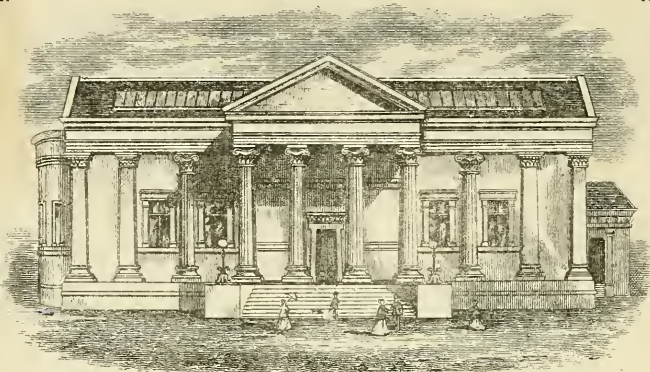



It is under the direction of three members of the Town Council, nine Gentlemen from the town at large, appointed by the Town Council, and a member from the Sessions of the three Parishes in the Town. It is supported by an annual assessment on the Inhabitants. Connected with the establishment is a small Asylum for Lunatics.

The Post Office do not convey packages exceeding 16 ounces in weight inland, except in the case of Parliamentary papers, and other privileged documents. The above are the charges on all letters posted and delivered in the United Kingdom, without regard to distance; and there is no difference in the case of letters posted and delivered within the boundaries of the old Penny Post offices in towns. The rate of postage is affected by the weight entirely, and not by the number of sheets or inclosures.

The postage is uniform, and applies, in whatever part of the United Kingdom the letter is posted, or to whatever colony it is directed to. In the case of East India letters, this rate applies only to those passing by the *Falmouth packets*, and thence overland, and not to those passing in the first place through France. There is no limitation to any particular weight.

SHIP LETTERS.

These include letters passing by private ships, between any place in the United Kingdom, and a place beyond seas, foreign or colonial, including Ceylon, the Mauritius, the Cape, and the East Indies. Owners, Consignees, or Charterers, (resident in the United Kingdom) and the Owner, Consignees, and Shippers of goods on board vessels, inward bound, are entitled to receive their letters from sea postage, to the extent of six ounce. A penalty of ten pounds is in-

curred by parties *falsely* superscribing a letter as Owner, Shipper, Charterer, or Consignee.

NEWSPAPERS.

Stamped British Newspapers pass free from one place to another. When addressed to a person residing within the

limits of the post town, where it is posted, or the suburbs, a postage of 1d is charged on a paper. British and colonial newspapers pass free to and from the colonies by the Falmouth packets.—The privilege includes papers to and from the East Indies by the Mediterranean packets. When the conveyance is by private ship the postage is 1d. All newspapers must be without covers, or in covers open at the sides, and must have no other writing on them but the address, and no enclosure. All newspapers sent out of the kingdom must be posted within seven days after publication. Newspapers may be examined by the officers of Post-office, and if there be any breach of the above regulations, the packet is chargeable with treble the amount of postage which a letter of the same weight would have been liable to. Any person contravening the law may, at the option of the Postmaster-General, be prosecuted as for a misdemeanour.

#### MONEY ORDERS.

The most secure mode of transmitting Bank Notes, Bank Post Bills or Drafts, is to divide each and send the halves by different posts, waiting the acknowledgment of the one half before forwarding the other.

Coin should not be sent by post, and persons having occasion to transmit small sums, will avoid all risk by sending the money through the medium of the Money Order Office, which is carried on by the Post Office on the public account. The charge for such orders will be sixpence on sums of Two Pounds and under, and one shilling and sixpence on sums between Two and Five Pounds. No order will be given for sums beyond this amount. To avoid trouble, it must be understood that the party in whose favour the order is drawn must attend personally to receive it.

REGULATIONS

*Appointed by the Trus'ees of the River Cart, to be observed relative to the Traffic on the said River, and the use of the Harbours and Quays of the same, and the Navigable Cut or Canal at Inchinnan, 10th October, 1837.*

I. On the arrival of any Vessel in the Harbour, the Harbour Master shall immediately ascertain her Name and Tonnage, the kind and quantity of Goods on board, with the



name of the Owner, and enter these particulars in a Book to be kept for the purpose ; and he shall assign to each Vessel such station or berth as he may think proper ; but no Vessel, except when loading or unloading, shall be allowed to retain an inside berth.

II. No Ballast, Sand, Lime, or Rubbish, shall be allowed to be put into or taken out of any Vessel, except under the superintendence or orders of the Harbour Master, who, if any such articles are to be laid upon the Quay, shall give directions for the place of deposit, which shall be at the distance of Three feet at least from the edge of the Quay ; and such articles shall be removed from the Quay, immediately after being laid down by the Owners or others having charge of the same, or at their expense, by the Harbour Master, in case of undue delay. In the removal, Canvass shall be used to prevent any of the said articles from falling into the Water.

III. All Goods put on board or taken from Vessels at the Quay, shall be laid at the distance of Ten feet from the edge of the Quay, and shall be so laid as not to interfere with the loading or unloading of any other Vessels. All Goods to be removed from the Quay within Forty-eight Hours after being deposited; and if not removed within this period, the Harbour Master shall cause the removal to be made at the expense of the Owners.

IV. Vessels taking in or discharging Coals, shall use a Rone, or Canvass, to prevent the Coals from falling into the River.

