Homecoming

The audience enjoyed performances by many talented faculty members. Friday evening comedian Jay Leno made his second visit to LFC, and performed for an enthusiastic crowd. The festivities continued Saturday with the football team's win over Ripon College. In keeping with the winning spirit, the volleyball, soccer, and field hockey teams were also victorious. The highlight of the weekend was the semi-formal dance held at the Hotel Moraine, with music provided by "Kicks". Overall, the efforts of the Homecoming Committee, chaired by Julie Abel, resulted in an enjoyable weekend for all.





Convocation

The 1985-86 Convocation Series provided a diverse selection of speakers addressing current and controversial issues, in addition to maintaining close academic correspondences. High attendance indicated an increased awareness and interest in the weekly Series.

The speaker at the opening Fall Convocation was Mike McCaskey, President of the Chicago Bears. Sex therapist Phyllis Levy, host of "Sex Talk," made a return appearance speaking to a large audience packed in to the Chapel. In conjunction with LFC's recently formed S.A.D.D. chapter, a special evening convocation was presented by Candy Lightner, founder of M.A.D.D. A most informative and interesting speaker, Phyllis Pitluga, Senior Astronomer from the Adler Planetarium, provided the audience with instructions for catching a "once-in-a-lifetime" glimpse of Halley's Comet. Academically, our fall calendar was highlighted by Irwin Weil, Professor of Slavic Languages at Northwestern University.

Academics and co-curricular activities were even further emphasized in the spring semester, commencing with a presentation by Franz Schulze, the Betty Jane Hollender Professor of Art at LFC. "Student Power in a Nuclear World" was the title of a special convocation conducted by selected LFC students and coordinated by Ron Miller, lecturer in Religion. Adding variety to the traditional calendar was a musical presentation by "Partitura," of which Abba Lessing, Associate Professor of Philosophy is a member. Music, or more specifically jazz, was also provided by Art Hodes, Chicago piano legend, in his return appearance to LFC. On a much broader level, and addressing an international condition felt strongly at LFC, Franklin Williams, President of the Phelps-Stokes Fund and Woodrow Wilson Visiting Fellow, delivered a talk on "American Policy in South Africa."

We hope, next year, to maintain the higher standards that the Convocation Series has achieved this year.

