INTRODUCTION

On the 348 rolls of this microfilm publication are reproduced the applications submitted for shares of the money that was appropriated for the Eastern Cherokee Indians by the Congress on June 30, 1906. The Eastern Cherokee applications, August 29, 1906-May 26, 1909, are part of the Guion Miller Enrollment Records that are among the records of the U.S. Court of Claims. This publication also includes a general index to Eastern Cherokee applications (two vols.).

History

Before the U.S. Court of Claims was established in 1855 there was no procedure by which claims arising against the U.S. Government could be enforced by suit. Consideration of claims was provided for when the Treasury Department was established in 1789; later acts of the Congress authorized the Department to settle all claims by or against the Government. If a claim was rejected by the Treasury Department, the claimant's only course of action was to appeal directly to the Congress. Petitions to that body for relief had become so numerous by the middle of the 19th century that the Congress was beginning to find it impossible to make the proper and necessary investigations for actions on the claims.

The U.S. Court of Claims was established by an act of February 24, 1855, to hear claims against the United States including those referred to the court by the Congress, based on any law of the Congress, any regulation of an executive department, or any contract with the Government, whether explicit or implied. Under this act the court served only as a factfinding agency, and its conclusions were submitted to the Congress for approval and for the granting of awards. In 1863 the Congress enlarged the court's jurisdiction and gave it authority to render judgments against the Government, with the right of appeal to the Supreme Court. An act of 1925 abolished appeals from the Court of Claims to the Supreme Court and substituted writs of certiorari.

An act approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat. 726), gave the Court of Claims jurisdiction over any claim arising under treaty stipulations that the Cherokee Tribe, or any band thereof, might have against the United States and over any claims that the United States might have against any Cherokee Tribe or band. Suit for such a claim was to be instituted within 2 years after the act was approved. As a result, three suits were brought before the court concerning grievances arising out of the treaties:

(1) *The Cherokee Nation v. The United States*, General-Jurisdiction Case No. 23199; (2) *The Eastern and Emigrant Cherokees v. The United States*, General-Jurisdiction Case No. 23212; and (3) *The Eastern Cherokees v. The United States*, General-Jurisdiction Case No. 23214.

On May 18, 1905, the court decided in favor of the Eastern Cherokees and instructed the Secretary of the Interior to identify the persons entitled to participate in the distribution of funds for payment of the claims. On June 30, 1906, the Congress appropriated more than \$1 million for this purpose. The task of compiling a roll of eligible persons was begun by Guion Miller, special agent of the Interior Department. In a decree of April 29, 1907, the court (1) vacated that part of its earlier decision that had given the Secretary of the Interior responsibility for determining the eligibility of claimants and (2) appointed Miller as a special commissioner of the Court of Claims.

The same decree also provided that the fund was to be distributed to all Eastern and Western Cherokee Indians who were alive on May 28, 1906, who could establish the fact that at the time of the treaties they were members of the Eastern Cherokee Tribe or were descendants of such persons, and that they had not been affiliated with any tribe of Indians other than the Eastern Cherokee or the Cherokee Nation. The decree further provided that claimants should already have applications on file with the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, or should file such applications with the special commissioner of the Court of Claims on or before August 31, 1907. Additionally, applications for minors and persons of unsound mind were to be filed by their parents or persons having their care and custody, and applications for persons who had died after May 28, 1906, were to be filed by their children or legal representatives.