V. Rafts of Wood are not to exceed Thirty Feet in breadth, and Three Tire of Logs in depth, and shall not be allowed to lie at the Quay, or in the Canal, or at any narrow part of the River, longer than Twenty-four Hours.

VI. All persons contravening these Regulations, or interfering with the Harbour Master in the discharge of his duty, shall be subject to the Penalties provided by the Act, entitled, " An Act to amend an Act for improving the Navigation of the River Cart, and for deepening and extending the Harbour of Paisley in the County of Renfrew."

## DIRECTIONS

*For the Recovery of the apparently Drowned or Dead.*

BY THE PAISLEY HUMANE SOCIETY.

IN APPARENT DEATH three objects are constantly to be kept in view ; 1st, to remove every hurtful cause ; 2d, to regulate the temperature of the body ; 3d, to restore breathing. For these purposes the following directions may be usefully employed, till medical assistance arrive, which ought instantly to be sent for in every case.

*In a Case of Drowning.*

Remove as quickly as possible all wet clothes from the body, dry it well, wrap it in any warm woollen covering, and convey it, with the head and breast moderately raised, to the nearest house, where none but useful assistance ought to be admitted. Let the body now be laid in a warm bed, or upon a warm blanket near a fire, *but not exposed to a strong heat.* Let the lost heat be restored by rubbing the surface with warm cloths or hands, by wrapping a piece of warm flannel or blanketting round the waist, and by applying warm substances, *first and chiefly* to the trunk and head, *next* to the limbs. The most convenient for this purpose are bottles or flasks filled with warm water, and bags or stockings filled with hot grain, chaff, bran, salt, or sand. Large glysters of warm water should also be exhibited. To restore the breathing, let a person firmly compress the nostrils with the fingers of one hand, then apply his mouth across the mouth of the body, and blow forcibly ; let him now lift his head, and the air will escape. This operation is to be commenced as soon as possible, and continued till natural breathing return, or till the case appear hopeless. If water in the mouth and nostrils prevent inflation of the lungs, it ought to be discharged by blowing into the mouth while the nostrils are left open.

*In a Case of Strangling.*

Remove everything tight from the neck and breast, then proceed to inflate the lungs and restore heat, as directed above.

*In a case of Suffocation from Impure Air.*

Admit fresh air, inflate the lungs, and if the body be cold, restore heat as directed above ; if, as sometimes happens, it be warmer than naturally, reduce the heat by dashing the head, neck, and breast smartly with cold water.

*In a case of Apparent Death from Lightning.*

Besides using the same means as for suffocation, give large glysters of salt and water, and use friction over the whole body.

*In a case of Apparent Death from Intense Cold.*

Avoid placing the body *at first* near the fire, use friction rather than apply heat for a time ; in other respects act as for drowning.

*In a case of Excessive Intoxication.*

If the breathing be suspended, act as for drowning, give large gysters of salt and water, endeavour to bring up the contents of the stomach by tickling the throat with feathers ; for the same purpose when the power of swallowing is restored, give copious draughts of warm water.

*To prevent Death from Loss of Blood.*

If from a wound, apply firm pressure to the wound by the finger or a small pad, till medical assistance can be procured. If from a limb, twist a handkerchief tightly round the limb, nearer to the heart than the wound. If fainting has taken place, lay the patient in the recumbent position, apply harts-horn to the nostrils. If the bleeding is from an internal part, apply cold wet cloths, and avoid all stimulants.

A Medical Apparatus lies in the Town's Hospital, another in the House of Recovery.

**PARLIAMENTARY BOUNDARIES.**

By the bill to regulate the boundaries of Scotch towns, returning, or joining to return Members to Parliament, under the new regime, the following are the boundaries assigned to Paisley and Renfrew. They are certainly ample, and will not be complained of as cutting too closely on the outskirts.

**PAISLEY.**

From the summit of Byres Hill, on the north-east of the town, in a straight line to the point near Knockhill, at which the Renfrew road is joined by a road from Glasgow; thence in a straight line to the summit of Knockhill; thence in a straight line to the northern gable of the Moss toll house on the Greenock road; thence in a straight line in the direction of the chimney of Linwood cotton mill to the point at which such straight line cuts the Candren burn; thence up the Candren burn to the point at which the same is joined by the Braidiland burn at the bridge over the same on the Johnstone road; thence up the Braidiland burn to a point which is distant five hundred yards (measured along the Braidiland burn) above the said bridge; thence in a straight line to Meikle-ridge bridge over the Candren burn; thence in a straight line to the point at which the old Neilston road leaves the new Neilston road; thence in a straight line to the summit

of Dykebar hill ; thence in a straight line to a point which is one hundred yards due north-east of the summit of Bathgo hill ; thence in a straight line to the first described.

RENFREW.

From the Milburn bridge over the Pudzeoch burn on the Glasgow road in a straight line to a point up the Pudzeoch burn, which is distant three hundred yards in a straight line from the said bridge ; thence in a straight line to a point on the Greenock road, which is distant two hundred and fifty yards (measured along the Greenock road) from the point at which the same leaves the Paisley road ; thence in a straight line to a point in the river Clyde, which is distant three hundred yards (measured along the river Clyde) below the point at which the same is joined by the Canal ; thence along the river Clyde to the point at which the same is joined by the Canal ; thence along the Canal to the point at which the same is joined by the Pudzeoch burn ; thence along the Pudzeoch burn to the bridge aforesaid.

The market place is spacious and very extensive, affording accommodation rarely to be met with.
