A.

Daniel Ames, and Benjamin Ames, were sons of John, the son of John, who was son of William Ames of Braintree, and nephew to John Ames, who was one of the first settlers in Bridgewater.

These brothers, John, and William, were sons of Richard Ames, of Bruton, in Somersetshire, in England. John the nephew, (born in 1651.) removed to Bridgewater; John his uncle had no children, and gave him his property.

DANIEL AMES,

M. a Keith, had five ss. John, Timothy, Noah, Daniel, and Job; and three ds. Sarah, Hannah, and Phebe.—Sarah m. Benjamin Fuller; Hannah m. Israel Burr; Phebe died a single woman. Daniel Ames died of the small-pox, 1778, aged 66.

1. John m. a Park; was a physician, settled at Rehoboth.

2. Timothy m. a Howard; had two children; they both died young. He m. a Carver for a second wife; had one s. Theron; and three ds. Nabby, Sibil, and Phebe. Nabby m. Oliver Bryant; Sibil m. Capt. Jeremiah Beals; Theron m. a Packard.

3. Noah m. a French; had 1 s. John, who m. a Southworth. Noah and his son, removed to Winthrop, Maine.

4. Daniel 2d. m. a Perkins; had two ss. Benjamin, and Josiah. Benjamin m. a French; had one son Daniel; and two ds. Damaris, and Nancy.

5. Job m. a Dike; has four ss. Azel, Joel, Elijah, and Nathaniel; and one d. Hannah, who m. Zebedee Snell, j.m. Azel and Elijah settled at Marshfield. Joel m. an Edson.

BENJAMIN AMES,

M. a Thayer; had one s. Joshua, who m. a Ford; Joshua had two ss. David, and James; and two ds. Betsey, and Hannah. Betsey m. Zephaniah French; Hannah m. a Talbot; David m. a Packard; is a Captain in the Grenadier Company. James lives in West Bridgewater.

Samuel Brett, and Simeon Brett, were sons of Seth Brett, who was a descendant of William Brett, one of the Proprietors, and one of the first settlers in Bridgewater. He was a ruling Elder in the church.

SAMUEL BRETT,

M. a Packard; had three ss. Isaac, Samuel, and William; and five ds. Hannah, Sarah, Mehitable, Molly, and Eunice. Hannah m. Mark Ford; Sarah m. Benjamin Ford; Molly, and Eunice, died single. Samuel Brett died 1807, aged 92.

1. Isaac m. a Jackson; has four ss. Isaac, Joseph, Eliphalet, and Zibeon; and one d. Polly, who m. Capt. Ichabod Reynolds. Isaac jun. lives in the state of Maine; Joseph m. a Beals; Zibeon m. a Snell.

2. Samuel 2d. m. a Packard; was a Lieut. in the militia; has two ss. Josiah, and Samuel; and three ds. Mehitable, Hannah, and Sally. Mehitable m. Alpheus French; Josiah m. a Packard.

3. William m. an Allen; had three ss. Zenas, William, and Cyrus; and three ds. Susanna, Sally, and Phebe. He m. a Phillips for his second wife; has one s. Asa; and three ds. Polly, Betsey, and Almira. Phebe m. Jabez Kingman; Zenas m. a French; William, and Cyrus, live in Boston.

SIMEON BRETT,

M. a Packard; had six ss. Rufus, Simeon, Amzi, Daniel, Luther, and Calvin; and four ds. Jennet, Zibia, Mehitable, and Ruby. Jennet m. Nathaniel Southworth, for her 1st. and Ephraim Groves, for her 2d Husband; Zibia m. John Noyes; Mehitable m. Major Daniel Cary; Ruby m. Ephraim Field.

Simeon Brett died 1732, aged 72.

Rufus m. a Cary; Amzi. m. a Packard; Luther m. a Dwelly; Calvin m. a Hollis. Rufus, Amzi, Daniel, and Luther, live in the State of Maine. Simeon 2d m. a Perkins; had two ss. Alpheus, and Parmenas; and one d.—she died in youth. Alpheus m. a Holmes—lives at Halifax; Parmenas m. a French; has one s. Simeon; and two ds. Betsey and Susanna.

ICHABOD BRYANT.

Came from Middleborough. His wife was a Staples. He had five ss. Philip, Nathan, Seth, Job, and Gamaliel; and 5 ds. Phebe, Ruth, Sarah, Anna, and Prudence. Phebe m. Henry Howard; Ruth m. a Holmes; Sarah m. Francis Cook; Anna m. a Robinson: Prudence died single.