In his report of May 28, 1909, Miller stated that 45,847 separate applications had been filed, representing a total of about 90,000 individual claimants, 30,254 of whom were enrolled as entitled to share in the fund--3,203 residing east and 27,051 residing west of the Mississippi River. On June 10, 1909, the court confirmed and approved the roll, submitted by Miller in his report, of Eastern Cherokees who were entitled to a share of the fund except "so much as shall be expected (excepted) to on or before August 30, 1909." After the exceptions had been filed and investigated, Miller submitted a supplemental report and roll to the court on January 5, 1910. In this report he stated that about 11,750 exceptions had been made, that the names of 610 persons (238 east and 372 west of the Mississippi) had been added to the roll, and that the names of 44 persons (5 east and 39 west of the Mississippi) had been stricken from the roll because clerical errors in enrollment had been discovered. Thus the final figure on the total number of persons entitled to share in the fund was 30,820, of which 3,436 persons

resided east and 27,384 resided west of the Mississippi River. On March 15, 1910, the court finally decreed that the rolls be approved and that, after certain deductions for expenditures, payments were to be made equally among the Eastern Cherokees who were enrolled. The court also authorized the Secretary of the Treasury to issue a warrant in favor of each person.

In certifying the eligibility of the Cherokees, Miller used earlier census lists and rolls that had been made of the Cherokees by Hester, Chapman, Drennen, and others between 1835 and 1884. Copies of some of these rolls and the indexes to them are filed with the Miller records (filmed as M685). Other enrollment records used by Miller are among the classified subject files of the Bureau and are designated as "33931-11-053 Cherokee Nation."

Records

The applications contain sworn evidences of identity and were filed with the Interior Department's Office of Indian Affairs until April 29, 1907 (the last application was No. 22268), after which the applications were filed directly with the court. The application required each claimant to state fully his or her English and Indian names, residence, age, place of birth, name of husband or wife, name of tribe, and names of children. It further required the English and Indian names of the claimant's parents and grandparents, place of their birth, place of their residence in 1851 if they were living at that time, dates of their death, and a statement as to whether any of them had ever before been enrolled as Indians for annuities or other benefits and, if so, with what tribe. Each claimant was also to furnish the names of all brothers and sisters, with their ages and residences, and the names and residences of all uncles and aunts. Applications were required to be made under oath and to be supported by affidavits of two witnesses who were well acquainted with the applicant. With each application is a card showing final action taken and the reasons therefore. Filed with many of the applications are inquiries concerning the status of the cases, requests for further evidence, protests about unfavorable actions, form letters that had been sent by the special commissioner to the applicants as notices of rejection of their applications and returned by the Post Office Department as unclaimed, affidavits and statements of witnesses, powers of attorney, and last wills and testaments. The applications are arranged by the number assigned at the time the application was received. There are some gaps in the application numbers; these are explained on insert sheets at the appropriate places on the film. The index is arranged alphabetically by name (either English or Indian) of claimant.

Many of the files contain a cross-reference card to other applications. This cross-reference card often refers to the EX file, the report on exceptions filed by Miller on January 5, 1910.

Related Records

The records reproduced in this microfilm publication are part of the records in the custody of the National Archives and Records Service (NARS) designated as Records of the U.S. Court of Claims, Record Group (RG) 123. Among related records in this record group are additional records relating to Miller's enrollment of the Eastern Cherokees. These include receipts for Treasury warrants and miscellaneous correspondence, 1906-11. The original of these records is in RG 123; a copy is in RG 75.

Some related records in Records of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, RG 75, have been reproduced as NARS Microfilm Publication T496, *Census Roll, 1835, of the Cherokee Indians East of the Mississippi and Index to the Roll*. Also in RG 75 are the classified subject files of the Bureau.

Records Relating to Enrollment of Eastern Cherokees by Guion Miller, 1908-10, M685, contains the general index to Eastern Cherokee applications, 2 volumes; the report submitted by Guion Miller, May 28, 1909, 10 volumes; the roll of Eastern Cherokees, May 28, 1909; the report on exceptions filed, January 5, 1910; the supplemental roll of Eastern Cherokees, January 5, 1910; transcripts of testimony, February, 1908-March 1909, 10 volumes; various indexes and rolls of Eastern Cherokee Indians, 1851, 1854, and 1884; and miscellaneous notes and drafts.

