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



#### PREFACE.

This volume contains what I have found up to date of the genealogical records of some descendants of Edward Fuller, who was a passenger on the "Mayflower" in 1620. Some years since I began, for personal use, a card index of records of near relatives, taken from the family Bible and from notes left by my sister, the late Martha A. (Fuller) Dutton. My attention being called to the great number of family genealogies published, and noticing very little in print about Fuller families, I have made more extended researches and present herewith the results concerning one ancestral Fuller and some of his descendants.

The work has been greatly facilitated by use of material obtained of Prof. Homer W. Brainard of Hartford, Ct., whose manuscripts contained much information, some of which had been published in the New York Genealogical and Biographical Record in 1902-3-4.

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Mr. Frederick A. Fuller of Buffalo, N. Y., who published about ten years ago a leaflet on "Mayflower Fuller Genealogy," has kindly permitted extracts from his later manuscripts containing more recent data.

Both of these gentlemen had exchanged genealogical information with the late \*Newton Fuller of New London, Ct., a veteran in the genealogical field. From his manuscripts I was permitted to gather information through the courtesy of his niece, Miss Amelia J. Fuller.

Mr. Francis H. Fuller, now of San Francisco, Cal., kindly loaned his copy of the will of Edward's father, Robert Fuller of Redenhall Parish, Harleston, Norfolk Co., England, and a reproduction of this copy on a reduced scale will be found included in this volume.

Mr. Francis H. Fuller published in the New England Historical Register other results of his researches in England, including the earliest vital records of the Fullers in Redenhall Parish.





#### PREFACE.

The information not obtained from these sources has been gathered by personal examination of comparatively nearby town, city and county records; from obliging correspondents and interested descendants; from many of the published family genealogies; from the published vital records of Massachusetts towns and cities; from town, county and state histories; from reports of historical societies; from cemetery records; and besides the genealogical periodicals already named, from items now and then found in "The Mayflower Descendant," Boston Transcript, Hartford Times, and others.

The aim having been to collect for preservation the family genealogical records, very little space has been given to biographical sketches, as my time has preferably been given to lessening the great number of incomplete records. The descendants are so widely scattered that it seems to me a family association could do the work to better advantage; but whether it should be composed of descendants of Edward, or of Robert of Redenhall, is a question.

It is hoped that the volume may be found as free from errors as the average family genealogy. Thanks are due to Messrs. C. B. Fiske & Co. of Palmer, Mass., for their careful attention to the work of printing; and the James B. McKinnon Photo Engraving Co. of Springfield, Mass., for excellent reproductions of photographs. The work of the binder, Mr. W. J. Eldred of Springfield, will without doubt be done in his usual satisfactory manner.

In conclusion I desire to thank numerous genial correspondents for words of encouragement and kind wishes for the success of this work.

# ILLUSTRATIONS.

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#### **EXPLANATION.**

In the arrangement of the genealogical record, each descendant bearing the surname of Fuller has an individual number and also a family number. The sign  $\ddagger$  placed before the family number of a son indicates that his record is given further on, in his group and generation, placed in order of seniority, by his individual number.

In case of daughters, it has been the intention to give, after the individual and family numbers, at least their individual genealogical records, and in case of marriage the name of husband, and generally the essential information concerning the genealogical record of the allied family for which search might be made. Given names of daughters' children are *italicized*, numbered by Arabic numerals in brackets on the left, and have generation number on the right. Given names of daughters' grandchildren are sometimes mentioned, and have generation number only. The explanation of change from record by generation to record by group and generation is given on page 51.

## ABBREVIATIONS.

Besides the usual commercial abbreviations, the letters, b., m., and d. are, as usual in works of this kind, used to indicate the constantly recurring words, born, married, died, and also s. and dau. for son and daughter.

In some cases the initials, "H. W. B.", "F. A. F.", and "N. F." of names of genealogists, H. W. Brainard, F. A. Fuller and Newton Fuller, have been used instead of the full name.

### FOREWORD.

Edward Fuller, who came to America on the Mayflower in 1620, was one of the Puritans who left England because of religious persecution. In the time of Queen Elizabeth — 1558 to 1603,— the policy was to enforce absolute uniformity in religious belief. The Catholics were persecuted because they could not accept the doctrines of the Anglican Church. The Puritans, because of their persistent attempts to purify the Church and dispense with ceremonies which they regarded as "badges of popery," brought down upon themselves the vengeance of the State. King James I., who succeeded Queen Elizabeth, was also intolerant in religious matters.

In 1607, a band of Puritans attempted to leave England for Holland, but were unsuccessful, as it was believed they were bound for Virginia, emigration there being forbidden by the King unless a Royal License was granted. In 1608 they succeeded in escaping to Amsterdam, and a year later settled in Leyden, where they remained until 1620, when they decided to emigrate to America. About Aug. 1, 1620, they sailed from Delfthaven, Holland, on the Speedwell, for Southampton, England, where they joined the Mayflower, and Aug. 15, 1620, the two vessels started on their long voyage across the Atlantic, but the Speedwell proving unseaworthy, returned, leaving the Mayflower to proceed on the voyage alone.

It seems quite probable that Edward Fuller never lived in Holland, since Mr. Dexter, after years of exhaustive research there among the records, found no trace of him. (See Dexter's "The England and Holland of the Pilgrims.") That Edward remained in England is rendered more probable from the language of the will of Robert his father, made in 1614 and given herewith, leaving Edward tenements and houses, with writings concerning the same, while to Samuel, then in Holland, only money was left. The more reasonable conclusion therefore is, that Edward was among those who joined the Pilgrims upon their arrival at Southampton.







In 1896 Mr. Charles Candler, now of London, England, published a volume of "Notes on the Parish of Redenhall with Harleston, In the County of Norfolk. Compiled Chiefly from the Records in the Town Chest," in which there is a copy of a list of subscribers, in 1588, for the sixth bell in the Redenhall Chimes, and among the names on the list is that of Robert Fuller, "bocher." It appears that Redenhall Church, views of the exterior and interior of which are here given, has a famous chime of eight bells which are described in Candler's volume.

