

INTRODUCTION.

Here and there along the line of two centuries individual members of the Cassel family have gathered stray items of family history, and, in many instances, dates and names have been preserved; but until the author of this little volume began his research, no one had collected all of the scraps of history regarding Julius or Yelles Kassel and his family which are found herein.

That these facts might not be wholly lost, the author has collected from many sources all the information obtainable regarding these worthy ancestors of our family, from whom came some of the first settlers of Germantown—an humble Mennonite preacher at Kriesheim, in the Palatinate (Pfalz), named Yelles Kassel, who died in 1681, from whom are descended the three brothers, who came and settled in the untrodden wilds of America, pursuing the even tenor of a modest and uneventful life.

Being a lineal descendant of Hupert Cassel, who was a grandson of Julius or Yelles, the author's interest has been particularly attracted to him, and there is presented 'herewith the names of the descendants of Hupert Cassel for six gener ations, more than three thousand in all, mostly "plain folk," but, as a rule, thrifty, intelligent and honorable people, a natural and creditable outgrowth of the sturdy German ancestry from which they came.

PREFACE.

Several years ago genealogical collections had been made by Samuel K. Cassel, of Blooming Glen, Bucks county, Pa., with the intention of having it printed. On account of ill health, however, and inability to write during his sickness, he gave all papers and documents relating thereto into the hands of his brother, Daniel K. Cassel, at Germantown, before his death, with a desire to have it completed for our own satisfaction and also for future reference. Consequently the original has been rewritten and enlarged, much information collected and added thereto, and arranged in proper form, so as to bring family connections in proper order. Care was taken to gather reliable information, and that of a doubtful character was not accepted.

Notwithstanding, errors will be found, because of incorrect information. Whenever a ——— occurs the necessary information could not be ascertained. There is also added much historical matter as far as it could be collected, which will make the work more interesting; also, much biographical matter was collected and added thereto. Those yet living were requested to write out their own biography themselves, in order to have nothing written that would be to them objectionable. I have also, for convenience's sake, added three columns of figures on the left-hand margin or each page. The first column indicates the generation, commencing with Hupert Cassel, the first of the family who came to America in 1715 or 1720. The second column indicates the individual number of each name continually to avoid confusion, where the same name occurs repeatedly. The third column indicates the number of children in each family. Hoping that this work will be appreciated by the members of the Cassel families throughout, and all honor be given to the Lord, the "Genealogy" is now respectfully submitted to the public.

EXPLANATIONS.

- 1. The arrangement of this work is selected from the best arranged family records found in the Pennsylvania Historical Society, among about six hundred copies, and is approved by many historians.
- 2. The volume commences with introduction and all necessary preliminary matter.
- 3. Genealogy commences with Julius Cassel, at Kriesheim, and genealogical numbering with Hupert in America, who is generation (¹), his children generation (²), and grand-children generation (³), etc.
- 4. The reader will find three columns of figures in front of each family name; the first designates the generation, the second is a continuous number running through the entire work, designating each name by its particular number, for reference.
- 5. The third or last column gives the number of children in each family.
- 6. The name of the head of each family is in capital let ters, and followed by the whole line of descent.
 - 7. The names of the children are given in italics.
- 8. The small figures found over particular names denote the generation.

FIRST IMPULSE OR MOTIVE OF THE CASSELS EMIGRATING TO AMERICA.

William Penn made his first visit through Germany in 1671 as a missionary, and only followed the example of his brethren in faith and stopped at Emden, Crefeld and West-

phalia.

His second visit he made in the year 1677, in the thirtythird year of his age, and not yet known as the founder of Pennsylvania. Four years later, it appears, he made a third trip; and from the city of Cassel he gave notice of a meeting he proposed to hold at Frankfort. From Frankfort he went to Kriesheim, where he arrived August 23, 1681, and intended to preach. A meeting had been previously announced for that purpose, but upon the urgent request of a Calvinist minister, all preaching was forbidden by the bailiff's deputy. However, a silent meeting was held, in which all took part; also, those from Worms, who followed them in a wagon. Penn, however, got permission from Count Karl Ludwig to preach again. Consequently, on Sunday, August 26th, Penn traveled on foot from Worms to Kriesheim, a distance of six miles, and preached to the people of Kriesheim in a barn. Count Ludwig quietly entered the barn and stood behind a door listening, but Penn did not know it. Ludwig afterwards reported to the Calvinist minister that nothing of a heretical nature occurred, but, on the contrary, all that he heard was actually very good. Penn preached in the German language, which he had learned from his mother, she being a Dutch woman from Rotterdam. During his discourse he pictured the then raging persecutions of the non-resistant Christians; how they were denied the right to worship God according to the dictates of their conscience, and how they were driven from one place to another and their property confiscated.

He further explained their principles of faith regarding swearing an oath, and waging war, and of revenge, which corresponded very nearly with that of the Mennonites, and gave great satisfaction to those present. Among them were Heinrich Cassel, Johannes Cassel and Yillis or Julius Cassel, members of the Mennonite church, who were so well pleased with his remarks that, as soon as the meeting closed, they took him by the hand and embraced him as a brother in the faith, and invited him to go with them, which he did. They then had a long consultation about matters of religion. He told them that he had a large tract of land in America, which had been granted to him by King Charles II, March 4, 1681. and made it free by purchase, to enable the conscientiously scrupulous to settle and enjoy their religious opinions without restraint. Thus by promising them perfect freedom and liberty to worship God according to the dictates of their conscience, was given the first impulse or motive of the Cassels emigrating to America.

CASSEL FAMILY.

The first family of Cassels that emigrated to this country, came from Kriesheim, in the Palatinate, in the year 1686, November 20, in the ship "Jefries," and settled at Germantown, near Philadelpha, then a small town; at this place the Mennonites, of which the Cassel family were members, had a church and regular preaching. An incident occurred about this period going to show, in a very striking manner, the simplicity of the church at this time. A letter came from Europe to the Cassels that a large legacy was left them by the death of a relative amounting to nearly a million of dollars, and that they should send out and get the treasure. A church council was called, and the matter freely discussed, when it was decided by a unanimous vote not to receive the money, as it would have a tendency to make them proud. Simplicity of

manner, plainness of dress, frugality, honesty and economy, were some of the characteristics of this people.—*Harris' Biographical History of Lancaster*.

Yelles or Julius Cassel was a native of the Palatinate, Pfalz. He suffered considerably on account of his religion, during the Thirty Years War. He was a member of the Mennonite Society, and a minister; he had to flee from one country to another, during which time he wrote a number of German poems in accordance with the circumstances, some of which have been brought over by his descendants, and are now in the hands of Abraham H. Cassel, of Harleysville, Montgomery county, Pa. He was born before 1618, and died about 1681. For his poems, see History of the Mennonites, German Edition, by D. K. Cassel, 1890, in German type. They will also be given to the reader of this little volume, as follows:

OUR ANCESTOR.

LAMENTATIONS ON THE SICK-BED.

Written about the year 1664 by Julius Kassel, a Mennonite minister at Kriesheim, in the Palatinate, during a long sickness of eighteen years.

Prepared for publication by Daniel K. Cassel, by first obtaining the consent of the undersigned, in whose possession we can find the original, who writes as follows:

Harleysville, Pa., Sept. 11, 1890.

The following sentences and poems, which are mv possession in the original, were written by my 6. Yelles Kassel, a renowned preacher of the Mennon te o nation in Kriesheim, in the Palatinate, at various tin places during the Thirty Years War, as he, with his had to flee from one place to another in order to save lives. After the war was closed, and they again came ho. he collected all his manuscripts together and wrote the nicely in a book dated the 28th of November, 1665. In late years he also wrote a treatise on the Christian belief, on bar tism, sacrament, and rules and regulations of the Mennonite congregation, which are also in the original in my possession, and bear the date Anno 1681. He died at an advanced age, before the latter was fully completed. ABRAM H. CASSEL.

The following sentences and poems were written by me during my sickness, as also during the time of war and its dangers, with sincerity, as spoken before God, wherein is expressed my sincerest desire and wish; also, upon what ground my consolation and hope is founded. Should anyone have a desire to read, and thereby be brought to light and thinking, it would be gratifying to me, because I do not know of anything better than to strive for mine and all men's salvation. God may add his blessing is my prayer. Yelliso Kasel.

He further says the following: "On the first day of January, 1667, the following were read again, with much bodily pain and suffering, with a desire that the sufferings in this world will soon be over."



THE THREE COMETS.

(OBSERVED BY YELLES KASSEL.)



Anno 1644, the latter part of the year, was the first star visible. In the morning, before day, towards the south.

In the beginning of the year 1665 the second star was seen, in the evening, high in the air, somewhat dark. Some were of the opinion that it was the first; others thought it was a different one.

The third star was seen in the latter part of March, 1665, and the beginning of April, in the morning, before day, in the east, very bright, with a very long tail.

These three stars or comets were visible within the space of a quarter of a year. I am concerned about their signification. Many may learn it to their own sorrow.

I also saw the great comet in the year 1618, and soon after that the great misery and affliction in Germany commenced, as many may yet know.

A FEW NAMES OF MEN OF NOTE

THOUGH NOT BELONGING TO OUR FAMILY.

David Cassel was a learned Jewish historian, born in Glogan in Silesia, March 7, 1818. He was educated at Breslau and Berlin, and became a distinguished instructor. Among his works are Leitfaden für den unterricht in der Jüdischen Geschichte und Literature, and others.

JOHN PHILIP CASSEL, a German phiologist, born 1707, at Bremen, where he became Professor of Eloquence; he published "Historical Notices and Documents of Bremen," in 1766, and other works. He died in 1783.

Paulus Stephanus Selig Cassel, born February 27, 1821, a German author of Jewish descent, educated both in Roman Catholic and Protestant schools, finished his studies under Ranko, in Berlin, and became a journalist. He was in the Prussian Chamber of Deputies, 1866–67, and declined a reëlection, preferring to become minister of Christ Church, Berlin. He has published articles and books on the Jews, and on religion and politics; and is well known as a lecturer on Papal history, the German war, etc.

CASSEL FAMILY.

Gen. Individual No. Pamily No. I JOHANNES CASSEL, born 1639, and his wife, Mary, came to America in the ship "Jefries," and landed at Philadelphia, November 20, 1686, at the age of 47 years, from Kriegsheim, with his children. He was a weaver by trade and settled at Germantown, county of Philadelphia.

