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

They had a large family, and one son named Michael would indicate that Lizzie was daughter of Michael Duell, who lived at Alburgh in 1790. Another son was called Sewell or Soule Bell, and we believe that there is relationship to the Mavflower Soule's, for we have heard that an old Bible in Vermont has the line back to the Mayflower. The History of Harvard, Mass., page 574, is in error as to the family of Thomas Willard, showing children by his second wife by whom he had none. Her name was given as Sarah Fletcher. It should read: Sarah (Brewer) Fletcher, widow, and they were married February 25, 1786. Her first husband, Timothy Fletcher, died in May, 1779, and the first wife of Thomas Willard, Sarah Gibson, died May 22, 1779. Harvard records and Bailey's Early "Massachusetts Marriages" both show that Thomas Willard, Ir., and Sarah Farwell were married May 3, 1768. They were undoubtedly the parents of the five children credited to his father, as having been born between 1768 and 1778. See U. S. Census 1790, page 222. I. A. P.

PAST AND PRESENT

GENEALOGY begets ancestral gossip, and I purpose in this column to chatter aimlessly but nevertheless agreeably and instructively, upon things, persons, places and what-not genealogically. It is a short journey, after all is said and done, from Plymouth Rock to Somerset Street, and from the martyrs of yesterday to the ancestral chart makers of today.

Only a few hours ago I found the marriage record of America's first "grafter" and money grubber, the renowned Captain William Kidd, he of buried gold renown. Captain Kidd was married in New York City, 16 May, 1691, to Sarah Oort. That is the way she spelled her name.

In our nomenclature we frequently find a Beet, an Onion, a Root or a Corn. Once in a life time we strike at the head of a Cabbage. In my own line there comes to the surface a Turnipseed. But a

moment ago I was called upon to record the marriage of Rhoda Bagger, and what is worse she was united to a Cook.

"Don't shoot this old gray head," she said. Who said? Why Barbara Frietchie. In Frederick County, Maryland, on February 2, 1793, William Carey was wedlocked to the said Barbara Frietchie. Whether she was the only, original Barbara it matters little.

After I had driven fourteen miles over the mountain trails, last summer, to a Virginia County seat, I met the whitehaired county clerk. "Good Lord, man," he said, "I've been yere in this office forty-two years, and yer the second pursohn that's been yere in all that time to look at them records."

What things there are, my dears, in the wills men make. One Thomas Brigham, of England, 1542, bequeathed to his son Ralph, "my chamlett gowne, my long night gowne, both my chamlett jackets and a paire of virginals." *

Mistress Katherine Roundell in her will dated 1522, wrote in a humorous vein. "I give to my son Thomas, half a mare, half a saddle and half a cart wheel." Which would be slow going for Thomas.

Who is the most famous Englishman of history? Not the Kings, nor the Sir Sydneys, nor the Chaucers, but good old vellow-journal, news-maker Guy Fawkes. His name comes readily and he lives on after all others are forgotten.

In his will dated December 6, 1773, Rev. Noah Hobart of Fairfield, Conn., made this provision: "Second, I give to my loving wife all she brought with her, also ye use of my house as long as she has a mind to stay there."

Payne-Leach-Brewster [Contributed to GENEALOGY]

As yet, proofs are lacking on the parents of Stephen Payne, who had son Ebenezer Leach Payne, who served in the Revolutionary War, taking his father's place when only sixteen. Recently from old records we procured description of this Ebenezer L. Payne, dated Northampton, September 14, 1780, of men detached from Col. Israel Chapin's 2nd Hampshire Co. for the term of three months. "Age 17 years: stature 5 feet and 3 inches. Complexion light", etc. His father, Stephen Payne mustered between January 20, 1777 and June 1, 1778 by Trumen Wheler, Master Muster for Berkshire co., Capt. Watkins' Company: term three years or during the war. Reported received state bounty. Where can one get data on those who received state bounty?

