EXPLANATORY NOTE.

The Directory is compiled on the following system :—The Names and Addresses of the nobility and gentry, of persons in business, of voters, and of persons residing in the County whose places of business are in Edinburgh or Leith, have as far as possible been inserted. These have been arranged first in Alphabetical order, and then in the order of their Postal or Sub-Postal Districts. In the cases of Dalkeith, Musselburgh, and Portobello, the names have been likewise arranged in the order of Trades. As no name appears in the District Lists which does not also appear in the Alphabetical arrangement, and *vice versa*, the information desired may be obtained from either, but generally more fully under the District Lists. The names of Officials only have been given under Edinburgh and Leith.

In the Index of Gentlemen's Seats, Farms, Hamlets, &c., at page 144, the *Italic Letters* refer to the respective Parishes in which the places are situated, a list of which is given at page 10 ; and the *Figures* refer to the number of the Postal District under which the places are arranged, which may be found either by turning to the Contents, or to the District Lists themselves.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COUNTY.

EDINBURGHSHIRE, or Mid-Lothian, the metropolitan county of Scotland, on the south of the Firth of Forth, is bounded on the east by the counties of Haddington, Berwick, and Roxburgh; on the south by those of Peebles, Selkirk, and Lanark; and on the west by Linlithgowshire. Its area is 367 square miles; its greatest breadth, from north to south, 18 miles; its greatest length, from east to west, 35 miles; and it has $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles of coast. It covers 234,925 acres; the population, in 1861, numbered 273,997; and, exclusive of the Canongate and City divisions, it is divided into 30 parishes. Exclusive of Edinburgh and Leith, there are 28 Parish, 18 Free, and 18 United Presbyterian churches; and there are 27 parochial schools, and 182 heritors. Edinburgh, Inveresk, and North Leith have no parish schools. It returns one member to the House of Commons; and the burghs of *Leith*, *Portobello*, and *Musselburgh* unite in also returning a representative to Parliament. The registered county electors in 1869-70 were 2513, a large number of whom are non-resident; and the valued rental for 1869-70, exclusive of railways, was £467,309, 17s. 4d. The county polling-places are *Edinburgh*, *Dalkeith*, and *Mid-Caldor*.

A maritime and agricultural county, the inhabitants are principally engaged in the cultivation of the soil, a large part of which is under crop. The farms, generally, are large; and wheat, oats, barley, potatoes, and turnips are raised in great quantities. The weekly wages of farm-labourers range from 14s. to 16s. for men, 6s. to 8s. for women, and from 3s. to 4s. 6d. for children, without food.

Extensive nurseries and fruit and vegetable gardens surround the metropolis; and for the supply of the city with milk and butter, a good deal of land in the immediate neighbourhood is kept under pasture.

Very few manufactures are carried on within the county, and these are principally confined to Edinburgh and Leith, or their vicinity. Printing being the most extensive and important trade of the capital, paper is manufactured at Penicuik, Lasswade, and Colinton; and there are numerous flour and barley mills on the banks of the Water of Leith. There are extensive collieries in the eastern division of the county, employing large numbers of workers, who live in villages in the neighbourhood of the pits, of which they are, for the most part, the sole occupants; and in the west of the county, there are several fine quarries, from which the city is supplied with stone for building purposes.

The county is traversed and intersected by the *North British* and *Caledonian Railways*, and their numerous branches; *stage-coaches* leave Edinburgh daily for the principal towns and more interesting localities; and *steamers* ply at

brief intervals between Leith and Granton and the Fife coast. The *Union Canal*, originally opened for passenger traffic with the west, is now used for the transport of coal, stone, and manure.

The county of Edinburgh is peculiarly rich in historical associations, there being scarcely a spot not made interesting on account of some incident connected with the warlike times which close only with the first half of last century; but the more prominent of these will be noticed in the description of the localities themselves.

The business of the county is conducted by a Lord and Deputy Lieutenants, a Convener and Commissioners of Supply, and Road Trustees. The assessment for police and county-court purposes is 5d. per pound. The *judicial* business is managed by a Sheriff and three Sheriff-substitutes, a Procurator-Fiscal, and Justices of the Peace.

TOWNS AND VILLAGES.—*Edinburgh*, the capital and a royal burgh; *Dalkeith*, a burgh of barony and busy market-town, the seat of the Duke of Buccleuch; *Musselburgh*, an ancient burgh of regality; *Portobello*, a favourite watering-place; *Penicuik*, at the south end of the county, the seat of Sir James Clerk, where there are extensive paper-mills; *Mid-Calder*, the seat of Lord Torphichen, and *West-Calder*, at the western extremity; *Corstorphine*, *Currie*, *Eskbank*, *Lasswade*, and *Loanhead*, are favourite country summer quarters of the Edinburgh citizens; *Trinity*, *Morningside*, *Joppa*, and *Duddingston* are pleasant suburban residences.

RIVERS.—The *Esk*, at Musselburgh, formed by the union near Dalkeith of the *North* and *South* Esk. The North Esk rises in Peeblesshire, and, passing Penicuik, flows through Roslin and Hawthornden. The South Esk rises in the Moorfoot Hills, forms the boundary of the parishes of Carrington and Borthwick, flows through Newbattle, and joins the North Esk in Dalkeith Park. The *Water of Leith*, 19 miles long, rises in the Pentlands, and, flowing through the villages of Balerno, Currie, Colinton, and Slateford, falls into the harbour at Leith. The *Almond*, a good trouting river, rises in Lanarkshire, divides the county from Linlithgowshire, passes Mid-Calder and Kirkliston, and flows into the Firth at Cramond. The *Gala Water*, rising in the Moorfoot Hills, joins the *Heriot* at the north-east boundary of the parish of that name, flows past the village of Stow, forms the boundary of the counties of Selkirk and Roxburgh, and flows into the Tweed at Abbotsford.