He was, presumably, a son of Julius or Yelles Cassel of Kriegsheim, in the Palatinate. They left Europe for America, March 20, 1686, consequently a journey or voyage of seven months. He died April 17, 1691, aged 52 years; resided in Philadelphia. He also signed the application for a charter for the Borough of Germantown, and was one of the committee or members of first council of Germantown.

EDWARD DRINKER, born December 24, 1680, in the cottage near the corner of Second and Walnut streets, which was the real primitive house of Philadelphia; he died on November 17, 1782, aged 102 years.

The father of the celebrated aged Edward Drinker had settled there some years before Penn's colonists came, and Edward himself was born there two years before that time. He lived till after the War of Independence, and used often to delight himself in referring to localities where Swedes and Indians occasionally hutted at their first landing.

When Dr. Franklin was questioned in England as to what age we lived in this country, he wittily said he could not tell until Drinker should die and settle it.

Drinker's parents came from Beverly, Mass., and settled on the site of Philadelphia before Penn came. He had all his eighteen children by his first wife, having had four wives in all. He was never sick, and always cheerful.

One of these eighteen children, named Edward Drinker, married Susanna Cassel, a daughter of Nicholas Cassel, born November 11, 1702, a son of Arnold Cassel, son of Johannes Cassel, who came from Germany in 1686.

Of the family of Johannes Cassel, who came to Germantown in 1686, I gave some account of the sons Arnold and Peter, and of their children; but of his children's children we have very little knowledge. They mostly resided in Philadelphia and were married there. I here give a list of some of them, who were married and resided in Philadelphia, as I have found in the Pennsylvania Archives, vols. 8 and 9, and otherwise, viz.:

Christian Cassel came from the Palatinate in September 11, 1738, in the ship Robert and Oliver, and bought a farm of Lorenze Klein, about two or three miles from Allentown, Pa.

YELLES or JULIUS KASSEL, of Kriesheim, in the Palatinate (Pfalz), before 1618, died about 1681, a Mennonite minister.

Heinrich Kassel was a Mennonite minister in the Palatinate or on the Upper Rhine. He wrote a pamphlet on the history of the Quakers to which Peter Hendricks and Jacob Claus, of Amsterdam, wrote a reply in 1679, which was the property of Daniel Francis Pastorius, and is now in the fire-proof of the Pennsylvania Historical Society at Philadelphia in the Abraham H. Cassel collection. See Pennypacker's Sketches, page 27.

History also mentions a Henrich Kassel, Preacher, of Lambertsheim, in 1689; also Henrich Kassel, Preacher, Gerolsheim, in 1690.

A Henrich Kassel is also mentioned in Rupp's 30,000 names, on page 432, among the first settlers of Germantown, between 1683–1710.

Also a Heinrich Kassel is mentioned among the fifty-two members of the Mennonite Church, at Germantown, in 1708, when the first Mennonite meeting-house was built. See Morgan Edwards' History, 1770. Of this Heinrich Kassel we have very little account.

It is, however, stated by the descendants of the Cassel family, of Maryland, that their ancestor came from Pennsylvania early in the 1700s, and settled near Frederick city, Maryland, or may it be that he removed with Van Bebber to Bohemia Manor, Cecil County, Maryland. See Pennypacker's Sketches, page 57. One of the descendants writes from Baltimore and mentions three sons, viz.:

FAMILY OF HUPERT CASSEL.

Hupert Cassel, our remote ancestor or original progenitor of the Cassels in America, more particularly the line represented in this work, emigrated to this country about 1715 or 1720, from Kriesheim, called the Palatinate (Pfalz), a Province of Germany, west of the Rhine. It is now divided between Bavaria and Hesse-Hamburg. He was then a single man.

On his arrival in America he stopped at Germantown and hired his services to different individuals, both as a husbandman and weaver, until he became acquainted with a Dutch girl (native of Holland), whose Christian name was Syche, with whom, as soon as circumstances would permit, he was joined in the holy bond of matrimony. Meanwhile his brothers, Yelles, or Julius, and Johannes, who were corresponding with him from Germany, charged him by the most solemn remonstrances not to marry a Dutch girl, they having for some—to me unknown—cause, imbibed a deep-rooted prejudice against the woman of that nation, but for which they had abundant occasion to repent, as the sequel will show. For soon after, his brothers, Yelles and Johannes, also emigrated to America and arrived in the ship Friendship, on the 16th of October, 1727, after a passage of four months, from Rotterdam.

Johannes Cassel settled westward in the vicinity of Columbia, Lancaster County, Pa.

Yelles or Julius Cassel settled with his brother Hubert, by whom he was received with the greatest imaginable kindness, and especially his wife. They boarded and lodged them, and afterwards divided their land, one hundred and fifty acres, with them and assisted them in every possible manner to put up his buildings, etc.; and, on the whole, she was such a noble, kind-hearted woman and so devotedly pious that he began to think she was one of a thousand, whose equal could not be found. In consequence he oft confessed and implored her forgiveness for having so unkindly and undeservedly despised her.

The tract of land which he occupied (150 acres) was a part of 6166 acres taken up or bought of Matthias Van Bebber, of Bohemia River, Maryland, who bought it from William Penn, Proprietary Governor of Pennsylvania, dated 1702, of which Dirk and William Renberg, of Mühlheim, bought three hundred acres in the year 1706, of which Dirk Renberg bought his moiety, one hundred and fifty acres, in 1719, and settled on it, from whom the aforesaid Hupert Cassel, all of Van Bebber (Skippack) Township, bought the said tract of The date of the title is November 16, 1725, which 150 acres. has constantly been occupied by his descendants until the year 1855, a period of about 130 years, without a deed. ing constantly willed from father to son until the last occupant, Samuel Cassel, son of Henry Cassel, who died without issue, whereupon it was sold, in the year 1857, and passed into the hands of Mr. Johnson.

The old articles of agreement between Dirk Renberg and Hupert Cassel are yet existing, bearing date July 24, 1725, and are in manner following, to wit: To give immediate possession. But the corn now in the ground is excepted, and sufficient house-room for himself and family till first of April next, and to keep a cow and horse with sufficient provender until the time aforesaid, and to have a good and lawful title executed until 16th of November, A. D. 1725, with seven

bonds of £10 each, the interest of the sum to be diminished only as the bonds are paid off, for the true performance of which they bound themselves in each other in a bond of £200 each. From his will we learn that he was a weakly man. A man of very delicate health, and, as it appears, never possessed much of this world's goods, for in his will we find many articles of a very trivial value specified to his several heirs. As for instance, to my dear and much beloved wife, "Syche," he says, I give £10 in cash, with best bedstead and bedding, besides a featherbed and two extra sheets, pillowcases, etc.; the first pick of my cows, besides some other very trifling articles, such as a teakettle, the little table, etc.

To my son Yelles or Julius I give all that tract of land which I bought of William Johnson, which was then a dense wilderness, but he has already put buildings on and fitted it up for himself, boarded the workmen at home at a distance of two and a half miles.

To my son Abraham I give my two looms with my whole weaving tacle.

And to my son Henry I leave this, my residence, with a dower of £70 for the maintenance of my dear wife. And if in case she proves uneasy with the noisomness of the family my son Henry shall find and provide for her a convenient apartment, such as may be agreeable to her, out of her said legacy.

And to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Nicholas Haldeman, Jr., I give £10.

And to my youngest daughter, Mary, I give the sum of twenty pounds current lawfull money, when she arrives at the age of eighteen years.

The above is copied from the original manuscripts, now in possession of Abraham H. Cassel, at Harleysville, Montgomery County, Pa., by Samuel K. Cassel, great-great-grandson of the aforesaid Hupert Cassel, January 2, 1879, for the Cassel genealogy. Afterwards, when his health failed, all the papers in his possession were given into the hands of Daniel K. Cassel, of Germantown, brother of the above mentioned

Samuel, and rewritten for this work on July 4, 1891. The children of Hupert were Julius, Henry, Abraham, Elizabeth and Mary.

Following is the will of Hupert Cassel as recorded at Philadelphia, Book H, No. 36, page 57:

Be It Known unto all whom it may concern That I Huppert Kassel of ye Township of Skippack and Perkiomen in y County of Philadelphia, Weaver, being Sick and weak of Body, Nevertheless my Memory and understanding Sound and perfect, and Considering the uncertainty of my life, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament this Eleventh day of May in the year of Our Lord One thousand Seven Hundred and forty-five. Impris. I Will that all my Just debts which I shall owe at ye time of my decease together with my funeral charges be duly observed and pd by my Executors herein named.

I give unto my Said Wife my best Feather bed, Bedding and Bedstead with the furniture thereof Likewise her choice thereof one of all my Cows with the privilege to dwell and abide in my dwelling house for and during ye time She remains my Widow unmarried, and if in case She proves uneasy with the Noisomness of the family my Son Henry shall find and provide for her a convenient apartment which Sd Legacys and privilege Shall be unto my Sd wife in Lieu of all other rights or Dowers out of my Estate, Real and personal whatsoever.

3rdly I give and devise and bequeath unto my eldest Son Julius Kassel all my Land which I bought of William Johnson by the Metes and bounds thereof with all its Improvements To be held by my S^d son Julius his heirs & Assigns from y^e day of my decease thence forward and for ever he pay-

ing y^e sum of Seventy pounds current Lawfull money of Pennsylvania for the use herein bequeathed, one part whereof is y^e Seven pounds ten Shillings bequeathed to my S^d wife as above mentioned.

4thly I give, devise and bequeath unto my second Son Henry Kassel all y^e land and plantation whereupon I now dwell by y^e Metes & bounds thereof Estimated to Contain Sixty four Acres (be y^e Same more or less) with all the appurtenances & Improvements thereunto belonging, To be held by my S^d Son Henry his heirs and Assigns from y^e day of my decease thenceforward and for ever He paying the Sum of Ninety five pounds Current Lawfull money of Pennsylvania for y^e use hereby bequeathed one part whereof is the Seven pounds ten Shillings bequeathed to my said wife as above mentioned.

 5^{th} ly I give and bequeath unto my third Son Abraham Kassel my two Looms with all y^e Gears and Utensils belonging thereunto, he paying unto my said wife y^e Sum of three pounds Six Shillings and Eight pence therefrom when she requires.