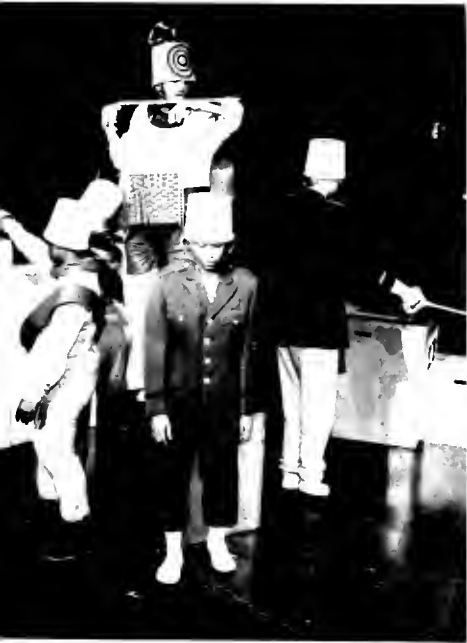




Ubu Roi

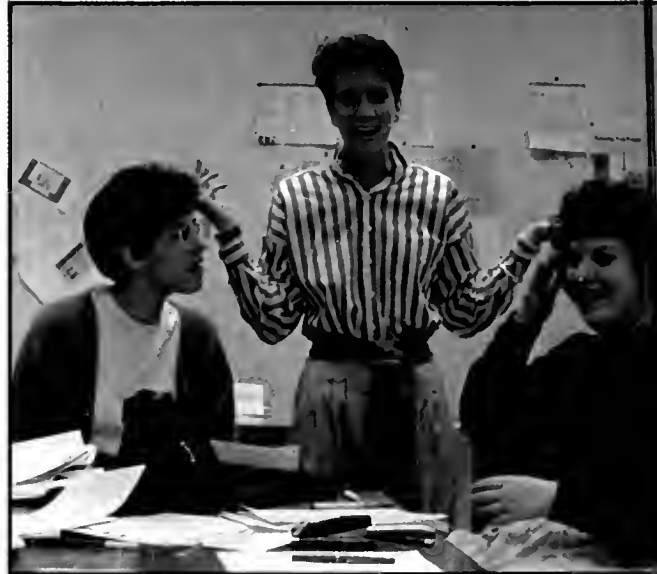


Campus Activities

Alpha Chi is a local fraternity which was formed in 1983. Its primary goals and philosophy are based on academic excellence and the betterment of the college and community as a whole. Alpha Chi works in cooperation with other established purpose units and independent students to enhance the social life of LFC, and to encourage leadership and participation. 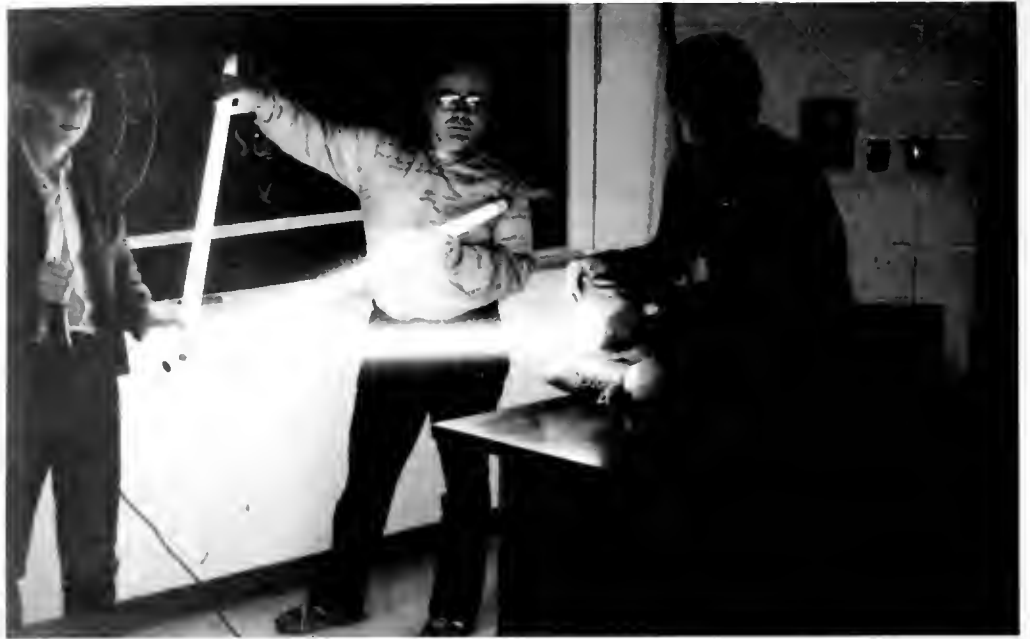
Social Services Organization

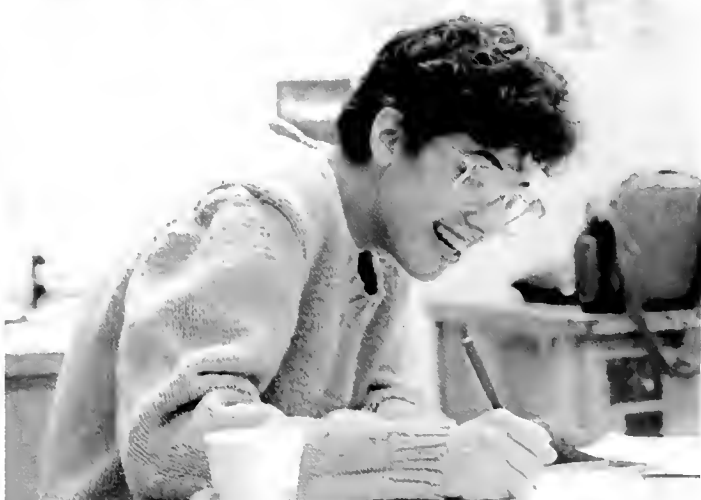
Spanish Club

Sports



Lacrosse

It is certainly an unusual Forester team that can boast victories over Big 10 powerhouses Ohio State and Michigan State in any sport. This is an accomplishment of the 1985 Lake Forest lacrosse team, but hardly the only one. Coach Wayne Braxton's squad rolled up a 7-2 overall record, and 5-1 in the Great Lakes Conference. They went 3-1 in the prestigious Suncoast Tournament in Florida, losing only in overtime to Eastern power Ithaca. The Foresters also claimed RPI, Haverford, and Wooster among their other victims.