HILLS.—The *Pentlands* (highest point 1890 feet), stretch, in a north-easterly direction, from the east of Lanarkshire through the centre of the county, dividing it into two comparatively level tracts, which unite within 5 miles of Edinburgh; the *Moorfoot Hills*, a branch of the Lammermoors (highest point 2136 feet), form part of the southern boundary, in the parishes of Temple, Heriot, and Stow; and the small but interesting *Corstorphine Hill*, *Braid* and *Blackford Hills*, and *Arthur's Seat*, in the vicinity of the capital, which command varied and extensive views of the surrounding country.

ANTIQUITIES AND PLACES OF INTEREST.—*Borthwick Castle*, about 2 miles south-east of the Fushiebridge station of the North British Railway; the ruins of *Craigmillar Castle*, on the old Dalkeith Road, about 3 miles from Princes Street; the ruins of *Crichton Castle*, in the valley of the Tyne, 1 mile from Borthwick Castle; *Roslin*, with its *Chapel* and *Castle*, 7½ miles south of Edinburgh; *Hawthornden*, the romantic residence of the poet Drummond (1585-

1649), 2 miles east of Roslin; *Newbattle Abbey*, the seat of the Marquis of Lothian, on the South Esk, 1 mile south of Dalkeith; *Habbie's Howe*, at the head of Glencorse Burn, 9 miles from Edinburgh, are places much visited by tourists.

To facilitate reference to the addresses of persons residing in the county, the last part of the Directory has been divided into Postal or sub-Postal Districts, arranged in alphabetical order, any one of which will easily be found either by turning to its letter in the Directory, or to the Contents for its page. Instead of attempting to describe so many districts singly, and in the same order, Strangers will get a better idea of such places as are of general interest by being conducted over the county in a series of main routes; and as the *HAND-BOOK* is designed solely for persons entirely unfamiliar with the localities, and presumably ignorant of the modes of conveyance, we shall prefer in our description to err on the side of minuteness of detail, as what appears obvious and familiar to the initiated, is often extremely doubtful and perplexing to a stranger. Proceeding on this plan, and taking *Edinburgh*, the capital, as the starting-point, we shall conduct our readers over the county in the following series of

COACH AND RAILWAY ROUTES.

1. EDINBURGH TO CRAMOND—AND CRAMOND TO MUSSELBURGH.

STRANGERS arrive in Edinburgh, if by the Caledonian Railway from the west, at the west end of Princes Street; if by the North British or Scottish Central Railway from the north, west, east, or south, at *Waverley Bridge*, near the east end of Princes Street; and if by Coach, at the east end of Princes Street. Thus, by whatever conveyance he may arrive, the stranger finds himself in Princes Street, the most fashionable and central street in the city, between the Old and New Town. Starting by coach from the east end of this street, on his way to Cramond, he may notice in passing, on the south terrace, the Scott Monument, the statues of Professor Wilson and Allan Ramsay at either side of the Antiquarian Museum, the Castle ramparts, and, at the west end, St John's Episcopal Chapel. Proceeding down Queensferry Street, he passes the Dean Bridge, which spans the Water of Leith on four arches, at a height of upwards of one hundred feet, and enters one of the finest and best kept roads in the county, from which, looking north and west, beautiful views are obtained. Looking northwards, the two new buildings are St Cuthbert's Poor-house to the west, and the Fettes College to the east. On his left, he passes the Dean Church and Cemetery, and Stewart's Hospital, and in a few minutes arrives at the village of

Blackhall (1), a small roadside post-town, 2 miles from Edinburgh, in the immediate neighbourhood of which are the stone quarries of Craighleith, from which most of the stones used in the erection of the New Town were obtained. The village, which consists of a few mean houses, stands in three parishes. On the left is one of the entrances to Ravelston House, the residence of David Davidson, Esq., manager of the Bank of Scotland. A quarter of a mile from

the village, and a little to the left, is Craigerook, the well-known residence of the late Lord Jeffrey, in whose time it was the scene of many social Saturday afternoon gatherings of the Edinburgh bar. Fully half-a-mile farther on, a little to the right, is

Davidson's Mains (9), a clean little village and post-town, with a considerable population, which was at one time called Muttonhole. It has a Free Church and school, a subscription school, and a female parochial school. The inhabitants are chiefly employed in the neighbouring farms and quarries. In the summer, a coach (the "Jock Howieson") runs from Edinburgh through the village to and from Cramond twice daily. There are several large farms in the neighbourhood. West of the village, and extending for nearly a mile, is the Barnton estate, now one of the seats of Sir Alexander Ramsay Gibson-Maitland, Bart., member for the county.

