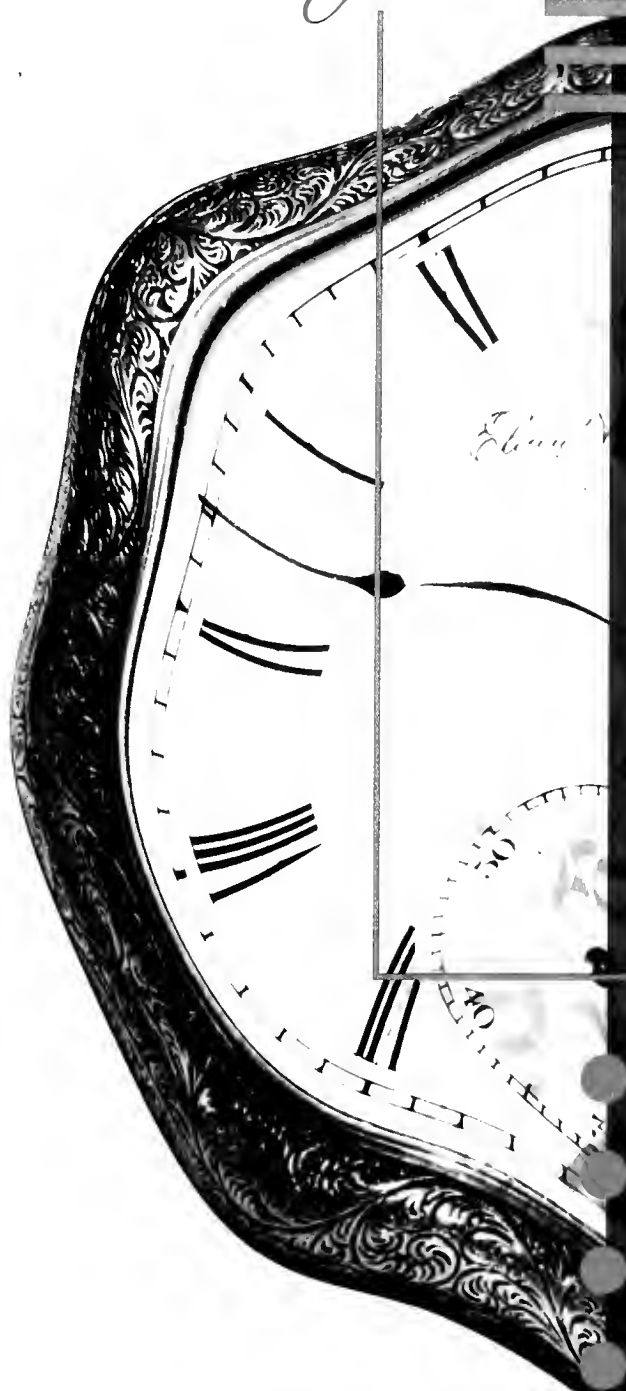

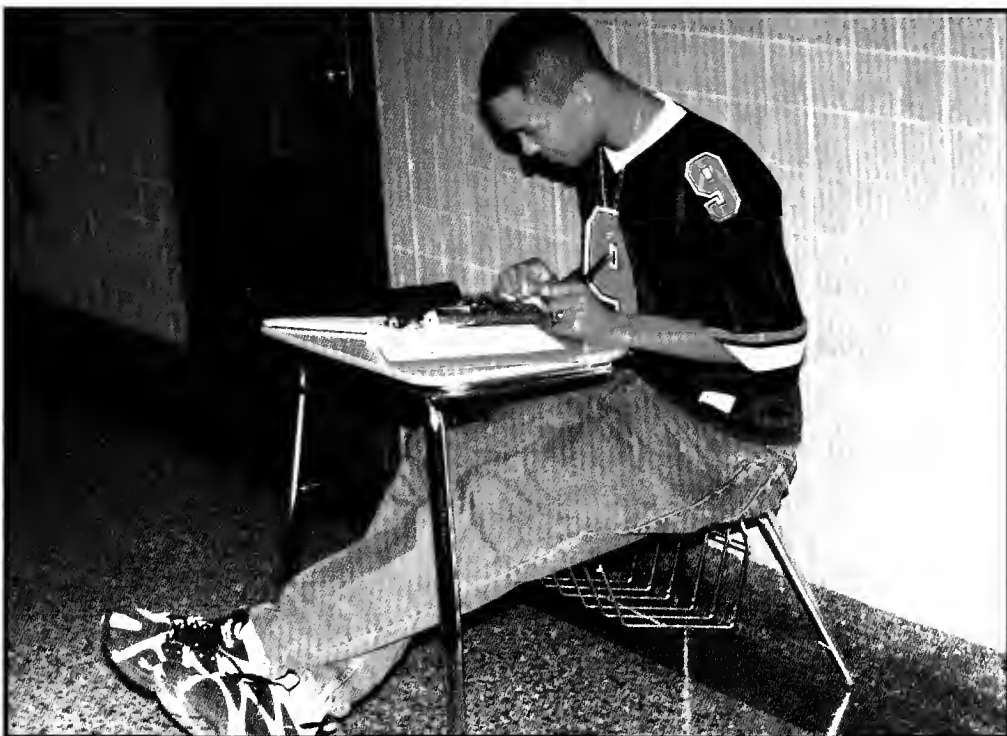

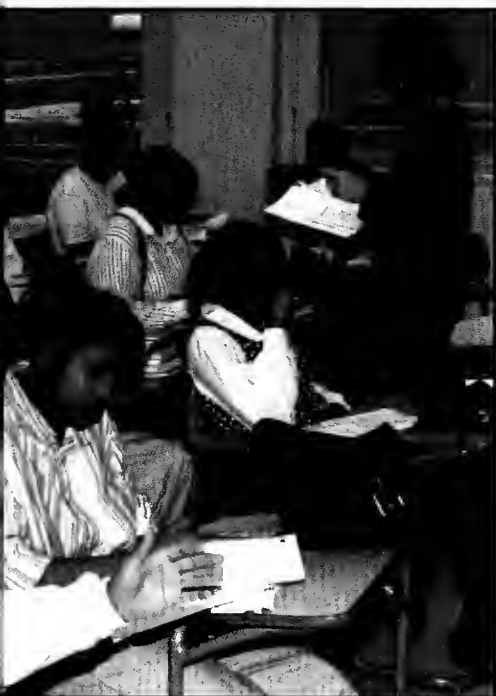

Megan Coyne enjoys playing on the soccer team so she can get good exercise and learn the techniques of the sport.



