










With a third attempt being made in Pittsburg, PA. Americans watched in horor as conunercial aircrafts were used as bombs and flown into the World Trade Center toppling the Twin Towers. Minutes later, another plane was flown into the Pentagon. In a news conference from Florida, President Bush stated, "Freedom itself was attacked this morning and I assure you, freedom will be defended." The attacks sent the FSU family and surrounding community into a tailspin. Security was tightened at local military installations while students struggled to make sense of the tragedy. To aid in this effort, the SGA held a prayer vigil on September 12. During the ceremony, students offered one another words of encouragement and prayed for a wounded nation.







A lthough HIV/AIDS has vanished from our news headlines, the SGA recognized the need for continued education on the deadly epidemic. In an effort to assist in this process, speaker Rae Lewis-Thornton spoke to the student body on the topic. he Honda Campus All-Star Challenge is a jeopardy style competition between teams representing America's Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Teams vie for monetary grants totaling more than \$300,000 at the national tournament in Orlando, Florida. On the campus of FSU, competing for a spot on the varsity team begins during the fall semester. Student organizations are encouraged to assemble teams from its membership rosters. However, individual students may who do sign up are randomly selected to play on various teams. To secure a varsity position, you must have one of the top five highest scores. The next five highest are placed on the junior varsity team.

The University has participated in this program for the past 13 years and continues to distinguish itself as a strong contender at the national level.











The Jones Invitational is sponsored annually by the Office of Student Activities. Honda teams assemble for intra-regional competition which affords them the opportunity to assess their strengths and weaknesses prior to competing at the national level.








