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

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PREFACE.

To preserve to the scattered individuals of the race some memorial of their progenitors, this account of the emigrant Bascom and his descendants has been prepared. In the summer of 1862, while passing a few days in the little town of Orleans on the outer shore of Cape Cod, I was shown the last resting place of one of the early ministers—the revered Jonathan Bascom. With a minuteness as laudable as, unfortunately, it is infrequent, the engraver had placed upon the tombstone the name of the dead man's birth-place, an obscure town in central Connecticut. A year later, a visit to that place afforded opportunity for a careful inspection of the town and church records. From the facts there gathered, augmented by others furnished me by the few individuals of the name whom I chanced to know, the nucleus was formed for the genealogy contained in the following pages. Encouraged by the hearty assistance extended to me on all sides, I was tempted to extend the limits of the proposed sketch and include all of the male branches of the family, so far as they could be reached.

The genealogist, in the prosecution of his work, meets with peculiar difficulties. He must contend with an indifference amounting in many cases to total neglect; with the carelessness of his correspondents, and with conflicting statements, traditions and records. Out of the mass of material finally accumulated he must arrange, select and collate; discard what is improper or unfit for publication; and at the last produce a result which shall be intelligible, and, above all, reliable. Entire accuracy in a work of this kind is impossible. Despite all care it is to be feared that mistakes will be detected in the following pages. Family records sometimes have differed in the different branches, and frequently both vary from those of town or county: then, too, much of the information has been communicated

by letter, and in many cases hasty transcripts from the family record, or indecipherable chirography, should bear the blame if errors be found in the print.

Within my necessarily circumscribed limits it has been found impossible to include more than the briefest notices of individuals. In many cases there will be found simply the bare dates and names, for more seemed unattainable except by long delay and much trouble, few families being more widely scattered, or more roving in their tendencies, than this.

Comparatively few of the male members of previous generations have been completely lost sight of, and it is believed that with rare exceptions, all in the United States, bearing by right the family name of Bascom, can, by simply supplying the given names of parents or grand-parents, connect directly with one of the lines found in the following pages.

Much difficulty was experienced in collecting information of a portion of the Fourth Line. In the biography of the late Methodist Bishop, Henry-Bidleman Bascom, mention is made of a "genealogical tree" in the possession of the family, but its present hiding place no perseverance of mine has been able to discover. Search was instituted, at my request, in the Surrogate Files of all the old New-York State counties for the will of his grandfather, and without success. The account of this very interesting branch of the family is consequently defective.

Commenced and carried to completion in the leisure hours scantily accorded by a crowded profession, there has been to me an indescribable pleasure in the preparation of this genealogy. Imperfect as it is, there are those to whom it will come who, I know, will give it their warmest greeting—some far along on the journey of life, who, glancing down the long list of names, will recall here and there the form of one now far distant, or of another long since laid with his fathers; and memory with such will clothe the dead once more with the old virtues and with the old failings, both alike, perchance, long since forgotten. And of the young, too, there are some to whom fancy will paint the sturdy forms of their ancestors, of whose very names they have till now been ignorant, and whose resting place no man knoweth.

I cannot close without recording the peculiar kindnesses of a

few who have greatly aided me in the compilation of the necessary material. Mr. Charles Wright, now deceased, was among the first, and had his life been spared, I doubt not the manuscript, which for three years has been ready for the press, would long since have appeared. To Prof. John Bascom, of Williamstown, Mass., and to Alonzo Bascom, Esq., of Jaffrey, N. H., I have been largely indebted for their hearty interest, as well as for the generous pecuniary aid guaranteed by them in the publication of the work. Simon C. Phillips, Esq., of Greenfield, Mass., and Prof. William F. Bascom, of Washington, D. C., both among my earliest helpers, have furnished valuable records of their respective lines; and to the extreme kindness of Miss Elizabeth C. Bascom, of Newport, N. H., I am indebted for very material assistance in the preparation of the branch there located.