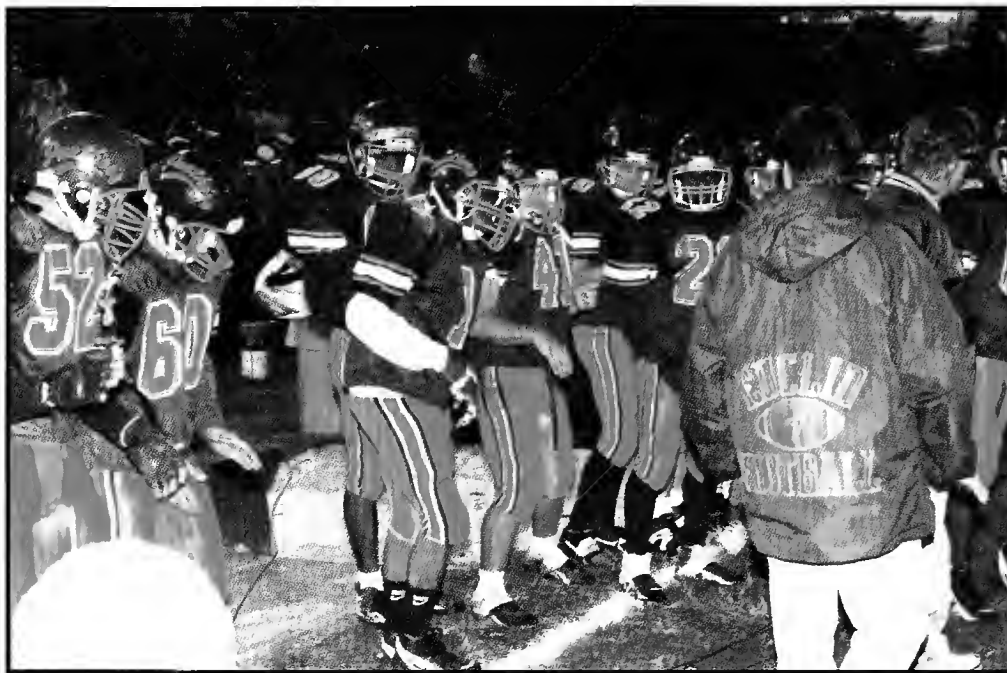

The entire Homecoming Court and their parents were introduced before the football game began. These students will have a lot to remember in the future.

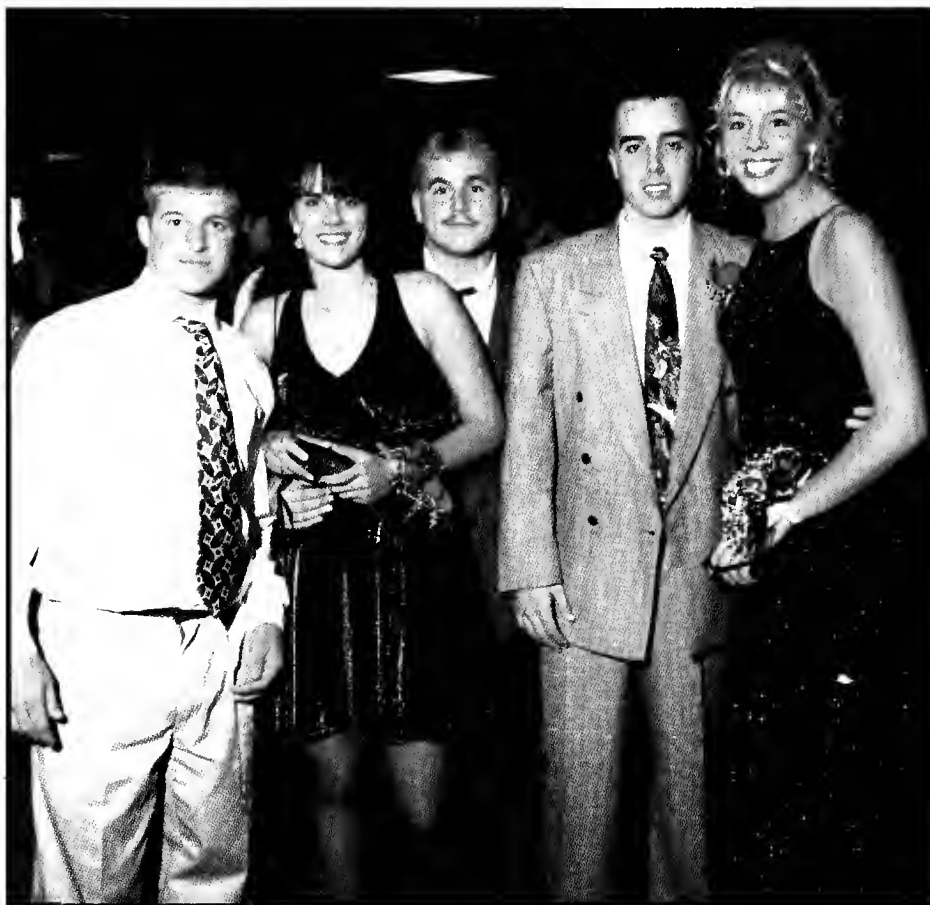
HOMECOMING DANCE WAS A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

Many of these students don't like to do homework but the ones that do their work are more likely to get a better grade than the ones who don't.