The 1985 squad also could claim some impressive players. Midfielder Mark Talgo became the Foresters' all time point scorer, with 147 hard-earned points. He also made the first-team All Conference squad. Midfielder Eric Jensen, attackman Nick Risom, defenseman Andy Hamblett, and goalie Ralph Kunzmann all were awarded second-team All-Conference honors. The fine crop of seniors left holes for Coach Braxton to fill, but they also left a winning legacy, which never comes — or stays — easily.

This was truly a fine team, as was evidenced by vociferous and large crowds the team attracted all year. The ability to stimulate such excitement for athletics on campus is rare. The fact that the squad could do so is testimony enough that this was indeed a special team, on and off the field.





Softball

The 1985 Softball Team placed four players on the all conference squad and captured the North Division crown of the MACW for the second consecutive year. Donna Lawlor (P-3B), Lori Edenhofer (P-CF), Cindy Hahn (3B-SS), and Nancy McKee (1B) were the all conference selections, with Lawlor being a unanimous selection among all the conference coaches. Lawlor also led the team with a .450 batting average. As a team, LFC batted .307 outscoring their opponents 122-71 and compiling a 9-1 conference mark and a 12-11 record overall. MVP honors went to Donna Lawlor. Lisa Mielzynski was the MIP.

Men's Tennis

The 1985 men's tennis team had a few question marks prior to its season. The team lost three starters from the 1984 squad (including 1 & 2 singles), had a first year coach coming in (the third coach in three years), and one of its toughest schedules ever.

Ex-Forester tennis star and rookie coach, Terry Peach, put together a team that included four freshmen and only two returning lettermen. The Foresters encountered the likes of Division 3 powerhouse University of Wisconsin-Stout, Division 1 DePaul and the always tough Ripon and University of Chicago in the MCAC.

The Forester line-up placed freshmen Mike Hartler, Mark Gaffney, Parn Chantha, and George Frangos in the top four singles positions, while junior co-captains Ken Robinson and Jim Pettit occupied the fifth and sixth spots. Hartler and junior John Rohner held the top doubles spot, Chantha and Frangos combined their talents at second, and Gaffney and Robinson manned the third position.

They scored impressive victories against St. Marys, Chicago State, and North Park and dropped a 5-4 heartbreaker to conference rival Knox at the Grinnell Triangular Tournament. The Foresters finished a respectable seventh out of twelve teams at the MCAC Championships, a great improvement over the tenth place finish in 1984.

Parn Chantha, who held the highest winning percentage among the Foresters, was chosen as the team's MVP. MCAC semi-finalist at number one singles, Mike Hartler, was selected as the team's most improved player by coach Peach.

The team finished their season with a record of nine wins and two losses, and a fifth place finish in the MACW Tennis Conference.

With only three players returning from the 1984 season this year's team proved to be a fighting team who gained experience and determination with each match. The new additions of Cate Brown, Chris Hilden, Molly Melone, and Ingrid Charleson helped the team tremendously, and will add strength and experience to next year's team along with Caroline Guip who holds the number one position.

The team graduates two seniors, Captain Grace Keeble and Sue Venables, whose determination and leadership will be missed by the team.

Soccer

The Forester soccer team finished with an 11-3 record and as Co-Champions of the MCAC North Division. Three Foresters (Steve Nicoli, Marty Wittmer and Rick Redfield) earned all-conference honors. The Foresters registered seven shutout victories, scored 41 goals and allowed only 10. The teams goals against average was an impressive .666. This team displayed a hefty amount of courage by bouncing back from two tough setbacks to register its best record in the teams history. This was a team, in the true sense of the word, with much of the character and cohesiveness coming from captain Ralph Kunzmann, its seniors and the attitude of the support players. With the loss of one, four seniors (Ralph Kunzmann, Kevin Hannigan, Marty McCann, Tom Wagner) next years team should prove to be a tough opponent.