The method of arrangement adopted in the following pages will be readily understood by the reader. For the sake of convenience, and in order to keep those of near relationship in proximity, it was thought advisable to divide the work into parts. Thus Part I. includes the descent through the oldest line; Part II. through the second line, the separation occurring in the third generation; and Parts III., IV. and V. through the third, fourth and fifth lines, the separations occurring in the fourth generation. Under the respective male heads of families will be found arranged in tabular form the names of the children, each with a distinctive numeral which is retained throughout. Thus on page 17, the issue of 21. Samuel and Mary Bascom of the Fifth Generation are 24. Thomas, b. &c.; on the next page, under the heading of the Sixth Generation, is found the family of this Thomas with the numerals (21) 24 prefixed, (21) being the distinctive numeral of his father Samuel, and 24 that assigned him in the order of his birth. By this system of double numerals (remembering that the one in brackets is always that of the father) the descent of each can be readily traced back without reference to the Index.

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INTRODUCTION.

Of the many families scattered throughout the United States and Canadas bearing the name in one of its various forms, Bascom. Bascome, Bascum, Bascomb and Bascombe, by far the largest proportion are descended from a common ancestor, Thomas, who came to this country about the year 1634, an account of whose descendants 11.6

forms the body of this work.

It may not be considered irrelevant, perhaps, to briefly mention, in this connection, some of the families who appear to have a distinct origin. A large and important race, spelling their name with a final e, is widely scattered through the various West Indian Islands: and individuals are to be found in several of our American cities. claiming descent from the same. Whether the Bascomes of Bermudas, Demarara, Turk's Island, Barbadoes, St. Domingo and Jamaica are descended from a common ancestor is uncertain. Further researches in the records of those islands may substantiate or disprove the tradition. One Nathan Bascome early settled at the Bermudas, hailing from England, and was Chief-Justice of the Islands from 1744 to 1748. He, it is claimed, was of a French family, and after his death his eldest son Paul went to Bordeaux to recover the family estates, but was poisoned and died at Paris. The Chief-Justice had sons: Paul (who was Comptroller of Customs and married Sarah Gilbert); George, a lawyer, who had three daughters; and William, a physician, who left one daughter Elizabeth, who married Wm. Smith, President of the Council. The eldest son, Paul, left three daughters and one son, Nathaniel, who. by wife Corbasier, had six sons. Of these Nathaniel and Western resided in Bermuda;Edward, a physician, died in the Crimea;John was Collector of Turk's Island; William settled in New York; and Paul early deceased.

One Henry Bascom, for many years a resident of Demarara but a native of Barbadoes, where a brother William resides, are of a family claiming, through remote ancestry, a French origin.

A few individuals, resident in the States and Canadas, are not apparently connected with either the New England or West Indian races, having a later foothold on this side of the Atlantic. One John M. Bascom, of Philadelphia in 1865, is son of Rosario of the same place, who was son of John, a seaman of Sicily, Italy. In the Palmer, Mass., records we find that Loveland Bascom, a laborer, and wife Sophia, both born in Canada, had born in Palmer, a son Loveland, April, 1852; Prudence, Jan. 13, 1853, and another son Sept. 16, 1854.

Of the colored families bearing the sur-name, research has established the fact that, in common with many thousand others of the oppressed race bearing good old colonial names, they have a claim obtained through the transgressions of their fathers to a clear if not a legitimate descent from the New England settler.

Among the earlier residents of Wethersfield, Connecticut, was one William Bascum, but there is no evidence of any descendants or of any connection with the forefather of the Northampton family.

