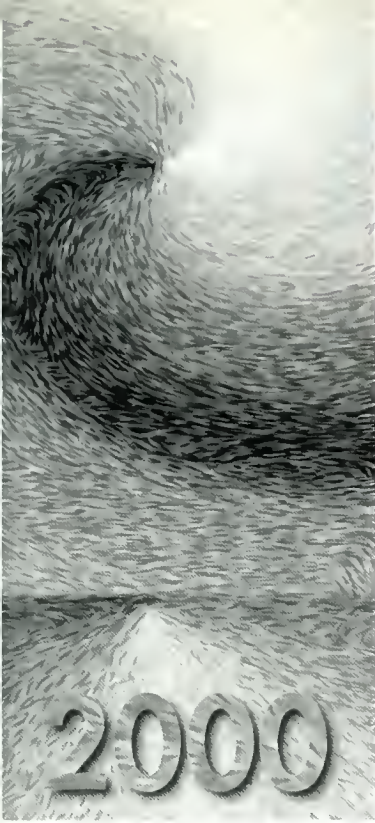

The year 2000 was met with a great deal of anxiety. Many people thought that it was the beginning of the third millennium since it began with 2. 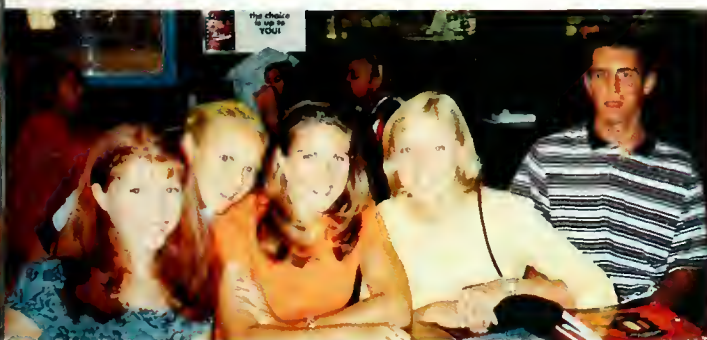