Another Stephen Payne lived at Lebanon, Conn., at or near same time; this Stephen was married there, September 23. 1756, to Rebecca Bushnell, and one of these served in the French and Indian wars with Capt. Ebenezer Leach, which might account for the name of his son. Or it may prove that this Stephen was son of Stephen and Sarah Leach, who were married at Pomfret, Conn., 1727, and had there two children, Judith and Noah. I found lately in the Comstock Genealogy, page 275: "Abel (5) Comstock (Daniel 4) born 1721, died 1814, Cooperstown, N. Y. He married September 17, 1747, Judith Pain, at Kent, Conn. She was born 1728, and died December 19, 1803, at Litchfield, Conn. In August, 1776, Abel Comstock was a private in Captain Carter's Co." So from this we find that Stephen, whose wife was Sarah Leach moved to Kent, sometime in 1730-40, as no record is found at Pomfret after about 1730.

One Stephen Paine married Jemima Morgan, and on the Norwich records I

found only this: "Roger, ye son of Stephen Paine and his wife Jemima was born the 25th day of July, 1760". They were married in 1754. It is probable that the Stephen Paine who married Rebecca Bushnell is the one born to Benjamin and Mary Brewster Paine, June 26, 1735, for he would be just past 21, while the one who married in 1754 would be only 19. Would be very grateful for any aid on this problem, so that descendants could join Mayflower Descendants. Kingsley's Records at Lebanon-he was for many years the Town Clerk-says this Stephen born to Benj. is the one who married Rebecca Bushnell. Would like to know when Stephen died at Partridgefield. Mass., and his age at death; this would prove whose son he was, most likely. Shall appreciate any clues. A. R. H.

PAST AND PRESENT

Thomas Pigge of Dedham, Mass., died in 1660. In his will dated October 30, the name is written Pig, Pigg, Pigge and Pidge. "A rose by any other name," etcetera.

The last survivor of the Battle of Concord, April 19, 1775, was Amos Lincoln Baker, who died July 16, 1850, in Boston. At a Concord celebration the same year, he signed a statement that he participated in the battle seventy-five years before.

The first white child born in America was Virginia Dare, daughter of Annanias and Eleanor Dare. She was born August 18, 1597, in Roanoke, North Carolina. Her parents were of the expedition sent out by Sir Walter Raleigh in that year.

* *

Love and wedlock knoweth neither age, condition, color, weather or previous condition of servitude. Hence, I am never

surprised at what one may discover in the course of one's researches. In Baltimore, Maryland, on May 8, 1801, Mr. M. H. Duval of Prince George County, aged 17, was married to Mrs. Allen, aged 50, widow of the late Zachariah Allen of that place. The marriage notice concludes with these lines:

"A wise and happy change of life, To get at once a mother and a wife.' * *

And this from the mother of states: "Married, in New Kent County, Virginia, February 27, 1802, Mr. Michael Sher-man, aged 97, to the amiable and accomplished Miss Eliza Poindexter, aged 14." Old enough to be her great, great grandfather. Where are May and December now?

Yet age is really of no account in the love-game. On January 23, 1764, Miss Mary Eldrington, "an old virgin," died in Elizabethtown, New Jersey, in the 109th year of her age. She was of an ancient family in Northumberland, England. The account further states: "Notwithstanding her great age, she was very desirous of getting a husband before she died, and when she had reached her 107th year, nothing could offend her so highly as to tell her she was too old to be married."

One of the early Otis emigrants was Robert, who came from Ireland in 1720, and settled at the mouth of the Connecticut river. The first arrival, John of Massachusetts, spelled his name Ottis, and on the original records of Hingham, the name is found as Otis, Otys, Ottis, Otes, Oates, Oattis and Oatis. * * *

John Foster was a mathematician and printer in Dorchester, Mass. He died September 9, 1681, aged 33. On his tombstone is the inscription

"Skill was his Cash."

Henrico County, Virginia Wills

[Contributed to GENEALOGY]

(Martin Smith, Son of Betsy Burton and Obadiah Smith—Will dated 1818.)