Writing of the building he says, "Redenhall is a typical example of the class of almost pure Perpendicular churches with which Norfolk and Suffolk abound. The chief feature is the tower which can be matched by very few in the same style." Writing of its age, "The oldest portion of the existing Church was built in 1319." Excavations show that the present edifice stands upon the site of an older structure.

Redenhall Parish, as described by Candler, "is about 4 miles long by 1 1-4 miles wide. At present, practically the whole parish is enclosed and cultivated. The Waveney River is close at hand and its curves and reaches, bordered by timbered meadows, osier grounds and reed beds, backed by bluffs of gravel, possess a peculiar beauty scarcely matched by any stream in these counties."

The name Redenhall is from the name Rada, which was the name of the owner of a tract of about 700 acres, as given in the Doomsday Book, which is a record of a survey of the lands of the entire kingdom, made about the year 1085, with an estimate of their value, and an enumeration of the various classes of landholders. This record indicates that Rada had about forty subordinate tenants, or tillers of the soil. Three hundred years ago then, the Pilgrims reached Holland; about 600 years ago Redenhall Church was begun, and about 900 years ago "Rada held Redenhall."

Concerning a Fuller "Coat of-Arms"; I have seen several cuts all of the same general appearance as the one given herewith, and in regard to its use quote from an article by Henry StoddardRuggles of Wakefield, Mass., published in the N. Y. Genealogical and Biographical Record for 1903. He cites from an English writer that, "Arms are borne by four titles, viz: Inheritance, grant. transfer and assumption;" and from Edward S. Holden, "In Germany and Austria it is lawful for any citizen to assume a coat-of-arms. It is



In 1935 and again in 1957 while my sister and her husband, a Justice of the Supreme Court, were in the Courts of London, my sister, a former history teacher, and her husband spent months in Oxford University and in the London University -Libraries in the Public Record Office of Somerset House. Several professors in Oxford interested in the research concerping the real status of the Pilgrims helped us. Places of learning like Oxford and Cambridge were the centers of the Puritan movement, and they were seeking political freedom as well as religious freedom. It is not realized by laynen and teachers that the Mayflower Compact was the first complete instrument of government and the basis for our Constitution and ranks in the history of the Anglo-Saxon people with the Magna Carta. Great jurists have said that the Mayflower: Compact could only have been written by a man trained in the the second second second law. ? - --

In 1920 William H. Fuller, the author of Fuller Cencelogies, was anxious that someone continue the research and rewrite and correct some of the history of the family. From our research I believe that Nicholas Fuller of Stepney was the father of Edward, Samuel and Susanna Fuller White (wife of William White and later wife of Governor Vinslow). W. H. Fuller gave ms copies of his book and urged ms to write a genealogy. He made an unsuccessful search of the records for a will, a copy of which had been sent to him from a Frances Fuller in California, which William published in his genealogy, but since it was only a copy, he could find no proof for its authenticity. Research into the records of the library of one of the ancient Inns of Court, Gray's Inn, shows Nicholas Fuller was admitted as a Barrister in 1567, and became treasurer of Gray's Inn in 1591; and in 1601 was a member of Parliament for St. Mawes in Cornwall. The records show that his son Edward was also trained in the law and his son Samuel a doctor. He had twins, Susanna and Nicholas. In 1607 Nicholas Fuller was a prisoner in the Tower of London. He had published a brief on behalf of two clients, the title page of which reads: "The argument of Master Nicholas Fuller in the case of Thomas Ladd and Richard Mansell Ladd, his client. Whereas it was plainly proved that the Ecclesiastical Commissioners have no power by virtue of their Commission to imprison, or to by the oath, to fine any of His Majesty's subjects." "Thomas Ladd, a merchant of Yarmouth, was brought before the Chancellor of Ipswish for a supposed conventicle because he the Sabbath days, after the sermon and so adjourning to the house of Mr. Jacklee in Yarmouth, joined with him in repeating the substance of the sermon." (See Chronicles of Old Congregational Church Great Yarmouth, pr. 8, 9, 27.) For his brave defense of these men Nicholas Fuller was to suffer. In the letters of John Chamberlain

however forbidden to assume a coat already in use by another family." Mr. Ruggles adds: "There is not even this restriction in England. Regarding Arms in America, it must be very clear that in Colonial days, and at the present, every one has been strictly within his lawful right who has displayed these harmless evidences of vanity."

# EDWARD' FULLER LINE.

.1 EDWARD<sup>1</sup> FULLER, baptized Sept. 4, 1575, in the parish of Redenhall, County of Norfolk, England, was son of Robert Fuller, butcher.

No trace of him has been found to indicate that he was with the other Pilgrims in Holland, and it appears probable that he joined the others on the arrival of the Speedwell in Southampton, England, where the Mayflower was awaiting them.

His name appears in the following "Compact," which was drawn up in the cabin of the Mayflower just previous to the landing at Cape Cod in November, 1620:

In the name of God. Amen. We whose names are vnderwritten the loyall Subjects of our soveraigne Lord King James, by the grace of God of Great Britaine, France, and Ireland King. Defender of the Faith, &c.

Having vnder-taken for the glory of God, and advancement of the Christian Faith, and honour of our King and Countrey, a Voyage to plant the first Colony in the Northerne parts of Virginia, doe by these presents solemnly & mutually in the presence of God and one another, covenant, and combine ourselves together into a civill body politike, for our better ordering and preservation, and furtherance of the ends aforesaid; and by vertue hereof to enact, to constitute, and frame such just and equall Lawes, Ordinances, acts, constitutions, offices from time to tiem, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the Colony: vnto which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witness whereof we have here-vnder subscribed our names, Cape Cod 11 of November (Nov. 21), in the yeare of the raigne of our soveraigne Lora King Lames of England, France, and Ireland 18, and of Scotland 54. Anno  $\Gamma^{\sim}$  ino 1620.

The name of the wife of Edward<sup>1</sup> Fuller, though sometimes given as Ann, is really wholly unknown.

Governor Bradford simply says that "Edward Fuller and his wife died soon after they came on shore." Edward died at Plymouth, between Jan. 11 and April 10, 1621 — and his wife died early in 1621, after Jan. 11th.

His only child was Samuel<sup>2</sup>, who came with his father on the Mayflower.