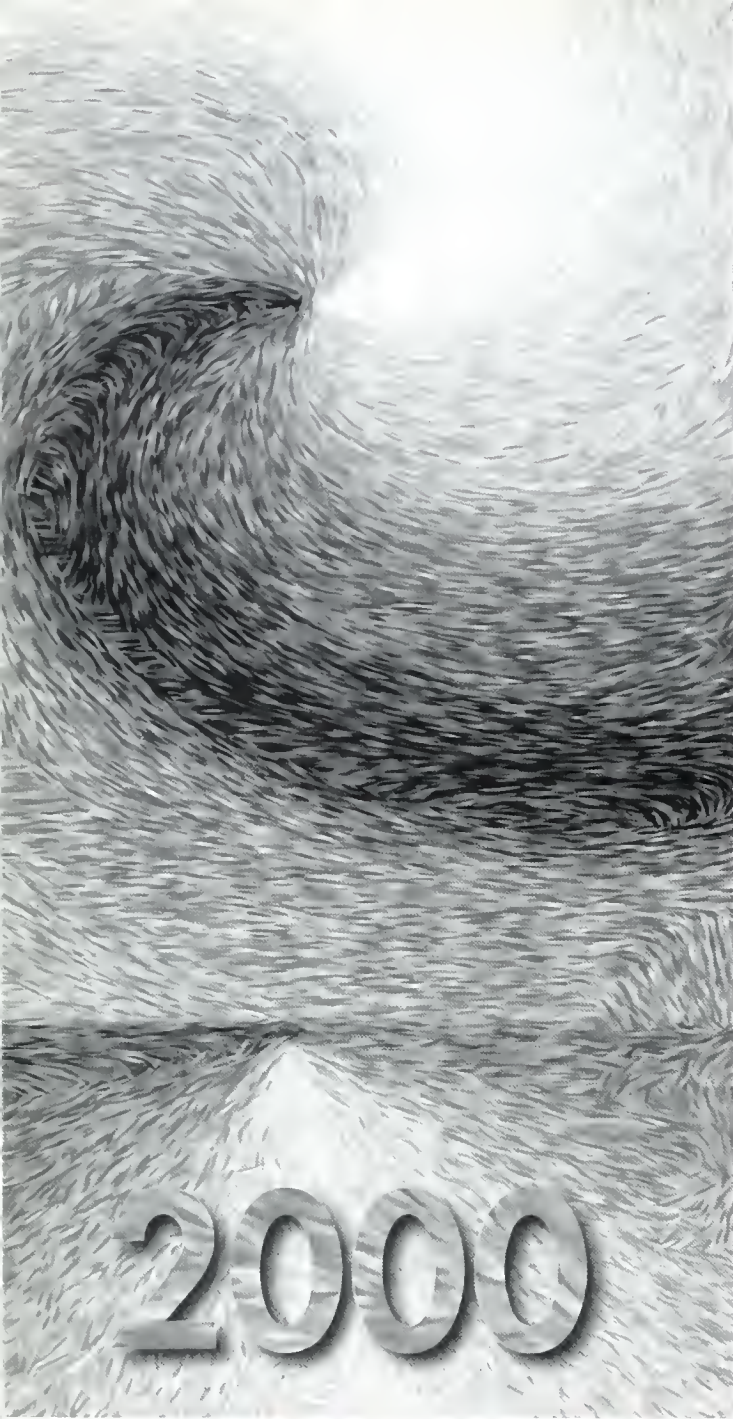

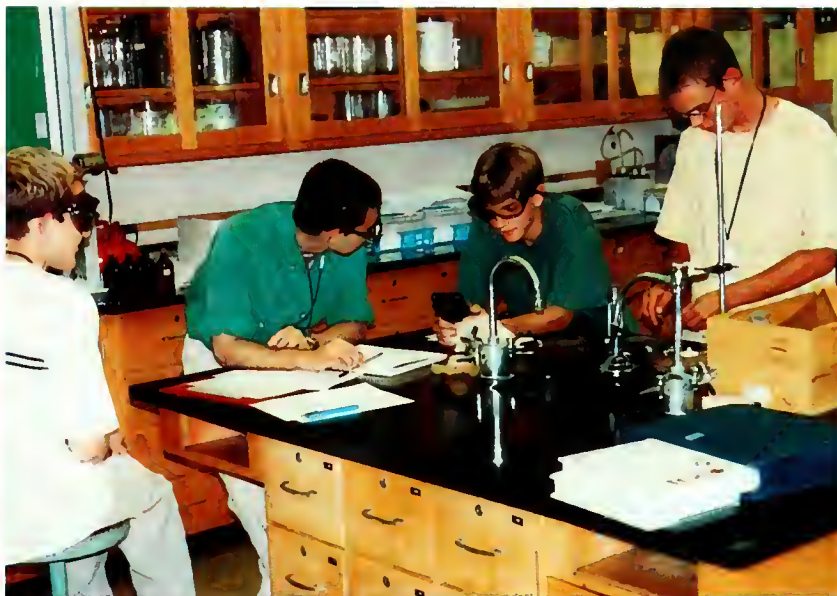

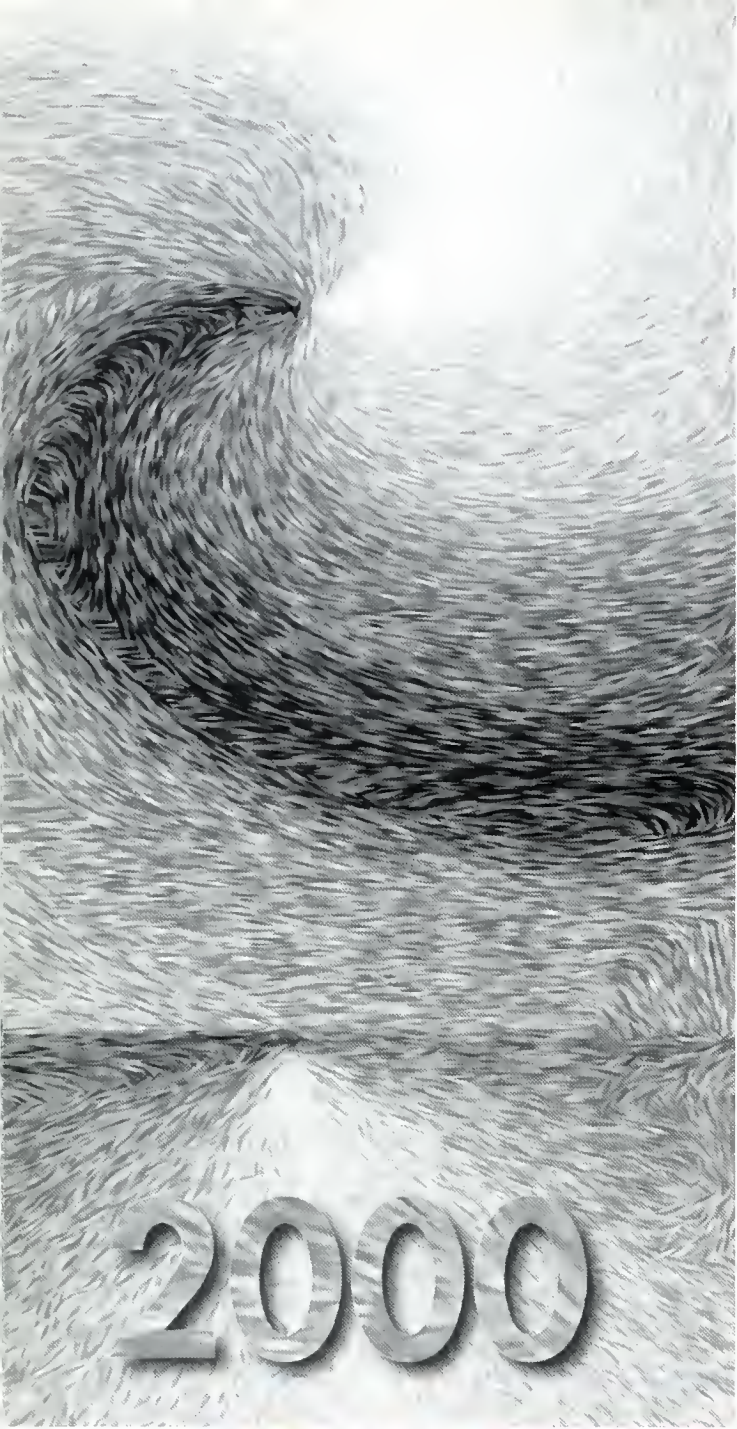

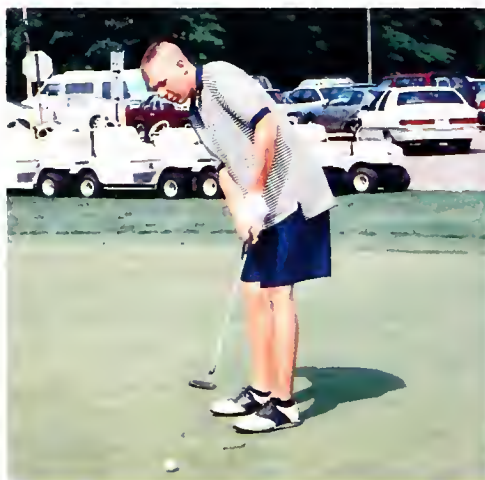

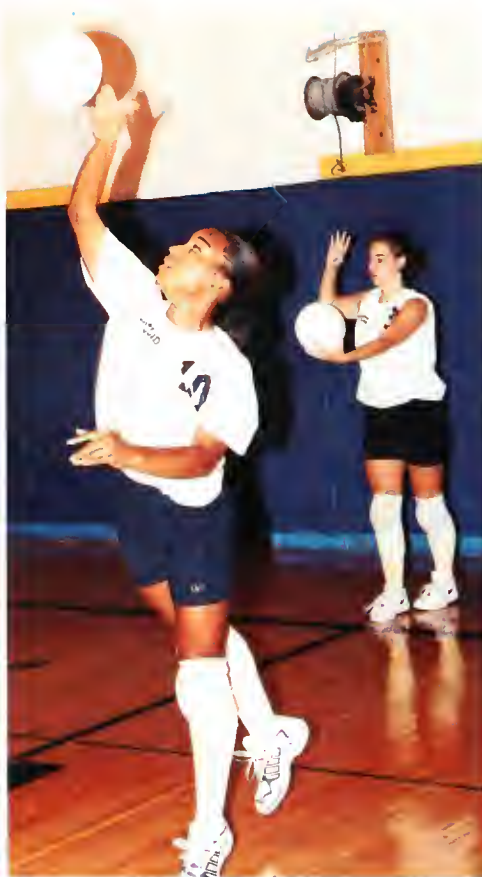
TOP OF THE HEAP

Most seniors feel they need a job after school

Having a job was a part of many senior's lives at Euclid High School. More than 76% of the seniors responded that they had some sort of job that they went to after school. 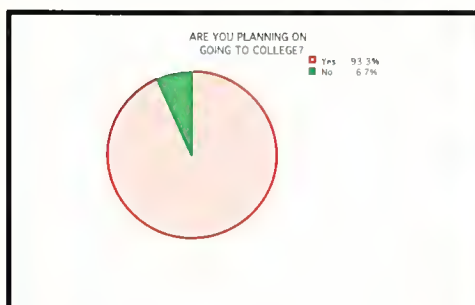

