


transformation came over Euclid High School in 1991-92 and a New Look developed. A large number of changes occurred during the summer and greeted the students when they returned in the Fall.

Physically the building itself went through numerous improvements. The roof was recovered to stop the leaking and to improve drainage. The Greenhouse was removed from the roof above the Planetarium so there would be no more leaks. Hazardous asbestos was removed from the walls in the E-Room and the decorations were completely redone. Carpeting was added to the floor of the activity room and walls of the entire E-Room. Skylights were installed and glassed doors were placed to separate rooms.

The halls on the first floor had their ceilings removed and dropped ceilings installed with enclosed lighting. Carpeting was installed in the Administrative corridor and offices. A new fire alarms system was installed to pass state laws. An improved P.A. system greeted students in the halls the first couple of weeks of school. The Girl's Pool was finally completed. A new computer network was installed and the Whittle Television System was expanded. Much of the parking lot was resurfaced and new lights installed. Old mortar was removed from the outside of the building and new mortar installed. The Stadium was finished and a new press box was built for the baseball field.

An enormous counseling change occurred within the administrative offices. The Unit Offices, once organized by grade level, were rearranged to alphabetical order creating three unit offices where there were four. A new Attendance office was established, along with the PASS Unit for at risk students.








STORAGE





Clinic aides help keep the school healthy












Indoor track helps prepare team for outdoor season




One of the great accomplishments made by the team was to show Euclid fans that hockey has truly developed into a winning program at Euclid and will continue to show constant development.


Boys and girls swim teams

Sophomores lack the sophistication of juniors and seniors and the naivete of being a freshman. They have a certain innocence which makes them very pleasant to be around.




He said that young people in the United States had less freedom than in Portugal where there were no restrictions on night clubs or drinking nor any curfews.







Channel One broadcasts into the homerooms throughout the school. It was really

appreciated during the war in the Persian Gulf since the students were able to get up-to-the-minute information about what was going on. Morning announcements, however, were still presented over the P.A. system.




Beginning at the end of the 1990-91 school year and c o n t i n u i n g through the 1991-92 school year the morning announcements were presented using the Whittle equipment

so that the announcers could be seen as well as heard. This was brought about by integrating the Media Aides and the Morning Announcers with members of the Media Aides becoming TV technicians and the P.A. announcers becoming TV personalities. This has brought about a much greater interaction between the announcers and the audience. The people in the homeroom pay much more attention to the TV broadcasts than they did to the P.A. announcements since they can see exactly who is making the announcement and there is a greater chance for creativity. The Whittle system has been a great asset so far and shows promise of being even a bigger asset in the years to come.









The show consisted of some land work around the pool and water work in the pool. The annual underwater number took place totally beneath the surface of the pool.







Colophon

00 copies of the 1992 Euclidian were printed by the Jostens Printing and Publishing Division at State College, Pennsylvania. The book was printed on Gloss 191 paper stock and included 48 pages of full color, 32 of which were the senior photographs. Copy was justified and dropped initials were used at the beginning of most copy. All pages were created using the Aldus Pagemaker 4.01 program running on a Macintosh IIsi computer which allowed a great flexibility in the use of fonts and type sizes. Most headlines and subheadlines were Helvetica type while the copy was Times. Senior names, Dropped initials, folios and captions were Palantino type. The computer was running system 6.07 and had 5 megabytes of RAM and a 40 megabyte hard drive. The book used about 15 megabytes of storage. This was the first time that the Euclidian was published using Desk Top Publishing. The pages were recorded on 3.5 inch high-density disks printed on a Hewlett Packard LaserJet III printer. The hardcopy and disks were sent to Josten's which stripped in the photos and produced the final copy on a Linotronic printer. The use of Desk Top Publishing led to a great many opportunities for creativity but the learning curve was so high which made it a time-consuming process.

The cover was designed by the Josten's Art Department. Pages were submitted to the plant on five deadlines; November 11, December 2, January 6, February 3 and March 2. All the color pages had to be in the first deadline since their production entails so much work. Since the final deadline was in late February, nothing that occurred after that time was included in the book.
