HREE weeks previous to Dr. Husenbeth's death, while spending an afternoon with him at Cossey, the conversation turned upon his Emblems of the Saints. When I enquired if he had made any considerable additions to the book, and if he thought of issuing a new edition, he replied that he had long contemplated a re-issue of his work, and he produced the interleaved copy, from which the following pages have been printed; but, he added, that he never hoped to be able to see the book through the press. "I am an old man now," he said. "It vexes me to have to make terms with booksellers, and I can no longer venture to print at my own expense as I once did. If I could find a younger man who would manage the matter, there is the volume ; and perhaps I might even hope to see the new edition myself."

The result of this hint (if indeed it were meant for one) was, that before I left him I had promised to take
all worry of negociating with publishers off his hands, that I would see that the book was printed, assist in correcting the press, and, in fact, lend myself to carry out his wishes in any way that might be of service to him.

A few days after this I left home for a holiday. During my absence Dr. Husenbeth was laid in his grave.

His executors were directed to sell his library and other property, and at the sale I felt myself bound to purchase the volume which had been the subject of our conversation. He seems to have put it aside for me shortly before his lamented death, and it was found only just in time to be included in the sale catalogue.

After our conversation Dr. Husenbeth seems to have begun counting the number of additions which he had made in preparation for the new edition of his book. He had set down roughly in pencil some memoranda of there being three hundred and ninetytwo such additions, and he has prefixed a note"Number of newu Angels, Saints, or Beaii added for a Third Edition." It is quite certain, however, that he never completed the enumeration : it is probable that death came upon him while he was engaged on the task.

Feeling sure that Dr. Husenbeth would have been gratified if, during his own lifetime, the Norfolk and Norwich Archæological Society had undertaken to republish his book, I had no hesitation in closing with the offer of the Committee to bear the expense of printing it.

My own part has been almost confined to looking over the proof sheets. At first starting my views were ambitious. I soon found that the work stood for such an enormous amount of labour as few men, and those only with special gifts and rare opportunities would dream of facing, and prudence told me that the more humbly I discharged my office as Editor the less chance there was of exposing my ignorance.

Dr. Husenbeth had touched very lightly upon the two branches of his favorite subject, which in this volume are handled in a most satisfactory manner in the Appendices. Mr. Marsh's Essay on the treatment of the Sibyls in art will speak for itself. It is the first attempt on the part of any English writer to deal with a very curious and obscure subject, and may be characterised as unique. Mr. Blackburne's Appendix on Sacred Heraldry, too, may be almost said to break ground in virgin soil. How greatly these two beautiful monographs add to the
intrinsic value of the volume must be obvious to all ; as a contribution to Ecclesiastical Archæology their appearance may be regarded as an event of some importance to those born antiquaries who have an irrepressible yearning to follow the workings of the human mind in past ages through all their fantastic wanderings.

## Warface to tbe sicond Cidition.



HE object of this manual is to supply in some degree a want often felt by persons engaged in the pursuits of Archæology and Ecclesiology, and by tourists and lovers of the fine arts in general. It was undertaken at first for personal convenience; but continued and completed at the solicitation of valued friends for public utility. It has been found useful for identifying holy personages represented in painting and sculpture ; and also as a guide to artists in the representation of Angels and Saints according to conventional and established forms. Its pretensions are very humble: the subject might be pursued far more elaborately and extensively, and the work might be advantageously illustrated by engravings. But this could not be without sacrificing its convenience as a pocket companion; and to keep within a portable size is in a work of this kind a primary consideration. The church tourist and the inspector of picture galleries
require a guide of ready reference and easy portability, and such a manual is presented in the following pages.

That the tourist and the artist may equally find their convenience in this compilation, it is divided into two distinct parts. In the First, under the name of the Saint,-whether Martyr, Bishop, \&c., and the date of his death, or the age in which he lived, as far as could be ascertained with tolerable accuracy,the Emblem or the various Emblems are given, with which he is represented in works of art, whether in painting, sculpture, or engraving. To each Emblem is generally appended a reference to one or more examples in art, or to some work, upon the authority of which it has been appropriated. In selecting these examples, preference has been given to paintings on roodscreens, or glass; and to sculptured figures on fonts still remaining in English parish churches, and abounding in the counties of Norfolk and Suffolk. It would have been easy to multiply such examples, and chiefly from personal inspection; but the object of this little work is sufficiently attained by presenting a few select instances.

Though the original object of this work was to point out the Emblems of various Saints, it was soon found impossible, and not even desirable, to
limit the compilation to these. It was often necessary to specify the way in which the Emblem was introduced. It might be carried, or worn, or used as an instrument of torture or a mark of honour ; and then it became difficult to draw the line between a mere Emblem and a commemorative representation. Thus in many cases examples have been introduced of various modes of representing Saints by remarkable incidents in their lives. So that pictures and sculptured subjects are continually intermixed with Emblems, in connexion with different Saints. But this has evidently so increased the interesting character of the book, and added to its usefulness, as to render any apology superfluous.