I, Martin Smith, being of infirm body, sound mind and memory, do make and order this as my last will and testament, revoking all others heretofore made by me. First, my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid in order to enable my executors hereinafter named to accomplish so desirable an end do ento upon and sell all my estate, both real and personal, or of whatever kind may consist (not here mention) dowered at such times and upon such terms that they may think most advantageous to my estate.

Second, My will and desire is that my executors do convey to Jacob Smith, by deed the land whereon he lives to that part running from a corner pine on Robert Gordon's line along a line of marked trees to a corner of poplar and timber or old mill pond, branch thence to the poplar to William Young line, so as to include the little meadow.

Third, My will and desire is that my executors do convey by deed to (my brother-in-laws) John Hawkins, Lyddall Bacon Bowles and my brother Jacob Smith, one-fourth part to each of them, two acres of land in the City of Richmond, Virginia, which was purchased of Jesse Smith by myself, John Hawkins, Lyddall Bacon Bowles and Jacob Smith, the said deed having been made to me by the said Jesse Smith, so soon as each of them shall complete the third and last payment for the same.

Fourth, I give and bequeath to my sister, Nancy Smith, fifteen hundred dollars, to be paid to her by my executors as soon as the sale can be made of my estate by them to her and her heirs forever.

Fifth, I lend to my mother, Elizabeth Burton Smith, during her life time, my negro woman, Lenora and her child Moses, together with her future increase, and at her death give and bequeath them to my sister, Nancy Smith, to her and her heirs forever.

Sixth, My will and desire that my mother and Aunt Lucy Price (she was Lucy Burton) and my sister, Nancy Smith shall have the use of the plantation whereon they now live which is owned by myself and brother, Jacob Smith, also two small pieces of land I bought of Thomas Buller and Jones Tyler, so long as they live or marry, and at the death or marriage of all of them, I give and bequeath the same land to my brother Jacob Smith and brother-in-law Lyddal Bacon Bowles to them and their heirs forever.

Seventh, My will and desire is that the remaining part of my estate is to be divided in the following manner. One fifth part between all the children of my sister Mary Smith King, which she has or may have as well as those by her first husband, John Bacon Ryall, deceased, as those by her present husband, George King.

One fifth part between all the children of my sister Lucy Smith Hawkins (dead). One fifth part between all the children of my brother Jacob Smith which he has or may have.

One fifth part between all the children of my sister Elizabeth Smith Bowles, which she has or may have; the remaining one-fifth to my sister Nancy Smith.

Eighth, My will and desire is, if either of the children of my sister Mary King, or those left by my sister Lucy Hawkins, should claim any part of the land which their mother heired as one of the heirs of my father, Obadiah Smith, deceased, which I have purchased, that they shall not have any part of my estate before devised.

I give and bequeath to my brother, Jacob Smith, all the interest I have in the wagons, mules, which we have held in conjunction and release him from all accounts, whether by note or open account, upon his paying to my mother, Elizabeth March, 1915

Smith, five hundred dollars annually, during her life, out of that part of my estate which I have given him.

Tenth, Lastly I appoint Lyddall Bacon Bowles and Jacob Smith and Benj. Sheppard, executors, in testimony whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this fourth day of Aug. 1818.

It would appear that "W. W.," the writer of the note and query on the Summer family in the January issue, was either misquoted or misinformed. Governor Increase Sumner, not having been born until 1746 could not well be the son of George (2) who died in 1715. As a matter of fact he was the grandson of George and son of Edward (3). 

Scotch-Irish Records

[Contributed to GENEALOGY.]

In tracing my Scotch-Irish ancestry, prior to the coming to America, I made a discovery that should be brought to the notice of Historical Societies. Pennsylvania was the early home of many of those arriving from the North of Ireland. I find that those who can trace their genealogies beyond this country are singularly few. It was by much application that I was able to find the slightest clue to my foreign ancestry. Having found it I am unwilling that a discovery made should remain unpublished.