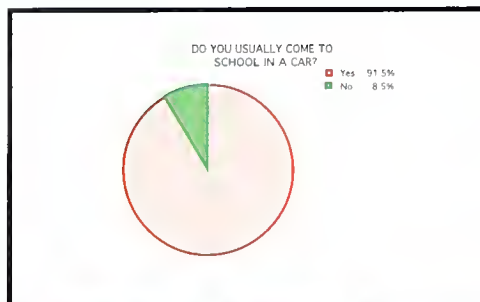

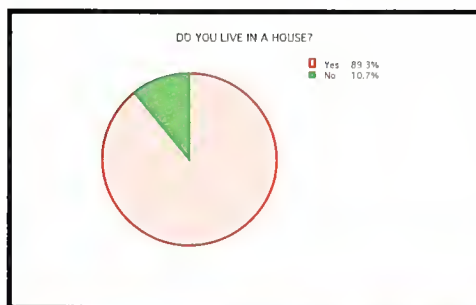

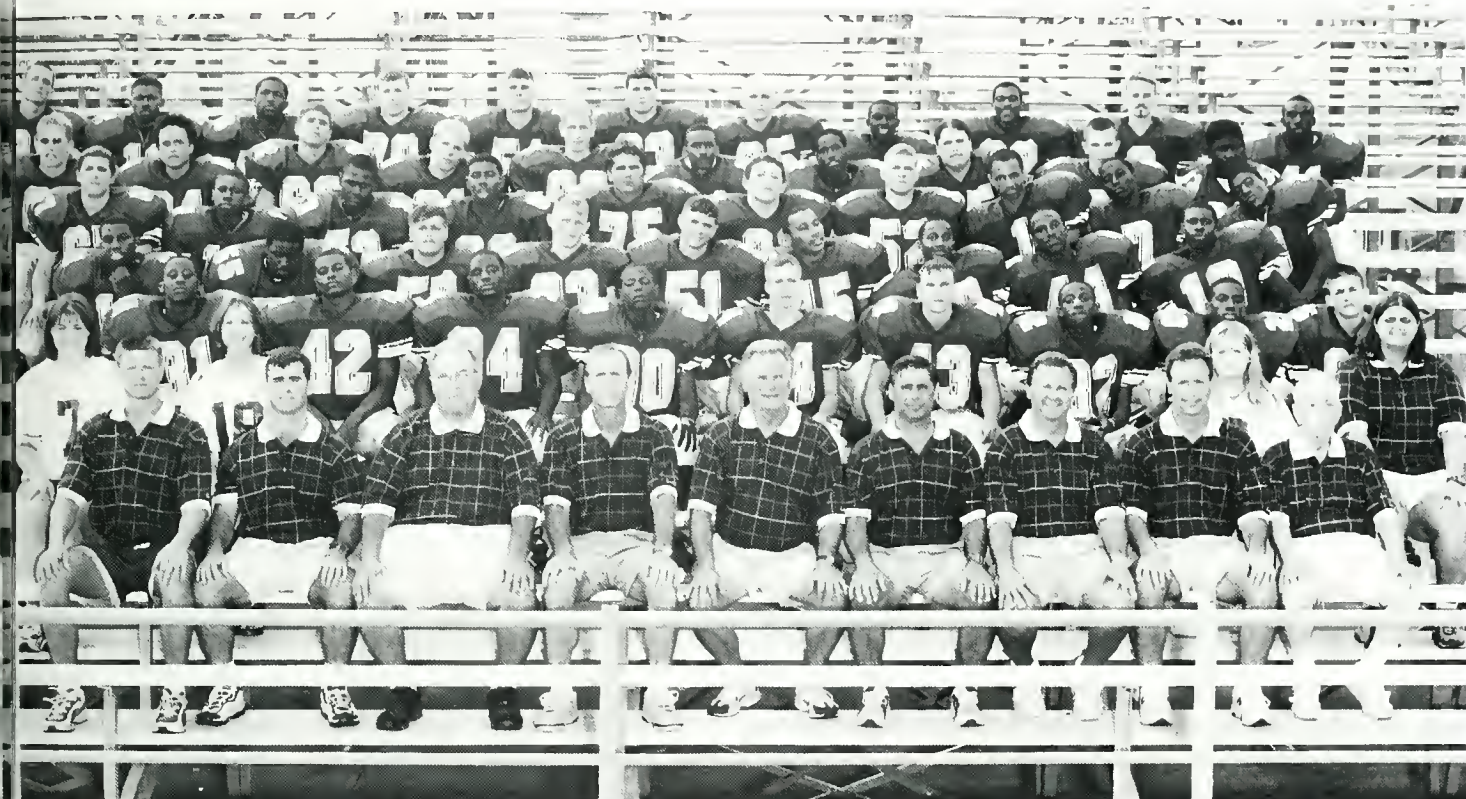

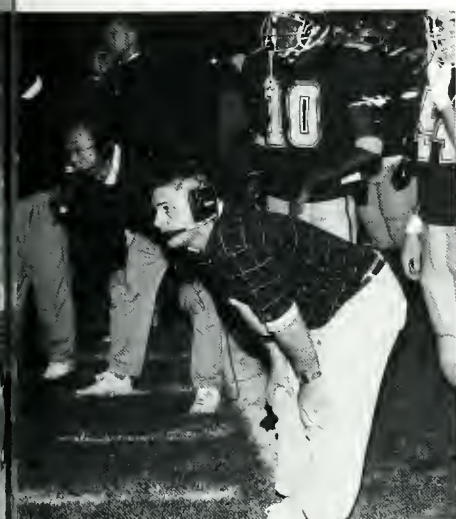

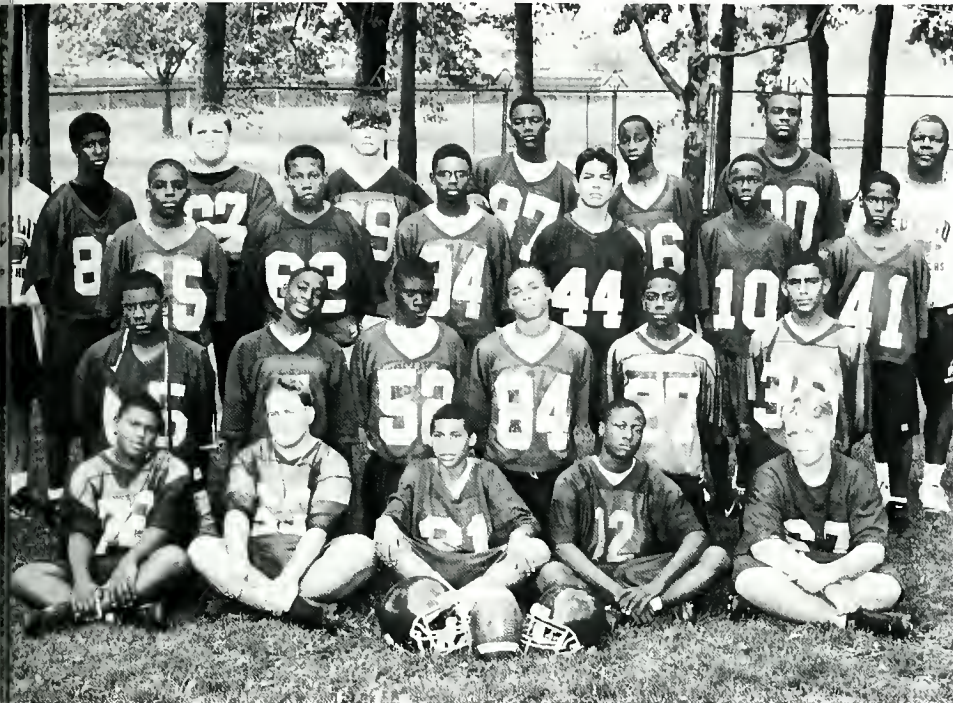

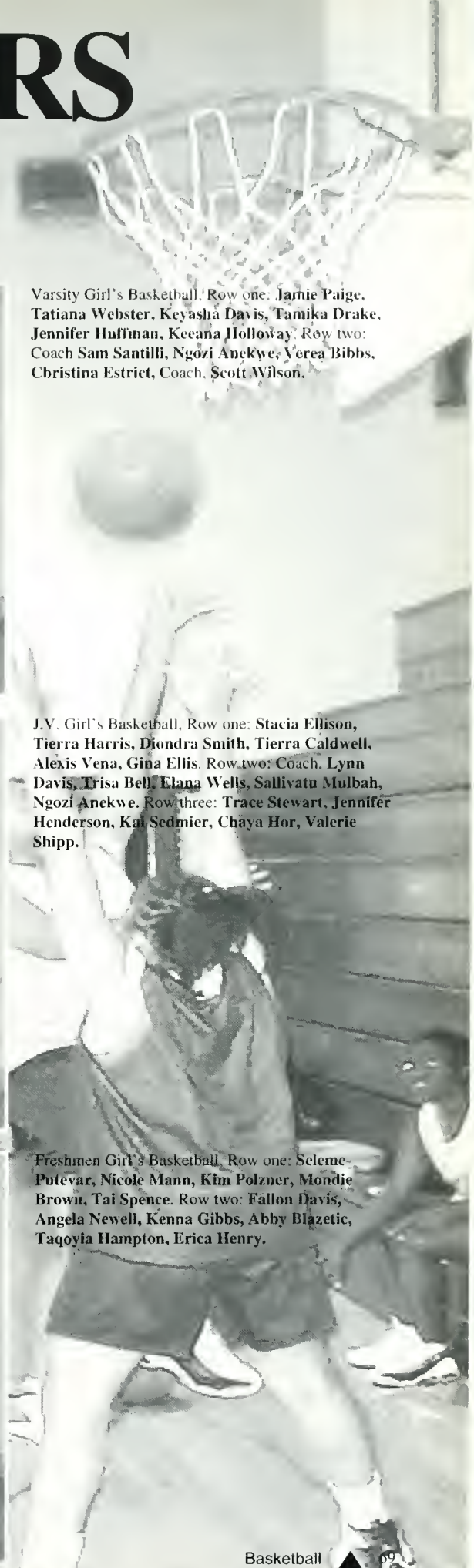

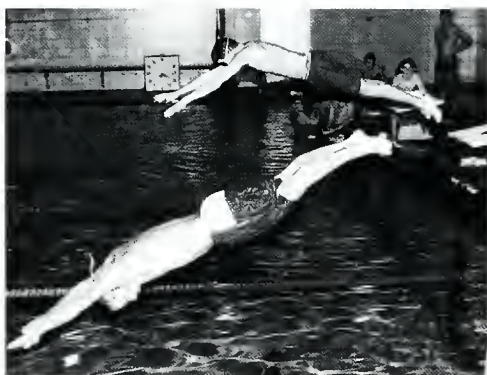
Boy's and girl's swim teams

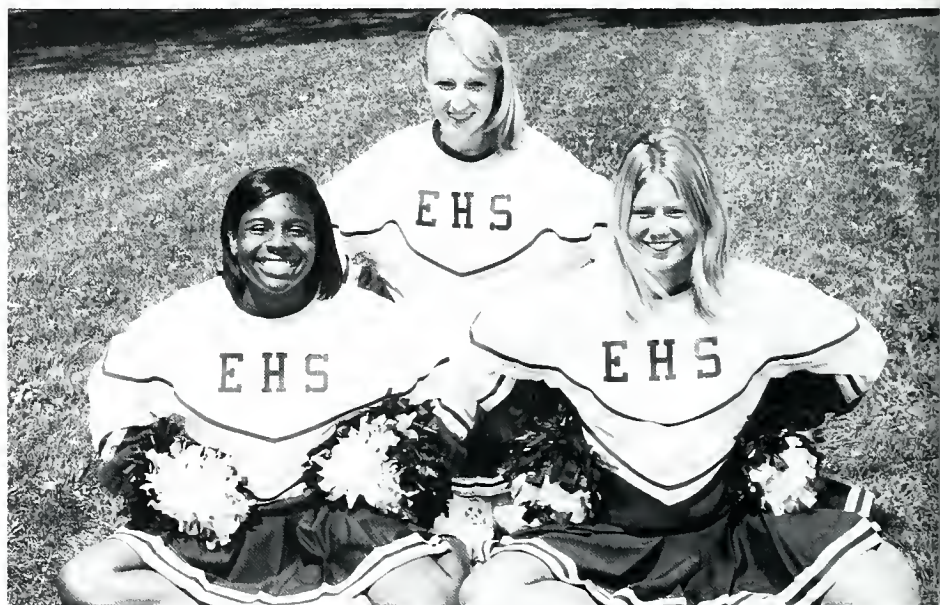

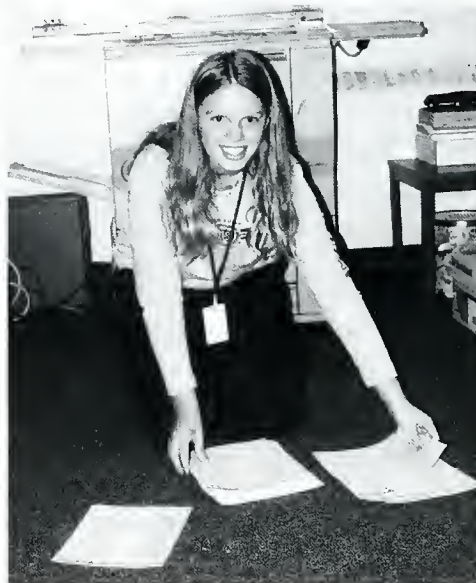
HELPING AROUND

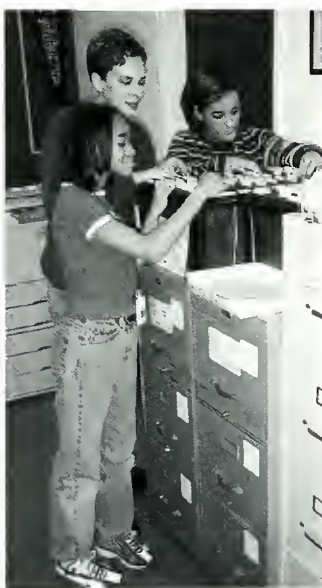

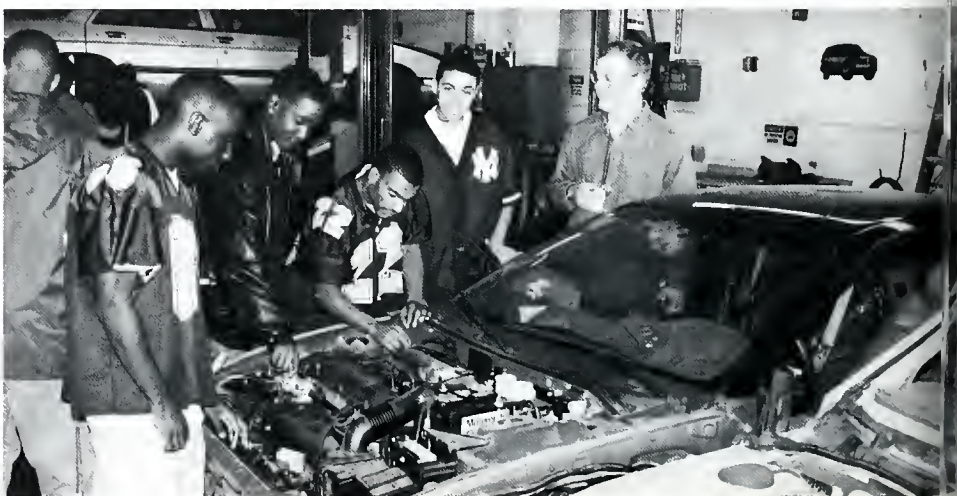

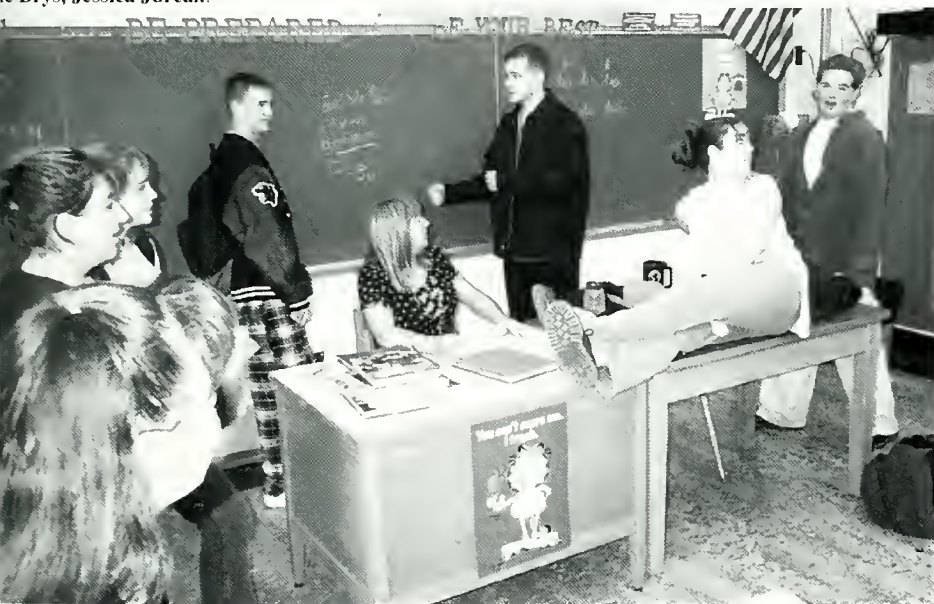

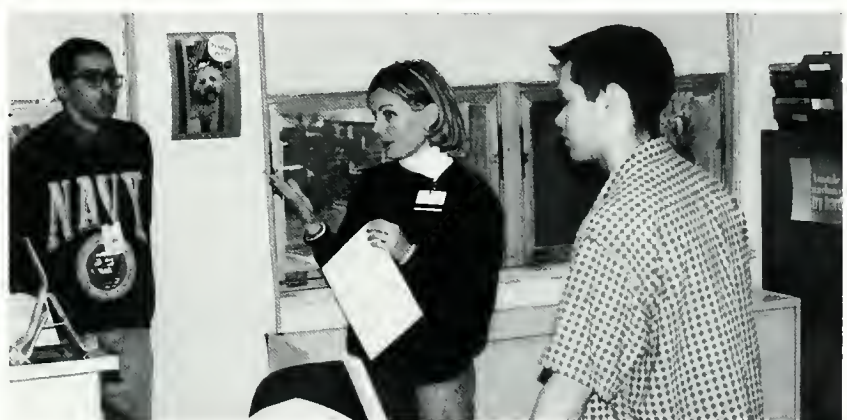

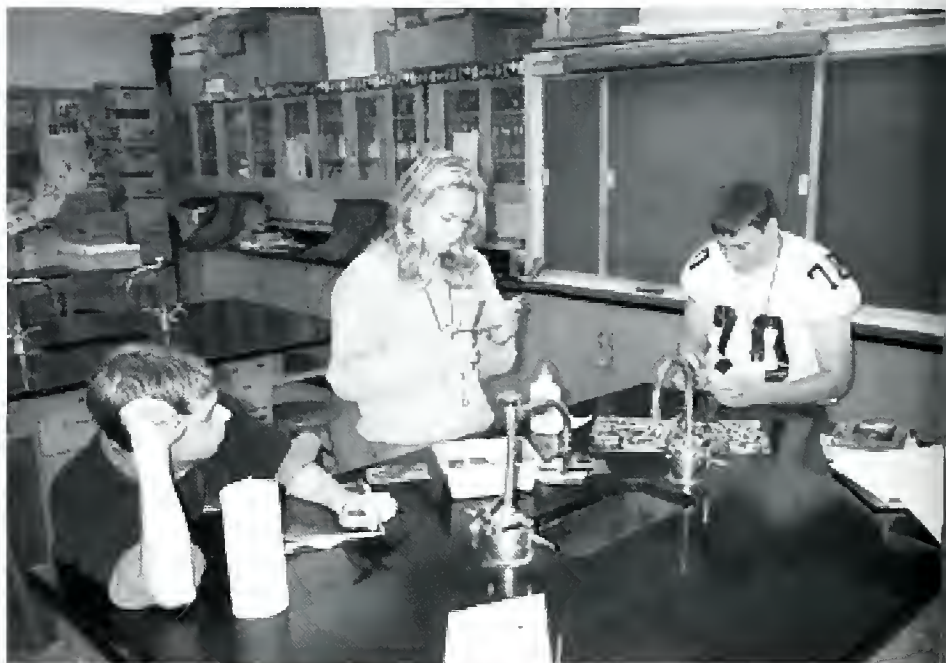

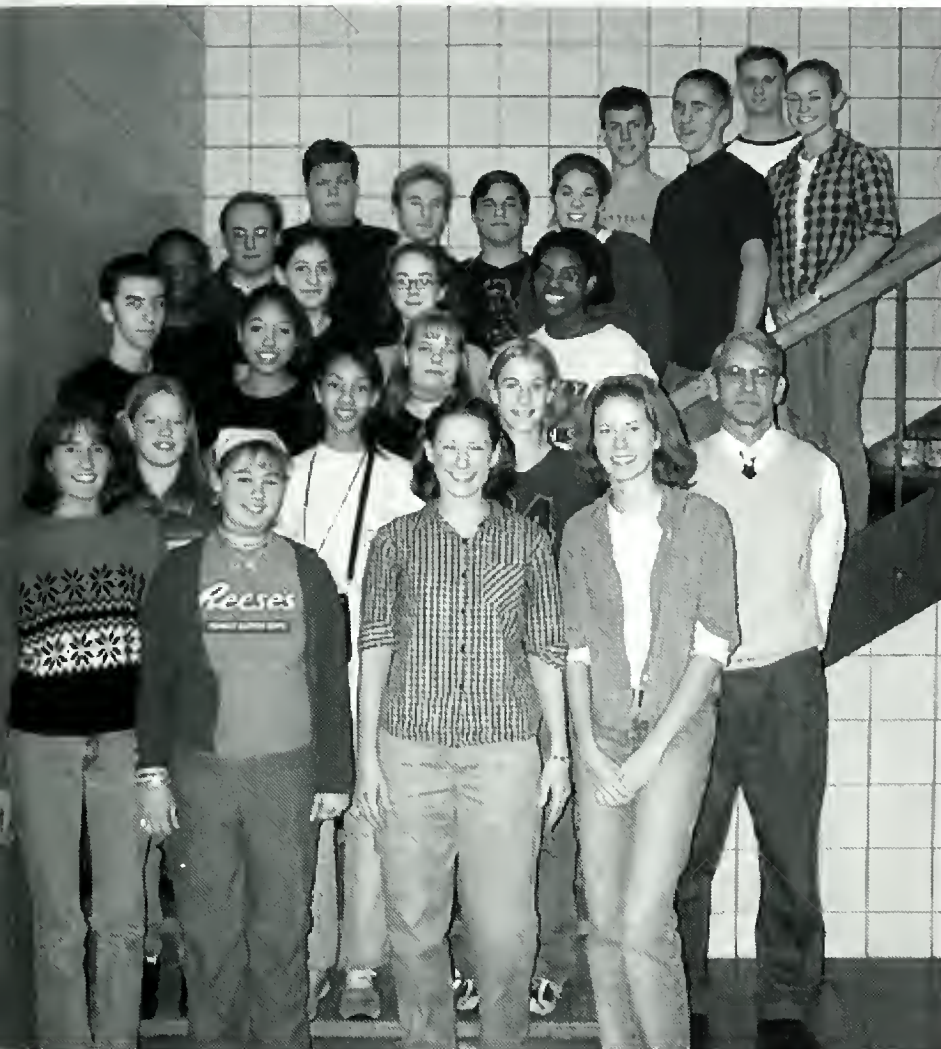

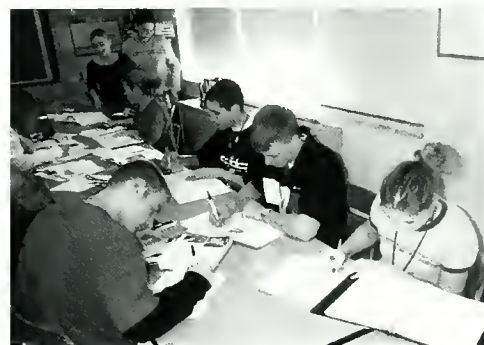

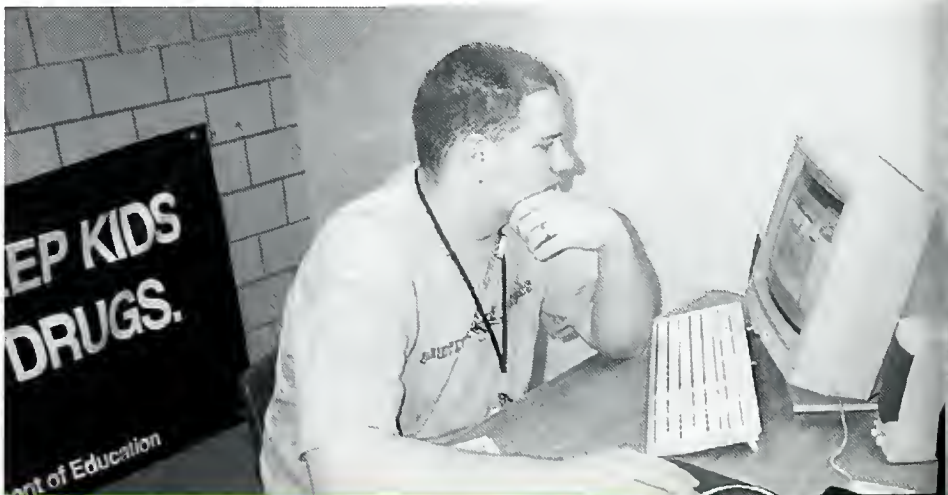

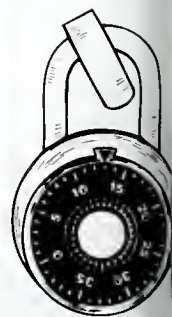
KEEP IT LOCKED UP