Thomas Bascom, the New England settler, is supposed to have come here from the mother country about the year 1634. Of his ancestry or of his birth-place we have no information of a positive character. Too much importance is frequently attached to family tradition which is as apt, perhaps, to be erroneous as true. In this case, however, circumstantial evidence exists, which goes far to prove the truth of the generally received statement of the early history of the family. Bishop Henry Bidleman Bascom, in his journal. writes: "It would seem from family records and tradition that I am paternally descended from a French Huguenot family, which, driven from France by the revocation of the edict of Nantz, settled in one of the border counties near the Clyde. It appears further, that three brothers, descendants of this family, during the civil disturbances and religious oppressions which drove so many of the English Puritans from the land of their birth, emigrated to the then new and feeble colonies of North America. Two of the brothers remained; the third, being dissatisfied, removed to one of the English West India islands. The remaining two settled in Massachusetts." leading points thus narrated by the eminent divine are correct, there is probably little donbt. That the family is of French extraction would seem likely from the fact that the wholly distinct race, many individuals of which have occupied and now occupy high positions of trust in some of the West Indies, is of undeniably French origin. The account on a preceding page of Nathan Bascome, of the Bermudas, received by me from his descendants, leaves little room for doubt on this score. The Barbados family, which has no connection whatever with that of Bermuda, claims also a French origin. four out of the five branches of the New England family, separated from each other since early in the last century, a tradition has been carefully preserved similar, so far as it relates to the origin of the family, to the one shared in by Bishop Bascom. It has been main-

tained, on the contrary, that the proper spelling of the name is Bascomb or Bascombe, and that the final syllable is one peculiar to some of the counties of England, hence implying an English extraction. But it will be noticed that both the elder Thomas, and his son, did not spell their names with the final b or be and that this mode has never been adopted by any of their descendants with the exception of a single branch in Vermont. The name does occur in Scotland, and to this day is common in some of the Clyde counties; but this may readily be accounted for by the supposition that a representative only of the family emigrated to New England, leaving others there to perpetuate the race. Even were it shown that Bascombe is a common English name in this generation, yet do we need a more reasonable explanation than that the Huguenot settlers there, or their immediate descendants, readily accepted the county mode, and by a trivial addition to their patronymic, fell into rank beside the Titcombes, Holcombes, Hanscombes and Seccombes?

Respecting that portion of the Bishop's statement relating to the "three brothers" I have not so decided an opinion. A large portion of the New England families claim to have descended from one of "three brothers," a claim which is generally found, upon examination, to be unfounded. Perhaps, however, the Bishop is correct, and that when Thomas settled at Windsor, Connecticut, his brother William settled at Wethersfield, close by. The Barbados family may have come from the third brother, who, "being dissatisfied, removed to

one of the English West Indies."

If little is known of the family history of the settler, so, also, little has come down to us concerning his character. In common with most of the early emigrants he was a church member, and certainly enjoyed the regard of his fellow citizens, evinced by his election to the office of Town Constable, a position requiring, in those troublous times, energy, judgment and bravery. He seems to have possessed a strong roving tendency, for we find him at Dorchester, Windsor, Conn., and at Northampton; and his descendants have largely partaken of this trait, only a small representation now remaining near the ancestral home in Massachusetts.

The physical resemblances between individuals of the different branches, whether derived from the emigrant or from some more remote ancestor, are so very striking as to warrant a notice here. During the last eight years, I have been brought into personal contact with very many of the name, and have been forcibly impressed with the strength of this family likeness in both sexes. Many will, I am sure, call to mind the stout, compact form, the head well set back upon the shoulders, the dark skin, dark grey eye, massive head, and, more marked than all, the round, high, full forchead—characteristics of many of the race, living and dead. With members of