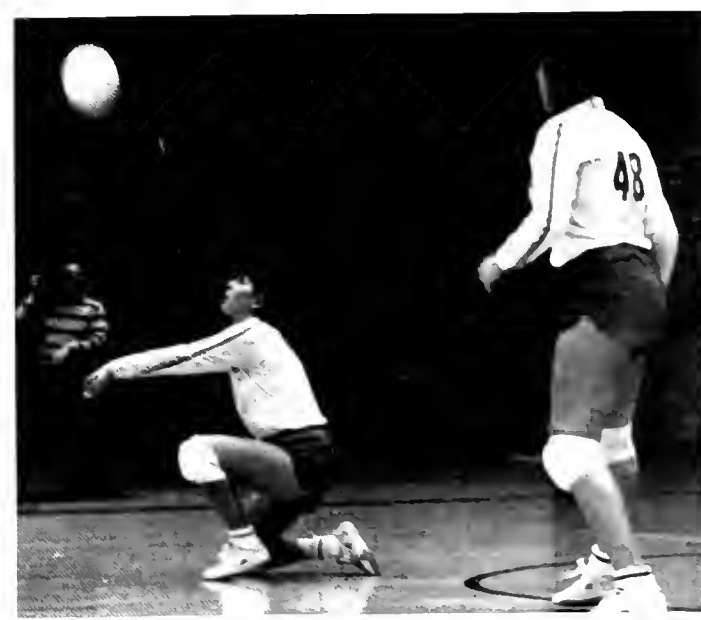
Volleyball

Football

Somehow, this should have been a better football season than it turned out to be. The veteran defense, led by some of the most vicious headhunters this side of New Guinea, gave up only 14 points a game, intercepted 16 passes, sacked opposing quarterbacks 27 times, and nailed assorted running backs and wide receivers with hurricane-force hits. On offense, the Foresters boasted a big and tough offensive line, a varied and potent aerial attack, hard-running backs, and solid kicking. All this would seem to add up to more than a 5-4 record and a third place in the tied in the MCAC North, but that's what happened.

The reason for this lies not in the skill and desire of the players — which was undoubted — but rather in a very tough conference, and a few bad bounces. The Foresters lost 4 conference games by a total of 32 points. Give a few of the breaks that St. Norbert and archrival Beloit got to the Foresters, and this could have been a championship team.

There was definitely championship talent here. Just among the seniors, wide receiver Colin Lundgren finished among the leaders in receiving in NCAA III, with 947 yards and 9 TD's. Defensive end Peter Dauk had 57 tackles and 7 sacks — and one safety. Defensive back Larry Malles had 6 interceptions, and was first-team All-MCAC, as was Lundgren. Safety Norm Kaiser had 65 powerful tackles and 6 interceptions. Mike Olsen kicked 5 field goals, 13 extra points, had 46 tackles, and 2 interceptions. These seniors and their talented classmates will be difficult to replace, both in talent and leadership. The Class of 1986's accomplishments on the football field were excellent. They deserved a much better coda than the star-crossed 1985 season, but they have much to remember with pride.