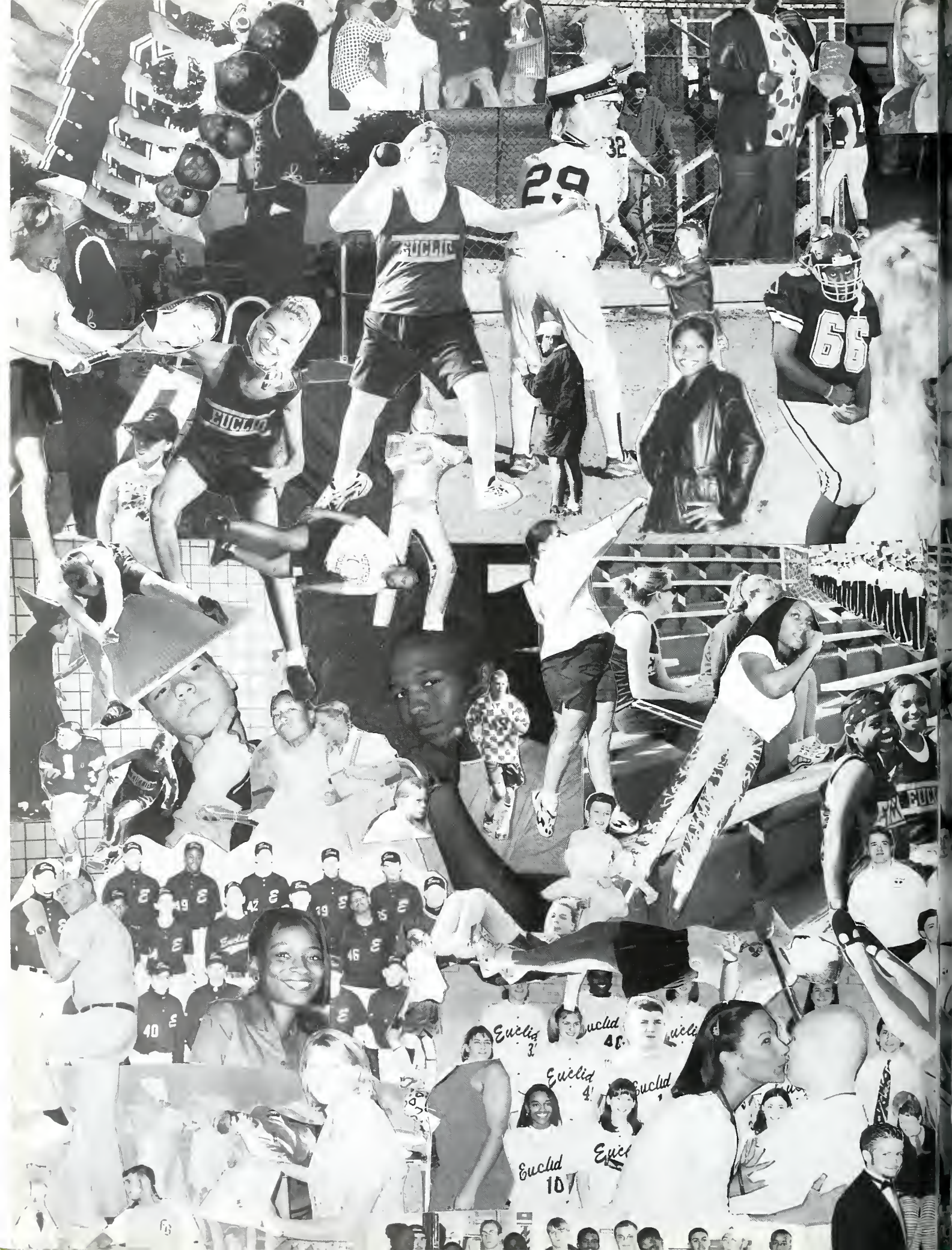

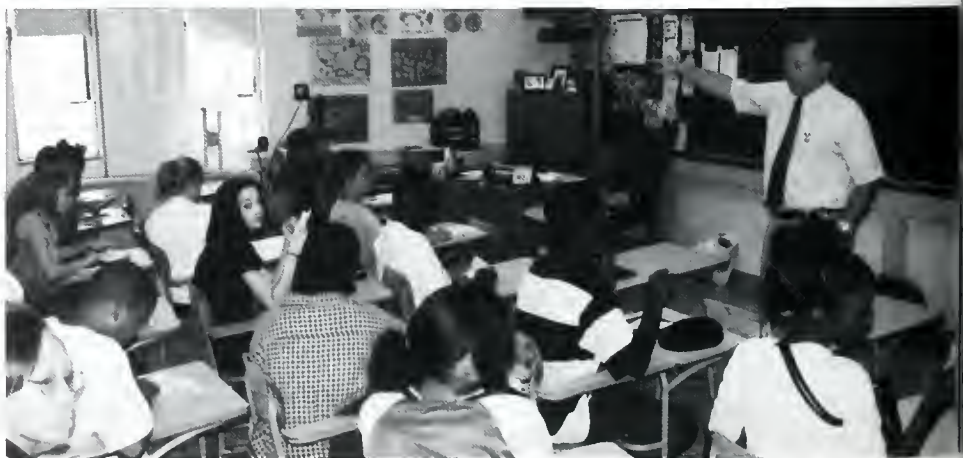


Freshmen

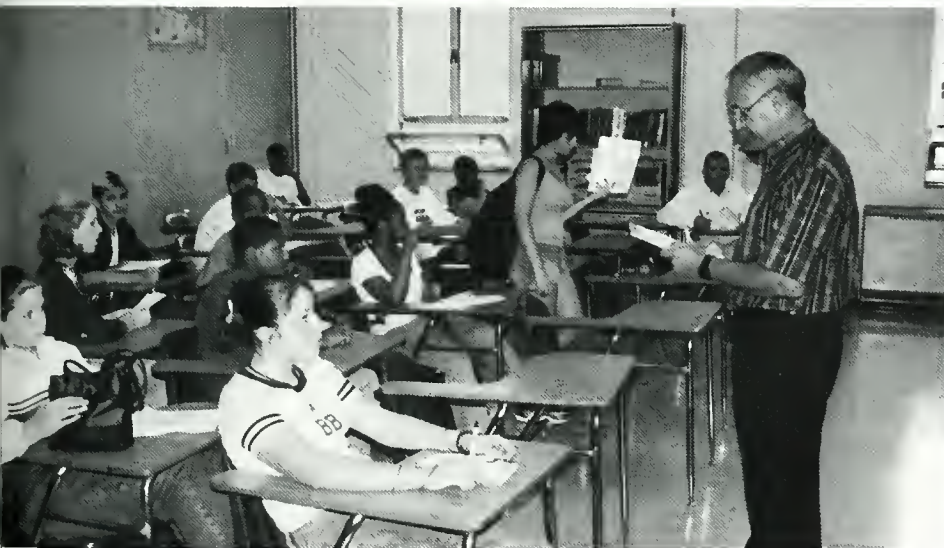

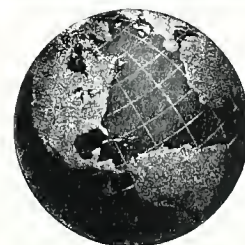

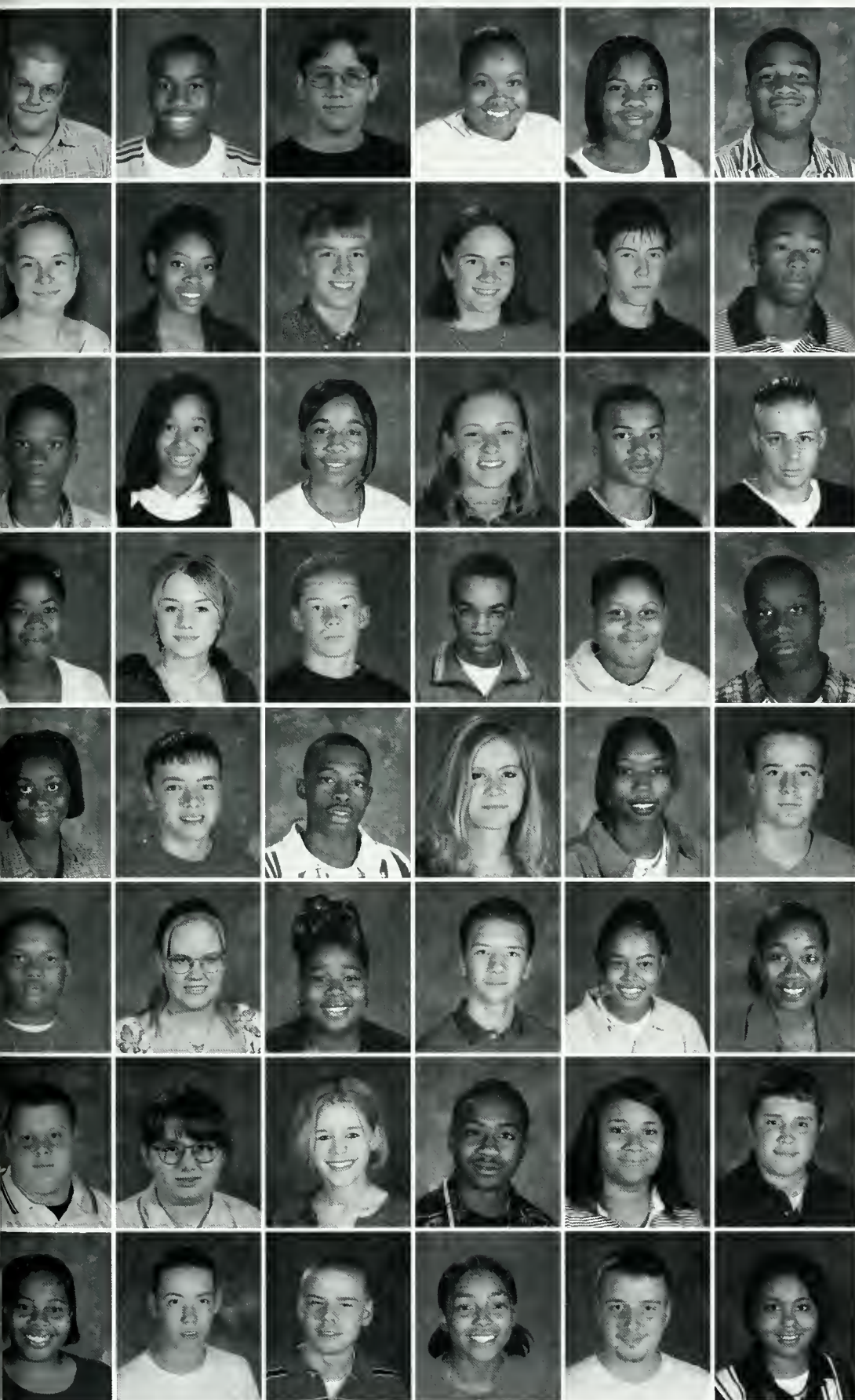

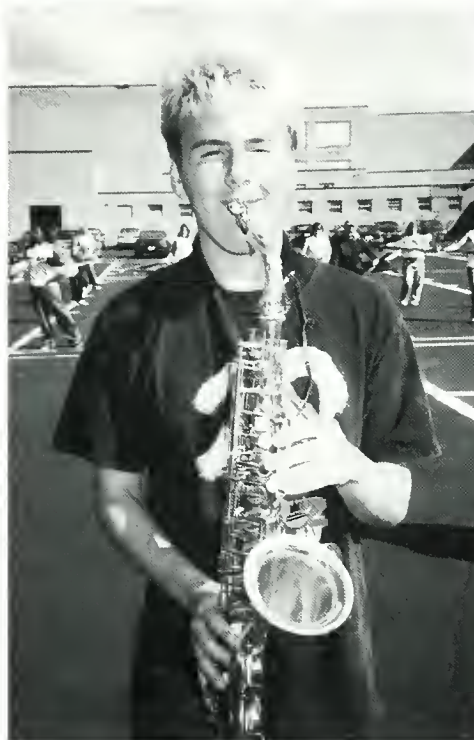

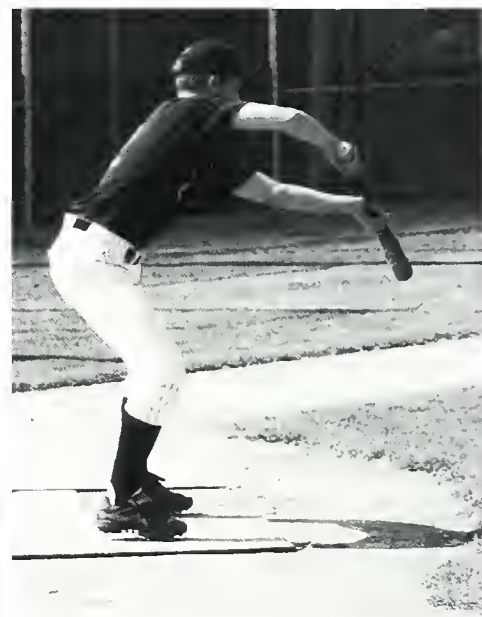

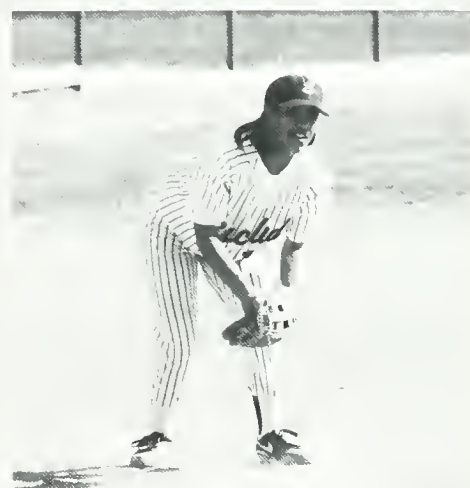

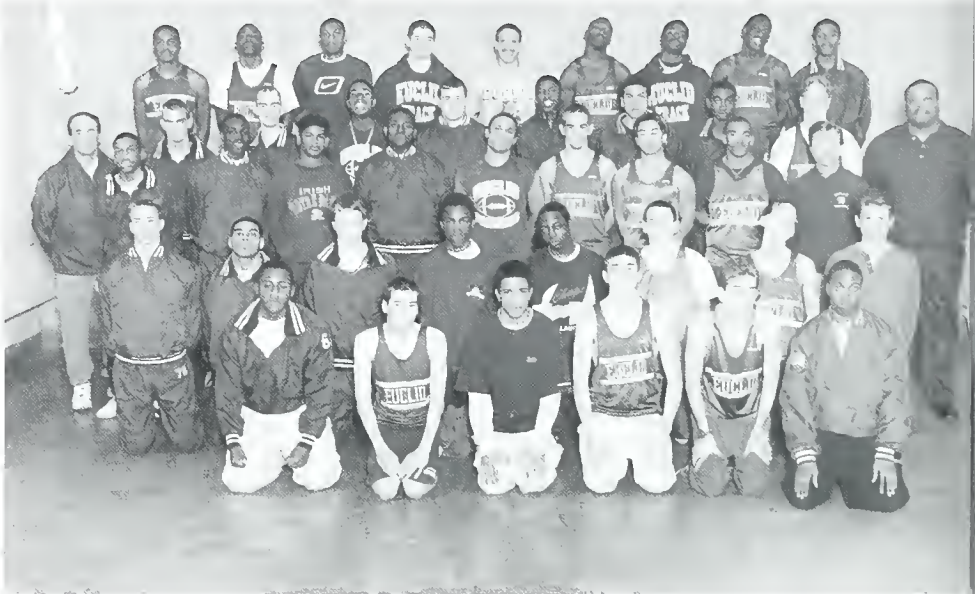

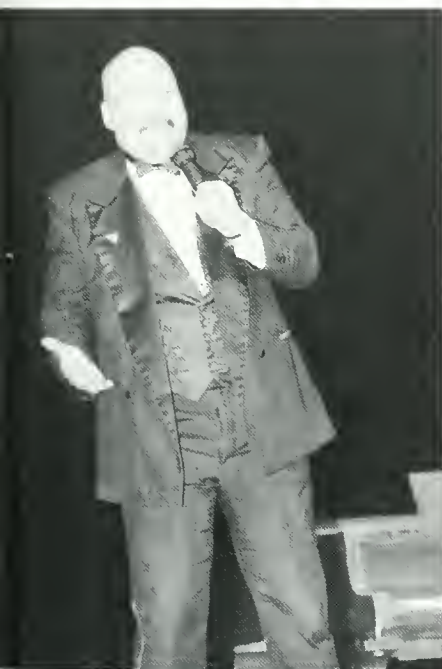

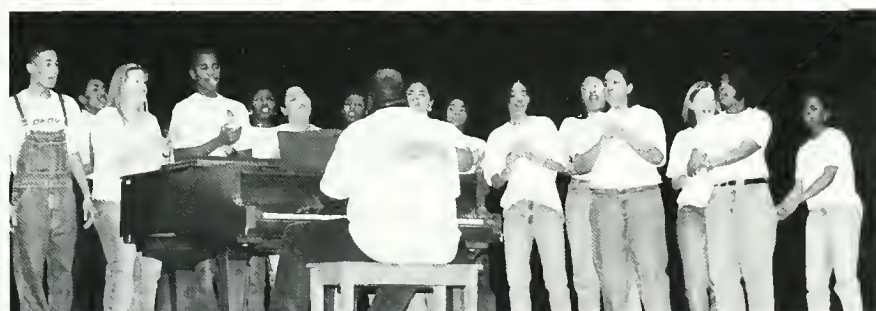

Josten's Printing and Publishing Division at State College, Pennsylvania printed the 530 copies of the 2000 *Euclidian*. The book was printed on Gloss 191 paper stock and included 48 pages of full color. All pages were created using the Aldus PageMaker® 5.0 program running on a Macintosh G3 computer that had 192 megabytes of RAM, and a 6 gigabyte