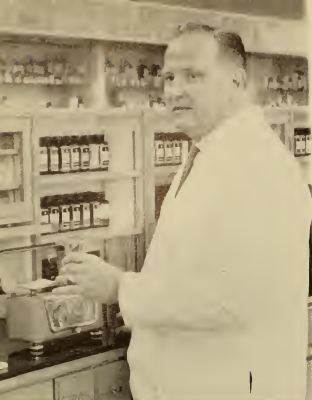

The Phi Mu's selected Charles Purvis as their Alpha Gamma Guy. Charles Hopson was elected president of the newly organized Association of Business Majors.

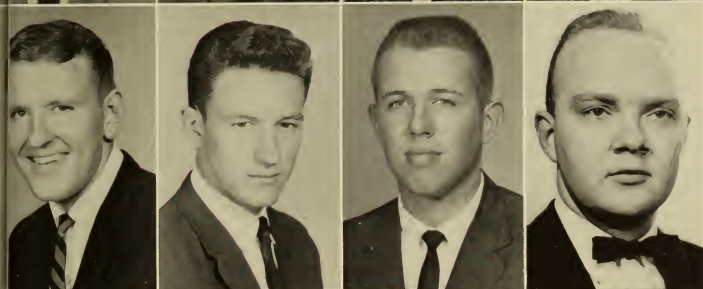

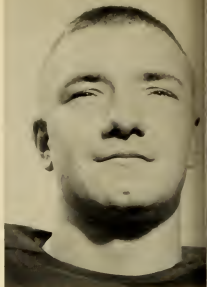

Bobby Jackson and George Versprille were the offensive leaders in the game.

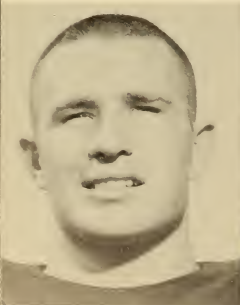

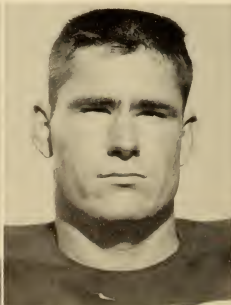

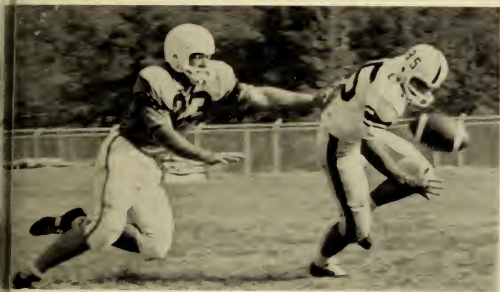

The Howard Bulldogs crushed the Georgetown Tigers 64-6 in Howard's first home game of the season, played in the newly completed Seibert Stadium.

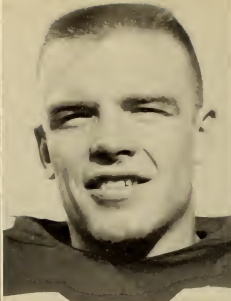

The Statesmen fought back to a score in the second period, and Howard led at halftime by a score of 14-8.

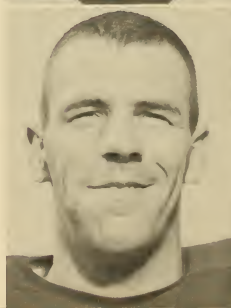

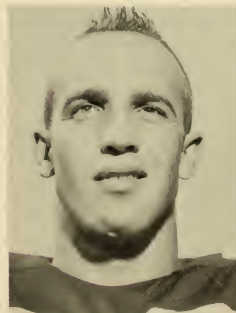

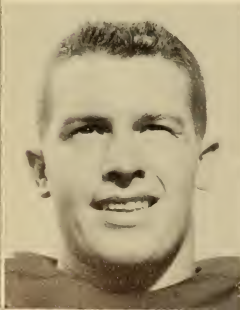
In the fourth period Greenlea threw a pass on fourth down with eight yards to go. A controversial pass interference

penalty was called and the Choctaws took this break on to a score and led the Bulldogs 15-8.

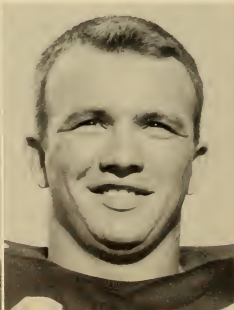

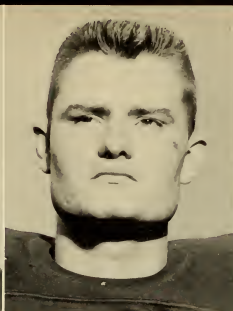

Buddy Bozeman, who wore No. 80, caught the eightieth point.

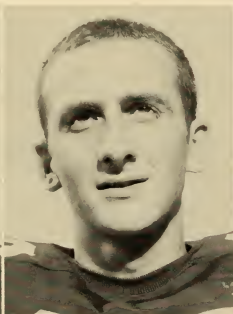