Cramond (6), six miles from Edinburgh, is reached from this point by the road at Davidson's Mains, which bounds the Barnton estate on the north-east, and along which the "Jock Howieson" runs; but the Queensferry coach from Edinburgh keeps the Queensferry Road, landing its passengers at *Cramond Bridge* (formerly Upper Cramond), picturesquely situated on the banks of the River Almond, which here flows through a wooded glen past the village, till it reaches the Firth of Forth. There is a good inn at Cramond Bridge, and also a post-office; but the village proper is about a mile towards the coast, which is reached by the road a little to the right, forming the west boundary of Barnton grounds, and which meets the road from Davidson's Mains at the village. On the right, as the Visitor enters this road, is Braehead, gifted by the "Gudeman of Balingeigh" to John Howieson for his timely aid in dispersing with his flail the gipsies who were likely to overmatch the disguised Sovereign. Cramond has a parish church and school, large iron-works, and a ship-coating company, and is beginning to be resorted to in summer as a sea-bathing quarter by the less wealthy classes. About a mile from the mouth of the Almond is Cramond Island, accessible on foot at low water. It has lately been bought by the Earl of Rosebery from the laird of Barnton. The coast-line of the county, a distance of fully twelve miles, stretches from Cramond to Musselburgh; and the Visitor who has time may enjoy a beautiful drive along this route, and return to Edinburgh in good time in the evening. Starting from Cramond, the Visitor, if on foot, may proceed along the shore of the Firth by Broomfield, Muirhouse, and Craig Royston, to Granton House; but if driving, he will require to return to Davidson's Mains by Cramond House (the residence of John C. C. Halkett, Esq.), and Laurieston Castle, formerly possessed by the Laws of Laurieston, who lost it for their adherence to the cause of the Stuarts, and of which George Law, founder of the Bank of France, was at one time proprietor. A mile from Davidson's Mains, he will turn down the road on the left, by West Pilton and Muirhouse, pass Granton House, the residence of the Right Hon. Sir John McNeill, and Caroline Park, one of the seats of the Duke of Buccleuch, and arrive at

Granton (20), a spacious harbour and breakwater, the property of the Duke of Buccleuch, where there is a large shipbuilding yard and patent slip, and also wool-stores and iron-works. Granton is a station of the North British Railway, and is the ferry to Burntisland and the North. The Caledonian Railway has a goods station here. There are very few houses at Granton, the district

being thinly peopled ; but there is a large hotel for the accommodation of strangers arriving by rail or steamer, a post-office at the harbour, and a branch of the Royal Bank. Driving along the road by the shore, the suburbs of *Wardie* and *Trinity* are seen on the elevated ground to the right ; and the Chain Pier, the resort of swimmers, is opposite the Trinity Railway Station. A little farther on the Visitor reaches

Newhaven (37), a well-known fishing village, whose inhabitants may be regarded as one large family, in many cases bearing the same name, and seldom marrying out of their own class. There are two hotels in the village, noted for their "fish-dinners," several good houses for summer visitors, and two churches and schools. The nearest Railway Stations are *Trinity* and *Bownington*, each about half a mile from the village, and omnibuses run to and from Edinburgh every half-hour. A short distance to the east is the busy seaport town of

Leith (12), now almost an integral part of the metropolis, though an independent town, divided into the two parishes of North and South Leith, and containing 34,000 inhabitants. Leith Fort, where a detachment of Royal Artillery is stationed, is at the west entrance ; and a little farther on, past the goods station of the Caledonian Railway, to the left, are a series of extensive docks, stretching to the harbour, in the centre of the town, from which two piers of great length extend into the Firth. To the east of the harbour is a large graving-dock, and another extensive wet dock (the Albert) formally opened on the 24th August 1869. Leith is supported principally by its shipping ; but there are extensive flour mills, sugar refineries, distilleries, and other works, which give employment to a large number of people. The revenue of the Dock Commissioners for 1869 was £58,869, 16s. 1d. Passing out of Leith by St Bernard Street, the more interesting route is by Constitution Street, Charlotte Street, and the Links, to Seafield, where there are salt-water baths, from which it is but a short drive to

Portobello (40), a fashionable watering-place, three miles from Edinburgh, greatly resorted to in summer by visitors from different parts of the country. There are a number of handsome crescents at the south and east parts of the town, and, skirting the Promenade, now being greatly extended, are several elegant villas. The beach is one of the largest, finest, and safest in the kingdom, and bathing is extensively indulged in. A handsome pier is at present in course of erection ; and when the Promenade is completed, Portobello will have attractions of a superior kind for visitors to the sea-side. With the exception of a large brick-work at the west of the town, there are no manufactories. Portobello is built on part of the estate of *Duddingston*, which lies fully a mile to the south-west, in the valley of Arthur's Seat. It is governed by a Provost, two Bailies, and eight Councillors, and unites with Musselburgh and Leith in returning a member to the House of Commons. At the east of the town is the little village of

Joppa, a railway station and suburb of Portobello, on the road to *Fisherrow* ; and farther east is the burgh of

Musselburgh, six miles from Edinburgh, at the mouth of the river Esk, which divides it from the fishing village of Fisherrow. The Edinburgh races are held annually, in July, on Musselburgh Links, also used as a golfing ground, and which was the meeting place of the Covenanters with the repre-

sentatives of Charles I. in 1638. South of the Links is Pinkie House, the seat of Sir Archibald Hope, Bart. On the east bank of the river, near the Railway Station, is a statue of Dr Moir, who, under the well-known signature of "Delta," contributed poems to *Blackwood's Magazine* when that periodical was at the height of its fame. Musselburgh, often, though erroneously, called a royal burgh, is governed by a Provost, three Bailies, and eight Councillors, who are also Police and Harbour Commissioners. A short distance to the south-east is the interesting little village of *Inveresk*, in which parish Musselburgh is situated; and about half-a-mile to the east of Inveresk, at the junction of two cross-roads, is the site of the battle of Pinkie, where, in 1547, the Scots were defeated by the English. The Visitor may return to Edinburgh either by coach or rail. If by the former, he will pass the villages of Fisherrow, Joppa, and Portobello, the little village of *Jock's Lodge*, midway between Portobello and Edinburgh, and, on the right, the Piershill Cavalry Barracks, arriving at the point from which he set out—the east end of Princes Street.