hard drive. The pages were backed-up onto a 100 megabyte Iomega® removable Zip disk. A 21" color, two page monitor working with a 17" color monitor made page layouts much easier. A Macintosh IIsi computer with 17 megabytes of RAM was networked to the G3 so that digital pictures could be indexed while the G3 was processing digital images. The IIsi was running system 7.5 while the G3 was using system 8.6. Digital images were imported either directly from a Kodak DC 280 Still Video Camera into the G3 via USB interface or were scanned in from a photograph using a 600 dpi scanner. The images were processed using Adobe Photoshop®. Graphics were produced using Aldus Freehand®, Type Styler® and Microsoft Works®. The index was made using the Josten's program, Last Name First®. The pages were recorded on 3.5 inch floppy disks and 100 megabyte Iomega® Zip disks and hard copy was printed on a Hewlett Packard LaserJet III printer. The hardcopy and disks were sent to Josten's who stripped in the photos and produced the final copy on a Linotronic printer. The deadlines were submitted on Iomega® Zip disks since there was so much memory needed with the digital images. The cover was designed by the **Josten's Art Department**. Pages were submitted to the plant on five deadlines: November 1, November 22, December 27, January 24, and February 21. The pages were submitted as double page spreads. All the color pages had to be in the first deadline since their production entailed so much work. Since the final deadline was in late February, nothing that occurred after that time could be included in the book. The picture patron