In Larne, County Antrim, Ireland, lives a Rev. J. Kennedy, who has charge of a church there dating back to about 1700, and probably much farther. In the pos-

session of this Rev. Kennedy are two old registers of marriages, baptisms, etc., which concern the immigrants to America who came so numerously from 1730 to 1750. My understanding is that these registers are in bad order and have never had any publication. That the information they contain should be preserved, seems of that importance, that I think it a duty to direct the attention of a historical society, which has an interest in such matters, to the fact. This is especially true of Pennsylvania. The heart of the immigration of Scotch-Irish to Pennsylvania and Virginia lies in the vicinity of Larne.

Perhaps steps to obtain copies of these registers may result from this information. O. K. L.

The earliest applications of the principles of genealogy were made by the law, so it is to that science that we are indebted for the meaning of most of the The law defines an terms now in use. ancestor as one from whom an heir inherits property or as one prior to another in the right to inherit property. * *

Such an ancestor may or may not be of the same line of descent. A son inheriting property is by law the heir of his ancestor and by descent the descendant of his ancestor. But if the position be reversed and the father inherit money from his son he is the heir of his ancestor according to the law, and by descent he is the ancestor of his descendant and the latter is an ancestor of his own ancestor.

* *

In the days when property rights were vested solely in men, and when women had little share in the distribution of wealth, the law recognized only the male issue, and, therefore, interested itself only in the tracing of the male line of descent.

But the evolution of public opinion has modified this condition so that the rights of property now, especially in the United States, are practically the same for men and women. Therefore, modern genealogy recognizes the importance of the female line of descent, and it has been scientifically established that the hereditary influence of the female ancestors upon posterity is fully equal to that of the male.

An English sculptor was ordered to engrave on a tombstone the following words: "She was a crown to her husband." The stone, being small, he engraved upon it: "She was 5s to her husband."

Up to the time of the Revolution all the early settlers of Augusta Co., Va., were of the Scotch-Irish race. After that period the German element drifted southward from Pennsylvania.

It is not in country graveyards only that the English of the epitaphs is open to criticism. In the Old Granary burying ground in Boston, there is a stone with the following inscription:

Here lies interr'd the body of Capt. Nicholas Gardner, who was

wounded by the enemy of which

he died June 13, 1782, aged 33 years. *

The first clergyman to preach in Tennessee was the Rev. Charles Cummings, who, in 1776, accompanied the troops of Colonel Christian against the Cherokees.

John McDowell, who was killed by Indians near the forks of the James River, Va., in 1742, had two sons, Samuel and James, and a daughter Martha, who married Col. George Moffett. W. M. C.

A generation is the interval of time that elapses between the birth of a father and the birth of his son, and was generally used in computing considerable periods of time, both in sacred and profane history. The interval of a generation is consequently of uncertain length, depends on the standard of human life, and whether the generations are reckoned by eldest, middle or youngest sons. Thirtythree years have usually been allowed as the mean length of a generation, or three generations for every hundred years. In compiling pedigrees, great attention is necessary to the number of generations in any given period, as they form a guide to the probability of persons having sprung from any particular individual. * *

Among our industrious and frugal forefathers, it was a maxim that a young woman should never be married until she had spun herself a set of body, bed, or table linen. From this custom all unmarried women were termed spinsters, an appellation they still retain in all law proceedings.

Gwatkin Family of Virginia [Contributed to GENEALOGY.]

Colonel Charles Gwatkin, of Bedford County, Virginia, was a native of Scotland, and emigrated to America. During his lifetime he filled several important civil offices in Bedford County as well as several military positions in the County. He married Miss Marv Callaway, daughter of Mr. Richard Callaway of said County, on or about the 6th of November, 1767.

The said Richard Callaway-son of Colonel William Callaway-born about 1719, made several visits to Kentucky and finally removed and settled there with Daniel Boone in 1775. He had been a prominent man in Bedford County, a Justice of the Peace and an Officer in the Colonial Army from the County in 1758. After settling in Kentucky his two daughters, Elizabeth and Frances, with Jemima Boone, were captured by the Indians July 14, 1776, and were re-taken the next day by Boone. This incident was made use of by Cooper in his novel, the "Last of the Mohicans." Richard Callaway helped to organize the government of Transylvania at Boonesborough; he was subsequently killed by the Indians near Boonesborough, March 8, 1780.