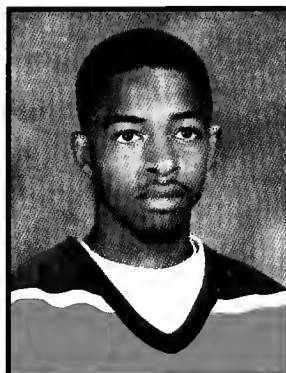

Most Euclid seniors have not been in the Euclid schools all their lives

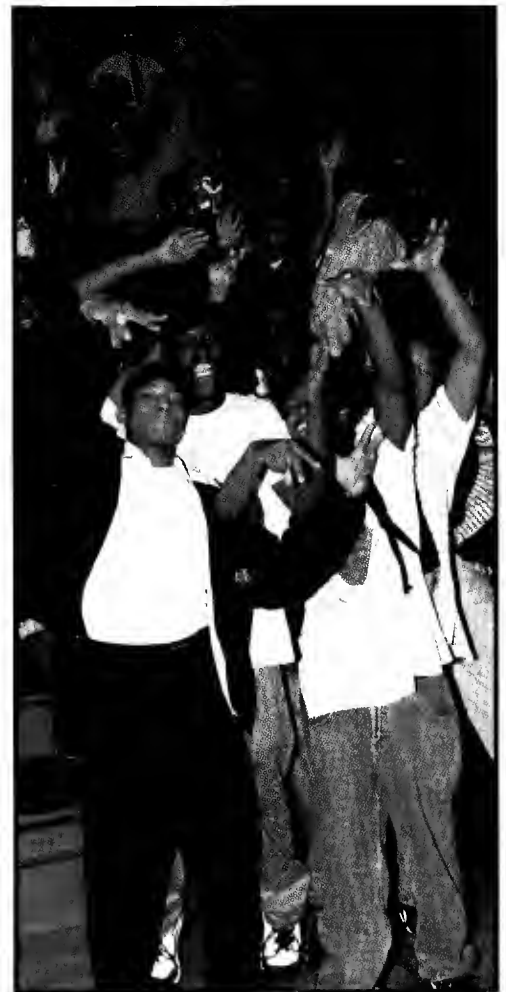


Have you attended Euclid schools all your life?



How many years have you been in the Euclid school system?

Euclid seniors were asked if they had attended Euclid schools all their lives. 45% of the seniors who answered said that they had. The rest of the seniors were in the Euclid schools anywhere from one to eleven years with the most frequent number being four years. This reflected a large number of students who attended parochial schools for the first eight grades and then came to the high school in the ninth grade. Almost ten percent of the seniors have only been in the Euclid schools for one year.

On Friday, October 20, 1995, students in some science classes were treated to a talk by **Mary Ellen Weber** about her mission on the Space Shuttle 70 mission which took place in July, 1995. Mary Ellen graduated from Bedford High School but visited Euclid since her mother teaches in the Euclid schools. She talked about the preparation and execution of her flight and described

some of the experiments that the members performed. She showed some slides and a videotape of her flight. 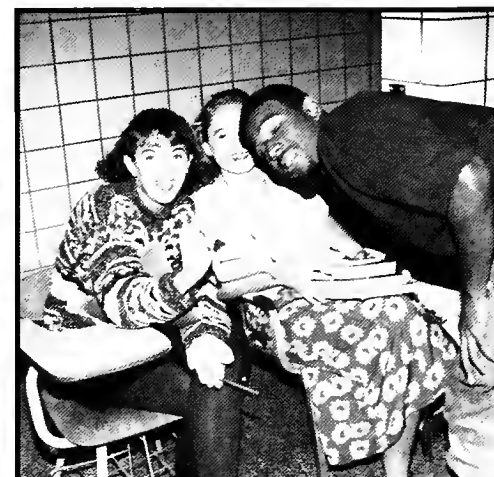

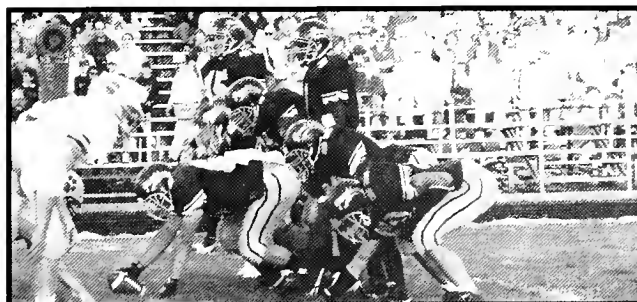

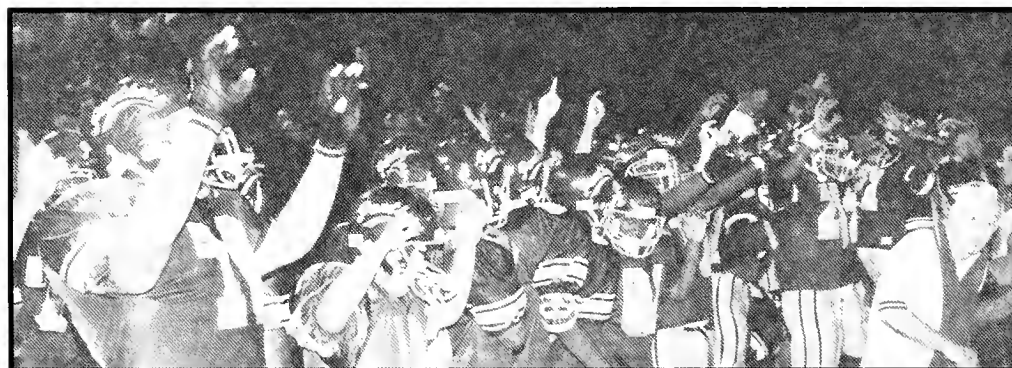
Day in and day out, the Panthers practiced for their next opponent. With the