2. EDINBURGH TO PENICUIK.

PENICUIK may be reached from Edinburgh either by Coach or by North British Railway (Peebles Branch). Taking the route by coach, the Visitor will be driven southwards the whole length of the Old Town, through its principal streets, passing along, on his way, the North Bridge (opened 1769); the South Bridge (spanning the Cowgate); the University (which occupies the site of the Kirk o' Field, where Darnley was murdered), on the right; and the Royal College of Surgeons, on the left, in Nicolson Street. Proceeding along Clerk and Minto Streets, there is nothing calling for particular notice till

Liberton is reached, a little to the east, on the Lasswade road, situated on rising ground about 3 miles to the south of Edinburgh, the parish church of which is a prominent object in the landscape for miles round. In this parish, which is 4 miles in length by 3 in breadth, there is abundance of limestone and coal, and several well-stocked farms. To the left of the village, a good view is obtained of the ruins of Craigmillar Castle, beautifully embowered among trees; and the whole way to the right the Pentland Hills skirt the route. Half-a-mile south of Liberton, on the left, is the villa of St Catherine's (the residence of Maurice Lothian, Esq., ex-Procurator-Fiscal), the site of the Chapel of St Catherine, the revenues of which, at the Reformation, were annexed to Liberton Church. On the right is the residence of Richard Trotter, Esq., of Morton Hall, ex-convener of the county, whose grounds are bounded on the south by the road at Kaims, which leads to Dreghorn (the seat of R. A. Macfie, Esq., member for the Leith Burghs), and to the village of Colinton. Passing the hamlet and lime-kilns of Burdiehouse, the coach arrives at the hamlet of Straiton, the road from which for some miles is formed on the Roman military way. On the left of Straiton is the coach road to *Loanhead* and *Lasswade*; and a mile and a quarter from Straiton, on the left, at Bilston toll, is the road to *Roslin*, on approaching which may be seen, on the left, peeping out from among the trees, the tower of Dryden. About a mile from the toll, on the right, is the residence of Lieut.-Col. Trotter, of The Bush; and adjacent to it is Glencorse, the property of

the Right Hon. John Inglis, Lord Justice-General. At the head of Glencorse Burn is *Habbie's Howe*, one of the scenes of the "Gentle Shepherd," a favourite resort of pic-nic parties from Edinburgh. Rullion Green, on the western road which skirts the Pentlands, is the site of the Covenanter's encampment, where they were defeated in 1666. The coach here passes

Greenlaw, the military prison of Scotland, in the neighbourhood of which is the postal district of Milton Bridge; and in a few minutes arrives at

Penicuik, ten miles south of Edinburgh, where the extensive paper-mills of the Messrs Cowan are situated. A little to the west is Penicuik House, the residence of Sir James Clerk, Bart., the extensive and well-wooded grounds of which are watered by the North Esk. At Harken Burn, within the grounds, are the remains of a Roman camp; and a little to the south-west are the ruins of Brunstane Castle, said to have been a residence of the Earls of Dumfries. The Visitor may return to Edinburgh by rail, a distance of 15 miles, which he will reach in less than an hour.

3. EDINBURGH TO ROSLIN, HAWTHORNDEN, AND LASSWADE.

THE traveller by coach will traverse the route described in No. 2, turn off to the left at Bilston toll-bar, and, after a drive of a mile, arrive at the village of

Roslin, $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Edinburgh, the property of the Earl of Rosslyn, at the entrance to a vale of remarkable beauty. Roslin was erected into a burgh by James II. in 1456, during whose reign William St Clair, its proprietor, lived in great splendour in the Castle. At that remote period Roslin was a comparatively populous town, in which a great many of the nobility and gentry resided; but it shared the fate of the other villages in the neighbourhood of the capital, being burned by the English army in 1544. In 1302, a battle was fought here between the English and Scottish armies, in which the English were several times defeated. There is a handsome new hotel, as well as a comfortable inn, for the accommodation of tourists; and there is a Parish and a Free Church and burgh school. A little to the east of the village, on the high ground, is *Roslin Chapel*, an object of great interest on account of its architectural features, which is open on Sundays for divine service. The Chapel (admission, 1s. each; party of ten, 6d. each), founded by St Clair in 1446, was defaced at the Revolution of 1688 by an Edinburgh mob, but was lately successfully restored in keeping with its original design. It is 69 feet long, 34 feet broad, 40 feet high, the arched roof being supported by two curiously carved pillars. The ancient Barons of Roslin are buried in complete armour under its floor. A short distance from the Chapel, to the left, on the slope of the hill, on the east of the churchyard, a bridge conducts the Visitor to the ruins of the *Castle* (admission, 6d. each), built on a precipitous rock overhanging the Esk, and which, in early times, was the residence and stronghold of the St Clairs. It was burnt with the village in 1544, and in 1650 surrendered to General Monk. The view from the Castle is of the most picturesque description. Leaving the Castle and descending a narrow pathway on the left, under the arch of the bridge, into the valley, the

footpath to the left conducts along an open meadow, through turnstiles, to the woods of Roslin; on emerging from which by a door in an old wall, the Visitor enters the woods of