Colonel Charles Gwatkin died in 1806. leaving, surviving him, his wife and children as follows:

The first Floyds in America were two brothers, who came from Wales to Accomac Co., Va. William Floyd, a son of one of these brothers, married Abiliah Davis of Amherst Co., who was of Indian descent. *

PAST AND PRESENT

Biography and genealogy contain the key to the intimate history of a whole people.

Errors in dates are easy to make and difficult to correct. An applicant for membership to the D. A. PAST AND PRESENT

The oldest and most exclusive organization in the United States which is based upon ancestry is the Society of the Cincinnati, founded in May, 1783, just before the disbandment of the Revolutionary army.

The first regiment raised in New York City for the Revolutionary war was composed of Hebrews. Consequently the descendants of these soldiers were among the earliest members of the newly developed patriotic societies based upon descent. Aside from this, the Jews have a genealogy of their own. Many orthodox members of the faith claim to trace their pedigrees all the way back to Abraham, but these records are disputedespecially by the members of the Reformed Jewish organizations. It is doubtful if positive proofs of any particular families go back beyond the destruction of the temple of Herod I.

Burton Family of Virginia

THE WILL OF MARTIN BURTON In the name of God, amen: I, Martin Burton, of the parish and county of Henrico, state of Virginia, being weak of body, but of sound sense and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit:

Imprimus, I give and bequeath unto my son, William Burton, the land and plantation I purchased of William Smith, containing two hundred and fifty acres. be the same more or less, beginning at a Birch in horse swamp in Carters' line near the old plumb tree, thence running a straight line to a Sycamore tree in the branch near Hicks Spring, thence up the branch and line to the corner of the old field to William Jones' line, this being the dividing line between him and the plantation whereon I now live, to him and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to my son, William, six negroes, viz.: Susan, Agg, Isaac, Bobb, Jacob and Pegg, to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son, John Burton, the tract of land whereon he now lives, it being part of the land I purchased of Miller and part of the land I purchased of Hughes, and bounded as follows: Beginning in Smith line, thence down Poplar branch, to where it empties into Meridith's branch, thence across Meridith's branch to Miller's Spring branch, thence up the Spring branch to three maples near the Spring, thence a straight line to a small Pine in Du Valk line near the corner, this being the dividing line between him and my son, Daniel Burton, containing four hundred and fifty acres, be the same more or less. I also give unto my said son, John Burton, six negroes, viz.: Sam, Judith, Sall, Jack, Aaron and Cate, to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son, Daniel Burton, the remainder of the before mentioned tract of land I purchased of Hughes and Miller to him and his heirs forever. I also give unto my said son, Daniel Burton, six negroes, viz.: Amy, Jenny, Davy, Cate, George and Fannie, to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son, Thomas Burton, the tract of land I purchased of John and William S. Smith (probably the S. is for Sterling) and known by the Meadow Plantation, to him and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath unto my aforesaid son the plantation whereon I now live, reserving to my beloved wife the free use of the same during her widowhood and also my daughter, Lucy Burton, the privilege of living in the dwelling house during her single life. I also give and bequeath unto my said Thomas, six negroes, viz.: Daniel, Nancy, Ursley, Stephen, China and little Daniel, reserving to my beloved wife the use of the negro little Daniel during her widowhood. I also

give and bequeath to my said son one horse and saddle, one bed and furniture and ten pounds to be raised out of my estate as hereafter directed to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Elizabeth Smith, six negroes, viz.: Lucy, Dorcus, Phill, Harry, Ned and Tilla, and their increase. I also give unto my daughter, Elizabeth Smith, one negro, by the name of Charles, reserving unto my beloved wife the use of the aforesaid negro, Charles, during her natural life to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Burton, seven negroes, viz: Jesse, Anicka, Roger, Rachel, Clair, Maria and Luck, reserving unto my beloved wife the use of the aforesaid negro, Luck, during her natural life. Also, I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid daughter, Lucy, one horse and saddle, one bed and furniture and ten pounds, to be raised out of my estate as hereafter directed, to her and her heirs forever.