1. Philip m. a Howard; was a physician; had five ss. Oliver, Daniel, Peter, Bezalial, and Cyrus; and three ds. Silence, Anna, and Charity. Silence m. a Bryant; Anna m. Capt. Henry Kingman; Charity, lives single, in the State of New-York. Dr. Phillip Bryant died 1816, aged 24.

Oliver, and Daniel, died in youth. Peter was a physician, settled in Cummington. Bezalial, lives in the State of New-York. Cyrus m. a Noyes; had one s. Daniel; and one d. Zilia, who m. Benjamin Dickerman. Daniel m. a Skinner.

2. Nathan, died a single man.

3. Seth m. a French; they moved to the westward.

4. Job m. a Turner; had seven ss. Nathan, Calvin, David, Staples, Oliver, Clement, and Asa; and two ds. Thirza, and Harriet. Thirza m. Abiel Phillips; Harriet m. Manasseh Dickerman; Nathan m. a Jordan; Calvin m. a Morse; Oliver m. an Aaes.

5. Gamaliel, settled at Bedford.

JEREMIAH BEALS.

Was son of Isaac Beals, of Weymouth. He came to live in the North Parish 1760. He m. a French; had one s. Jeremiah; and five ds. Sarah, Hannah, Rachel, Olive, and Mary. Sarah m. a Ford; Hannah m. Oliver Snell; Rachel m. Capt. Asa Jones. Olive m. Joseph Brett; Mary m. Elijah Smith; Jeremiah m. an Aaes; was a captain of the light horse.

C.

Simeon Cary, and Jonathan Cary, were sons of Deacon Re-

compence Cary, son of Jonathan son of John Cary, who came from Somersetshire, in England, about the year 1640; and was then about twenty-five years of age. He was one of the proprietors, and one of the first settlers, and the first town clerk in Bridgewater.

SIMEON CARY,

M. a Howard; was a Captain in the French war, in the years 1758, and 1759; was a Colonel in the Revolutionary war, in 1776. He had one s. Howard; and five ds. Molly, Mehitable, Damaris, Martha, and Rhoda. Molly m. Simeon Keith; Mehitable m. Bela Howard, and afterward, Samuel Dike; Damaris died in youth; Martha m. Benjamin Keith; Rhoda m. Richard Wild.

Colonel Simeon Cary died 1802, aged 83.

Howard Cary m. a Packard; was a Captain in the militia; is a justice of the peace; has six ss. Simeon, Daniel, Zenas, William, Elbridge, and Francis; and two ds. Molly and Rhoda. Molly m. Ezra Dunham; Rhoda m. Lieut. Nathan Hayward; Simeon m. a Howard—lives in the State of Maine; Daniel m. a Howard; Zenas lives in Winthrop, Maine.

Howard Cary, Esq. m. a widow Brown for a 2d wife.

JONATHAN CARY,

M. a Curtis; was a deacon in the church; had four ss. Moses, Jonathan, Alpheus, and James; and four ds. Mary, Dorothy, Huldah, and Sarah. Mary, and Huldah, died in youth; Dorothy, lives single; Sarah m. Daniel Alden, and afterward, Lazarus A. Beals.

Deacon Jonathan Cary died 1813, aged 90.

1. Mose: m. a Field, had two ss. Lucius and Barzillai; and three ds. Susanna, Polly, and Cassandana. Susanna m. Rev. John Shaw; Polly m. Jonathan Beals; Lucius graduated at Providence, 1793. Studied law; went to Charleston, S. C.; died there in 1806, aged 39. Barzillai married a Snell.

2. Jonathan 2d m. a Perkins; had four ss. Caleb, Jonathan, Luther, and Martin; and six ds. Huldah, Nancy, Abigail, Sally, Mary, and Aurelia. Nancy, and Aurelia, died in youth; Huldah m. Darius Howard; Abigail m. Isaac Dunham; Sally m. Zib. Keith; Caleb, Jonathan 3d, and Luther, live in the State of Maine; Martin m. a Howard; Jonathan Cary 2d m. a Widow Clark, for a 2d wife.

3. Alpheus m. a Perkins; settled at Milton.

4. James m. an Alden; had one d. Lydia. He afterward m. a Wales; has two ss. Otis, and Austin; and one d. Nancy.

Lydia m. Ephraim Howard.