the eldest branch my personal acquaintance is limited, but among its members may note the late Mr. Charles Wright, of Hinsdale, as possessing several of the peculiarities named; descendants of 38 Nathan Bascom also possess them. In the second branch the likeness exists in a remarkable degree; taking, for instance, the fifth generation, I have met descendants of 212 Daniel, 217 John, 219 Jonathan, and 220 William, and recall hardly an instance where this does not occur. It will be noticed that 218 Elisha, of this branch, married his relative, Elizabeth, of the youngest or fifth branch, and I expected in their descendants to find the same features; nor was I disappointed, for the daguerreotype of a grandson, now before me, might well be taken for that of a dozen others in both these lines. In the third branch I have had less opportunities of judging than in the others, but sketches of the characters of some of its prominent men lead me to infer that physical peculiarities may be as marked here, as are the mental. The fourth and fifth branches form no exception to the general rule, both numbering many men and women, any one of whom might readily be taken as the type of the family. Truly the progenitors of the race must have been strongly individualized thus to have implanted in their progeny, through so many generations, such distinctive, ineradicable characteristics.

THOMAS BASCOM AND HIS DESCENDANTS.

PART I.

FIRST GENERATION.

THOMAS BASCOM came to this country probably not far from the year 1634, at which time he was established at Dorchester, and from whence, in 1639, he removed to Windsor, Connecticut, one of the second company that settled at that place. No record of his marriage or of the birth of his eldest daughter, Hannah, has been found; both these events undoubtedly took place prior to his removal to Connecticut. At Windsor three of his children were born, and here he continued until his removal to Northampton, Massachusetts. Of the exact date of this change in his residence we are ignorant, but he was probably one of the earliest settlers of that most beautiful township. The first mention of his name to be found in the records of that place is the date of his own and wife's admission to full communion in the church—the 14th day of the 5th month, 1661. In 1666 he was elected Town Constable, made freeman in May, 1670, took the oath of allegiance Feb. 8, 1678-9, and died there May 9, 1682. His wife. Avis, died Feb. 3, 1676.

His will, as recorded in the Probate Office at Northampton, is as follows:—

"I, Thomas Bascom, Sent, of Northampton, being of perfect memory and understanding, and at p'sent enjoying a competent measure of health, although I have lived to old age yet knowing not the day of my death, do therefore in preparation to my Last change Doe make and constitute this my Last will and testament which is as followeth.

"And as respecting my eternal estate, I know my redeemer Liveth and that he shall stand at the Latter day on the Earth and will change

my vile body and make it like his glorious body.

"And as touching my body when it is removed out of this earthly

tabernacle that It be decently buried.

"And as touching those outward blessings we the Lord of his mercy hath bestowed on me, I dispose of them in this manner as followeth.

"Imprimis, My Wil is that my son Thomas doe out of my Estate pay all my just debts and funeral expences. And I doe hereby give and bequeath to my son Thomas al my Lands of al Sorts together wth my house, orchard and barn to be to him and to his dispose forever; Also I give to him my Cart wheels, plough, chaines and al other husbandry implements and Mason tools and my great brass Kettle and almy wearing apparel, onely my Wil is that my Son William Janes shall have my cloth suite and my Son Robert Lyman my Searge coate, and the remainder of my wearing apparel I doe hereby give to my Son Thomas Bascom;

"And that as for the remainder of my Estate my Wil is that my just debts being paid out of it, that it being prized it shall equally be divided between my Children, viz. my Son Thomas Bascom, Hannah

Janes and Hepzibah Limon:

"And I doe hereby make and ordain my Son Thomas Bascom to be ful and sole Executor of this my Wil and doe intreate and request my wel beloved and trusty friends Deacon William Holten and Deacon Medad Pumry to be my Overseers of this my Last Wil and Testament and doe hereby declare that any former wils of mine are hereby made voide and this only to stand in force, in witnesse whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the eight day of July in the year of O' Lord one thousand Six hundred seventie and nine.

SECOND GENERATION.

