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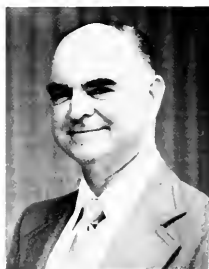

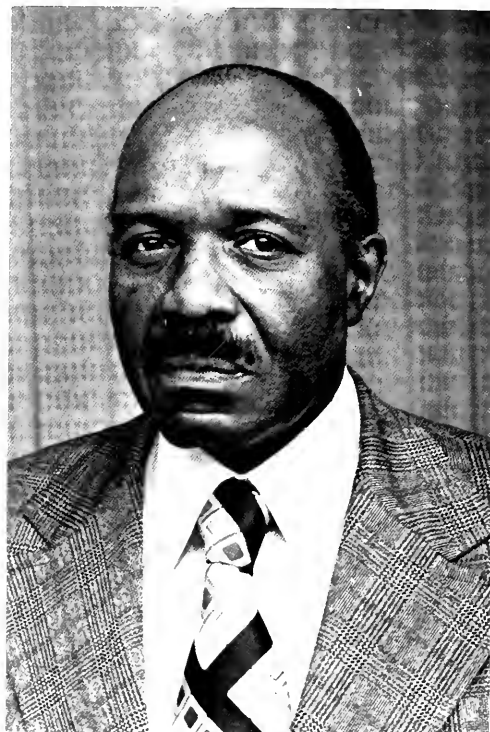

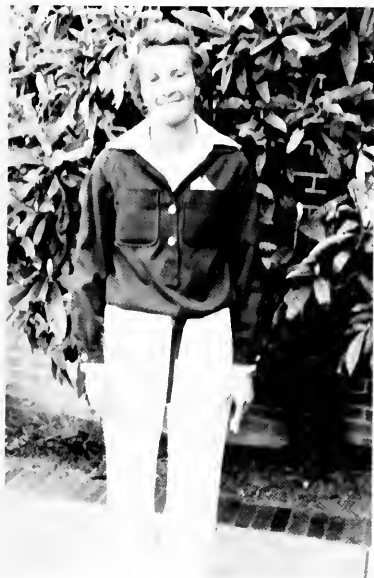

A TRIBUTE TO OUR FOUNDERS



At a time when the education of Black youth, even on an elementary level, was virtually ignored, seven Black men recognized the need to develop a cadre of literate Black citizens in Fayetteville, N.C. Through their gifts of material, moral, and intellectual resources, MATHEW N. LEARY, A.J. CHESNUTT, ROBERT SIMMONS, GEORGE GRAINGER, THOMAS LOMAX, NELSON CARTER and DAVID A. BRYANT founded the institution which is today known as Fayetteville State University.

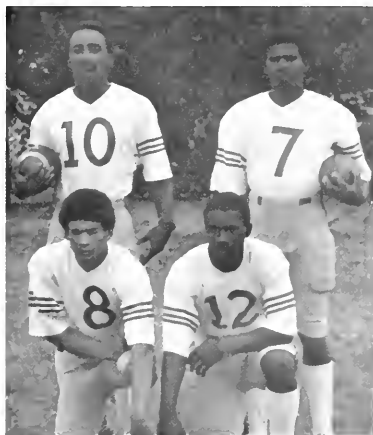

The National Pan-Hellenic Council was organized in May, 1930 at Howard University, Washington D. C. The charter members were: Kappa Alpha Psi and Omega Psi Phi Fraternities; Alpha Kappa Alpha, Delta Sigma Theta and Zeta Phi Beta Sororities.

In 1931 Alpha Phi Alpha and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternities joined the Council and in 1937 Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority completed the list of organizations that continues to comprise the affiliate organizations of the National Pan-Hellenic Council.

The stated purpose of the organization in 1930 was "Unanimity of thought and action as far as possible in the conduct of Greekletter collegiate fraternities and sororities, and to consider problems of mutual interest to its member organizations."

Early in 1937, the organization was incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois and became known as "The National Pan-Hellenic Council Incorporated."

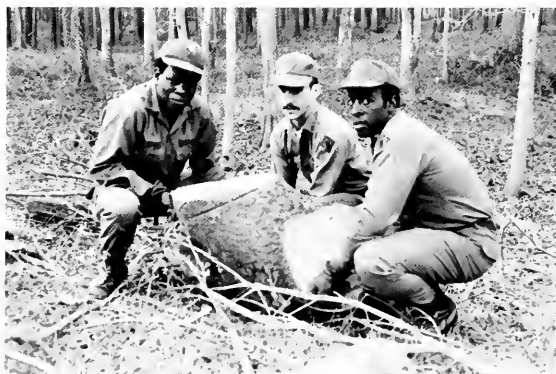

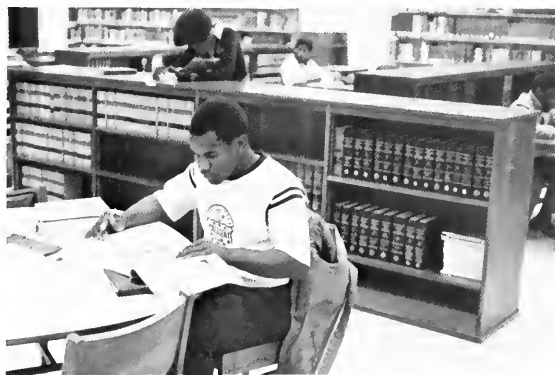

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER



GRADUATION MESSAGE

Dr. Samuel D. Proctor, FSU commencement speaker, told the 450 receiving degrees from the predominantly black institution they were among the first generation since the U.S. Supreme Court's landmark *Brown vs. Board of Education* ruling, and he urged the graduates to take advantage of the 1954 decision.

"The consequences of *Brown* on our society and culture have been enormous," said Proctor, professor of education at Rutgers University and pastor of New York City's Abyssinian Baptist Church.

"We stand on the threshold of something great. We have just begun to understand what it means to have an educational system that removes the disparities," Proctor said.

Proctor, a graduate of Virginia Union University who earned his doctorate from Boston University and returned to become Virginia Union's president, drew frequent applause as he spoke of his own struggles against bias and inequality in a segregated society while a youth.

Proctor spoke to a Cumberland County Memorial Arena audience of thousands.

At the FSU commencement Sunday, Proctor characterized the "struggle of the black people for dignity after slavery" as unlike any other struggle in Western civilization.

"It was an unprecedented circumstance. Nowhere else had four million people been emancipated and then decided to remain on the same land to cast their lot with their enslavers," he said.

Critics of integrated education who think the disparities between the races are too great to overcome mistakenly point to standardized achievement testing to support their view, Proctor said.

"I think we put too much emphasis on the way we measure academic and intellectual development."

"These tests do not measure what a person can learn, they measure what exposure a person has had and they reflect the kind of cultural and economic background we come from," he said.

He called for development of a "real sense of justice" in higher education and all segments of society.