ZACHARIAH CARY,

Was son of Ephraim, son of Francis, son of John Cary, aforementioned. He m. a Bass; lived where John Wales now lives; had three ss. Ezra, Daniel, and Luther; and two ds. Mehitable, and Susanna. Mehitable married Zachariah Silvester; Susanna m. Rufus Brett.

Zachariah Cary died 1788, aged 76.

1. Ezra m. a Tolman; lives in Turner, Maine.

2. Daniel m. a Brett; lived awhile on his father's place; was a Major in the militia, and was one of the Selectmen, a number of years. He had one s. Francis; and four ds. Zibia, Eunice, Olive, and Arse. Zibia m. Capt. Roger Sumner.

Major Daniel Cary, removed to Turner, Maine, and died there, 1819, aged 62.

3. Luther m. a King; settled in Turner, Maine; is a physician, and was a justice of the sessions.

SAMUEL CHEESMAN,

Was son of Samuel Cheesman, of Braintree. He came to live in Edgewater 1772. M. a French; had two ss. Noah, and Samuel; and four ds. Olive, Naomi, Polly, and Betsey. Olive m. James Thomson; Naomi m. Josiah Orcutt; Polly m. Arabella; Betsey m. Barzillai King.

1. Noah m. a Howard; was a Captain in the troop; has two ds. Zachariah and Noah; and two ds. Olive, and Lucinda. Samuel 2d m. a Leach; lives at Merrimac.

JOSEPH COLE,

Came from Plympton; had four ss. Samuel, Ephraim, Joseph, and Eleazar; and five ds. Molly, Susanna, Katharine, Eliza, and Sarah. Samuel m. Col. Frederic Pope; Susanna m. a Niles; Katharine m. a Field; Eliza m. a Smith; Sarah m. a Withington; Samuel m. Eckard; Joseph m. a Southworth—they both went to the West; Eleazar married a Shurtleff—lives in the State of New York. Ephraim m. Randal, had one s. Ephraim; and four ds. Zilpha, Hannah, Molly, and Rachel. Zilpha m. a Bartlett; Han-

nah m. a Keith; Molly m. a Drake; Rachel m. a Packard
 Ephraim 2d m. a Webb; had five ss. Ephraim, Thomas, Zibeon,
 Ornan and Abau; and one d. Hannah, who m. Silas Snow
 Ephraim 3d m. a Packard; was a Lieutenant in the militia.
 Thomas m. a Thayer; Zibeon m. a Field; Ornan m. a South-
 worth. Ephraim Cole died 1775, aged 41.

JOHN STAPLES CRAFTS,

Was son of Moses Crafts, of Newton. He came to Bridgewater
 1756. He was a physician; m. a Park; had six ss. Thomas,
 Samuel, John, Moses, Edward and Zibeon; and two ds. Patty,
 and Polly. Patty m. Rev. Zachariah Howard; Polly m. Rev.
 Naphthali Shaw. Thomas graduated at Cambridge 1783. He
 m. Polly, 2d daughter of Rev. John Porter; was sometime min-
 ister at Princeton, afterward settled at Middleborough. He
 had three ss. Thomas, Frederick, and Eliphalet; and three d.
 Mary, Betsey, and Sophia. Betsey m. Jesse Perkins; Thom-
 2d died in youth; Frederick graduated in Providence 1815; El-
 phalet graduated at Providence 1821.

Rev. Thomas Crafts died 1819, aged 60.

John m. Olive Porter; had one s. Jonathan. He graduated
 Providence 1817; died 1822, aged 30; Samuel m. a Packard
 Moses m. a Snow; Zibeon m. a Howard.

Dr. Crafts, and his sons, Samuel, Moses, Edward, and Zibeon
 moved to the State of Maine.

PEREZ CROCKER,

Was son of Heman Crocker, of Carver; a descendant of a P.
 Crocker, who came from England, and was an early settler
 Cape-Cod. He m. a Thompson; came to live in Bridgewater
 1802; has five ss. Daniel, Henry, Edward, Charles, and Fre-
 derick; and two ds. Louisa, and Jane. Louisa m. Charles Gunn.

MANASSEH DICKERMAN.

Was son of Ebenezer Dickerman, of Stoughton. He m. a B-
 dall; had three ss. Samuel, Benjamin, and Daniel; and one
 Rebecca. He afterward m. a Bryant; had three ss. Ol-
 Lyman, and Manasseh; and five ds. Ruth, Sally, Mary, Th-
 and Roana. Rebecca m. a Dalie.

SAMUEL DIKE.