6thly I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Elizabeth Holdeman, wife of Nicholas Holdeman, Jr., ye Sum of Ten pounds current Lawfull money as above said payable by my Executors out of my estate when my daughter Mary arrives or Should so arrive to Eighteen years of age.

7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary the sum of Twenty pounds Current Lawfull money as aforesaid, payable unto her by my Executors when she arrives or should so arrive to Eighteen years of age.

8th and with respect to what shall remain over and above paying my Said debts and Legacies aforesaid I do hereby Will, direct and bequeath that ye Same shall be divided in five equal Shares between my S^d five children viz.: Julius, Henry, Abraham, Elizabeth and Mary, when my S^d daughter Mary arrives or Shall so arrive to twenty one years of age and payable then to each & every one of them by my S^d Executors and if in case any of my said children dieth before my

S^a daughter Mary arrives or Should so arrive to ye age aforesaid having Lawfull Issue to Survive, Such Issue or Issues shall have her or their parents' share, payable on the time and manner aforesaid.

oth and I do hereby Constitute, and depute, and appoint my Said Wife Sythe Kassel and my Said Son Julius Kassel, together with my Brother Julius (or Yelles) Kassel to be my Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament giving them or Either of them (as the case may require by reason of death or other disability) full power to do and act in ye premises what may be necessary and Lawfull, and in like manner I do by these presents nominate and Request my loving and Trusty friends and Neighbors Valentine Househere, of Ye Township of Skippack and Perkiomen, aforesaid yeoman, and Andrew Ziegler, of Salford, in the County of Philadelphia, Sadler, guardians over my children, Such as Shall be in their Minority at ye time of my decease giving them hereby full power and absolute authority to command, compell that this my said will, be duly observed, performed, fulfilled and kept, according to the purport, meaning, Tenor, true intent, thereof finally revoking and disannulling all other former Wills, Testaments, Legacies, Executors by me in any manner of ways before this time Willed, named and bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

Individual Family Gen. Yelles or Julius Cassel, a brother to Hupert Ŧ 22 Cassel, came to America in the ship Friendship from Rotterdam on the 16th of October, 1727, after a passage of four months, and settled with his brother. Hupert, in Skippack, now Montgomery County, Pa. Hupert divided his farm, one hundred and fifty acres, and sold one part to his brother Yelles, who at once erected buildings thereon. It is also said that he had been a Minister in the Mennonite Church at Skippack, then called Bebberstown

YELLES CASSEL, THE PREACHER.

The following is a historic sketch relating to Yelles Cassel and was printed by Christopher Saur in 1749, which I will give in its original language:

Gleich wie aber die Raaben, Adler und Raub vögel. Wann sie ein vettes aas erchmäcken, nicht erst warten bis man ihnen pfeifet. Sondern, ungerufen hineilen. So machten es auch die Zinzendörfer by denen Sonst aufrichtigen und reichen Mennoniten. Sie Sind aber auch meistenstheils als unberufene Gäste angesehen und mit leerer Hand wieder fortgeschickt, und ihnen gar nichts ubrig gelassen worden als dasz sie sich nun mit ihren eigenen rechtfertigen. Vorgeben als wann sie so Groszen Segen unter ihnen gehabt, breit machen können welches doch der wahrheit nicht Gemäsz ist. Dann die Mennonisten haben den Zinzendorf auf der ersten Conference in Germantown 1741-42, Schon in Groben lügen erfunden und darum ihm nicht mehr zuhören wollen da aber doch ein Lehrer unter ihnen. Namens Yelles Cassel, von den Zinzendörfern ist beredet worden dasz er zur Conferenz nach Oley Kommen und nur zuhören soll, hat der Graff die List gespielt dasz Cassel ihm Seinen Kram unterschreiben Soll, und damit hätte der Graff andere Mennonisten hintergehen, oder zum wenigsten in die welt hinein Prelen können, mit eines Mennonisten Lehrers namen aus Pennsylvanien, aber der ehrliche man entschuldigte Sich, dasz er weder im Namen Seiner Gemeine, oder vor Sich Selbsten etwas von Seinen Sachen Unter-Schreiben könne. Da Sagte der Graff. Ich will mit euch wetten worum ihr wolt, dass ehe ein Jahr vergeht so Sollen die halben Mennonisten Mährisch Sein (denen doch mehr als 2000 hier Sind) Yelles Cassel Sagte; ich hab nichts zu wetten. Zinzendorf Sagte nochmal, warum wollt ihr nicht wetten? Cassel Sagte, das wetten ist eine Sache vor lose Buben, oder leichtsinnige leute und Sagte nochmal Ich wette nicht und Unterschreibe auch nichts.

Da nun der Graff ein Jahr im land war und noch Sieben Jahr dazu vorbey Sind, und hier noch nicht ein einziger Mennonist so Mährisch worden wie der Graff ist, oder in sein Netz kounte gebracht werden, so ist es auch bey ihnen ein Ausgemachtes, nach dem wort des Herrn: Wann ein Prophet etwas redet und wird nichts daraus, und kommt nicht so ist er ein falscher Prophet, und Sein wort ist nicht vom Herrn. Und man soll sich nicht vor ihm Scheuen; dann der Prophet ist leichlsinnig und vermessen, Deu. 18: 20. Zeph. 1, 4, Er redet nach Seines herzens Gesicht, das war falsch. Jer. 23: 16. Sie haben aber doch des Graffen Diener bescheidentlich begegnet, dann Sie wollen keinen fremden Knecht richten. So viel mögen die besucher sich mit recht rühmen.

Gen. Individual No. 1 23 3 Johannes Cassel, also a brother of Hupert and Yelles, came to America with his brother Yelles in the ship Friendship, from Rotterdam, on the 16th of October, 1727, and settled in Lancaster county, Pa., in the vicinity of Columbia.

These three were brothers, and also grandsons of Yelles¹ the preacher, at Kriesheim. They all came from Kriesheim, and, as far as known, were members of the Mennonite church. They also brought with them many valuable papers, manuscripts and poems, written by Yelles Kassel¹, at Kriesheim. A large portion of them were destroyed in a fire at the burning of the house of one Hupert Cassel, a grandson of Hupert the first, and many of them are yet in the library of Abraham H. Cassel, at Harleysville, Montgomery county, Pa.

His will is recorded in Book 2, page 5, at Norristown, and reads as follows:

In the name of God, Amen. I, Henry Cassel, of Towamencin township, the county of Montgomery, and state of Pennsylvania, being advanced in age but of sound mind, understanding and memory, thanks be to God, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following:

First. I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be satisfied and paid by my executors out of my personal estate. Then it is my will and I give to my beloved wife Margaret our bed and bedstead all belonging thereto, my pipe stove, thirty-hour clock, one cow her choice, and as much other household goods as she chooses and fifty pounds in money to be paid to her in three months after my decease. I also give unto her two rooms the northwest end of the house where we now live, and the two upper rooms and privilege at the fire-place, and in the cellar for her use, with sufficient egress and regress, and fire-wood ready cut and brought to the door fit for the pipe stove as much as she chooses. One-quarter of the garden and dung brought in as much as she chooses, and fruit of the orchard as much as she has need of. Fifteen pounds yearly and every year. The first payment to

commence in one year after my decease, and my son Yelles or his successor is to keep her cow, summer and winter, as he keeps his own. All this above mentioned she is to have as long as she remains my widow. Item, I give unto my son Yelles my wagon, plow, harrow, horse gears, the weaver loom with all the tackling belonging thereto.

And whereas, I hold one hundred and thirty-one acres of land situated in Towamencin township, item, I give the aforesaid one hundred and thirty-one acres of land with appurtenances thereto belonging to my son Yelles Cassel, his heirs and assigns forever. And he the said Yelles Cassel is to pay and allow all the above mentioned articles to his mother. And I do estimate and value the aforesaid plantation to my son Yelles at seven hundred pounds in specie, out of which I give unto him one hundred pounds first and foremost instead of what I have given to my daughters Eve and Susanna in holds and money, and the remainder what is unpaid he is to pay as follows: seventy-five pounds in one year after my and my wife's decease, and so yearly and every year till the whole is paid, he having his equal share in each payment. Item, I give all my personal estate what is not already willed to my three children, named Yelles, Eve, wife of John Springer, Susanna, wife of George Trumbor, share and share alike; and after my wife's decease my son Yelles is to have the thirtyhour clock, the pipe stove, and the large Bible, first and foremost. The remainder is to be divided among my three children, as before said. Item, it is my will and I order that my son Yelles is to get any necessaries my wife is in need of, such as going to mill and store or elsewhere; but he is not to have any pay for his trouble.

And lastly, I constitute and appoint my son Yelles Cassel to be my executor of this my last will and testament, disannulling all the wills and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I, Henry Cassel, have hereunto set my hand and seal, dated the seventeenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven (1797).

Be it Remembered, that on the 14 August, 1797, the foregoing will of Henry Cassel was proven in due form of law and letters testamentary granted unto Yelles Cassel, executor within named, he having first affirmed well and truly to perform the same and to render an account according to law.

He settled in Salford township, Montgomery county, Pa., near the southwest corner of Upper Salford, about a mile from the junction of the Perkiomen and the Northeast branch and about a mile east of Schwenksville. He was a member of the Mennonite church at Salford. His farm contained about one hundred acres, and his will reads as follows:

To know how it May concern: That I, Abraham Cassel, of Upper Salford Township, in Philadelphia County, Yeoman,

do find myself Sick in Body, But of Sound mind, Memory and understanding, Blessed be God, and as I know there is a time appointed for all Man to die, I therefore do order and make this my last will and Testament.

First. I do recommend my Soul into the hands of God, the Allmighty, and my body unto the Earth to be buried in Christian-like manner. And Concerning my worldly Estate, I do dispose of the Same in the following manner:

I will that all my Legal Debts and funeral charges shall be just and fully paid by my hereafter named Executors.

Item. I will that my beloved wife Fiega shall keep house with my estate with the children, and to have the whole management of the same if she remains my widow, till my only son Jacob shall be at his Lawfull age, and then it is my will that my Land and Plantation shall be valued and appraised by three men, which shall be chosen by my children, and my son Jacob shall have the place at the appraisement as the men then chosen shall think proper and the place can afford. In case my son shall refuse to take the place, then it shall be sold to the best advantage of my children. Likewise shall then all my movable estate be sold, and what my wife and children shall advance till my son is at age that shall be in equal shares between my wife and my son for their use forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my well beloved wife our Bed, with the Bedstead and all the furniture belonging to the Same, all her Clothes with her Chest, and one-third of my movable Estate. All this I give to her for her own use and disposal, and further I give and devise unto her the interest of the third part what my land shall be appraised or Sold at which third part shall be Lease on my place, And the interest be paid to her yearly so long she remains my widow. But in case she marry, then she shall receive only half the Interest of the same, and the said third part; the one-half when she marries shall be divided among my children or their Heirs in equal Shares and the residue after her decease.

