With a third attempt being made in Pittsburg, PA. Americans watched in horror as commercial aircrafts were used as bombs and flown into the World Trade Center toppling the Twin Towers. Minutes later, another plane was flown into the Pentagon. In a news conference from Florida, President Bush stated, "Freedom itself was attacked this morning and I assure you, freedom will be defended." The attacks sent the PSU family and surrounding community into a tailspin. Security was tightened at local military installations while students struggled to make sense of the tragedy. Honda Tournament

The Honda Campus All-Star Challenge is a jeopardy style competition between teams representing America's Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Teams vie for monetary grants totaling more than \$300,000 at the national tournament in Orlando, Florida. On the campus of FSU, competing for a spot on the varsity team begins during the fall semester. Student organizations are encouraged to assemble teams from its membership rosters. However, individual students may who do sign up are randomly selected to play on various teams. To secure a varsity position, you must have one of the top five highest scores. 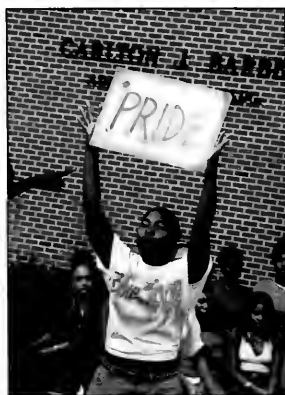
"How High"

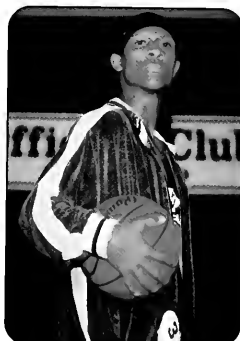

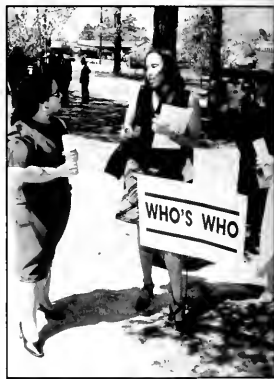

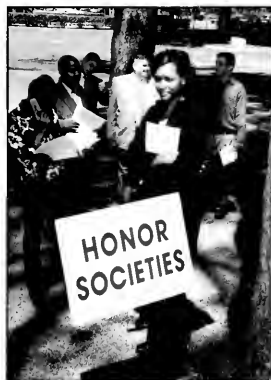

Founders' Day

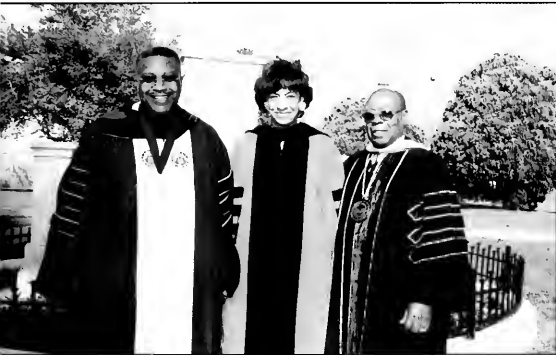

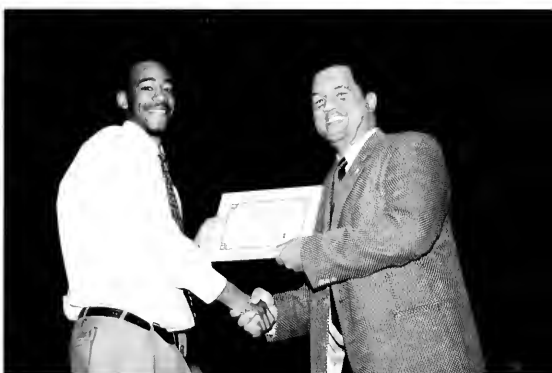


Student Affairs Honors & Awards

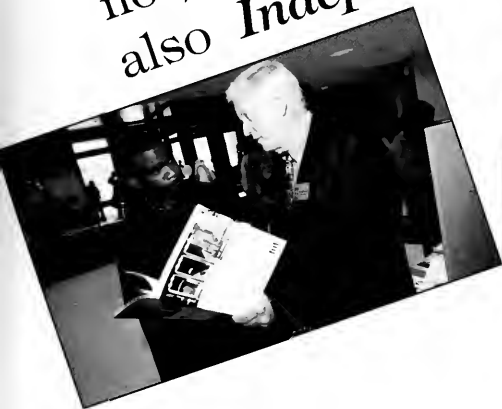