2. SAMUEL<sup>2</sup> FULLER, (*Edward*<sup>1</sup>), b. about 1612, at some place in England not yet found, no record of his birth or baptism having been discovered; d. Oct. 31,-Nov. 10, 1683, at Barnstable, Mass.; m. at Mr. Cudworth's house in Scituate by Capt. Miles Standish, nagistrate, "on ye fourthe daye of ye weeke", April 8 – 18, 1635, ane Lathrop, dau. of Rev. John Lathrop of Scituate and (after 1639) Barnstable, bipt. Sept. 29, 1614, at Edgerly, Co. of Kent, England; d. subsecuent to 1658 and before 1683, but the exact date is not found.

Samuel Fuller grew up under the care of his uncle, Dr. Samuel Fuller, at Plymouth. He had three acces at the division of lands in 1623, receiving, it is thought, those of his father and mother, and one for himself. If this theory is correct he was at least sixteen years of age at the time, and his birth occurred as early as 1608, instead of 1612 as we have conjectured above. It is not quite certain however that he was old enough to work this land alone.

Gov. Bradford's words about this matter are as follows: "All this whille no supply was heard of, neither knew they when they might expecte any. So they begane to thinke how they might raise as much come as they could, and obtaine a beter crope than they had done, that they might not still languish in miserie. At length, after much debate of things, the Govr (with ye advise of ye cheefest among them) gave way that they should set corne every man for his owne perticuler, and in that regard trust to themselves; in all other things to goe on in ye general way (as a joint-stock company) as before. And so assigned to every family a parcell of land, according to the proportion of their number for that end, only for present use (but made no devission for inheritance), and ranged all boys and youth under some familie. This had very good success." Bradford's History of "Plimouth Plantation", ed. Mass. p. 162. The land assigned to him was on the South side of the town brook; "to the Woodward" and included what is now Watson's Hill. His neighbors were John Howland, Stephen Hopkins, Edward Winslow (?) Gilbert Winslow, and the Indian Hobomok.

On June 1, 1627 at a town-meeting, the inhabitants were divided into twelve groups for the purpose of dividing the cattle then owned in the Colony. "The eighth lot fell to Samuel Fuller (the Doctor) and his company; joined to him his wife Bridget Fuller, Samuel Fuller, Jr., Peter Browne, Martha Browne, Mary Browne, John Ford, Martha Ford, Anthony Annable, Jane Annable, Sarah Annable, Hannah Annable, Damans Hopkins. To this lot fell a red heifer, came of the cow which belongeth to the poor of the Colony, and is of that consideration, viz.: these persons nominated to have half the increase; the other half with the old stock, to remain for the use of the poor."

He is mentioned in his uncle's will in 1633 as follows: "It. my will is that my Cozen (nephew) Samuell goe freely away with his stock of Cattle and Swine w<sup>th</sup>out any further recconing w<sup>ch</sup> swine are the halfe of six sowes, six hogges, one boare & four shotes. Also one Cow & one heyfer." "It. my will is that in case my sonne Samyell and other my children die before such time as they are fitt to enter upon my land for inheritance that then my kinsman Sam. ffuller now in the howse with me enjoy w'soever lands I am now possessed of except my dwelling howse at town or whatsoever shall be due to me or them." "It. I give to him my Rufflet Cloake &

my stuffe sute I now weare." The date of this will is July 30, 1633 and within three months of that date the good doctor had been laid to rest. As the doctor's children survived, Samuel<sup>2</sup> received none of the lands, and soon, apparently, started out with the cattle and swine to seek a home. The whole transaction seems clearly to show that he had reached man's estate, being at least 21, and perhaps as much as 25 years of age at the time. He became a freeman of the Colony in 1634, and settled in the near by town of Scituate, where on April 8-18, 1635, as before stated, he married Jane, daughter of Rev. John Lathrop, the pastor of the Scituate church. Nov. 7, 1636 he joined the church of Scituate, having a letter of dismission from the church of Plymouth, of which he had been a member. He built in 1636 the fifteenth house in Scituate, on Greenfield Street, the first lot abutting on Kent Street. He had twenty acres of land on the east of Bellhouse Neck in that town, probably a grant from the town. The kind of house these early settlers built is worthy of note. Mr. Lathrop calls them "small plaine pallizadse Houses." The walls were made of poles filled between with stones and clay, the roof thatched, the chimney to the mantle of rough stone, and above of cob-work, the windows of oiled paper, and the floors of hand sawed planks. Mr. Lathrop who had been accustomed to life in Christ's College, Cambridge, and to a generous life in England, truly says that the dwellings in Scituate were "meane". Elsewhere he calls these structures booths, and says they were open and cold, and in winter a high piled fire had constantly to be kept burning. All the houses in the village were alike,-- there was no opening for pride to claim supremacy. In June and July 1639 the Rev. Mr. Lathrop and many of the members of his church removed and founded the town of Barnstable, probably at the time the most easterly settlement on Cape Cod. If Samuel Fuller and his young family did not at once follow him thither, he did so in a few years. Otis, following the church records of Barnstable, thinks that he was there as early as 1641, basing his view on the fact that the Barnstable church record contains the baptism of his daughter Sarah on August 1, 1641, and of Mary on June 16, 1644. Otis says further that it does not appear that he was an inhabitant of the town till after January first, 1644. Now it is quite possible that the baptismal record is correct, and that Samuel Fuller did not settle in Barnstable until 1650. There being no pastor at Scituate, it is quite likely that

the two children were carried to Barnstable, or that the Rev. Mr. Lathrop visited Scituate, for their baptism. The record was little more than the minister's private diary, and all that it can certify to is the fact the children were baptised by him. The place might be anywhere he might be, if not within the parish of another settled pastor. The reasons for thinking that Samuel Fuller settled in Barnstable as late as 1650 are two.

