BILL GROSSMAN

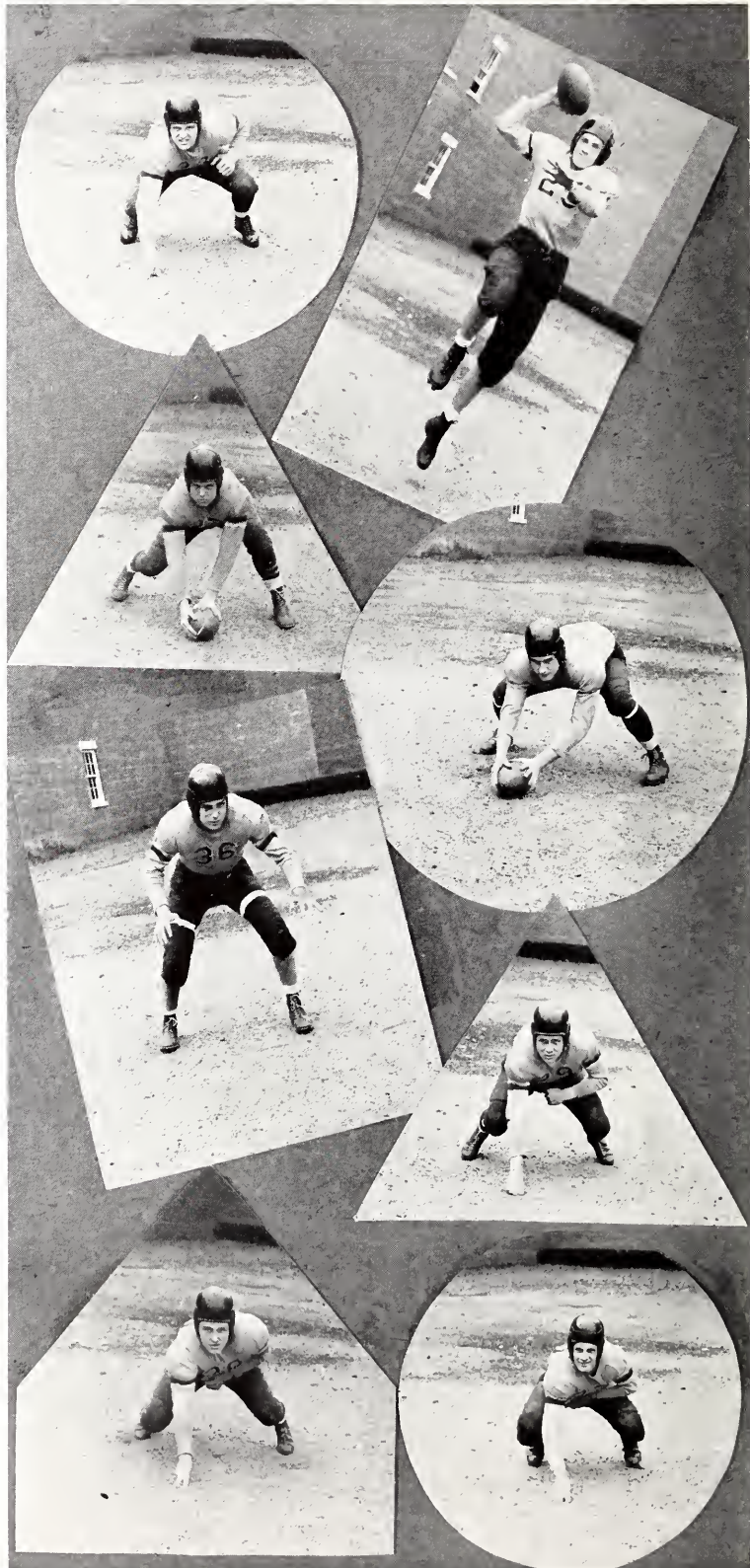

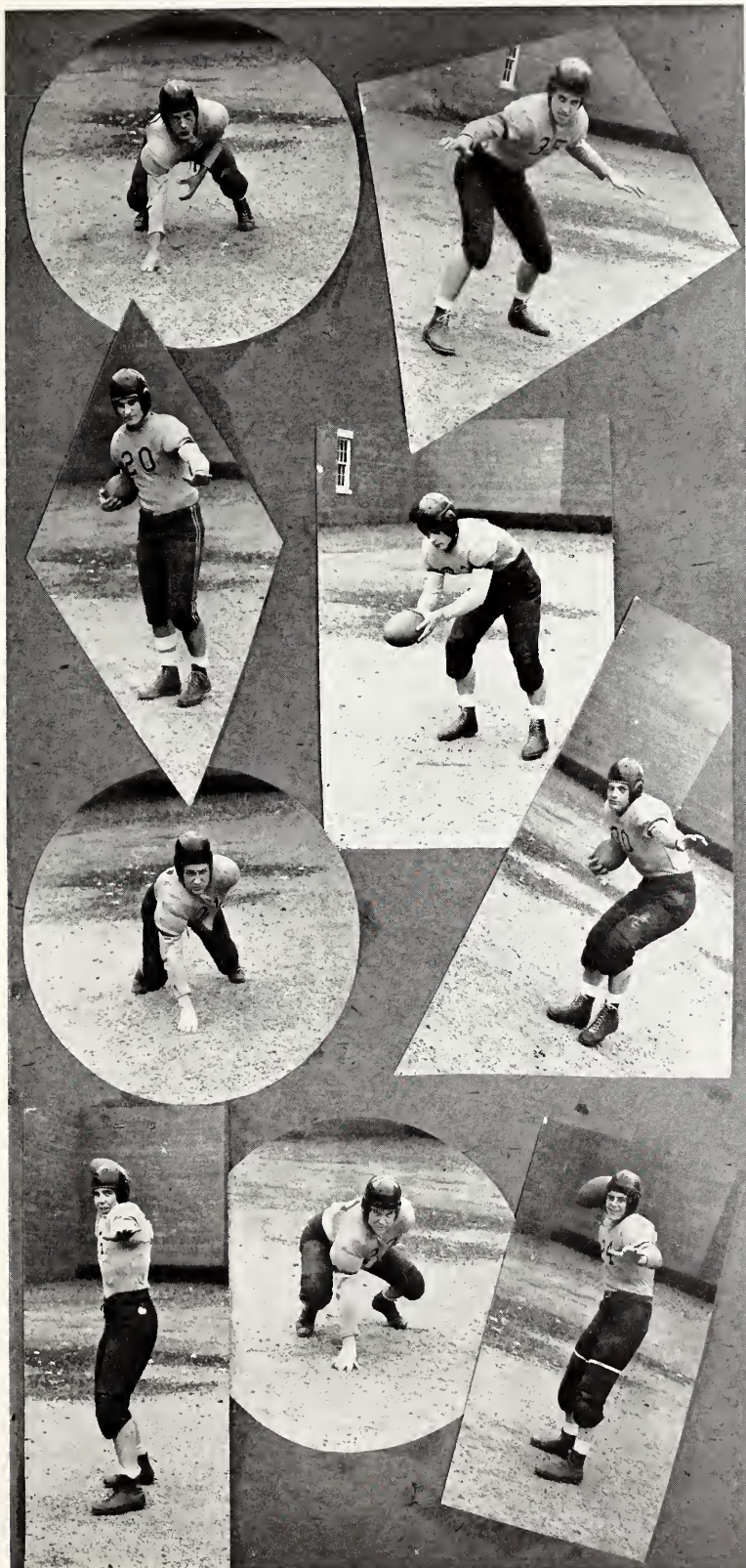
DUDLEY ROLLA—Guard

