

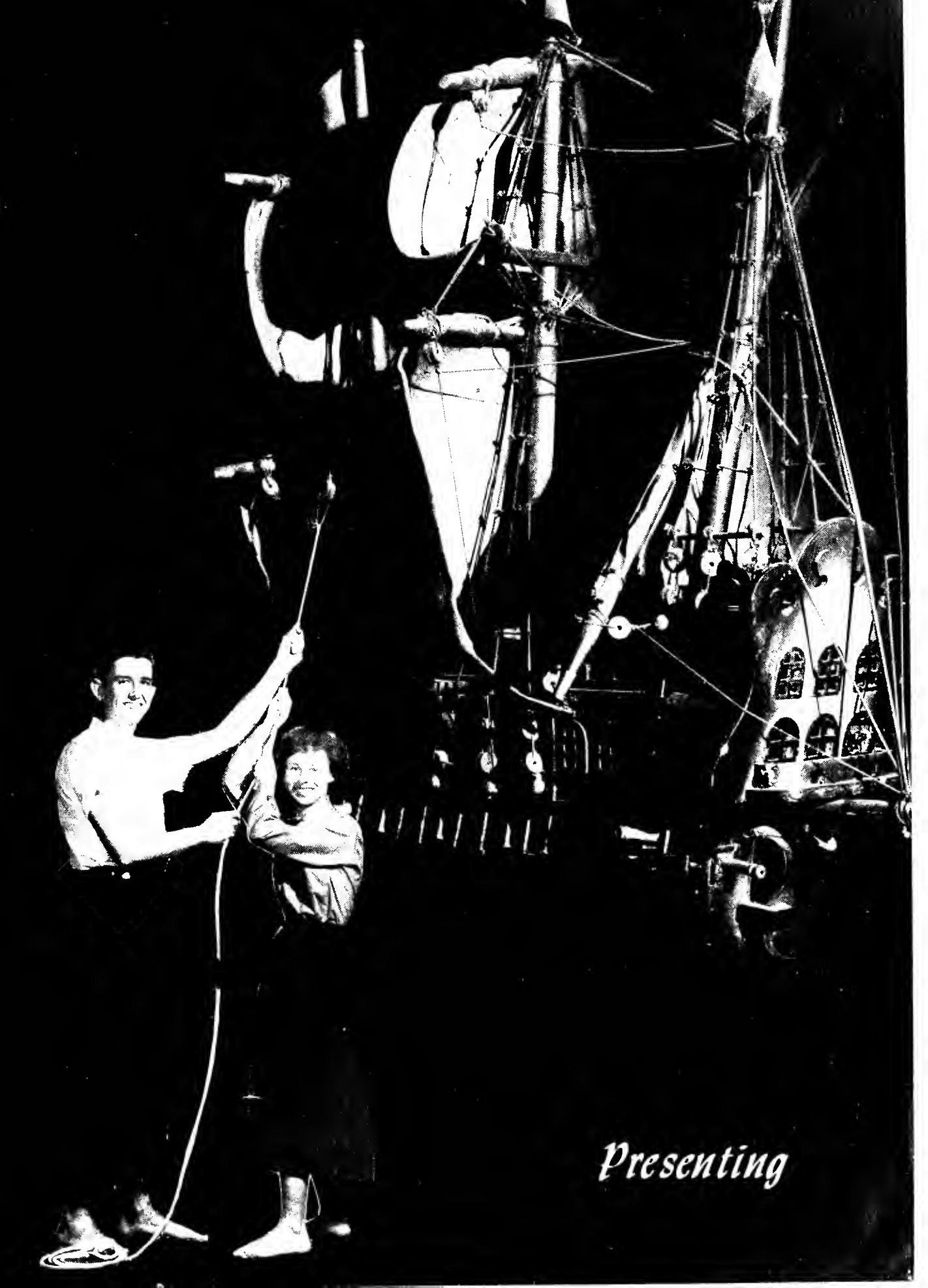

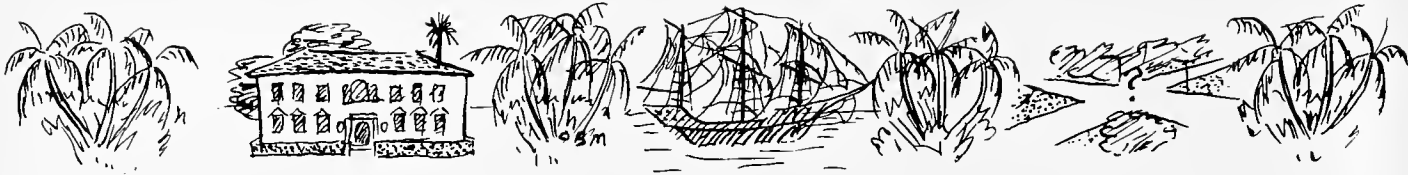

Where the crossroads meet!