In the second volume of Plymouth Colony deeds, folio 1. ( See Mayflower Descendant, Vol. 1. April 1899, p. 91) is a deed which begins as follows: "To all Christian people to whom this prsent writing shall com Samuel ffuller of Scituate in the government of New Plymouth in New England in america sendeth greeting :" He then proceeds to convey to "Peter Collymore of Scittuate" "one dwelling house and a barne and Cowhouse with sixteene acars of upland more or less bounded on the west with the land of Mr William Varssall, on the south with the land of Resolved White, on the north with the hieway by the herring brook; and on the last with the mersh; as allsoe two peells of mersh land contoining twelve acars, ------ with all and severall the appurtenances therunto belonging or any way apperteining." This deed was signed and sealed March 25, 1650, the first day of the year according to the calendar then in use, equivalent to April 4, 1650, N. S. Samuel Fuller signed his name to this deed and there is appended the consent of his wife, as follows: "The 16th (26th N. S.) of May 1650 Jane ffuller the wife of Samyel ffuller did com before mee Timothy hatherley asistant to the Governor of New Plym: in New England and did freely acknowlidg her willingness of the within Mencioned sale and did freely Resigne up her Right to Peeter Collymore.

This is perhaps the only mention to be found of Samuel Fuller's wife Jane *after* her marriage. Mr. Hatherley was never a resident of Barnstable, and everything seems to show that the Fullers were still in Scituate at this date, May 16-26, 1650.

The other reason is that the first recorded birth of Samuel's children occurs on the Barnstable records, in the birth of the child Thomas on May 18, 1651. The earliest records of Scituate are lost.

Captain Matthew Fuller, Samuel's cousin, appears to have removed from Plymouth at about the same time, and together they bought of Secunke, an Indian, Scorton or Sandy Neck, that is, so much of it as lies within the town of Barnstable. The arable land in the purchase was set off to the Fullers, the remainder, including the meadows, was reserved as town commons, and afterward divided.

Samuel Fuller also bought meadow of his cousin Matthew that was Major John Freeman's and meadow of Samuel House, and land on Scorton Hill. He lived in the northwest angle of the town in a secluded spot, where few had occasion to pass. He had been a constable at Scituate in 1641, and his name appears a few times as juryman, or committee to settle difficulties with the Indians. He was the only one of the passengers of the Mayflower who settled permanently at Barnstable, and one of the late survivors of that immortal company. He was buried, if not on his own estate, in the ancient burial place at Lothrop's Hill in Barnstable, near the site of the first Meeting House. No gravestone now exists.

# The Will and Inventory of Samuel<sup>2</sup> Fuller (Edward<sup>1</sup>).

Recorded in Plymouth Colony Wills and Inventories, Volume IV, Part II, pages 138 and 139. (Transcribed by George Ernest Bowman, and first published in the Mayflower Descendant, Vol. II. p. 237)

(p. 138) "The last Will and Testament of Samuel ffuller of Barnstable Late Deceased Exhibited to the Court held att Plymouth fift of June 1684 on the oath of Capt: Josepth Laythorp and Mr Samuel Allin as followeth The nine and twentyeth Day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred eighty and three; I Samuel ffuller senir of the Towne of Barnstable in the Govrment of New Plymouth being ancient (aged) and very weake in body but of good and Compitent memory thankes be unto allmighty God; and Calling to remembrance the uncertaine state of this transitory life and that all fflesh must yeild unto Death when it shall please God to Call, Doe make ordaine and & Constitute & Declare this my last will and Testament in Manor and form following:

Revoking and Anulling by these presents all and every Testament and Testaments will and wills heertofore by mee made and declared either by word or wrighting; and this to be taken onely for my last will and Testament and none other; and first I give and Comitt my soule unto almighty God my Saviour in whom I trust and beleive assuredly to be saved; and my body to

the earth; from whence it was taken, to be buried in such Decent and Christian manor as to my executors heerafter Named shalbe thought meet and Convenient; and Now for the Settleing of my temporall estate and such goods Cattles and Debts as it hath pleased god farr above my Deserts to bestow upon mee; I Doe order Give and Dispose the same in Manor and forme following; That is to say first I will that all those Debts and Dutyes as I owe in right or Conscience to any manor of prson or prsons whatsoever shalbe well and truely Contended and payed or ordained to be payed within Convenient time after my Decease by my executors hereafter named:

Item I Give and bequeath unto my eldest son Samuell ffuller two prsells of Marsh one of them I bought of Mr Samuell house Deceased and the other I bought of Captaine Matthew ffuller Deceased that he had of Mr John ffreeman;

Item I give and bequeath to my son John ffuller four acrees of Marsh and one halfe which I bought of Peter Blossome

Item I give and bequeath that prsell of Marsh that lyes by Ralph Jones, his Marsh, To my two sones Samuell ffuller and John ffuller to be equally Devided betwist and one prsell of Marsh that lyeth on this side Scoton ffeildes to be Devided as abovesaid and and the angle Lotts of Marsh att Scoton point to be equally Devided between them alsoe the Eelcreik Lott of Marsh to be alike Devided as above specifyed and the Lott of Marsh att Sandy neck upon the same accoumpt alsoe; and all my upland upon Scoton neck to be equally Devided betwist them as the other above Mensioned.

Item I give to my son Samuell ffuller all my upland that lyeth above my uppersmost ffield and to range quite Crosse my land upon one and the same lyne as the uppermost ffence as my upmost feild now ranges, but alwaies to allow Cart wayes to the Comons into the Comons for his brother John ffuller his heires and assignes

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John fuller my now Dwellinghouse orchyard and all out housing and all the rest of my Upland wherever it dothe lye, but alwaies to allow a Cart way into the meddowes for his brother Samuell ffuller his heires and assignes.