Hawthornden, the romantic residence of Lady Drummond, and of her distinguished ancestor, William Drummond, the poet (1585-1649), where he was visited by Ben Jonson in the winter of 1618-19. The pathway along which the Visitor proceeds is on the left or west bank of the Esk, a lovely though somewhat rugged and lonely walk, now open to the public by legal decision, after an unsuccessful attempt to close it. The private grounds and mansion of Hawthornden are on the other or east side of the river, half-a-mile from the entrance to the woods, connected by a bridge, to which, however, no access can be had by strangers from the public road;¹ but any disappointment on this account is compensated by the circumstance that an excellent view of the house, which stands on a cliff rising almost perpendicularly from the bed of the river, is obtained from the public as well as the private side. The path, which takes a winding course through the recesses of the wood, conducts the Visitor, a short distance from the house, through a pleasant, open meadow by the river side; thence through a wooden stile, to the rising grounds which overlook the paper-mills at Springfield and Polton in the valley beneath. Descending this hill to the left, past two low-roofed cottages, a footpath to the right leads to *Polton Station* (for Lasswade and Edinburgh), and the road on the left leads to the village of *Loanhead*, six miles from Edinburgh, and about half-a-mile to the north of Springfield. The Visitor may either take this road to Loanhead, and, by driving fully a mile east, reach Lasswade, or he may proceed to Lasswade on foot, nearly the whole way, along the banks of the Esk—the preferable route to one acquainted with the locality. Should he, however, prefer to see more of Hawthornden before leaving the neighbourhood, he will cross the river on the Loanhead road at Springfield to the right, retrace, as it were, his steps along the road south of the Esk till he arrives at the Lodge, on his right, the entrance to Hawthornden, by which admittance to the grounds is gained on payment of 1s. each person. [We may here mention that the most direct route from Edinburgh is by train to Hawthornden, the Lodge being only a few minutes' walk from the station.] In the well-kept grounds are shown several subterranean caves, St Matthew's Well, the ruins of an old tower, and a seat called the Cypress-grove, where the poet is supposed to have sat while writing his poems. The caves, which are hewn out of the solid rock, are well worthy of a visit. They are called the Caves of King Robert the Bruce, and are so low that they can only be explored in a stooping posture. At one end, on a table, are shown the Bruce's sword, and the desk from which John Knox preached. On the right is Bruce's bed-room, a sort of circular chamber, lighted and aired by a narrow port-hole to the river; and opposite the bed-room is the library, the most curious of all the apartments, in which are no fewer than 170 shelves, in five tiers, cut out of the solid rock. The Visitor may leave the grounds by the path up the south bank of the Esk, and

¹ The low and romantic walk by the river side past the bridge, formerly open to the public, has been closed since the above decision, which applied to the high road only; and strangers who descend by this footpath must return to the road which conducts to the higher ridge of the glen. The prohibitory ticket at the approach might have some chance of being attended to were all the obsolete prohibitory notices removed, as they deface the trees as well as perplex strangers.

proceed to Roslin by the bridge already noticed; or he may return from the Lodge by the road which he came, and after a drive of about two miles to the east, reach the village of

Lasswade, the centre of an interesting and beautiful district, 6 miles from Edinburgh, where Sir Walter Scott and De Quincey resided for some time. There is both an Established and United Presbyterian Church in the village, and towards *Bonnyrigg*, half-a-mile to the south (much extended of late to meet the demand for summer quarters), there is a Free Church. The chief manufacture is paper, for both writing and printing purposes. A little to the north is Melville Castle, an elegant building in the Gothic style, the seat of Viscount Melville. A mile west from Lasswade is Newbattle Abbey; and the same distance north of Newbattle is Dalkeith, the seat of the Duke of Buccleuch. The Visitor may return to Edinburgh either by coach or rail. If by coach, he will be driven, a mile to the west, through the village of

Loanhead, on approaching which, on his left, he will pass Mavisbank House (the residence of Geo. C. Arbuthnot, Esq.), near which is a mound of earth, begirt with ramparts, where many relics of antiquarian interest have been found. About a mile from Loanhead is the hamlet of Straiton, from which the Visitor proceeds to town by the route he traversed on leaving Edinburgh.

4. EDINBURGH TO CURRIE, MID-CALDER, AND WEST CALDER.

By this route the traveller will be conducted through the entire western part of the county, a distance from Edinburgh of 16 miles. Leaving by the Caledonian Railway Station, at the west end of Princes Street, and passing Dalry and *Gorgie* on the right, the train stops at the village of

Slateford, a distance of little more than two miles from the capital, on the Water of Leith, in the neighbourhood of which are several large stone-quarries. The stations on the Caledonian line are of the most wretched description. The ticket-office at Slateford is the dirty little box on the left, about six feet square; and the wooden shed on the right, called the "waiting-room," might easily be mistaken for a convenience of another kind. On the left of the village is Craiglockhart House, the residence of the Sheriff (Davidson) of the county. Slateford is the post-town for Colinton, in which parish it is situated. About a mile south-west of Slateford is the village of