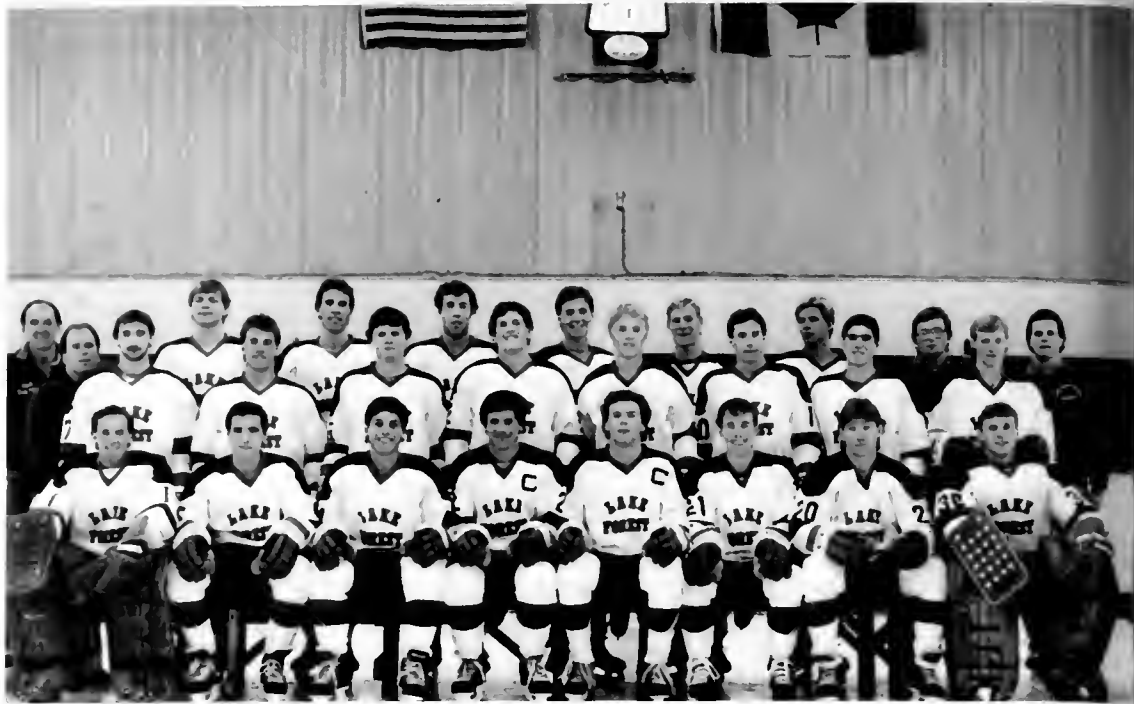


Hockey

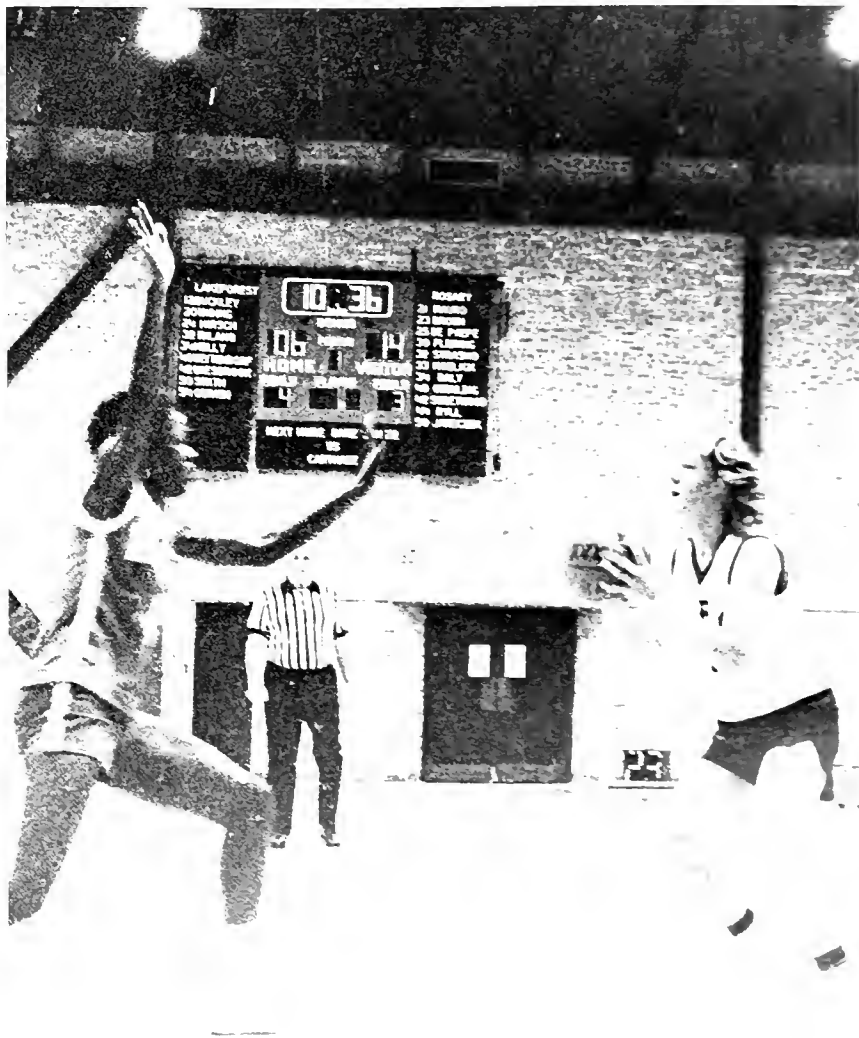
Women's Basketball

This was a good team, with plenty of team spirit and aggressiveness. Coach Charles Miller will miss this squad, but there is much to build on including this fairly successful campaign.



