

Extract from letter to
Lucia Weston from Deborah
Weston New Bedford June 15th
1847.

Our Bristol Co meeting was a
very good one. Remond
was of course rather sulky
at times but no more than
he always is. Douglas spoke
finely, & appeared well. All
N. B. was much interested in
him. He told stories with great
 zest of when he lived in
such a cellar & when he
rolled oil cakes & when he
sawed wood & attributed
all his greatness to the fact
that before he had a cent
to call his own, he subscribed
for the Liberator & made

himself thoroughly master of
the past history of the cause.
Brown acquitted himself
admirably, we were very much
pleased with him. If he
does as well everywhere as he
did here, he is a great gain
to the cause. He got 24 sub-
scribers to the Standard &
several to the Liberator.