I lend unto my beloved wife six negroes, viz.: Ben, Dick, Luck, Charles, Beck and little Daniel, during her natural life, and at her death to dispose of the aforesaid negro girl, Beck, in any manner she may think proper to some of my children, or their heirs. I also lend unto my beloved wife onethird part of my personal estate during her natural life and at her death to be, with the aforesaid negroes, lent to my said wife not before divided, equally among my children or their heirs.

My will further is that the privilege of my ten lots of land in James river be equally divided among all my children, or their heirs. My will and desire further is that all the rest of my estate not before divided be sold, and after paying all my just debts and legisees herein mentioned, the money from such sale be equally divided among all my children, their heirs.

And, lastly, my will is that my estate shall not be appraised nor my executors give security for their executorship, and I appoint my sons, William Burton, John Burton, Daniel Burton and Thomas Burton, executors of this, my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first day of January, 1791.

The John Brainerd Family

John Brainerd, who succeeded his brother David, as missionary among the Indians of New Jersey, was born at Haddam, Conn., February 28, 1720. He was fitted for college probably by his brother Nehemiah. This brother was pastor of the Eastbury (Conn.) Church from April, 1740, until his death, November 9, 1742. John was graduated at Yale in 1746.

He went to Bethel, near Cranberry, in April, 1747, and began assisting David among the Indians. David took a journey to New England during the summer, hoping to recover his health, but died October 9th, at Northampton. John was commissioned in his brother's place by the Society for the Promotion of Christian Knowledge. He was ordained in February, 1748. The Indian children were provided with a school and were taught spinning, business and some of the trades.

The Indians, having been dispossessed of their land, Brainerd, in May, 1755, was released by the society. He returned to New England, but soon was invited to preach at Newark. He accepted, and moved there with his family, remaining about one year.

Brainerd, in June, 1756, at the request of the society, again began work among the Indians, removing to New Brunswick. He was again released in September, 1757, and the same month again was called to Newark and settled there. In March, 1759, at the request of the society, to which was added the appeal of Governor Francis Bernard, he once more considered going to the Indians, finally leaving his comfortable charge at Newark, in May, 1759.

He labored among the Indians at Brotherton, Burlington County, and also did pioneer work among the white settlements. He dwelt for a time at Mt. Holly, where his meeting-house was burned by the British. He was called, in 1777, to Deerfield, Cumberland County, where he preached until his death, March 18, 1781.

Brainerd's first wife, Experience Lyon, died September 17, 1757, leaving three little children. His second wife, Experience Price, died August 28, 1793; she had no children. Two of Brainerd's children, Sophie and David, died at Newark, during September, 1758. The surviving daughter married Major John Ross, of Revolutionary fame.

Brainerd is buried beneath the floor of the Deerfield church.

Logans in the Revolution [Contributed to GENEALOGY]

Samuel Logan, b. 1759, d. 1845, was placed on the pension roll of Pennsylvania in 1832, for 11 months for actual service as a private in the continental army. He was born in Ireland and died in Washington Co., Penn. He was at the battles of Brandywine and Germantown.

Benjamin Logan, b. 1743, in Augusta Co., Va., d. 1802, in Shelby Co., Ky., commanded many expeditions against the Indians in the Northwest.

William Logan, b. 1756, in Pennsylvania, enlisted in 1776, in Capt. Peter Grubb's Co., Col. Samuel Miles' Rifle Regiment. In 1781, he received deprecation pay for his services.

Hugh Logan, b. Augusta Co., Va., 1745, d. Lincoln Co., Ky., 1816, was a soldier in 1779, in Gen. Geo. Roger Clark's Illinois regiment of Virginia troops.

In memory of William, son of Isaac and Mary Wright, who died Jan. 21, 1828, in his 12th year. L. H. W.

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
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












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