Came from Ipswich; his wife was a Perkins; had five ss. Samuel, Anthony, John, Nathaniel, and Veren; and four ds. Mary, Sarah, Anna, and Abigail. Mary m. Job Ames; Sarah m. Lieut. Ephraim Noyes; Anna m. James Loud.

Samuel Dike died 1800, aged 79.

1. Samuel 2d m. a Fuller; had four ss. Fuller, Oliver, Nathaniel, and Samuel; and three ds. Lucinda, Olive, and Rebecca. He afterward m. a Howard; had one s. Bela. Olive m. Joseph Shaw; Rebecca m. a Bisbee; Fuller and Nathaniel live in Maine; Oliver m. a Howard; Samuel 3d m. a Burrell.

2. Anthony m. a Pool; was a Captain in the militia. He removed to Plymouth.

3. John lives in Beverly.

4. Nathaniel died in youth.

5. Veren settled in Southbury, Conn.

WALTER DOWNIE.

Had one s. William; and one d. Isabel. He and his two children emigrated from Scotland to America about 1735. He settled on the farm where Howard Cary, Esq. now lives. His daughter m. Barnabas Pratt. His son died 1747, aged 23.

The following Epitaph is on his grave-stone on the plain.

MEMENTO MORI.

Here William Downie, rest my son,
Till Christ shall call thee from the tomb:

Dear Scotian youth, short was thy stay;
But bright thy hopes of endless day.

In Scotland born, to death in score,
I pay'd the debt on India's shore:
Nipt in my bloom I drop my dust;
In hope to rise among the just.

Mr. Downie was so afflicted with the loss of his son, that he sold his property, and went back to Scotland.

ELISHA DUNBAR,

Son of James Dunbar, of Hingham; m. a Howard; had six ss. Jacob, Lemuel, Elisha, Nathaniel, Seth, Peter, and Sarah; and one d. Abigail, who m. a Gilmore.

Mr. Dunbar died 1773, aged 74.

1. Jacob m. a Randall; had four ss. Ebenezer, Jacob, Lemuel, and Thomas. Ebenezer m. a Copeland; had five ss. Martin, Ebenezer, Salmon, Charles, and Nahum; and two ds. Anna, and Vesta. Martin m. an Alger.

Jacob 2d m. a Hayward; had two ds. Hannah, and Olive. He afterwards m. a Willis; had two ss. Sillman, and Jason; and three ds. Susanna, Samantha, and Polly. Hannah m. a Lathrop; Lemuel m. a Morey; lives in Maine. Thomas lives in New-York.

2. Lemuel was a Captain in the French war; made an excellent officer, and was universally esteemed, wherever known.

Capt. Lemuel Dunbar died 1762, aged 31.

3. Elisha m. a Wade; settled in Stoughton.

4. Nathaniel went into the army with his brother; was taken prisoner, and died.

5. Seth m. a Belcher.

6. Peter m. a Curtis; settled in Easton. His son Simeon, lives in North Bridgewater; m. a Bird; was a Lieutenant in the militia.

7. Silas m. a Reynolds; had eight ss. Elisha, Silas, Reuel, Josiah, Oliver, Thomas, Joseph, and Perez; and three ds. Patty, Parmela, and Amy. Patty m. a Reynolds; Parmela m. an Ewels; Amy m. a Ramsdale.

Silas 2d m. a Reynolds; was a Captain in the militia. He moved to Maine; Josiah m. a Perkins; Reuel m. a Willis; Joseph m. an Allen; lives in East Bridgewater; Thomas m. a Thayer; Perez m. his brother Reuel's widow.

Was a descendant of Samuel Edson, who came from Salem, and was an early settler in Bridgewater. He m. an Orcutt; had six ss. Benjamin, Peter, William, Seth, Ichabod, and Ebenezer; and two ds. Joanna, and Abigail. Joanna m. Isaac Perkins; Abigail m. Josiah Perkins.

1. Benjamin 2d m. a Thayer; had one s. Jacob, who m. Packard; they both moved to Pelham.

2. Peter m. a Southworth; had no children.

3. William m. a Howard; had two ss. Seth, and William; and four ds. Keziah, Martha, Abigail, and Jennet. Keziah m.

Deacon David Edson died 1795, aged 73.

David 2d m. a Shaw; is a Deacon in the church; has three ss. Jonathan, David, and Daniel; and seven ds. Hannah, Sarah, Lydia, Mehitable, Polly, Eliza, and Rebecca. Hannah m. John Smith; Sarah m. a Burrell; Polly m. a Burrell.

James Edson died 1808, aged 82.