Colinton, picturesquely situated in the valley of the Water of Leith, which may be reached either from Slateford, or from the station of Kingsknowe, only half-a-mile farther west. The direct route from Slateford is by the road south of the village, to Craiglockhart, afterwards turning to the south-west, on the right of which, and at the entrance to the village, is Colinton House, the residence of the Dowager Lady Dunfermline. A more romantic walk is by the side of the river, which is well wooded, entering by a footpath at Kate's Mill, and emerging at a narrow pathway near the parish church. The history of Colinton has been written by Thomas Murray, Esq., LL.D., Lasswade, who, a few years ago, resided in Colinton Bank, at the main entrance to the village. Half-a-mile east of the village is Dreghorn Castle; and a mile to the west the Visitor by foot or conveyance passes through

Juniper Green, a pleasant little village lying midway on the road to Currie,

on the north bank of the Water of Leith. It is said to have received its name from its immense number of juniper trees. About a mile to the left, between Colinton and Juniper Green, is Bonally, at one time the residence of Lord Cockburn. Passing on the left Kenleith paper-mills (Mr Bruce's),

Currie is reached; and the Visitor whose time will not permit of his going farther in this direction, may return to Edinburgh from the station half-a-mile to the left of the village. Currie, which is a parish and post-town, was anciently called Killeith. Its church, in the reign of James VI., was made over to the newly-founded College of Edinburgh, whose curators possess the right of patronage. In the churchyard, there is a pretty sun-dial carved in slate by the late Mr Palmer, the parish schoolmaster. Freestone, ironstone, and limestone abound in the neighbourhood. Currie stands at an elevation of 800 feet above the level of the sea, in close proximity to the base of the Pentlands, the road through the village to the south leading to the reservoirs of the Edinburgh Corporation Waterworks, about two miles distant. A mile and a half west of Currie, the road on the left leads to the village of

Balerno, about seven miles from Edinburgh, at the foot of the Pentlands, the road through which leads to the reservoirs of Harelaw and Thriepmuir.

But it is now necessary to retrace our steps to Currie, and proceed farther on our journey by train. A little to the north of the station is Riccarton House, the residence of Sir William Gibson-Craig, Bart., Lord Clerk Register of Scotland; and a mile to the west, and about the same distance north of Balerno, are the extensive grounds of Dalmahoy, the seat of the Earl of Morton. Three miles farther on is the village and parish of

Kirknewton, ten miles from Edinburgh, the station to which is a short distance to the west, close to the parish church. East of the village is the small estate of Meadowbank, once the residence of Lord Meadowbank, one of the Senators of the College of Justice. Two miles to the west is

Mid-Calder, on the east boundary of its own parish, 12 miles from the capital, on the old Glasgow Road. Half-a-mile to the east, in the parish of Kirknewton, is the village of *East Calder*; and a little to the south-west is Calder House, the seat of Lord Torphichen, beautifully situated in the midst of a wood of considerable extent. It was in Calder House that John Knox first dispensed the Sacrament after the Reformation, and the portrait of the great Reformer adorns one of the rooms. There are paper mills on the Almond, and abundance of limestone, freestone, and ironstone in the parish. Proceeding along the new Cleland line, and passing Newpark, the residence of Ralph Richardson, Esq., W.S., we arrive at the village of

West Calder, about 16 miles by rail from the city, and 5 from Mid-Calder, in the centre of a large but rather uninteresting district. There are traces of a Roman encampment in the parish; and near the estate of Harburn, 2 miles south of the village, and formerly its station, Cromwell fought one of his battles. The spot is still pointed out by the name of "Cromwell's Wit." Two miles to the south-west of Harburn is the large reservoir of Cobinshaw, which supplies Edinburgh with part of its water. As there is no other mode of conveyance, the Visitor has no alternative (unless economy be no object) than to return to the city by the way which he came.

5. EDINBURGH TO DALKEITH, GOREBRIDGE, AND STOW.

Stow is 27 miles from Edinburgh, near the south-east boundary of the county, its parish being partly in the adjacent county of Selkirk, and is reached by North British Railway (Galashiels line). The Visitor not on immediate business, nor pressed for time, may add to the interest of the journey by taking the coach from 4 Princes Street to Dalkeith. Should he take this route, he will proceed as in the route No. 2, till he reaches the toll-bar at the south end of the suburb of Newington, when, a few yards farther on, he will enter the road on the left, on the east of which are the small estates of Inch and Kingston Grange; and on the west, the estate of Moredun, the residence of David Anderson, Esq. The road a little to the east of Moredun leads to Edmonstone House, the residence of Sir James Gardiner Baird, Bart.; and a little to the east of the village of

Gilmerton, through which the coach passes, is the estate of Drum, the residence of John More Nisbet, Esq. A mile and a half from Gilmerton, on the right, are the grounds of Melville Castle, through which the North Esk flows; and on the other side, a little to the east, is Sheriff-hall, where George Buchanan for some time resided. Half-a-mile farther on is the burgh of

Dalkeith, six miles south-east of Edinburgh, the seat of the Duke of Buccleuch, the grounds of which are entered at the east end of the High Street, the principal street of the town, to which strangers are admitted, in the absence of the family, on Wednesdays and Saturdays. The palace, which occupies the site of a castle formerly owned by the Earls of Morton, is a comparatively plain structure; but the grounds are of considerable extent and beauty, stretching eastwards towards *Inveresk*, and are watered by both branches of the Esk, which unite at the south-east boundary of *Newton parish. There is a chapel at the entrance, in which there is Episcopal service on Sundays. Her Majesty and the late Prince Consort, on their first visit to Scotland in 1842, were guests of the Duke of Buccleuch, and resided in the palace, which has been the temporary residence of James VI., Charles I., and George IV. It was visited by Froissart, the French historian, in 1364, as the guest of William, Earl of Douglas. General Monk lived in it during his government of Scotland under Cromwell, in 1654-60, the extensive grounds of which enabled him to enjoy his favourite pursuit of gardening. Dalkeith is a burgh of barony, the seat of a presbytery, and a parish. The barony and patronage of the church passed by purchase into the possession of the Buccleuch family in 1642. It was previously the property of the Earls of Morton and Douglas, who inherited it from the Grahams. The town is governed by 15 trustees, of which the baron bailie is chairman, and is celebrated as one of the best grain markets in Scotland. There are iron works, tanneries, woollen factories, and coal-pits, which give employment to large numbers of persons. It has two Parish, one Free, three United Presbyterian, one Congregationalist, one Episcopal, and one Roman Catholic Church; and two newspapers are published in the burgh. Passing through the town westwards, the Visitor can resume his journey at the station of