Item I Give and bequeath to my son John ffuller one three yeer old horse runing in the woods;

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Samuell ffuller two mares runing in the woods;

Item I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Tayler five pound in Mony and two Cowes;

Item I Give unto my Daughter hannah Bonham four pounds in Money and two Cowes;

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Williams four pound in Money and two Cowes

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Crowe four pounds in Mony and two Cowes

Item I Give and bequeath to my two sons Samuell ffuller and John ffuller all the rest of my Neat Cattle to be Devided To my son Samuell one third prte; and to my son John ffuller the other two third prtes therof; and all my sheep to be equally Devided betwixt them;

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Samuell ffyller ten pounds in money which hee now owes to me and hath now hath it alredy; and all the rest of my estate in what kind soever it be I Give and bequeath to my two sones Samuell ffuller and John ffuller; to be devided to my son Samuell ffuller one third prte therof and to my son John fuller the other two third prtes therof, and by these presents make ordaine & Declare the above said Samuell and John ffuller the executors of this my last Will and Testament; In Witness wherof I the said Samuell ffuller have heerunto sett my hand and seal the Date above written;

There is no record of his family on the Barnstable records, and but little is known of him. He probably lived on a portion of his father's estate. An inventory of his estate was taken at Barnstable, Dec. 28, 1691, amounting to  $\pounds 98.$  17. 00. From this it appears that he had been some time deceased, and that his widow had recently died, for her estate was settled on the 30th of the same month. An East Haddam deed of 1714 in which Elizabeth<sup>3</sup> (Fuller), widow of Moses Rowley, Senior, calls John Fuller her son, is additional evidence. Otis is wholly in error. Mehitable Rowley was born in Barnstable, Mass., Jan. 11, 1660-61, and d. in East Haddam about 1732. Mehitabel, wife of "Little John" Fuller, was admitted to the church in Barnstable Oct. 30, 1688, and four of her children were baptised there soon after. "Sometime in 1704, Elizabeth, wife of John Fuller from Barnstable," was admitted to the East Haddam church. The latter record was made from the minister's recollection, some time after the event, and is in error as to the name Elizabeth. There is no evidence that John Fuller had a second wife Elizabeth, in fact the evidence is quite to the contrary.

John<sup>3</sup> Fuller was called "Little John" to distinguish him from his cousin, Dr. John<sup>3</sup> Fuller. He lived on his father's estate at Scorton Neck until 1694, when he removed to East Haddam. Here he seems to have prospered in worldly estate. About 1721 he conveyed to each of his seven sons ample lands and farming inaplements.

His will — on file at Hartford — has never been printed before to my knowledge. It is not in his own hand, and the signature is very poor, showing extreme age or infirmity.

#### THIRD GENERATION.

I, John Fuller, Senr of the township of Haddam, County of Hartford, upon the east side of the Great River, by the great goodness of God, retaining my reason, yet being crazy and infirm in body and not knowing the day of my death, have thought it my duty, and do by this my last will and testament, dispose of what temporal estate God has graciously given me as follows: viz: first of all I commit my body to the dust to be decently buried, and my soul to Jesus Christ in hope of eternal life.

Imprimis: I give and bequeath to my dear and loving wife, one cow, such as the shall chuse, eight sheep, four pounds in money, the bed she lies on, one room in my dwelling house, and so much interest in the plow land and grass land of my home lot as may be necessary for her comfortable support during her widdowhood, and I do appoint my son Thomas to take care of the creatures from year to year, and I do appoint my sons Joseph and Benjamin each to give her a day's mowing, in a year yearly, and my sons Shubael and John to do her weaving in same proportion between them yearly.

, Item, I give to my oldest son Thomas besides what I have already given him by deed of gift, twenty pounds of my right or interest in the Iron Ware belonging to the field, but not what is in or for the house.

Item: I give to my son Samuel besides what I have already confirmed to him by deed of gift, viz: twenty pounds of my right or interest in the common or undivided land, and one half of my meadow lot called by the name of the little pine meadow, together with sundry other valuable things he has already had of me.

Item: I give to my son Shubael, etc. (Identical with the bequest to Samuel).

Item: I give to my son Edward, six pound in money, that is to say, in case he never finds his lost money, yet the demands upon him from me upon the account of the fat cattle he bought of me late shall be abated to the value of six pound, because he hath a deed of gift and sundry other things from me.

Item: I give to my son John, beside the deed of gift, one half of my first division meadow lot.

Item: I give to my son Joseph, beside the deed of gift twenty pounds of my interest in the common and undivided land, and one half of the little pine meadow.

Item: I give to my son Benjamin, beside the deed of gift, twenty pounds of my interest in the common land and one half of my first divison meadow lot.

Item: I give to my daughter Thankful what she has had already in brass, pewter, etc.

Item: I give to my daughter Elizabeth sundry valuables she has already received.

Item: I give to my daughter Mehitabel what she has already received, a coverlet and iron pot, also the bed I lie on after my and my wife's decease.

Item: I give to my wife my mare and to my son Thomas a steer coming

two years old. I appoint my sons Thomas and John to be the executors of this my will, and direct them to divide any overplus of my estate between my three daughters.

Edward Fuller removed from East Haddam to Colchester in 1719. He was not prosperous; met with pecuniary losses and left an insolvent estate, the personal property appearing in the inventory at £54.10.6. The births of his children are recorded in Colchester; their baptisms at East Haddam.

The probate records at Hartford show that Edward<sup>4</sup> Fuller married twice, and the will of James Bates Sr. of Haddam, east side, dated Dec. 4, 1729, found in the same records, mentions "my granddaughter Elizabeth Fuller, who is to receive but  $\pounds 20$  from my estate, since her mother in her lifetime had sundry things out of my estate." The distribution Nov. 15, 1732, shows that Elizabeth Fuller received three acres of swamp east of Salmon River, one black pied heifer, one ox, three sheets as her portion of  $\pounds 20$ .

Deacon Joseph Fuller probably left no will. He made several deeds of gifts to his sons about 1757-1760, as shown on Kent land records.

Deacon Joseph Fuller and his wife Lydia were buried at North Kent. The inscriptions on their monuments read as follows:

> "In memory of Deacon Joseph Fuller who died July ye 19th 1775 aged 75." "In memory of Mrs. Lydia wife to Deacon Joseph Fuller died Nov. ye 2d 1763 in ye 66 year of her age."

A deed, (Colchester land records, Vol. x., p. 11) dated Jan. 3, 1777, speaks of the heirs of Licut. David Day of Colchester, deceased, being brothers and sisters living chiefly in Kent, in the County of Litchfield and State of Connecticut, who sell land set out by distribution from the estate of said David Day, and is signed by Jeremiah Fuller, Joseph Fuller, Zachariah Fuller, Abraham Fuller, Jacob Fuller, Samuel Bates and Rachel his wife, Asa Parish and Mindwell his wife, and Lydia Hatch.