To compile a manual of this kind, even limited as it is, would have been impracticable without the aid of friends, and the assistance of previous publications. The late John, Earl of Shrewsbury, with great kindness and condescension, collected from his rich library much valuable information, which he transmitted to the author in rapid succession for several weeks. The late Dawson Turner, Esq., then residing at Yarmouth, most liberally placed at the author's disposal the treasures of his extensive library and most valuable collection of illustrations of Norfolk. Mrs. Jayesox's splendid work, Sacred
and Legendary Art, has, by the kind permission of its authoress, been frequently referred to in the course of this Manual, and has afforded much valuable information. The Very Rev. Canon Rock, D.D.., is heartily thanked for several important and valuable communications, as well as for the loan of scarce and curious old books. The Rev. Richard Hart, of Catton, generously permitted the free use of his own List of Emblems of Saints, communicated to the Archaological Fournal, and this kindness has proved valuable, and is here gratefully acknowledged. To C. A. Buckler, Esq., the author is indebted for many valuable examples, particularly for numerous illustrations of Saints of the Order of S. Dominic. Sincere thanks are also tendered to H. Harrod, Esq., and Goddard Johnson, Esq., late of Norwich, for the loan of curious and useful works; and to all other kind friends who have lent their assistance.

This new edition contains more than one hundred and sixty additional Saints, with Emblems and references in proportion, besides many new illustrations of those previously introduced. The List of Patrons is also very considerably augmented; two more Calendars are given ; and the Emblems of the Sibyls are appended. Another curious and original feature
of this edition is the List of Armorial Bearings assigned to various Saints in the enthusiasm for heraldry prevalent in the fifteenth .century.* The work has also been carefully revised throughout, and contains many corrections and improvements.

## APPENDIX I.

## Itomograybu of the Sibuls.

BY
W. MARSH.
[Representations of the Sibyls are so frequently met with in medieval Christian art, and they play such an important rôle in Christian iconography, especially in accompanying the Prophets, that a few words as to the manner in which they are represented, the emblems they generally carry, or the prophecy traditionally assigned them has been considered of sufficient importance and interest to form an appendix to this new edition of the Emblems of Saints.

The ancients are not agreed as to the meaning of the word sibyl. Some derive it from orós (Æolic for $\theta=0 ;$ ) and $\beta \cup \cup \lambda \frac{n}{n}$, and regard it as signifying a revealer of the counsel of God; others, as Hesychius and Suidas, giving to the name a Latin origin. In
our own time Max Müller has pronounced it to be "a diminutive of an Italian sabus, or sabius, wise ; . . . . Sibylla therefore meant a wise old woman."*

The traditions of women bearing this title, and possessed of prophetic gifts, point to a very remote antiquity. Already in the fifth century B.C. Aristophanes speaks of the sibylline verses as matters of old superstition, and Plato, some forty years later, talks of the Sibyl with a certain measure of respect, as a prophetess generally believed in and entitled to more than ordinary credit.

Neither Aristophanes nor Plato, nor indeed do any writers for centuries after their day, know of more than one Sibyl, around whose shadowy personality an immense mass of mythus grew up as time went on. When the Capitol at Rome was burnt, B.C. 82, the old sibylline books, said to have been purchased by Tarquin, perished in the flames, and a commission was issued for making a fresh collection of sibylline oracles. It is after this that the number of the Sibyls begins to increase, and in the second century of our era Ælian (circa 140 A.D.) mentions that in his day four Sibyls were generally recognized, though, he adds, some authors increased them by six more. $\dagger$

One well-known passage in the Fourth Eclogue of Vergil, in which the advent of our Lord was

[^10]supposed to be foretold, attracted much attention to the Sibylline Oracles, and became the occasion of much dishonest and perverse forgery on the part of fanatical and unscrupulous "liars for God." It is hardly to be wondered at, that in an uncritical age the credulity of the multitude was played upon by designing charlatans.

The Christian Fathers of the fourth century with some hesitation appear to claim the Sibyls as witnesses who had prophesied the coming of the Messiah, though they are cautious in quoting or referring to them. *]

It would be impossible to say how early the Sibyls appear in ancient liturgies, but in medieval hymnology the Sibyl-often with the title the Cumean Sibyl-figures as the one prophetic personage in the heathen world whose utterances were deserving of universal attention.

In the well-known sequence of the twelfth century, usually called "Lætabundus, Exultet fidelis chorus;" and attributed to $S$. Bernard, we find an early example :-

Teste David cum Sibylla. So David and the Sibyl say.
In the church of the Ara Cœli at Rome, every evening, the Franciscan Fathers after compline recite the following :- $\dagger$

In the religious processions of the middle ages the Sibyls often played an important part, and were generally accompanied by their special emblem. To this day, in the religious processions during Holy Week at Seville, the Sibyls form prominent figures, and in the old mystery plays they were frequently

[^12]introduced. In the liturgical drama of Les Propkétes $d u$ Clurist, at the end of the play the Sibyl is appealed to, and chants the following :-

In Christian art the Sibyls are generally twelve in number. There is a series of paintings of the Sibyls at Cheyney Court, Herefordshire, and another series at Augsburg, which appears to be derived from the same source as those at Cheyney Court. (Notes and Queries, Fourth Series, v. 317.) There is also a series

[^13]in miniature at Munich. Dr. Husenbeth has given their Emblems "from an old French Prayer Book, Heures a l'usage de Chalons. Paris, Simon Vostre, 15 I4."