- (1) 4. Thomas Bascom, Jr., the only son of the elder Thomas, was born in Windsor, Ct., Feb. 20, 1641-2. Savage says that he married March 20, 1667, Mary, dau. of Thomas Newell, of Farmington, but Edwards, in History of Southampton, claims that he married Mary Baldwin, who died Feb. 3, 1676. The fact that his "widow Mary" settled his estate after his death, which took place at Northampton. Sept. 11, 1689, leads one to infer that Savage is probably correct. I have not been able to find the date of the birth of their eldest child, and from the fact that both Thomas Bascom and wife Mary were not admitted to full communion until the third month of 1670, there is a probability that he did not settle at N. until about that time. He died at Northampton, Sept. 11, 1689. His will is as follows:—
- "I, Thomas Bascum of Northamptom, being Weak and Sick in Body yet being off sound memory and understanding and knowing not how soone death may put a period to my britle and uncertarne life doe therefore make and constitute this my Last Will and Testament as followeth.
- "In primis, I committ my Soule to God which gave it and to Jesus Christ w^{ch} I hope hath redeemed it with his most precious blood, and as for my body I commit it to ye Grave by my Executors and ffriends hereafter named buried in a comely and decent manner there to rest till ye Generall Resurrection wⁿ I hope it shall be renewed in glory and being againe united Soul and body together shall ever be with ye Lord.
- "And as for ye portion of Worldly goods web ye Lord Out of his Bounty hath bestowed on me, I thus order and determine ye distrebution of as follows.
- "Item. To my well beloved wife I give out of my Estate ninetie pounds to be free and absolutely her own dureing her Naturall life, but my Will is yt in case she shall marry again or change her widdowhood Condition yt then Onely One 3d pt of my Estate shall be hers during her Naturall life and ye Rest of Estate my Will is that it shall be devided betweene my two sons-my Eldest son Thomas having fifteene pounds in ye first devision more than his Brother and five pounds at his Mothers death more than his Brother, and with this Exception my Will is that my Estate be devided betweene my two Sons to be to ym their heirs for ever. flurther my Will is that my Wife and my two Sons shall have an equall proprietie and interest in house and homestead and at my beloved wife's death then it shall be equally devided betweene my two sons, and I doe hereby appointe my Lovinge Wife and my Eldest son Thomas Bascum to be my Executors of this my Last Will and Testament and do alsoe entreate my respected firiends Thomas Lyman and Medad Pomeroy to be the overseers to counsell and advise my foresd Executors in any matter of difficultie that may arise in the just distribution of my Estate according to my Will as is above xpressed in confirmation of this to be my Last Will and testament hereby revokeing and makeing voide any

former Will or act of mine of this kinde I have hereunto sett my hand and fixed my seal this ——— of August 1689.

The inventory returned by the widow valued the estate at £269 07s.

THIRD GENERATION.

(4) 6. Thomas Bascom, 3d, eldest son of Thomas Bascom, Jr., was born probably in the year 1668. He inherited the homestead at Northampton, and died in that town Feb. 3, 1714. His widow, Han-NAH, the mother of all his children, was daughter of John Catlin, of Deerfield. She survived him many years, and died Jan., 1747. By his will, dated Jan. 28, 1713-14, he gave to her one half of his house, land and "movables," so long as she remained a widow. To his eldest son Samuel he gave a wood lot on "Cobler's Hill," and the other half of the homestead—the whole to be his at his mother's death. To his other sons he gave his "woodlands," and to his daughters £12 each.

FOURTH GENERATION.

(6) 10. Samuel Bascom, eldest son of Thomas Bascom, 3d, was born at Northampton, Jan. 27, 1692. On the 18th March, 1717-18, he and his mother sold the homestead where they then lived, and which had been, probably, the property of the elder Thomas, to Benjamin Stebbins. At the same time he purchased of William Holton, an estate situated on the river bank, in the same town, and May 30, 1728,

