Whether it be in varsity athletics, drama, or the pep-band, a talent used is a talent improved.

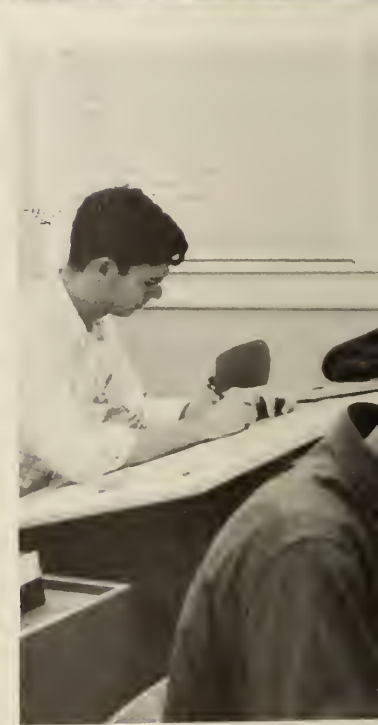




Learning does not end with the day. The evening program is expanding and affords an excellent opportunity to those who wish to continue their formal education at night while meeting the other necessary demands made on their time.

Henry L. Ashmore

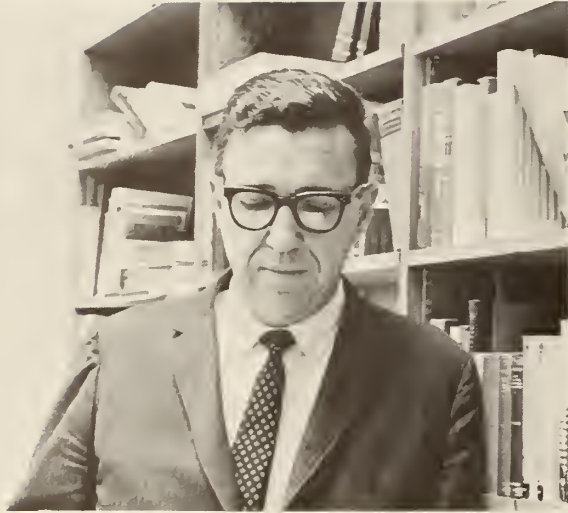

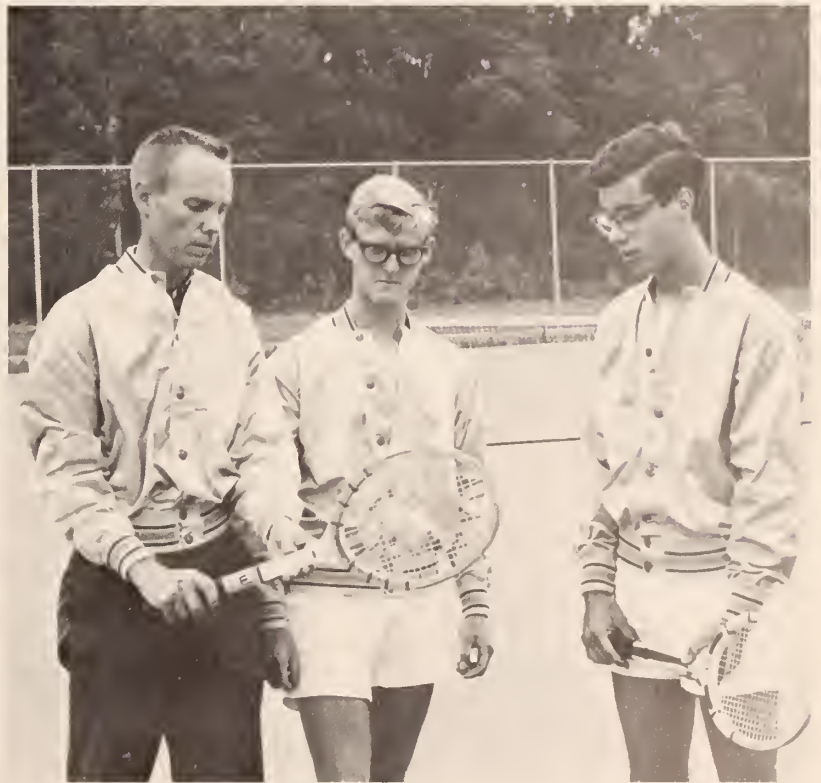
