The election on Tuesday last resulted in a glorious Union Victory. Dogmatic efforts were made by the enemy to carry Pennsylvania, but they were handsomely beaten by four tenths to three thirtieths majority on the house vote, which will be increased twenty thousand by the returns from the army.

Out of the twenty-four Congressional districts, sixteen are Union, being a four of five.

The State Legislature is Union by a large majority in both branches. The Copperheads elected only three from Philadelphia. The glorious City of Philadelphia gave 7700 Union majority.

In Lancaster, Chester, Bradford, Tioga, and in fact all the strong Union Counties, our majorities were reduced, by reason of error of counting. They will do much better in November.

In Berks, Luzerne, Montgomery, Schuylkill, and several other democratic counties, where the effort was made, we gained on last year's vote, and thus the popular majority in the State was secured for the Union.

Burrall For the Soldiers.
 The copperheads who voted to deliver the Union soldiers of the rights to vote, are already rewarded. The soldiers have now the right of suffrage by virtue of an amendment to the State Constitution, which was ratified by the people of this State on the 2nd of August last, in pursuance of the copperheads. The brave soldiers voted, last Tuesday at the front, in the camp and in the hospitals, and they recorded their vote, at the rate of about six to one, for the Union. They will repeat their verdict in November—only a little stronger.