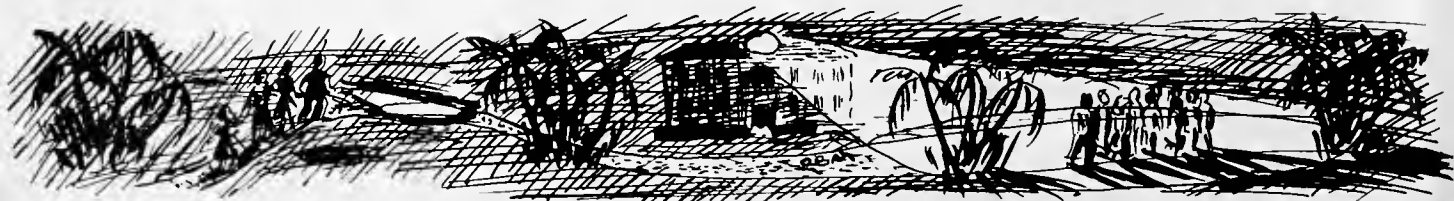

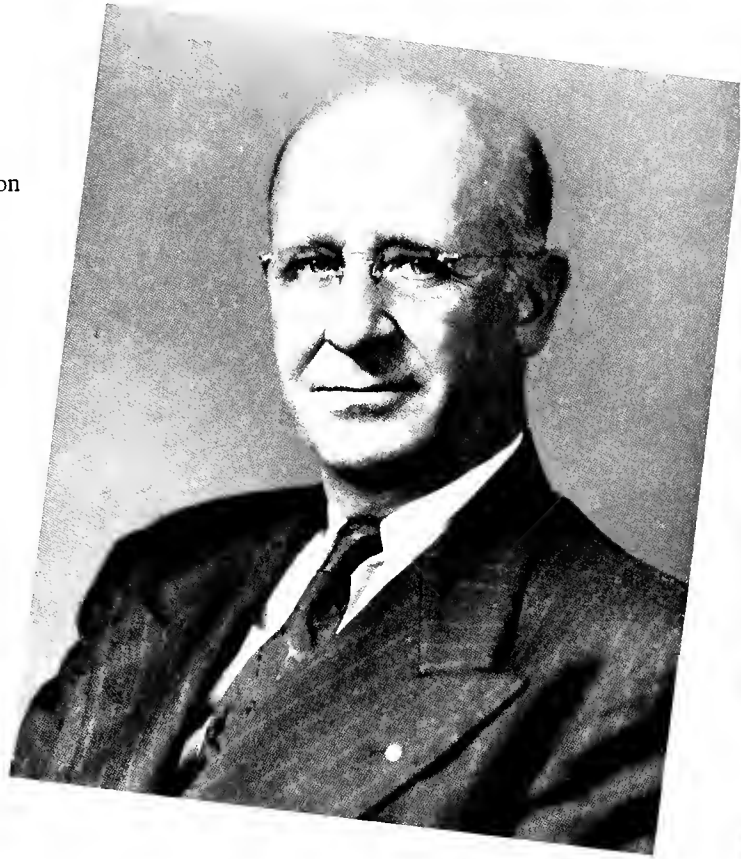
It is the hope of the Editorial Staff that this book will bring back to each of you thoughts of these memorable trails which we have traveled together.

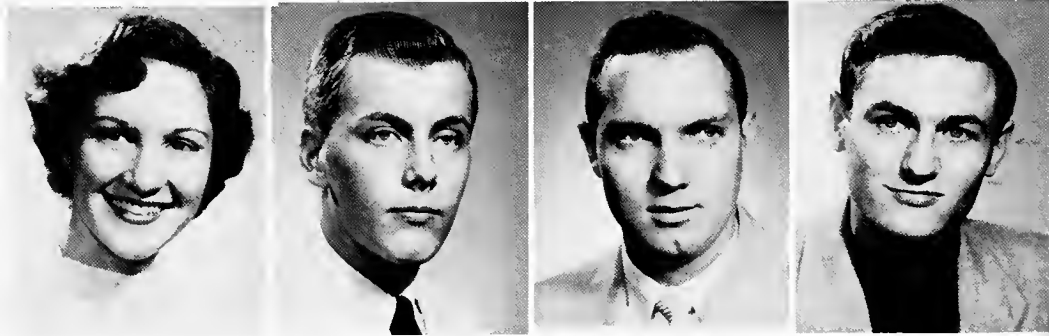
In the months that followed, the Class of '55 has made a real contribution to the student life and activities of the College.