The East Haddam Probate Records, Vol. vii., p. 431, (preserved at Colchester) mentions the heirs of Lieut. David Day, among whom are "the heirs of Lydia Fuller." These, with the inscriptions, prove that Lydia Day was the mother of Joseph Fuller's children. É

# EXPLANATION.

In tracing the genealogy of the descendants of Edward Fuller, I find all of the sons of the first four generations accounted for, with but one or two exceptions.

The incompleteness of the genealogical history of the generations following is explained in various ways. Inadequate records of homes and parents of enlisted soldiers of the wars of the Revolution and 1812; confusion arising from similar given names and uncertainty as to fate of prisoners render complete records for these periods impossible. This last is illustrated in the case of the prisoners on British prison ships as given in the following letter from the Secretary of the Society of "Old Brooklynites," in response to a request for information.

# Dear Sir:

Replying to yours of October 6th, I find among the names of the eight thousand prisoners who perished on the British Prison Ship Jersey during the Revolutionary war the names of Thadeus Fuller, James Fuller, Benjamin Fuller and Thomas Fuller. The last named I find mentioned twice in the list. I have no means of knowing, however, whether it is an error, or whether there were two named Thomas Fuller.

The publication issued by our Society in 1888 is not for sale, and their numbers have grown so scarce that much to my regret I do not feel that I can supply you with one. Quoting from the publication referred to I find, "no record of the names of any of the prisoners of the prison ships Scorpion, John, Strombolo, Falmouth, Hunter, Prince of Wales and Transport can be found, though their log books make very frequent mention of prisoners having been received on board."

As you are studying up the genealogy of this family probably you

will be interested in the following, from one of our Revolutionary poets, who thus describes the manner in which the remains of these martyrs were disposed of:

> "Each day at least six carcasses we bore, And scratched their graves along the sandy shore; By feeble hands the shallow graves were made, No stone memoria' o'er the corpses laid; In barren sands and far from home they lie, No friend to shed a tear when passing by; O'er the mean tombs insulting Britons tread, Spurn at the sand and curse the rebel dead."

Other obstacles to genealogical researches are incomplete town records, or their loss by fire or otherwise; removals of families, perhaps several times repeated, to localities which have been forgotten in the lapse of time; and the indifference or neglect of descendants in answering letters of inquiry.

There were 30 families to begin the 5th generation, and I have concluded, from this point forward, to place the descendants of the heads of each of these 30 families in a group by themselves, starting each group with its own individual numbering, but continuing the numbering by generations.



Elijah Fuller was educated for the sea, but one trip with consequent seasickness turned him in another direction. He served an apprenticeship of several years with a merchant and he was a merchant for many years. He was a fine mathematician. He was a military man. For many years he was captain of a company and was in command at the time of the war of 1812, but was not called into active service. In 1818 he was a member of the New Hampshire Legislature. It was during this session that the bill passed separating Church and State in New Hampshire. Just before the vote was taken, Elijah's old minister, Mr. Howe, of Surry, N. H., called on him and with tears in his eyes besought him not to vote to starve the ministers. He replied that the ministers must look to voluntary contributions for support.

His first seven children were born in Surry, New Hampshire. He moved to Wellsboro, Tioga Co., Pennsylvania, about 1823. The blood of Governor William Bradford and Edward Fuller were united in the marriage of Elijah Fuller and Matilda Newcomb. Jerusha Bradford, daughter of Thomas Bradford, son of Major William Bradford, son of Governor William Bradford, m. Hezekiah Newcomb (4). Matilda Newcomb was a lineal descendant of this union. David Fuller removed in boyhood from Colchester to Ellington

parish, then in the town of Windsor, and continued to live there until about the time of his marriage, when he settled upon the farm which had belonged to Mrs. Fuller's first husband. This farm was purchased from Mrs. Fuller's heirs by her son, Jabez<sup>7</sup> Fuller, and has remained in the Fuller family until recently (1896).

David Fuller was not an owner of real estate in East Haddam, but Windsor deeds show him to have been well provided with lands in that town. One deed is especially important. It reads: "Young Fuller of Windsor, for the love and good will that I have to my son David Fuller, formerly of Windsor, aforesaid, now living in East Haddam, two pieces of land in the parish of Ellington, one half my dwelling house and barn." David Fuller remained in East Haddam.

He was appointed April 30, 1759, guardian to Diademia and Beulah Fuller, his wife's children by her first husband.

The births of the children of David and Lois Fuller are not recorded in the East Haddam town records, but we have their baptisms from the church records as follows:

In 1758 he graduated from Yale College, receiving the degree of A. M. in 1762. He was licensed to preach by the Hartford South Association Feb. 5, 1760, when he is described as "of Windsor, now residing at Andover." Oct. 28, 1762, he married Hannah Weld, the seventh daughter of fifteen children of the Rev. Habijah (Harvard 1723) and Mary (Fox) Weld of Attleborough, Mass., and sister of the wife of Rev. Oliver Noble (Yale 1757), pastor of the church at Coventry, Ct. Caleb Fuller seems never to have been a settled pastor, though doubtless he often preached as a supply, since manuscript sermons of his are now in possession of his descendants. From 1770 to 1777 he resided in East Windsor, Ct., removing thence to Middletown, Ct., and from Middletown in 1790 to Hanover, N. H., perhaps because he desired to educate his son at Dartmouth College. At Hanover he was deacon of the college church. He was a man of earnest piety, benevolence and kindly heart, affable, quiet and unostentatious, perfect in integrity, an adviser of the whole community.



About 1747 he exchanged land with Samuel Calkins of Hebron, and I supposed moved there, but I find no further trace of him. It is said that he was the first Fuller who settled in Hebron, about 1733. This is not impossible, but I think it must have been later than 1735.

In a muster roll of Provincial troops of New York, Dutchess County, 1758, is the name of Cornelius Fuller, aged 19, b. in Con-.. necticut. He was perhaps son of Cornelius<sup>5</sup> Fuller.

In the Field Book of Survey of Lot No. 6, in the town of Carmel, N. Y., April 12, 1762, are found among other names: Robert Fuller, Amos Fuller and Cornelius Fuller. The first two are descendants of Robert Fuller of Salem and Rehoboth, Mass., in the line of his son Benjamin, five or six sons of whom settled in Lebanon or Hebron, Connecticut, and thence removed to the northwestern part of Connecticut, and finally over the line into the State of New York. 1755-6 the following members of the western Society of Philippi, (Town of Carmel, N. Y.), signed a call for Mr. Ebenezer Knibloe as pastor: Shubael Rowley, Eleazer Hamlin (from Barnstable, Mass.), Matthew Rowlee, Benj. Howland, Edward Carver, Amos Fuller, Cornelius Fuller, John Kelly, Elisha Kellogg, John White.