Josiah Edson died 1820, aged 67.

Jabez Field died 1804, aged 92.

REV. JOHN PORTER,

Was son of Samuel Porter, of Abington. He graduated at Cambridge in 1736; was ordained over the 4th church of Christ, in Bridgewater, October 15th, 1740. He m. Olive Johnson, of Canterbury, Conn. She had one d. and died soon after, in the 53d year of her age; her daughter survived her but a few years. He m. Mary Huntington, of Lebanon, Conn. had five ss. John, Huntington, David, Jonathan, and Eliphalet; and three ds. Olive, Polly, and Sibil. Olive m. John Crafts; Polly m. Rev. Thomas Crafts. Sibil went to visit her sister at Princeton, and died there.

1. John graduated at Yale College in 1770. He studied divinity and preached awhile. When the war broke out between Britain and America, in 1775, he took a Captain's commission, and went into the army. He made a good officer, and was promoted to the rank of Major. He left the army a short time before the peace, went to the West-Indies, and died there.

David, who was a twin to Jonathan, when about ten years old, got into a chaise; the horse ran, threw him out, broke one of his legs, it was taken off, and he lived but a short time.

Huntington, Jonathan, and Eliphalet, graduated at Cambridge in 1777. Huntington is settled at Rye, N. H. Jonathan studied physic, went aboard a Privateer as surgeon, and has not been heard of since. Eliphalet is settled in the ministry at Roxbury.

Thomas Thompson died in 1810, aged 81.

LEMUEL TYRREL,

Was son of Jacob, and grandson of Thomas Tyrrel, of Abington; m. a Trask; had three ss. Jacob, Lemuel, and Zibeon; and four ds. Abigail, Susanna, Mehitable, and Polly. Abigail m. Lewis Hayden; Susanna m. Thomas Nightingale; Jacob lives in East Bridgewater.

SETH THAYER,

Was son of Richard Thayer, of West Bridgewater. He m. a Prey; had three ss. Enos, Micah, and Seth; and three ds. Hannah, Susanna, and Mary. Hannah m. Daniel Cary; Mary m. Silas Howard.

Seth Thayer died in 1798, aged 72.

Enos m. a widow Reynolds; had no children. Micah died in youth. Seth 2d m. a Thayer; had eight ss. Enos, Micah, Seth, Eliphalet, Zechariah, Zebah, Samuel, and Charles; and one d. Hannah, who m. Thomas Dunbar. Enos 2d m. a Damon; Micah, and Seth, live at Springfield; Eliphalet m. a Stone; Zechariah lives in the State of Maine; Zebah m. a Stone.

JOHN TILDEN,

Was son of John Tilden of Canton; m. a Howard; has two ss. John, and Howard; and four ds. Polly, Susanna, Abigail, and Lavina. Polly m. Caleb Howard; John m. a Reynolds.

*W.**JOSHUA WARREN,*

M. an Orcutt; had three ss. Ebenezer, Ezra, and Joshua; and three ds. Hannah, Mary, and Sarah. His daughters never married.

Was brother to Thomas, above mentioned. He m. a Howard; had two ds. Mehitable, and Anna. He afterwards m. a Capen; had one s. John; and two ds. Susanna, and Sally. Mehitable m. Isaac Curtis; Anna m. William French; Susanna m. Eliab Whitman, Esq.; Sally died in youth.

John 2d m. a Howard.

ELIAB WHITMAN,

Was son of Seth A. Whitman, of East Bridgewater, the son of Nathan, the son of Thomas, the son of Nicholas, the son of Thomas Whitman, who came from Weymouth, and was one of the first settlers in Bridgewater.

Eliab Whitman graduated at Providence, in 1807; he m. a Wales; and is in the profession of law.

EPHRAIM WILLIS,

Was son of Elkanah, the son of Nathaniel Willis, one of the first settlers in Bridgewater. He m. a Ganza; had two ss. Ephraim and John; and two ds. Anna and Betsey.

Ephraim Willis died 1790, aged 76.

There was a family of Waldos among the first settlers in the North Parish; they were driven from Chelmsford by the Indians; they lived near where Gideon Howard, Esq. now lives; they staid there but a few years, and moved to Pomfret, Conn.

Three of their daughters married in Bridgewater. One m. Thomas Hayward, one m. Ephraim Cary, and one m. Richard Field.

The late Rev. Mr. Weld, of DRAINTREE, was son of another of the daughters.