The following is offered as a preliminary sketch of the usual emblems whereby the Sibyls are distinguished.

The Sibylla Persica. (From Persia.)
Generally represented as an old woman: holds a lantern and open book, and sometimes a serpent at her feet, she having foretold the birth of our Lord and that Satan should be overthrown. Called also Sambette.

The Sibylla Libica. (From Libya.)
Holds a lighted torch, or a taper, or a branch of myrtle. Prophesied the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles.

The Sibylla Erythrea. (From Erythre in Asia Minor.)
Her emblem sometimes a sword, a horn, or white rose. Generally represented as a very old woman, or as a nun dressed in black. Prophesied that a Virgin should conceive and bear a Son. She is also the prophetess of divine vengeance, and is credited with the celebrated acrostic'I

The Sibylla Delphica. (From Delphi.)
Emblem, a crown of thorns, or a horn. Prophesied that our Lord should be born of a pure Virgin, and that He should be crowned with thorns. Called also Artemis.

The Sibylla Samia. (From Samos.)
Holds a reed or cradle. Prophesied that our Lord should be born of a Virgin. Called also Sania, Feto, Sanne.

The Sibylla Cimmeria. (From the Black Sca.)
Holds a cross, sometimes a "feeding bottle," called in French a "biberon," or a horn. Prophesied that our blessed Lord should be nursed by His Mother.

The Sibylla Cumana. (From Cumæ or Babylon.)
Holds a cradle, a sponge, or loaf of bread. Prophesied that our Lord should be born of a Virgin in a stable at Bethlehem. Called Amalthea.

The Sibylla Hellespontina. (From the Hellespont.)
Holds a bunch of flowers, a rod, or a cross. Prophesied the Crucifixion, Passion, and Incarnation of our Lord. Called Marpeus or Marpessos.

The Sibylla Phrygia. (From Phrygia.)
Holds a cross with a banner of the Resurrection. Predicted that our Lord should rise again. Called also Ancyra or Antico.

The Sibylla Tiburtina. (From Tivoli.)
Emblem a hand, glove, rod, or scourge. Foretold the mocking and scourging of Jesus Christ. Called also Alburne or Albune.

## The Sibylla Agrippa.

Emblem a scourge. Foretold the scourging of our Blessed Lord.

## The Sibylla Enropa.

Emblem a sword. Prophesied the murder of the Innocents.

We will now proceed to give a more detailed account of the manner in which the Sibyls are represented in Christian art, the legends or emblems that accompany them, and examples which are to be found of their occurrence.

It will be observed that in the foregoing pages I have made no mention of the treatment of the Sibyls by the great masters, in the larger and better known works of art which are familiar to many of us. The truth is, that in my brief paper I have rather been dealing with the methods of treating the Sibyls in art which have been handed down by old tradition.

To a very great extent Michael Angelo broke away from the traditionary treatment, and allowed himself that liberty, in the Sistine Chapel, which the artists of an earlier age would not have ventured to use. The same may be said of Perugino's five Sibyls in the Collegio del Cambio at Perugia, of Raphael's Sibyls in the Church of S. Maria della Pace at Rome, and of Peruzzi's Sibyl in the Church of S. Maria in Fonte Giusta at Siena. These examples are well known, and they all indicate to some extent that the treatment of the subject has "entered upon a fresh departure." It was not my ambition to write a complete chapter on the history of art, but simply to set down some unpretending notes which may perhaps assist the Archæologist.

It remains for me to acknowledge my obligations where I have derived important help from others. The references in the text will show my authorities for the instances mentioned. I am however largely indebted to : -

It is a small 4 to. in a richly enamelled binding bordered with velvet.

I may be permitted in closing this paper to draw especial attention to an article in the Times newspaper of 13 th March, 1876 , describing that wonderful set of Sibyls by Sandro Botticelli, which passed into the possession of Mr. Malcolm.

    $\dagger$ The reference is to a legend that on the spot where the church of the Ara Cœli now stands, the Emperor Augustus inquired of the Sibyl whether or no he should accept the divine honours recently decreed to him by the Senate of Rome. She replied "that a King greater than he would one day appear," and pointed to the sky, where, lo! there appeared a vision of the Divine Child in His Blessed Mother's arms, and a voice was heard saying-"IHee ara filii Dei!" The emperor knelt down in adoration, and erected on the spot an altar where now the church of the Ara Cceli stands.