Item. It is my will if my son shall keep the place that my wife shall live with my son so long as she remains my widow. and he shall find her a good warm stove, Room and firewood fit for her use, and other Liberties in the House for her use. All the residue of my Estate I give and Divide unto my five children or their Heirs in equal Shares, named, Jacob, Elizabeth, Catharine, Mary and Magdalena, and their Shares shall be paid to them as they follow in their age, and as the payments of my plantation shall come due. But in case one or more of my children Should die before their Lawful age or without issue, then his or their share shall be equally Divided Between my wife, if she remains my widow, and my children then living or the heirs of their body. And I do nominate and appoint my Brother Henry Cassel and my Brother-inlaw Solomon Grimley Sole executors of this my last will and Testament and give them full power to execute to my son or to the purchaser of my land or Plantation or the Survivor of them, a Deed and Sufficient Right as I personally could do myself, and that they shall execute the same according to the true Intent and maining herein Contained.

As Witness my hand and seal this 18th day of January, in the year of our Lord One Thousand, Seven Hundred and Seventy Six. 1776.

Rev. Samuel Harley, son of Abraham Harley, born November 26, 1795, married Elizabeth Kline, and had two children, Jonas and Leah, who married Samuel Kline, but leaves no issue. He was a farmer by occupation, and early in life became a member of the German Baptist or Brethren Church. It was not very long until he was elected to the office of deacon in which capacity he was often requested to offer prayer and to bear testimony to the sermons, which he did with so much ability that he was soon called to the ministry. He was a diligent reader of Scripture, of church history, of the

church fathers and of religious authors, and improved rapidly as a speaker and orator. After the death of Elder William Price, in 1849, he was ordained to the position of Bishop by the laying on of hands. He had much magnetic influence and in his preaching had a very persuasive way in declaring his ideas, appealing to sinners, convincing and converting them. He was the most eloquent German minister in the Brethren Church in his time, and wherever he went he drew large crowds of people. He was also very sociable and affectionate in his intercourse with his friends. He often went into other localities to preach, and when it was known that he was coming, the people would flock together to hear him. It was by his preaching that many people were converted to God and a number of churches were started, and eight or more meeting-houses were built under his care. As a minister and an orator he was very successful, and his abilities were of the highest order. In his old age he suffered much from gravel, with which he was afflicted a number of years, and the several last years of his life kept himself secluded in his room. died October 20, 1878, aged 82 years, 10 months and 24 days. His wife, Elizabeth, died March 12, 1872, aged 77 years and 20 days.

Abraham Harley Cassel, antiquarian and bibliophile, founder of the Cassel library, was born in Towamensing township, Montgomery county, Pa., near Union Square, generally called White's Corner, on September 21, 1820, and lived there until the year 1834. [Then his father, Yelles Cassel, bought a farm in Lower Salford, above Harleysville, Montgomery county, Pa., and moved there, Abraham going with him. It is on this place where his well known library is located, the collections of which he commenced about

1830.—AUTHOR.]

Though he has spent almost his entire life at this secluded spot, six miles from any railroad, following the occupation of a farmer, he is well known in this country and in Europe for his remarkable literary attainments and his great success as a collector of rare books, pamplets, papers and manuscripts. Having acquired a vast fund of valuable information by his own individual efforts from the many thousands of books he has collected, and never happier than when inspiring others with his own thirst for knowledge, or when dispensing the contents of his books to his many guests, for many years his country home has been the favored resort for editors, authors, learned men, and students of history, from all over this country and parts of Europe. On the paternal side he is a descendant of Hupert Cassel, a nephew of the pioneer, Johannes Cassel, Mennonites, who with many early German emigrants, by the personal invitation of William Penn, came over and settled at Germantown near Philadelphia, in 1686. On the maternal side he is a great-greatgrandson of the first Christoph Saur or Sower, the celebrated scholar and printer of Germantown, and of Peter Becker, the first elder of the German Baptist Church in America. From these men noted in the colonial history of Pennsylvania, Mr. Cassel doubtless inherited his great thirst for knowledge and taste for historical and classical literature. Many of the unlettered Germans in his state and neighborhood, in consequence of a supposed attempt in a previous generation to proselyte their children by compelling them to attend schools in which the religion of rival sects was taught, were averse to giving a boy an opportunity of gaining more than the rudiments of an education. This view was held by his stern father, who endeavored to crush the son's desire for private study and reading by imposing upon him an extra amount of farm work. But Abraham seemed to have been born with a love for books: as a little child his attention was attracted to a book more than any other plaything. An elder sister taught him to read in his eighth year, by the side of her spinning wheel. His only additional advantage was six weeks' attendance at a country school near his home; but he employed all his leisure time from his labors on his father's farm in diligent study of such books as came within his reach. His fondness for books developed in a wonderful degree, and he even spent much of the night, wrapped up in the covers of his bed, sitting in a cold room by the dim light of a tallow candle, eagerly obtaining a comprehensive knowledge of their contents. Being strongly endowed with mental concentration and a retentive memory, he soon learned to absorb from a book its most valuable features, without the assistance of others, and he thus became a complete example of the self educated man. By his own efforts he obtained a thorough knowledge of German and English, and became quite familiar with Latin and Greek. At the age of eighteen he began to teach school and continued in that avocation from six to eleven months in each year, for eight years, and then engaged in farming at the paternal homestead, where he still resides. Mr. Cassel prospered as a farmer, Early in life he became interested in colonial literature and began to collect rare and valuable books. While teaching school he learned the whereabouts of those now priceless works, which the religious enthusiasts who settled Pennsylvania, brought across the Atlantic. In after life in search of rare volumes, he made many a long trip, partly on foot through Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, Ohio, and the west of the Mississippi river and (C. F.-7.)

beyond. On one of these tours he traveled over 6,000 miles. His sole object in bringing together these literary treasures was a love for books and his desire to study them. So the wonder grew until this plain, unpretentious farmer astonished the historical societies and learned men, when it became known that he owned a library of over 50,000 valuable books, pamphlets, and documents-historical, theological, and scientific. He brought together probably the most complete collection of the Franklin, Saur, Ephrata, and Swenkfelder publications in America. His library establishes the fact that the early Germans in Pennsylvania were the most prolific publishers of books in this country, previous to the revolution. He has many original documents of the literature of the reformation, and first editions of the works of all the principal reformers, the earliest Bibles in many languages, first issue of all the leading newspapers in the American colonies, and a great variety of works on ancient philosophy and archeology. For half a century he wrote for German and English periodicals and furnished a vast amount of valuable historical information to local histories in Pennsylvania and elsewhere. Early in life he was the companion of Watson the annalist, and of I. D. Rupp, the historian, and furnished to them much information. Fearing that his priceless volumes might some day be scattered through many libraries and their value lost to the investigator, Mr. Cassel gave about 28,000 books and documents to the Brethren's Collegiate Institute, at Mount Morris, Ill., and contributed to the Historical Society of Pennsylvania, about 3,000 valuable books and papers relating to the early history of that state; besides making liberal donations to Bridgewater College, Virginia, and a College in Ohio. His library now contains about 8,000 volumes and about 16,000 pamphlets and miscellaneous documents. Mr. Cassel is a very prominent and influential member of the German Baptist or Dunkard Church, and has long held a commanding position in its conferences, but he persistently refused to enter the ministry in answer to the earnest appeals of his brethren, because he loved his studies so much, and because

he thought he was not "called of the Lord." For half a century he has been a wise counsellor in his church, and his decisions on important questions are generally accepted as final. He is universally recognized as the historian of his church. He declined lucrative situations offered him by merchants and by a bank, and twice refused to accept public office. He is the personification of benevolence, and has a gentleness of manner and kindliness of heart which win for him recognition among all classes of people, who find in him a worthy friend and charming companion. Crowning all his noble qualities, is the spirit of humility which shows itself in all his daily acts. He has a certain simple eloquence of speech which is made impressive by his earnestness, and to which is lent an added charm by a slight German accent. He dresses in the plain habit of his brethren, and possesses a clean-cut face which is lit up with intelligence and kindled with enthusiasm when he discourses on his favorite themes. It is one of the best evidences of the complete development of Mr. Cassel's mind and character that he is held in the highest esteem by his prosaic neighbors who care little for books, and everything for the crops and for thrift and economy. This is partly due to the fact that he has thrived by holding the plow himself, and has accumulated a competency, but the universal respect in which he is held by a large circle of acquaintances in all classes of society is mainly due to his sincere and noble character.

The atmosphere of piety pervading his home, the beautiful simplicity of his manners, the endurance of his friendship, and the story of his remarkable career, have kindled a love for him, which is not bounded by the county or the state, but which even extends to foreign lands.

The following is taken from the "Norristown Herald":

"Born and bred among the simple country-folk who make up the population of the German districts of the county, Abraham Harley Cassel is one of the most remarkable men that Montgomery county has produced. He has, strongly developed, the qualities of originality, acquisitiveness and persistence, as may be learned from the story of his life.

"Surrounded by his books in his Lower Salford home, remote from the centres of learning and culture, he presents a most striking personality, indeed. An affection of the eyes prevents him from that close application to his beloved books which would be his choice, and which would be the solace of his old age.

"He can still read a few minutes at a time, glancing in an hour, perhaps, at what would have occupied him ten minutes when his sight was perfect. In this way he is still able to enjoy to a certain extent the accumulations of a lifetime.

"His books and other literary rarities are stored in the upper rooms of his dwelling, which is occupied by himself, his wife, his sister and an unmarried daughter. Visitors mount old-fashioned back stairs, and are ushered at once into one of the rooms containing his treasures. The room is long, low and narrow, containing many thousand volumes. Both sides are lined with drawers to the height of three feet. Above are book-shelves extending entirely around the room. At the ends are Mr. Cassel's worktables, between which extends a sort of partition in the middle of the room, lined on both sides with books, classified into various kinds. In this room there is scarcely space to turn for books.