Robert Morrison, Alexander Wilson, David Brown, and Thomas Henry, came from Ireland about 1740. The two first were married; the other two were single men. They settled in the North Parish, and near together; the three first on land now owned by Howard Cary, Esq. and Thomas Henry where Theron Ames now lives: they were pious, industrious people. Robert Morrison had two ss. William, and Alexander; they came from Ireland with him; he had one son John, born here.

William m. a Strobridge; settled in Middleborough. Alexander m. an Erskine; lived in Boston. John m. a Giffin; settled in Connecticut. He was the father of the Rev. Giffin Morrison, in the Isle of Saba, West-Indies.

Robert Morrison died in 1764. He was the first person the bell tolled for in the North-Parish.

Alexander Wilson had one d. who m. John McBride.

David Brown m. a Miller; had two ss. John, and James: and one d. Anna. He died in the prime of life.

Thomas Henry m. a Miller; had six ss. Thomas, James, John, David, Samuel, and William; and three ds. Jennet, Margaret, and Nancy. Jennet m. Hosea Dunbar of Halifax. Two of her ds. m. in Bridgewater; one m. a Mitchell, and one Zephaniah Howard.

About the year 1771, Thomas Henry and all his family, except Jennet, moved to Harpersfield, New-York. In 1775 or 6, Thomas and James were killed by the Indians and Tories, and John was taken prisoner and died in Canada.

Wilson, and McBride, and his family, and the two ss. of David Brown, went to Hathersfield.

The six following families lived in a corner of Steughton, and were incorporated with the North Parish.

MOSES CURTIS,

Was son of Theophilus Curtis, of Quincy, and grandson of Henry Curtis, who came from England, and settled in Marblehead.

Moses Curtis lived where the Rev. Joel Briggs now lives; m. in Ashly; was a Captain in the militia; had five ss. Edward, Theophilus, Ashly, William, and Moses; and three ds. Dorothy, Mary, and Hannah. Dorothy m. Benjamin Porter; Mary m. Deacon Jonathan Cary; Hannah m. Nathaniel Littlefield.

Captain Moses Curtis died in 1763, aged 90.

Captain Simeon Leach died in 1777, aged 43.

Was son of John French, of Randolph. He m. a Linfield; had four ss. Dependance, Levi, John, and William; and four ds. Elizabeth, Mary, Silence, and Martha. Elizabeth m. Seth Bryant; Mary m. Jeremiah Beals; Silence m. Ephraim Churchill; Martha m. Samuel Cheesman.

Joseph Porter died 1804, aged 74.

Samuel Alden died in 1816, aged 81.

A HISTORICAL SKETCH

OF

North Bridgewater.

North Bridgewater was, until very lately, a part of the town of Bridgewater, which was settled by a company from Duxbury.

The first settlement, was in the year 1651; and in the year 1656, the town was incorporated.

The first settlements were, in what is now called West Bridgewater; and Mr. James Keith, a native of Scotland, was their first minister.—He was ordained in 1664. The settlements extended first into the south part of the town. The South Parish was incorporated in 1716, and the East Parish in 1723.

There were no permanent settlements in what was afterwards called the North Parish, until after the year 1700; and the first settlers were principally descendants from the first settlers in the town.

They continued a part of the West Parish, and attended meeting there, until the year 1733.

In that year they sent a petition, signed by fifty-five persons, to the General Court, praying to be incorporated into a separate town. The petition was so far granted that they were set off a separate precinct, called the North Parish.

The first parish meeting was held on the 5th of February, 1739. Timothy Keith was chosen Moderator, and Robert Howard, Clerk. The parish committee were Timothy Keith, David Packard, and Daniel Howard. Robert Howard, continued to be chosen parish clerk thirty-two years successively.

The inhabitants composing the North Parish had, in the year 1737, erected a meeting-house; it stood a little south west of where the present meeting-house now stands.

The Rev. Mr. Dunbar, of Stoughton, preached the dedication sermon, from Solomon's Songs, viii. 2.—"We have a little sister, and she hath no breasts: what shall we do for our sister in the day when she shall be spoken for?"

A church was organized, September 18, 1740, consisting of fourteen males and eleven females.

The Rev. John Porter, a native of Abington, was their first Minister; he was ordained October 15, 1740, and died March 12, 1802, in the 37th year of his age, and 62d of his ministry.

The Rev. Asa Meach was settled colleague with Mr. Porter, in October 15, 1800. He was dismissed by a mutual council in 1811.

The Rev. Daniel Huntington, their present pastor, was son of General Jedidiah Huntington, of New-London, and was ordained October 28, 1812.