BUD JONES—Forward

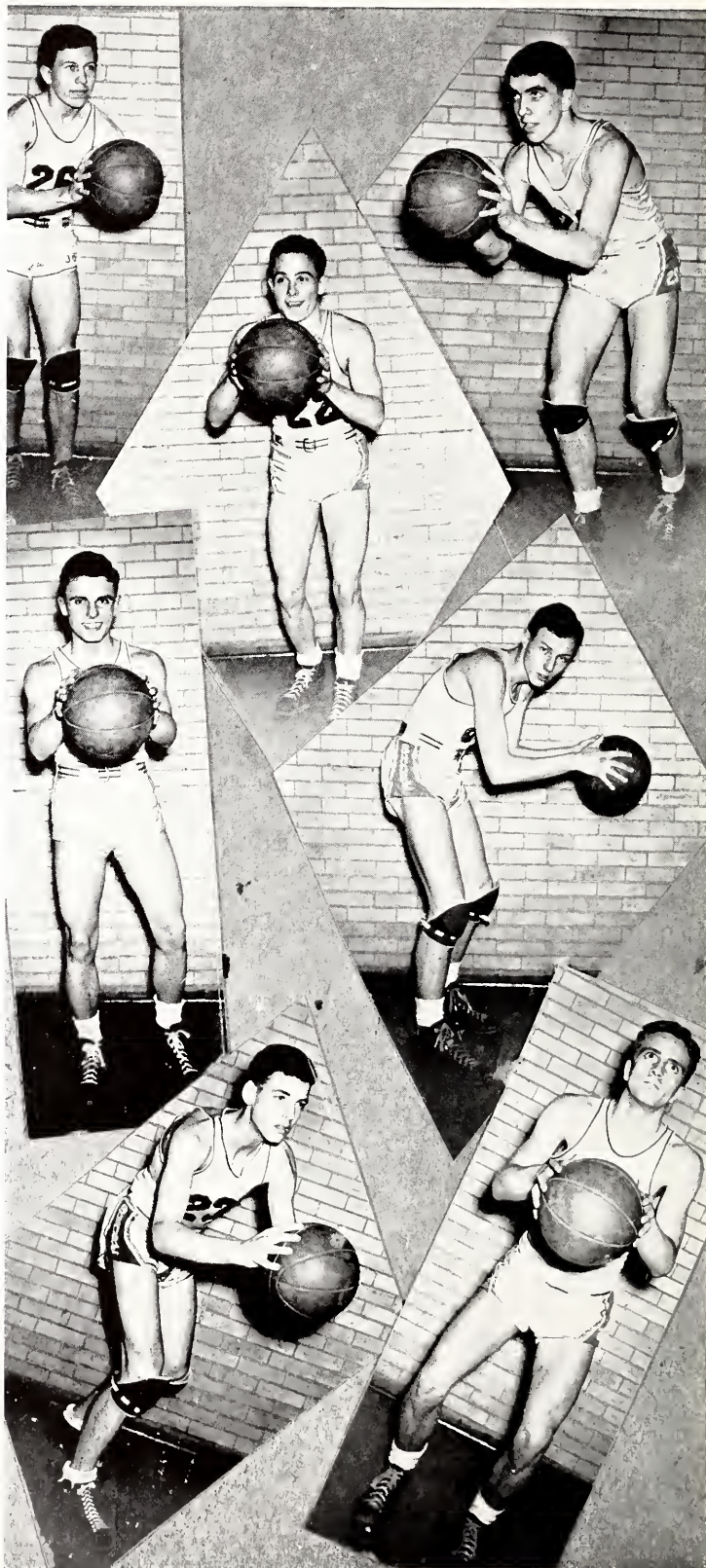
Bud was another recruit from the reserves at mid-year. As a natural left-hander he proved to be a scoring threat against any team. He was also a good passer and floorman.