The above shows that Cornelius<sup>5</sup> removed to Carmel, now Fredericksboro, N. Y., perhaps stopping at some Connecticut town meanwhile, and incidentally shows where some of the Rowleys went. Probably further search thereabout would disclose their descendants. (H. W. Brainard.)

Mr. F. A. Fuller writes March 4, 1908, that he recently found the following in regard to a Cornelius Fuller in the "History of Greene Co., N. Y.," published by J. B. Beers & Co., N. Y., 1884 :

WINDHAM, GREENE CO., N. Y.

Cornelius Fuller emigrated from Dutchess Co., N. Y., as early as 1800. He lived in Big Hollow at what is now Hensonville, on the farm now owned by Linus Peck. He afterwards removed to what was known as Fuller's Tavern, on the old turnpike. The house was built in 1812, the same summer as Mr. Fuller went to the war, now the residence of John Holcomb. He lived here more than 50 years, and his family consisted of eight sons and eight daughters, all of whom lived to be married. His wife died from the effects of a fall, breaking her thigh. Mr. Fuller kept a hotel at a time when the

turnpike was much traveled, and made money rapidly. He was a genial, affable, kind and benevolent man. Barney Fuller, son of Major Cornelius, is a resident of Mitchell Hollow. He was born at Hensonville, 1809. A Mr. DeWitt purchased from Mr. Fuller his first place, the present Linus Peck place. None of his family are now in this vicinity.

Perhaps this is a son of Cornelius<sup>5</sup>. Carmel and Phillipi, Putnam Co., were formerly in Dutchess Co. up to 1800. The records of Putnam Co. were burned at Brewsters some years ago, which accounts for lack of information.

Mr. F. A. Fuller says he also at one time came across some books called "Merchants of N. Y.," published 1865, from letters in a N. Y. paper. One article was claimed to be the diary of a foreign commercial man, copied from "Freeman's N. Y. Almanac 1767," who traveled on horseback up through Dutchess Co. and across to Danbury, and was directed in the storm to the house of Cornelius Fuller. This is the only mention of the name, and was about in the location of Carmel, showing there must have been an elder Fuller there at that time.





Joseph Fuller lived for a time in Stockbridge and Egremont, Mass. Berkshire deeds show that he owned land there in 1767, and the same deeds show that he possessed land in the Wyoming Valley in 1772, where perhaps he had intention of settling. The outbreak of the Revolution caused him to return to Kent. Both he and his son Joshua were Revolutionary soldiers, Joseph being a Captain in the 18th Conn. Regiment. Late in 1794 or early in 1795 he sold his land in Kent to his brother Jeremiah and removed to Plymouth, Luzerne Co., Pa. Jackson township was set off from Plymouth and the first settlement made in 1795. Huntsville was also in this township. Joshua, Benajah and Jehiel Fuller were in Jackson in 1795. Wright's History of Plymouth speaks of these men as among a "class of pioneers who scaled the northern wall of Shawnee Mountain, and settled on the western slope literally in the wilderness." The first frame house in Huntsville was built by the Fullers. Philetus<sup>7</sup> Fuller, a grandson of Joseph<sup>5</sup>, was the first white person buried in Jackson, being interred in the forest where the cemetery now is.

In 1853 he purchased 160 acres of wild land in Elmira Township, and at the expiration of his term of office began the improvement of the land, adding 80 acres more in 1855.

In addition to the farming business, in 1865 he established the Fuller General Merchandise store at Elmira, and was appointed postmaster, holding this position and carrying on these lines of business until his death, besides holding several official positions in connection with school and township matters. He cast his first vote for Henry Clay, and when the Republican party was formed he joined its ranks and continued to be one of its most faithful adherents.

## Obituary of Rev. Isaac Fuller.

Died, in Poultney, Rutland Co., Vt., Aug.  $\overline{26}$ , 1843, Rev. Isaac Fuller, in the 72d year of his age. His was a character and life on which it is delightful to dwell, and a brief notice of which, while it will be gratifying to a large circle of friends, cannot but be profitable to the readers of the Register. He was born in Kent, Ct., April 17, 1772, whence, at an early age, he removed to Roxbury. His religious experience is sufficiently remarkable to justify an account of it here. At the age of eighteen he went to visit three brothers residing in a distant part of the state of Vermont. The place was new and thinly settled, and there was no house of worship. On Sabbath morning his elder brother proposed to him to go up on the mountain Though a thoughtless and irreligious and gather whortleberries. youth, yet his mind revolted at such a profanation of the Lord's Day. " No." ' said he, "let's go and have a meeting." His brother assented. Several came together; they read and sung, but without a praying soul among them. The afternoon of the Sabbath was spent in a similar manner, and convictions were that day fastened in several of their hearts, which were quieted only by the peace-speaking blood of Christ. A revival commenced, and from that little meeting was originated a Baptist church. How striking an indication of the favor with which God regards His own chosen day of rest. How loud the warning to the impenitent to employ faithfully the means of grace. Mr. Fuller had been brought up a Pedo Baptist, but on searching the Scriptures for arguments with which to refute their principles, he found himself, to his amazement, soon become a convert of their sentiments, and after violent struggles, being baptized, he became a consistent, faithful, and devoted advocate of the faith which he had once destroyed. In 1802, he was ordained over the Baptist church at Roxbury; and in this place, and in neighboring towns, he labored with great success during nearly eighteen years. In 1820, he removed to Poultney, from which time he chose never to be settled over a church, but rather to labor with destitute churches as Providence might indicate. He was ever ready at the call of duty, was engaged in many revivals, and instrumental, it is believed, in the conversion of many souls. For a few of the last years of his life he cherished the opinion that the personal reign of Christ was soon to commence. He never, however, went so far as to fix a definite period, and exhibited, we believe, not a vestige of the fanaticism which sometimes accompanies the adoption of similar sentiments. Humble, child-like, devoted, he never dogmatized, but gave himself up to the great work of winning men to promise to meet God, and pointing them to the blood of Jesus. He died after a short and severe illness, on the 26th of Aug., 1843. Those who were acquainted with Elder Fuller need no eulogy on his character. To those who were not, the language of sober truth would seem extravagant panegyric.