Eskbank, a pleasant suburb of Dalkeith, and a railway centre to lines branching out in various directions. A short distance from the station, on the left, is

Newbattle, the seat of the Marquis of Lothian, the Abbey of which was

founded in 1140 by David I. for Cistercian monks, and endowed with various privileges ; but it was burnt during the Earl of Hertford's invasion. In 1587, Sir Mark Ker, its last abbot, and ancestor of the present proprietor, obtained a grant of the whole estates of the monastery from James VI. ; and in 1591, the barony was converted into a lordship, and its owner created Lord Newbattle. Newbattle parish was formed of the ancient parish of Maisterton and the Abbey of Newbattle, and the abbey became the parish church. The present mansion, on the north bank of the South Esk, is a modern building, and contains a choice selection of valuable books and paintings. At the entrance to the mansion is "King David's Gate," part of the old abbey. Newbattle may be visited from Eskbank by walking or driving half-a-mile to the south, and the Visitor can resume his journey at *Dalhousie* Station, another half mile south of Newbattle. About a mile south of the station is Dalhousie Castle, the seat of the Earl of Dalhousie (Lord Panmure). In 1860, the last Marquis of Dalhousie (Broun-Ramsay), Governor-General of India, died here in his 48th year, "leaving behind him a name that ranks among the highest in the roll of Indian viceroys for statesmanship, administrative vigour, and the faculty of inspiring confidence among the millions subjected to his sway." As he died without male issue, the earldom reverted to his cousin. West of Dalhousie is the parish church and manse of Cockpen ; and a mile further south, and a little west of the railway, is the small estate of Kirkhill, the residence of Sir William Johnston, the eminent geographer, who was Lord Provost of Edinburgh in 1848-51. The line here takes an eastern direction for three or four miles, passing, on the north, the village of

Gorebridge, in a detached portion of the parish of Temple, the postal centre of a large and scattered district, on the left of which are the ruins of Newbyres Castle. To the south-west, between Gorebridge and Carrington, is Arniston House, the seat of the Dundas family, eminent in the legal and political history of Scotland. Sir James Dundas, the first of Arniston, was Governor of Berwick, and was knighted by James VI. The grounds, at the south-west, border on the village of Temple, a mile from which is Rosebery, one of the seats of the Earl of Rosebery. About a mile south-east of the *Fushiebridge* Station, is Borthwick Castle (the seat of John Borthwick, Esq. of Crookston), built in 1430 by Sir William Borthwick, by permission of James I. The building is nearly square, the walls being of great thickness, and is delightfully situated in the valley of the Gore Water. Queen Mary resided in Borthwick Castle after her marriage with Bothwell, and previous to her flight to Dunbar. The eastern wall of the Castle shows the effects of a cannonade by Oliver Cromwell, who sent a detachment from Edinburgh to demand its surrender. The governor refused ; whereupon a cannonade was begun from an eminence to the east of the Castle. The governor was compelled to surrender, which he did, receiving one week to remove his family and his gear. The original summons of surrender, bearing Cromwell's signature, is in the possession of John Borthwick, Esq., of Crookston, the present proprietor of the Castle and lands attached, who is also a claimant for the title of Lord Borthwick. The parish church was conveyed by David I. to the monks at Scone, which received its present name of Borthwick at the Reformation. It was burned accidentally by fire about 80 years ago, and remained an interesting ruin until 1863, when it was incorporated with a handsome new church of Gothic architecture, built by David Kidd, Esq., of Woodhouse, in

the county of Peebles. He was a native of the parish, and erected the church to the memory of his parents, who were interred in the burial ground. It is, without doubt, one of the handsomest churches in the county. In this parish there is a valuable mortification for the purposes of education. It is of the annual value of £60, and was left by the late Col. Kinnaird, for the education of the children of the industrious poor; one third, however, goes for salary to the teacher of the school in the village of Newlandrig, where he was born, and where he received his education. An interesting fact may here be recorded of Col. Kinnaird. His father was a tailor in Newlandrig. When he died, the son sold off, and with the proceeds endeavoured to purchase a commission for India, through some persons in London who pretended to have such things at their disposal. The money was dispatched, but the commission was not forthcoming. Kinnaird found his way to the city, and made known his case to gentlemen from his own neighbourhood in power at head quarters. His tale excited sympathy, and being a "likely lad," he was forthwith sent out to India. Previous to this he had formed an affection for a daughter of the miller at Borthwick, and after the lapse of more than twenty years, he returned and made her Mrs Col. Kinnaird. Dr Robertson, the historian, was born in the manse. A mile to the north-east of Borthwick, on the banks of the Tyne, are the interesting ruins of Crichton Castle, once the residence of Sir William Crichton, Chancellor of Scotland in the minority of James II., "whose towers," says Scott,

" In different ages rose ;
Their various architecture shows
The builders' various hands."