"The drawers mentioned are filled mostly with books, placed on their edges in rows, for economy of space. In these are also pamphlets and other documents, all disposed so as to take up as little room as possible. In another room adjoining is a somewhat similar arrangement of literary treasures, numbering thousands.

"In the course of a long life Mr. Cassel has received and written many letters. He opens drawer after drawer and shows all that have come to him, fifteen or twenty thousand, preserved and filed away with the most scrupulous care. They are from more than 1200 correspondents, many of them men and women distinguished in the world of letters. He is

a most indefatigable collector, as everything around you indicates.

"Unassuming, and gentle as a woman, Mr. Cassel is a delightful talker. In listening to him you can imagine that he has familarized himself thoroughly with the best thoughts of the multitude of books before you. He is one of the best informed men of his day and he can converse intelligently on almost any subject. His countenance bears the impress of the innocence and simplicity of the Dunkard faith in which he is an earnest believer. You do not attempt to carry on a conversation in the ordinary sense of the term. You simply listen while he tells you, his eye lighted up with enthusiasm, of his matchless collection of books. He takes down reverently a King James Bible, a commentary, or other work, religious, scientific or medical. He shows you that electricity is not the entirely modern science that you believed it, and that there are a hundred English Grammars older than Lindlev Murray.

"You listen enthralled to the flow of words from one who is thoroughly familiar with his subject, knowing more, perhaps, about rare books than any man in America. He hands you down from his shelves old volumes bound in vellum, in parchment, in hog-skin. You take hold of another volume with a shiver, for you feel that there is something weird and uncanny about it as soon as you see it and he informs you that it is bound in human skin. He goes on, showing you his treasures until night falls, and you regret that the time has come to part with one who impresses you as a man of wonderful patience and industry and learning and wisdom and gentleness.

"He still detains you in conversation, and you find yourself, like the listener in Coleridge's 'Ancient Mariner,' held by his 'glittering eye.' He talks of the men he has known, of the various experiences of his long life, of his passion for books and other topics. You finally bid him farewell and go away, wondering where you will find another like him. You have been charmed with the visit, which has opened directly to your eyes that of which you had formed but a faint conception from what you had read or heard."

To Joseph Cassel and Hannah belonged an old family Bible which had been in the Cassel family, and is now in the possession of Solomon K. Grimley, Esq., of Schwenksville, Montgomery county, Pa. It contains some very valuable records to those interested. It appears that it was brought to this country by Johannes Cassel about the year 1686, and was in the possession of Yelles Cassel, of Schriesheim, in der Pfalz, a number of years before it was brought to this country, he being one of the ancestors of the Cassel family, a number of the descendants of whom are located in Bucks and Montgomery counties.

The Bible remained in the Cassel family until about four years ago (1890), at which time it was purchased by Mr. Grimley, having been in the Cassel family between two and three hundred years; it is still in a good condition. It contains complete family records, dating back to the sixteenth century. It is not exactly Luther's translation but a revision of it by Christopher Froschaûer, and printed by him in Zûrich, in the year 1530.

John C. Boorse commenced his business career as farmer, and in 1855 purchased of his father the old homestead and conducted the business pertaining to a large farm until 1866, when he retired from the dull routine of the farm and engaged in the more active duties of surveyor, conveyancer, and Justice of the Peace, the duties of which he still performs to the entire satisfaction of all parties concerned. He entered the political field in the early part of 1855, when he was elected township assessor, which position he filled for eight years. He was elected Justice of the Peace at the spring election in 1862, and has held that office continuously until the present time. He has been one of the school directors of the township for six years, judge of election for two terms, member of the election board for twenty-seven years, a member of the Republican County Committee for at least twelve years, and since the organization of the Republican party has been honored many times with a seat in the councils of its leaders, in the state and county, and has received the most flattering testimonials from the press of the county.

In his official capacity he formulated the charter and made the original survey for the borough of Lansdale. He was one of the original directors of the Lansdale Water Works Company and is the present secretary of the same, a director and secretary of the Lansdale Cemetery Association, one of the original members and secretary of the Towamensing Creamery Association, one of the originators of the Kulpsville Literary and Library Association and one of its active members, a director in the Perkiomen Fire and Storm Insurance Company of Montgomery county, and was the official surveyor of the borough of Lansdale from 1872 to 1881.

He was the originator and prime mover in getting the

first telephone line from Norristown to Kulpsville, via North Wales and Lansdale, with station at his office.

He held the office of Justice of the Peace for twenty-three years, during which time only nineteen cases were returned to court, he always endeavoring to settle them previously. As the Honorable Judge Ross at one time remarked before court: "If all justices of the peace in the county would act like John C. Boorse, of Kulpsville, thousands of dollars would be annually saved to the county in costs."

In 1870 he received the appointment to take the census of Towamensing and Lower Salford townships, which he filled with credit to himself and to the entire satisfaction of the department.

In 1865 he received the unanimous nomination for county commissioner, and ran far ahead of the regular ticket. The Democratic party being then in large majority, he was defeated.

He was also several times strongly urged by the leaders and many others of the party to become a candidate for the Legislature, which honor he positively refused, saying he was "not competent." He was one of the delegates to the state convention held in 1875, in Lancaster, and voted for John F. Hartranft for Governor and Wm. H. Rawle for treasurer. He was an active committeeman in the county's centennial, and is also a member of the Montgomery County Historical Society. Mr. Boorse has always been active in all progressive movements of the age in which his business life has thus far been spent, especially anything tending to improve the morals and intellect of the young and rising generation by whom he is surrounded.

He has in his possession many old documents and manuscripts of his grandfather and great-grandfather. Also the old Bible brought from Germany by his ancestors. He resides on the old homestead, which has been in the Cassels name for several generations (119 years), about a mile west of Kulpsville; has been a heavy dealer in grain and feed.

The following has been found later: Jacob H. Cassel, of Towamencin township, has in his possession numerous old and valuable documents. Among these is a certificate for damages dated 1777, for 696 fence rails destroyed by Washington's army. The document is still in good condition. It reads as follows:

Estimate of damage on the plantation of Henry Cassel, by the army under the command of His Excellency, General Washington, between the 7th and 16th inst.

696 Fence Rails, @ 25c a piece £8.14s.0

We, whose names are undersigned, at the request and desire of Henry Cassel, have taken a strict and careful survey of the damage done to his plantation, and to the best of our knowledge and judgment believe the same to amount to eight pounds and fourteen shillings current Pennsylvania money of Pennsylvania, and we are ready to qualify unto when ealled upon.

Given under our hands on said plantation in Towamen

sing township this 23d October, 1777.

Mr. Cassel is also the possessor of an old German Bible dated 1666. There is only another one known to be in existence, and is therefore very valuable. The one referred to is owned by a wealthy family in Germantown. Mr. Cassel has been offered over a hundred dollars for the Bible. As the book is an heirloom he prizes it highly and refuses to sell it.


Obituary notice from a Mifflin (Juniata county) paper: "It was with sincere regret that we learned last week, too late for notice, of the sudden death of Jacob Bergey, an old and respected citizen of Fayette, and subsequently of this place, but who for the last couple of years has made his home with his sister, Mrs. Richenback, in Philadelphia. Mr. Bergey moved into this county from one of the lower counties, Montgomery, we believe, somewhere in the forties, locating in Fayette, where he farmed and carried on carpentering. From there he moved to town early in the fifties and built the first 'Crystal Palace,' for Sellers, Sulouff & Stambaugh, and was a resident of the town ever since, until he moved to Phil-

adelphia, as stated. During the war and up until '73 or '74 he was engaged in droving, with a man named Harrison Weaver, of an eastern county, as a partner, and had succeeded in amassing a right comfortable competence. But about the latter year, the failure of Weaver, while indebted heavily to him, swept away his entire means, and wrecked his life physically as well as pecuniarily. From that blow he never re-From that time on life has been a hard struggle with him. But he manfully strove to make the best of everything, and resumed his trade of carpentering, in which in his early life he was a master hand, and when in health was never idle. The successive deaths a few years ago and but a short time apart of his brothers, Enos and Samuel, from paralysis, seemed still more to wreck his life, already seriously impaired by growing infirmity, and doubtless prompted him to leave Juniata for his sister's home in Philadelphia. for several weeks prior to his death he had seemed to fail rapidly, and on that day, the 28th ult., had started out for a short walk to take air, when he was first seen by an officer, sitting on a door-step speechless, and to the officer unknown. He was taken in an ambulance to the German Hospital, which was close by, where he received proper medical care, but remained unconscious and died in a few hours. Information, obtained from papers in his pocket, was sent to Daniel K. Cassel, who recognized him and notified the family. death was attributed to paralysis, which seemed to have been a family inheritance. In all his dealings Mr. Bergey was an honest and upright man, and possessed the confidence and respect of all who knew him, who sincerely regret his wrecked life and sudden death." He was buried at the New Britain Mennonite meeting-house, at Line Lexington, Bucks county, Pa."

Daniel K. Cassel was employed on his father's farm and learned the art of linen weaving with his father. In his youth he received a limited education, such as the country schools afforded at that time, and that only in reading, writing and arithmetic, which he acquired by going to school about forty to fifty days in a year. He devoted his leisure time in studying his lessons at home and mostly in the evenings, many a time till midnight, so that he acquired more knowledge through his own exertions at home than in school. age of nineteen he was urged by the residents of his neighborhood to take charge of a school, which he accepted. But he soon felt his incompetency; therefore, at the close of the term he entered a select school for one term. He has been engaged in teaching in public schools for twenty years, during which time he devoted all his spare time, and many a

night till midnight, to his studies, in order to enable him to teach the higher branches, viz.; grammar, geography and the higher branches of mathematics, which he introduced in his school. He also served in the school board four years, during which time he was urged to accept the office of County Superintendent of Public Schools, which he positively declined, not being an aspirant for office nor a politician, but always voting the Republican ticket. He voted for every Republican candidate for President since William H. Harrison, the "Tippicanoe." He has in his library a large collection of old and rare works, and many rare manuscripts, among them a volume of a full Polyglot Bible, printed in 1599, in twelve languages, probably the only copy in America. He has an extensive correspondence throughout this country, also with Germany and Holland. He is conversant in the English and German languages, also the Dutch or Holland language, and the rudiments of Latin and French. He wrote and had printed a work entitled, "History of the Mennonites," in the English language, and afterward the same revised and enlarged and printed in the German language. He is also the author of three genealogical works, viz.: the Cassel Family, the Kolb Family and the Rittenhouse Family. He is chairman of the Rittenhouse Genealogical Committee, and a direct descendant of William Rittenhouse, the first Mennonite Bishop in America. He is also a shareholder and member of Bethel College, in Kansas, a Mennonite Theological Institute. He has also been active in Sunday school work, and organized the Sunday school at Alderfer's, below Harleysville, Montgomery county, Pa., about 1855, being the first Sunday school in that vicinity, which has been kept up ever since; he also organized a German Sunday school at Chester, Delaware county, Pa., with success. He was also one of a committee of five appointed to draw up preamble and resolutions protesting against the Catholics marching into the Centennial grounds free and carrying the Papal flag in 1876. He resides in Nicetown, Philadelphia, near Wayne Junction, and is a member of the Mennonite church. He is a member of the

Montgomery County Historical Society, also a life-member of the American Archaeological and Asiatic Association of Iowa. He was also appointed a delegate to the Denominational Congress to the World's Exhibition at Chicago, in 1893, nominated by A. Harmer, member of Congress.