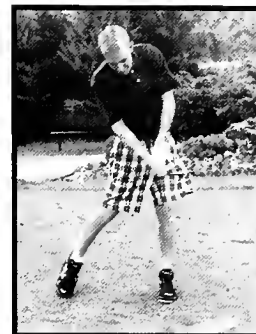

Golf team has best record in five years



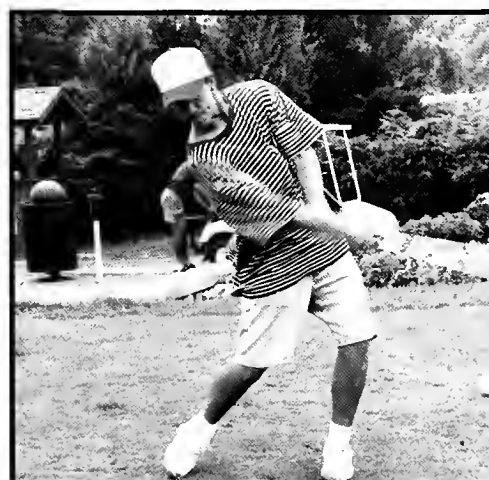

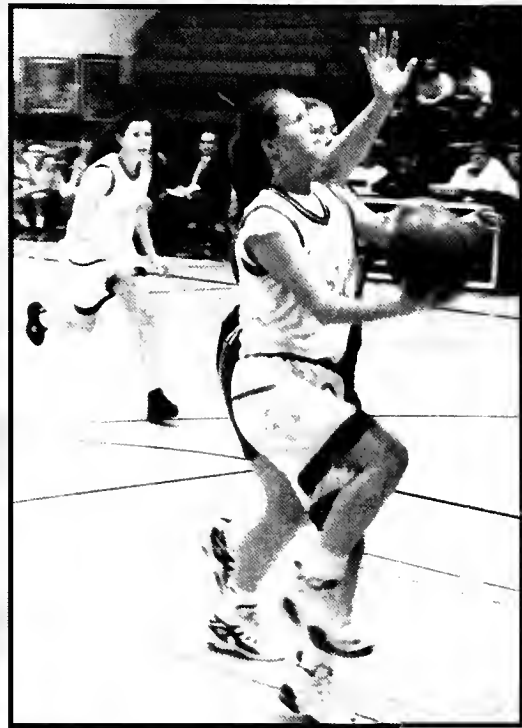

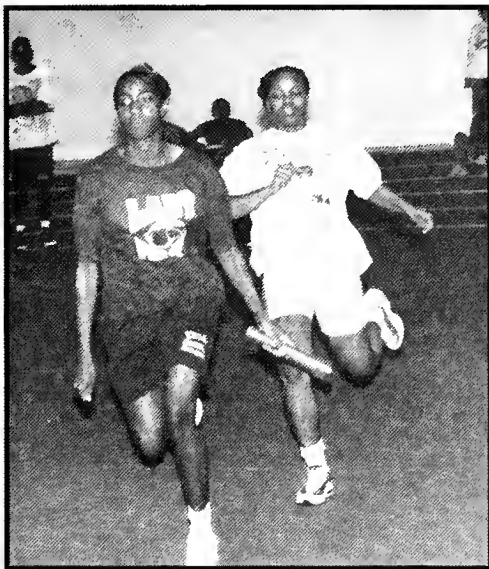