From *Tynehead* Station (16 miles from Edinburgh), in the eastern portion of the extensive parish of Heriot, the train passes through a hilly and uninteresting tract of country. A mile to the south-west of *Heriot* Station is the parish church and manse of Heriot, close to which is Borthwick Hall, on the south bank of the Heriot Water, the residence of Charles Lawson, Esq., Lord Provost of Edinburgh in 1862-65. The next station, *Fountainhall*, 3 miles farther on, is the centre of a more interesting district; but the parish of Stow (10 miles long, by 3 broad, part of which is in Selkirkshire), anciently called Wedale, is generally hilly and covered with heath. Four miles south of Fountainhall is the village and post-town of

Stow, a little to the east of the station, on the banks of the Gala Water, a mile from its junction with the Lugate. At the south boundary of the county is *Bowland* (30 miles from Edinburgh), the residence of W. S. Walker, Esq., Chairman of the Board of Supervision.

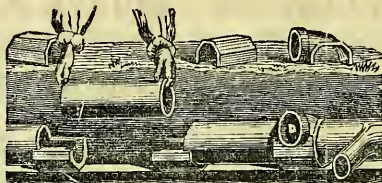

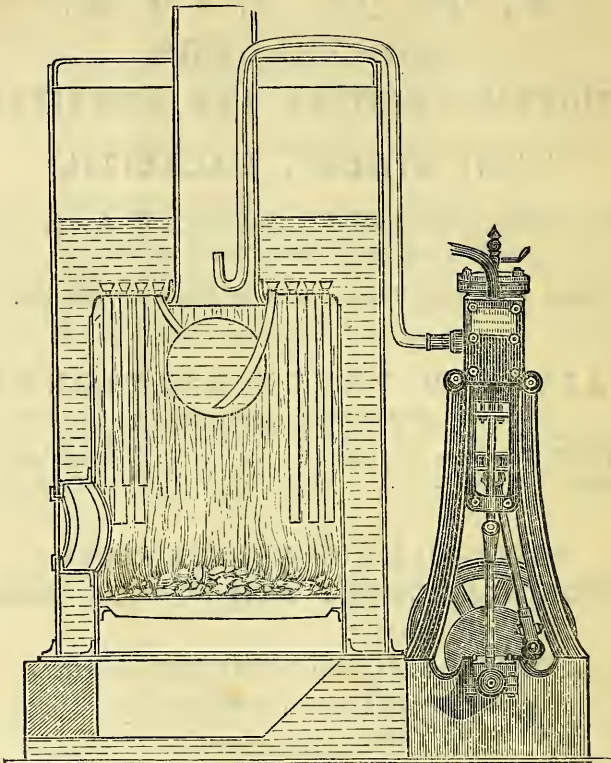

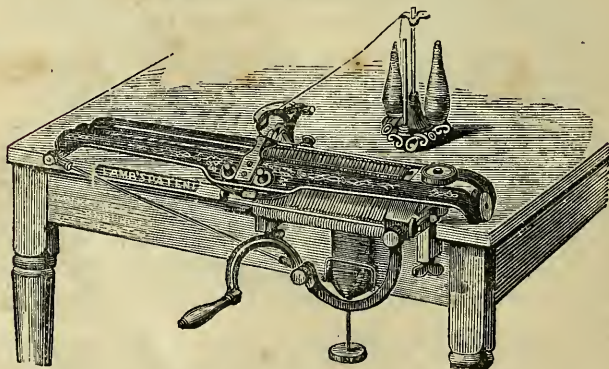

Instead of charging rates admirably higher than are necessary, and afterwards returning the excess, or a portion of it, to the advantage of periodical Bonuses, it gives from the first as large an Assurance as the Premiums, all with safety bear—reserving the Whole Surplus for those Members who have lived long enough to secure the common Fund from loss on account of their individual Assurances.

A Policy for £1000 to £500 may thus at most ages be had for the Premium else where charged to assure £1000 only, while the effect of reserving the Surplus (instead of sharing it with all indiscriminately) has been, that Policies originally for £1000, which have shared at three Sequential Investigations, have already been increased to £1400, £1600, and even to £1800.

ITS TERMS are thus well calculated to meet the requirements of intending Assurers. They are specially adapted to the case of Provisions under Family Settlements or otherwise, where it is of importance to secure from the first, for the smallest present outlay, a competent provision, of definite amount, in the case of early death.

The ADMINISTRATION has uniformly been liberal—as in relaxation of restrictions, and in removal of grounds of challenge; etc. Members not residing, and too far to reside in any part of the world, Asia excepted, to the north of 33° 30' and to the south of 30° S. When extra Premium is charged (as for India, &c.) its payment, under the distinctive system of the Office, secures the important advantage of participation in Profits.

The Rates for other Ages, or for other periods, may be had on application.

EXAMPLE.—A person aged 40 may secure £1000 at death, by a yearly payment, during life, of £100. This Premium, if paid to any other of the Mutual Offices, would secure a Policy for £800 only, instead of £1000.

Or, if unwilling to burden himself with payments during his whole life, he may secure the same sum for £1250, by a certain yearly payment of £27, 12s 6d. At age 40 the Premium ceasing at age 65, the £1000, £50, 12s 6d, being about the same as these Offices require during the whole term of life.