From the Norristown "Herald" of December 5, 1895:

"Two representatives of this paper, in response to a cordial invitation from the well-known local historian, Mr. Daniel Kolb Cassel, spent an afternoon last week in a visit to him at his residence, 4333 Germantown avenue. His home is one of a row of modern three-story brick houses on that thoroughfare, located in the lower portion of Germantown.

"Mr. Cassel's labors in the field of genealogy, especially those in connection with the Rittenhouse family, have given him a reputation in this line, and he has hosts of visitors, several persons calling to obtain information during the stay of his Norristown guests. As he is social in disposition and rarely fails to obtain valuable information from his visitors, he does not seem to regard the matter in the light of an annoyance.

"Many persons come to purchase copies of his numerous publications. Others wish to learn facts in reference to the genealogy of their family, in which Mr. Cassel, so far as relates to those of Pennsylvania German descent, is probably the best informed man in this state, if not in the whole country.

"Mr. Cassel is now past seventy-five years of age, having been born April 22, 1820, in Upper Salford township. As he grew to manhood he was employed on the farm and in linen weaving, receiving only the limited education which country schools at that time afforded, supplemented by faithful study at home. He engaged in teaching at nineteen, continuing his studies in order to perfect himself. He served in the township School Board, and was known as a progressive and earnest director. He was a Whig, and later a Republican, voting for every candidate of those parties for President, commencing with Clay in 1844. The bent of his mind to-

wards authorship early displayed itself, and he has been for many years an indefatigable collector of facts relating to local history and genealogy. To accomplish this, very long journeys have been necessary, on which occasions he has incidentally sold many copies of his published works. He is familiar with the Pennsylvania German, English, German and Dutch languages, and has some knowledge of Latin and French.

"His best-known works include 'History of the Mennonites,' printed in German as well as English; 'The Cassel Family,' 'The Kolb or Kulp Family,' and 'The Rittenhouse Family.' The last three are mainly genealogical. He is a direct descendant of William Rittenhouse, the first Mennonite Bishop in America.

"Mr. Cassel has been honored by the Mennonite Church, to whose faith he adheres. In 1893 he was a delegate to the Parliament of Religions at Chicago. He has been active in Sunday school work.

"He married, February 16, 1845, Elizabeth Kolb, of Harleysville, who is a few years younger than himself. Their children are Simeon K. Cassel, Skippackville; Jonas K. Cassel, who has traveled much in the West, and is now in Denver; and Abel K. Cassel, of Philadelphia, Secretary and Manager of the Dairymen's Protective Association, and Deputy Food Commissioner. All three are married, but none, up to the present time, have given any particular evidence of inheriting the genealogical and historical tastes of their father.

"Mr. Cassel is a remarkable man in many respects. Practically self-taught, he is a very industrious worker. He has collected a large and valuable library. It contains many old and rare volumes and manuscripts. Among his books is a volume of a full Polyglot Testament in twelve languages, printed at Nüremburg, by Elia Hutteri, in 1599, there being only one other copy in existence in this country—in the New York Bible House. Physically, he is robust and very active for a man of his years. He is genial and kindly in disposition, his deep interest in literary pursuits having operated to pre-

serve him to a green old age. His travels in connection with his genealogical researches have no doubt contributed to the maintenance of the apparently perfect health which he enjoys.

"A native of this county, Mr. Cassel continues to take a lively interest in everything relating to it. He is an active member of the Montgomery County Historical Society, and is frequently in attendance at its meetings.

"The work of preparing the Cassel history was at first undertaken by Mr. Cassel's brother, Samuel K. Cassel, now deceased. His health failing, he handed over all his material to Daniel, who consented to complete it. In an introductory note to the work he says:

"'We present the history of an ancestry whereof we are justly proud and whom we ever delight to honor. We present the history of a people whose memory posterity may cherish and whose virtues the world may well emulate. Every man, every hour of his life, whether consciously or unconsciously, is making history, and either that history is to his credit or it is not. May the Cassel posterity ever bear this truth in their hearts and so live that the history of the future shall be to them an honor and a blessing.'

"Mr. Cassel is a fine specimen of the race from which he has sprung. Plain, practical and unassuming in manner, he illustrates by his long and useful life the advantage of the practice of the sturdy virtues inherited from a long line of Montgomery county Mennonite ancestors."



PART SECOND.

DESCENDANTS OF YELLES CASSEL, BROTHER OF HUPERT.

I 1700 I Julius, or Yelles Cassel, came to America in the ship Friendship, on the 16th of October, 1727, with his brother, John Cassel, after a passage of four months from Rotterdam.

He was a brother of Hupert, who came in 1715 or 1720 from Kriesheim, as the will of Hupert Cassel will show. This Hupert, Julius, or Yelles, and John were grandsons of Yelles, the preacher at Kriesheim, which is beyond a doubt, because they came from the same town, and brought many of the books and old original manuscripts of Yelles, the preacher, which are yet in the possession of Abraham H. Cassel, the antiquary at Harleysville, Montgomery county, Pa. After the arrival of Yelles or Julius Cassel in America he settled in Skippack township, Montgomery county, Pa., and lived with his brother Hupert in Skippack, then called "Bebberstown," who divided his farm with him, and at once erected buildings thereon. It is also said he had been a preacher in the Mennonite church, at Skippack, Montgomery county, Pa. He died about 1750.

Soon after his marriage he bought a farm of one hundred and six acres of land in Hilltown, Bucks county, Pa. It appears he was a man of limited means. The greater portion of the purchase money was advanced and secured on first mortgage, on the delivery of the deed to Hupert Cassel, by Rev. Christian Funk, of Franconia township; the mortgage, however, was satisfied in the year 1763. Hupert Cassel was a brother to Barbara, wife of Rev. Christian Funk. Again, in the year 1775, this same Hupert Cassel bought another tract adjoining the aforesaid one hundred and six acres, containing about seventy-two acres, of Philip Fluck and Christian Kern.

I found the following recorded in docket No. 8, in the office of the Orphans' Court of Philadelphia. [AUTHOR.]

Know all men by these presents, that we, John Kassell, of Worcester township, in the county of Philadelphia, yeoman, Jacob Umstet, of Perkiomen and Skippack township, in the said county, yeomen; Melchior Waggoner, of Worcester, aforesaid, yeoman, are held and firmly bound unto Christian Funk, of Franconia township, in the said county, yeoman, and Barbara, his wife, one of the children of Julius Kassell, late of Worcester, aforesaid, yeoman, deceased, in the sum of seventy-four pounds, lawful money of Pennsylvania, to be paid unto the said Christian Funk and Barbara, his wife, their certain attorney, executors, administrators or assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made and done, we do bind ourselves and each of our heirs.

The 10th day of June, 1769, before me, James Humphrey, clerk of the said orphans' court, came and appeared Christian Funk, the obligee in the within bond named, and acknowledged to have received from the within named John Kassell the just and full sum of thirty-seven pounds, in full satisfaction of the said bond and interest, and therefore doth hereby discharge the said John Kassell, Jacob Umstet and Melchior Waggoner, and every of them of and from the same.

In witness whereof he hath hereunto set his hand the day and year aforesaid. Christian Funk.

REV. CHRISTIAN FUNK.

Rev. Christian Funk, son of Bishop Heinrich Funk, was born in Franconia township, Montgomery county, Pa., 1731, married Barbara Cassel, daughter of Yelles Cassel, 1757, and was called to the ministry in Franconia, about the same time. Mr. Funk lived in the township of Franconia, near Indian creek. He was a man of considerable native ability and force of character who had interested himself more in public affairs than his ministerial brethren; and was of a progressive tone of mind that was in advance of his times in that neighborhood.

The writers of our local history have hitherto chosen to ignore the fact that among the non-resistant societies there was not only indisposition to engage in military affairs, which would be indeed expected, as in accordance with their religious principles, but that large portions of them actually sympthized with Great Britain, hoped for the success of the troops of King George, and refused, until compelled, to pay taxes to the American authorities. The animosities engendered by this state of things have happily passed away.

Before giving the account of Christian Funk's difficulties with his brethren, it may be as well to notice his father, Henry Funk, one of the leaders of his people, and a man evidently of culture and mental powers above the average of those who came with him to Franconia. Some of his descendants even may not be aware that he essayed authorship and wrote several books, which must have been of some merit, or they would not have received the attention they did, or have been reprinted so many times. His biographer, Samuel W. Pennypacker, Esq., says he was one of the most able and enterprising of the Mennonite preachers, and was long a Bishop.

He settled on Indian creek, Franconia township, in 1719. He was ever faithful and zealous in his work, and did much to advance the interest of his church. He wrote a book upon baptism, entitled "Ein Spiegel der Taufe," published by Saur, in 1744, which has passed through at least five editions. A more ambitious effort was the "Erklärung einiger hauptpunk-

ten des gesetzes," published after his death, by Armbruster, in 1763. This book was reprinted at Biel, Switzerland, in 1844, and at Lancaster, Pa., in 1862, and is much esteemed. He and Dillman Kolb supervised the translation of Van Braght's "Martyr's Mirror," from the Dutch to German. Henry Funk died in 1760.