Additional records relating to the enrollment of Eastern Cherokee Indians are in Records of the Office of the Secretary of the Interior, Record Group 48.

I, N. A. Gibson, Special Master herein under the order of the Court heretofore made, show to the Court that under said order the I have examined the pleadings and proof herein, which are herewith filed and made a part hereof and that I find as follows:

I

That this cause was filed on the 8th day of September 1896, on which day application was made to the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes for citizenship by blood in the Cherokee Nation of Indians, that the said cause was tried by said Commission on the 23rd day of October, 1896, and the application denied, no reason being given for the said decision, and from this decision the applicants appealed to this Court on December 31, 1897.

II

That this application was made by Eliza Mayberry, Newton J. Eddings, Amanda C. Lewis, Rosa C. Blankenship, Harvey A. Mayberry, John W. Blackburn, John W. Blackburn, Jr., Andrew A. Blackburn, Anna Shoemaker, Lovony Lovelace, Ophelia Curry, John R. Middleton, Charles G. Middleton, Andrew J. Eddings, Susan C. Foster, Thomas W. Foster, John W. Foster, M. F. Foster, Sarah J. Owens, Luther Blackburn, Jane Brown, Mary F. Edwards, Dell Owan, Pleasant B. Blackburn, William J. Blackburn, Andrew B. Blackburn, Sarah H. Jourdan, and Mary Howard and her three children, all of whom are great grand children and great-great grand children of Dave Weaver, who lived among the Eastern Cherokees in what is now the State of Georgia and who is claimed to have been a Cherokee Indian by blood and a recognized member of the Cherokee Nation.

III

That the parties filed in support of their application the affidavits of Andrew B. Blackburn, W. J. Eddings Blackburn, Thomas J. Taylor, Richard B. Eddings, C. R. Harris, James P. Eddings, John W. Eddings, Samuel R. Hill, Joseph Allsup, Andrew S. Eddings, and John Ross, and a certified extract from the roll of the Cherokee Nation, taken in the year of 1835, showing that Dave Weaver, his six boys and one girl were enrolled as Cherokees and that he lived in Cherokee County, Georgia near Charr Mountain Creek. That the proof shows that Dave Weaver had a daughter by the name of Elizabeth who married a man by the name of Eddings, and that she had a daughter by the name of Francis who married a man by the name of Blackburn, and who was the mother of Eliza Mayberry the principal claimant herein whose maiden name was Blackburn. That these claimants are residents of the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, where they have resided for the past eight years.

IV

That the claimants contend that under the showing made by them that Dave Weaver's name appears upon the roll of the Cherokee Nation for the year 1835, and being now residents of the Cherokee Nation they are entitled to be admitted to citizenship in the Cherokee Nation as citizens by blood, while the Cherokee Nation contends that Dave Weaver's name does not appear on the roll of the Cherokee Nation since the removal west to the present location, and that hence under the laws applicable to cases of this nature these claimants are not entitled to be admitted to the Cherokee Nation as citizens thereof.

The premises considered, I find that these claimants are the descendants and heirs of Dave Weaver, whose name appears upon the roll of the Cherokee Nation for the year 1835, that the proof does not show that the said Dave Weaver, ever came to the present Cherokee Nation, or was enrolled here as a member thereof, that these claimants are persons of Cherokee Indian blood and descent, and that they are now residents of the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory.

BY THE COURT:---From this report it appears that the claimants base their right to be enrolled as citizens of the Cherokee Nation upon the fact that they are Cherokee Indians by blood. Some of the Claimants have resided in the Cherokee Nation for seven or possibly eight years. It does not appear that any of them have ever been recognized as citizens of the Cherokee Nation as now constituted. The Judgment of the United States Commission rejecting this case is affirmed, and the application of the claimants to be enrolled as citizens of the Cherokee Nation is denied.