" Like a patriarchal sage,

Holy, humble, courteous, mild,

He combined the awe of age With the meekness of a child."

He was emphatically a peace-maker. It was his delight to labor in healing the dissensions of his brethren, and his labors to this end were often in a high degree successful. He studiously avoided anything that could wound the feeling of his brethren. He bridled his tongue. He avoided all evil speaking, and seemed literally to have put away all malice and uncharitableness. It was his maxim, and one on which he acted with remarkable consistency: "If you can say no good of others, say nothing of them." Hence he hardly ever had an enemy; but on the contrary, enjoyed the unbounded affection and esteem of all. He was also remarkable for humility. He arrogated no honor to himself, but was willing to serve his brethren in whatever capacity. His grand aim was to be useful, to glorify God in the building up of His church, and the salvation of sinners. To say all in a word, he was eminently a holy man. He walked habitually with God. He lived by faith in the unseen world, and seemed ever to have a deep and overwhelming sense of spiritual realities. Few Christians, we believe, even few Christian ministers exhibit so much consecration to God, so much forgetfulness of self, so much anxiety for a world perishing in sin, so much of the meekness, benevolence and purity of the Gospel. His life was the life, his death the death of a Christian. His memory lives in the hearts of the thousands, and the records of his fidelity is inscribed on hundreds of immortal spirits, redeemed through his agency, from sin and hell.



Y., and the Connecticut line, about 13⁄4 miles wide, extending from the Massachusetts line to Westchester Co., N. Y., settled earlier than adjoining N. Y. territory because land there was sold, instead of being leased to settlers. Putnam Co. was taken from Dutchess Co. about 1800. County records were burned at Brewsters, N. Y., the county seat, some years ago.

Julius L.<sup>5</sup> Dunning, who married Martha Whittlesey Nov. 20, 1808, was b. 1783 at Saybrook, now Centrebrook, Ct., youngest son of Rev. Benj.<sup>4</sup> and Anna<sup>6</sup> (Botsford) Dunning.

Rev. Benj.<sup>4</sup>, who d. there in 1785, ae. 45, after a ten-years' pastorate of the Second Congregational Church, was b. and m. in Newtown, Ct., and was the fourth in name there, the first Benjamin having been one of the original settlers in 1710.

Mr. and Mrs. Dunning resided first in Shelby Centre, N. Y., but before 1817 removed to New York City, where he became a member of the firm of Dunning & Prior, booksellers. He d. there Feb. 6, 1829, and zbout 1832 the family returned to Shelby Centre.

In regard to Cornelius Fuller of Greene Co., N. Y., mentioned on page 136, who may be a descendant of Cornelius<sup>5</sup>, page 135, Mrs. S. L. Munson of Windham, Greene Co., states that she is "the daughter of Barney Fuller, the thirteenth child of Major Cornelius Fuller;" that according to the inscription on the gravestone of Cornelius, her grandfather, he died June 18, 1839, in his 69th year,

and Zilpha (Knapp) Fuller, his wife, died July 10, 1829. His sons' names were Peter, Aaron, William, Horace, Elijah, John, Barney and Amos. The daughters I remember hearing of were Hannah — m. Deacon Rider, Zilpha — m. Heman Bump, Chloe — m. Ambrose Brackett and went to Michigan, Sally — m. Hiram Fox, Rebecca m. Orren Parsons. Barney Fuller had seven children, four sons and three daughters. Two sons, Roswell and Oscar, and two daughters, Mrs. Oscar Bronson and Mrs. Munson, reside in Windham. Peter Fuller had a son Asahel, who visited Windham many years ago from Ashtabula, O."

It appears there are no deeds on record in Greene Co. to indicate where Major Cornelius came from. His will—Aug., 1839—bequeaths property to Hiram Fox and wife Sally, sons and daughters Phebe, Hannah, Clark, Peter, Cloy, Orrin, Martha, Horace, Cornelius, Barney, Elijah, Amos, Rebecca and John, and grandson, Cornelius Bump.

Information from Adjutant General's office, Washington, D. C., is that "one Cornelius Fuller served as Major of Van Dolfsen's Reg., New York Militia, War of 1812. His service commenced Aug. 22, 1814, and expired Oct. 4, 1814."

In regard to John<sup>5</sup>, Samuel<sup>4</sup>, perhaps the John Fuller of Farmington, Ct., (see page 169) Prof. Brainard's notes show from Farmington Probate Records a will of John Fuller *Senior* of Burlington, Ct., dated Oct. 1, 1807, with children as below:

My correspondent, Mr. Sherman W. Fuller of Garrettsville, O., states that he was born May 27, 1835; that his father was *Chauncey* 

Fuller of Avon, Ct., who was born Mar. 25, 1794; died May 4, 1837; that his mother was Annis (Humphrey) Fuller, dau. of Ralph Humphrey; that his grandfather was Josiah Fuller, who he thinks was born in Avon or Canton, Ct.; that his grandmother's maiden name was Nancy Woodruff, who was also of Avon.

Land Records show a John Fuller in Avon in 1763, and a John Fuller died in Burlington, Ct., April 6, 1838, aged 90 years.

In view of the uncertainty of later history of John<sup>5</sup>, I have thought best to preserve these names and dates here for the benefit of "whom it may concern."

A Cambridge, Mass., correspondent, searching for the ancestry of Ebenezer, found a Mr. Hinckley who gave a succession as follows :

6th generation : Daniel Fuller, m. Nov. 1, 1753, Martha Hinckley.

But Barnstable Records give marriage of Barnabas Feb. 25, 1680, and that Ebenezer, his son, m. Ann Rowley.

Prof. Brainard finds that Ebenezer, who m. Martha Jones, was a descendant of Capt. Matthew Fuller.

On page 178, read Melvin G. and Matthew G. for Melvin C. and Matthew C.

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
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
