

For defences of Mobile, Ala., liabilities incurred and estimate for additional work but recently decided on, \$700,000 For reconstruction of railroad bridges destroyed by enemy, recently imposed on Engineer Department (conjectural), \$00,000 For liabilities incurred and work undertaken in Texas 500,000 (recent call), For liabilities incurred in various Departments (recently reported), 300 000 For contingencies, 2,000,000 \$2,000,000 Total.



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