Lewis H. Smith, being first duly sworn, in behalf of Thomas Colnesky, deposes and says:

That I am 63 years of age. I live in Robbinsville, N. C. I am a half blood Cherokee. I was acquainted with Thomas Colnesky's mother. Her name is Betsey Col-lo-ne-hes-kee, which is the correct pronunciation. Thomas was a right small boy when his mother left him and went to Swain County, N.C., and I think she is living in Jackson county, N. C. now, but am not sure. She is living with Newt Jumper and goes by the name of Jumper. Up until the time she left here she carried Tom around and nursed him as a baby and everyone in the tribe considered him her son, and I never heard her deny that he was not. John Ropetwister has raised Thomas since she left here. Ah-ne-wa-ga was Betsey Col-lo-ne-hes-kee's mother. John Col-lo-ne-hes-kee was Betsey's father. Ah-ne-wa-ga has been dead thirty or 40 years, and she was about 60 years of age when she died. Her husband has been dead about 20 years, he died in Swain County. Ah-ne-wa-ga died in Graham county, N. C. Both of Betsey's parents were living when Hester made his roll. I was mistaken about Ah-ne-wa-ga being alive--she was dead when Hester made his roll. Col-lo-ne-hes-kee was enrolled by Hester and his english name was taken from a part of his Indian name and was probably Deceiver. Quaitsey is Tom Colnesky's mother, and is the Indian name for Betsey. Quaitsey had a sister by the name of Lucy or Lu-sih, and a brother by the name of Leander. Lucy and Leander are both dead; they died almost immediately after Hester made his roll. Betsey or Quaitsey had some brothers and sisters older than she,--one named Caroline one named Susan, and another one was called Sis by the white people but her Indian name was Te-cah-he-ste-ge (or Peacemaker). I am told that Col-lo-ne-hes-kee's first wife was Gin-ne-lun-kih. (The correct pronunciation is Gin-ne-la-gih.) They had a daughter by the name of Coah-le-eh. Ah-ne-wa-ga's father was named Tom Big Meat. Ah-ne-wa-ga had a sister by the name of Ka-ho-kah, and a bother by the name of Lacy Big Meat, and another brother by the name of Se-kil-lih, but he was called Zek Big Meat.

Thomas Colnasky, being first duly sworn deposes and says:

That I am 20 years of age. I live in Graham County, N. C. I do not know who my father was. I think he was probably an Indian. My mother lives close to Yellow Hill, N. C. She left me and went to Swain County when I was about five years of age. She left me with John Consene. She is about 40 years of age. My maternal grandparents died some 30 or 40 years ago; they were possibly 30 or 40 years of age when they died. They died in Graham County, N. C. My grandmother's name was Ah-ne-wa-ga (Ah-ne-wa-kih). Ah-ne-wa-ga's father was Big Meat or sometimes called Big Fat. Big Meat died about ten years after the war. He was about 80 years of age when he died. Ah-ne-wa-ga was pretty nearly grown when the civil war ended. Ah-ne-wa-ga had a sister by the name of Ka-ho-ga (Ka-ho-kih). Ka-ho-ga was younger than Ah-ne-wa-ga. Ah-ne-wa-ga had a brother by the name of Se-ga-lih (Se-kih-lih), who was younger than the girls. Ah-ne-wa-ga had a brother by the name of Les-se, who was older than she was, by about five years. I never heard of the name of Big Meat's wife. I don't know whether my mother received any money or not, she left me when I was very young, and I have always lived with John Consene. My mother is now living with the Indians in Swain Co, N. C. She married Newt Jumper and she goes by the name of Betsey Jumper. I think my mother has got some younger children now but I don't know what their names are. I don't know of my mother having any other children but me, at the time she left me, and I have no full brothers and sisters that I know of. My mother had a brother by the name of U-si-ah Colnasky, who is living over where my mother is in Swain County, N. C. My mother had two sisters, one was named Susy, and I cannot think of the other one's name, but some of the older people around here can give you their names.