About the year 1774 the trouble with England commenced. Several acts had been passed by the king, one of which was intended to raise a duty or tax on imported mer-The Americans refused their consent; they petitioned to the king against them, but no notice was taken of it by him. Merchandise was, however, sent over and an effort made to force the Americans into it. This circumstance was the cause of a military force being sent over from England. An army was now raised by the several provinces and a congress called. Pennsylvania, however, at this stage was at rest, not being under the king's government. This province had been ceded to William Penn a considerable time before on account of services rendered to the Crown by his father, Admiral Penn, who had also money advanced to the Crown, and after his death it fell to his son, William Penn, a Quaker, who caused it to be known in Europe that he had lands to dispose of in Pennsylvania, that liberty of conscience was granted to all who settled on them; that no man was compelled to bear arms or take the oath on account of which our fathers left Europe and settled in this wilderness.

In the year 1776 a meeting was held in Franconia township for the purpose of choosing three men, who were to attend a delegation from other parts of the province to deliberate whether Pennsylvania should join the other provinces, which were already engaged in the war, and to consent and acknowledge the independence from England. This naturally brought Christian Funk into an unnecessary reflection—that our liberty might be endangered; and although he never before attended a township meeting, he resolved to attend this. On his arrival he found that nearly the whole township had

assembled, composed of nearly two-thirds Mennonites, and the remainder people from other churches, and others.

Christian Funk expressed his opinion that the Mennonites could not interfere in tearing themselves loose from the king; that he was the head and protector of Pennsylvania, and we should submit to the three acts because we acknowledged ourselves a defenceless people.

Pennsylvania, however, united herself with her sister provinces, and after the Declaration of Independence, our former constitution, as established by Penn, was done away and the authority of our former Governor and Assembly annulled. Soon after a new government was established in Pennsylvania (united with the Congress), under which circumstances the liberty granted by William Penn was taken away from the defenceless people, because under all kings' governmens no liberty of conscience was established by their constitutions.

At this time the new government was established in Pennsylvania. But the Congress and American government was rejected as rebellious, and the king acknowledged by many of Christian Funk's accusers, under the idea that Congress would soon be overpowered. This Congress prepared and adopted a constitution for Pennsylvania which guaranteed to all religious societies liberty of conscience in worshiping Almighty God according to their own convictions, as was promised by William Penn to our forefarthers in Europe. This Congress also laid a tax of three pounds and ten shillings, but many of the defenceless people opposed the paying of this tax, and believed Congress would soon be overpowered; but Christian Funk gave it as his opinion that they ought to pay it, and this caused much dissatisfaction between them. He also was accused for expressing himself favorable to Congress. This difference of opinion caused a division in the church, for which Christian Funk was suspended in about 1778. After the close of the war, in 1783, they still kept him under suspension. He made several attempts to

effect a reunion with the church, even as late as 1807, but it appears no reunion could have been brought about. For further information on this subject see a small work entitled "A Mirror for All Mankind," written by Christian Funk, and "History of Harleysville and Lower Salford," by James Y. Heckler. Christian Funk died in 1811, aged 80 years, and is buried in Delp's grave-yard, in Franconia, and his wife Barbara died December 29, 1792.

John C. Cassel, third son of John B. and Catharine Cassel, was born in Montgomery county, Pennsylvania, December 23, 1839. He received his education in the township schools, and at the age of sixteen was apprenticed to a carpenter, although his great desire was to study medicine. He remained at his trade until he was twenty years of age, when he came to Philadelphia. While here the difficulties which caused the civil war were agitating the people, and with the breaking out of the civil war he was one of the first to enlist in response to the call for volunteers for three months. the expiration of the three months he reënlisted for three years as Corporal of Co. G, Fifth Pennsylvania Cavalry, and finally, on November 21, 1864, Governor Andrew G. Curtin commissioned him as Lieutenant of the same company, which position he maintained until the close of the war. He was a man of amiable disposition, and was much beloved by the men of his company.


He married Isadora R. Garrison, a public school teacher of Philadelphia, January 24, 1867. The issue of this marriage was four children, Clement C., Harriet Florence, Lydia, and Alma B.

His constitution was undermined by exposure in the army, where he contracted malaria, which developed into valvular affection of the heart, from which he died January 19, 1881.

He was an active member of Post 2, G. A. R., and was buried at Deerfield, N. J., January 25th, with military honors.

Amos H. Cassel, son of Joseph and Rebecca Cassel, was born June 23, 1830. In his youth he received an ordinary common school education. Later he entered Treemount Seminary, at Norristown, Pa., under the care of Rev. Samuel Aaron, where he served some time as assistent teacher. In later years he entered Dartmouth College, where in 1857 he graduated with high distinction. He died March 2, 1858, of pulmonary disease, at Norritonville, Montgomery county, Pa., in the 28th year of his age. His last request was that Rev. Samuel Aaron should preach his funeral sermon. The deceased while under the kind and fostering care of his Alma Mater, made use of his literary advantages with faithfulness and diligence. Always educated in sight of models of the strictest purity and integrity, and under a domestic training which inculcated the purest virtue both of heart and mind, he became exemplary in all his actions and manifested an uncommonly high appreciation of justice, honor and truth. In his relations of life he was sprightly and cheerful, and his varied attainments, his fine conversational powers, his evident desire to please, and, above all, his exceeding kindness of heart, made him beloved by all who knew him. He was a man of great talents, and wrote many articles for the press, especially during the campaigns of Col. Fremont and Horace Greeley, being an active Republican. He was also a very good poet. The following are specimens of his poems, as originally written by him on different occasions.

A horrible and fatal accident happened to Henry C. Kulp, of near Salfordville, on Thursday afternoon, December 13, 1894. He was burning brush in his son's field, and it is supposed that the fire was spreading too much and he tried to trample it out, when his pants caught fire; and in going backwards about twenty feet he fell over a log, where his body was found burned almost to a crisp. All his clothing, except his hat and shoes, were burned off the body, and the body presented a horrible sight. The deceased was not missed till toward evening, and then a search was instituted and his son's hired man found him by the light of a lantern. The coat was found near by also somewhat burned. The ground where the body was found showed marks that the deceased struggled terribly with the fire-fiend before death came. Squire W. S. Slotterer held an inquest, and the following composed the Coroner's jury: Dr. P. O. Wickert, H. R. Gabel, M. M. Kremer, Jere. S. Shelly, Henry Weber and P. R. Cressman. The verdict rendered was accidental death. The surviving children are Henry, with whom he lived; Mrs. Henry Garges, of Elroy; Mrs. C. S. Bergey, of Bergey. The deceased was a quiet and highly esteemed citizen, and was almost 40 years a deacon in the Salford Mennonite congregation. He was 82 years, 2 months and 24 days of age. The funeral was held last Sunday, and the remains were buried at the Salford Mennonite meeting house in the presence of a very large concourse of people. Revs. Henry S. 

William Price was born August 29, 1789, on part of the ancient homestead, and early in life, when working with his father on the farm, manifested an eager desire for knowledge, occupying all spare moments in reading and other studies. He had made great progress in learning, when, in his sixteenth year, he was apprenticed to the tailoring trade, which he followed until arriving at manhood. Then he was requested to take charge of a school, in which employment he continued for several years. In 1813, when twenty-four years old, he was married to Mary Reiff, daughter of John Reiff, and commenced farming. William and Mary Price had ten children born to them, seven of whom are living—Mary, wife of John Fisher, of Pottstown; Timothy, residing at Annville, Lebanon county, now deceased; Elizabeth intermarried with Samuel H. Cassel, of Harleysville, Pa.; Sophia married to Ignatius Karn, of Limerick; Magdalen, wife of Abraham Heckler, of Franconia; Catharine, living in Philadelphia; and Benjamin, of Springfield, Bucks county.

In 1814, Rev. William W. Price was elected to the ministry, and about 1830 was advanced to the office of elder or bishop, which position he filled with untiring zeal and unflinching faithfulness until the day of his death, which occurred August 7, 1849, in his sixtieth year. He was for many years an esteemed elder of the Brethren Church at Indian creek. Of him it may well be said, "He preached the word; was instant in season and out of season," sowing the divine seed on every side. Besides the care of a large family, and a faithful discharge of duties to his charge at home, he traveled much as an evangelist, visiting surrounding churches and assisting them at communion seasons. Occasionally he took missionary journeys to other states, once at least through Ohio before modern facilities of travel had been established, going in his own conveyance and at his own expense, thus

practically enforcing the precept, "Freely ye have received, freely give.

As he was a preacher of more than ordinary gifts, he answered many calls from outside his own people to labor in the work of the ministry. He had a powerful voice, retentive memory, a thorough understanding of the science of music, and sang with great compass and power. He was also a poet of no mean ability, and wrote a number of hymns and several poems of considerable length, all in German. He also had published at Ephrata, in 1838, a collection of German hymns, many of them being translations by him of popular English ones, with a large number of his own composing. He wrote a poem of some length on the promises to the patriarch Abraham, and another on the history of the prophecies, which have never been published.

Joseph K. Gotwals has been connected with the Norristown public schools since 1860, and has been superintendent since 1872.

Jos. K. Gotwals, at present superintendent of the public schools of Norristown, was born in Lower Providence township, Montgomery county, Pa., October 15, 1832 He received his early education in the public schools of his native township. He was under the tuition of the Rev. H. S. Rodenbaugh, pastor of Lower Providence Presbyterian Church, four terms. He also attended the Millersville State Normal School, and was among the first students of this institution.

In September, 1853, he commenced teaching in the public schools of Silver Creek, Schuylkill county, Pa., where he taught eight months. The following year he commenced teaching in his native township, where he taught several years. In the spring of 1859 he went to the Arcadian Insti-

tute, at Orwigsburg, for the purpose of reviewing some of the higher branches. He remained at this institution as teacher and student until the fall of 1860, when he was elected principal of the Cherry street public school, Norristown. From this place he was promoted to a grammar grade, from which he was elected principal of the Boy's High School, in 1865. This position he held until he was elected superintendent of the schools in 1872, the position he still holds He received the honorary degree of A. M. from Franklin and Marshall College. Since 1872 he has been an elder in the First Presbyterian Church, at Norristown.