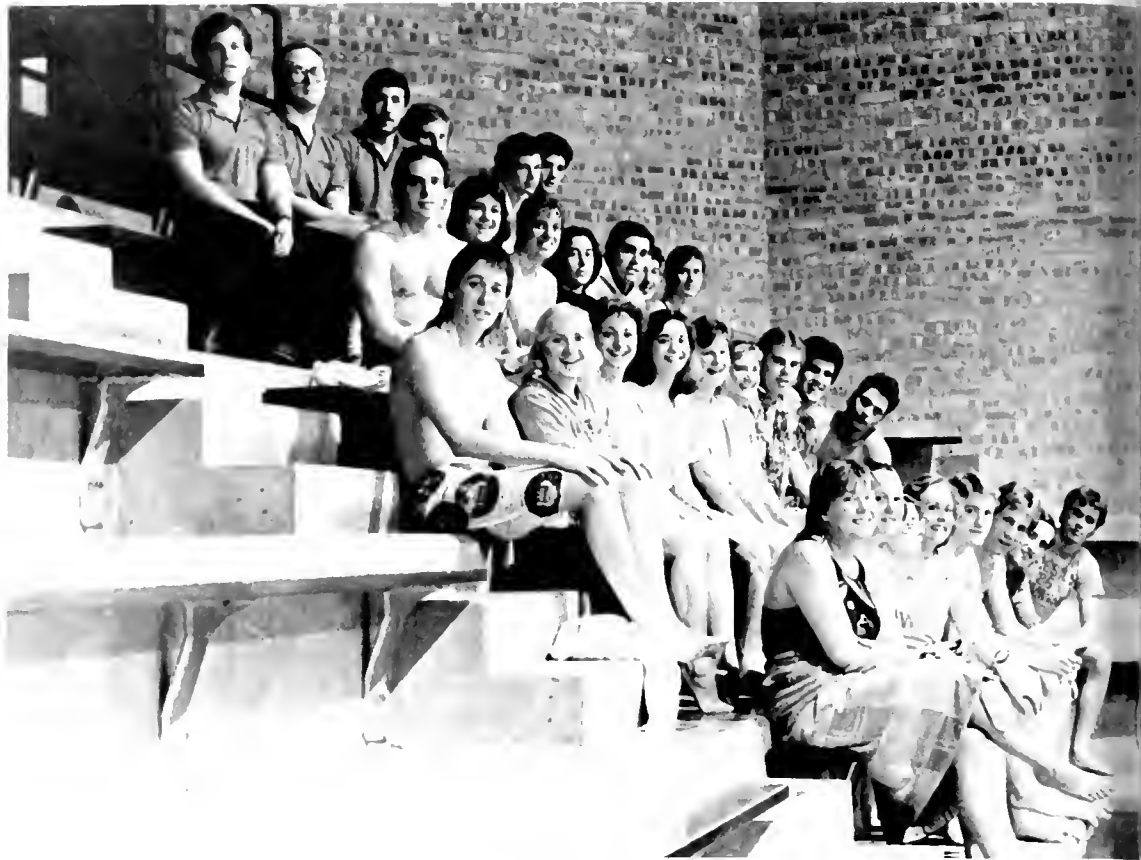

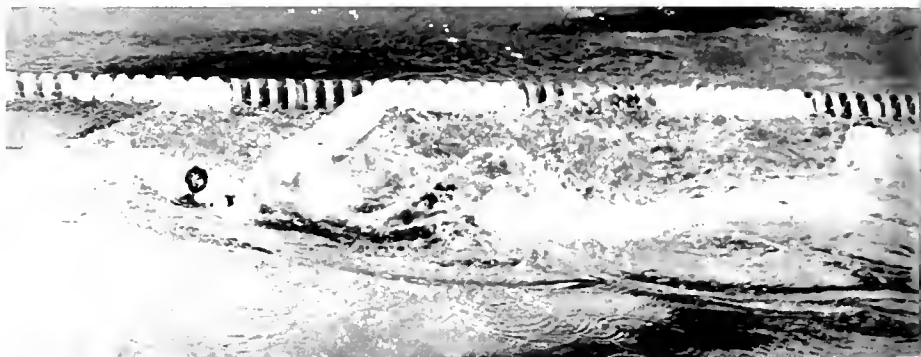


