


Seventh Wear, 1909-1910

#### Constitution of General Culture Club

#### ARTICLE I.—NAME.

This Organization shall be called General Culture Club, of Fort Wayne, Indiana.

#### ARTICLE II.—OBJECT.

The object shall be to promote social and intellectual advancement among the members.

#### ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. The membership of this Club shall be limited to twenty.

Section 2. Any lady desiring to become a member must comply with the following:

Pledge herself to secrecy in regard to the business transactions of the Club; note carefully what is contained in the constitution and by-laws and sign the same.

#### ARTICLE IV.—OFFICERS.

Section 1. The officers of this Club shall be: President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. The president shall perform the usual duties of a presiding officer.

Section 3. The Vice President shall perform the duties of the President in her absence.

Section 4. The Secretary shall record the minutes of each meeting, keep a record of the date of admission of each member, keep an account of the receipts and expenditures, collect all dues and fines, and make a report at the expiration of her term of office to the Club.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall be costodian of all funds, keep an account of all receipts and disbursements, and make a report at the expiration of her term of office to the Club.

ARTICLE V.—TIME OF ELECTION.

An election shall be held annually.

ARTICLE VI.-HOW AMENDED.

The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of all the members present after due notice has been given at a prior regular meeting.

#### Ny-Laws

Section 1. The Club shall hold its meetings every alternate Thursday afternoon from 2:30 to 4:30 o'clock.

Section 2. The election of officers shall be held on the first meeting in May, each year.

Section 3. The nomination of officers shall be made on the afternoon of the election. The nominations for each office shall be immediately succeeded by the election of the same, and before the nominations and election of the next officer. If there is but one candidate, the Club may, by motion, authorize the Secretary to cast the vote of the Club for the nominee.

Section 4. The officers shall be elected by ballot, a majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to constitute a choice. Each member shall be entitled to one vote.

Section 5. The membership fee shall be twenty-five cents.

Section 6. The dues of each member shall be ten cents at each meeting.

Section 7. Each member who does not respond to the call of duty and fails to provide a substitute, shall be fined twenty-five cents.

Section 8. Each member shall have the right to propose candidates for membership. To entitle a candidate to consideration, she must attend one regular meeting of the Club, and must take part in the reading at said meeting. Her name may then be proposed at any subsequent meeting, and the Club shall vote by ballot upon the proposal. No lady shall be asked to become a member until the above named conditions have been complied with. One negative vote shall bar a candidate for membership.

Section 9. These By-Laws may be amended by two-thirds vote of the members present provided the amendment be made in writing and recorded by the Secretary one week before final action is taken.