Rev. Henry A. Hunsicker married Annie C. Gotwals on May 11, 1876, it being his second marriage. He was born near Trappe, Montgomery county, Pa., November 10, 1825, spent his boyhood days on his father's farm, and had only the limited advantages of the country schools of that time. obtained his Alma Mater under Rev. Henry S. Rodenbaugh. In 1848 he and his father founded "Freeland Seminary," an educational institution designed for young men and boys. He at once became the principal of the school, and three years later the proprietor. He continued as principal of this school until 1865, when he leased the school and property to A. N Fetterolf, one of his assistants, for five years. During the time of his lease to Prof. F. he sold the school property to Rev. J. H. A. Bomberger, D. D., of Philadelphia, who, in connection with other enterprising persons, obtained a charter and founded Ursinus College. In 1850 Mr. Hunsicker was ordained to the ministry of the (New School) Mennonite Church, after the establishing of an independent church, known as Trinity Christian, of which he was one of the founders, and for which he continued to preach until 1875. Freeland G. Hobson was born in Upper Providence township, Montgomery county, October 13, 1857. He took a full classical course in Ursinus College, graduating in the class 1876. He then entered the law office of his uncle, Jacob V. Gotwalts, at that time District Attorney of Montgomery county, and was admitted to the bar, October 1, 1880. He has been very successful in his profession, confining himself to the civil practice, although in 1890 he successfully defended Antonio Frederick, charged with murder. He is at present Solicitor for Collegeville borough, Ursinus College, and a number of prominent corporations.

He is Treasurer and Trust Officer of The Norristown Title, Trust and Safe Deposit Company, having held this position since its institution in 1888, and largely to his ability is due the proud position occupied by this institution to-day.

He is founder and publisher of the *Montgomery County Law Reporter*, which is now in its twelfth volume. Hon. Singleton Mercer Ashenfelter, born in Reading, Pa., May 9, 1844, married Nettie A. Bennett, November 21, 1872. P. O., Colorado Springs, Colorado. Mr. Ashenfelter is a descendant in direct line of Ludovic Eshenfelder, whose name appears on the Revolutionary militia rolls of Philadelphia county, and who, by deed executed in eastern Montgomery county, in 1775, is described as "Ludwig Eshenfelder, yeoman." THE JOHANNES (JOHN) CASSEL FAMILY.

Family I Johannes Kassel, or John Cassel, came to I America with his brother Julius, or Yelles, in the ship Friendship, from Rotterdam, on the 16th of October, 1727, and they stayed with their brother Hupert,

> in Skippack, Montgomery county, Pa., for a short time.

John then moved to Lancaster county, Pa., and settled in the vicinity of Columbia, in Hempfield township. Yelles and John were brothers, and also grandsons of Yelles, the Mennonite preacher at Kriesheim, Germany, between Manheim and Worms, in the Palatinate (Pfalz). And as it appears from the records that the name "Abraham" was so common among them, and each of the brothers had a son Abraham, we are led to believe that their father's name might have been Abraham, and a son of Yelles, the preacher at Kriesheim. They all came from Kriesheim, and were members of the Mennonite church. They brought with them many valuable papers, manuscripts and poems, written by Yelles Cassel, at Kriesheim. Many of them are yet in the library of Abraham H. Cassel, at Harleysville, Montgomery county, Pa.

Alexander Harris, in his Biographical History of Lancaster County, Pa., says: "Abraham Cassel and an elder brother emigrated to Lancaster county in about 1750." I made a thorough search, and find that no Abraham Cassel left

Montgomery or Philadelphia county at that time. The first Abraham was a son of Hupert Cassel, was born in 1734, lived, died, is buried at Salford Mennonite meeting house, and was my great-grandfather (Daniel K. Cassel). There is no doubt but what the Abraham Cassel mentioned by A. Harris, who located with his elder brother at Sporting Hill, in Rapho township, was a son of John, who left his brothers Hupert and Yelles at Skippack, Montgomery county, Pa., and settled in the vicinity of Columbia, in Hempfield township, Lancaster county, Pa.

I have also examined the deed given by Deborah Norris, of Philadelphia, to Abraham Cassel, of Hempfield township, county of Lancaster, for 560 acres of land, dated the 29th day of August, 1747, and is recorded in Book G, Volume 5, page 355, etc. The patent for that tract is dated 1 day, 4 mo. June, 1734. Recorded at Philadelphia in Patent Book A, Volume 6, page 327.

The subject of this sketch was the youngest child of Henry Cassel, and was born January 28, 1810, on a farm, the buildings of which are standing near the eastern boundary of the borough of Marietta, Lancaster county, Pa., and where he now resides.

When he was quite young his father sold forty-five acres of his farm, which was laid out into town lots, for fifty-eight thousand five hundred dollars.

Soon after this, by the failure of the Marietta and Susquehanna Trading Company, his father lost the greater portion of his fortune, and on account of this failure, when he was eleven or twelve years of age we find him working at a small country store, at Bainbridge, Lancaster county, where he remained about three years. His early education was under the care of Messrs. Jefferies and Rankin, most of his studying being done after the store closed at night.

At the age of fifteen he was apprenticed to a hatter, Mr. David Ferrees, where he acquired the trade in two years. After working a year or more at journey work, he and Mr. John Barr formed a partnership, bought the business and carried it on for a number of years, when he bought Mr Barr out and carried it on himself for a number of years more, and finally sold the business to Mr. John Crull.

In 1834, when the public school system was introduced into Pennsylvania, he was one of the first school director elected in his district, and did much to overcome the opposition of having a school tax levied upon the people. He served in this capacity off and on for ten years.

During the winter of 1836 the Marietta Lyceum was organized, in which he took a very active part, and was an attendant for many years.

In 1837 he was elected to the State Legislature. It was during this term that the famous "Buckshot War" occurred. During this session a number of important banking laws were passed.

He with a number of others organized the Susquehanna Institute (a stock company), as a school of higher education, which was afterwards sold and conducted as a private school.

During the year 1840 he took an active part in the organization and incorporation of the Pioneer Fire Company, in which organization he was an officer until 1868; fourteen years of this time he was Treasurer.

He also took an active part in the organization of the Marietta and Lancaster Turnpike Company, of which he is President.

In 1847 he married Mary Jane Stahl, the eldest daughter of Jacob Stahl, by whom he had seven children, of which only two, Henry Burd and George Lincoln, survive.

During the year 1854 he was one of the number who formed a stock company and edited and published for a few years a weekly paper called "The Mariettian." This was afterwards sold, and is known at present as "The Marietta Register." He also served during the period occupied in building the Presbyterian Church as a member of the building committee In 1865 he was ordained as an elder in the Presbyterian Church, in which capacity he continues to serve.

After disposing of his hatting business, he entered the lumber business, in which he is interested at the present time.

Many years he served as a member of the town council, until he refused to allow his name to go before the people for re-election. In politics he was first an Anti-Mason, then a Whig, until the organization of the Republican party, when he became an adherent to the principles of that great party.

Thus we find him, a man nearly eighty-five years of age, after a busy, useful and prosperous career, retiring from active

business, in fair health, to a life of well earned leisure and rest.

The following is taken from the Marietta Times:

DEATH OF A RESPECTED AND HONORED CITIZEN.

Hon. Abram Neff Cassel, senior member of the lumber firm of A. N. Cassel & Son, died on Saturday morning, December 28, 1895, at his residence on Third street, death resulting from the infirmities of age, aged 85 years and 11 months.

Deceased was born in Marietta, January 28, 1810, and was a son of the late Henry Cassel, one of the pioneers in the lumber trade on the Susquehanna river, and who was at one time the owner of the ground on which the eastern part of Marietta now stands.

The subject of this sketch, at the age of eleven years left school and accepted a position as clerk in a store at Bainbridge. At the end of three years he returned to Marietta and became an apprentice to a hatter, which business he in a very short time learned, and afterwards carrying it on successfully himself for a long time. During this time he pursued his studies under direction of teachers employed by himself and his companions, who availed themselves of evening hours, their only leisure time. Mr. Cassel made very rapid progress in his studies, and was noted for his fondness for logic and literature.

In 1848 Mr. Cassel retired from the hatter's business and engaged in the lumber trade, in which he was remarkably successful. He continued the business up to the present time, though for several years past he did not give it his active personal attention. In 1834 he was elected one of the first school directors under the common school law of the state, having been an earnest and active advocate of the system. He continued director until 1845.

In 1837 he was elected to the Legislature on the Whig ticket and served during the sessions of 1837, 1838 and 1839, when he aided in framing important laws under the Constitu-

tion of 1838. He also served for a number of years in the Borough Council, and was looked upon as the leading member of council.

In politics he was a staunch Whig, but since 1856 has been an ardent Republican. In county conventions and in local political meetings he was long a prominent figure. He was foremost in all matters relating to the welfare of the borough, a strong advocate of the public schools, and was one of the strongest debaters in Marietta Lyceum of Natural History. Being an exact and profound thinker, though not fluent, he generally carried his point by his logical arguments. He was one of the incorporators of the Lancaster and Marietta Turnpike Company, and was its president until the last few years, when he refused to act, but remained a member of the board until his death. He was at the time of his death a member of the board of the Marietta Cemetery Association.

Originally he was in religious faith a Mennonite, but in 1848 joined the Marietta Presbyterian Church, of which he was a Ruling Elder for over thirty years.

In 1847 Mr. Cassel united in marr age with Miss Mary Jane Stahl, daughter of the late Jacob Stahl, and she and two of their seven children survive—Henry Burd Cassel, his father's partner and the present Republican County Chairman, and Dr. George Lincoln Cassel, who has offices in Lancaster and Philadelphia.

Mr. Cassel was a remarkable man in many ways Though he quit school when quite young, he did not abandon study, but continued it even when pressed with other duties. He was a reader of the latest solid literature of the day, with which he made himself master. Even when he arrived at the age when men usually retire from business, he kept steadily at work, managing his extensive lumber business and other interests. He was a man of a sunny, genial nature, social in his habits, and in the business world was regarded as possessing sterling integrity. He had strong convictions and lived up to them. His counsel and advice was frequently sought, and was always cheerfully given. He was the friend

of everybody. He was exceedingly generous, and the poor of the town have lost their best friend. In his death Marietta has lost a valuable citizen.

The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon, from his late residence, and was largely attended. Rev. A. T. Stewart, pastor of the Presbyterian Church of this place, and Rev. John McElmoyle, formerly pastor in this place, now pastor of the Presbyterian Church of Elkton, Maryland, officiated. Interment was made in Marietta Cemetery. The pall-bearers were three elders of the Church, S. P. Sterrett, John Swiler and Joseph L. Brandt, and three deacons, Abram Summy, I. S. Geist and George Mable.