option has gained in popularity with eighty six students having their baby pictures included. New this year was the option for parents to purchase more than just the 1/9 page ad if they wished to put multiple pictures or longer messages to their children. The Name Stamp option that was begun last year has also increased in popularity.

The staff of the 2000 *Euclidian* would like to extend thanks to all who helped to make this book possible. First and foremost, thanks have to go to the adviser, **Mr. Von Benken** for the many long hours of hard work and planning that had to be put in to get the entire operation going and to keep it going. Others to be thanked are: **Ohio School Pictures, Inc.** for supplying film and processing for the many pictures that appeared in the book and for taking many of the team pictures, senior and underclass pictures. **Josten's Yearbook Company** for putting it all together in such an artistic manner, **Charlotte Elston** for all the time she spent arranging photography dates and supplying needed materials, **Joanne Hodder** and **Joan Benoy** and **Michael Barnes** for all the time and work they did trying to get the senior pictures arranged and taken, all the writers and photographers who contributed their time, and last but not least, the entire student body at Euclid High School without which this book could not exist.

Many people helped in some way with the 2000 *Euclidian*. Some wrote stories while others worked on the laying out of the book while others helped in the mailing of letters. 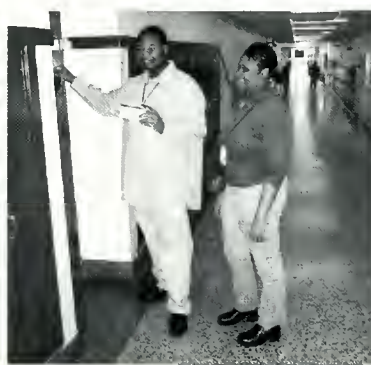

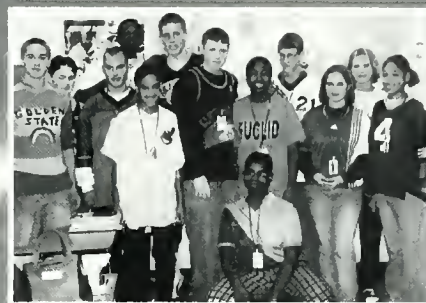