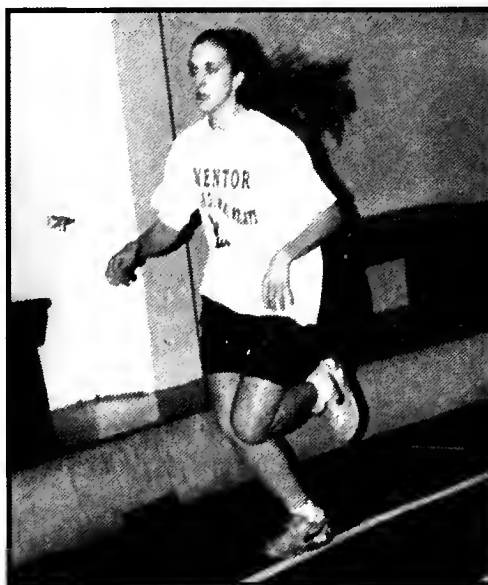

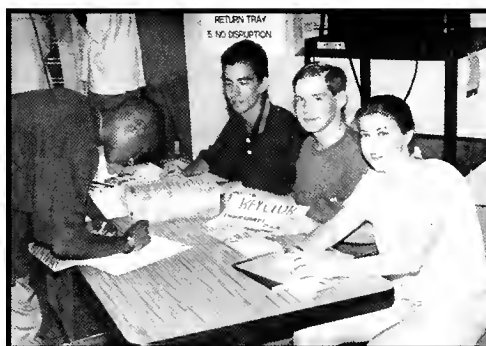

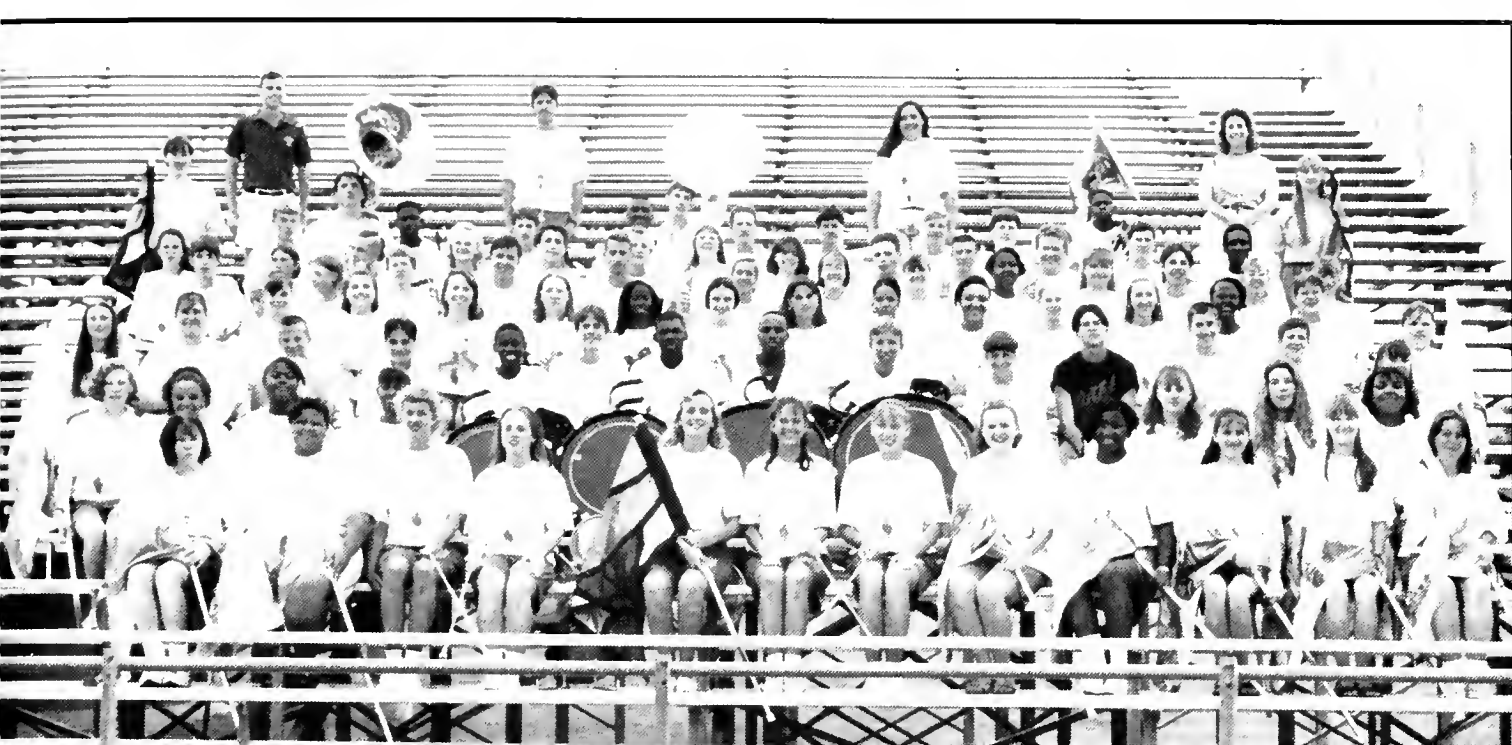

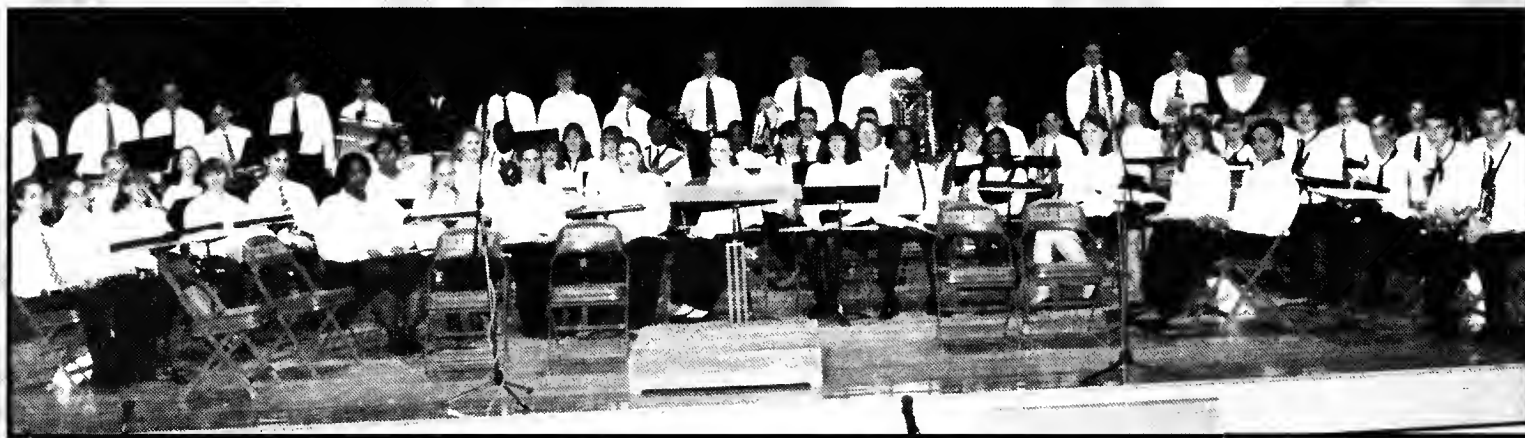

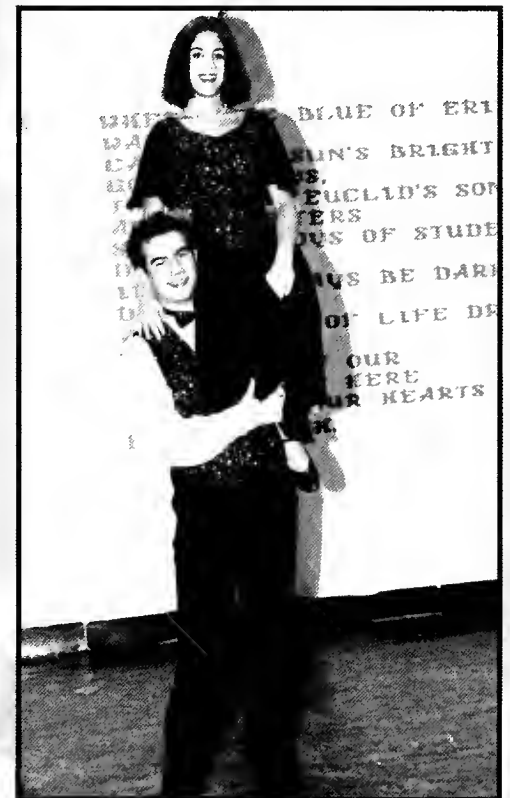

