#### **BILL GROSSMAN**




#### **DUDLEY ROLLA—Guard**

#### WALTER SCHWEGLER—Coach



#### BUD JONES—Forward


Bud was another recruit from the reserves at mid-year. As a natural left-hander he proved to be a scoring threat against any team. He was also a good passer and floorman.


#### BILL CRAWFORD—Forward




The team then traveled to Shaw, where they were defeated 4-0. The following day Shore came out and trounced a Willoughby nine, 14-5.
