up fray against non-conference foe, South Carolina State, the Eagles won a hard-fought overtime tussle, 69-66. Then came the four-game streak that cinched third spot and a tourney berth with victories over Morgan State and finally a vindication victory over the Shaw Bears 76-55, for an earlier setback. Thus regular season's play ended, and the NCC Eagles had completed a 10-7 conference record, and an over-all season mark of 11-10.

In the CIAA tournament NCC won 2 games and dropped one for third spot in the tourney ranks. This marked the first time in three years that the Eagles had survived the opening-day competition.

In the opening round the Eagles behind at the half-



way mark 28-12, came back to score 62 points in the second stanza to set down the Howard University Bisons 90-75. In doing this, the Eagles scored the most points that they have scored all season, and the second highest total in point production ever scored by a Brown-coached team. In the semi-finals NCC went down to the Jack Defare led Winston-Salem "Rams" and a resounding 79-69 defeat; but Brown's yearling club rebounded and pinned back the A.&T. Aggies 89-58, in the consolation game to cop the third place trophy award.

From last year's team—Captains Charley "Scoreboard" Badger and Claydon "Spider" Fields, and John "Jumbo" Keels were the only returning eaglers of promise. Badger, a junior, and Keels, a sophomore, were the only two regulars of this trio, while Fields, who played sparingly as a sub, was the only senior on the club. A starting unit of Keels, Badger, and Sligh along with two heralded frosh eaglers opened and closed the Eagles 55-56 season.

Carlton "Ding-Dong" Bell, 6'6" Texan from Houston, was inserted in the starting line-up and proved to be a valuable addition as he topped the team in rebounds with a 245 and in scoring with 317 points for a 13.2 average. The fifth man of this unit was the determined local product, J. Gilbert Riley. The 6'4", stern-faced lad was a tremendous rebounder and fine outside shot. His added rebounding gave the Eagles 1-2-3 rebound off the boards.

The most applauded of all the Eagles was James "Chip" Sligh, 5'10" guard from Winston-Salem. His 291 points for a 12-1 average and the team's second leading scorer do not tell the story of his value. He was sensational in his drive to inspire the Eagles on to play "winning ball."

The most underrated of this aggregation was Charley Badger, the 6'5" center from Peckskill, N. Y. Badger had trouble finding himself during the early stages of the season, but thanks to Coach Brown, who stuck with him, the once prolific Badger found the range and the Eagles began to roll. "Badger" lung up a total of 252 points for a 10.8 average and trailed only Bell in rebounds with 199 grabs.

Keels, the loose-hipped eager from Tarrytown, N. Y., saved many a game with his timely "push-shots." His 6'4" proved valuable and his 244 points were just what the doctor prescribed.

Others instrumental in NCC's uphill battle to sew-up a tourney berth were Donald "Pete" Burke, a frosh from the Pittsburgh Hills, who had a cool head under fire and an uncanny knack of recovering loose balls and intercepting passes; Charley McCullough, an armed service vet who proved to be valuable fill-in; Calvin "Sweetcake" Alexander, the second-half of the Texas duo, a real "Smoothie" on hardwood; Fields, with his swinging hook shot and unstoppable Kangaroo shot; Dorian Parreott, the hustling Asbury Park, N. J. lad who helped the Eagles tremendously in the tight spots; and Joseph Alston, Durham product, who was used sparingly in the NCC line-up during the season.

Brown and his eaglers with a year of play and experience behind them have great plans for next year, with the possibility of playing in a proposed NCAA small-college tournament.