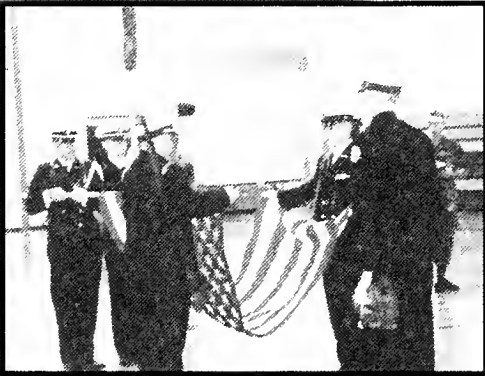

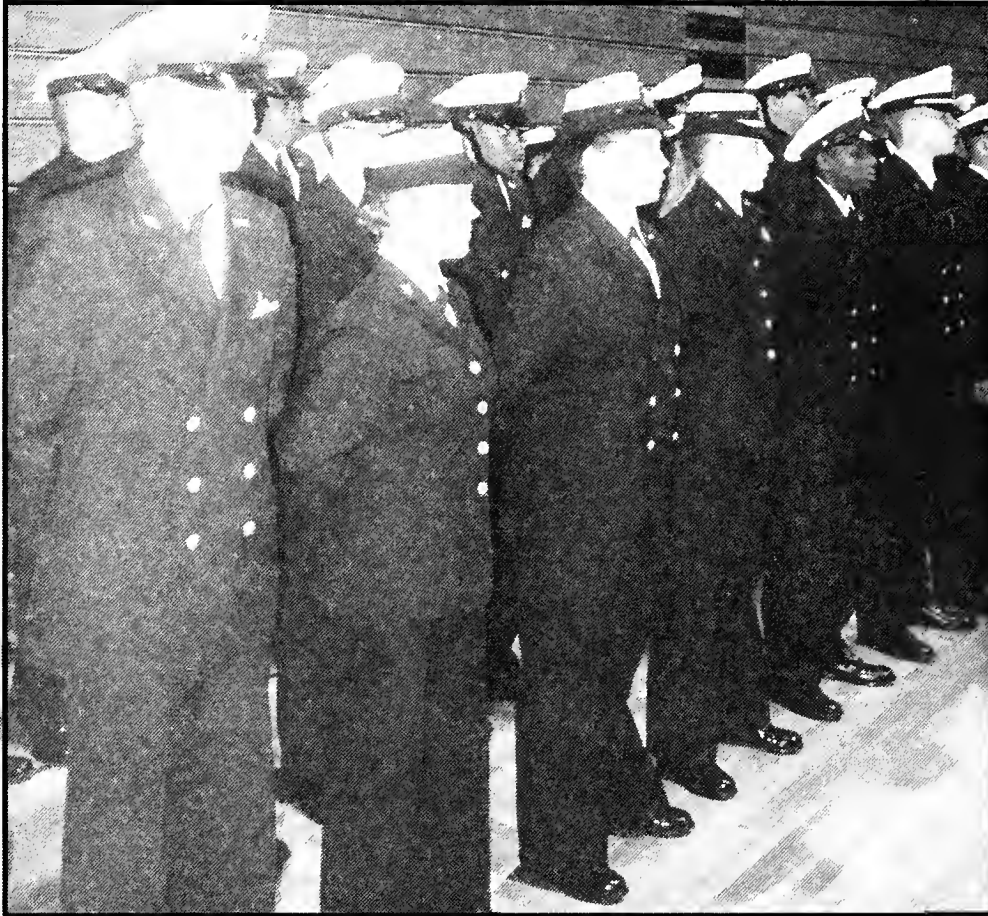

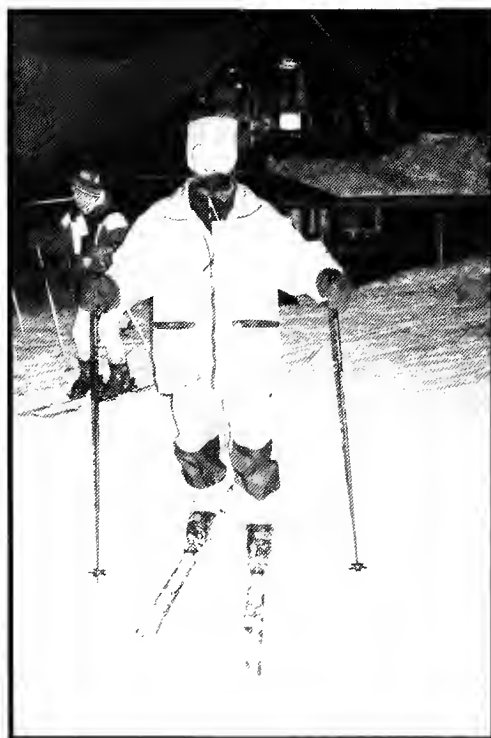

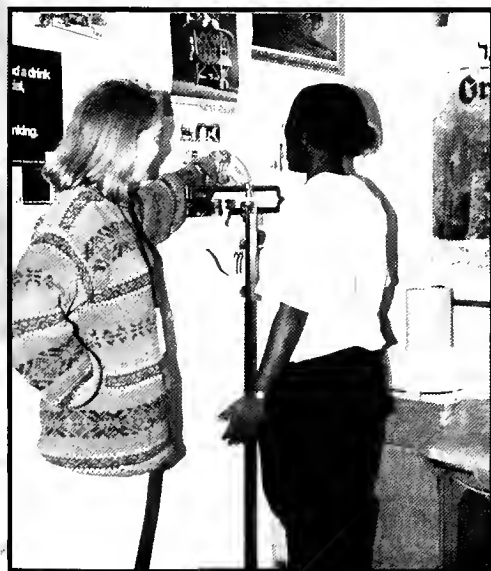

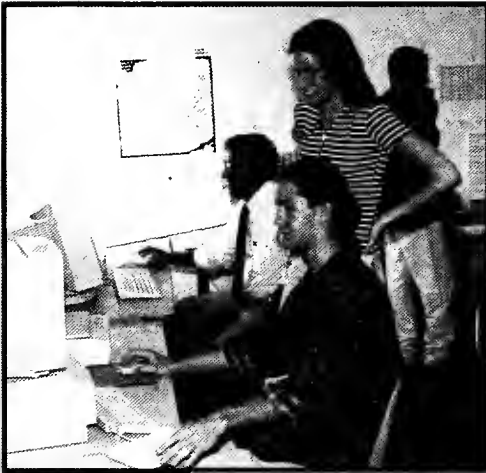