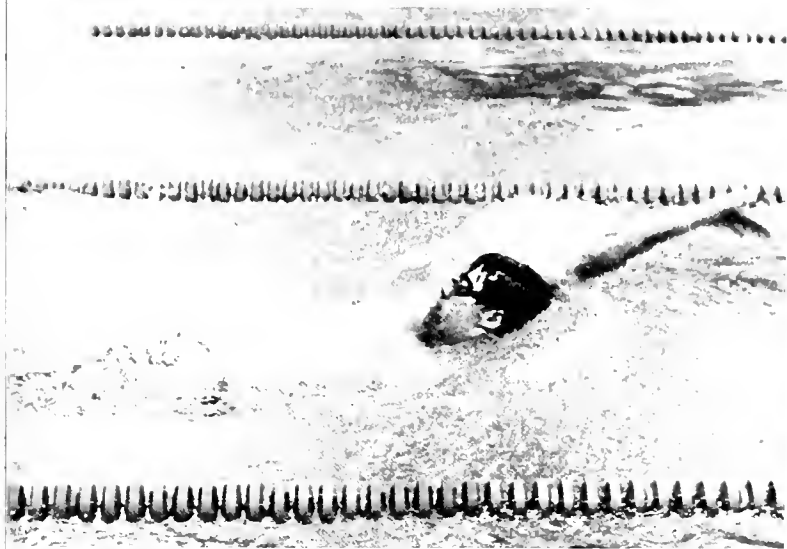
Swimming and Diving

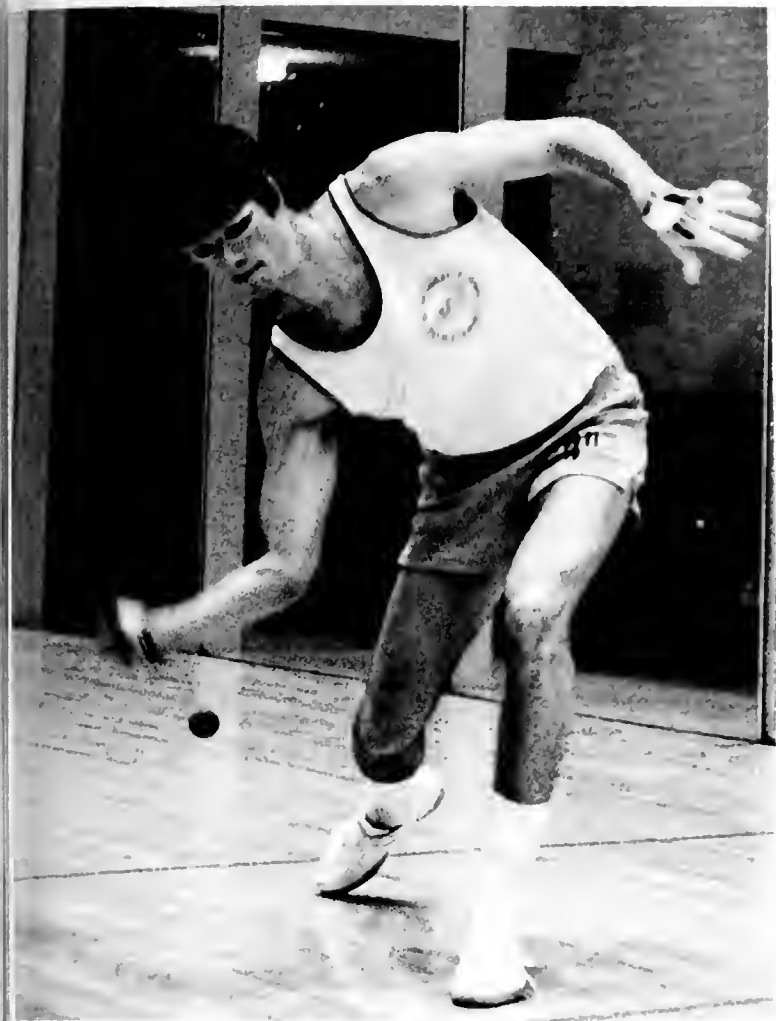
Handball
