SIDNEY LANIER MEMORIAL CLASSROOM DEDICATION

The Formal Dedication of the Sidney Lanier Memorial Classraom was held May 18th. The Rotary Club of Buckhead refurbished this Oglethorpe Classroam in which literature speech, writing, and English will be taught.

In 1860, Lanier graduated from Oglethorpe with first honors at the age of eighteen. During the last days of his life, Mr. Lanier stated that he awed to his Oglethorpe Professor James Woodrow (uncle to Woodrow Wilson and first Ph.D. in Georgia) "The strongest and most valuable stimulus of his youth."* Lanier's own desk used when he was a student at Oglethorpe will be enscanced behind glass in one portion of the room. A brass plate over the door of the Sidney Lanier Room reveals an inscription proclaiming the participation of the Buckhead Rotary Club in decorating the room. Buckhead Rotarians and friends of the College were invited for a firsthand view of the project results on May 18th.
