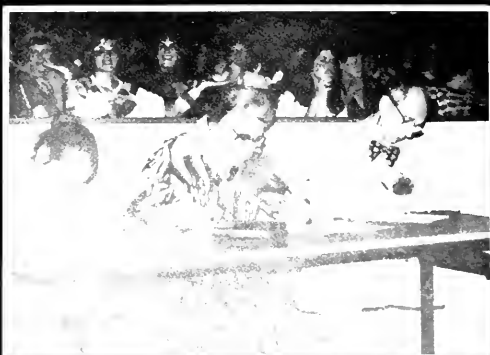

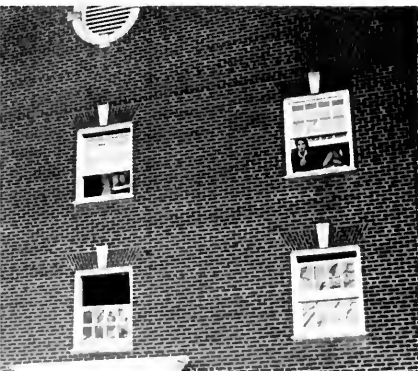

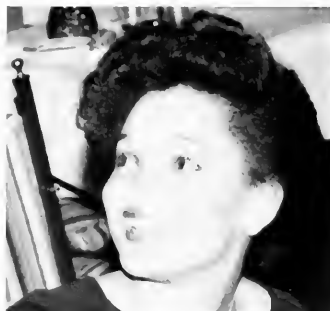
## The Plexus Mime Theatre

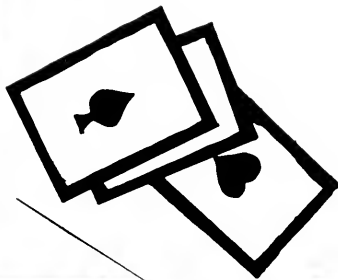