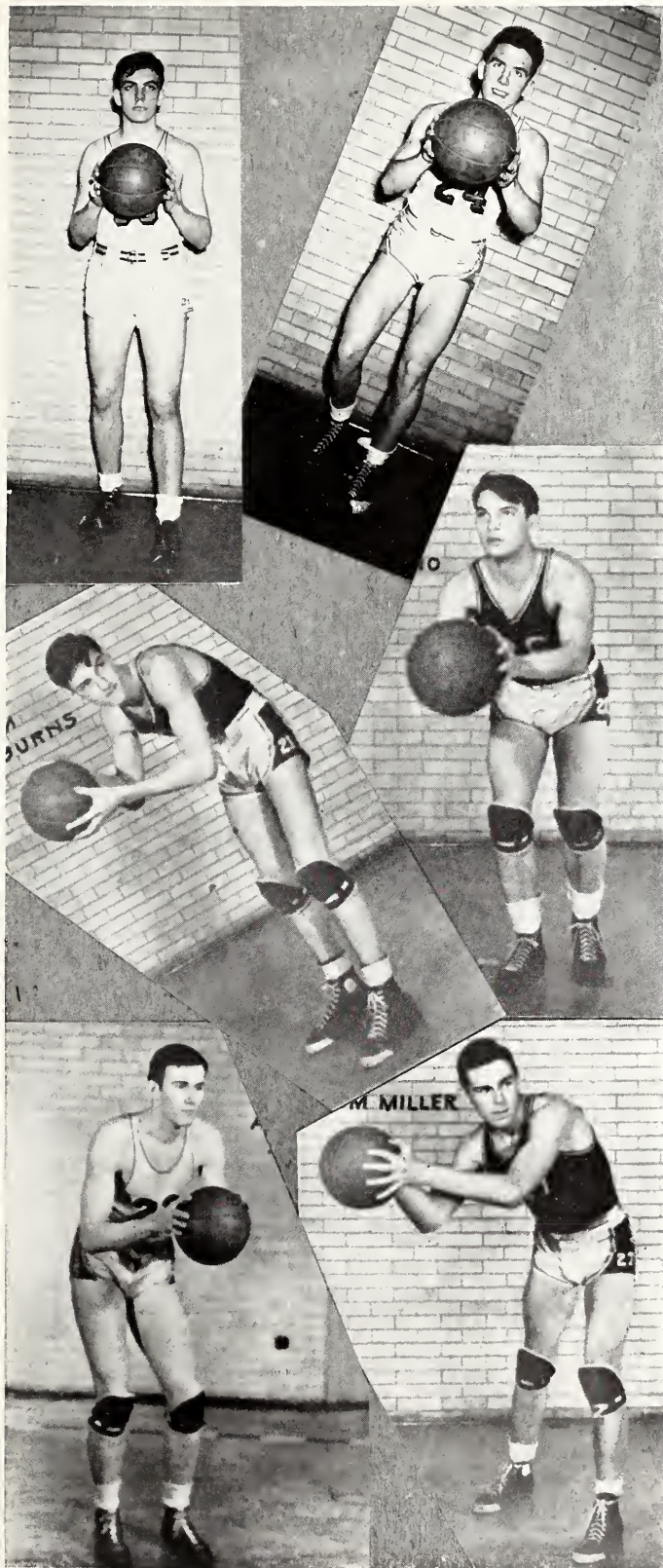
BILL CRAWFORD—Forward

CAPTAIN TOM MILLER—

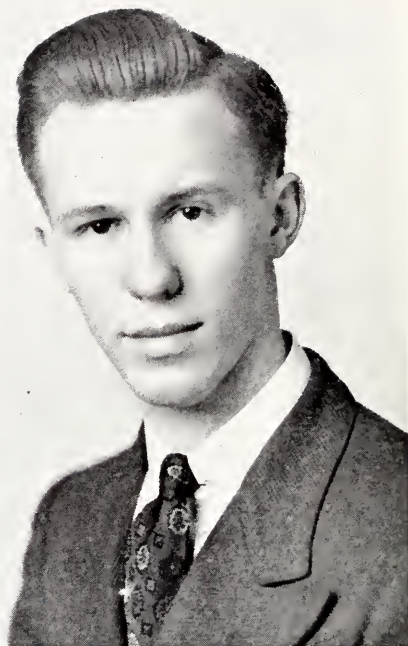