There were 481 added to the church in Mr. Porter's day, and 58 in Mr. Meach's day; and there have been 100 added under Mr. Huntington's ministry. The present number is about 220.

Daniel Howard was the first Justice of Peace.

The first Militia Officers were Daniel Howard, Captain; Robert Howard, Lieutenant; and Abiel Packard, Ensign. These were succeeded by Robert Howard, Captain; Abiel Packard, Lieutenant; and Henry Kingman, Ensign. And those by Abiel Packard, Captain; Henry Kingman, Lieutenant; and Constant Southworth, Ensign. These continued in office until about the year 1761, or 1765, when the militia were divided into two companies.

The officers in the north company were, Barnabas Howard, Captain, John Howard, Lieutenant, and Abiel Packard, Ensign. The officers in the south company were, Isaac Packard, Captain, Josiah Packard, Lieutenant, and Issachar Suel, Ensign. Those officers held their commissions till the Revolution, 1775. All militia officers before the Revolution, were appointed by the Governor; from that time to the present, they have been chosen by their companies.

The inhabitants had so increased, that in 1762 it was found necessary either to enlarge the meeting-house, or build a new one. They concluded to build a new one, and made preparation for it the following Winter. In the Spring of 1763 they began and laid the foundation, the frame was raised in June and in December the house was finished. The carpenter-work was all done by carpenters who lived in the Parish. Colonel Simeon Cary, who was one of the building committee, was master of the outside of the house. Colonel Josiah Haden was master of the inside:—he built the pulpit and case. Isaac Packard built the front work of the galleries. The

carpenters were Deacon Jonathan Cary, Benjamin Packard, Micah Packard, Seth Packard, Barnabas Pratt, Thomas Pratt, Job Bryant, Gamaliel Bryant, Samuel Hayden, Phineas Paine, and Jeremiah Beals, who is the only one now alive.

The new meeting-house was dedicated the last week in December. The Rev. Mr. DUNBAR, of Stoughton, preached in the forenoon, from Isaiah 60th chapter, part of the 7th verse;—“*I will glorify the house of my glory.*” The Rev. JOHN ANGLIER, of the East Parish, preached in the afternoon, from Psalm cxxii 1:—“*I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord.*” The first Sabbath in January, 1764, Mr. Porter preached for the first time in the new meeting-house from Haggai, 2d chapter, part of the 9th verse;—“*The glory of this latter house shall be greater than the former.*”

In the latter part of the year 1764, the Parish procured a bell for the meeting-house; the first in the town.

The number of inhabitants in the North Parish, were in this year, 333; and the number of dwelling houses 120.

In the year 1769, when the disputes between England and America had begun, and the importation of foreign goods was stopped, it became customary for people to manufacture their own clothing; and in many places the young Ladies had spinning matches, at their minister's, for the benefit of their families. On the 15th of August, 1769, at two o'clock, P. M. ninety-seven young Ladies met at the house of their Pastor, the Rev. JOHN PORTER, and generously gave his Lady, for the use of her family, three thousand three hundred and twenty-two knots of linen, tow, cotton and woollen yarn, which they had spun for that purpose! At three o'clock, something of American produce only, was set before them for their refreshment, which was more agreeable to them than any foreign dainties, considering the situation of the country at that time. At four o'clock, the Ladies walked in procession to the meeting-house, where a discourse was delivered by their Pastor, from Acts ix. 36;—“*This woman was full of good works:*” in which piety, industry, frugality, and benevolence, were recommended and encouraged. The closing prayer being made, the following lines, composed by their Pastor, were sung.

Ye rubies bright, ye orient pearls,—
How coveted by men!—
And yet, the virtuous woman's price
Excell's the precious gem.

How kind and generous her heart!—
 How diligent her hand!
 How frugal in economy,
 To save her sinking land!

Foreign productions she rejects,
 With nobleness of mind,
 For home commodities; to which
 She's prudently inclined.

She works, she lends, she gives away,
 The labors of her hand;
 The pious, the poor, the people, all
 Do find in her their friend.

She clothes herself and family,
 And all the sons of need;—
 Were all these virtuous soon we'd find
 Our land from slavery freed.

After which several anthems were sung, and the assembly being dismissed, they retired to their respective homes.

