Shipping Time. Most of the items listed in this catalog are ready for shipment in September or October, but a few are not ready until later. In each case we will forward each kind on your order at the proper time to plant.

## Daffodils

Narcissi-Daffodils. The sunshiny-petaled fragrant Daffodils during February and March are the showiest flowers in the garden and the finest for cutting. You will have no trouble growing them. They will thrive in any sunny spot, and in any good garden soil. Planted 6 inches apart, other later blooming plants may be grown in between without disturbing them, and even though they multiply it is always at least three years before they need to be dug up and replanted.

## Giant Trumpet Daffodils

Aerolite. A newer giant golden Daffodil now becoming very popular. The giant flower is beautifully proportioned and graceful; has a deep yellow trumpet thrust out in bold relief against the broad pointed primrose yellow star formed by the enormous outer petals. Blooming early and remaining late, it is one of the longest lasting of all Daffodils either in the garden or as a cut flower. 3 for 80 c ; 12 for $\$ 2.60 ; 100$ for $\$ 17.10$.

Ben Hur. This new Giant variety with its immense deeply frilled blooms of pure Roman gold is our largest Daf fodil. ## "Different" Daffodils

Our customers get a lot of pleasure out of trying some of the rarer exhibition Daffodils that we can highiy recommend as desirable under our growing conditions.

Lovenest. The large starry perianth of translucent white forms an enhancing background for the beautiful trumpet. Fully 11/2 inches across, the trumpet is saffron-yellow at its base, and the daintily frilled lip is a rich glowing apricot-pink. Look on page 2 for an idea of the exquisite color blending. 3 for $\$ 1.05 ; 12$ for $\$ 3.40 ; 100$ for $\$ 22.35$.

Tunis. The experts agree that this giant flowered, tall, robust grower is tops. The large, wide flaring ivory trumpets have turned back, neatly cut borders of coppery gold. They look out at you against a beautifully contrasting background of pure white petals. Illustrated, page 2. $\$ 1.30$ each; 3 for $\$ 3.25$; 12 for $\$ 9.55$.

February Gold will surprise you. The blooms are golden all right, but the long trumpets are interestingly fringed with orange. Siarts io bloom very early-but is still going strong in February, and you get, on each stem, two or three large blooms with gracefully curved-back petals. Illustrated below. 3 for $70 \mathrm{c} ; 12$ for $\$ 2.20$.

Mrs. R. O. Backhouse. The most famous of pink daffodils. Petals of ivory white surround the long slim trumpet which is apricot-pink changing to shell-pink at the frilled edge. $\$ 2.50$ each; 3 for $\$ 6.50$.

Red Shadow. Creamy yellow petals with a chrome yellow cup margined with orange-red, making a bold appearing flower. This is a beautiful plant in the garden and one of the latest to bloom. Illustrated below. 3 for $\$ 1.05 ; 12$ for $\$ 3.40$.

Helios. A splendid vigorous plant, with broad foliage and heavy stems, and the flower has that attractive "looking at you" habit. The perianth is a deep golden yellow, the petals over lapping. ## Shallow Cup Daffodils

These daintily formed varieties have a flat cup in the center, which is often vividly tinted and frilled, instead of a trumpet. 'The varieties lisced below all make exquisite cut fiowers.

Bath's Flame. The deep yellow cup has a broad edge of orange-red, and the long petals spring from around it like six individual wavy golden flames. Illus rated, page 2.3 for 55 c 12 for $\$ 1.80$.

Mis. Barclay. The illustration on page 4 (about two-thirds natural size) gives you the colors found in the large flowers with their broad overlapping peials. A side view would better show the deeply frilled orangescarlet rimmed cup. 3 for $80 \mathrm{c} ; 12$ for $\$ 2.60 ; 100$ for $\$ 17.10$.

## Double Daffodils

## Bunch-Flowered Narcissi

No other group of Narcissi blooms as freely or naturalizes as readily as these free-blooming favorites. The big clusters of small yet perfectly formed blooms make their appearance early in the spring and will fill your garden with their intense fragrance. The long, sturdy stems hold the flower heads proudly erect, a requis te for lovely floral arrangements.

Soleil d'Or. This is the newer golden kind. The gleaming yellow flowers with their deep brilliant orange cups are very showy and appear very early in the garden before the other Narcissi. The bulbs increase rapidly in the garden. Illustrated above. 3 for $50 \mathrm{c} ; 12$ for $\$ 1.60 ; 100$ for $\$ 10.40$.

Chinese Sacred Lily. This is the Chinese "Flower of the Gods". Each bulbs produces several spikes of ex ceedingly fragrant white flowers with a yellow cup. Those who have grown them prize them highly for their large clusters of deliciously fragrant, well formed flowers and for their vigorous growing habit. ## Fragrant Jonquils

Below we list two dainty Jonquil Narcissi varieties with typical miniature Daffodil blooms, perfectly formed and extremely fragrant. Some confuse these varieties with the Poetaz Narcissi and the Bunch Flowered Narcissi. However, Jonquils are entirely different and distinctive, blooming much earlier than most Narcissi. Try several clumps around the base of a small deciduous tree, such as a birch. They'll bloom before the tree leafs out in the early spring, and you'll enjoy them immensely. Campernelle. A single flowered golden Narcissus really entitled to the name Jonquil. Because of its extreme earliness, ability to grow anywhere, and exquisite scent, there should be a clump of them in errory garden. The foliage is grass-1:ke, and the dainty miniature blooms are usually borne three on a stalk. They bloom in February in Southern California and make marvelous winter cut flowers.

Golden Sceptre. A new Hybrid Jonquil which is only half the size of the Giant Trumpets but much more gracefully proportioned. The fine substance flowers are deep golden yellow with lighter trumpet. (See illustration, page 3.) Their exceptionally early blooms are very long lasting both in the garden and when cut.

## White Cyclamen Daffodil

Thalia is one of the most daintily fashioned of all Daffodils. The exquisitely formed petals curve gracefully back from the formal, smoothly tapered cup. Each stem has two or three snow-white blooms and each bloom is 2 inches across. It is a superb cut flower. 3 for $\$ 1.50$.

## Grape Hyacinth

## Something New in Freesias

The popularity of Freesias has increased rapidly dur ing the last several years, but it is due to increase tremendously once the public becomes acquainted with the newer varieties. The spectacular, giant flowered Tecolote Freesias are twice the size of ordinary kinds. The delicately fragrant blooms appear so early in the spring that they are almost classed as winter flowers. These improved varieties, like the old-fashioned favorites, are easy to permanently establish in the garden.

## "Tecolote" Ranunculus

Ranunculus are among the gayest, cheeriest and most brightly colored of all flowers, and they do particularly well in California. They are extremely effective when planted in beds and are ideal for cut flowers for they bloom profusely and keep for several days after cutting. During late February, March and early April some of the most beautiful beds of flowers that can be grown in California are those of well grown Ranunculus.

The strain of Ranunculus that we offer will, if properly grown. be almost $100 \%$ double. To get the largest proportion of double flowers the tubers should be planted as soon as possible after October 1. Ranunculus should be planted in full sunshine 4 or 5 inches apart.

## Armstrong Giant

Armstrong Giant Mixed. There are many strains of Ranunculus but we believe that this particular blended strain is as fine as can be obtained. Developed here in Southern California: improved over the years by careful selection; now almost all of the flowers are fully double.