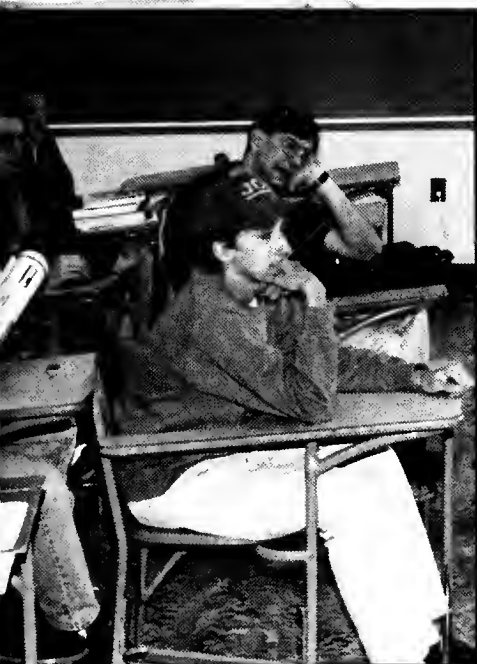

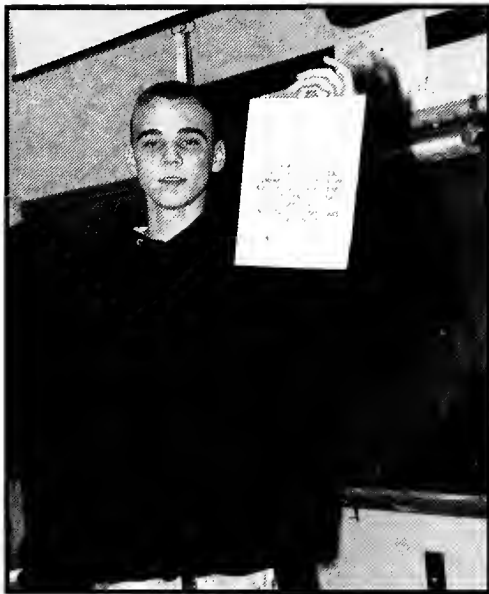
DON'T DRINK AND DRIVE

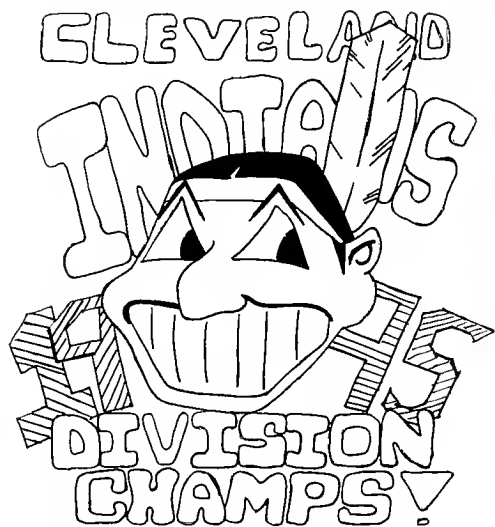
Cleveland Indians take pennant for the first time in forty-one years