The inhabitants of the North Parish remained contented with their connexion with the other parts of the town, for a number of years: but as the people increased, they began to talk of a separation, and there were several attempts made for that purpose, but they failed. At a parish meeting, in 1817, the parish voted by a large majority, to petition the General Court, to be set off as a separate town. Accordingly a petition, signed by a large number of voters, was presented to the Court for that purpose. It was opposed by the town, and by a respectable minority in the parish. It continued in suspense until June, 1821, when they were incorporated into a town, by the name of North Bridgewater.

The first town meeting was held July 4th, 1821. The meeting was opened by prayer, by the Rev. Mr. Huntington. Joseph Sylvester, Esq. was chosen moderator, and Colonel Edward Southworth, town clerk. The selectmen were Abel Kingman, Esq. Howard Cary, Esq. and Captain Zachariah Gurney. A number of other town officers were then chosen. There were upwards of two hundred voters present.

North Bridgewater is about 4 1-2 miles square, and is bounded on the East by Abington, on the North by Randolph and Stoughton, on the West by Easton, and on the South by West Bridgewater. It contains about 13,000 acres. The town is 20 miles from Boston, 25 from Plymouth, 16 from Dedham, 15 from Taunton, and 30 from Providence.

North Bridgewater is well watered by springs and brooks, or small rivers, some of which are large enough for mill scites, the greatest part of the year. Salisbury river takes its rise in Stoughton, runs in a southerly direction about half a mile west of the middle of the town, till it passes the centre, then turns and runs East till it meets with Trout Brook, which also takes its rise in the South-east corner of Stoughton, and runs in a South-erly direction, about half a mile east of the middle of the town till it meets with Salisbury River, near the Factory;—here they form one river, which runs Southerly till it enters East Bridgewater. Beaver Brook, which takes its rise in Weymouth, runs in a Southerly direction, and forms the boundary line between North Bridgewater and Abington, till it enters East Bridgewater. There is another river, called Cowsett Brook, which rises in Easton, and runs through the South-west corner of the town, into West Bridgewater. Tilden's mill stands on this river.

There was formerly a Furnace and Forge in the town, in which large quantities of hollow ware and bar-iron were made; but on account of the scarcity of wood have been discontinued. The Furnace stood where Colonel Howard's works now stand, and was built by a number of the inhabitants, but was afterwards sold to Mr. Bowdoin of Boston, and was successively owned by Colonel Hobart, of Abington, Mr. Perry, of Easton, Mr. George Howard, of Bridgewater, and last by Caleb Howard, Esq. The Forge stood near where the Cotton Factory now stands;—it was built by Ensign Constant Southworth and others. Southworth himself was a forgerman.

There are now in the town four Grist-mills, two Saw-mills, a Cotton Factory, two Carding Machines, and one Fulling-mill.

The town always has been, and is now, well supplied with sorts of Mechanics, such as Carpenters, Masons, Blacksmiths, Sheet makers, Wheelwrights, Saddlers, and Shoemakers.

The manufacture of Shoes for foreign markets, is carried on to a considerable extent.

The manufacture of Saw-bread is carried on very extensively by the Females.

There are three Public Houses, and eight stores in the town. North Bridgewater is a very beautiful ship of land, having no hills of consequence. The North-west corner, called the West Shares, is the highest land in town. The soil is various; the northern part is clay, and central so deep rich loam, and is very productive;—the southern part, is a heulry Salisbury Flints, very suitable for tillage, being of a light mould. There are considerable quantities of fresh meadows, adjoining the rivers and brooks, which afford large crops of hay and of a pretty good quality.

The farms are generally fenced with stone wall. The wood of the upland consists of the several kinds of Oak and Walnut;—that in the sward of Maple, Birch, Ash, and Elm.

Large quantities of plank, and ship-timber, have been, and are still, carried to the same markets; also considerable quantities of wood and coal, are annually carried to Boston and other towns.

The town is divided into eleven School Districts, and there is a School House in every District.

The town raises six hundred dollars annually for schooling, which is divided in the several Districts.

There is a social Library in the town which contains two hundred volumes, and is increasing by annual instalments.

A Discourse was delivered by the Rev. Mr. Huntington, in the meeting-house, in the North Parish, December 22d. 1822. It being the second centennial anniversary of the landing of the Pilgrims at Plymouth. Text Psalm xlv. 1—3.

Ordained at North Bridgewater, on the 31st of October, 1822. Messrs. Daniel Temple and Isaac Bird, as Missionaries to the Heathen. Sermon by the Rev. Richard Storrs of Braintree.

November 13th, 1823. David Brown, a native of the Chickee tribe of Indians, delivered an Address in the meeting-house in North Bridgewater; after which a collection was made for the purpose of supporting schools in his nation.
