Former Governor Visits

The former governor of North Carolina, James Holshouser, had a six lecture series in November. Mrs. Carolyn Beyer, who taught the government classes during the first semester and who is finishing her doctorate second semester, arranged for Mr. Holshouser to speak at G.C. The former governor talked and answered questions. The North Carolina governor does not have the power of veto.

But he does manage the finances. When asked about the corruption in his administration, Mr. Holshouser replied that there were always problems of special interest groups wanting bills passed for their own benefit. Violence on TV, state corrections systems, and the governor's authority to pardon and commute sentences were discussed by the former governor.

Cousteau Visits G.C.

Jean-Michel Cousteau visited the G.C. campus on February 8. This son of the famous Jacques Cousteau gave a lecture in the Chapel entitled Project Ocean Search. Mr. Cousteau was a very entertaining speaker. Not only did his speech have a very heavy California-French accent, but also he had a very good sense of humor. One example of Mr. Cousteau's humor was the talk of the one road through the jungle island of Wuvula Island in the New Guinea's territory. That single road was called Highway number one.

Project Ocean Search is an expedition made by anyone interested in the trip. Through a slide show, the audience joined one of the expeditions which already consisted of teachers, housewives, divers, non-divers, and others both male and female. The fifty or so people in the group lived in

"Downtown Wuvula" which consisted of an all purpose house, three dorms, one supply/medical/scientific house, a kitchen, and a bathroom. Access to the island itself was by boat or by plane. A single dirt lane made up the "National Airport." Members of the expedition studied many different aspects of nature, both in the sea and on land. Classes were held on birds, reptiles, plants, and insects as well as sea life. Jean-Michel Cousteau ended his lecture with a beautiful movie of the coral reef and with a question-answer session. In all, it was a very entertaining and an educational lecture. — BS

The Honorable Samuel James Ervin, Jr., is best known for his work as Chairman of the U.S. Senate "Watergate" Committee, resulting in the re-affirmation of government by law in the nation. During his Senate career, beginning in 1954, he served in many other important capacities. Constitutional rights being the area of his greatest specialty. A native of Morganton, N.C., he received his A. B. degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, his LL. B. degree from Harvard University, and many honorary doctoral degrees from a variety of institutions. He has served in the North Carolina General Assembly and in the Congress of the United States; as a judge in the criminal court and the Superior Court; and as an Associate Justice of the N. C. Supreme Court.

Senator Ervin is a trustee of several educational institutions. His memberships in distinguished societies are too numerous to enumerate. He is a Presbyterian, a Democrat, a Moose, a Mason, and a Kiwanian. Currently he is in great demand as a speaker throughout the world. He and Mrs. Ervin have three children.

Father Richard Biega, Catholic Campus Minister in the City of Greensboro, and Associate Pastor, St. Paul the Apostle Roman Catholic Church, is an adjunct lecturer on our faculty.

Rabbi Arnold S. Task is rabbi at Temple Emanuel in Greensboro, and is an adjunct professor on our faculty.

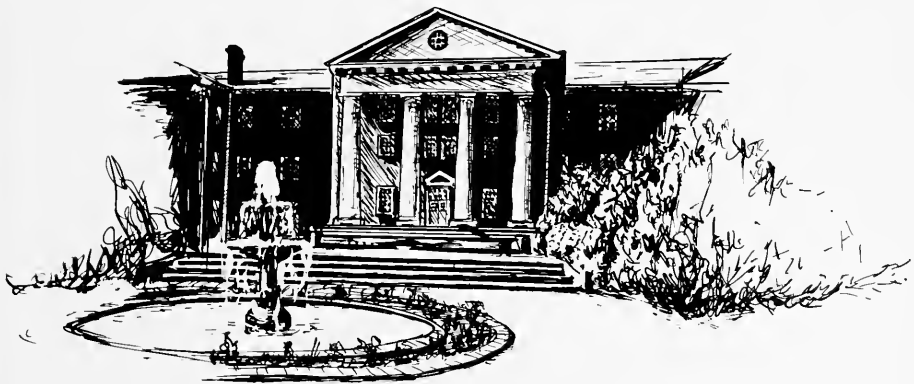

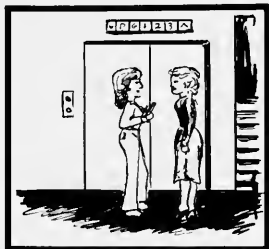