augmented his possessions by a further purchase of adjoining land. Here he resided until the spring of 1733, when he abandoned his luxuriant farm on the Connecticut River, and turned his face eastward, settling at the village of Cold Spring, now Belchertown, on a tract of two hundred acres which he bought of Benjamin Stebbins. His homestead in Northampton, he sold on May 5, 1733, to Benj. Alvord, and his other lands there, in all twelve acres, to his brother Joseph. He resided in Cold Spring until 1744, when he removed to Western, now called Warren, in Worcester co., where he purchased an estate of Isaac Beale and Benj. Bartlet. Sometime about 1751, he removed to Brookfield and afterwards to New Braintree, in which places his second wife possessed some real estate. He died Nov. 22, 1765. He was twice married: first in Northampton, May 10, 1722, to Ex-PERIENCE PARSONS, who died Nov. 29, 1740, in the 57th year of her age; and second, Sept. 18, 1750, to Sarah, widow of Comfort Barnes. of Brookfield. His grave-stones, with those of his first wife, are still to be seen in the Warren grave-yard.

FIFTH GENERATION.

(10) 21. Samuel Bascom, Jr., only surviving son of Samuel Bascom, was born at Northampton, June 13, 1723. He early settled at Western, now Warren, having purchased one hundred and ten acres of land there, Jan. 5, 1744-5. He was a tanner and currier, and in the latter years of his life bore the title of "lieutenant." He died at Western, Sept. 11, 1779, and was buried by the side of his father. His widow Mary (maiden name unknown) afterwards married——Root, and died at Chester.

He kept a hospi-The house, renotable mansion for the shelter of all who sought it. vated and remodelled, is still standing beneath two huge elms of his own planting. He is described as having been puritanic in his theology, dignified in his demeanor, "a very useful and laborious minister." Old residents of Chester and vicinity still remember "Priest Bascom" for his many virtues and sterling worth. He was twice married: first, Oct. 23, 1770, to Theodosia Ashley, of Westfield, who died Jan. 10, 1791; and second, Feb. 1, 1792, to Mrs. MARTHA RAYNOLDS, of Longmeadow. Here he spent the remainder of his days, dying Nov. 29, 1833, at the advanced age of ninety-six years. He was, till within a few years of his death, remarkably vigorous and sprightly. He was a diligent reader of the Scriptures, intelligent and discriminating in his judgments, forcible and resolute in character, simple and unostentatious in manner. "Orthodox" in faith, he held for many years the position of Deacon in the Congregational Church at Orwell.

Births of two only, and baptisms of three more of his children, all by the first wife, are recorded in Southampton. mer tour of exhortation. To supply themselves with the necessary means they diligently worked during the intervals of their travel in the construction of pumps and aqueducts, the companion of young Bascom being a mechanic by trade. At the end of the season he returned to his father's house with a reputation already established for earnest, sincere piety, and for extraordinary powers in the prayer and exhortation meetings of his church. A year later, in 1812, he travelled seventy or eighty miles to attend the General Conference of the Methodist Church at Chillicothe, meeting there many of the leading preachers of the day. In 1813 he was licensed to preach, and entered immediately on what proved to be a life of toil and privation in his chosen work. In 1818 he took elder's orders, and settled at Louisville, Kentucky. In 1823, after repeated changes in his location, he was elected Chaplain to the House of Representatives at Washington. In June, 1827, he was elected President of Madison College, then just established at Uniontown, Pa., a position which he occupied for a little less than three years, leaving it to accept the general agency of the American Colonization Society. In 1832, he was elected to a professorship in Augusta College, and retained his connection with that institution for a period of ten years. In 1837, he received the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity, and in 1845 that of LL.D. In 1842 he removed to Lexington, Ky., and assumed the presidency of Transylvania University. This he resigned in 1849, and the year after was elected and consecrated Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. Providence, however, decreed that his earthly work was over, and on the 8th of September of that year, having presided as Bishop but at one Conference, he passed to his reward.

Bishop Bascom was a man of remarkable powers. Without early education, influence or personal ambition, by a mental activity that found no rest till the secrets of science and theology had been mastered, by natural oratorical ability of a most startling and persuasive description, and by a piety as earnest and sincere as it was abiding, he attained a reputation as a scholar, preacher and Christian almost

unrivalled in his generation.

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
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
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
