In the State Junior College Tournament the Geechees romped over Georgia Military College in the first round but fell in the second to top-seeded Young Harris College, the subsequent tournament champion.

Jimmy George, outstanding second year man, took top honors in conference scoring with a 22.3 average and went on to win the Ashley K. Dearing Trophy for the best percentage of free throws by Armstrong players.