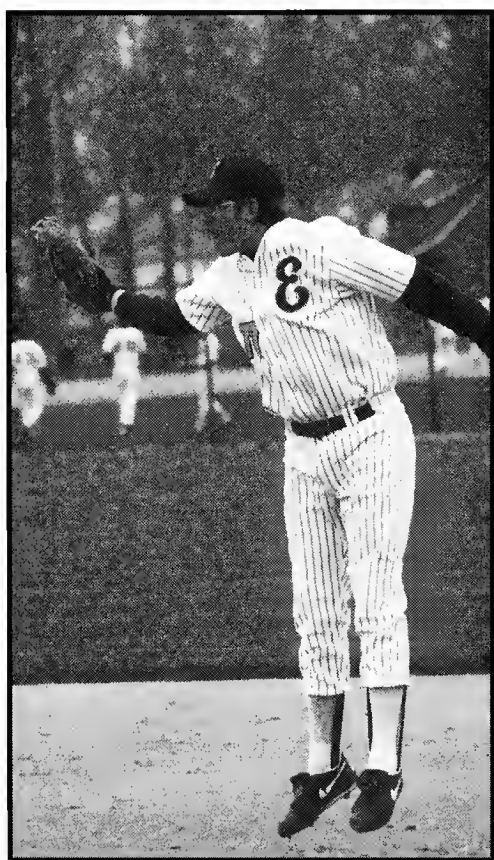

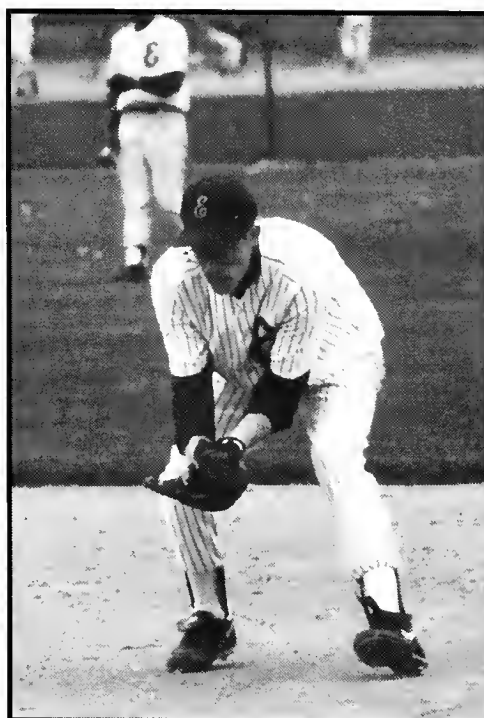

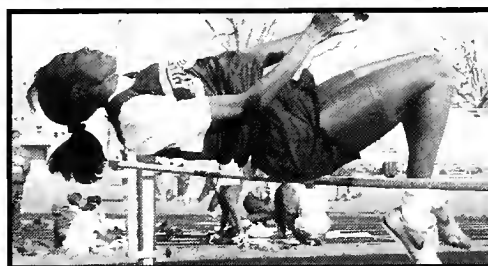

technical director and Mrs. Garlauskas was the stage artist and Mrs. Perusek assisted with the costumes.

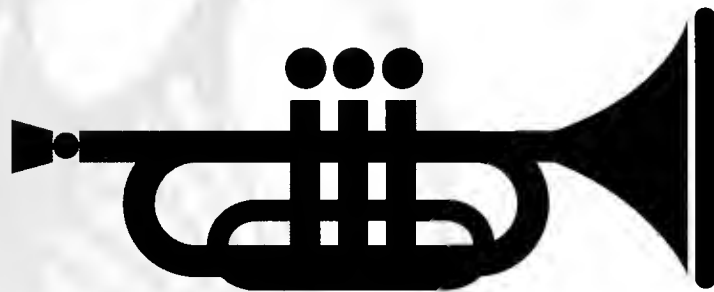

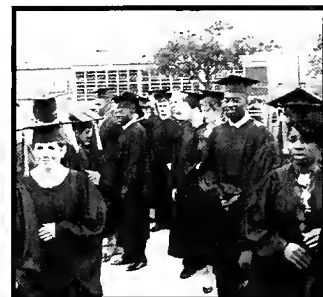

Colophon Thank You Staff

Josten's Printing and Publishing Division at State College, Pennsylvania printed the 650 copies of the 1996 *Euclidian*. The book was printed on Gloss 191 paper stock and included 48 pages of full color. All pages were created using the Aldus PageMaker® 5.0 program running on a Macintosh IIsi computer that had 17 megabytes of RAM, a 540 megabyte hard drive and a Daystar Powercache 50 megahertz accelerator card with math coprocessor installed. The pages were backed-up onto a 88 megabyte Syquest removable hard disk. A 21" black and white, two page monitor made page layouts much easier. A second Macintosh IIsi computer with 5 megabytes of RAM and a Video Spigot card was networked to the first. Both computers were running System 7.1. Digital images were imported either directly from a Sony Mavica MVC-A10 Still Video Camera into the Video Spigot or were scanned in from a photograph using a 600 dpi scanner. The images were processed using Adobe Photoshop® which had Kai's Power Tools® plug-ins installed. Graphics were produced using Aldus Freehand®, Type Styler® and Microsoft Works®. The index was made using the Josten's program, Last Name First®. The pages were recorded on 3.5 inch floppy disks and 88 megabyte Syquest disks and hard copy was printed on a Hewlett Packard LaserJet III printer. The hardcopy and disks were sent to Josten's who stripped in the photos and produced the final copy on a Linotronic printer. The first two deadlines were submitted on Syquest disks since there was so much memory needed. The rest of the deadlines were submitted on 3.5 inch floppies. The cover was designed by the **Josten's Art Department**. Pages were submitted to the plant on five deadlines: November 27, January 1, January 22, February 12, and February 26. The pages were submitted as eight page multiples. All the color pages had to be in the first deadline since their production entailed so much work. Since the final deadline was in late February, nothing that occurred after that time could be included in the book.

The staff of the 1996 *Euclidian* would like to extend thanks to all who helped to make this book possible. First and foremost, thanks have to go to the adviser, **Mr. Von Benken** for the many long hours of hard work and planning that had to be put in to get the entire operation going and to keep it going. Others to be thanked are: **Lifetouch National School Studios Inc.** for supplying film and processing for the many pictures that appeared in the book and for taking many of the team pictures, senior and underclass pictures. **Josten's Yearbook Company** for putting it all together in such an artistic manner. **Charlotte Elston** for all the time she spent arranging photography dates and supplying needed materials, **Joanne Hodder** and **Joan Linderman** for all the time and work they did trying to get the senior pictures arranged and taken, all the writers and photographers who contributed their time, and last but not least, the entire student body at Euclid High School without which this book could not exist.

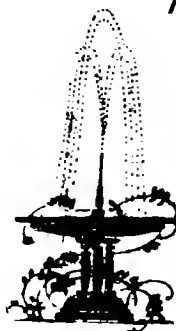
