

Muster Roll of Captain William H. Redding's Company of the Mounted Florida Militia, commanded by Col. W. J. Bailey, ordered into service of the United States from the 9th Day of December 1840 to the 9th Day of March 1840. The company was enrolled at Tallahassee, Florida.

At Camp Townsend, Fla. on 9 Dec 1840, the muster was certified to be true and accurate by William H. REDDING, Capt., commanding the company and by Capt. Jno. C. CASEY, Inspector & Mustering Officer.

Muster Roll of Capt. William H. Redding's Company of the 1st Regiment, Brigade of Florida Mounted Militia, commanded by Col. W. J. Bailey, ordered into service of the United States by the Secretary of War, from the 9th Day of December 1840 to the 9th Day of March 1841 when discharged. The miles traveled from place of rendezvous to place of discharge were forty.

At Charles Ferry, E. F., on 13 March 1841, the muster roll was certified to be true and accurate and the remarks set opposite the names of officers and soldiers were accurate and just. The signatures signed were William H. Redding, Capt., commanding the company and F. C. Churchill, Maj. 3rd Art'y, Inspector & Mustering Officer.

Muster Roll of Captain William M. Reed's Company of the 1st Regiment, 2nd Brigade of Florida Militia, commanded by Col. John Warren, ordered into service of the United States by his Excellency Gov. Call from the 23rd day of September 1836 to the 27th Day of January 1837.

At Fort Gilliland on 8 Apr. 1837, Wm. Reed, Capt. commanding the Company, certified by signature tht the muster roll was true, accurate and just. On the same date, L. B. Webster, Capt., 1st Regt. of Art'y, by signature certified the muster roll to be correct.

Remarks by W. J. Mills, Lt. Col., Comm'd 1st Battalion, 1st Regt. F.M. in the U.S. Service: "Capt. Reed with Lts. Ross and Hooker and a part of this company served in my Battalion in Col.
